## ... SAMOYEDS ...

Scarcely seems possible!—here it is July 31—and starting these notes for September Western Kennel World—so already it is time to start plans for December. We hope, or course, to give you a good Christmas issue. And please folks, if you hope to have any Christmas puppies for sale—send us that Ad and news by **OCTOBER** in order to get it in the November issue—in that way you don't miss out on sales.

If you want a WKW Ad. rate card, please write me immediately.

Our first story this month comes from Gary and Rowena Gray, owners of the Yeniseisk Samoyed Kennels in Boulder, Colorado.

"Our first dog was Bartholomew—our first Sam came later, and when you've had dogs (not to speak of Sams alone) as short a time as we have, you've got to fill in with something. Baby "B", as we called him, came to us at the very tender age of three weeks. His dam had a serious encounter with a car which lost for her an eye, and her subsequent interests were not those of conscientious motherhood. We picked him as he was the largest, liveliest and the darkest in color: it seemed probable then that he might resemble his registered Siberian sire.

Half a year later we thought "B" might like a brother for company, so we answered the ad of some very nice people who had some "mostly" Husky pups. We managed to come home with Hootchينو. By this time our interest in Northern breeds was sealed and when we began thinking of other dogs, we had decided that they would be pure-bred Arctic.

A book from the library stretched the possibilities past the Siberian Husky and the Alaskan Malamute. Samoyeds, Eskimos, Norwegian Elkhounds all seemed to hold some promise... (We'd never even heard of them!)

"A visit to a local newstand produced a copy of a magazine in which we saw McLaughlin's Silver Acres ad. Being the only Sam kennel in Colorado with an ad, we wrote a postcard, receiving from them a friendly letter with an invitation to drop up anytime. We did, and the first glimpse of a Samoyed as we drove up their drive sold us on the breed. We hadn't even seen an Elkhound.

"From there things happened rapidly. It's a little difficult to remember in just what order and when. We met Glen Crosley who invited us to a Sled Club meeting, and I believe that

ought surely to be able to do her share on any team.

"But our current excitements are two:—

"First, in point of time, though not necessarily of interest, is Yen's having taken his first points. . . a 4 pt. major. . . at Colorado Springs, Colorado, in June under Judge Charles Hamilton, at the very tender age of nine months.

Yocom. Donna later suggested a litter by Silver DeDe O'Snow Ridge might have a promising pup still unsold and gave us Helene Spathold's address. We received a note from her saying she no longer owned Shondi and that our letter had been forwarded to Elliott Colburn who owned Shondi and the litter; but before we would write we received a long interesting letter from him which began a correspondence that culminated several months later with the purchase of our Ellbur's Mitzie of Yeniseisk.

"The trip to Denver's Stapleton Field to meet her had us all excited, and we loved her immediately. She came out of the crate cautiously, a little frightened, but beautiful and perfectly groomed. The freight clerks were as impressed as we were!

"That was (and is) our first Sam, and how we came to be hers.... Since then things have never been the same. Are they ever with Sams around? In a trip last Christmas to California we spent a week with Elliott and picked—with consultation!—our second Sam, "Yen" (Ellbur's Yenisey of Yeniseisk), who stayed until he was brought out in April. We

also had the pleasure of meeting Bob and Dolly Ward, Billie Tucker, and Helen Spathold, and are very much indebted to the Sinclairs for their hospitality in providing bed and breakfast to weary travelers, a baby, and Mitzie just coming into her first season. Their Impy (Shalloon of Drayalene), a litter brother to Mitzie, is one of the flashiest Sams we have seen.

"Our second Sam—in order of arrival, though not of choice—was "Kym" (who will probably be registered 'Ksiulikagta's Kym O'Yeniseisk'). Bred by Donna Yocom, she is out of Ch. Kenny's Blazer Boy of Caribou, C. D. ex Starctic Nan-nuk. She should mature at the very top of the female standard, possibly a little over, and is a big raw-boned country-girl type Sam. At six and a half months she's a solid, rugged 52 pounds.

"And then, the first babies at Yeniseisk, out of Mitzie, sired by Ch. Chu San's Silver Folly. Now, at three weeks, they are cute, roly-poly plump, wide-eyed at the extent of their small world and at each other, just beginning to be playful, puppyish and exploratory. One amazed itself, the others, Mitzie and us by letting out a Pekingese-type bark the other day. We have hopes for these four and plan to keep one. Their 'old man' whom you may remember (he finished on the Coast several years ago), has over 20 BB and several Group Placements, including 3 Group firsts that we know about. He should improve the bone size and some of the structural features that Mitzie is weak on, while the combination of coat and typiness between the parents should surely be retained.

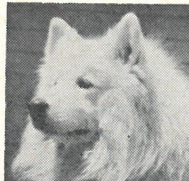

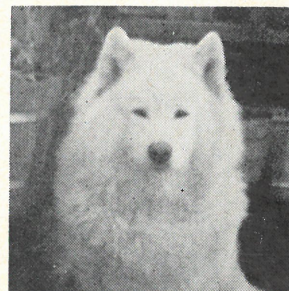

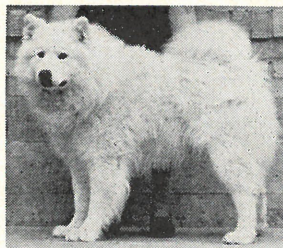
