DR. ADRIAN EBELL

"Why was our Club named 'Ebell'?"

This question is often asked, both by new members and by our friends outside the Club. We should be able to give a complete answer.

Adrian Ebell was born in Ceylon in 1840, of German-British-Dutch ancestry. He was brought to America when a small child and was educated in this country. After graduating from Yale, he studied in German universities and returned to America with a deep interest in higher education and broader culture for women. He established several study classes in eastern states, and was returning to Europe for further study and development of plans for an international college for women, when he died suddenly at the age of thirty-seven.

The Oakland Ebell was founded in 1876 and our own Ebell was suggested by two members of that Club, Mrs. H. W. R. Strong and Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, when they came to Los Angeles to live.

Groups of women in several communities in California have erected living monuments to Dr. Adrian Ebell by taking his name for their Clubs and by following closely his ideals for women.

The Ebell of Los Angeles, founded in October 1894, is now approaching its "Golden Year" with an enviable record of achievement in every activity it has initiated. Both to its members and the community Ebell has been of inestimable value.

The membership of sixty-eight has grown to more than two thousand, the number of study departments is now sixteen, a well-chosen library contains over three thousand five hundred volumes, and the Art Salon, organized in 1929, is considered a distinct asset to the city's cultural life. Hundreds of women who have been guests of our Rest Cottage philanthropy bear witness to the understanding kindness and efficient management to be found there through the twenty-five years of its life. Our Scholarship Fund has been so wisely administered that, since 1920, hundreds of young men and women have thanked Ebell for the opportunity to continue their college work. The Ebell Juniors, established in 1921, bring young blood to the Club and furnish splendid training for our future leaders. Red Cross, both in the first Great War and in the present one, has received strong support from Ebell, and the Club holds membership in many charitable organizations and has assisted many others.

So, in some department or special activity, every member of the Club can justify Dr. Ebell's faith in women's intelligence, ability and unselfish interest in human betterment.

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REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

1942-1943

In this message to you the President is asking you to review with her a few of the achievements of the club year which has just closed; then let us look ahead into the future which will be "Our Adventure."

The annual reports give you a better understanding of the operation of the Club and a keen appreciation for the year's accomplishments. Many unforeseen responsibilities have arisen during the year, but they have been met with courage. The change of the tax status was a ruling of the Treasury Department of the United States Government. This was accepted as a matter of duty and loyalty in the National Emergency.

Because of the need to increase the membership, it was decided by the Club that the registration fee be waived. Action was taken first in October of 1942, then in January of 1943, and again in June of 1943, this latter action covering the period which will expire June 30, 1944. As a result, 340 new members have been accepted so far. In September the clubhouse was opened for a Fashion Show and Tea which afforded the members an opportunity to meet friends who were already members, and to introduce other friends whom they wished to sponsor as new members. This pre-season Tea was a happy innovation and helped to stimulate the membership growth.

More than 10,000 members and guests have attended the departments. Thirty-one thousand have enjoyed the Monday afternoon programs, the high standard of which has been maintained. The discrimination in the selection of speakers and artists is, in a great measure, responsible for the increase in membership.

The evening meeting, another innovation for Ebell, with Mr. Fulton Lewis, Jr., as the speaker, proved to be the outstanding event of the year.

The club philanthropies have been maintained with a sense of satisfaction to all those vitally interested in their welfare. Due to changing conditions, Rest Cottage has been a refuge for not only business women in need of a brief rest, but also nurses who have seen active duty and who have benefited by the quiet surroundings of Rest Cottage and the helpful understanding of the Chairman.

For the first time, scholarships have been awarded to young women being trained as nurses, in addition to the regular students maintained at the universities.

During the year, \$15,375 has been paid on the mortgage. Much of the credit for the substantial reduction of the club mortgage goes to Mrs. Samuel Cary Dunlap, Chairman, and the many mem-

bers working together for the past five years as the Ebell Associates, who have raised the sum of \$50,475.00. It is hoped that some plan may be conceived to perpetuate this excellent record during the months to come.

Because the theater business has changed materially during the year, the income from theater rentals is not so great as that to which the Club has been accustomed; however, the Theater Manager and the Rentals Chairman have worked unceasingly to increase that income, with the result that it is not far short of the amount anticipated in the year's budget. The Figueroa property has been renovated and the income is now greater than for some time past. The House rentals have increased materially because of our ability to satisfy other organizations who use Ebell as their meeting place. There are already on file many requests for rentals for next year.

The continued endeavor of the House employees who have loyally remained with Ebell has helped maintain the spirit of friendliness and co-operation that has permeated the Club this year.

The Solarium Teas, which have always been a source of income for the maintenance of the Club, have been an attraction on Wednesday afternoons. The amount realized is excellent when so many women today are turning to "all work and no play."

The Salon of Art has continued to be a place of interest each month. Representative exhibits have been obtained and interesting programs have been provided by the Chairman and her Committee.

Three philanthropy benefits were planned early in the season, the first one sponsored by the Former Officers' Round Table, in the Spring a Fashion Show and Tea, and in June a Garden Tea at the home of Mrs. Lyman Farwell, one of the club members.

Five Assembly Dinners have been held. The annual Palm Sunday Vesper Concert of the Ebell Chorus was one of the most impressive events of the year.

The President's luncheons, presenting interesting personalities in world affairs, were well attended. The May luncheon program appealed to so many members and guests that it was necessary to adjourn to the auditorium immediately after luncheon in order to accommodate everyone present.

There have been many personal gifts to the Club, among them being the Shakespeare First Folio from Mrs. Charles E. Love, and an inspirational statue of Christ, a gift of the distinguished sculptor, Roger Noble Burnham, husband of an Ebell member.

The record of the work done by the War Service Committee is one of which the Club may well be proud. More than 50,000 hours have been devoted to unselfish work in all its branches. The Red Cross Production Unit has doubled its output over former years.

An Army officer, when asked what he considered the most important attributes of a soldier, replied: "First, Discipline." By this he meant team work. Discipline of soldiers to work together makes an army. "Second, Self-Discipline," that quality which allows a person to place the common good above self. Then there is the quality of Self-Respect, which makes any mean act unthinkable. That is, there is no pettiness in the good soldier—there isn't time. Courage, the traditional attribute of the good soldier, was not even mentioned, until the General explained that these other qualities make Courage.

May we continue to be good soldiers in our chosen field, which means to work easily under leadership. This is Discipline. May we at the same time exercise Self-Discipline. All of these qualities will give us Courage to work for Ebell and perpetuate the ideals for which it stands.

During the Club year 1942-1943, four hundred seventy-two letters and notes were written for the President and Board of Directors; one hundred ninety-four items were reported for the Chairman of the Personal Interest Committee; invitations for Charter Day were sent Ebell's seven Charter members; invitations for the annual In Memoriam Service were sent to the families of thirty-nine members who passed on during the year; eighty-six invitations for a Reciprocity Tea were mailed; three communications were sent to the General Federation of Women's Clubs; five complimentary Year Books and twenty-seven monthly Bulletins were mailed to the General Federation, other clubs and organizations; twenty-four orders for flowers were placed by the Secretary, twenty-two of which were for funeral services of members. By decision of the Board of Directors of The Ebell, on December 3, 1942, the sending of flowers was discontinued for the duration of the war.

REPORT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP CHAIRMAN

One of the purposes for which Ebell was formed was "to carry on educational and philanthropic work." Our Scholarship program, with its magnificent Endowment Fund, grew from this avowed purpose, and each year we proudly report the number of scholarships awarded, but this financial aid is only the foundation for the great and far-reaching educational program that is Ebell's.

Through our Scholarships, hundreds of young women and young men are themselves carrying on this educational program into homes, schools, factories, industrial plants, hospitals, or wherever their life's work may take them.

The Scholarship Committee regards seriously its responsibility in selecting the students who are to be awarded an Ebell Scholarship. Besides the recommended high mentality, integrity, energy and good health that Ebell's By-Laws require, future leadership and the ability to fit well into society, are deciding factors.

Twenty-one students were honored with Scholarship awards this past college year. One, a Junior majoring in Music, attended George Pepperdine College; two attended the University of Southern California; and eighteen attended the University of California at Los Angeles.

Seven young women graduated in June. Three of them had been elected to Phi Beta Kappa, national honorary scholastic fraternity. Only three young men were on our roster. One left in February for Officers' Training School, the other two donned uniforms of the Naval R.O.T.C., to be on the Government payroll in July.

To help meet the urgent need for nurses, it was decided to award five Scholarships to student nurses who will soon be ready to enter our various hospitals for training. Three of these have already been selected.

A decided revision in the length of semesters at our local universities necessitated a change in our program of disbursing funds to our students, who, to meet this revision, will attend school the twelve months of the year, beginning in July, thus shortening a four-year college course to about two and one-half years.

Regardless of the numerous demands upon every member of the Club during these days of war, the Needlework Guild of America has again demonstrated its unwavering interest, not only in the needy among our own people but in the starving of war-torn Europe as well.

In this great work, the Needlework Guild of Ebell has played its part. Through the generosity of Club members, 446 garments and \$25.36 in cash were contributed last year.

All garments of apparel, such as robes and sweaters, together with blankets, were sent to the Ingathering at the Children's Hospital, and from there the Guild made distributions to hospitals,

charitable institutions and homes in the Los Angeles area.

The co-operation of Ebell members in the past year augurs well for the future, and it is hoped that the Guild's membership will increase to such an extent that a substantial expansion of this very charitable work shall be the result.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN

The Library Committee was composed of fourteen members. A meeting was held before the opening of the Club year, at which time plans and details of the library work were discussed and explained, and suggestions offered to aid in the library technique.

Thirty-six new books were purchased during the year, including fourteen fiction and twenty-two non-fiction.

Twenty-one books were presented to the library by interested members of the Club.

The grand total of new books during the year is therefore fifty-seven.

Five magazine subscriptions were purchased and several magazines were presented by members.

Owing to the need of the army and navy for good books, about ninety books, many of which were duplicate copies of popular works, were given to the army and to the chaplain of an aircraft carrier. Great appreciation of this gift of Ebell has been expressed.

At the close of the year an inventory of all books was taken and all library records completed and corrected to date.

The scrap book containing jacket covers of the new books was continued through the year. This has made information of authors and brief reviews of books available to members desiring suggestions about their reading.

The statistical records kept during the year are as follows: Books circulated, 1,580; magazines circulated, 154; fines collected, \$36.39.

Merritt Partridge, as of our first year. The program was given by the curators of Ebell. We all know that our leaders could present a very dignified affair but this was in lighter vein: that little nonsense that is relished by the best of us.

The Monday afternoon meeting was devoted to our California history when the Russian, Spanish and Yankee influence was depicted in three short plays: one by Miss Pauline Curran, one by Mrs. S. Merritt Partridge and one by Mrs. Charles Rathman. All the state "Governors" brought their state flowers to the pot of gold at the foot of the rainbow, each carrying her state flag, and were presented to our President, Mrs. Norman E. Branch, herself a native daughter of our Golden State. The Ebell chorus added to the beauty of the plays, and as a grand finale over a Hundred Associates on the stage joined with the audience, singing "America," under the direction of Mrs. Hugh Patterson, leader of the chorus.

REPORT OF THE SALON OF ART

As a result of the great world conflict, Art evidenced a definite forward movement during the past year. This has been reflected in the works of our California artists. Art is a morale builder of inestimable value, as has been proven by the work of artists with the men in the service and in army hospitals.

Fully realizing this far-reaching effect, the Art Patrons of Ebell have shown keenest interest in the work of the Salon during the past year. The finest examples of the latest works of our California artists have been shown in the Salon and Galeria.

The Clubs represented with monthly exhibits have been: The California Art Club, in October; The Sanity in Art Society, in January; The Painters and Sculptors Club, in March, and The Women Painters of the West, in April. Each exhibited works in the various mediums of Oils, Watercolors, Sculpture, Pastels, Etchings, and Prints.

In November, individual exhibits were shown by Nell Walker Parner, of Oils; Beryl Ireland, of Watercolors; Tom Manners, of Etchings of "Tall Ships"; and Edgardo Simone, of strongly accented Sculpture.

In December, the works of Lenard Kester, Robert McIntosh,

Brinnette Crawford, in Oils, Ginette Fels, in Aztec Potteries, and Panrhyn Stanlaws, of Pastel Portraits, were shown.

For the January program, the Sanity in Art Society, led by Judge Daniel Beecher, President, presented speakers on Art, including Roger Noble Burnham and James Swinnerton.

During February the Salon was filled with the Decorative Art of Karoly Fulop, executed in wood, bronze, marble, ceramics, and watercolor, and the Galeria with watercolors of scenes of the war activities in the Hawaiian Islands, by Kenneth Andres Reid.

For the April program, a "Panel Discussion on Art," sponsored by the Women Painters of the West, was led by Alma May Cook. The Panel included Dr. Vicotr Parkyn, noted alienist; Genevieve Dodge of the Los Angeles Parole Board, Judge Georgia Bullock of the Superior Court, and the Chaplain of the Sawtelle Hospital for the wounded.

The Annual Competitive Art Exhibition during May and early June was of more than usual interest, and was augmented in June in the Galeria by the works of our own members and the Class in Painting, of Loren Barton.

Seven program teas were given in the Salon, featuring Art subjects: Dr. George Berson, "Hunting the Impulse to Art"; "Nell Walker Warner, "Flower Painting"; Ginette Fels, "Aztec Potteries"; Tom Manners, "Etchings." A lecture on the technique of an "American Masterpiece of Painting," given by George Barker; modelling in clay from life by Edgardo Simone, and the head of Abraham Lincoln, by Merrill Gage, were of special interest. The monthly program teas averaged an attendance of two hundred. Twice monthly, talks on Art Appreciation were given in the Salon by Loren Barton, internationally known artist, and teacher of painting.

Tours were made to the studios of local artists, including Geza Kende, Penrhyn Stanlaws, Stan Pochecko Porey, Martha Baxter, and Christian Von Schneidau. A tour was also made to the Los Angeles County Museum, the Fisher Gallery and to the Foundation of Western Art.

Conference Teas were held at the home of Mrs. Ralph Emerson Filcher, chairman, in September, and Mrs. Marcius Curtis Smith, in April.

A complimentary tea was given to the Art Patrons, by Mrs. H. M. Parker, to see her exhibition of International Dolls, and to the home of Mrs. David Smith, to view her private collection of paintings and art objects.

An evening reception, honoring the California Art Club, was given in October, attended by over three hundred. The annual Artists' Dinner was given on May 14, with an attendance of 330. On this occasion, the artists were introduced by Judge Daniel Beecher, and prizes were awarded to the winners in the May Com-

petitive Art Exhibition, by the Chairman, Mrs. Ralph Emerson Filcher. A choice musical program was presented by the Chairman of Music, Mrs. Scott B. Rager.

REPORT OF EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

This year of our Lord 1943 marks the twenty-fifth anniversary of the organization of Rest Cottage, a haven for "women who because of their physical condition need rest and quiet for a time to enable them to return to their former occupations."

It may interest you to know that over 3,500 have availed themselves of this opportunity to rest—an average of 140 per year gratefully accepting a courtesy which is unique in the annals of social service work in this part of the country.

Nearly \$300,000 has flowed into the Rest Cottage exchequer in these twenty-five years—so wisely managed that it has paid all expenses of building and maintenance and formed the nucleus of our so-called Endowment Fund which brought us over \$2,700 in dividends this year. The report of the Treasurer, Mrs. Edgar Allen Doran, follows this one, and shows the receipts from four sources, all of which have their origin in the generous hearts of Ebells women, whether they come from bequests and gifts and the dividends which their investment brings, from roll-call donations, or the monthly gifts of the Club and the Juniors.

The Chairman of Finance, Mrs. James A. Rogers, tells us that \$9,000 has been received from the estate of a former member, Miss Jamie Maud Blanchard, \$250 from a trust fund established by Commodore Louis Beaumont, and \$200 from the Ada Van Pelt Memorial Fund. She reports the Endowment Fund has been carefully invested, with the advice of the three businessmen who are our investment counselors, and the approval of the Ebells Board of Directors, quite evenly divided between War, Municipal and Utility Bonds, preferred and common stocks, with a cash balance for an emergency.

The Secretary, Mrs. Robert S. McAvoy, reports nine business meetings of the Association, nine regular meetings of the Executive Committee and four called meetings. She has written five letters and sent 486 invitations for the Christmas Party.

The Assistant Chairman, Mrs. Edwin G. Howard, keeps her finger on the pulse of the food problem and watches and approves the well-balanced menus provided for Rest Cottage guests. Ten thousand, five hundred thirty-eight meals have been served during the year.

Mrs. William Bertram Burns, House Chairman, reports very little in the way of furnishing except for routine needs. Eight cement piers were placed under the kitchen, which, with its heavy furnishings, rather overloaded the inadequate foundation.

The spacious garden continues to bestow its blessing of sun and shade and peace. Many meals are served there to the delight of the girls, who carry out their trays themselves.

Even though there has been no permanent gardener, Mrs. Robert Hardy has done wonders in keeping the garden beautiful.

Three times during the year Mrs. Marshall Andrews and her large committee arranged social affairs for the Cottage. In October, one hundred Ebells women were guests at luncheon. In April, 63 came to tea there, and, in December, 169 former guests of the Cottage and 52 Rest Cottage Committee women came to the Club to enjoy a Christmas banquet and a beautiful program arranged and given in part by our own Betty Roadman.

The Membership Chairman, Mrs. Ernest L. Soister, reports 440 of the Ebells members have responded to the annual Roll Call; two, Mrs. Edgar Allen Doran and Mrs. Frank Pollock, with \$100 contributions, making a total of \$1,090.50. If the other 1,600 members of Ebells responded in like fashion, Rest Cottage would be comparatively self-supporting.

The gasoline situation has put a stop to the Field Survey work but Mrs. A. O. Luer, the Chairman, holds herself in readiness to carry on when conditions permit.

Mrs. Charles Rathman keeps her history of Rest Cottage up to date.

Dr. Charlotte M. Brown and Dr. J. Margaret Roberts have examined 173 cases the past year, of which 121 were accepted and 52 rejected.

The War, which left the Cottage almost untouched last year, is now making itself felt. Our guests have been nurses, two of whom went through the Pearl Harbor horror; wives and widows of men in the service; more of the older women who must earn their living; fewer of the younger; lack of hospital space sending us women really needing medical care and not quite ready for our type of service—all this creating a new phase in Cottage life.

Very few of them fail to respond to its benign influence and the kindly ministrations of Mrs. Lush. It is fine to see how quickly most of the girls adjust themselves to the Cottage plan, how they help restore the morale of the saddened, care for the more helpless ones, some of whom, incredible as it may seem, are having their first experience in the art of simple and gracious living.

Our requirements for entry may seem severe as they shut out those who are not employed or can afford to pay elsewhere. The Cottage could easily be filled with elderly women whose families are seeking care for them.

But the ideal for Rest Cottage is rehabilitation, and it is a happy moment when we can speed a parting guest who has recovered her physical strength and mental poise and send her on her way renewed and eager to do her share of the world's work, grateful to the women of Ebells whose altruism has recognized and met the need for just such a service.

RESOLUTIONS

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of the Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise

FOR BENEFIT OF EBELL REST COTTAGE

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage _____ dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows: _____"

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

SECTION 41 OF THE PROBATE CODE

Restrictions

No estate, real or personal, may be bequeathed or devised to any charitable or benevolent society or corporation, or to any person or persons in trust for charitable uses, by a testator who leaves a spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor surviving him who, under the will, or the laws of succession would otherwise have taken the property so bequeathed or devised unless the will was duly executed at least thirty days before the death of the testator. If so executed at least thirty days before death, such devises and legacies shall be valid, but they may not collectively exceed one-third of the testator's estate as against his spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor, who would otherwise, as aforesaid, have taken the excess over one-third, and if they do a pro rata deduction from such devises and legacies shall be made so as to reduce the aggregate thereof to one-third of the estate. All property bequeathed or devised contrary to the provisions of this section shall go to the spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor of the testator, if and to the extent that they would have taken said property as aforesaid but for such devises or legacies; otherwise the testator's estate shall go in accordance with his will and such devises and legacies shall be unaffected.

BY-LAWS OF EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. The three directors who are elected from Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be chairmen, respectively, of Finance, House and Garden.

Section 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except those members otherwise provided for, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

Section 3. The Chairman of Finance shall head a committee composed of the President, Chairman of Finance and the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles, and the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. This Finance Committee shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Association.

The Chairman of Finance and the Chairman of Rest Cottage shall be assisted by an advisory committee of three investment counselors who shall advise as to the investment of all Endowment Funds, together with such other moneys as may be available for investment. The Finance Chairman shall bring to the Finance and Executive Committees meeting together the recommendations of these advisors for approval. Upon approval by a majority of said committees of a recommended investment the Chairman of Finance shall be empowered to make such transactions. The Chairman of Finance shall verify the monthly financial reports of the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Section 4. The House Chairman shall have charge of all replacements and repairs at Ebell Rest Cottage, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Garden Chairman shall have supervision of the planting and upkeep of the garden, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all standing committees. She shall appoint all special committees and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall receive from the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles all moneys due and contributed to the Association, together with a statement showing the accounts for which such moneys have been contributed and shall give a receipt for same. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and she shall be bonded as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be

1. Finance
2. Membership
3. Investigation
4. Service
5. Follow-up
6. Program
7. Hospitality
8. Field Survey

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

Section 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

Section 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

Section 4. A payment of One Hundred Dollars may be made by any person for a life membership or a memorial gift.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month, except the month of August, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the months of August and September, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Monday in June, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

Section 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Section 2. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Section 3. The members of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President, Treasurer and Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be divided into two groups of three members each. Group Number One shall consist of two directors and the Treasurer to be elected at the annual elections in even numbered years for a term of two years. Group Number Two shall consist of one director, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary to be elected at the annual elections in the odd numbered years for a term of two years. At any election a member may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 4. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

Section 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

REPORT OF EBELL JUNIORS

1942-1943

On Friday, October 2, 1942, our Club season opened with a combined party given for prospective members and our regular monthly Dessert-Bridge benefit, at the home of our advisor, Mrs. A. Bartlett Ross. Our total membership for the year was 110 members. The Membership Chairman, Mrs. Wixon Stevens, assisted by the Credentials Chairman, Miss Lillian Sloan, welcomed into the group twenty new members.

During the summer we carried on numerous activities. The Sports Chairman, Mrs. Douglas E. Martin, arranged for our members to meet every Wednesday at the Jonathan Beach Club, through the courtesy of Mrs. Buford Helferich. The Social Welfare Chairman, Miss Grace E. Milliron, held a monthly meeting during the summer for her committee members, who produced toys for convalescent children and a few pillows for Ebell Rest Cottage.

The seven monthly business and program meetings have been held in the Solarium, following the luncheons planned by the Chairman, Mrs. John Combs. Mrs. Horace I. Proulx, Jr., assisted by Mrs. Jack Boden Rogers, has been in charge of the sale of tickets. The lovely decorations were arranged at little expense by Mrs. W. P. Johnson. Programs, under the direction of the Chairman, Mrs. Carlos R. Mangham, were: In October, Fashion Show in the Patio by Phelps-Telkel, Mrs. Milligan, fashion advisor, commenting; a talk on Red Cross activities by Mrs. Lyman Johnson and on the Community Chest by Mrs. A. Bartlett Ross. In November, Mrs. Henry Lee told of "The Most Famous Piece of Jade in the World" and Mr. Maurice Lui, Chinese Chancellor, told of his experiences during a recent trip to China. In January, Mrs. Akeley Quiek, from the Speakers Bureau, gave information on wartime jobs available for women, and Mr. Carroll Righter, astrologist, gave his predictions for the future. In February, Mrs. Elmer Belt, a United States Representative, asked for aid; Miss Ann Sumners, a past Ebell Junior President, and Miss Hansena Frederickson showed photographs, accompanied by a commentary, on their recent trip to Mexico. In March, Ensign Stribling of the WAVES and Lt. Towery of the WAACS described activities of their respective Services, and Dr. Frederick Woellner of U.C.L.A. Psychology Department gave a talk entitled, "Your Bombshelter Is Under Your Hat." In April, Mrs. Mansvach, Girl Scout representative, spoke of that group's activities; Mr. Lloyd Casper, from the California Institute of Technology, gave practical suggestions for Victory gardens; Mrs. Katherine Pelty, instructor of floral decoration, showed slides of flower arrangements adapted to

watime limitations. In May, our traditional Mothers-and-Daughters Luncheon was held, at which Mrs. J. C. Duffendack, Jr., gave a piano recital, Mrs. H. Britton Logan, Jr., a book review; Mrs. Theodore Blakeslee, member of Opera Reading Club Juniors, sang, accompanied by another member, Mrs. Champ Reese. In June, our traditional Installation Luncheon was held in the dining room, the ceremony being followed by bridge.

Our two main philanthropic projects for the year were: Ebell Rest Cottage and the Children's Hospital. We gave \$15 monthly to each project. In the summer, we gave a \$25 Campership to the Girl Scouts, and this June we gave \$25 to the Ebell Associates.

In order to raise money for our charities, we gave two major benefits under the leadership of our Chairman, Mrs. Calvin T. Owens. In January, we netted \$95.73. In April, Mr. Boyd Comstock spoke in the Fine Arts Room on wartime conditions within Italy, netting us \$194.80.

A series of pot-luck dinners were introduced which were held monthly, beginning in November and carrying through June. All but the last meeting, which was held in the home of Mrs. William McGee, were held in the Playhouse of our advisor, Mrs. James Sweetzer Lawshé. We each contributed towards the food, purchased a ticket, played bridge, and not only became better acquainted but also netted \$89.40. These dinners were so successful that plans were made to continue them throughout the summer. Our Dessert-Bridge Benefits, held at members' homes, under the supervision of the Chairman, Mrs. George Edward Hoedinghaus, netted us \$45.30. The receipts for all of the benefits totaled \$425.23.

Book Chamber Section and Music Department were again combined this year, meeting at members' homes with programs following dessert. Book reviews were given by members. Among the Musical Programs were the following: Miss Robert Poxon, soprano; Elizabeth Dobbins, pianist; members of Opera Reading Club Juniors, and a piano recital by the Ebell President, Mrs. Norman Branch.

The Community Chest Committee, under our Chairman, Mrs. Victor H. Kendrick, obtained \$427.70.

Our National Defense Chairman, Mrs. Allan L. Leonard, Jr., had two committees working throughout the year. The Canteen Committee, under the Chairmanship of Mrs. Alton B. Garrett, provided doughnuts and volunteer workers for the Army Induction Center Canteen at Fourth and Main on the third Thursday of each month. In October, we added a second day, the first Monday of each month, which brought our monthly expenditure to an average of \$5.00. We maintained the Canteen throughout the summer of 1942.

The Ebell Juniors, under Mrs. Calvin T. Owens, who was ap-

pointed to the office of Third Vice-President when Miss Grace E. Milliron resigned, changed the Social Welfare Department to the Production Unit under the Red Cross. We worked under Mrs. Robert H. Bacon, Chairman of the Ebell Production Unit, on the fourth Fridays, in the Solarium. We purchased material and made twenty-four dresses and slips for a layette.

Our Publicity Chairman, Mrs. Horace I. Proulx, Jr., procured many fine pictures and articles about our activities.

Ye Belles, Ebell Juniors' own monthly publication, was edited by Mrs. Webb J. Thomas. The Telephone Committee and Junior Directory Chairman was Mrs. Downie Davidson Muir III.

We have found that, in wartime, social functions in which members may become better acquainted help greatly in keeping the group a unified whole.

Changes in our policies, due to war conditions, were found to be necessary. A Corresponding Secretary was added to our Board of Officers. The Chairmen, and even the Officers, have had to be changed with sometimes alarming rapidity as husbands were called away to other parts of the country or members went into war industries. The members who took over difficult tasks in mid-stream did splendid work, many doubling without complaint. A year which could have been difficult under present wartime conditions has been made one of lasting pleasure through their loyalty and dependability.

BY-LAWS OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

Section 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebells Bulletin all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

Section 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.

Section 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Juniors not otherwise provided for and shall issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor, and she shall sign all vouchers for expenditures. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
2. Courtesy and Membership
3. Credentials
4. Program
5. Social Welfare and Scholarship
6. Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

Section 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Chairman of Ebells Scholarships, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors. The chairman of this Committee shall ex-officio be a member of the Scholarship Committee of the Club.

Section 6. Chairmen of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Section 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

Section 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebells and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years.

Section 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation, and if favorably acted upon by the Board of Governors, shall then follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Section 3. Each member of the Ebells Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebells upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebells without further registration fee.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebells.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees, but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

The regular meetings of the Ebells Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. All departments of Ebells shall be open to Ebells Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

Section 3. Ebells Juniors may have the privilege of attending all regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

Nominations

Section 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebells Bulletin.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

Section 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall then be called for. Names of all nominees shall be published in the Ebells Bulletin.

Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member

shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Adviser on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first, provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together during the months of May and June for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

**Second*—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted, is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A.D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed

to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The Officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section I. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times

be under the control of the Board.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

Section 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any person serving more than one-half of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

Section 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

Section 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees, including the Presentation Committee, and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers, but in her absence or disability, the First Vice-President shall sign such checks, contracts, and other legal papers. The President shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may desire. In the absence or disability of the President, she shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly statement of all receipts and expenditures to the Board of Directors and a semi-annual report to the Club. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

Section 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club, and unless otherwise provided for in these By-Laws, over all committees of the Club having power to receive and disburse moneys. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

Section 8. The Chairman of Hospitality shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees.

Section 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations, and report to the Board of Directors from time to time the activities of such organizations.

Section 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval.

Section 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

Section 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the

Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer, giving her a statement designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Chairman of Rentals and all other directors in charge of the business of the Club. She shall be custodian of the seal, the books, and records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club, and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer for the faithful performance of her duties.

ARTICLE VI

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
2. Former Officers' Round Table
3. Departments
4. Finance
5. Hospitality
6. House
7. Membership
8. Printing
9. Program
10. Public Relations
11. Rentals
12. Rest Cottage
13. Scholarship
14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.

Section 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.

Section 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Hospitality Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

Section 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall supervise the building and its contents.

Section 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

Section 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Bulletin and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

Section 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering. It shall keep in touch with and report the activities of all organizations in which Ebell holds membership and assists financially.

Section 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

Section 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

Section 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

Section 15. Chairmen of committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VII

MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Com-

mitte for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the applicant for a period of _____ (State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than five applications for regular membership, five for temporary membership, and five for Junior membership during each year.

Section 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

Section 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management. Regular members include those members specified in Sections 4 and 5 of Article VIII.

Section 5. Any member may apply for life membership who has continued in good and regular standing for five consecutive years next preceding the filing of the application for life membership. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in Article VII, Section 1. If the application is granted, the applicant shall pay the sum of \$500.00 provided she is under fifty (50) years of age, otherwise \$300.00.

She shall receive a certificate of life membership and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership, without payment of dues.

Section 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

Section 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

Section 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a nonmember for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

Section 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend all Monday programs each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed in any subsequent year,

provided the applicant is still a temporary resident. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

Section 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one-half of the regular admission fee, or one-half of the dues accrued during the time of nonmembership.

Section 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The payment of this fee may be suspended for a stated time at any regular meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote, provided due notice of the proposed suspension has been given.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first, and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A regular member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She

shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 5. A regular member of the Club whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX

MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June, inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

Section 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any

business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meetings and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two years and shall be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. No member shall be eligible to election to the office of President who has not served on the Board of Directors for at least two years.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, General Curator, and Chairman of Hospitality. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Chairman of Finance, Chairman of Rentals, Chairman of Public Relations, Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

Nominations

Section 3. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members, who shall have been active members of the Club for five years. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in January for the purpose of electing a chairman and a secretary. Meetings thereafter shall be held at the discretion of the committee.

The Nominating Committee by a two-thirds vote of its members shall select one or more candidates, who shall consent to serve if elected, for each office to be filled at the annual election, and shall post these names on the bulletin board on April 1 or immediately thereafter.

Section 5. Not later than April 1 of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for each office to be filled at the ensuing election.

Each voting member may fill out such a blank with the name of not more than one member for each office. This ballot so filled out shall be sealed in a plain envelope, enclosed in a second envelope upon which is written the name of the voting member as it appears in the Year Book, and mailed to the chairman of the Nominating Committee at the Ebell office before April 21. When received, the office secretary shall check the name and, if the member is in good standing, shall open and discard the outside envelope and deposit the sealed envelope in the ballot box.

Section 6. On April 21, or immediately thereafter, the Nominating Committee shall meet, count the nominating ballots and prepare the ballot for the annual election. This ballot shall contain the names of the candidates presented by the Nominating Committee and the name of each candidate receiving fifty (50) or more votes for one office on the nominating ballot, or a combined vote of seventy-five (75) or more votes, the office in this case to be the one for which she received the largest vote. The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the election ballot.

Section 7. On the second Monday in May the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

Section 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

Section 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between May first and May fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received *before* the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the names of those candidates receiving a plurality vote. A full report of the number of votes cast for each candidate shall be filed in the office of the Club and shall be available to any member.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary, who shall destroy them after installation of new officers.

Section 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

ARTICLE XI

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) and Ebell Juniors.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII

CLUB POLICIES

Section 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

Section 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

ARTICLE XIII**AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to be voted upon and the date of such voting. At the regular Monday meeting preceding the date of voting, the section or sections to be amended shall be read and the proposed amendment or amendments shall be read and explained.

Section 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV**PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY**

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by *Robert's Rules of Order Revised*, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV**CHARTER DAY**

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

* * *

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club;

and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1943. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

STANDING RULES

ADMISSION

1. Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
2. Regular members may bring three guests to all but special programs, by paying the stipulated fee plus tax.
3. Junior members will receive six guest cards for departments of Ebell, one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
4. Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive six guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
5. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.
6. Husbands of club members may be admitted to all department meetings on members' calling cards.
7. Husbands of club members may be admitted on members' calling cards to all except special Monday programs. These cards must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.
8. Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.
9. All courtesy admission cards for Monday afternoons must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

1. Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.
2. New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from January first and July first, respectively.
3. Applications for either non-resident or business rates should be presented before October first for the ensuing year or before March first for the last half of the year.
4. Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

SOLICITATIONS

1. Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.
2. No solicitation of signatures to petitions, memorials or similar documents shall be permitted in the clubhouse.
3. No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and the Board of Directors; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.
4. Members may not solicit gifts, commissions or favors from merchants or commercial concerns of any kind.
5. Members may not sell tickets for outside events in the club rooms.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Curators, committee chairmen and others arranging for called meetings in the club shall notify the office, stating the time and place of meeting.
2. Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.
3. A member may not represent Ebell on any outside committee unless so appointed by the President or Board of Directors.
4. No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Lounge, except to the Reception Committee and for major benefits within a designated area.
5. It is a rule of the Club that there shall be no tipping.

LUNCHEON AND DINNER TICKETS

1. In order to assist and cooperate with the House Committee, and because of possible shortage of food and help, all meals will be served buffet.
2. Tickets will be sold for all regular meals. Others will use the check-in committee services.
3. Regular meals are: President's Luncheons, Assembly Dinners, and Book Chamber Department. All other meals will be served a la carte.
4. Reservations for all regular meals should be made two days in advance. If reservations are not cancelled, members ordering them will be responsible for payment.
5. Cancellations for luncheon reservations will not be accepted after ten o'clock of the day.
6. Cancellations for dinner reservations will not be accepted after twelve o'clock of the preceding day.
7. Reservations for Monday luncheons should be in on Friday.

STANDING RULES GOVERNING THE ART SALON

The Art Exhibitions Committee of Ebell was organized in 1916. Its name was changed to The Art Salon in 1931. Its purpose (so recorded in the minutes of the Board of Directors) is to exhibit the work of professional artists of high standing in *conservative art*. All work accepted for exhibition must conform to that standard.

Before any art object shall be exhibited in the Club, the exhibitor shall sign a written lease waiving any claim against the Club on account of damage, theft, or other loss of art object. (Adopted by Board of Directors in 1939.)

A written order must be issued by the Art Chairman and presented at the club office before any art object may be removed.

All art objects must be removed from the clubhouse within thirty days after the exhibition.

Exhibitions of the work of outstanding painters, sculptors and miniature painters are held from October first through May in the Salon, water colors and prints in the Galeria.

The May exhibition is always competitive and prizes are given for the best work in each medium.

Competing artists may be invited by the Art Chairman or a general invitation may be sent out by the Chairman to all artists. In either case

their work must pass a Jury of Selection and Awards appointed by the Chairman.

Dues shall be paid by the Art Patrons and shall be used by the Art Salon to pay for overhead expenses, for transportation of the exhibitions and for prizes additional to those given annually by interested Art Patrons. A prize is also given for the popular-vote choice of the Ebell members. It is the consensus of opinion that these prizes shall be of sufficient value to make them a worth-while honor.

All money collected by the Art Salon shall be paid at once to the Financial Secretary of Ebell and a receipt required therefor.

In June the Galeria is given over to the exhibition of the work of the artist members of Ebell, each member exhibiting not more than one in each medium.

The May exhibition in the Salon is usually held over, in whole or in part, through the month of June.

It is customary for the Art Patrons to hold an evening reception during the month of October, honoring exhibiting artists, and an artists' dinner in May, when the prize winners are announced.

The Art Chairman and her Committee shall serve one year. On retirement she shall pass on all papers and records to her successor in office.

There shall be four formal business meetings during the club year.

The Art Salon shall be under the direct control and supervision of the President of Ebell.
