Attention, Sammy friends — a news release has come to us from Howard Gorman, Associate Advertising Manager of Gaines Research Division which reads: "The Samoyed is scheduled for appearance on 'Juvenile Jury' on No. 8 p. m. Eastern Standard Time — which means vember 5. The show will be on from 7:30 to 4:30 to 5. p. m. Pacific time. It will be known 'Juvenile Jury' is heard over a Mutual network of 192 stations.

No mention was made as to which dog will appear on the show.

It's been good to hear from two of our readers, Elizabeth Wyman of Santa Barbara and Mrs. Estella Dunck of Milwaukee, that "the guessing game of 'What's My Name' is great fun." "Our Sams are so individual it's most like recognizing old friends" wrote Mrs. Dunck. The response to the picture quiz in October issue brought answers from several of our members. The first letter to reach us with the correct name coming from Mrs. Charles Tucker of Encino, California, whose answer was the imported Ch. Nova Sonia of Kobe (Ch. White Fang of Kobe ex Kosena of Kobe). Others submitting correct answers were Mrs. Cecil Laughery and Sandra, Elizabeth Wyman, Shirley Ann Hill, Ruth Bates Young, and Mrs. William Powell who wrote, "the picture on page 23 is of Ch. Nova Sonia of Kobe. She is by Ch. White Fang of Kobe ex Kosena of Kobe. Mrs. Dorothy Perry of England was her breeder and she was imported from England in January 1940 by Mrs. Robert C. Ashley. Among her progeny are Kara Kobe of Oceanside, Tish of Krimthurser, Kik-Mik of Oceanside etc. (We might add that Mrs. Ruick's late Ch. Echo of Kobe was one of Nova Sonia's most famous progeny.)

Mrs. Powell tells us that she and Mr. Powell have just returned from Europe where they had the great pleasure of visiting Nova Sonia's home kennels and of meeting all the present Kobes and Mrs. Perry and Mrs. Ashfield. They also went to Snowland and met the Westcotts. "At the show at Leicester we met Miss Keyte Perry and a number of other Sammy folks" wrote Mrs. Powell. And folks—we hope we'll have an interesting story of that trip for you soon.

It is with a deep sympathy that we report the untimely passing of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Witcher's beloved young bitch, Kobe Kolika

of Encino (Tzarina) who passed away September 20 after an illness of about 3 weeks at 10 months of age. Tzarina was bought from Mrs. Margaret Tucker of Encino, a daughter of the imported Ch. Raff of Kobe (now owned by Mrs. Goekel of New York) and Mrs. Tucker's Suretta of Kobe (also imported).

Tzarina had twice gone Reserve Winners bitch and was a very promising youngster.

Our sympathy also goes to Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Mason of Sacramento whose Ch. Herdsman's Faith has gone to the great beyond at the ripe age of 10 years. Born Septembre 3, 1940, Faith was a daughter of the imported Silver Spark of the Arctic out of Cleo — and litter sister to the well known lead dog of the Mason sled team—"the showoff" Ch. Herdsman's Chattigan, and Ch. Victory Leader (called Silver). Among some of the progeny left by Faith are Mason's Ch. Gay of White Way and her litter sister Ch. Snow Queen of White Way, owned by E. E. Ebersol, sired by Ch.

White Way of Kobe. The late Ch. Silver Star of White Way was another of her progeny. Bred to Ch. Petrof Lebanov, Faith produced another litter of future winners. Ch. Suzanne of White Way (owned by the Edwin Adam's of Los Angeles) Mason kennels' Ch. Petrof's Nich of White Way, and the latest to complete her championship Joe E. Scott's Ch. Karina of White Way.

Faith's litter brother, Ch. Herdsman's Chattigan, bred to Ch. Silver Star of White Way, produced the champions Ch. Borealis of the Far Steppes, owned by Mrs. Levant Brown of Ross, and Ch. Starchak, C. D., owned by the Robert Wards of Culver City, who produced the Charles Tucker's Ch. Kunto of Encino when bred to their Rhanor's Tynda of Petsamo. Ch. Silver Star also produced Ch. Chinde of Caspar, owned by Lois Rayner, and his litter brother, Ch. Laska of White Way owned by Mrs. Esther Proudfoot.

Ch. Faith's first big win was made at the first Sam Specialty Show on the Pacific Coast at Oakland Show in 1941 in an entry of 43 Sams. Faith, then only 10 months old, made a five point win.

Mrs. Mason wrote that "Faith was Mr. Mason's shadow—went to town with him almost daily—and slept by his bed every night. We'll all miss her greatly—she was so much the lady—and an excellent watch dog as well." Mr. Mason says he "never wants to get so attached to another dog"—(but we'll give Mr. Mason in his great love for Sams only a few weeks and he'll have another smiling Sam haunting his footsteps! V. L.)

Suitably engraved 'Samoyed Memorial Trophy', it was won by Ch. Frolene of Sammar, shown and owned by petite Mrs. J. J. Marshall, Jr., of Chicago, who made a pretty picture as she left the ring.

"In addition to this outstanding trophy were many others contributed by our club members and friends. Some of the prizes were of silver, some of sun-ray gold, and all were handsome—down to a wee gold cup won by Polar Princess the III in Puppy class—owned and shown by Mrs. Laura Poirier.

"There was a fine traveling clock, presented by Mr. James Neblett of Detroit, and a gorgeous sterling silver bowl from our two loyal friends, Mr. and Mrs. P. L. Bajus of Milwaukee in memory of their beloved Sammy, Ch. Rikki Tik. There was an oil painting of a beautiful Sammy standing in a setting of white birch trees before a background of blue water—painted and presented by Mrs. Ardath Chamberlain.

"One of the most interesting trophies was an antique bronze vase, presented by one of our correspondents in England, Mrs. Harold Hodgson; the base was won many years ago by Ch. Starlight who has long since passed to his reward. The family home had been nearly destroyed by bombs, resulting in the death of Starlight's owner. In the rubble and ashes of a once lovely home this bronze vase proved to be imperishable. We were deeply honored to receive a gift with such a poignant history.

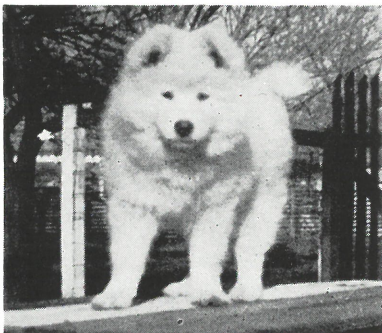
