Our Pacific Coast Division Secretary, Lloyd Bristol, reports that the trophy list prepared by the trophy chairman, Elliott Colburn, is "long and full" — a real credit to him, who has worked so hard to make this possible. Mrs. Bristol tells us that the Specialty will receive National publicity on TV, radio and in magazines.

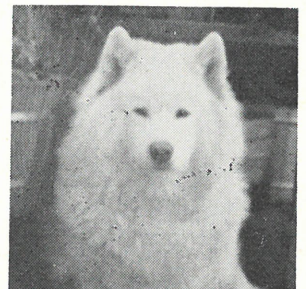
Gene Bennett, Sam owner and dog photographer of San Francisco, has been a traveling companion of whom "Dare" has become very fond.

#### News from Anchorage, Alaska

It was such a welcome letter that came from Mrs. Clyde Bastian, to know that her Ala-Cryss Sams came through their giant earthquake unharmed. Mrs. Bastian says that it didn't seem to bother the dogs too much — altho at every after-shock they looked toward the house "as tho they expected us to do something about it."

The home is about seven miles from the downtown area of Turnagain Arm, where most of the damage was done. At the house there was minor damage done to the thermopane windows, which were shaken loose — the fireplace sank about an inch and the chimney was cracked at its base. "How anything was left standing is a miracle," wrote Mrs. Bastian.

In spite of it all — Anchorage held one of its largest (by number) shows — with 233 dogs entered. This was its Spring show on May 10th.

Bastian's Fancy Free of Ala-Cryss went W.D. and B.B. — 5 points, which completed his championship with 19 points. Robert and Idesta Green's Sinew of Green Star was R.W.D. Soraya of Ala-Cryss was B.O.S.

The Fairbanks, Alaska, show was May 3rd, with R. A. Cross judging Sams. 7 entered — 4 dogs, 3 bitches. B.B. was Salcha's Cotton Ball — a bitch owned by Larry and Carolyne Barr. B.O. was Fancy D. of Ala-Cryss. R.W.D. was Prince Rebel, owned by Leslie and Celia Burt, with R.W.D. going to Soraya of Ala-Cryss. "Raya" was completely shed out for both shows. She already has two 5 point wins to her credit — has been shown 5 times. Continued good luck to you, Freda Bastian, and good folks in Alaska — and thanks again for your letter.

A note from Mrs. Anne Snee of Washington, D.C., that unfortunately, arrived just too late to make our June issue, announced the arrival of 3 boys and 3 girls, whelped April 25th. "Of course, you can't tell anything about them yet, but they are sure nice looking already — their noses are mostly black — and they are growing like weeds," wrote Mrs. Snee, adding that she is most sure that there will be a "King" in the litter. However, she adds that she just might take a bitch instead — at any rate, we hope for the best for you in your choice of the puppies, Anne — and do tell us about the pup when you do choose it, won't you? And do continue sending us news from Washington and the East.

Mrs. Mary Richmond of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, whose champion "Tana" was pictured in May W. K. W., writes that the attempted breeding of Tana to a Snowdrift dog did not produce any results — so there will be no puppies at this time.

She then decided to drive to the Tulsa, Oklahoma, show and there he completed his championship with a 5-point major. His title is now officially reported.

went Best Dog in Show at Ogden, Utah — Bauzuhl of Caribou); the Cohen's Summer Gale of Silver Acres; Donna Yocom's and Lorraine Pearson's Kara Nor; and Mays' Tinka's Snowbell. Dr. Simpson's Sir Jolly took Winners Dog at Santa Fe with 2 points (needs only 1 point to complete his championship). Summer Gale of Silver Acres went Best of Breed.

Mrs. Miller plans to retire Ch. Star Nika for a time during the summer heat — and return him to the shows later in the year.

Tazbel, who was fondly called "Tinker."

Such sad news came to me recently from Billy Tucker of the Encino Kennels in North Hollywood.

"Charles and Gene Burr of Beverly Hills have lost 2 more of their beloved Sams (3 in 3 months) — and I've lost my 12 year old Paddywack, following an operation for breast tumors.

The Burrs' "Trinket" (litter sister to Billy's "Rogue"), suffered a blood clot following a spaying operation, and about 5 or 6 weeks later they lost their famous Ch. Blizzard — for no apparent cause. They had an autopsy performed, only to find that in some way he had inhaled a bone splinter which had punctured the lung, allowing a bubble of air to get into the blood stream. Both dogs were in perfect health, had never been sick in their lives and were 10½ years old. Both deaths were so sudden and unexpected — and such a shock.

Not very long after the death of Billy's "Paddy" — the Burrs lost Ch. Kazan at 13 years of age. He is missed so very much —

was such a 'character' and so much a part of the family.

Our deepest sympathy to these folks, who have done so much to help with bettering our Sammy breed.

Billy tells us that "Jilene" (a litter sister to "Snowie") is still a live-wire. Poor Tonyi — she teases him as often as she can — and he, poor fellow, won't turn on her, so goes in under the bench in the kennel room to get out of her way. She has pulled out much of the long hair on his tail by hanging on to it — and when Ch. Shona (Jill's mother) joins her daughter, and both take after him — "I feel sorry for the poor fellow" says Billy, adding "and yet, if I take him away from these two and put him in with other girls — he is very unhappy."

Incidentally, Billy plans to enter Jill at Santa Monica, where she will compete with one or more of Vicky Wheelock's Sams.

Nine year old Ch. Shona, who is again in full coat, will probably be entered in the Veteran's Class at the Specialty.

Do hope to have a report on the entries and winners at Pasadena. This is always a lovely show held under those beautiful big trees — and it's always such a friendly affair, thanks to Alta Hill and her family."

I am hoping to hear from Mrs. Jeanette Bedingfield, who 3 years ago bought a son of Mrs. Tucker's Kun-Tonyi, out of Ch. Judy-Lyn. He has recently become a champion — and makes the 14th champion that was bred at Billy's Kobe of Encino Kennels.

Billy writes — "I now have a new girl — 3½ years old. She is a litter sister of Sir Jolly Wintertime, owned and bred by Dr. and Mrs. Don Simpson of Tucson, Arizona. She is quite a nice 'gal' — but a bit too fat at present. Her sire is Snow Master of Kobe and her dam is Kobe's Nicheeta of Encino.

"Chee Chee" is by Rogue ex White Way5s Jacko-Lyn. An officer in the Armed Forces brought Snow Master from England when he returned to the States.

"Snow-Bell" had a nice litter of 8 puppies a year ago — and I had her X-rayed recently and her hips are beautifully normal. Am so glad to have her, for her sire's bloodlines will

live-breed with some of my English bloodlines," writes Billy.

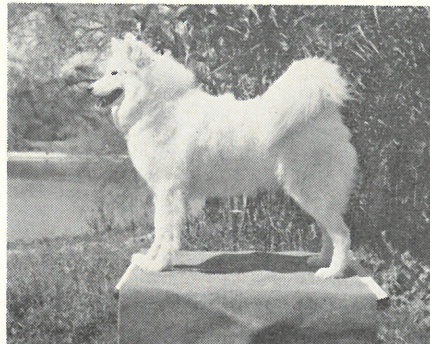
