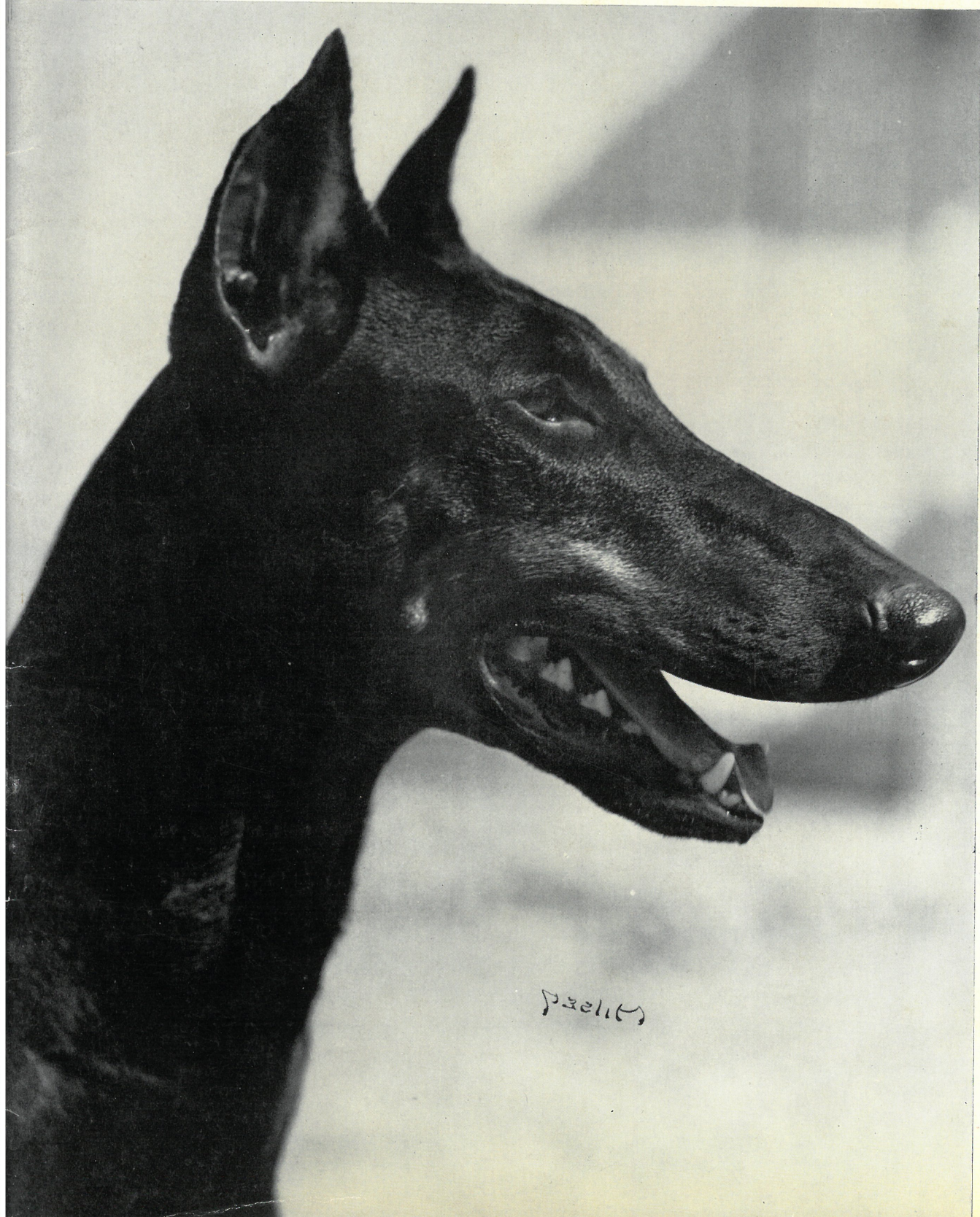

The summer shows are on in full, the majority of which are one day shows. The following is a report of the wins of a few that have come to our attention.

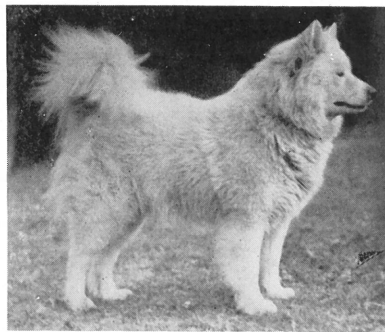
The Orange Empire Show

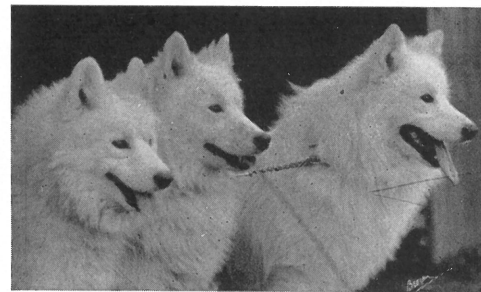

Nansen, now close to 11 years of age, born December 15, 1935, was bred by the late Mrs. Kilburn Scott and sired by Ch. Kara Sea out of Pinky of Farningham. (Note: "Very, very seldom today a Scot-bred dog is shown anywhere.")

Bred by exhibitor dogs and bitches winner was Mrs. Harris' Voltorn of Snowland. In the specials only, competing with the best of winners, Martingate Snowland Taz, were Mrs. Stanley Child's (Faith Harris), Ch. Nalda of Snowland son of Ch. Sprint of the Arctic ex Ch. Nadya of Snowland, and Nalda's son, Ch. Noel of Snowland out of Ch. Norna of Snowland. Noel, we believe, is now owned by Mrs. Marie Grillo.

Our first picture shows Nadine of Snowland, who finished her championship at this show (to be A.K.C. verified). Nadine is the litter sister to Ch. Nalda and Mrs. Ruicks Ch. Novik of Snowland, and dam of the Eldon King's Princess Narta of Snowland, Mrs. Harris' Voltorn of Snowland, and Mrs. Joe Marshall's Frola of Snowland.

Mr. and Mrs. Eldon King, formerly of Cottage Grove, Oregon, have moved to Central Point, about 7 miles north of Medford, where they have a motel. The place has lots of beautiful shade trees, so the Sammies will be very comfortable, too. At first it was all strange to them, and they seemed discontented, but they are quite happy now. about Samoyedes to decide whether he is typical in his action, but I do know that he is the most amazing combination of sweetness and brigandry I ever saw. In his journey to me, he

tore the screen out of the door of his crate. When I took him out of the crate, he overwhelmed with kisses, and after I had him in the car, his caresses made it impossible to start the car for at least 10 minutes.

He always obeys me, but he evidently resented being taken away from his brothers and sisters, and being left alone, because in my absence, he literally wrecked my living room, venetian blinds, upholstered chairs and rugs, were his playthings. Now he is house-broken and doesn't tear things up, but I had an exciting and expensive time for two months.

At the same time, he is gentle as a lamb with me and with all people. He dearly loves chil-

dren. He doesn't want to fight other dogs, but let another start a fight with him, and he is deadly in the most quiet, efficient way.

I take him walking in the cemetery frequently. For the first times, he would run to a marble statue of a little girl and kiss her repeatedly, until he finally realized she wasn't alive.

He has taught me his version of hide and seek. He partially hides behind a tree or bush, and I am supposed to tip toe up, peek around at him and say "booh," and then run with him after me full tilt. He rarely knocks me down in the onslaught, but nimbly and most gracefully sidesteps at the last moment. You can see that there is never a dull moment in our household.

After a walk on a wet day, he gets up on the window seat, and, when I bring a towel, he holds out one paw to be wiped dry. While he has, I am sure a high I. Q. he is impatient with formal education.

This summer I hope to secure some harness and put him to work hauling rocks and doing other useful things.

We can see that Kuban is not only a companion dog, but is scheduled to live up to his heritage as a working dog.

Our sympathy goes to Miss Elizabeth Smith of Franklin, New York, who wrote recently; "I have lost my beloved brood matron, Parke Cliffe Krasewo. She was the first Samoyede I ever owned, and occupied a special place in all our hearts.

"Sweetie," as we called her, was the sweetest tempered, gentlest, most lovable dog I have ever known, and while all Sams are grand companions, I don't expect to ever have another just like her. She loved all the puppies—whether her own or some other's. We feel sure that she is happy in 'doggy heaven.'"

I have recently purchased a daughter of Norka's Icy Queen, sired by my own Tsar Nikolas and I have high hopes for her. She is very beautiful, has black eyes and nose and a lovely coat and is the most playful pup I have ever had.

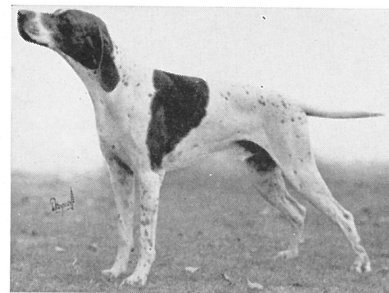
