

## WELL KNOWN HOTEL MAN

### WILLIAM MILLER DIES OF KIDNEY TROUBLE

Was in Business at Same  
Stand For 36  
Years.

William Miller, proprietor of Miller's Inn, died about 7.15 o'clock Saturday evening of diabetes and pneumonia. Mr. Miller has had a kidney trouble for a great many years, and on different occasions in late years has had attacks which confined him to the bed for a time. His final illness dated about a week before his death, it being complicated by an attack of pneumonia. He was unconscious most of Saturday, and at 5 o'clock had a sinking spell from which he did not rally.

Mr. Miller, who was born in Montpelier, would have been 60 years of age on the 17th of the present month had he lived. His father was John Miller and his mother Mary Gravelin Miller. Mr. Miller was married 11 years ago to Eliza Miller, who survives him. He is also survived by his mother who is 81 years of age and one sister, Mrs. Elmer Pattee. His brother, Charles of Cabot, died about 14 months ago, his brother, John Miller, many years a mail carrier, died about 15 years ago. Another sister, Josephine Lanier, is also deceased. Mrs. Miller, his wife, has been an invalid for several years.

Mr. Miller was educated in the public schools. When a boy he worked in Bailey & Park's grocery store. Thirty-six years ago the present month he bought the Keith place on Main street which was a small frame structure that stood on the site of his present hotel building and since that time he has been in business at this location, operating a restaurant and bottling works and when the local option law became operative he went into the hotel business. The block was remodeled by him twenty years ago.
