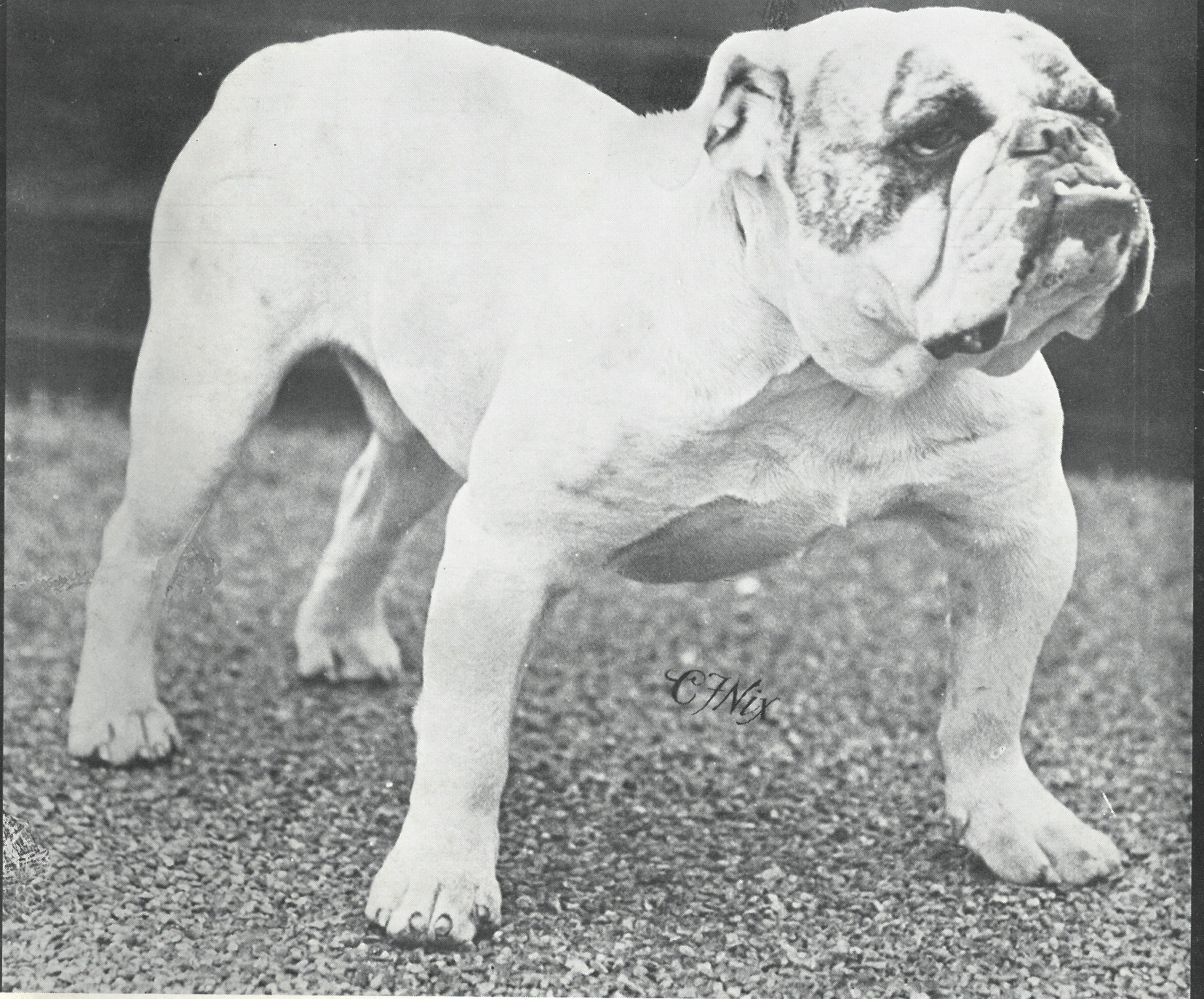

SAMOYEDES

First of all, we wish to make a correction. In our May news report we mentioned that Mr. S. H. Sutton's Ch. Gorka's Sneg was the daughter of Mrs. Horace Mann's Ch. Gorka and White Sprite of the Arctic. This was a mistake in part. Sneg is the daughter of Mrs. Ralph Woerner's Orka of Farningham by Mrs. Mann's Ch. Gorka. Orka was the daughter of Maroosa of Farningham and Nim of Farningham. Maroosa (Ch. Polar Light ex Laura of Farningham) was bred to Nim at Mrs. Kilbourne Scott's kennels in England—her litter was whelped just three days after her arrival in the United States.

Quintuplets arrived to the writer's Snow Sprite on Friday, July 19—two males, three females. They are sired by Mr. Mel Harris' splendid stud, Maelchek (Ch. Yorza and Ch. Gorka's Sneg).

Full credit must be given to Dr. H. B. Wintringham of Berkeley, whose prompt arrival when called, and assistance given the young mother in a difficult delivery, saved the life of the splendid big pup that would

have otherwise perished by suffocation—thus endangering the life of the mother as well.

Again we take pleasure in announcing that another eastern-bred Samoyede has attained his championship. This time it is Mrs. Mann's (handled by Mr. Sutton), who won his final points at the recent Rumsun show. Yorza, the only surviving member of that first litter by Ch. Gorka ex White Sprite of the Arctic, has recently been bred to Mr. Sutton's gorgeous bitch, Ch. Gorka's Sneg. White Sprite and "Sonny" (Suinu), are well called Mrs. Mann's shadows, for wherever she goes about the house, they are at her heels.

We are delighted with the picture of those two charming pups of Starshaya's (sired by her Sabarka of Farningham), with which Mrs. Helen Harris has illustrated her ad, and for which we thank her.

Mrs. Harris tells us that she had a letter from Mrs. Keplar of La Porte, Indiana, telling of the safe arrival of little Kirill of Snowland, and of how he was loved and admired from the moment of his arrival. Mrs. Harris voices our feelings in saying "I do worry so much when one of the "babies" goes—and to know they are loved and appreciated helps a lot!

Crystal's little family is developing beautifully and it would be difficult to find a more even or more perfect litter. They seem to be absolutely snow white, with not even a touch of biscuit, and so alike it is hard to tell one from the other.

I shall be happy to write and tell you how "the boys" like the northern woods. I had some of them with me last year, dear blind Pedlar of the Arctic and my Adorable Barka—and they thought they were in heaven, I believe."

Mrs. Harris is planning to take all these youngsters of Crystal's to Canada for the summer, planning to sell none before the Fall at the earliest.

We have before us several lovely pictures sent by Mr. Sutton, of that truly gorgeous bitch so much resembling her sire the late Ch. Gorka, as to dense white coat, with jet

black points, broad head with the lovely facial expression and sweet disposition of her sire. Mr. Sutton tells us that Sneg has just been mated to Mrs. Mann's Ch. Yorza, her half-brother. They are again hoping for a possible duplicate of Gorka.

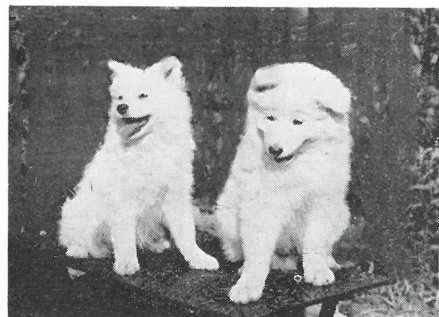

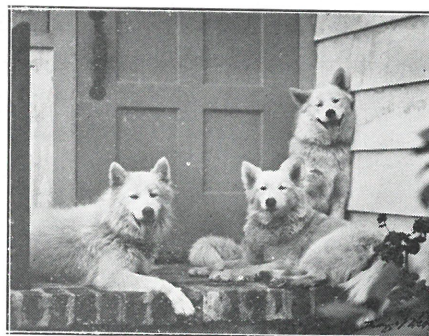
