However, when he has had enough, he just goes away and lies down.

pings from Henry and Dora Bousquet of the Hen-Do Kennels of Manchester, New Hampshire, along with a picture of their Mystic of Aardvack (Sire, Ch. Bunkey III of Lucky Dee ex Shining Star Monasecka).

The clipping shows a picture by Bob Drew titled "Main Expedition Group Completes Trek." The item from "Millinocket" reads "The main party of an expedition traveling through the wilderness with mechanized snow sleds arrived here Thursday night, their part of the five day expedition completed. The exact location of three other men with dog sleds was uncertain at the time. The three-man party camped at Eagle Lake Wednesday night. They were to continue traveling the homeward leg of the expedition Thursday. In the party was Clarence LeBell, co-leader of the expedition undertaken to test men, dogs and machines against the Maine winter. The main party, nine men under Robert Morrill, arrived at Millinocket Thursday evening after traveling an estimated 45 miles during the day. The photo taken enroute shows a trail break by the expedition between Heron and Um-saskis Lakes. They left the Western edge of Baxter State Park Thursday morning and headed Southeast. Considerable difficulty was encountered in the State Park with hills and deep snow. Several times the men had to get out and push the snow sleds up the mountain trails.

"Traveling with dog sleds were LeBell, Allan Hetteen, Robert Morrill, Angel Pette-tier and Edwin J. Childs.

"Among the Samoyed dogs used in the party were Mr. and Mrs. Bouquet's Thaddeus of Hen-Do, a very good sled dog at Point position."

"Duke" (Mystic of Aardvack was entered in the Providence, Rhode Island show, report on the judging not yet received). He went Winners Dog for one point at the recent Boston, Massachusetts show.

Thanks to Mel Fishback for the results of the Second Annual Mother Lode Sled Dog Club races, March 4 and 5, 1961. The course on Saturday was 14 miles, with about 10 miles packed snow and the remaining 4 miles bare pavement—which made it mighty rough on the mushers and their sleds. Sunday's course was 6 miles long, under ideal snow conditions (by Sierra standards!), quite a steep grade going out and a rip-roaring downgrade on the way in to the finish line. Needless to say, the drivers enjoyed Sunday's race heartily.

A fine banquet was held on Saturday night at the Ebbetts Pass Inn. Jim and Betty Allen were in charge of the entire race AND the banquet and I am sure that all the drivers present would like to know that they received all the credit due them. Also, the local merchants and businessmen bent over backwards to welcome dogteams and their owners to the Ebbetts Pass area, besides making many generous contributions to the trophy and prize fund.

There were 15 teams entered on Saturday, 14 on Sunday. The team that came the farthest was a team of Siberian Huskies, owned by Doug and Nancy Bard of WILLIAMS, ARIZONA, 750 miles away. Art and Dorothy Christiansen brought their team of Siberians and Samoyeds from Jefferson, Oregon, for second spot in the distance-travel department--525 miles.

Here are the winners: First on both days, and first in combined time and non-arctic time: Lloyd Van Sickle of Truckee, California, driving Targhee Hounds.

Second on both days: Stanley Rasmussen, Lake Tahoe, Targhee Hounds and Irish Setters. Although this is a Samoyed column, I must point out that this was one of the most beautiful teams we have ever seen!

Third on both days, and first in combined

time for an arctic type team, Lee Fishback of Nevada City, California, driving six Alaskan Huskies and a Samoyed leader.

Fourth on both days, Doug Bard, Siberian Huskies.

In the Lead Dog Contest, judged by Sam obedience expert, Beckye Austin, Bob Richardson's Siberian Husky "Ozzie" once again took first place with a faultless performance. Lee Fishback's "Shu" took fastest time, but two faults which penalized him 20 seconds; Shu of course is a Samoyed. In third place was Doug Bard's tiny Siberian Husky "Vodka."

Steve Van Sickle won the Children's Race, driving one Targhee Hound, "Jet." WKW Siberian columnists' son Paul Emrich was second with a Siberian Husky borrowed from Pat Daniels.

The Samoyed teams did quite nicely at this race, although they did not quite get into the winners' circle. Harold and Shirley Keepers split the driving job on the two days and made a nice showing with their seven-dog team of Sams, led on the second day by a lead dog that had never competed in a race, a youngster named "Lancer" from Mrs. Mason's kennels.

The Allen team "of Calaveras," which had never been more than 10 miles, finished nicely under the management of 16-year-old Robert Fitzpatrick, with "Boris" leading. Robert had a little trouble on Sunday and came in last, to claim the handsome red lantern for "better late than never."

Additional notes: The Christensens from Oregon with their mixed team of Sams and Siberians had never entered and run a race before, and therefore were a little worried about how their dogs would perform. We are glad to say that they made a nice solid 6th placing, and Art said, "Boy, look out for me next year!"

Being extremely helpful around the race area were SCA members: Beckye Austin (oh, brother, was she! What a dishwasher!) Alice Thomsen, Larry Soper who came to assist the lead dog judging despite his sad loss of Ch. Tagh only a few days before, and many others.

We all appreciated the interest and help given by members of the Samoyed Club, competitors at the races, local businessmen, and even the spectators—and all of us in the Mother Lode Sled Dog Club invite you back next year for an even bigger and better race on the first weekend in March.
