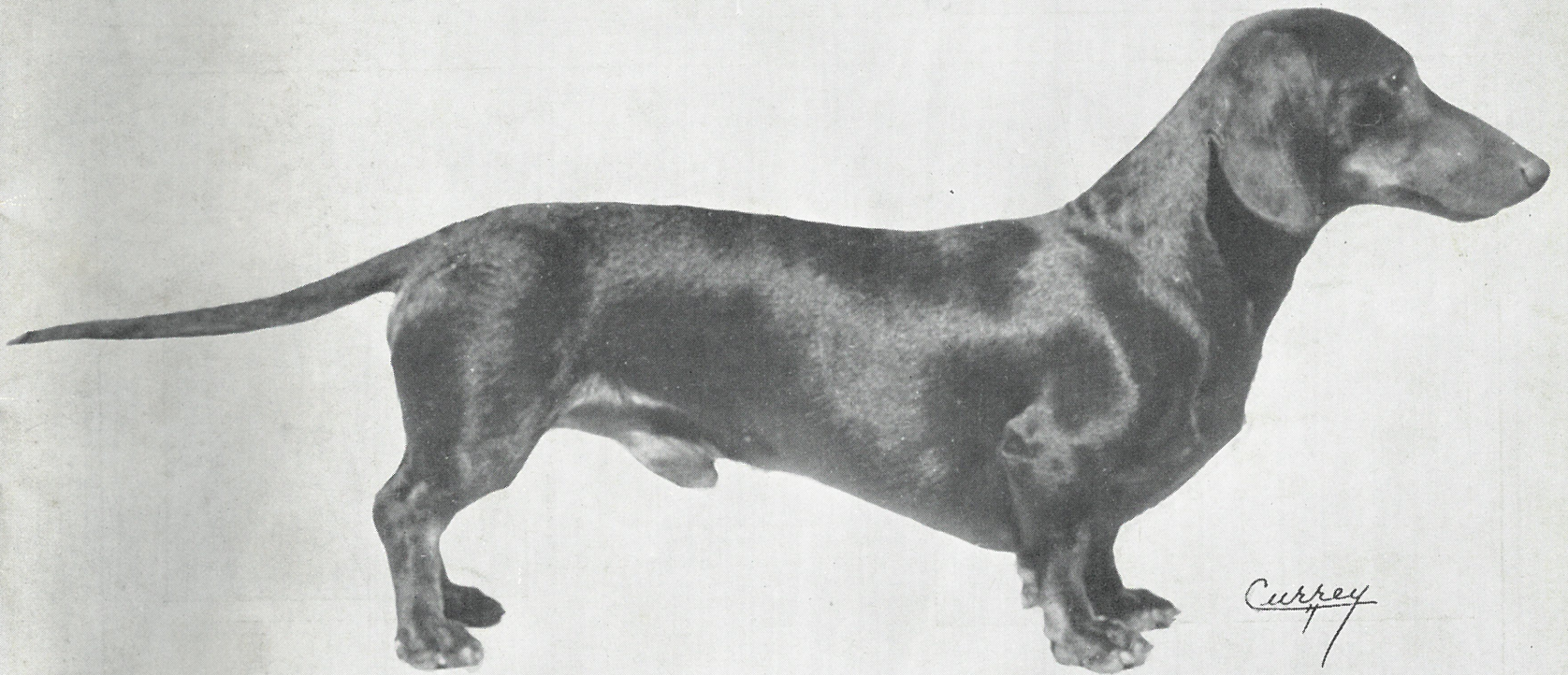

SAMOYEDES

Friends of our East Bay "Sammies" will be glad to hear that one of our members—Maelchek, belonging to Mr. Mel Harris of Oakland attended the show held in Los Angeles on May 25-26, bringing back with him two points towards his championship.

Mr. Harris was delighted with the competition received there, with six Sammies benched four males and two bitches, remarking "there seems to be more interest in benching the dogs in the South".

Ch. Snow Frost, owned by Khiva Kennels, went best of breed. Maelchek went best of winners; Lady Stara, owned by Mrs. Waldo J. Marra of Belmont, opposite sex.

Others benched were Mrs. McDowell's Snow Drifter; Frost's Freesia, owned by Mrs. McDowell; Mrs. Mary Kern's Drujoke of Haslemere, a very fine looking son of Ch. Snow Frost and Ch. Patricia Obi. Kari Kol, owned by Mrs. Bev. H. Jones of Fresno was absent because of the illness of his owner.

Mr. Harris reports: "Mrs. Nina Dexter, the judge, was very thorough and did as complete a job of judging as I have ever witnessed. Mrs. Dexter did not overlook a single point, from the padded feet to the breadth of head, taking plenty of time and giving each dog equal attention."

We trust that it will be possible to obtain Mrs. Dexter as judge for some of our northern shows—for it's that attention to detail that we need for the good of the breed.

An inquiry regarding our West Coast Sammies comes to us from Miles R. Vernon,

one of the veteran breeders of Sammies in the East and now head of the Samoyede Club of America. Mr. Vernon's kennels are located in Ossining, N. Y.



WHITE SPRITE OF THE ARCTIC

Our picture this month is of Mrs. Horace Mann's White Sprite of the Arctic, imported by her a few years ago by her from Miss M. Keyte Perry's famous kennels in England. Sprite is the daughter of Ch. Loga of the Arctic and Ch. Winter.

She has a wonderfully dense coat, with unusually heavy feathering on her legs and feet, the blackest of noses, lips and eye-rims, and passes these points on to her offspring. Her black nose with no taint of artificial coloring about it, drew very favorable comment from Judge Charles Hopton at one of the recent shows.

For news of the Morris and Essex show held on May 25th we are grateful to Mrs. Mann, who reports that Rebinock owned by Mr. Sutton, won the American-bred dog class—always a big win—and young Boscka (Ch. Storm Cloud and Sprite) at his second show, went fourth.

Gorka's Sneg won American-bred bitch and winners bitch. We are delighted for Mr. Sutton. We hope to publish a picture of this gorgeous bitch at an early date.

Mr. Reid's Ch. Moguiski was winners dog at Morris and Essex, but Frank Jaekel's Duke of Norka was best of breed and also won the special award for American bred dog.

"The death of Mr. Horace Mann of Trenton, N. J., on May 2nd was a blow to members of the Samoyede Club. Mr. Mann has been a breeder and exhibitor for years. Mr. Mann is survived by his wife, a son, Horace Jr., and a daughter, Mrs. La Violette, and a sister, Miss Corinne Mann. Our sympathy to his family.

The news clipping follows:

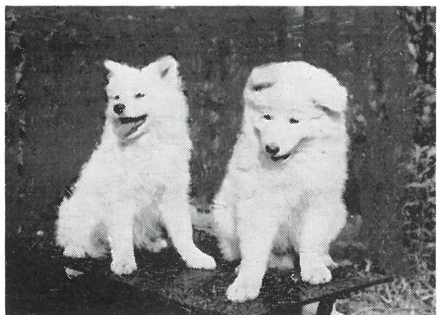
Several weeks ago an imported Samoyede named Ice Crystal of the Arctic arrived from England to be added to the string being collected by Mrs. Helen S. Harris of Overbrook. The newcomer, a magnificent young female heavy in whelp to Ch. Leader of the Arctic, an English champion, encountered a novel experience upon its arrival in New York. Ice Crystal had won two challenge certificates in English shows.

The ship was delayed by fog and docked late in the evening. Mrs. Harris reports she arranged by wire to have the Animal Department of the Customs office remain open and hour or so in the hope that the "lady" could be passed through without delay.

It developed that the imported Samoyede was the only "passenger" passed through the customs that evening. The canine, being insured, was brought on to its abode here, the same night, arriving in state, being accompanied by two customs broker representatives.

Mrs. Harris owns two other striking specimens, both imported Samoyedes, named Sabarka of Farningham, and Pedlar of the Arctic, and deserves much praise in her foundation of a kennel of these glorious dogs.
