.. Samoyeds ..

It scarcely seems possible that already we are writing the news for this, our August issue — an anniversary month for our Sammy folks — beginning their 24th year in Western Kennel World.

And folks, may we say here that of the many fine folks interested in sponsoring our breed during the years, one of our most consistent sponsors has been Mrs. Agnes Mason of the White Way Kennels in Sacramento, California. Her very first ad appeared in our section in the October issue of 1936, just 20 years ago. At the time her Czar Nicholas Lebanof (later Champion) was being advertised as stud—and pups sired by him, out of Dascha of Laika were for sale. To the best of my knowledge, and I think a thorough check through the years would bear me out in this statement. Mrs. Mason has continued to help us boost our breed each month in this manner.

And so, we give you a story in honor of the Mason White Way Kennels in Sacramento. As the following paragraphs are excerpts from the December Samoyed Club of America Bulletin of 1944 they do not include information on the later Sams bred at White Way. Perhaps at some later date we may be able to persuade Mrs. Mason to help us supply the missing information.

We note a lack of news on Mrs. Mason's first Sammy bitch, Dacha of Laika, who was influential in establishing much of the good blood produced at White Way. However, we give you the following (dated December 1944)

"In a kennel with several as we have it is easy to study comparisons and my likes or dis-

likes may apply to standard as far as show points are concerned. I have never seen a Sammy that I did not admire for some special trait or beauty all its own. I have so much to learn about Samoyeds that I hesitate to pass along my observations for publication, but I hope that some of my conclusions agree with others who really know the breed better than I do. (1944).

"Now, regarding our boys and girls, past and present: Right now we have five champions in our kennel, just enough for a five dog sled team. Our Ch. Czar Nicholas and Ch. Chum would have made seven — if only Nick had not met with accident and Chum had not passed on. We still miss them and have never been able to replace either one with another in spite of having nine mature Sammies. However, each one is an individual and finds a special place in our hearts in his own right.

"Nick (Ch. Czar Nicholas Lebanov) performed many interesting tricks — he enjoyed singing most of all, accompanying himself on the piano by thumping the keys with his big paws (that were four of the largest). His voice changed from low to high, depending upon the keys played, and he always looked around for applause — then when four of his companions joined in — it was always a howling success with any audience that might be in our home.

He was quite a success when he sung in San Francisco "Be Kind to Animals Show." After his performance it was most difficult to keep him from attempting to make a duet with the soloist, an opera star. He also sang over the radio and perhaps well enough, but was not up to his usual performance, no doubt because he was more interested in the doughnuts the announcer was eating. We made the error of giving Nick a bite before he went on the air. It was the Channel Bakery hour, so they announced to the radio that even the Sammy soloist liked Channel doughnuts — plug??? Nick's companions always depended upon him to release them from house or kennel. He had the whole kennel out three times in one day before we discovered that he shook the gate until the hook on the outside released, then by the time the wide gate was opened sufficiently for Nick to get around all his companions were likewise on their way — fortunately each time they made a beeline for the house. Frequently, his ability to unhook the screen door with his nose was a convenience for us — we would unlatch the lock from outside and then call Nick to unhook the hook — both were necessary to keep him in. He never failed us. He was as proud as a peacock when called upon to carry mail, umbrellas or packages, and enjoyed so much pulling Aljean in the wagon — she was then nine years old. His hide and seek game was a daily pleasure for the children as well as Nick. He knew property lines and did not venture over. His guardian instinct was used intelligently. If we were not in our car no

one dared go near it, but he could be introduced to a gasoline attendant who could later move the car if necessary. We would have the attendant call Nick by name, then get into the car while we were there. We also used this method successfully with Varka.

"Ch. Chum was our lap dog. He would nudge his way into laps regardless, and I understand Duke, his son, now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Zellerbach of San Francisco, has the same trait. All our Sammies would like to be lap dogs, but some are more persistent than others. It was always most interesting to watch Chum and Nianya herd a neighbor dog preventing his returning home after he became tired of playing. Many times it was necessary for us to call them away so that the little fellow could go home. I notice the pack instinct is still strong in our breed. They do not often run with other breeds, when they have a playmate of their own kind — when they do take a liking to an outsider it is usually a small dog.

"Ch. Dashnik's Sam will whisper for his tidbit — likes to carry packages and started to fumble with locks like his daddy) but after the many experiences with Nick this was discouraged. When Sam was living with my daughter in Fresno, a fire engine came down the street, she saw Sam deliberately shove Patsy and Sandy, her two children, from the street onto the sidewalk by getting on the outside of them and gently nudging them over. Sam has not been shown a great deal and finished his championship in a few shows, placing third in group. He is a good showman, but most indifferent looking most of the time around the house. Nick was the showman around home and looked like a bored mongrel in the show ring most of the time. I believe the dog with the more calm disposition makes the better show dog in the ring. Leader is very calm and shows well with anyone.

"Ch. White Way of Kobe is exceptionally friendly, and when we left him in the car with the puppies at the last Marin County show, we said "Rikki perhaps will allow anyone to take the pups, but no doubt his size will keep any away who may have evil designs on them." We didn't reckon on the protective instincts in all Sams. He refused to allow anyone near, not even Juilleys and people he knew who called him by name. I find that females are marvelous mothers, but after a certain age the males assume more responsibility in protecting young dogs. They will also endure more of the puppy's antics. Ch. White Way has placed four times in group. He is also a champion in the game of gopher hunting and will kill a rat at every opportunity, but I believe Perof is better at this game.

"Ch. Petrof, 8 years old, is the oldest dog in

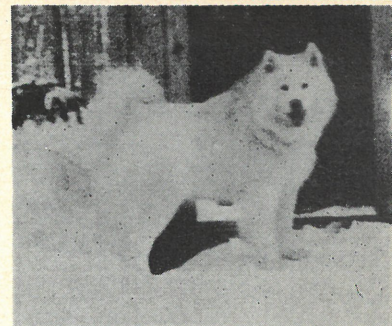

our kennels now, and the only male from our first litter of seven. Polar Princess Tonia is his litter sister. Petrof is also the most agile, and can and will scale any 6 or 7 foot fence. Thank heavens, the others are satisfied to stay in their yards. He will jump back into the kennel as well as out and continued even after hurting his leg. We now have a 2 foot wire across top of upright fencing. They surely have stamina, annoying at times but so valuable when needed for our own or their own protection. His greatest thrill is to wrestle with Aljean. He could compete with any police dog exhibition. He never hurts and quits the minute she says 'Stop'. He will sit, then bring himself up to a standing position.

"Ch. Herdsman's Victory Leader (Nick-named Silver) we call the nurse of the kennel. He is constantly washing the faces of the others, and taking care of any scratch or sore they happen to have. The peculiar thing is, they all permit his attention — when under ordinary circumstances they might put up a fight. Silver placed fourth in the group at the Oakland Show, and third at our last Sacramento show. Ch. Herdsman's Faith is most like her brother Chattigan, always talking, and a watchdog at all times when alone, and a most devoted mother.

"Chattigan has 6 points toward a championship, and we are thrilled with his son Star-Chak who has gone Best of Breed in his first three shows and placed fifth and fourth in the group — not yet 1 year old — owned now by Mr. and Mrs. Ward of Los Angeles. Chattigan still chats and has a regular Sammy lingo, when asked to tell a story. Nothing excites him more than to go along with Aljean horseback riding. He is a good lead dog but a natural as Varka was — spoiled too much, I guess.

"Nianya, with 12 or 13 points, is always the gracious hostess to greet guests. She bows on her two front paws saying 'How-do-you-do' in her Sammy language. She sits up — which is an ordeal as she eats morning, noon and night, if given half a chance, making it next to impossible to keep her weight down. If she wants anything badly enough she will sit up, then bow — to get it. She is precious.

"Silver Spark of the Arctic, we call the politician, always shaking hands and how the

people fall for his handshake and the grin on his face. However, he is anything but the politician in the kennel — bosses the whole gang and they don't like it — but we like him immensely.

"No wonder we think the Sammys the most fascinating of all breeds, if talked to and encouraged they perform many tricks without any special effort at training them. We do enjoy them."

Your Sam editor has recently come upon a record published Sept. 1947, giving some data on some of the early Mason Sams which I believe will be of interest to our readers — for comparison with their own.

Ch. White Way of Kobe (imported) born 3/28/38, at 9 years old was 22½ inches in height and weighed 63 lbs.

Ch. Victory Leader, born 9/3/40, at 7 years was 23 inches and weighed 64 lbs.

Ch. Petrof Lebanof, born 7/28/36, at 11 years was 23¼ inches and weighed 61 lbs.

Ch. Herdsman's Chattigan, born 9/3/40 (same litter as Leader) was 21½ " tall and weighed 55½ lbs. at 7 years.

Reiningrad, born 10/6/41, at 6 years old was 22 inches and weighed 54 lbs.

Toby of White Way, born 5/25/44, at 3 years old was 22 inches and weighed 52 lbs.

Ch. Herdsman's Faith (bitch) born 9/3/40, at 7 years was 21 inches and weighed 55 lbs.

Ch. Gay of White Way, daughter of Faith,

born 11/9/42, at five years old was 20½ inches and weighed 54 lbs., while Ch. Nianya of Snowland, born 9/17/37, at 10 years old was 20 inches and weighed 53½ lbs.

I believe it is safe to say that White Way has continued to produce Sams of even better calibre than these forbears.

And so we offer you the background of the Mason White Way Kennels of Sacramento.

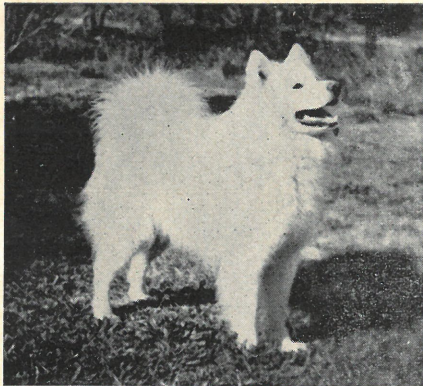
SIKANDI PLACES HER FOLKS HIGH ON CLOUD 999

Silver Crest's Sikandi, known to those who love her as "Kandi," is the daughter of White Frost's Tybo, out of Ch. White Beauty of Lucky Dee. She is a home-bred from the Draylone Kennels, owned by the Spatholds. Born Feb. 21/55, Kandi has made a spectacular record to date, starting with January 1956, where she went Reserve, taking second in the Open class. She has attended 10 shows since that time each time taking Winners Bitch, and once going on to Best of Breed then placing 3rd in

IN MEMORY OF THE GREAT SAM CH. MARTINGATE SNOWLAND TAZ

It is with sincerest sympathy that we report the passing of the veteran Champion Martingate Snowland Taz on June 20 — at just 13 days less than 12 years of age. To his grieving owners, Elma and Kenneth Miller of Corning, N. Y. there can be no other Sam just like Taz — none to quite fill his place. He was a grand, noble animal beloved by all who knew him — and his loss to our breed will be keenly felt. Though his show honors were many through the years, "Taz" will be remembered best as a most outstanding Sam Stud, producing a record of champion sons and daughters which will be hard to beat. Taz was the winner of the Wyman beautiful Sheffield Stud dog Trophy. Our record shows 23 champions sired by Taz, including the following—Ch. Tazson, Ch. Tazy, Ch. Truls, Ch. Snowbelle III, Ch. Silver Taz of Stronghaven and Ch. Tazbel, all out of Snowbelle, and bred by the Ulfengs of Dunellen, N. J. These were full, but not all litter brothers and sisters.

Then there were Ch. Barrie and Ch. Peter Pan, out of Wendy, C.D., Miss Margaret Schlichting of New York, Breeder. Ch. Jaytee's Kharkov, out of Ch. Jaytee's Kola, breeder, J. T. Roth of Cincinnati. Ch. Gay Boy, Ch. Pattee Duff, Ch. Tatiana, Ch. Sweet Missy, all "of

Sammar," out of Ch. Frolene of Sammar, bred by the Joe Marshalls of Palos Park, Chicago, Ill. Then Ch. Parkcliffe Taz Malik, out of Ch. Barkeeta of Snowland, owned by Parkcliffe Kennels of New York.

Ch. Pratika of Top Acres and Ch. Narguess of Top Acres, out of Ch. Sparkle Plenty of Arbee, Mrs. Ruth Bates Young, of Medway, O., breeder, Ch. Eikenglo's ola, out of Frona of Blakewood, Mrs. K. A. Miller of Corning, N. Y. breeder.

Ch. Silver Spray, Ch. Silver Beam, Ch. Saba, Scion and Ch. Silver Mist, all "of Wynchwood," out of the imported Ch. Princess Silvertips of Kobe, Mrs. Bernice Ashdown of Manhasset, N.Y.; breeder. Also listed as being sired in England by Snowland Taz, is Eng. Ch. Snowland Canras, Mrs. Wescott, breeder. To the best of our knowledge. Thomas Ralph's Chin Chin Dan McGrew, out of Ch. Katje, CDX. of Salt Lake City, has been added to the list of champion sons of Taz. If others have qualified since, please advise us, so the list will be complete.

It will be noted that with the exception of Ch. Silvertips, the mothers of all other litters were American born bitches, with the "Snowland" in their pedigrees from Mrs. Helen Harris' famous Snowland Kennels. Among the Snowlanders were, Ch. Zoveek, Ch. Nadya, Ch. Frola. Ch. Barkeeta, Ch. Kurgan Ch. Nadine, Nimreena and Pollyanna all "of Snowland." And so it is, through many generations to come, the great influence of Ch. Martingate Snowland Taz will carry on—a great tribute to our breed.

Mrs. Miller tells us that Imp. Snowland Vana is still alive and in the best of health, and is 13½ years old. It is her pleasure to "run the house", now that Taz is no longer in command. She is ably assisted by the imported two year old, Rippleby Fanfare (Ch. Snowland Rooski ex Rippleby Dinah), bred by Miss D. Luke at the Rippleby Kennels in England. In her pedigree, the name of Ch. Martingate Snowland Taz appears three times. We take pleasure in presenting here a picture of Mrs. Miller with "Fanfare," who has already produced a mighty promising looking son called Tym (now 7 months old).

IDAHO FALLS WINS HONORS IN OBEDIENCE TRIALS

Such is the title of a newspaper clipping from the Deseret News and Telegram, of Salt Lake City, along with a picture showing Joe Dyer and "Mr. Big" and Tom Ralphs and Williwah, sire of Mr. Big.

A clipping from the Post-Register of Idaho Falls, Idaho, proud of its own, gave a picture also, and an interesting item titled, "Idaho Falls Samoyed Wins Dog Honors." It reports the following—"Mr. Big of Caribou, owned by Joe M. Dyer, is holding his head prouder than usual. He was chosen for top dog in the Idaho Falls first Obedience Trial, Sunday, sponsored by the Upper Snake River Valley Dog Training Club. Mr. Big of Caribou was the highest scoring dog in the trial scoring 199 of 200 points. Besides taking over—all honors, Dyer's dog was the highest scoring dog from Idaho. Awards were also given in this class to the top dogs from Utah and Wyoming. Mr. Big received awards for the highest scoring dog in the Working class and the Novice B class. Winners in other classes were Yukon Joe, a Samoyed by Tom Ralphs, in the Utility class—Gauthier, a miniature poodle, owned by Olive J. and Keith Whipple in the Open B. class, with Williwah, the Samoyed owned by Ralphs, in Open A class. Prince Flash of Caribou, another Samoyed owned by Dyer was the winner of the Novice A class with score of 197½.

Williwah was the highest scoring dog from

Utah, while Duke of Kent VIII, an English Springer Spaniel, owned by Kent Doing of Casper took top honors for Wyoming. Roy Hatfield of Portland, Ore., was the judge of the Trial. Mr. Big's win at Idaho Falls, completed his last leg for the C.D. title, and gave the other pup, "Prince," his first leg — his first time in the Obedience ring. Mr. Dyer writes, "Needless to say we are thrilled and proud of the six beautiful trophies and three ribbons we won. It was truly a day for the Samoyeds, proving again the wonderful intelligence of the breed.

Mr. Emil Moore and his daughter Mary Lee, owners of Ch. Chinde's Snow King, were in the audience enjoying the show very much. They plan to start training their King in the next beginners class which will start soon."

Another newspaper picture on our desk shows young Danny and 11 year old Linda Moll of Highland Park, Calif., with their blue ribbon Derby race winners Cheena of Neva, Beau Brummel and Suepchen." 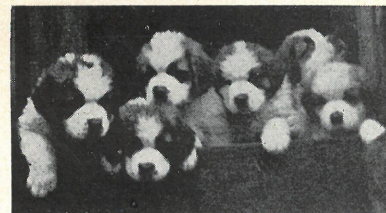
