


Admission to all meetings shall be by card of the current term only.

President's Report

-06

HIS is an important date in the annals of the Club—
the end of its twenty-fifth year—a quarter of a century
in which constant thought, united effort and purpose
have made the aspirations and sentiments of Ebell's
founders, the promise and hope of its beginning, a glad reality.

Thirteen Presidents, with able Directors and faithful, devoted Executive Committees, have presided over its destiny; and I would that space permitted me to call the splendid roll of these, who have been wise in counsel, rich in hope, firm in command, intrepid in deed, and consecrated in service; truly an heroic group, who have made a place for Ebell unrivalled in the Club world of today.

As the reports show, the Programs and Departments have maintained the excellence of other years, and some unusual features have been added.

First, a reception to Secretary and Mrs. Daniels and the officers of the Pacific Fleet. Secretary and Mrs. Daniels and Mayor Snyder made interesting speeches on the importance and significance of having for the first time the Pacific Coast defences guarded by ships of the Navy. This reception was programmed as one of the official entertainments of the city; and in addition to this, Ebell was the only Woman's Club that contributed to the city's fund for its celebration and welcome to the fleet.

Then there was an evening meeting in April to honor Shake-speare's birthday. The gifted and beloved actor, Mr. Frederick Warde, gave a most eloquent and illuminating lecture on "Shakespeare and His Plays." It is hoped that the Club will make this an annual feast.

Later, Mrs. Minnie Maddern Fiske, dear to the hearts of all lovers of the drama, was the inspiration for a reception and tea. She spoke with great charm and feeling of some of her humanitarian ideals.

The guest luncheons have proven most attractive, and among the distinguished visitors bringing messages from all parts of the world were Mr. L. N. Brunswig with Canon Gibbs B. Canabel of the Cathedral of Montpelier, France, who served as Chaplain of the Blue Devils; Hon. Sheridan Bickers of London, who was returning after two years' service in Russia; Miss Laura G. Beecroft of Jerusalem; Mrs. T. R. N. Cama, a Parsee, of Poona, India; Mr. Raymond Blathwayt, literary and dramatic critic of London; and from the same English metropolis came Capt. Harry de Wendt, author and traveler; Col. Jack Rose of New York, National Chairman of the National Guard, with the message of that organization. Dr. R. B. von Kleinsmid, President of the University of Arizona, and Miss Helen Taft, Acting President of Bryn Mawr, gave timely talks on education. Dr. Aurelia Reinhart, President of Mills College, was a delightful speaker, and Madame Baronovsky of Russia proved most charming in her dramatic stories of her own land. Senator Robert N. Owen, accompanied by Mrs. Owen, gave an earnest plea for some needed legislation.

The exhibition of pictures, each week, secured by the Art Exhibits Committee, Mrs. William S. Bullis, Chairman, has lent interest and beauty to the Auditorium.

One of the unusual attractions brought to light was the display of the rare old laces of Mrs. Cameron Shute of London, pronounced by connoisseurs the largest and finest collection in the world.

The Honor Roll Book of the Club has been completed and presented. It bears the name and service of those who went from the homes and hearts of Ebell to the great World War.

Mrs. A. B. Cooke, Chairman of the War Service Memorial, is busy with plans for a fountain for the patio, that shall further honor and perpetuate the memory of these soldiers.

At the request of Mr. Perry for a history of Ebell for the City Library, the Directors of the Club asked Miss Mattie H. Wilson (a beloved Charter member, closely identified with every interest of the Club all these years) to write the story of Ebell. Miss Wilson generously performed this task, and copies of it may be found in the Public Library and in the library of the Club. The Club library has been greatly improved and more books added than in any period of its history. Mrs. Parsons and her committee have done faithful and efficient work, and it has been their desire to make the library meet the needs and ideals of the Club.

Ebell has been active in all civic matters, and the President has been called upon to assist on many boards and committees. Notably: the only woman on the Executive Committee of the City Planning Commission; active in securing improved conditions in the City Jail; attended meetings of the League of

the Southwest, with its great reclamation project; asked by Supervisors to view the devastation caused by forest fires, and to assist in replanting of trees; invited with a Committee of Ten by Governor Wm. D. Stephens to discuss the special call of the State Legislature to ratify the Federal Amendment for Woman's Suffrage, and gave time and attention to many other calls that cannot be noted here.

The reports of the Treasurer, Mrs. Lewis Clark Carlisle, and the Chairman of Social Service, Mrs. C. N. Flint, show the generous hand of Ebell. It has aided every worthy cause and assisted in every reconstructive call at home and abroad; but the social service efforts of Ebell in the future will find expression in Rest Cottage, and the educational fund—the Scholarship. Full records of this work will be found in the reports of the Chairmen of these two committees, Mrs. William Read and Mrs. Ilot Johnson. Liberal contributions, and a genuine interest in the worth and work of Rest Cottage, give the "blessed assurance" of a new building in the very near future.

The Scholarship has become a vital part of the Club work this year—the foundation of a very definite and a very fine plan to give opportunity to worthy young people who desire and need it. Surely there can be no higher aim than this,—and this is but the beginning, the cornerstone on which is to be built a better and a finer citizenship, and in which all the members of Ebell can aid.

The most important event of the year was the purchase of the lot (89½ x 187 feet) on the corner of Figueroa and Eighteenth Streets, for \$50,000.00, and for which the Club has been offered \$80,000.00. This speaks in no uncertain tones of the wisdom of this addition to the Club's holdings. The ground has been leased and is being laid out as a beautiful garden, which adds greatly to the attractiveness of the Club House. To pay for this property means sacrifice and economy, for a few years at least, but the vision of the women of Ebell has always been broad and true, their generosity and loyalty have never failed, and they will respond to this demand.

May I not add just one personal word as I resign my cherished charge to the able guardianship of my successor, Mrs. Toll. First, I would express my thanks now and ever more for your courtesy, kindness, helpfulness and encouragement at all times. Whatever of success there has been in the Club the past two years, you were the cause and inspiration of it all. Last, I would urge upon each one of you, your individual responsible.

sibility to your Club. If each of you do your part, our lot will be paid for this next year, and I am sure that this combined effort for our Club, for its present necessities, and its future development as a vital factor in our greater city, will be a bond that shall unite us more closely than ever. It may mean self-denial and work, but may it also be to each of us "the further seal of mental comradeship, the earnest of larger joys, and a lift to higher levels."

Report of the Recording Secretary

HE year 1919-20 will go down in the annals of history as the period of greatest unrest the world has ever known; the aftermath of four years of war has been strikes and labor agitation of every sort; to keep abreast of the times and to do the wise thing has been no easy task; to be progressive and yet not be radical; to reach out a helping hand to our less prosperous brother, and yet care for our own, has been Ebell's constant endeavor. Looking ever upward and onward, Ebell has passed another milestone, and forged another link in the chain of progression that has ever marked her growth.

Under the skillful leadership of our President, Mrs. Matthew Robertson, Ebell has occupied a prominent place in the civic life of the community, coöperating with the Chamber of Commerce and the Municipal League in all movements for the betterment of public welfare.

In August, during the vacation period, Ebell threw open her doors and entertained in honor of Mrs. Daniels, the wife of the Secretary of the Navy, and the visiting ladies of the Pacific squadron of the fleet.

On October 27th, Ebell paid tribute to her charter members, whose far-seeing effort and wise endeavor paved the way for the great organization that now bears the name Ebell.

April 23rd, Ebell inaugurated her first Shakespearian Commemoration program. The presence of Mr. Frederick Warde, the eminent Shakespearian actor, as speaker of the evening, combined with the large and cultured audience, composed of many prominent in club and literary world, made this a notable

On June 4th, Ebell was again hostess, honoring the great actress. Mrs. Minnie Maddern Fiske, with a reception.

The Monday meetings have presented diversified programs that have always sustained the high standard of excellence Ebell prides herself upon maintaining; no easy task in these days of inflated prices and doubtful propaganda.

Mrs. Jav B. Millard, as Chairman of program, has been indefatigable in securing speakers and artists of note, and many world-famous personages have appeared upon Ebell's platform the past year. We have sipped the honey from the dew, carried upon the wings of enchantment, as we have listened to such singers as Lawrence Strauss, Estelle Heartt-Dreyfus, Mme. Clara Pasvolsky, Signor Companio, Maurine Dyer and Poyl Bjornskjold; we have wandered in Elysian fields as Mme. Petschnikoff, Anne Thompson, Mme, Roumanova, Olga Steeb. Mrs. Simonsen, the Zoellner Quartette, Gertrude Ross and many others have charmed our souls by their magic fingers. East and West, North and South, England, France, Russia, Italy, Persia, Chaldea, India and China, as well as our own country, have given of their store in the lecture field.

From these aeroplanes of lofty intellect we have viewed the mingling of colors and music in modern painting; imbibed the wisdom of Persian ancients; heard the call of desolate France and the plans of Miss Anne Morgan for its relief; listened to the horror of Bolshevik-ridden Russia; culled the gems of literature with Hugh Walpole; Granville Barker and Coningsby Dawson have magnetized us with their plans for reconstruction; we have bridged the chasm between the mystic poetry of Yeats and Kreymborg's free verse; viewed the movies through the dispassionate eyes of Dr. Burton, and come safely to land again from Paris to New York with Captain de Wendt.

Two Ebell programs were given by past Presidents of the Club, Mrs. Robert Burdette speaking upon "World Citizenship" and Mrs. W. S. Bartlett upon "The Democracy of the

At Christmas time, Ebell was hostess to the children of the Club.

Two dramatic programs have been staged during the year, their effectiveness much enhanced by the beautiful new stage curtains and the newly installed lighting system.

Ebell has welcomed to her platform Captain Henri de Negre, of the French High Commission; Mr. Waddia, a Parsee from India: Miss Mary Conan Doyle, daughter of the famous author: Miss Emily Morrison, from Sleigleton Farms, the celebrated reform school of Pennsylvania: Mrs. George Black, wife of the Commissioner of the Yukon: Carrie Iacobs Bond and many others.

Two exhibits of unusual quality added to the pleasure of Ebell's programs; one a very rare collection of laces loaned by Mrs. Cameron Shute; the other an exhibition of the "Paintings of the Orient," rare Oriental rugs, forming the background for an unusually artistic program on June 21st.

The following resolutions have been endorsed during the vear: October 6th—An amendment to the By-Laws. December 15th—Endorsing the creating of a Federal Commission to investigate the needs of the California Indians; a Resolution asking the County Supervisors to take action for flood control by planting young trees in the area devastated by recent forest fires; a Resolution asking the State Highway Commission to finish the highways leading to the boundaries of the State. March 1st-An Amendment to the By-Laws. April 26th—A Resolution advocating the establishment of a municipal farm. May 10th—A Resolution endorsing the Shepley-Towner Bill, creating a bureau for maternal and infant hygiene; a Resolution advocating an increase in teachers' salaries.

"Incentives come from the soul's self." The soul of Ebell through years of fruitful endeavor has expanded with that breadth of vision and forgetfulness of self that is the heritage of all who serve humanity.

Report of the General Curator

NOTHER milestone has been passed in Ebell's history. and a report of the Department work of 1919-20 records thirteen departments, with total attendance of 9085; 696 members were enrolled, and 1012 guests attended the 195 meetings.

Following is a brief resume of the work of the departments in rotation, according to the days of the week.

The Browning Section, Mrs. Edward Crumley, Curator, studied poems illustrative of the two dominating principles of Browning's art: the progress of the soul through effort, and the infinite issues latent in commonplace affairs. Half the year's study was devoted to "Paracelsus" and "La Saisiaz." Besides excellent work of members, an interesting lecture on "The Poetic Beauty of Paracelsus" was given by Professor Paul Spencer Wood of the University of Southern California. The closing meeting of the year was an "Afternoon" complimentary to the Section given at the home of Miss Florence Riley, Assistant Curator.

The Parliamentary Law Department under the leadership of Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, Curator and Instructor, had a successful and interesting year's work, marked by increased and prompt attendance, and earnest, enthusiastic study. The course included not only the right thing to say at the right time, but why it should be said, thus making for intelligent use of all motions.

The Choral Department, Mrs. B. F. Nance, Curator, Mrs. Abbie Norton-Jamison, Director, Mrs. Mamie Ashley Franklin, Accompanist, has been conducted along the lines of a study section, with special reference to improvement in sight-singing, and some of the principles underlying the fundamentals of music; the class slogan being, "An open mind, an open ear and an open throat." Twenty-three new songs by American composers were studied; and thirty-two meetings were held, attesting the interest and diligence of the members.

The Emerson Section with Mrs. Emerson Clyde Gates, Curator, read the following essays: "Poetry and Imagination," "Social Aims," "Eloquence," "Resources," and "The Comic," supplemented by many of the poems elucidating the thoughts of the essays. Many interesting and worth-while papers were given by members on subjects pertaining to Emerson's life, friends and neighbors, and the influences molding his thought. A comprehensive paper on the Chinese philosopher, "Laotzu," was given by Professor William H. Knight; and at the last meeting of the year, Dr. E. Stanton Hodgin presented a scholarly address entitled "The Re-discovery of America."

Unusual interest and large attendance has marked the meetings of the English Section under Mrs. Laura P. Joyce, Curator. Mrs. Harry Purdon, Instructor, during October and November, brought many new words to the attention of the class. In January Mrs. Purdon found it necessary to resign; and Mrs. Ilot Johnson assumed Instructorship, taking charge of the vocabulary work of the class, assisted by Miss Anne Smith, ortho-

epist; Mrs. Charles Burt directing the grammatical construction and choice of diction. The class sincerely regretted the resignation of Mrs. Frederick Beau de Zart, for three years the efficient Secretary of the Section. Miss Mildred Gray Bulfinch was appointed in her place, and has proven a worthy successor.

The Shakespearian Department, with Mrs. Edward A. Tufts and Mrs. Thomas R. Coles, Curators, spent an interesting year in the study of "Cymbeline," "King Lear" and "The Winter's Tale." A delightful and profitable part of the year's work was three interpretative lectures given by Miss Helen A. Brooks of the Cumnock School of Expression.

The Spanish Section, Mrs. Charles Burt, Curator, enjoyed a very profitable year under the direction of Señora Aurelia Borquez and Señora Claudina Alvarez. There were three classes. The books studied were "Spanish Conversations" (Borquez), Spanish Reader and Grammar (De Vitis) and "Fortuna" (Escrich).

The lecture given by Miss M. Winifred Rouzee on "The Bible and World Events,—Past, Present and Future," aroused such interest that the Bible Department was revivified and formally opened March 10th, with Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator, and Miss Rouzee, Lecturer. Six addresses were given by this devoted scholar on the "Inspiration of the Scriptures"; giving the testimony of archaeology, as preserved in the British museum, the fulfilled prophecies, the corroboration of the highest science, the witness of the stars to inspiration, and the evidence of statesmen, business and professional men; all attesting proof of the authenticity and truth of the Bible.

The Social Science Department under the leadership of the Acting Curator, Mrs. Loren Crenshaw—the Curator, Mrs. A. D. Jack, being indefinitely out of the city,—held six regular meetings, at which book reviews, papers and addresses treating of world events, phases of national and community life from the sociological standpoint were given by competent speakers. Among these were William Roscoe Thayer's "Democracy, Discipline and Peace," and Basil King's "City of Comrades," reviewed respectively by Miss Gertrude Darlow and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt; a paper, "In Wisdom's Way," by Mrs. Charles H. Toll: a talk on the "Relation of the Women's Council of Community Service to Other Social Agencies," by Mrs. J. T. Anderson; an address by Mrs. Susan M. Dorsey, Superintendent of Public Schools. Sharing the time with the Social Service Department, Mrs. William Read, Chairman, more than filled the hour from ten to eleven with reports from the Social Service and

Rest Cottage Committees, and discussion of topics germane to the same. The meetings were followed by Special Guest Luncheons, details of which appear in the President's report.

The Art and Travel Section, Mrs. William S. Bullis, Curator, enjoyed a varied program, travelling first to Constantinople, where an intimate glimpse of the lives of Turkish women was given by Mrs. Desborough, who resided for years in the home of a Turkish princess; from there a delightful trip around the Grecian Archipelago with Mrs. W. S. Bartlett; then on to our native land, visiting Alaska and the great northwest with Mrs. Charles N. Flint; in imagination, to far Ceylon, enjoying not only the history but the beautiful views of the buried cities, presented by Mrs. J. W. Hendricks.

The Art programs consisted of "Sir Joshua Reynolds and His Connection With Early American Art," by Miss Virginia Graeff; a lecture on "Interior Decoration," by Miss Caroline Wood; a comprehensive and instructive lecture on the "Art of Etching," by Mr. John W. Cotton. Mr. C. P. Townsley's lecture on Art, in April, was unfortunately omitted. The Department adjourned in respect to the memory of Mr. Daggett, late Curator of the Art Gallery at Exposition Park, whose obsequies were held that morning.

The Book and Current Literature Section, Mrs. Sidney J. Parsons, Curator, held seven meetings, two of which were devoted to Current Periodicals with Miss de Laguna, leader; a resume of the latest and best articles on Religion, Drama, Art, Philosophy and Sociology being given. The following books were reviewed: Johan Bojer's "Great Hunger," H. G. Wells' "Joan and Peter," "Soul of a Bishop" and "The Undying Fire"; Hugh Walpole's "Secret City," Ernest Poole's "The Village," "The Education of Henry Adams," and Samuel Butler's "Life and Letters," and "The Way of All Flesh." Mrs. Eugene T. Pettigrew gave a half hour to the reading of modern poets at each meeting.

The six meetings of the Drama Section, Miss Alice Louise Jones, Curator, offered a varied choice of subjects, presenting at the first program in October no less an authority than Miss Willamine Wilkes, in a "Survey of the Dramatic World of Today and Tomorrow." In January we were carried back to the beginning of things dramatic, by Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, who gave an illuminating paper on "The Religious Drama," followed by interpretative dances illustrating "The Dance in Religion," by Miss Martha Graham and Miss Nina Byron of the Denishawn School of Dancing; and a reading of Arnold

Bennett's play, "Judith," by Mrs. Gentry L. Hiett. An interesting morning on "The Drama of the American Indian" was given by Mrs. B. W. Starkweather, supplemented by Indian Musical Themes by Mrs. Walter Raymond Gillette. Professor Anthony Faulkner Blanks of the University of Southern California gave in March a scholarly address on "The Function of the Drama in Americanization," followed by an eloquent reading of John Drinkwater's play, "Abraham Lincoln." Mr. Edward Everett Horton brought us down to date with an address on the "Stock Company and the Legitimate Actor." The last program was "The Child and the Theatre," elucidated by Miss Sybil Jones' address, "Play-Houses for Children."

The French Section, with Mrs. Frederick D. Sanborn and Mrs. Joel B. Gwynne, Curators, enjoyed a year of unusual progress under the inspiring and scholarly tutelage of Professor Louis F. D. Briois of the University Extension Course. The members again contributed to the support of the little French orphan. Mrs. Sanborn's resignation in February was reluctantly accepted. Mrs. Joel B. Gwynne graciously and generously assumed the Curatorship for the remainder of the year.

A record of the year's work would not be complete without mention of the enjoyable Department Luncheons, of which there were fourteen. The festal board was graced by the presence and messages of many notable personages in all lines of active thought and work in world affairs.

A luncheon followed each of the seven meetings of the Book Department. Among the guests and speakers entertained were: Mrs. H. W. R. Strong, Miss Nanna With, Journalist of Christiana, Miss Conan Doyle, Pauline Barrington, Mrs. Seiffert, Gene Stratton Porter, Mrs. Cameron Shute of London, Miss Elaine Inescort and Horace Wade.

BELL Rest Cottage, which 18 months ago was considered by some of our Ebell household a doubtful venture, stands today, July 1st, 1920, a justified instrument of Ebell for the helping of a few of the many women who frequently become hopeless invalids for the lack of a brief additional period of care-free convalescence.

For a record of the beginning and the history of the Rest Cottage Association, reference is made to the report of the first Chairman of the Association, now retiring, as found in the 1919-1920 Year Book.

A "Drive" during October, November and December of 1919, as reported by Mrs. W. A. Moses, Chairman, resulted in membership of 319 by December 30th. The present total is 345; this includes Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life members, of which last there are 12—Mrs. Sloan-Orcutt, Mrs. Ralph W. Avery, Mrs. E. M. Sloan, Mrs. Wm. B. Webb, Mrs. R. T. Burge, Mrs. Aurelia B. Ferguson, Mrs. R. B. Williamson, Mrs. Wm. T. Lewis, Mrs. Robert L. Gifford, Mrs. E. W. Moses, Mrs. Wm. A. Moses and Mrs. Benjamin F. Perkins.

Mrs. Edward C. Magauran, Chairman of House and Grounds, reports a total expenditure for the year of \$142.46. This includes all in and out-door furnishings, and the labor and service therewith connected. A new bath tub and a beautiful Victrola with many fine records, the gifts respectively of Mrs. W. K. Parkinson and Mrs. Cummins B. Jones, are valued contributions to the comfort and pleasure of the dwellers at Rest Cottage. Seventy-one guests have been entertained during 1919-1920.

This report commends the service rendered by the matron, Mrs. J. A. Eby, who seems to have caught the spirit of Ebell's vision and to have put into her service that which is above price. The reports of Chairmen of Investigation, Follow-Up Work, Transportation, Johnson Apartments, Neighborhood Schools and Jail Committees present such an inspiring array of fact and comment, showing the possibilities of willing coöperation in service, that an impossible restraint is necessary to resist

more than this passing mention. But when all the workers met, as they did on each Tuesday throughout the year, in the Sewing Room with Mrs. Gertrude R. Nash, and pooled their assets and resources, planning, delivering, receiving, segregating, cutting, basting, stitching, ripping, packing and storing, each according to her several ability and choice, service found ample reward in interchange of human interest.

The following totals taken from the annual report of the Custodian of the Rest Cottage and Social Service cupboards are most interesting: July 19, 1919, to June 19, 1920, garments distributed: men's, 1805; women's, 2503; boys', 2476; girls', 2325; infants', 2022; total, 11,131. Miscellaneous: household furnishings, 838 articles; pieces of furniture, 121; packages of food, 237; quarts of fruit, 190; glasses of jam and jelly, 230; Christmas gifts, 1309. We submit without comment the eloquent epitome of Mrs. William Irving Hollingsworth's report of the Rest Cottage benefit card party: "Delivered to the Treasurer of the Ebell Club, \$1047.25."

In addition to five meetings of Rest Cottage Association with the Social Science Department, thirteen business meetings of the Rest Cottage Association Executive Committee have been held. Lack of space forbids chronicling interesting details.

The objective sought in this work is a foundation of friendship and mutual understanding and the energizing force, Faith that accepts no defeat and Love that never faileth.

Resolutions Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

-06

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage; and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is unnecessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26th, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Philanthropy of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected whe about the serve for

election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell orials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors

[The EBELL of Los Angeles]

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from sustaining, associate and life members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of sacciation, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise for Benetit of Ebell Rest Cottage

-

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage.......dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows....."

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "and I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the moneys derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own hand writing.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

Articles of Incorporation

-06

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth-That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents. a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Sec. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Sec. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Com-

ARTICLE VI. Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be sub-

ject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

During the month of June the President-elect shall have the authority to prepare a tentative list of all committees for the ensuing year to be presented to the incoming Executive Committee at its first regular

meeting the fourth Thursday in June.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Com-

mittee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee. The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership

- SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.
- SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.
- SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the

Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on De-

During the month of June the General Curator-elect shall prepare a tentative list of the officers of the departments for the ensuing year to be presented to the incoming Executive Committee at its first regular meeting the fourth Thursday in June.

- SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of the Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.
- SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship fund of The Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship Funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.
- SEC. 9. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt.
- Sec. 10. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committees.

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing;
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Departments;
- 5. House Committee.

SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for to the Executive Committee.

- SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.
- SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.
- SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

SECTION 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting, when the applicant shall be voted upon by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board, and, if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card of a current year from a Federated Club may use that card as an endorsement.

- SEC. 2. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election to membership.
- SEC. 3. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 4. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the admission fee and one-half the annual dues.
- SEC. 5. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.

Sec. 7. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

Sec. 8. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members. for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

SEC. 9. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 10. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$10.00, payable in advance; onehalf on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.
- SEC. 3. Members of the Club who are employees, and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted. They shall receive one-half the guest cards allowed regular
- Sec. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their
- Sec. 5. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, pay one-half the yearly dues from date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She

shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

SEC. 6. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (101). (2) The ber of this Club for ten (10) years, shall, propriate the dues remitted.

Sec. 7. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 2. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.

SEC. 8. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.

Sec. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a, m.

Sec. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

Section 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall he posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample hallot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall he placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

"We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF LOS as a nominee for the office of in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES for the term from July 1, 19 . ., to July 1, 19 . .; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office.

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

Sec. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

Sec. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

Sec. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a. m. and three p. m. of the date set; three members of the election board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

ARTICLE XII.

SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

Sec. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

Rule 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the

ARTICLE XV.

SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Sec. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than

ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted shall, when approved by

the Board of Directors, become effectual.

Sec. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX.

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.
