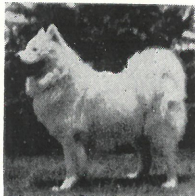

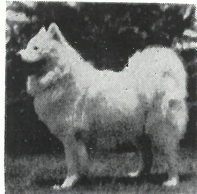

Best of Winners. He picked up another point towards his championship. He now has ten points and two majors. Drujak is owned by Virginia Poletti.

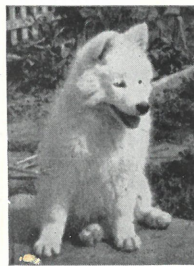

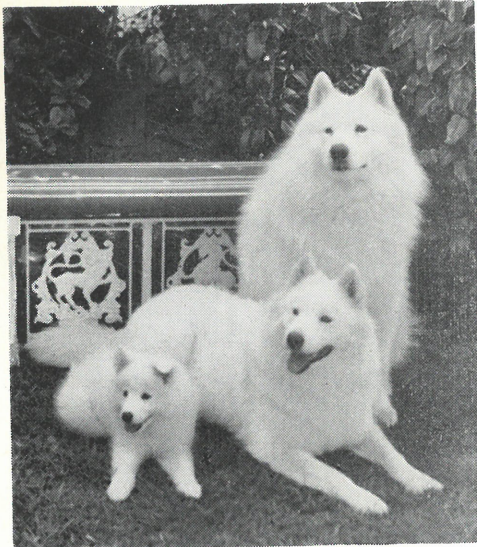
how an exhibitor can help himself by cooperating with the ring stewards. A number of points were cleared up concerning the limitations put upon the ring stewards by the A.K.C. and the real need for exhibitors to realize their responsibilities in getting themselves to the ring on time, regardless of the fact that others may be delayed by understandable reasons. The notifying of the stewards ahead of time of absent dogs would be greatly appreciated by the stewards and aid in achieving a more smoothly run show. It was suggested by Mr. Boegman that the different breed clubs each should appoint someone who knows the various exhibitors to assist the ring stewards in getting the exhibitors to the ring on time. Perhaps the same person could be notified regarding the absent dogs so that information could be given the stewards before the judging starts.

Several other points were brought out concerning showing, such as: dogs can be disqualified because of chalking, and in the bred-by-exhibitor class the dog should be shown by the breeder or a member of his immediate family.

An interesting accomplishment of the meeting was the identification of a nice young bitch, bought by Mrs. Roy Gatti from the pound, as a lost Samoyed bred by Mr. and Mrs. J. Poletti. Positive identification was made because of the obedience training given it by Mr. Thomas Witcher in two languages. The dog obeyed all the commands in both languages. This dog, now 20 months old, had been gone from its former owner for about four months and hadn't been worked in obedience all that time, but hadn't forgotten.

Mr. and Mrs. Nelson certainly were wonderful hosts and provided a very delicious repast.

The next social gathering was held at the home of Miss Eleanor Jahn in Alameda where twenty-nine Bay area members and friends of the Samoyed Club of America were present on Sunday afternoon, September 13th. A discussion of the Clarification of the Standard of the Breed was held. The group was unanimous in the opinion that if any clarification should be made they should not change the standard in any way. The breed, which has retained its versatile utility, natural beauty, grace, charm and

Winners Bitch and Best of Winners and Best Opposite Sex went to Mr. and Mrs. Dawes' Modette of Lucky Dee, litter sister to Bai—with Reserve going to Helene and Layard Spathold's White Beauty of Lucky Dee — another litter sister. Best of Breed was taken by Mr. and Mrs. Robert H. Ward's splendid stud, Ch. Starchak's Witan (Ch. Starchak, C.D. ex Ch. Staryvna of Snowland).

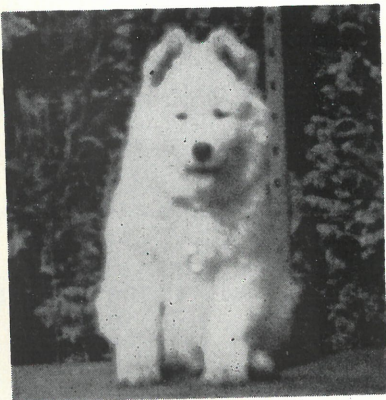

"The standard of our Samoyed breeds says 'Dogs are 21 to 23½ inches at shoulder and weigh 55 to 67 pounds; bitches are 19 to 21 (22 if AKC approved) inches at shoulder and

weigh 36 to 55 pounds. I don't think the 36 pounds congruous with the height. Color is pure white, white and biscuit, or cream, nose and eye rims black for preference, and lips also, but may be brown or flesh colored.

"Now that the hot weather is here, a word of caution: Your dog feels the heat the same as you do, so keep him cool, do not cause him to exercise strenuously. Keep plenty of cold, fresh water available at all times and see that he has a cool, shady spot to rest. Brush his coat out. Cut down on his diet, for he doesn't need as much food. Permit him to remain quiet after eating. By following these suggestions, your dog will be happier and healthier in the heat of the summer.
