your attention to the one of Glendale Show's Best of Winners and Best of Breed (in a group of sixty Sams) with Wm. Pym judging. This young fellow (2 years old) Smithson's Snow King, owned by Mr. and Mrs. W. K. Smithson of Los Angeles—went on to place second in the Working group under A. E. Van Court, judge.

Smithson's Snow King was sired by Rhanor's Santa Claus out of Princess Kheta — and is spoken of as "an exceedingly beautiful and capable dog." We are happy to present this picture in our section for our readers this issue.

Our third picture shows the Edwin Adams' young homebred — Suzanne's Alicia Suraine — a daughter of Ch. Rainier out of Ch. Suzanne.

Alicia was winners bitch and Best of Opposite Sex — 3 points for the young lady. Winners dog was Starchak's Witan who now has fourteen points. Vera Compton's Nimbus of Antarctica was Reserve Winners dog. Reserve Winners bitch was White Way Snow Puff.

Mrs. Maxine Shapiro's Ch. Snow Boots was Best of Breed. The entry was forty-two Sams with about thirty-three present.

In a former letter Mrs. Adams told us of a "wild and wooly pup" (well about 6 months old now). His name is Daschar — and he really

lives up to it. His mother is Modoc, and Racier (Suraine) is his dad, though he doesn't seem too excited about the responsibility of looking after the amusement of a young son." One comment by her is — "I'm gaining first hand knowledge of head anatomy, muscles certainly play a major role in width of head, believe me." Our hat's off to Hazel, and Bunky too, who are working so hard to overcome an eye injury that Bunky received in the simplest accident.

Hazel reports that White Beauty of Lucky Dee is now making her home with Helene Spat-hold of Richmond. She is sired by Raicer Suraine out of Modoc of Lucky Dee.

The following item by Hazel is presented especially for novice exhibitors of our Sams — and gives a clear idea of what to work for in showing a Sam.

"Utmost attention is given to the specimens general appearance, beginning with feet, legs and gait. It is my belief a dog conforming to AKC Standard must maintain a certain picture and in turn that conformation must retain kinetic balance. A dog must have proper angulation to accomplish this. A dog is only as strong as its weakest point. The dog must have related measurements to the pattern of the standard.

The dog must have foot pads well filled in, as the dog moves and picks up speed the feet must come nearer the center line of the body, falling slightly to the left or right of the center line. The bone must be of good grain and quality (no softness or sponginess). Muscles fine textured and not too coarse. (Finer muscles respond quickly). A long third digit in the foot to produce a desirable foot and heel pad, thick and cushioned, and the dog must strike the ground on the heel, otherwise the foot would soon flatten.

sprung ribs providing ample heart space. Front quarters must relate to the back quarters (which develop the push). Length of body approximately one inch longer than height at shoulder, slightly more on bitches. Chest deep, but not extremely broad.

Head wedge shaped, flat skull, medium muzzle, ears in proportion to head, prefer dark, almond-shaped eyes, black lips and alert expression. Absolutely no coarseness is tolerated.

The above qualities must then be covered with a very heavy sparkling white coat and a long profuse tail. Then we are ready to slip a lead over the head and by voice command start our training. That accomplished, thorough grooming and a bath and we are ready for the next show."—Hazel Dawes.

In closing may I again remind our Sam owners (and we quote) "The Southern group Pacific Coast Division Samoyed Club of America is supporting this show. We are planning a gala week end. "Open house at Elizabeth Wyman's home (1st Vice President, P. C. D.) in the afternoon Saturday July 25th.

to other people but encouraged by Miss Dietrich to exhibit. Remember her magnificent Ch. Storm von Dietrichsburg.

We all know Miss Dietrich's recent illness has prevented her from showing the latter part of last year and some of this and we were delighted to find her progressing so well that she was able to take part in the San Jose show, but in the wrong ring. Miss Dietrich had a Minnie, which, I think are wonderful smaller editions with so much character all their own, but I do hope Miss Dietrich is not forsaken us Standards. Her dogs were always a credit not only to the breed but to a dog owner, they were always beautifully put down and in tip top condition.

If anyone bothers to answer my question as to the lack of entries, maybe they will say well, Jessica, you have Schnauzers why don't you show more. I will tell you, first I do not have the transportation all the time to the shows, and second, I don't like the way the Schnauzer is being stripped for show and I mean stripped not trimmed. In other words I like to see him with a coat on his back. An undershot or over-shot mouth is a fault so is over trimming. If I exhibit a dog with as many major qualities as the next man's, I object to being put down for a dog with a short coat who has a short coat because he is in the process of being stripped for a larger show a few weeks ahead. If your dog is not ready for competition don't show him.

It is bad enough for a judge to deal with the taults a dog is born with. No one can prevent anyone from showing a dog without a hair on his back, but a judge who knows the Standard should certainly not put him unless it happened that the others had as many faults, and the short coated one was so outstanding that as a fair judge he had no alternative. Perhaps there is my answer as the judges know the Standards, are they than the reason for small entries.

I am still showing my Schnauzer when I can get to a show, but with his inlong coat I more often than not look like I am dragging a doormat around compared to the slick trims now fashionable. Still my fancy is more coat than none at all so I'll not complain when I'm dumped as I do agree when entering a show to abide by the judge's decision.

I talked to one of the local breeders at the Santa Cruz Show about this coat business and she told me the public now demanded that the Schnauzer should be glamorous, and that is what we should strive for in getting our dogs ready for show.

Now this breeder has a beautiful solid rugged true to type champion male Schnauzer. His very attractiveness lies in his ruggedness, his compact body with its tough wiry coats suggests power, but with all this he could never be called glamorous. I know a dog like a Poodle can look glamorous yet have many other qualities too, but a Schnauzer should not even suggest glamour. I don't want him to look like a bear with shaggy hair hanging down from all over, trim him only to emphasize his body lines, when he is finished if he is worth exhibiting he should bring to your mind a far worthier adjective than "glamorous."

Now for a just a spot of news. Mr. Berman has sent Bay Gel, the dam of his really nice type winning male Baghdad by the Bay, or Sam, to Miss Elise Boyce of Bacon Hall Kennels of Glencoe. Bay Gell is to be bred to Ch. Winalsky Volzeck. This mating should produce a fine litter. Bay Gel has specialty show winners and Best of Breed winners in both Ch. Chief of Staff, her sire, and the unforgettable Ch. Flare von Tappen, who also made two Bests in Show, all breeds. Baghdad by the Bay, has really been catching up. Went Best of Breed at Petaluma and fourth in group at Salinas and Del Monte went third in group both days. I saw him in the ring at Del Monte, his ring manners were something to watch. If he has any bad points, he never gave the judge a chance to see them. Sam never made a false step, and he stood as firm as a rock. Every time the judge moved around Sam was ready and his balance was perfect. I do like his type very much and would point him out as what a working Schnauzer should look like, but it would be a slur on the male ruggedness to call him glamorous.
