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REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

1945-1946

Another eventful year has become world history. Its annals record V-J Day, with the jubilant hope that this magnificent achievement, added to the triumphant victory of V-E a few months earlier, would bring about that Peace which was so universally expected and desired. Instead, the world is now in such a state of international distrust and confusion as has never before been known, with th consequent fear of a global disaster.

Scientific research and discoveries have so far outstripped man's piritual advancement as to threaten the very existence of the human race. However, we are confident that in God's own time, we shall have learned some of the basic lessons and all will again be well with the world.

Within our own club life, though some minor atomic bombs may have exploded, there have been steady growth and progress.

The Board of Directors has had serious decisions to make and has met these, thoughtfully and wisely.

The annual reports given from this platform establish conclusive proof of this statement.

The excellent Monday programs have had an attendance of 26,502, while the interesting presentations of the 16 study departments have attracted 24,152. The work "behind the scenes" done by the Program Chairman and her committee, and that done by General Curator, her assistants, and the 16 department curators, merit the special appreciation of the membership.

Despite paper shortage and printing difficulties, the Printing Chairman has produced the full quota of bulletins and year books.

The Chairman of House and her committees have been confronted by almost insurmountable problems. Materials for repairs have been lacking but emergencies have been met in some miraculous way. As the recent report showed, imperative repairs have been made. "Patience" will have to be the watchword of the membership until reliable materials and labor can be secured.

Also in this period of food shortages, it is with pride we report that under the House Chairman and her committees, including house manager, dining-room manager and their staffs, 64,069 persons have been served during the year.

The carefully selective enrollment of new members under the Membership Chairman, has brought 276 new members in the two years, making a total club membership of 2,184.

The work of the Recording Secretary has kept the Board and

the membership clearly informed, while that of the Corresponding Secretary has cared for all personal interest items and the Board's official correspondence.

The duties of the Treasurer and the Chairman of Finance have involved some war-time complexities and problems. These have been solved in a business-like manner. In the reports of these officers, you learned that the proceeds from the sale of the Figueroa Street property were applied to reduction of the mortgage. The original indebtedness of \$700,000 on this Wilshire property of Ebell in 1927, had been reduced to \$238,500 at the beginning of this administration. Today, the mortgage stands at \$94,732.28.

The credit for this steady reduction through the years is due to the skillful handling of Ebell's finances by the Finance Chairman and the Treasurer, to the untiring efforts of the Ebell Associates under the five-year Chairman, to the Rentals Chairman, to the Former Officers with their successful bazaars, to the Solarium Tea Chairmen, to the Chairmen of Hospitality with their remunerative Benefits, to the annual Birthday Luncheons and to the generous contributions of many interested and devoted members.

In keeping with the Club's 1945-1946 slogan, "An Informed Membership," the Public Relations Chairman has not only attended and reported important civic meetings in the community but has secured speakers upon vital subjects for the President's half-hour, luncheons, and dinners. In addition an Information Desk has been established in the Lounge. The interest and response of the members demonstrates the need for this innovation.

The reports of the Rest Cottage and Scholarship Chairmen, prove the keen interest and success of these worthy projects so close to the hearts of all the membership.

The Juniors continue to provide excellent programs for their increasing membership. They have contributed generously in time and funds to various war activities and other fine philanthropies.

Ebell Chorus reached a peak of perfection at its seventh annual Palm Sunday Vesper Service this year, under the direction of Mrs. Hugh A. Patterson, conductor for the entire seven years.

The Chairman of the Art Salon, with her committees, has maintained a high standard of exhibits and lectures, again enriching the cultural life of Ebell.

Ebell's office and house staffs possess exceptional qualities of efficiency and loyalty. They deserve much credit for the smooth functioning of the Club.

At the close of this administration, the President is proud of the Club's achievements in the two-year period. The challenge of this critical time have been met by the Board of Directors and by the entire membership in a most commendable way. The loyalty and co-operation of the 2184 members, Regular and Junior, have again proved the sterling qualities of Ebell's members.

The finest and best in all things to the new President, to the Board and to the entire club, is the wish of the retiring President. May Ebell grow materially and culturally, but most of all, piritually.

To the Boards of Directors with whom it has been my privilege to serve for these two years, words are inadequate to express my gratitude for high standards of performance, countless hours of work and unswerving loyalty.

To the membership, as a whole, my sincerest thanks are given for the honor and trust accorded me in placing this position of highest responsibility in my keeping. May you have felt something of my joy in serving you.

REPORT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP CHAIRMAN

At the close of World War I, the women of the Ebell of Los Angeles decided to extend a helping hand to worthy students, who were not able to complete their college educations without financial assistance, so in the year 1919, the Ebell Scholarships were begun.

Mrs. Ilot Johnson, who at present is living in San Francisco, but whom many of you will remember as a very active Ebell member, was the first Ebell Scholarship Chairman. At that time ten was the maximum number of Scholarships granted because of limited funds.

A few years later, Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint established a substantial Endowment Fund, the income of which was to be used for Ebell Scholarships. In addition to the income derived from the \$14,000.00 Ebell Endowment Fund and the \$76,000.00 Flint Endowment Fund, an appropriation of \$600.00 from the Ebell General Fund and cash donations from Ebell members have made it possible to award twenty-five scholarships this year.

Due to the accelerated programs in the colleges, we have had seven girls in school during the summer semester and twenty-four girls in the two regular semesters and two girls taking nurse's training.

The Scholarships have been awarded to girls attending four local colleges. There are sixteen girls enrolled in UCLA; seven at the Los Angeles City College; two at Occidental College, and one at the University of Southern California; one student nurse at St. Vincent's Hospital, and one at the California Lutheran Hospital.

At present the Scholarships are given to women students because the G I Bill of Rights provided for the education of all returned veterans.

In applying for an Ebell Scholarship, the student is required to fill out an application blank and provide letters of recommendation as to character, scholarship standing, and financial need and submit these to the Scholarship Committee. The Committee is made up of eleven members; a chairman, two counsellors and eight committee members. If the letters are in order and if the recommendations meet the requirements, the student is invited to appear before the Committee. In this way we become acquainted with the student and she in turn realizes our interest in her welfare and achievements. We are her friends and as one of the Scholarship students put it: "Ebell is her Fairy God-mother." All of the students are selected with care and would be a credit to you or me, if they were our own daughters.

Each Scholarship student receives \$20.00 a month during the school year. The checks are sent to the office of the Dean of

Women, where the students call for them. This gives us the opportunity to work very closely with the college and to keep a close check on our Scholarship students.

A few Ebell members have given cash donations to the Scholarship Fund this year. They realize that an education is an investment in the future and the students we are helping now are the potential leaders of tomorrow. REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF PUBLIC RELATIONS

As the cessation of War lessened the need for some of the activities in Red Cross and other branches of war work in which Ebell women had been so busily engaged, the Chairman of Public Relations has endeavored to stimulate the interest of Ebell members in the complexities of problems with which they found themselves surrounded in a world at peace.

As an innovation in Public Relations work in the Club, an information desk was established in the lounge every Monday afternoon, staffed by the Chairman and her committee. From this desk there have been distributed printed lists of names of the Los Angeles City Councilmen, State officials, and National Congressmen. Here was to be had, for the asking, pamphlets on safety, information regarding proposed zone variances affecting Ebell property, analyses of proposed legislation, and here was stationed for two weeks a deputy registrar of voters for the convenience of club members. Councilmanic maps were kept at this desk so that members might locate their districts and get to know who their councilmen were, also printed matter to facilitate identifying their Congressmen in Washington.

The Chairman of Public Relations has been permitted by the President to secure speakers for some of the Assembly dinners, and the President's luncheons and occasionally the President's half-hour on the Monday programs. These speakers discussed timely subjects of vital interest, including Youth Welfare, the United Clothing Drive, Good Neighbor Policies, reports on proposed and pending legislation, reports on the special session of the State Legislature, and other topics.

The Chairman has also had the privilege of representing the President when she was unable to attend various meetings during the year, such as meetings to secure better radio programs, the Women's Committee of the Community Welfare Association, the program planning committee for the Women's Civic Conference, and other occasions.

The Chairman has had the opportunity to attend regional and New York meetings of the National Association of Manufacturers, where notes were taken on men's work in the post war period, as seen through a woman's eyes, and reports have been made to Ebell.

At a "Bonds for Peace" luncheon sponsored by the Women's Division of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, the Chairman arranged for the attendance of a group of women from Ebell, each of whom was required to buy a bond in order to attend, and Ebell won first prize of a \$100.00 bond for purchasing \$22,325.00 in Victory Bonds. Another first prize was won that day for the best table decorations, these having been made and arranged by Ebell women.

The Chairman has had one of her committee in attendance throughout the year at meetings each month of the Women's Tax Study Group, and has herself attended the Consumer's Research Committee of the Better Business Bureau and the Women's Division of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce.

A depot was provided in the club house for use during the United Clothing Drive, and more than a thousand pounds of good and useful clothing were collected and sent on their way to the needy in Europe.

REPORT OF WAR ACTIVITIES

In making a report of so vital a thing as participation in War Activities, the bare statistics give little hint of the satisfaction gained by the person serving. It has brought its daily reward, in the knowledge that each was contributing to help lessen the worry and pain incident to war, and to help speed its end by keeping up the morale of the fighting men.

In Red Cross work and U. S. O. we have recorded 75,000 hours this year, but realize that figure is only a fraction of the time which has been spent in sewing, knitting, making surgical dressings, serving canteens, and hostessing in U. S. O. centers.

An average of 53 women have met each week to sew for Red Cross. Twelve women went on the preceding day to prepare the work. Many kit bags, bath robes, pajamas and shirts, dresses and coats for men, women and children have been made for Head-quarters by the women sewing in our Solarium. The United States Naval Hospital at Corona has been the recipient of garments of many sorts which were made by an interested group of Ebell workers. Mending of all sorts has been done for the hospital, surgical dressings made by the hundreds, money given to help them in their Christmas program, and other gifts given as the need arose.

A group of our women sold Defense Bonds and Stamps each week in the Club House, also a weekly staffing of a down town booth for Bond selling was taken care of by Ebell. These sales were discontinued the first of January.

The U. S. O. centers have been furnished hostesses weekly, throughout the year, while five monthly canteens were served food by our Ebell women. One U. S. O. canteen was taken over for the entire third week of each month. The Nursery at Union Station has been another project of Ebell, as well as the Scrapbooks for U. S. O.

Wherever there has been a need, we are proud to report that Ebell has been ready to carry on.

REPORT OF THE NEEDLEWORK GUILD OF AMERICA EBELL UNIT

Ebell members contributed very generously to the Needlework Guild of America during the annual collection of new clothes for the needy. The combined result made a total of 929 garments which, with a cash surplus of \$10.85, were sent to the "Ingathering" held at the Orthopaedic Hospital. All articles collected in the local area were then, as is the custom, distributed to institutions, hospitals, and private homes in the community.

The members of the Ebell Committee of the Needlework Guild feel gratified at this result and are confident of continued interest of Ebell members in this long-established custom of helping clothe the needy ones—especially the children—in our own city.

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF ART SALON

The Art Patrons of Ebell have completed the first post-war year with a degree of satisfaction and success.

They have enjoyed a steady membership, the support of the Club, the co-operation of the committees and a most generous co-operation and appreciation on the part of the Art Clubs of the

community. The pictures and sculptures have been of an increas-

ingly high standard.

The club year was opened with our exhibit by the Painters and Sculptors Club of Los Angeles. At the October Art Salon Tea, Mr. Frank Gould of Gardena High School spoke on Art Appreciation in our present school system, and Mr. Leland Curtis, a member of the United States Government Expedition to the South Polar Regions under Rear Admiral Robert E. Bird, spoke on his experiences on this trip and showed some of his pictures.

In November the California Art Club gave us a very fine exhibit and at the Art Salon Tea a most interesting symposium on The

Life of An Artist, by eight of their members.

The January exhibit was by the Scandinavian-American Art Society and was very typical of Scandinavian art in its native land. At the tea that month, Mr. Helmuth Ellersieck, an artist and world renowned wood carver, spoke on the Fine Art of Violin Making.

The Society for Sanity in Art exhibited in the Art Salon in February and Miss Martha Wheeler Baxter, an Ebell member who is well known as a painter of miniatures, spoke on Miniature

Painting at the monthly tea.

In March the Art Patrons were hostesses to the Pasadena Society of Artists. Mr. Paul Coze, who is technical director of Razor's Edge, as well as an artist, was to have been the speaker but was detained at the studio at the last minute. However Mrs. Coze substituted for him in a most delightful way and told us of Mr. Coze's life and work. Mrs. Mildred Bryant Brooks spoke of her recent experience as resident artist at Scripps College.

The April exhibit was the work of The Women Painters of the West. Miss May Gearhart spoke very interestingly at the tea on

"This Changing World and the Eternal Arts."

In May the Art Patrons held their Ninteenth Annual Competitive Exhibit. Since this is an invitational affair, it is the outstanding art event of the club year. At this time the Art Patrons make their annual awards.

The jury awarded the prizes as follows, first in oils to Ejnar Hansen for his Mexican Still Life, second in oils to Mr. Orrin White for his beautiful "Sycamores," the prize in water colors to Mr. Alanson Spencer for his "Hill and Dale," and the prize in sculpture to Miss Gladys Bush for beautiful portrait bust.

On May 8, a reception was given in the Lounge for the exhibiting artists. The speaker was Mr. S. MacDonald Wright who spoke on Modern Art and showed us that Modern Art is not just modern

but the evolution of all art through the centuries.

The outstanding achievements of the last three years, seem to the chairman to be the increasing interest by our Ebell members as evidenced by the greater number of visitors to the Art Salon, the growing appreciation of art itself, and the real friendliness of

the art groups in and about the city who very much appreciate what Ebell is doing for art and the artists. On the other hand we appreciate all that the artists have done in contributing so much beauty to the cultural life of Ebell Club.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL CURATOR

The value of the department activities of Ebell may be measured by three criteria: first, the interest of the members, as demonstrated by their atendance at, and participation in the meetings; second, the growth of the members mentally, sociologically, spiritually and otherwise, as evidenced by their larger participation in cultural, civic and other community interests; and third, their ability to assume and discharge responsibilities in the total Club program. As tested by these three criteria, Ebell's department activities during the year just closing have been fruitful.

Including the weekly meetings of the language groups, Ebell's sixteen departments have held one hundred fifty-six meetings during the year, with a total attendance of 24,152 (an increase of 444 over the attendance of last year). This is significant in view of the fact that, because of our twenty-five-day transportation stoppage, the attendance during the month of May was 868 fewer than during the same month of 1945. Seven departments exceeded their attendance of a year ago.

The General Curator attended seventy-six department meetings, and fifty meetings of department committees. Four conferences

for all Curators were conducted.

The Club as a whole has profited by generous contributions from several of the departments. The French Department gave a sectional bookcase and an excellent selection of French books, and made a donation of \$41.11 to the Mortgage Fund. For the special fund for re-decorating the Fine Arts Room, the American Speech, Applied Design, Art and Travel, Book Chamber, Public Affairs, Shakespeare and Spanish Departments contributed n total of \$515.23. Members of the Applied Design and Art and Travel Departments participated in a radio quiz program for women's clubs, and were awarded the sum of \$25.00, which was donated to the same fund. All departments joined in contributing to a fund which was used to purchase the table microphone which now used in the Dining Room.

As times change, so do our department programs. But, regardless of change in form and content, they always seek the same objectives: development and progress; and with the development of individual members, their standards and the standards of the entire Club are raised, and progress becomes certain. Where

there is progress, there is strength.

To the department Curators, who have labored so faithfully and so conscientiously to make this year's work worth while, I repeat the words of Ralph Waldo Emerson: "The reward of a thing well done is to have done it."

Cook, Mr. Joseph Alexander Hartley and Mr. Leo O'Flaherty. Mrs. George C. Cook, Secretary, and Mrs. Harvey A. Connett, Treasurer, have been most helpful. The Treasurer's report will be made in full elsewhere.

Mrs. Harvey A. Connett, Mrs. William Holt and Mrs. Luther C. Anderson were re-elected to their respective offices on June 7th.

In closing, we of Rest Cottage look upon our duty as a civic one and the word charity does not apply in any sense to the service we render our guests. In this post-war period of reconversion and readjustment we, of the board, hope to make our contribution to a better understanding among all groups in our city and thus prevent conflict and friction. RESOLUTIONS Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing aid property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforetald, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, will and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annui-

ties, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of the Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise FOR BENEFIT OF EBELL REST COTTAGE

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the Maintenance of Rest Cottage

******************************	***************************************	dollars."
If real estate,	use: "I hereby give and	devise to The Ebell of
Los Angeles that	real property described as	follows:

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

SECTION 41 OF THE PROBATE CODE

Restrictions

No estate, real or personal, may be bequeathed or devised to any charitable or benevolent society or corporation, or to any person or persons in trust for charitable uses, by a testator who leaves a spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor surviving him who, under the will, or the laws of succession would otherwise have taken the property so bequeathed or devised unless the will was duly executed at least thirty days before death, such devises and legacies shall be valid, but they may not collectively exceed one-third of the testator's estate as against his spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor, who would otherwise, as aforesaid, have taken the excess over one-third, and if they do a pro rata deduction from such devises and legacies shall be made and as to reduce the aggregate thereof to one-third of the estate. All property bequeathed or devised contrary to the provisions of this section shall go to the spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancester of the testator, if and to the extent that they would have taken said property as aforesaid but for such devises or legacies; otherwise the testator's estate shall go in accordance with his will and such devises and legacies shall be unaffected.

BY-LAWS OF EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los

REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. The three directors who are elected from Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be chairmen, respectively, of Finance, House and Garden.

Section 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committe eshall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except those members otherwise provided for, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

Section 3. The Chairman of Finance shall head a committee composed of the President, Chairman of Finance and the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles, and the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. This Finance Committee shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Association. The Chairman of Finance and the Chairman of Rest Cottage shall be assisted by an advisory committee of three investment counselors who shall advise as to the investment of all Endowment Funds, together with such other moneys as may be available for investment. The Finance Chairman shall bring to the Finance and Executive Committees meeting together the recommendations of these advisors for approval. Upon approval by a majority of said committees of a recommended investment the Chairman of Finance shall be empowered to make such transactions. The Chairman of Finance shall verify the monthly financial reports of the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Section 4. The House Chairman shall have charge of all replacements and repairs at Ebell Rest Cottage, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Garden Chairman shall have supervision of the planting and upkeep of the garden, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all standing committees. She shall appoint all special committees and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall receive from the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles all moneys due and contributed to the Association, together with a statement showing the accounts for which such moneys have been contributed and shall give a receipt for same. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and she shall be bonded as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Finance
- 2. Membership
- 3. Investigation
- 4. Service
- 5. Follow-up
- 6. Program
- 7. Hospitality
- 8. Field Survey

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues. Section 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

Section 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

Section 4. A payment of One Hundred Dollars may be made by any person for a life membership or a memorial gift.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall he held on the first Friday of each month, except the month of August, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the months of August and September, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Monday in June, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

Section 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Section 2. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Section 3. The members of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President, Treasurer and Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be divided into two groups of three members each. Group Number One shall consist of two directors and the Treasurer to be elected at the annual elections in even-numbered years for a term of two years. Group Number Two shall consist of one director, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary to be elected at the annual elections in the odd-numbered years for a term of two years. At any election a member may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 4. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of such proposed amndment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

Section 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

Due to the ending of the war, this club year proved to be a transition period of reconversion from our curtailed wartime program to the more extensive activities allowed during peacetime. We were able to renew some activities that were not feasible with wartime handicaps and restrictions. Several of our Committee Chairmen had to be replaced because they left the city when their husbands returned from war, and a number of girls were re-instated when they returned to the city.

Our first meeting was held the second Tuesday in October. We combined our day with the French Department Benefit by having our luncheon and business meeting in the Solarium and then adjourning to the Auditorium where several of our girls acted as ushers for the French Department and the others attended the program. The other six luncheons and programs were held in the Solarium and were planned by the luncheon chairman, Mrs. Charles Peterson. The decorations were arranged by Mrs. Helmuth Hannemann. The programs, under the direction of Mrs. Bertram Coffee, Jr., included the following speakers: Susan Cagill, Fashion Expert and Type Analist; Mrs. Allison Bisgood, Coast Editor for Vogue; Ruth Corey, an Advertising and Marketing Research Authority; Mary McCall, Jr., Author and Screen Writer; Vincent Price, Stage and Screen Actor; and Dr. Clarence Dykstra, Provost of U.C.L.A.

Our mothers were guests at the May Program, and we were proud to introduce them at that time.

We installed new officers at the June meeting and enjoyed a bridge party following the ceremony.

Total membership for 1945-1946 was 109 members. The Membership Chairman, Mrs. Downie Muir III, welcomed into the group 17 new members and 4 girls were re-instated.

The Juniors presented a \$25 Campership to the Girl Scouts so that a girl who could not otherwise afford it, would be allowed the privilege of attending summer camp.

Also added \$250.00 to the Ebell Mortgage Fund and \$250.00 for the Nursing Scholarships. In addition the U.S.O. Project at the Union Station took an average of \$25 a month.

At the end of the year \$350.00 was voted as a nucleus for a fund to be used to redecorate the Solarium and to install a microphone there.

Two benefits were held this year. The first was a Theater Party with Mrs. Alfred Henrich in charge and netted \$100.00. The second was a Bridge Luncheon at the Club under Miss Margaret McKitrick and added \$372.62 to our Fund.

On the fourth Friday of each month, five girls under the direction of Miss Patricia Van Norden, gave generously of their time by serving at the U.S.O. Canteen. Each member donated six dozen sandwiches, and the

club treasury supplied the rest to provision the Canteen with milk, doughnuts, coffee and sandwiches.

We continued our Pot Luck Suppers on the last Saturday of every month throughout the summer as well as during the club year and met in the homes of various members. Mrs. John Craig, Jr., was chairman. This activity included husbands who considered the event a highlight of the month. An average of 45 people attended each supper which netted \$384.44 for the year.

The monthly Dessert Bridge parties were held throughout the summer months—thus there were twelve of them. Mrs. John Combs and Mrs. Russell Nance were in charge. This activity added to the treasury \$\$88.00.

The Book Chamber flourished under the able leadership of Mrs. George Keyzers and Mrs. Dean Hurchel whose enthusiasm and high standard of cultural values made this meeting stimulating and interesting. Many members highlighted the programs with their book reviews.

Publicity for the group was very ably handled by Mrs. Carl Laster, who left for Washington, D. C. and later by Mrs. Paul Jones, who succeeded in securing much space for us in the leading newspapers by their fine articles.

To keep ourselves posted Mrs. Robert Greenwald edited the paper "Ye Belles." We thoroughly enjoyed the news and items of interest.

Mrs. Victor Kendrick spent many hours at the telephone carrying out her duties as Chairman of the Telephone and Directory Committee. She and her committee kept us informed as to future events and reported reservations. She also published the Directory.

Many of our members and their escorts met at the Beverly Hills Hotel the Third Friday of each month for dinner and dancing.

A children's party was held at Griffith Park. We met at the Merry-Go-Round and after a few happy rides went below to the picnic tables for refreshments arranged by Mrs. Fairman Burgess. Forty-eight mothers and children were present.

We were very fortunate to have as our advisors three outstanding women, Mrs. Paul D. Dodds, Mrs. F. Walton Brown and Mrs. Carl B. Van Sant. These sponsors guided us through the year with unselfish devotion. We appreciated their kindness and generous support.

In retiring from office, I wish to express my deep appreciation for the loyal support, co-operation and assistance received throughout the year.

Our association has been a most happy and friendly one, and I shall always treasure the sweet memories of the courtesies extended to me, both by our own membership, and by allied organizations as President of Ebell Juniors.

BY-LAWS OF THE EBELL JUNIORS ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

Section 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

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Section 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell Bulletin all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

Section 3. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.

Section 4. The Third Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Juniors not otherwise provided for and shall issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Executive Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor, and she shall sign all vouchers for expenditures. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Courtesy and Membership
- 3. Credentials
- 4. Program
- 5. Social Welfare and Scholarship
- Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

Section 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Chairman of Ebell Scholarships, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors. The chairman of this Committee shall exofficio be a member of the Scholarship Committee of the Club.

Section 6. Chairman of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Evecutive Committee.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Section 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to th Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

Section 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years.

Section 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation, and if favorably acted upon by the Board of Governors, shall then follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Section 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of memberhsip.

Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board o fDirectors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues are payable. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall constitute forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before June 30, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club. Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees, but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall received a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

Section 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending all regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

Nominations

Section 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting proceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

Section 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall then be called for. Names of all nominees shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin.

Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Executive Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Adviser on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first, provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together during the months of May and June for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The Ebell of Los Angeles Articles of Incorporation

Know All Men By These Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third-That the place where the principal business of this corporation

is to be transacted, is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth-That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A.D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The Officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings, and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect. from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

Section 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any person serving more than one-half of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

Section 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

Section 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees, including the Presentation Committee, and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers, but in her absence or disability, the First Vice-President shall sign such checks, contracts, and other legal papers. The President shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of May following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may

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desire. In the absence or disability of the President, she shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Executive Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Executive Secretary an itemized statement of all moneys paid to her, designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall direct the Executive Secretary to deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors, and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall present a statement at all regular meetings of the Board of Directors and a semi-annual report to the Club. She shall give a bond to the Club for the faithful performance of her duties in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of May following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

Section 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club, and unless otherwise provided for in

these By-Laws, over all committees of the Club having power to receive and disburse moneys. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

Section 8. The Chairman of Hospitality shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees.

Section 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations, and report to the Board of Directors from time to time the activities of such organizations.

Section 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval. She shall have supervision over all theater employees.

Section 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

Section 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. An Executive Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer, for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall issue duplicate receipts for all moneys paid to the Club, and received by her, and deposit all such funds in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall give to the Treasurer an itemized statement of all funds received, designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Board of Directors in all matters pertaining to the business of the Club. The Executive Secretary shall be the custodian of the seal, the books, and the records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE VI

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Former Officers' Round Table
- 3. Departments
- 4. Finance
- 5. Hospitality
- 6. House
- 7. Membership
- 8. Printing
- 9. Program
- 10. Public Relations
- 11. Rentals
- 12. Rest Cottage
- 13. Scholarship
- Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.
- Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.
- Section 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.
- Section 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.
- Section 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills,

claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Hospitality Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

Section 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and sshall supervise the building and its contents.

Section 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

Section 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Bulletin and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

Section 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering. It shall keep in touch with and report the activities of all organizations in which Ebell holds membership and assists financially.

Section 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

Section 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

Section 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

Section 15. Chairman of committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Executive Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VII

MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committed shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than five applications for regular membership, five for temporary membership, and five for Junior membership during each year.

Section 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to up hold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

Section 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management. Regular members include those members specified in Sections 4 and 5 of Article VIII.

Section 5. Any member may apply for life membership who has continued in good and regular standing for five consecutive years next preceding the filing of the application for life membership. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in Article VII, Section 1. If the application is granted, the applicant shall pay the sum of \$500.00 provided she is under fifty (50) years of age, otherwise \$300.00. She shall receive a certificate of life membership and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership without payment of dues.

Section 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

Section 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

Section 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a nonmember for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

Section 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, between the ages of eighteen (18) and thirty-five (35), are entitled to be special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend all Monday programs each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approvial of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

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An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, became a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed in any subsequent year, provided the applicant is still a temporary resident. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

Section 12. Any member may resign at any time. Such resignation must be in writing and be accompanied by the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one-half of the regular admission fee, or one-half of the dues accrued during the time of nonmembership.

Section 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The payment of this fee may be suspended for a stated time at any regular meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote, provided due notice of the proposed suspension has been given.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues are payable. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first, and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall constitute forfeiture of membership.

The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 3. In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year, that unless such dues are paid on or before June 30, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 4. A regular member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 5. A regular member of the Club whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX

MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June, inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All businesss to be transacted must be specified in the call.

Section 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no

further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meetings and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two years and shall be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. In order to be eligible for election to an office on the Board of Directors a member must have been in good standing for at least three years immediately preceding election. No member shall be eligible to the office of President who has not served on the Board of Directors for at least two years.

*The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Chairman of Rentals, Treasurer, General Curator, and Chairman of Hospitality. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Chairman of Finance, Recording Secretary, Chairman of Public Relations, Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in May and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in May, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

Nominations

Section 3. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members, who shall have been active members of the Club for five years. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in January for the purpose of electing a chairman and a secretary. Meetings thereafter shall be held at the discretion of the committee.

The Nominating Committee by a two-thirds vote of its members shall select one or more candidates, who shall consent to serve if elected, for each office to be filled at the annual election.

Section 5. Not later than March 1 of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for each office to be filled at the ensuing election.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with the name of not more than one member for each office. This ballot so filled out shall be signed by the member as her name appears in the Year Book and must be returned to the Ebell office on or before March 21.

Section 6. On March 22, or immediately thereafter, the Nominating Committee shall meet, count the nominating ballots and prepare the ballot for the annual election. This ballot shall contain the names of the candidates presented by the Nominating Committee and the name of each candidate receiving fifty (50) or more votes for one office on the nominating ballot, or a combined vote of seventy-five (75) or more votes, the office in this case to be the one for which she received the largest vote. The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the election ballot.

Section 7. On the second Monday in April the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report, designating method of nomination, shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

Section 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

Section 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board

^{*}Note: (That this grouping may be established, the following changes are made if the above amendments are adopted: At the election in 1946 the Recording Secretary will be elected for one year. At the election in 1947 the Chairman of Rentals will be elected for one year.)

between April first and April fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. A sample ballot stating hours of election, as set by the Board of Directors, shall be included in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Before casting her ballot, each member shall sign the register as her name appears in the Year Book. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in May the names of those candidates receiving a plurality vote. A full report of the number of votes cast for each candidate shall be filed in the office of the Club and shall be available to any member.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Executive Secretary, who shall destroy them after the installation of the new officers.

Section 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the second week in May for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year.

ARTICLE XI

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have six definite forms of activity: (1) General Monday Afternoon Programs; (2) Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) Ebell Juniors; (6) and Art Patrons.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of The EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in April each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the officers of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club. No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII

CLUB POLICIES

Section 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

Section 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to be voted upon and the date of such voting. At the regular Monday meeting preceding the date of voting, the section or sections to be amended shall be read and the proposed amendment or amendments shall be read and explained.

STANDING RULES

Section 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV

CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

STANDING RULES

ADMISSION

- 1. Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
- Regular members may bring three guests to all but special programs, by paying the stipulated fee including tax.
- 3. Junior members will receive six guest cards for departments of Ebell, one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
- 4. Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive six guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.

- 5. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.
- 6. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Department meetings in one year.
- Husbands of club members may be admitted to all department meetings on members' calling cards.
- 8. Husbands of club members may be admitted on members' calling cards to all except special Monday programs. These cards must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.
- Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.
- 10. All courtesy admission cards for Monday afternoons must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

- Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.
- New members notified of their election during January or June shall pay dues from January first and July first, respectively.
- Applications for either non-resident or business rates should be presented before October first for the ensuing year or before March first for the last half of the year.
- 4. Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

SOLICITATIONS

- Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.
- No solicitation of signatures to petitions, memorials or similar documents shall be permitted in the clubhouse.
- 3. No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and the Board of Directors; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.
- Members may not solicit gifts, commissions or favors from merchants or commercial concerns of any kind.
- 5. Members may not sell tickets for outside events in the club rooms.

MISCELLANEOUS

Curators, committee chairmen and others arranging for called meetings in the club shall notify the office, stating the time and place of meeting.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of May, 1945. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

 A member may not represent Ebell on any outside committee unless so appointed by the President or Board of Directors.

 No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Lounge, except to the Reception Committee and for major benefits within a designated area.

LUNCHEON AND DINNER TICKETS

- 1. Tickets will be sold for all meals.
- Reservations for all meals should be made two days in advance. If reservations are not cancelled, members making them will be responsible for payment.
- 3. An extra charge of ten cents will be made on luncheon tickets purchased after eleven o'clock that day.
- Cancellations for luncheon reservations will not be accepted after ten o'clock of the day.
- 5. Cancellations for dinner reservations will not be accepted after twelve o'clock of the preceding day.
- 6. Reservations for Monday luncheons should be in on Friday.

STANDING RULES GOVERNING THE ART SALON

The Art Exhibitions Committee of Ebell was organized in 1916. Its name was changed to The Art Salon in 1931. Its purpose (so recorded in the minutes of the Board of Directors) is to exhibit the work of professional artists of high standing in *conservative art*. All work accepted for exhibition must conform to that standard.

Before any art art object shall be exhibited in the Club, the exhibitor shall sign a written release waiving any claim against the Club on account of damage, theft, or other loss of art object. (Adopted by Board of Directors in 1939.)

A written order must be issued by the Art Chairman and presented at the club office before any art object may be removed.

All art objects must be removed from the clubhouse within thirty days after the exhibition.

Exhibitions of the work of outstanding painters, sculptors and miniature painters are held from October first through May in the Salon, water colors and prints in the Galeria.

The May exhibition is always competitive and prizes are given for the best work in each medium.

Competing artists may be invited by the Art Chairman or a general invitation may be sent out by the Chairman to all artists. In either case their work must pass a Jury of Selection and Awards appointed by the Chairman.

Dues shall be paid by the Art Patrons and shall be used by the Art Salon to pay for overhead expenses, for transportation of the exhibitions and for prizes additional to those given annually by interested

Art Patrons. A prize is also given for the popular-vote choice of the Ebell members. It is the consensus of opinion that these prizes shall be of sufficient value to make them a worth-while honor.

All money collected by the Art Salon shall be paid at once to the Executive Secretary of Ebell and a receipt required therefor.

In June the Galeria is given over to the exhibition of the work of the artist members of Ebell, each member exhibiting not more than one in each medium.

The May exhibition in the Salon is usually held over, in whole or in part, through the month of June.

It is customary for the Art Patrons to hold an evening reception during the month of October, honoring exhibiting artists, and an artists' dinner in May, when the prize winners are announced.

The Art Salon shall be under the direct control and supervision of the President of Ebell.
