

Over thirty years ago Mr. King was elected one of the trustees of Goddard Seminary of Barre. At that time the Seminary was passing through an embarrassed financial condition, being heavily in debt. For a time it was even doubtful as to the wisdom of continuing the school. But by the heroic efforts of Professor Shipman of Tufts College, at Medford, Mass., and two of the trustees, one of them the Hon. Harvey Tilden and the other being Mr. King, enough money was raised to pay the debt. Had it not been for Professor Shipman's earnest efforts in Massachusetts, however, the sum would hardly have been sufficient. Since then the Seminary has been run on a business basis, and at the present time has an endowment of \$100,000. Mr. King has served as auditor of accounts for over thirty years.

For ten years Clark King was a director in the Montpelier National Bank. He served as a Selectman for four or five years and was a School Director for a short time. At present he holds no office. He has retired from business except for holding a trusteeship in various estates.
