Samoyeds

Yes folks, it's that time again—and so—We wish you all a Happy and Prosperous New Year for 1953.

The highest scoring dog of the year has been Mrs. Bernice Ashdown's handsome home bred Champion Silver Spray of Wychwood (out of her imported Champion Princess Silvertips of Kobe) who, in a week's time twice placed Best Dog in Show. The first was at Troy, New York and the second show was at Brooklyn held the following week with 750 dogs entered in competition.

Clippings from the New York Times, The Herald Tribune and the Brooklyn Daily Eagle all gave excellent publicity to Silver Spray and our breed — as well as to his owner, Mrs. Ashdown and his handler Charles Rollins. The Daily Eagle headlined a column "Samoyed Repeats" and the item by Joe Lee reads in part "Ch. Silver Spray of Wychwood, a stunning white Samoyed owned by Mrs. Bernice Ashdown of Manhasset, Long Island went 'Best in Show' for the second time in a week when he copped the coveted 'best' award at the fifth annual dog show of the Brooklyn Kennel Club held at the 106th Regiment Armory.

"It was evident that the sturdy white-coated 65 pound Spray would be in the thick of battle by his mannerisms and alertness against his select rivals. The solid built, deep-chested Spray displayed perfect show manners as he strode the length of the ring and posed patiently before Mr. Paul Palmer made his decision. "That's the best Samoyed I've ever seen," Mr. Palmer said after his decision.

"Besides his second "Best" feat, Spray was also winning his second group victory. This two year old has only been shown six times, one of which he was a third behind Ch. Stormy (Doberman) and Ch. Bang Away (Boxer) at last year's Westminster Show. Spray is home-bred, and his mother, Ch. Princess Silvertips of Kobe was Best in Show once and a group winner ten times — a record for Samoyeds.

Congratulations to Mrs. Ashdown, owner of these two outstanding Sams — and to Charles Rollins their handler.

We had hoped to have a picture of Ch. Silver Spray for you this issue.

Here on the Pacific Coast Hazel Dawes has given our breed some mighty fine publicity—as shown in our picture (by Tye).

The first story re the Sams part in the Flower Festival was from the newspaper clippings which appeared in our December issue.

Hazel tells us that the Premier of the exhibit was held on November 22 and limited to 1,000 guests, adding that the beauty of it all will be something she will always remember.

"We had four Samoyeds on exhibit from November 22 to and including November 29, with the Sams a part of the Canadian display. The theme of the garden was a Royal Northwest Mounted Police outpost at Christmas time in the early 1900s.

"Everything was authentic—Cylinder gramophone playing "Silent Night," wood stove, old alarm clock, yellow soap and wash basin, bear-

skin rug and food bags strung on wire from the ceiling of the cabin. There was one tree over twenty feet tall. A backdrop of a scene of the Northwest blended very naturally into many trees, with simulated snow, moss, dried leaves etc., that had been brought in for the display. Even logs for firewood, ax and chopping block were there. A "Red-coat" was in charge of the Out-Post.

"Many people took pictures during the week for their Christmas cards. Others wanted the pictures for their beauty. Two of the Sams were stationed in the doorway of the cabin, and two more, at random in front of the sled that contained a huge mailbag and dozens of Christmas packages. The Canadian Consul, Mr. Senior was very pleased with the exhibit as were the members of the Peninsula Garden and Study Club who sponsored Canada.

This exhibit according to all reports was the highlight of the Show, and attracted crowds.

Hazel says it was a great pleasure to be a part of such a beautiful and well-managed affair. The San Francisco Chronicle, San Mateo Times and Burlingame Advance published pictures.

The Flower Fiesta will be shown on "News of the Day" at the theaters in the United States and Canada.

(What Hazel did not say is that she had to keep those Sams looking in "apple-pie" order—and had to drive down from Cupertino to San Francisco each day.

Congratulations, Hazel, for the good work.

From Mrs. John Poletti and Mrs. Thomas Witcher we learn that the sled team is to make several appearances on television and will also take part in the Shrine activities at the crippled children's hospital in San Francisco, taking Santa to the affair in the sled.

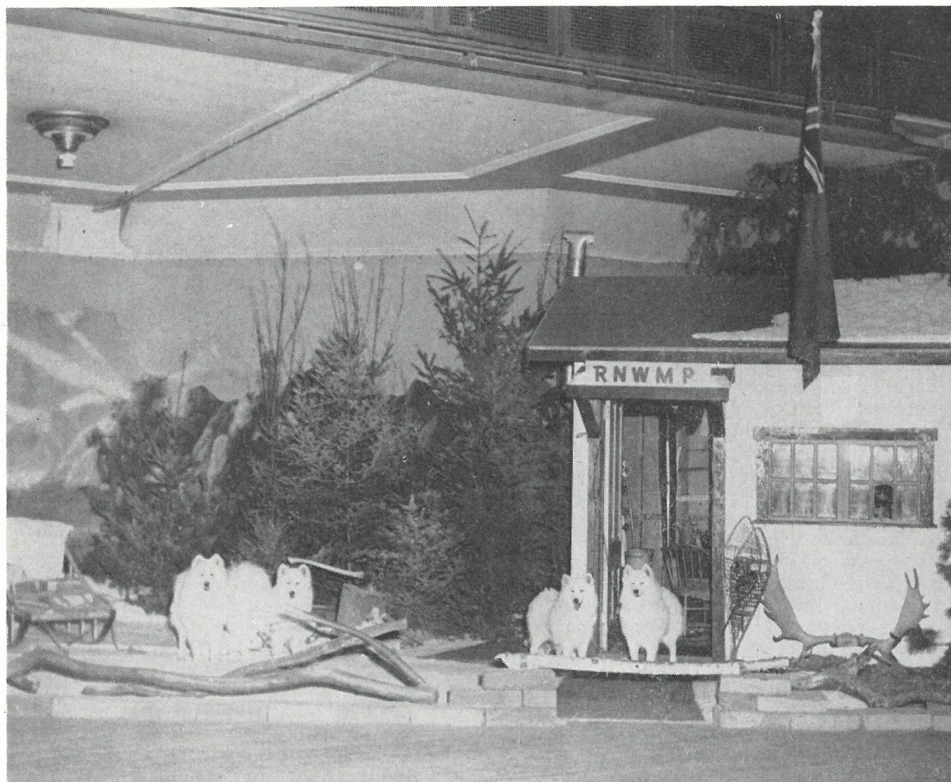
"TOTO" HAS GONE.

kong, China by Mrs. Ivy Kilburn Morris, when he went Best of Breed at the Elizabeth, New Jersey show.

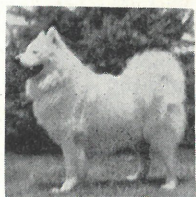

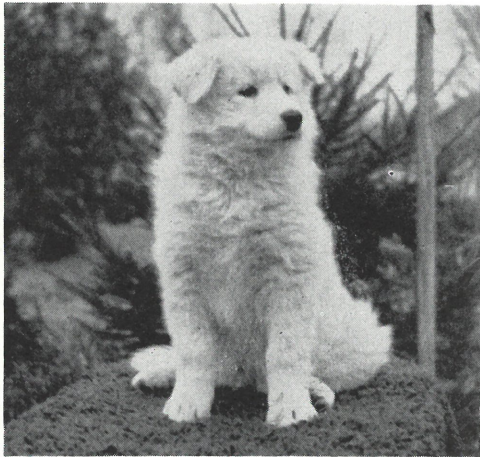
Winners bitch was White Way's Snow Sheen who also placed first in local class with Albion of Lucky Dee reserve.

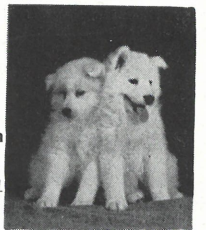

hardt's Gyda Hyperborea was first. Mr. J. Farmer's Yurak Snow Storm was second, Mrs. Percy Millard, with Yukon Waitemata, third—and Imp. General of the Arctic with handler Stevens, fourth.

In the finals, English Judge Wilson awarded best Samoyed to Mr. Enkhardt's Gyda Hyperborea. Reserve and the Challenge was taken by White Hunter of Kobe, owned and handled by Mrs. M. D. Chisholm.

Gyda Hyperborea (2 year and 9 months old) was said by the judge to be a fine dog. "England has nothing better in Samoyeds."

In this delightful surprise package also were several copies of Australian Dog News — a nice little magazine of thirty-two pages.

Gyda Hyperborea, bred by L. S. Graham of Australia, has been awarded 17 Challenges within 17 months under 17 different judges. A splendid record.

There were also several copies of the magazine published by the Kennel Control Council of Australia.

Note to Secretaries of Show Giving Clubs in the United States! I notice that in all pictures of judging each exhibitor (instead of wearing those bothersome arm bands bearing the catalogue number) wears a tag (a round card-like affair bearing the number) which is fastened on a coat lapel or front of dress, etc. The number is clear—and always in splendid position and there is no trouble such as we experience with arm bands continually falling down—never up where we really want them. The tags surely look neat.

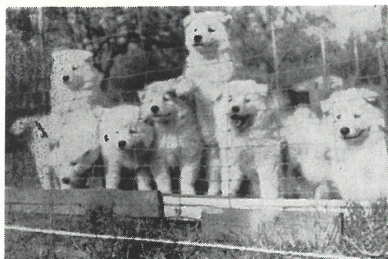

"This little fellow has a fine chest and black, black points—excellent feet. At 9

weeks old he tips the scales at twenty lbs.

Here's a hint, folks, passed on to us by Mrs. Levant Brown of Ross, California. When purchasing a brush recently, for her young grandson, she was warned by an honest salesman that nylon bristle brushes are too stiff to use on any child's hair. The nylon bristles split their hairs, causing them to die—eventually producing baldness. It is possible that the same effect could take place in such brush use on dogs as well. It is often noted that considerable use of such brushings of a Sam's tail have brought about a definite loss of hair of the dog's tail. Another danger is from the use of a wire brush so often advised for the dog's coat. Best play safe—use a softer brush and save your dog's coat.
