



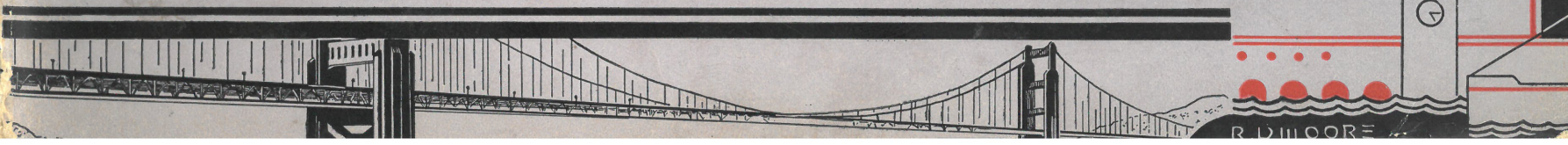

**SAMOYEDE NOTES**

The Desert Kennel Club had a beautiful setting for a one day outdoor show held on the Golf Course of the Desert Inn, January 14th. It was an ideal day for a picnic and everyone seemed to enjoy himself. Four Samoyedes were benched. The Siebels from Alhambra, took advantage of the one day show to enter their laughing "Lucky Mattern" (by Nicky of Creve and Ch. Patricia Obi). Lucky had only six months and six days to his credit, and despite his extreme youth gives one the impression of a powerful dog, tipping the scales at 41 pounds and 19½ inches tall. Miss Helen Kern entered Drujoke of Haslemere, the recent winner at the Ambassador Show; my own Taz (by Ch. Snow Frost of the Arctic ex Yancey's Daughter), and White Countess of the Arctic completed the entry. Taz was awarded best of breed and received two points toward his championship. Anna Sten, one of the film colony, was staying at the Inn and invited the writer to call and see her Samoyede which had been brought over from Russia through Germany. Teddy is valued at \$10,000. Mrs. Sten believes it is better to buy blue ribbons in a department store rather than bench her dog at dog shows.

Samoyede fanciers are again grooming their dogs for a splendid entry at the coming Pasadena Show to be held in the Civic Auditorium. Northern dogs will be down in better coats than ever, Catalina's famous pair, Chita Obi and Nockisma will be there and ever so many more.

**Nursery News**—Yes, at last we do have some new families to report. My own Yancey's Daughter (by Eng. and Am. Ch. Tiger Boy of Norka ex Yancey) is caring for a litter of six sired by Ch. Snow Frost of the Arctic. Also, Natashka, (a daughter of Yancey's Daughter ex Nico of Creve) is caring for a fine litter sired by Ch. Snow Frost of the Arctic. Natashka is the pal of Master John Williams MacDonald. And, still more nursery news, and that of which we are especially proud, is the arrival in Oakland of a fine litter by Laughter (sired by Nico of Creve ex Yancey's Daughter) sired by Nico's Norseman (same breeding), owned by Mrs. M. From the Kilburn-Scott Kennels in England came these two great champions who helped to make the breed so popular in America.

The Kilburn-Scotts, pioneers of the breed, have placed their dogs throughout the world and everywhere the Samoyede is known in the civilized world, the name of Farningham Kennels is known. I have always said Farningham spells beauty and Tobolsk means strength and power.

The recent importations of Mrs. Helen S. Harris of Overbrook, Penna., of two young puppies from the Farningham Kennels gives further proof of the desire to continue the Farningham strains in America. These recent importations are just five months of age, and we hope to see much of them at the coming shows.
