## ... SAMOYEDS ...

Happy May-Days folks! We had planned for this May issue to feature pictures and stories of some of the Sammy bitches that have made their mark on our breed—but that we must plan for another time.

Our first story will be of interest to many, I am sure—especially to those who plan to buy or sell puppies.

It is always a joy to receive a letter from Mrs. Betty Kimpflin of Tucson, Arizona, who is hoping to be able to have another Sam some day. Since the passing of her beloved Torchy several months ago, Betty has had to take things easy—but she keeps her eyes open for news items which might assist other owners of Sams—and are sure to be of interest to all.

The most recent story she sent comes from the "Kennel and Leash" column by Mr. Maxwell Riddle in the March 13 issue of the Tucson Daily Citizen. We give it to you in full. Its title—

### "PUPPIES AND HIP DISEASE"

"The problem of hip dysplasia—hip joints which don't fit together properly—has confronted the dog world with a host of problems—some of which are moral and ethical in nature.

"For instance—this one which came to the writer. 'I bought a St. Bernard puppy for \$250. I bought it expressly as a show dog, when it was seven weeks old. Now, at seven months it is a cripple, and I must have it destroyed. Can I get my money back?'

"The question was then put to Dr. Wayne Riser, who is surely one of the world's great experts. He said he could recognize about 25 per cent of the cases when pups are four months old; 90 per cent when they are six months and the rest at a year.

"The average breeder who sells a pup at

six weeks of age, has no way to tell whether it will be displastic or not. If at seven months, the dog dies of distemper, the breeder would NOT be liable. Neither should he be in this case.

"Can heavy exercise give the dog the muscle mass it needs to protect its hips?

"Dr. Riser answered that one by saying that careful studies of dogs put on treadmills to develop their muscles had shown only an average increase of seven to eight per cent.

"If one dog gets hurt in normal activity so that he gets hip dysplasia, why don't they all?

"It's a question of genetics and heredity, Dr. Riser replies.

"Could you prevent hip dysplasia by restricting puppy exercise?

"Dr. Riser said he had taken Foxhound puppies bred from two generations of dysplastic puppies and had raised them without a single case developing. But—he had KEPT THEM CONSTANTLY IN THREE FOOT SQUARE CAGES FROM BIRTH.

"You can't do that with your home pet—but you CAN guard it from falls. You can guard pups of giant breeds from playing on waxed floors—and from running down stairs. If you can do this until they're six months old, you may have prevented hip dysplasia, and later, osteo-arthritis."

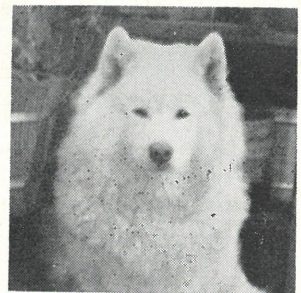

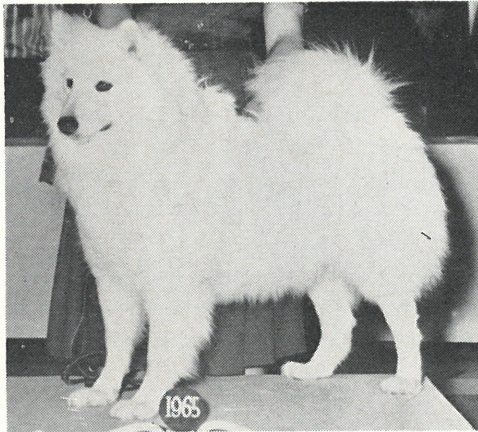

Folks, Be Careful in the Use of Those Metal Choke Chains!

A note from LaVera Morgan speaks of the number of folks who use the heavy metal choke chains when showing their dogs. She advises novices that these metal chains will do more to injure your dog's lovely ruff around the neck - and are unnecessary to say the least.

When you want a leash that will hold your dog - why not try one of the white braided nylon type? Cost is about \$2.50. It is guaranteed not to "cut" the hair - nor will the ruff become discolored as it does with hubbing by the metal collar.

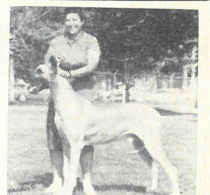

## Dachshunds

Several months ago, I made some mention of the fact that we are seeing more and more Dachshunds with INCORRECT long hocks and that they seem to be doing a lot of winning — the end result being more and more Dachshunds with the same fault.

At the time, Mrs. Mary Blandin and I had a discussion about it and I asked her to do a write-up on the subject. It follows:

"Norah dear, I told you some time ago when you talked with me about writing about LONG HOCKS I would do so promptly, but got sidetracked and never got at it. Hope I am not too late. It was brought to my mind very strongly after the two weekend shows where long hocks were so prevalent.

"This is a quote from The Complete Dachshund (refer to this book very often for information).

"Not the least part of the Dachshund is its hindquarters, which are seldom found in perfection. Let us emphasize that the power of the dog is developed in the quarters and transmitted through the spine. The skeleton of the quarters is a series of right angles. The long thigh bone drops from its insertion into the pelvis bone, forms a right angle at the knee with the equally long second thigh, which in turn forms a right angle with the hock at the hock joint. This series of angles with their muscular covering constitute levers which drive the animal forward. The musculature is large and bulky, hardly possible that it shall be too large. The hock is vertical as the dog stands, never bent under the dog to form sickle hocks nor turned backward in a double-jointed manner. A vertical line from the rear of the buttock should fall through the front part of the hock joint, which should be SHORT but strong and vigorous, with a powerful Achilles tendon.

"The whole hindquarters formation should be massive in proportion to the size of the dog, the hams both broad and thick, the bones strong and well tied together. Loss of angulation is a loss of propulsion, and is apparent in a hindquarter that is a mere prop to the dog. On the other hand, saber hocks betray themselves in a tendency of the dog to go down at the heel and to walk like a rabbit. Opposite faults, they are to be avoided."

"From my observation of the LONG HOCK JOINT I believe this is the reason for a dog hock-walking and squatting when posing. When I see a dog with a long hock-joint invariably he walks with the lower leg shuffling under his body and appears never to walk on his feet. Some people believe this long hock is something to strive for - they are surely wrong from what I get from reading the Standards.

"You will recall Mr. Kellog the judge of the Golden Gate Dachshund Club Specialty called attention to the 'Hindquarters.'

"I am a stickler of good hindquarters, but know that they are very difficult to come by, since there is so much of this fault being bred into our present Dachshunds. Otherwise, they are good overall specimens. — Mary Blandin"

Through the courtesy of Mrs. Mary Jane Davis, we have a marked catalogue from the Florida East Coast Dachshund Club Specialty show held in Palm Beach in January.

Judged by Ramona Van Court, the results were: Longhairs, WD and BW to Selkert's Fritz owned by Gladys Ruckert; WB to Bayard La Vogue owned by Richard Huntoon; BV to Ch. Tothonus of Thorn Pines owned by Bettye Copeland. In Smooths, WD to Dunkeldorf's Hussar owned by Mr. and Mrs. T. R. Dunk with WB and BW to Herthwood's Diana owned by Herthwood Kennels; BV to Ch. Dunkeldorf's Falcon Forester owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles and BOS out of the Veterans Class to Ch. Timbar's Bubbling Over owned by T. R. Dunk. In Wires, WD (only two entered????) to the puppy Holmdachs Bit O' Devilry owned by Betty Holmberg with WB and BW to Liebchen of Dackelwire owned by Mrs. H. Tyson Lykes III; BV to Ch. Vantebe's Draht Taune owned by Mrs. Betty Dukes with BOS to the WD. Best of Breed to the Smooth and BOS to the Wire.

The Dachshund Association of Long Island announces its 14th annual Specialty Show will be held on June 26th in Hicksville, Long Island. This fabulous show which always has the top entry for the country should do even better this year when Norman Lough of Seattle, Washington, will judge the Longs and Wires, Mrs. Albert Goulder of Chardon, Ohio, will judge the Sweepstakes and Mrs. Dorothea Metzger of Burbank, California, will judge the Smooths and Inter-Variety competition. We predict that with this fabulous panel of judges, the 1965 show will easily break DALI's record of 321 entries.

We were sorry to hear that Carol and Stan Orne have lost their beautiful and well-loved

Ch. Fir Trees Coco. Coco was the dog who went East and really racked up wins right and left and put wirehairs really in the front.
