# SAMOYEDES

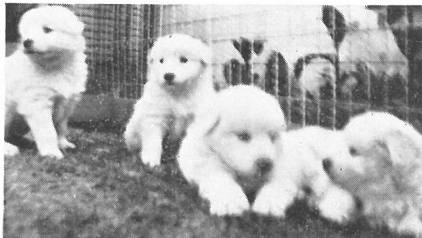
A very interesting letter came to us recently from Mrs. Beverly H. Jones of Fresno, who is spending the summer at their vacation home in Aptos, California. With her are her two little boys and their 4 Samoyede pets.

Mrs. Jones reports the sad news of the death last Spring of Fram of Glacierland and her two female puppies, in spite of expert veterinary care, and hours of care on her part. The male puppy was sold to Miss Haynes of Los Angeles, who reports that the pup is a beauty and growing into a splendid big dog.

One of the females was to have been an Easter gift for a little girl.

Mrs. Jones attended the Pasadena show with Barrie and Silverheels—the latter having been shipped south for breeding. Barrie was in fine show condition, and took winners dog. She said further: "I was so encouraged I went to San Bernardino two weeks later, where he beat his mother (Ch. Yancey's Daughter) for best winner—it was a 3 point show for females. Barrie now has 13 points—a hard place to stop.

Mrs. Jones also showed Tarrie at both these shows, for his erstwhile owners, Mr. and Mrs. Englert. He won his blue ribbons, in puppy

and novice, and they were most thrilled. Later they were forced to part with him, and a Mrs. Murphy of Pasadena, who had gone to Fresno to buy a puppy—bought Tarrie instead. He now has a lovely home with all the attention his heart could desire.

He is being trained by a professional, for the show ring. Experts have said he will easily go to his championship.

Of the Del Monte show, Mrs. Jones says, "It was a beautiful day, though warm. I did not expect an entry of Samoyedes, but the McCleary's surprised me.

I only entered Sitka, the bitch formerly owned by Sue Thorne. Registration difficulties kept me from showing her before, in fact I didn't do much about her until after I lost Fram.

She looks lovely now, and showed beautifully—the judge told me that she was a very lovely dog. That was almost as good as getting points. Jack Frost took best of breed—he too did very well."

At Santa Cruz, there was an entry of six Samoyedes, "I would certainly have had Barrie in had I known" Mrs. Jones added

Sitka again was entered, and she again got winners and 2 points. "I met the Bourgoins and the Dyes for the first time, and once again got to visit with the Stangs," she added, and also said, "Finally received Sitka's papers and hope to have her in the ring this winter." Mrs. Jones is looking forward to again sharing the care of rearing a litter of Samoyede puppies. Good luck and lots of it!

A recent inquiry about puppies came to us from an interested party in Bristol, Tenn., who reported having seen our advertisement in the Western Kennel World.

We are of the opinion that Sergei owned by Mrs. P. Anton Stang of Mill Valley, was winners dog at Santa Cruz and Belii Chort, owned by Georges Bourgoins, was reserve.

Mrs. Jones' Sitka was best bitch, and Zita, owned by Mrs. Stang, reserve.

Ch. Jack Frost of Sacramento, owned by Mr. and Mrs. E. L. McCleary was best of breed and best of winners.

From the August Sam Club Bulletin recently sent us by Mrs. Catherin Quereaux of Long Island, N. Y., we read that at the Troy N. Y. show, judged so splendidly by Monsignor R. F. Keegan, there was a record entry of 23 Samoyedes.

"That this was a tribute to Monsignor Keegan's sportsmanship and an acknowledgement of belief in his ability and knowledge of the Samoyede is clear, and the painstaking manner in which he went over every dog, good or bad, was pleasing."

The high winners in this show are as follows: Winners dog and best of winners, Siberian Icy King II; reserve Norka's Levson. Winners bitch, Laskybelle of Darya; reserve Ch. Siberian Feodorooona. Best of breed, Ch. Ice Crystal of the Arctic. Credit for her work in rounding up such an entry of Samoyedes, is given to Mrs. Ada I. Yencer.

Mrs. Quereaux also reports that across the movie screen at Jamaica, Long Island, paraded the California bred, Jack Frost of Sacramento, owned by Mr. and Mrs. E. L. McCleary. Frost won his championship at the Spring Oakland Kennel Club show.

Another report is, that Mrs. Helen Harris and Faith have been spending a vacation in the Lake Louise country, riding and roughing it a bit. They came home to send one of their Laika-Snowfenn puppies to Columbus, Ohio and one to Maine.

Again comes a plea for owners of Samoyedes to join the club. The club must pay annual dues to the Kennel Club, pay for advertising, etc., and it is urged that all who genuinely love their dogs and have interest in the breed should support the only organized effort to aid the breed. 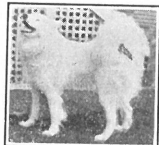

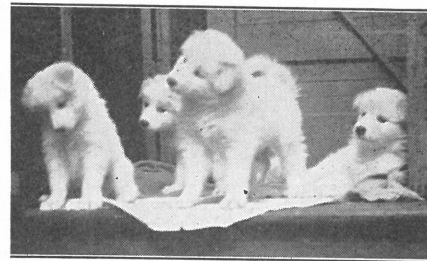

At the third annual show of the Illinois State Fair Kennel Club in Springfield, Ill., on August 21-22, at which 416 dogs were entered, Fritz went winners dog, at Pontiac he again went winners dog. Next Fritz went best of breed at the 2 recent shows held at Milwaukee in conjunction with the Wisconsin State Fair, the first of the two being on the annual classic of the State Fair Kennel Club of West Allis, Wis., held on Saturday, August 28 at which 338 dogs were entered, and the second, the Wisconsin Kennel Club show, was on Sunday, August 29th. Judge C. J. Casselman tendered the honors at the first while Judge A. W. Brockway officiated the second day.

Other eastern bitches of interest are that at the annual show of the Lennox Kennel Club held on Saturday, August 21st, on the grounds of the Berkshires Hunt and Country Club in Lennox, Mass. 522 dogs were entered and that Judge Alva Rosenberg gave best of breed to Mrs. H. W. York's Ch. Monarch of Halecroft and later, put him fourth in the working group.

At Wilkes Barre, Pa., where the fourth annual show of the Wyoming Valley Kennel Club was held on Sunday, August 9th, Judge E. R. Tolfree gave best of breed to Mr. and Mrs. M. S. Scureman's Scureman's Tristan.

On Saturday, August 7th, at Skytop, Penn., the Lackawanna Kennel Club held its twelfth annual show, with 552 entries and this was the 18th time that Mr. Louis J. Murr's champion Borzoi, Vigow of Romanoff scored a best in show win, but he met stiff competition in final judging from the black Cocker Spaniel, winner of the Sporting group and also from the working group representative a Great Dane. Mr. C. Ludwig judged the breed at this show, while Mr. G. V. Glebe of Bryn Athyn, Pa., officiated at the final group.

Mrs. Beverly Jones brought up her Kara Kol and Sitka from Fresno and it was noted that each dog entered represented different champion stock—Kara Kol, (Ch. Snow Frost and Patricia Obi); Sitka (Ch. Balkash of Rurik); Maelchek (Ch. Gorka); Lensen of Snowland (Ch. Ice Crystal of the Arctic). As this was Lensen's first show, we feel happy in our point win, especially as she had made a long trip up from Santa Paula, arriving in Berkeley the night previous to the show.

However, every possible care had been given her by the agents of the Southern Pacific Co., both at Ventura and all along the route, and it was a satisfaction to know that as she must take this trip, it would be with the least amount of hardship for the dog.

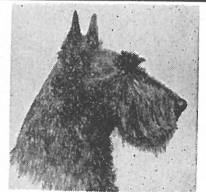

Reach the Prospective Dog Buyer at the Lowest Cost and Most Effective Means  
The base size for Display Ads (ads which run in the various breed news columns) is a one inch space (1 inch deep and one column—2½ inches wide). The two sample ads above are the base size—1 inch, one column.

Insertions	Cost per Issue
1 to 5 times per column inch, as described above)	\$2.00
6 11 times (per column inch)	\$1.75
12 or more times (per column inch)	\$1.50

For a two inch space double the amount, and so on.
