### SAM NEWS ITEMS FROM OUR READERS

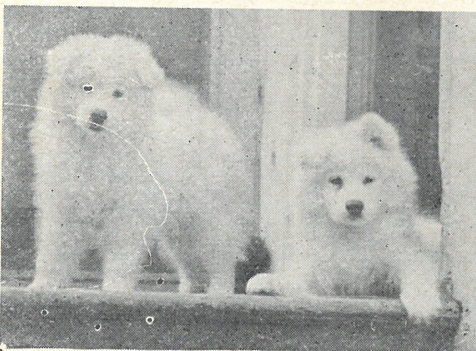
Lorna Sprock tells us that she lost her Ch. bitch, Ch. Nadia of White Krystal last July 4th—and Luba broke her leg.

### NO CARIES IN CANINES

A report by Dr. Thompson M. Lewis of the University of Washington in "Dental Abstracts" indicates that dog's teeth are remarkably resistant to decay. During a two-year study of dogs exposed to artificially induced caries lesions, caries never were manifested clinically, radiologically or histologically. Although previous studies have sometimes shown carious lesions in dogs, Dr. Lewis has found that where carious areas were thought to be present in teeth, histological scrutiny has invariably failed to substantiate these observations.

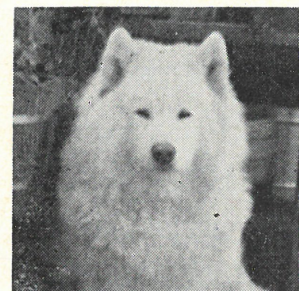
