Edwin S. Meigs opened his bar on Main street last evening at 6 o'clock. The place has been papered and painted and presents a neat and attractive appearance. A large arch has been cut between the two rooms uniting them into one large room, the portion in the rear being fitted up with several oak tables about four feet in diameter. The bar, manufactured by the M. R. Ward Bar Fixture Company, is twenty feet long made of solid quartered oak with mahogany top and is a very handsome affair. The mirror frame, made from splendid specimens of oak, decorated by carving of a fine grade, holds two mirrors 7x4½ feet. Fred Walker of this city and Harry Long, formerly of the Hancock Tavern and Quincy House of Boston, have been engaged by Mr. Meigs as bar keepers.
