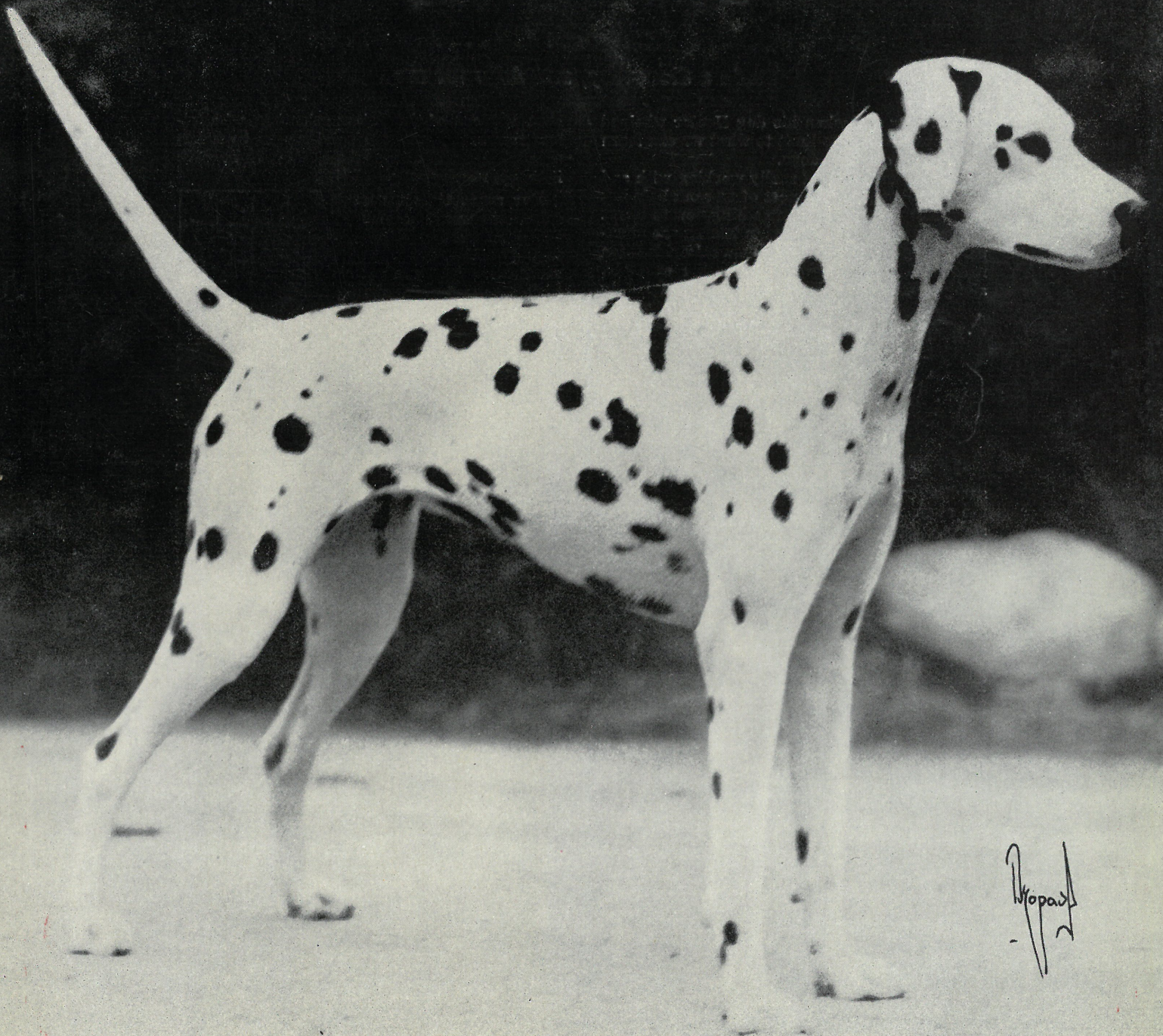

## Samoyeds

July 3, 1950! A week ago today we were homeward bound from the Samoyed National Specialty Show held at Long Beach, California. And what a show it was! Exact number of Sams actually benched and judged—101 glistening white Sams, 9 absentees, 110 entered.

A huge circus-type tent with a green grass floor covering, housed this formerly unheard of number of Sam entries. A pleasant coast breeze blew through the tent making things very agreeable for both dogs and exhibitors—as did the wide aisles, affording easy access for visitors to each exhibit.

The judging ring, though located in the hot sun, was made comfortable by the stiff breeze blowing across, however the ring was found to be a bit on the small side. When that class of 15 junior puppies took over with their owners there wasn't much space left, but what a lovely sight!

The judging began at 10:30 sharp, and Judge Christian Knudson worked ceaselessly, with a half hour interim for lunch, completing his assignment at approximately 5 o'clock. It was a task indeed, and we'll admit that we (and others too) did not always agree with his placements, but then, of course we were at the ringside—he, it was, who went over the dogs, and we will admit that he seemed consistent. To appearances, he gave first place (all else being equal) to the dogs of medium or smaller size, third and fourth placings went to the better of the larger dogs. All in all, we feel that Judge Knudson knew our breed. He appeared to give little credit for coat (realizing perhaps that June finds many California Sams, especially those in Southern California in the midst of their summer shedding period. Gait was given particular notice.

In this report we must necessarily limit ourselves to noting the first place winners, full report will be found in the Sam Club Bulletin.

Junior Puppy Dog's winner of first (in the group of 15) was Mrs. Dorothy Drum's Zodiac of the Igloo, 9 months old son of Czhomir of Petsamo ex Verla's Stardust-bred by Verla Davis and handled by her in the ring.

Senior Puppy Dog's winner of first (2 in the class) was William J. and Greta A. Rasmussen's Kong Gorm (Verla's Teton Star ex

Verla's Ahmighito) bred by Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Cordner.

Novice Dog winner (class of 9) was Mr. and Mrs. W. N. Sullivan's Prince Kingston (Ch. Verla's Tagenrod ex Pola Dvina of Rhanor's).

Bred by Exhibitor winner (class of 7) was Dr. Ivan M. Steele's Sno-Beau (Int. Ch. Snohomish of Oceanside ex White Beauty. This dog went on to place first in the American Bred Dogs class of 13.

Open Dogs class (14 in class) was won by Mr. and Mrs. John Polettis Samoyland's Sergei (Soldier Frosty of Rimini ex Samoyland's Verla's Tula, of San Francisco) handled by Tommy Witcher of Vallejo, California.

This fellow went on to place as Winner Dog (5 points) with Reserve going to Dr. Steele's Sno-Beau.

Junior Puppy Bitches class had an entry of 9, with Thomas and Chloe Witcher's English bred-American born Kobekolika of Encino, by Ch. Raff of Kobe ex the Tucker's Suretta of Kobe taking the blue.

Senior Puppy Bitches class of 3 had as its winner Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Bristol's Startinda's Topka, by Toby of White Way out of Ch. Princess Startinda.

Novice Bitches (class of 6) had as its winner David Helman's Victoria of Starctic, by Ch. Starchak, C. D. ex Shee Shee.

Bred by Exhibitor Bitches (2 in class) was Mrs. A. E. and Aljean Mason's Trooperine of White Way (Toby of White Way ex Ch. Nianya of Snowland), who went on to place first in the American Bred Bitches class (11 entries, 2 absent).

Open Bitches class had an entry of 10, (1 absent) with Earl M. Pulley's Park Cliffe Snowball (Siberian Shinkie ex Park Cliffe White Ginger) taking the blue.

Winners Bitch was Trooperine of White Way, with Park Cliff Snowball Reserve.

Veteran Bitches Class of 5 found as its winner Mrs. A. E. and Aljean Mason's Ch. Gay of White Way (Ch. White Way of Kobe ex Ch. Herdsman's Faith) not quite 8 years of age. Second place went to Elmer Ebersol's Ch. Snow Queen of White Way, litter sister to the above. Third place went to Elizabeth Wyman's Snowy Dawn (Silver Spark of the Arctic ex Lensen of Snowland). 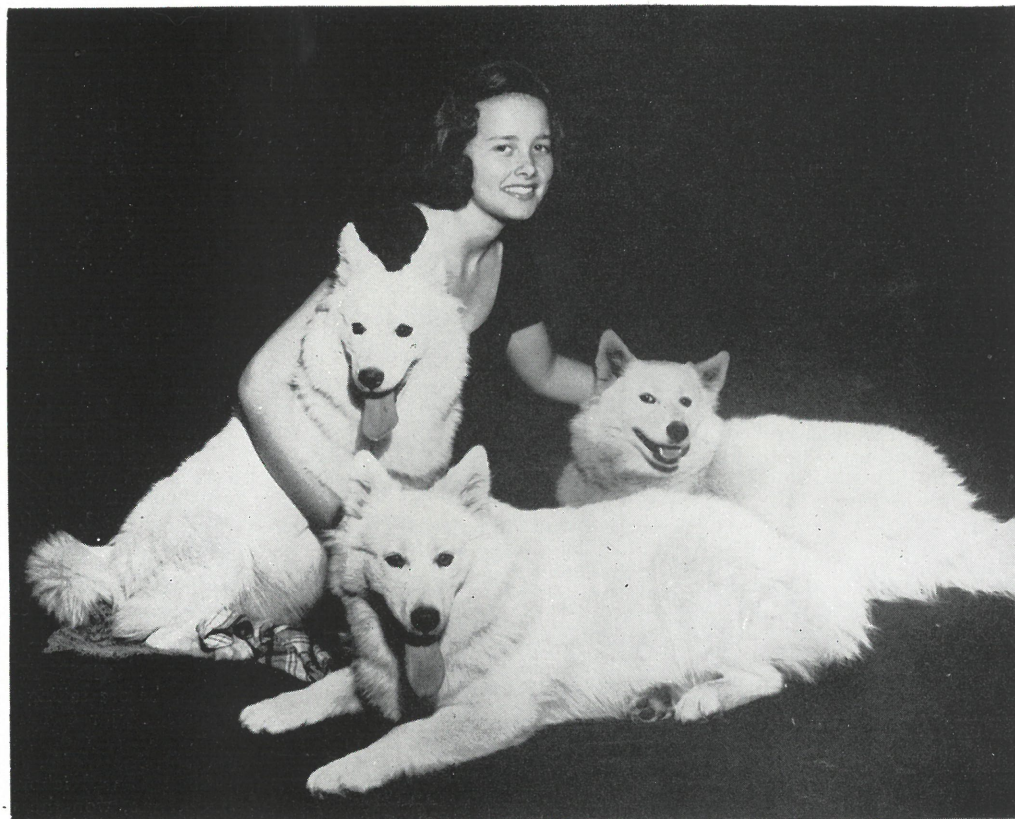

lady, in beautiful coat and condition lacks only one month of being 11 years of age. Somehow we believe that the veteran's class should be divided into 2 groups, 7 to 10 years of age, and over 10.

Specials only class-dogs and bitches, had an entry of 14, three of which were absent. Silver Star of White Way); Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Hurley's Ch. Nikki of Petsamo (Ch. Sammy of Petsamo ex Ch. White Christmas of Snowland); Shirley Ann Hill's Ch. Verla's Prince Comet (Verla's Comet ex Verla's Princess Aida); Mrs. Margaret R. Tucker's Ch. Kunto of Encino (Ch. Starchak ex Rhanor's Tynda of Petsamo); Chloe Witcher's Ch. Samoyland's Vojak, C.D.X. (and now U.D. we believe) (Soldier Frosty of Rimini ex. Ch. Samoyland's Lucky Ann); Mrs. Mason's Ch. Gay of White Way; Mrs. A. E. and Aljean Mason's Ch. Petrof's Nick of White Way (Ch. Petrof Lebanof ex Ch. Herdsman's Faith).

Also in line were Mrs. Anne Marie Goekel's Ch. Raff of Kobe (Snowray Chief of Kobe ex Khittish of Kobe) who had been flown to care of Mrs. Tucker at the last moment, and F. R. C. Clarke's Kandor Superbus (Czar Sammy of Sufanova ex Princess Bailikova of Safanova) brought down from Canada.

Hours, it seemed, during which Judge Knudson studied one dog after another, gaiting them—lining them up again, parading them and finally arriving at his decision. For Best of Breed the Purple and Gold went to Shirley Ann Hill's Ch. Prince Comet. Best of Opposite Sex was Ch. Gay of White Way. Stud Dogs class found Ch. Prince Comet taking first. Brood Bitches class was taken by Charles and Margaret Tucker's Suretta of Kobe.

Mrs. Mason's Brace took first place in Brace Class. As a fitting end for an outstanding showing of Sams, by a group of Sam owners, good sports all—was the appearance of the Mason team beautifully handled by Aljean Mason. This team was later handled in the working group team class by Robert H. Ward, placing second to the Great Dane team handled by Zimmerman.

Our report of this show would be incomplete should we fail to acknowledge our thanks and appreciation to Minnaruth Mott who did such an excellent job as Ring Steward.

Our thanks to Judge Christian Knudson for a stiff job courteously performed and well done, we'd recommend him at any time.
