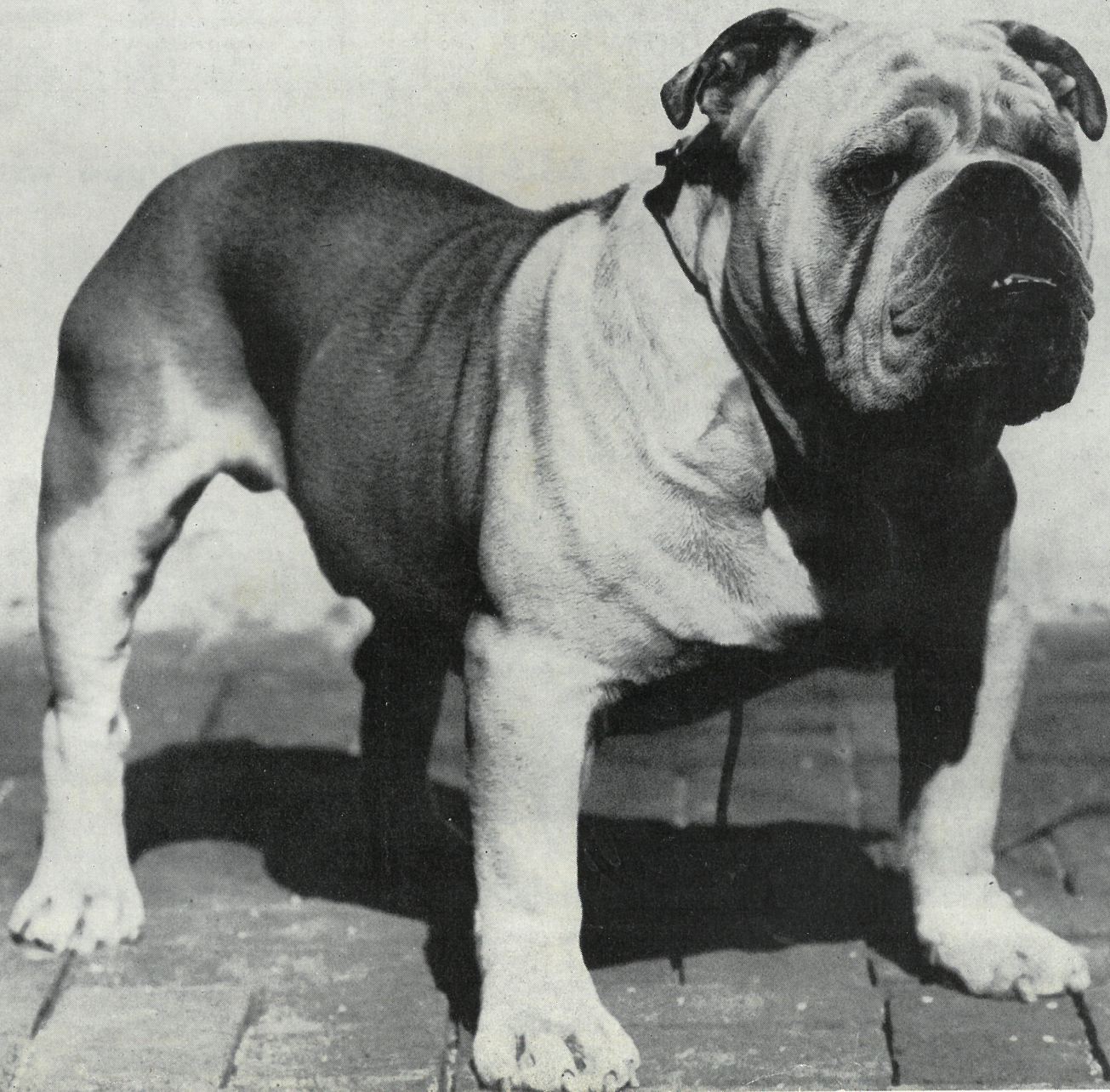

Against a background of sky blue, the theme of the exhibit was based on a colonial model spinning wheel, upon which Sammy wool is being spun into yarn. Then there were samples of the spun yarn, types used for knitting and weaving into cloth. Cards bearing samples of various weights of woven material. There was a huge ball of yarn with a sweater in the process of being crocheted. There were elegant ski socks, a man's sleeveless sweater, a boy's sweater, also sleeveless, a woman's skirt, with accompanying bolero jacket, a woman's coat sweater knitted in basket weave style, a nifty purse, two beanies dyed in a lovely shade of blue, and then a ladies' beautiful top coat of cloth woven from Sammy wool by the Biltmore Weavers and fashioned by its owner, Mrs. Collicott of Albany.

urines, a box of letter paper bearing the "Pups on Ice" picture in color, various copies of Western Kennel World Magazine with Sams on the cover pages, and a calendar fashioned by a local photographer. Then the Sammies own story book, "Ranger—Sea Dog of the Royal Mounted," by Charles N. Strong was there. There were cards giving some data relative to our breed—and upon the wall above the exhibit was a card donated by Petland, bearing the quote "Berkeley Samoyeds Salute National Dog Week,"—and in small type "at Petland."

Among the hundreds who visited the exhibit were many who were interested in purchasing the woolen articles on sight—but this was not a sale, it was an exhibit whose purpose was to show that our Sams are not only beautiful pets, companion dogs, guardians of home and the folks therein, but their coats are of immeasurable value when no longer of use to their owners (the dogs themselves). The wool is obtained by brushing or combing, when the dogs are shedding their coats. The shedding process may be quickened by a thorough brushing, the wool being saved until sufficient quantity is obtained and spun into yarn to be used for whatever purpose any wool may be used.

Our sincere thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Bierbaumer who gave us this opportunity to sponsor the one time in the year that man's best

friend is officially honored — National Dog Week.

The picture submitted was taken by a local photographer at the request of Bierbaumer. Our thanks to them for the publicity thus given our Sams.

Meet Some Canadian Sams

The five and one half weeks old puppies pictured on our pages show two of the recent babies whelped in Aylesford, Nova Scotia, Canada by Dr. C. Seldon Bezanson's Venus of Rhanor (By Ch. Snohomish of Oceanside out of Ch. Snowland Nada.) The sire of the pups is none other than 2 year old Spark of Altai (by Int. Ch. Snowland Stara out of Koraleva of Altai) who was imported into Canada by Bezanson from Mrs. Lucille Miller's kennels in Albuquerque, New Mexico. This mating produced a most outstanding litter of beautiful pups on June 6th, four males and three females.

"Meynell," writing in "Dogs in Canada," says, "It was of the home of these Sammies that I would like to speak. Dr. Bezanson has had built a kennel that is replete with every possible arrangement for the comfort and well-being of the inmates—the main building is approximately 26 feet by 30 feet and is erected upon a concrete base—the floor being of pine boards—the walls are of clap-board with layers of tar-paper, then more sheathing, the three inches of Rock wool, then another layer of sheathing. These walls are really only half walls, as the top half all the way round the kennel consists of sliding double windows.

The ceiling is of special material upon which are several layers of tar paper, then sheathing, then an air space, and more special insulating material, more tar paper, sheathing and finally asphalt shingles complete the roof. In the center of the roof is a large ventilator, that in conjunction with the windows ensures an ample supply of fresh air. The interior is divided into four pens that have communicating doors, and each pen opens out into a large run of gravel and turf. This run is around 35 by 50 feet, but the doctor contemplates increasing this until

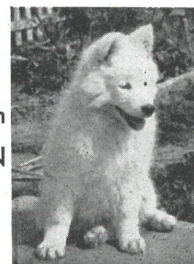

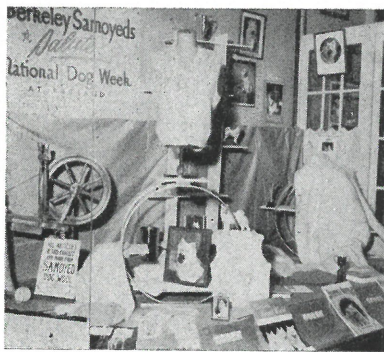
