Samoyeds at Oakland Kennel Club Show
March 3, 1957

It was a gray day, with lowering clouds threatening rain, when the 19 glistening white Samoyeds were benched on Sunday, March 3rd—but inside the Exposition Building all was different. Thanks to Mary Breatchel, First Vice President, Pacific Coast Division of the Samoyed Club of America, and the members of her committee, the benching for the Sams provided by the Northern California group was delightfully spring-like and very attractive. As usual Oakland gave us wide aisles with Sams benched on opposite sides, making a most attractive setting.

There were eight males and ten females entered and present in the classes (one absent) with one for Specials and another absent. Mr. Edward D. McQuown of Xenia, Ohio, judged the breed, making the following placements:

Puppy dogs and American-bred dogs, one in each class, no competition. The Open Dogs class with six entries found the first placement to be Mr. and Mrs. B. P. Dawes' Bunky III of Lucky Dee (Ch. Bunky Junior of Lucky Dee ex Ch. Vrai of Lucky Dee), a gay youngster of about 15 months. Second went to Percy Matheron and Jean Blank's Omak II of Whitecliff (Ch. Omak ex Princess of Valiki).

Bunky III went on to place Winners Dog and Best of Winners, thus capturing three points as won by the Winners Bitch.

The following classes in bitches had no competition: Junior and Senior Puppy and Novice bitches. First in American-bred bitches class was White Way's Sassy Fras Ch. White Way's Silver Streak ex Ch. Starchak's Warnistura), Mrs. E. A. and Mrs. Aljean Mason Larson, breeder-owners. Second place was Mrs. W. H. Hunt's Princess of Valiki (Ch. Petra of Valiki ex Ch. Sisipuk of Whitecliff, C.D.).

Open bitches class had five entries present with first place being taken by Mrs. Mason and Aljean Larson's White Way's Sisero's Buttons (White Way's Romeo x Ch. Starchak's Warnistura) with 2nd place going to Whitecliff Kennels Samoyland's Frosty's Natusha (Soldier Frosty of Rimini ex Samoyland's Bonnie Bess. Third place went to Mary Breatchel's Muffetta of White Frost (White Frost's Tybo ex Leela of White Frost).

Winners Bitch, with three points and on to Best Opposite Sex was White Way's Sisero's Buttons. This bitch had previously gone Winners Bitch at Golden Gate Show in January.

"Buttons" was pictured in our March issue of Western Kennel World. Our congratulations to Mrs. Mason and Aljean Larson, breeder-owners of these two outstanding bitches, "Buttons" and her half-sister "Sassy Fras", in beautiful coat and put down in excellent condition.

Best of Breed Samoyed was Percy R. Matheron and Jean M. Blank's outstanding winner of well over a dozen Bests of Breed and placements in the Group, Ch. Yurok of Whitecliff (Ch. Omak ex Kara Babkah of White Frost).

And so we have the Oakland winners for March, 1957: Best of Breed, Ch. Yurok of Whitecliff; W.D. and B.W., Bunky III of Lucky Dee; W.B. and B.O.S., White Way's Sisero's Buttons.

Just between us—it was a grand privilege to be able to attend Oakland Show again, and to visit with our friends. We were especially delighted to meet Patricia Healey again after these many years. "Pat" will be remembered as the young owner of the splendid Champion Ski Trooper of Tamaland, son of Mason's imported Ch. White Way of Kobe ex Cleo, born Nov. 5, 1942. Sams on the Arizona Circuit

California Sams did really fine for themselves when they took in the three Arizona

shows recently. Phoenix and Mesa each had an entry of six dogs, eight bitches and three for Specials only. Mr. Pickhart judged at Phoenix and made the following placements. Incidentally five of the males were from California. Mr. and Mrs. B. P. Dawes' Bunky II was Winners Dog and Best of Winners, with Jean Blank's Tonto of Whitecliff, Reserve. Winners Bitch was Nakomis of Whitecliff, Percy Matheron and Jean Blank, owners. Reserve at Phoenix was Mrs. Alma Smithson's King of the Snows Juliet.

Best of Breed was taken by Mrs. Smithson's King of the Snows, Ch. Snow King, who went on to take that coveted spot, FIRST in the Working Group! Congratulations, folks! Best of Opposite Sex was Mrs. Georgette Evans' Ch. White Mist of Bel-Air.

The Mesa Show, with the same entries was judged by California's Anton Korbel, who found Tonto of Whitecliff to be his Winners Dog and Best of Winners. Winners Bitch was again Nakomis of Whitecliff (fondly called Missy), and King of the Snows Juliet was again Reserve Bitch.

Best of Breed and Second in the Working Group, another coveted spot was Dr. Edwin Strong's Ch. Silver Taz of Stronghaven, a splendid win for Arizona's Dr. Strong. Best of Opposite Sex was again Mrs. Evans' Ch. White Mist of Bel-Air.

Next in order was Tucson, Arizona show with an entry of 14 Sams, judged by Mr. Spence. Winners Dog and Best of Winners was the John Butler's Chekuv with Tonto of Whitecliff going Reserve. Winners Bitch was again taken by Nakomis of Whitecliff, making "Missy's" third Major in a row, totalling 15 points and her championship (subject to A.K.C. of course). Missy, now about 20 months old, was strangely enough taken along to the show with the purpose of making her "show-wise" she evidently learned how to be that in her very first show, for a land-slide was hers! 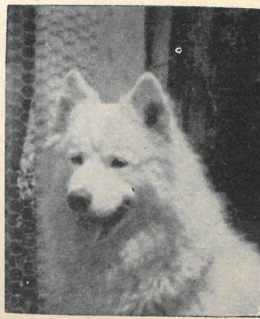

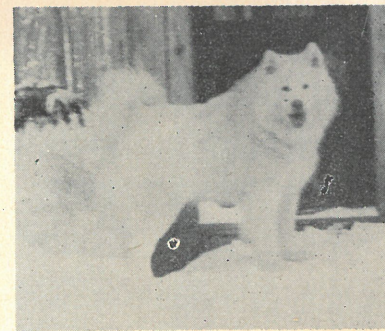
