

President's Report

Every club in order to live must grow in the scope of its work. If it stops growing, it stagnates, then dies. Each new administration must bring in new aims, new ideals, new methods. Always these must be in the line of progression, else there is no growth, no life. Every President of a club, be it large or small, is delighted when a chairman brings in a new, workable idea and demonstrates the ability to carry it through. It means growth for the club and development for its members.

During the past year, the Drama Department's use of large numbers of the members in pageants, the new reach of the Drama Workshop, the Solarium teas for sociability, the transformation of the tea-room into an Art Salon for more extensive exhibitions of paintings and sculpture, the use of the banquet hall for the Monday afternoon teas, thus giving increased room for the large Monday crowds, the new Art Patrons Committee, the several new departments and the excellent work being carried on in the existing departments, all show a healthy growth in Ebell.

The Solarium teas inaugurated at the beginning of my regime for promoting hospitality have been so successful that the Chairman, Mrs. George H. Mosher, and her committee have been able to completely equip the Solarium with china, glass and silver for luncheons for two hundred, which number is all that can be accommodated in that lovely room.

The establishment of the Art Salon and the Art Patrons Committee as a sub-committee of the Art Exhibitions Committee has met with wide approval. They have for their purpose the fostering of a keener art appreciation both in the club and in the community. Our beautiful Art Salon is the admiration of artists and art lovers throughout the city, and the paintings assembled each month are master productions of the leading artists from all over the country. A well known art critic says, "Art appreciation in Los Angeles has received a powerful stimulus through the activities of the cultured women of Ebell." The Art Patrons by their subscriptions have borne the expense and made possible the increased scope of the Art Salon. The entire club membership and their friends reap the benefit in the beautiful paintings and sculpture that are exhibited in the Salon from month to month. We are keenly

The innovation of the President's Luncheon on the first Wednesday of the month has proved most popular, from three to four hundred being present at each one. The program was always confined to one speaker, an outstanding one, with a message to deliver for which he was given the full period of time. This was also Drama Day in the morning and Art Salon Day with a gallery talk in the afternoon. At this luncheon the artists whose paintings were exhibited in that month's Salon were guests of honor as were also the members of the Advisory Board who are all National Academicians. In this way the members have been in touch with numbers of the famous artists of the day.

Two other events stand out in my memory, the luncheon in honor of the President of the General Federation, Mrs. John F. Sippel, at which nearly five hundred were present, and the Law Observance Rally, an evening meeting in our theatre. This latter was a public meeting under the joint auspices of Ebell and the Law Observance League.

Our other social activities of the year have been most enjoyable. The four beautiful Benefits parties, two of them evening affairs, engineered by Mrs. Frank Brown Wheat and her assistants and the two lovely parties, one of them evening, sponsored by the Art Patrons under Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher and Mrs. Willitts J. Hole. I mention the evening parties particularly because they gave us the pleasure of having the men of our families with us. That they are interested in the club is evidenced by the gift of Mr. Albert W. True of a beautiful Steinway Grand piano in memory of his wife. I look forward to the time when we shall have our men in Ebell as Associate Members.

Not the least of the pleasures of being President of Ebell is meeting the eminent men and women who come to us from all parts of the world. During the past winter we have had guests from nearly every state in the Union, from Hawaii, the Philippines, Samoa, Japan, China, India, and many parts of Europe and South America.

Another source of great pride to me is the completion and

unveiling of the War Service Memorial Fountain during my administration. This has been re-named the Fountain of Honor. It might be well to give a short account of its history here and call it the report of the War Service Memorial Committee which now goes out of existence, having finished its work.

Just after Armistice Day in 1918, it was my privilege to suggest to the Executive Committee, Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, President, that Ebell erect a suitable Memorial, preferably a wall fountain, to the memory of the Ebell members' sons, husbands and brothers who had given their service to their country during the World War. This suggestion was immediately accepted and a committee appointed with myself as chairman. A sum of money was raised, a sculptor—Julia Bracken Wendt—chosen, who submitted a design for a wall fountain to be placed in the patio of the Figueroa club house. This was accepted by the Committee and the Executive Board.

Several years passed while the sculptor was finishing other commissions. By that time plans were being made for a new club house in another location, and as nothing more had been done on the model, the sculptor was asked to postpone further work until the patio of the new club house would be in shape for measurements to be taken. When that time arrived it was found best to change from a wall fountain design to a central basin. This was done in 1926 at which time the sculptor consented to submit a suitable model in the round instead of the bas-relief which was first accepted and for which she was adequately compensated.

Ill health on her part prevented the submission of such a model and when I became President in 1928-29, none had been submitted. I felt the time had come to push the work to completion and appointed Mrs. Grantland Seaton Long to the chairmanship of the Fountain Committee. She promptly declined, saying she would work with me but that I should be Chairman when the work was finished since I had been such from the beginning. By this time the sculptor had relinquished the commission on account of continued ill health and a new sculptor, Henry Lion, was chosen who immediately submitted a model for the central figure which was accepted unanimously by the Committee and by the Executive Board.

Mrs. Long as acting chairman has given invaluable assistance in bringing about the completion of the Memorial during my administration. She was also chairman of the commit-

tee which planned and carried out the gorgeously beautiful Fountain of Honor Fete—the Parade of all Nations—which marked the unveiling ceremonies. This constituted our annual closing function and will always be remembered as an historic event in Ebell.

The financial side of a big enterprise like Ebell is always most important and I am happy to report that these two years show a successful business administration. Although these two years mark the greatest financial depression this part of the country has known since the World War, we have by the strictest economy on the part of every one handling the budget and by means of the hardest of hard work on the part of the rentals chairmen, Mrs. S. M. Browne and Mrs. James Andrew Rogers, paid \$20,000 on the mortgage (thus reducing it to \$510,000), \$40,079.83 taxes, \$56,344.45 interest, \$27,000 employees, besides all the running expenses of the house, theatre and departments. There are no unpaid bills. We are leaving a cash balance of \$27,194.82 and have further contributed to the smooth running of the next administration an added income of \$25,000.00 increase in dues voted by the club members in March to take effect in October.

Our Figueroa club house was in a very bad state of repair when we left it three years ago. More and more money was required to keep it in condition for renting. Finally in December, 1929, it required more to put it in even partial condition than the yearly rent offered for it. In consequence, on the advice of the President of the bank which holds our mortgage, we wrecked the building and we now receive a fair rent for the land. As soon as real estate values go back to normal we hope to sell at a reasonable figure and apply it on our mortgage.

Our Charter Day Tea was a brilliant affair—a reception for the Charter members, and a very attractive program in the banquet hall.

That we have been interested in public questions is evidenced by the many speakers from various city agencies on the Monday afternoon programs in the business hour, and by the resolutions of one kind and another passed by the club. Of these the most noteworthy are the endorsement of the request to the Regents of the State University to establish graduate work for teachers in the University of California at Los Angeles, the resolution sent to President Hoover endorsing his stand

on law observance and law enforcement and pledging our support, and the resolution sent to the Senate Committee asking them to consider favorably the entrance of the United States into the World Court.

The temptation is great to speak of the many other fine things done by our chairmen and committees but their reports are elsewhere in this book. I have enjoyed my two years as your President. The loyal co-operation of the members of the Executive Board, the chairmen and members of the standing committees, the curators and officers of departments, has made a pleasure of what might have been a task. I extend my sincere appreciation and heartfelt thanks to each and every one of them and to all of the club members and I hope we may continue to work together in the same harmony under each new President in the years to come. Ebell occupies a large place in our lives and it is the club it is because of the loyalty of its members.

Report of the Recording Secretary

The records of the Recording Secretary of the Ebell of Los Angeles show that there have been minutes taken for thirty-seven Monday afternoon meetings, and fifty of the Board of Directors and forty-six of the Executive Committee sessions. For the convenience of the members, and as a matter of easy reference, all these typewritten minutes have been incorporated into one large permanent record book, which is on file in the office.

Previous to the program hour on Monday afternoon, the time has been given to regular announcements, matters of business, and speakers from various civic or philanthropic organizations. These subject topics have been: Fire Protection; Plea for Community Chest; Purchase of the Browning Letters; Delinquent Children; Out-of-Door Christmas; Women and Aviation; Lincoln Memorial University; The Rebuilding of the Pilgrimage Play Theatre; The Plant, Fruit and Flower Guild; Benefit for the Blind; The Russian Ukranian Colony; The Water Bonds; Indian Home Culture; The Urge to Use Home Products; Red Cross Work; The Los Angeles Playground; The Midnight Mission; The Hollywood Bowl; and the Inter-Collegiate Oratorical Contest. All of the speakers have brought to the members facts of vital outside interest.

The Board of Directors handles all permanent business and matters of finance such as rentals and taxes. This Board of seven members, including the President, has certain specific duties allotted to each, upon which reports are made at the meetings. This year the work assigned was as follows: Library and Garden, Mrs. Charles D. Burt; Social Welfare, Mrs. Charles Egleston Crary; Resolutions, Miss Frederica de Laguna; Auditor, Mrs. Julian Ellsworth Garnsey; Public Relations, Mrs. William Read; Rentals, Mrs. James Andrew Rogers.

Miss de Laguna as Chairman of Resolutions, presented to the Board the following resolutions, which were later confirmed by vote of the club:

- Endorsing the promotion of peace between England and the United States with the visit of Premier MacDonald to President Hoover.
- 2. Endorsing the Law Observance Campaign carried on by the women of Los Angeles.

- 3. Emphasizing the duty of the United States in joining other nations in a World Court.
- 4. Expressing regret in the passing of Miss Alice K. Parsons, a charter member.
- Telegram to Mrs. Henry Peabody, Chairman of Women's National Committee for Law Enforcement, Washington, D. C.
- 6. Requesting the Board of Regents of the University of California to offer teachers graduate work at the University of California at Los Angeles as well as at Berkeley.

Miss de Laguna presented also the following Amendments, which were all passed by the club:

- Raising the dues to thirty dollars a year.
 Amended Article IX, Section 2, by striking out twenty and inserting thirty.
- Changing day of Board of Directors and Executive Committee meetings.
 Amended Article X, Sections 4 and 5, by striking out second and fourth and inserting first and third.
- Removing scholarships from the Philanthropic to the Educational.

Amended Article VII, Section 10, by inserting and between relief and rest and striking out and of scholarships.

Amended Article VII, Section 12, by the addition of the section.

Amended Article XII, Section 1, by a substitution, making five definite forms of activity, with No. 4 to read The Department of Scholarships under a Chairman of Scholarships.

The seventeen members of the Executive Committee handle all current business of the Club. These reports are listed elsewhere, with the exception of those of the First and Third Vice-Presidents.

The First Vice-President, Mrs. Charles S. Crail, has the distinction of editing a club magazine and actually making it pay, for the income from the Ebell magazine paid for all printing, stationery and year book expenses and still left a cash balance of \$804.32.

The Third Vice-President, Mrs. Frank Howell Stanbery, as Chairman of House, has had many committees functioning under her. With tact, she has kept the harmonious atmosphere

of sociability and courtesy paramount. Sixteen thousand three hundred four persons have enjoyed a cup of tea on Mondays, and six thousand one hundred fifty-eight persons have been served at the sixty-six luncheons held, while one thousand ninety-six have played cards in the Solarium on Wednesdays.

The same earnestness which Mrs. Stanbery has given to the supervision of the house has been shown in her attendance at Executive Committee meetings, as she has not been absent from a meeting during her term of office. Miss de Laguna has been present at every meeting of the Board of Directors this year, and the President, Mrs. Cooke, has presided at every business meeting of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee during the year. Many of the others have been detained only by unavoidable circumstances.

With such faithfulness to duty and with the confidence the Club has placed in its leaders, the year has been made one of accomplishment and service to Ebell.

Report of the Corresponding Secretary

The Corresponding Secretary has written seven hundred letters during the year beginning July 1, 1929, and ending June 30, 1930. A classification of these shows that one hundred fifty-four were letters of business, two hundred ninety-five of sympathy or cheer and two hundred fifty-one of congratulation or appreciation. Report of the General Bederation Secretary

The General Federation of Women's Clubs is constantly assuming a more and more vital role in the history of our country and of other peoples. It is a great unifying element here at home; and it is one of the powerful organizations now making for better understanding among the nations of the world. It is like a strong ocean cable that transmits messages of friendship and confidence, a bond, we believe, that no storms shall ever be effective in destroying. At home and abroad the Federation stands for co-operation.

The past year has seen increased interest in strengthening the fibre of the home,—from good home cooking and laborsaving devices to well-balanced rations in the amusement program. The power for good or ill in the Motion Picture world has been of great concern to the Federation, and lines have been sent out in all directions to discover those pictures potent for good, and to commend them to the federated clubs and so to the homes.

Uncompromisingly the Convention at Denver stood for Law Enforcement and Prohibition. It seemed almost like a voice crying in the wilderness after the devastating straw poll taken by the *Literary Digest*, but it was a brave answer and a clear summons.

With the same far-reaching and clarion call the voice of the Federation has spoken for the outlawry of war, and for adherence to the organized forces bent upon establishing world peace—not the peace of neglectful desuetude, but the active, urgent, compelling doctrines of an intelligent crusade—"There must be no more wars," a manifesto written upon the phylacteries that bind each brow and engraved upon the heart of the world.

The Federation has sent out messages of hope through a reliance upon the teachings of the Scriptures and the wonderful body of religious truths left to the world. I have been deeply moved by the steady faith of our Federation President and her stimulating trust in the undiminished strength of Christianity in a world where trenchant pens and world-known voices are raising doubts, or openly declaring that the religion of the past two thousand years has fallen into naught.

She has never failed with her gentle, unfaltering message, expressing a renewal of faith in the potency of the old-time religious teachings.

It is a wonderful thing to belong to a world movement whose beneficent influence and splendid morale encircle the globe. We may well rejoice that there is a General Federation of Women's Clubs in America.

"Speech," according to Mr. Webster, "is the faculty of expressing thoughts by words or articulate sounds." But America holds in her language the words of many nations, both the living and the dead, and the peoples of many countries are thinking within her gates. How shall America speak, that each may find expression, that all may understand? How may we choose the words, that "fitly spoken, are like apples of gold in pictures of silver"? What is "better" American speech?

Report of the General Curator

During the year 1929-1930 the nineteen departments of Ebell held one hundred ninety-six (196) meetings, with an approximate attendance of eighteen thousand, eight hundred thirty-two (18,832), including guests.

Mrs. William Milton Kinney and Mrs. Charles E. Stanton served as Assistant Curators, and the support they have given has been invaluable.

The Applied Design, the French, the Spanish and the Parliamentary Law Departments have been self-supporting, at their own request. Through the generosity of Mrs. Norman D. Hall a series of five lectures was given in the Shakespeare Department by Dr. Frederick Warde. In the Applied Design Department the members competed for a prize offered by Mrs. Charles E. Wolfenden, and in the Better American Speech Department Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher and Mrs. James Catlett Ernst presented prizes for the best two short stories, professional and amateur.

A report of the department work, however, can not be a thing of figures and statistics; the departments are too vigorously alive to be so limited. They are the channels through which constantly flows into the club a stream of material,educational, stimulating and entertaining. Each member has dipped from the stream the thing which seemed to her most attractive or which best fitted her need, remembering always that she who put back a portion in the way of personal effort not only enriched her own talents but contributed to the common source.

Throughout the year each curator has striven to make her department as strong and fine as hard work, thought and friendliness could create it. The record of attendance proclaims that they have succeeded, although numbers alone do not mean success. Small groups with unity of purpose and sentiment have a definite place in our club regime.

Through the programs of the Art and Travel and Music Departments and through the Art Salon we have seen and heard the delights of many lands; but best of all we have been made more sympathetically conscious of the artists in various

lines of endeavor within our gates.

The Applied Design Department has created its own beauty by originating form and color harmony and applying them in practical and artistic ways.

The Bible, the Browning, the Poetry and the Shakespeare Departments have impressed upon us the everlasting beauties of the volumes from which they derive their inspiration.

The Book Chamber has taught us a certain niceness in our choice of reading, and how to interpret and understand that

which we have read.

The Lives and Times Department, with the vision of youth, has brought to our attention outstanding events of our modern world, and something of the lives of the men and women who are accomplishing these things.

The French, the Spanish and the Better American Speech Departments have advanced the highest speech standards in their respective languages, and have suggested carefully thought

out courses by which we may exemplify their teachings.

The Drama Department and the Drama Workshop, working hand in hand, have added greatly to the enjoyment of the club throughout the year. They have concentrated on the history of national drama, followed by pageantry and plays sypical of the country under discussion. Fifty members have taken part in the spoken plays, while at least three times that

number have appeared in pantomime and pageantry.

The Law, the Parliamentary Law and the Public Affairs Departments have pointed out how we may best serve our country, our community and our fellow men, while the Psychology Department has aided us in that greatest of all endeavors, the mastery of self. In the Law Department Miss Florence M. Bischoff, Court Commissioner in the Probate Department, has given a valuable series of lectures on Things Women Should Know about Law.

April found us hostesses to the notable Mural Painters of California and brought also an exhibition of the California Water-Color Society, while May marked the first annual exhibition of the California Oil Painters.

We have held important exhibitions of the foremost etchers of California, with Edward Borein and Arthur Millier in one-man shows, and a list of other distinguished etchers obtained through the courtesy of the California Etchers Association.

We have had wood-block prints from Frank Morley Fletcher and drawings by the young Chinese artist, Keye Luke. Persian miniatures and fabrics were exhibited by Dr. Ali Kuli Khan of Persia.

Every effort has been made to show the miniatures of the California Miniature Society to the best advantage, and the works of the foremost women painters of America have been assembled for exhibition by Miss Gertrude Little, secretary of the Society. These exhibitors were Ella S. Bush, Alice Ludovica, Minerva Chapman and Martha Wheeler Baxter.

We have had two cash awards presented to us for use in prizes for exhibiting artists: "The Elizabeth Holmes Fisher Prize," given by Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher for the best oil painting by a California painter, and "The Leafie Sloan-Orcutt Award," given by Mrs. Leafie Sloan-Orcutt for the best water-color. We hope to keep these prizes a permanent event of our exhibitions. "Honorable Mention" and "The Ebell Popular Vote" also have added interest to the exhibitions.

"The Leafie Sloan-Orcutt Award" for the best water-color was given to Milliard S. Sheets; First Honorable Mention to Theodore Modra; Second Honorable Mention to Herbert Jepson; Popular Vote of Ebell to Henry Richter. The judges were Max Wieczorek, Carl Oscar Borg, Hanson Puthuff,

Robert Vose, De Witt Parshall and Hugo Ballin.

"The Elizabeth Holmes Fisher Prize" for the best oil painting was won by Carl Oscar Borg; First Honorable Mention by Milliard Sheets; Second Honorable Mention by Mable Alvarez, and the Ebell Popular Vote was given to George Sherriff. The judges for the oil show were Arthur Millier, Frank Tenney Johnson, Charles O. Middleton, Charles Sindelaer, Francis Vreeland, Mrs. William Henry Lyman and Dr. A. Bennett Cooke.

The season closed with a Salon showing of the works of California painters and a Galeria exhibition of the water-colors of Anthony Euwer and examples of the year's work of the Applied Design Department. We had also a rare and valuable Dubuc clock of Napoleon's on exhibition in the Salon.

We are deeply gratified by the success of the past year's work, the first year of the Ebell Salon of Art activity, and realize fully that only through the sympathetic co-operation of the President and the Executive Committee, and the spontaneous appreciation of the club members as a whole, could this have been accomplished. The Art Exhibitions Committee has assumed not only a responsibility to you, but has been granted a place in the art world of the West, which it must maintain through the coming years.

We accept the responsibility, with your help.

Report of the Scholarships Committee

Twenty-three students have been awarded our scholarships the past year, two of whom are boys attending California Institute of Technology at Pasadena. One of the girls has just finished at Manual Arts High School, one is finishing at the Summer School of the University of Southern California, one is at the Chouinard School of Art, and all the remainder are attending the University of California at Los Angeles. Of the latter, six have graduated in June and two of these have married.

The new awards have been given to one girl at the Los Angeles Junior College, two girls at the University of Southern California, three entering Freshmen at the University of California at Los Angeles, and one boy has been re-instated.

Our ideal of assisting potential leaders, insisting upon "high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health," thus quoting from our by-laws, has been most satisfactory. Not one student has been dropped for the entire year, although several have had to be investigated. The adjustment to the new campus at Westwood has been difficult, but our Ebell students have measured up to our requirements.

Defining our Scholarship work as an educational activity is in line with the modern trend of thought. The Harmon Foundation with about a half-million in its Scholarship fund has issued a pamphlet, stating that after seven years of experience with student loan funds one of "the first aims of the Foundation has been to take student aid out of the field of philanthropy where most Americans have unconsciously placed it heretofore." By making it a matter of competition, we can insist upon our high standard of scholarship, and thereby stimulate the best minds of our youth.

The second essay contest, sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint, brought out some interesting ideas on "The Meaning and Scope of Citizenship," the prizes proving a godsend to the four lucky winners.

The total of our investments remains at \$55,500, of which \$40,000 is the Flint Foundation. The financial statement for the year follows:

Report of the Practical Relief Committee

The service rendered by the Practical Relief Committee reaches out in many directions, while the work in the main is the same as when the committee was organized. We sew every month in the year with the exception of July, which is our vacation month.

Our special object of interest last autumn was the Helen Mathewson Club House in Westwood. The twenty-four girls who live in this home do all of the work, and in addition they have to earn money to pay their college expenses. Much in furnishings and new bedding and table linen was needed for the home. One of our good members of Ebell donated one hundred dollars for the bedroom curtains and spreads. These were planned and cut by a member and were made by six women of our committee, who gave days of their time to this work. Another generous gift was fifty dollars for the dining room curtains, this sum covering the cost of materials and the making of the curtains. Again fifty dollars to be used as we saw fit was given by a club member and her husband. By smaller gifts this was increased to two hundred fifteen dollars and we were able to supply many conveniences. We made nine comforts, four of which had pieced tops, our scraps of cotton goods being used for these. Fifty-three napkins were hemmed, old table cloths being cut up for these. Two dozen doilies and table mats with crocheted edges were made from pieces of linen and Indian head. This work was done by our members at home. Among our gifts were also fourteen sheets, thirty-four pillow cases and twenty-four pads. In addition, we dress completely eighteen of these twenty-four girls and assist the remaining six.

Our Christmas activities included the annual jelly and jam shower, which was held this year at the Helen Mathewson Club House. A general invitation was extended to Ebell members, and the response was so generous that the preserve closet was well filled with jelly, jam and canned fruits.

We have always told you much about our university students, but perhaps you do not know about the high school girls whom we assist. They are sent to us by the vice-principals and are always girls who stand high in scholarship and are working

their way, in part at least, through school. We made three graduating dresses for high school girls for the February commencement and one for the June exercises. Besides, seven graduating dresses were required for university students. When we can not make all of these dresses we supply the material and the girls make them. We received donations from two Ebell members for two dresses.

Any guest from Rest Cottage, who comes to us, is well cared for by us. We have about ten Rest Cottage guests who look to us for most of their clothing.

We have had more demands from the disabled veterans than ever before. Almost every piece of men's clothing is sent out at once to the needy ex-service men. For them, in our Christmas activities, we gave seventy-three Christmas dinners, a bushel basket holding each dinner. The donations for these Christmas dinners were as usual very generous, amounting to two hundred one dollars and eighty-five cents. We were indebted to Bullock's for two hundred different articles; including clothing, toys, books and small tubs of candy. Some of these were distributed in the soldiers' baskets and a part of the games, toys and candy was given to the children in the tubercular ward of the General Hospital.

Our further Christmas activities included the Barlow Sanitarium, to which we sent one dozen flannelette night-gowns, two dozen nightingales, three hoods and two pairs of bed socks; and to the County Farm we took three dozen nightingales, five hoods and four pairs of bed socks for the women in the infirmary.

We are indebted to the Needlework Guild for three hundred forty-seven garments.

We can not tell you all the appeals that come to us, but a few outstanding ones follow. The assistant chairman became

much interested in a university man who is working his way through college. His home was so far from the university that he had to leave at six-thirty in the morning to make an eight o'clock class and car fare was costing him fifty cents a day. Miss Moorhead decided that he should have a Ford and succeeded in getting donations for this car without much solicitation. The young man now has more time for work and study and takes other boys to school, thus giving them more time.

One of the school girls came to us in trouble. Her father had died and most of the family savings had been used in caring for him through a long illness. He had left a little insurance and the mother, who was ill, lived on this for a few months, until she could decide what to do. She had three small children, besides the daughter in high school. She decided to go out in the country, with her children, and raise turkeys and chickens. She had been reared on a farm and felt that she knew how to do this. To establish herself, she used the remainder of her insurance money, but we pointed the way to State aid. While she was waiting for that, two of our Ebell members made donations for three months, which greatly helped her. Also we clothed her and the children.

We are looked upon as an employment agency, for we have many requests for work and also many requests for housekeepers and maids. We have just succeeded in placing three women in good homes at fair wages.

The Red Cross asked Ebell to knit one hundred sweaters. This work was put in charge of the Practical Relief Committee and wool for one hundred six sweaters was sent out by the Red Cross to Ebell members and friends. Again Red Cross has asked Ebell for one hundred sweaters to be completed by Thanksgiving.



Mrs. Benjamin A. Rhoades, membership chairman, reported seven new life members, thirteen added to our *In Memoriam* list, eighty-one sustaining members, total membership nine hundred eighty-seven.

Mrs. Helen Louise Kramer and her committee answered transportation calls one hundred fifty times.

Follow-up committee made ninety contacts with former guests, usually by personal calls.

Last year Ebell Club graciously opened wide the doors of our spacious club house and gave the Rest Cottage committees an opportunity to entertain all gue to and former guests at a Christmas dinner. It was a festive occasion, and marked an epoch in the drab life of many a guest. The true Ebell spirit of service and goodwill mingled well with the Christmas spirit. This event was planned and executed by Mrs. Harry J. Brown and her committee, assisted by the other committee. Ebell's musical artists, Mrs. Roy Charles Arnold and Mrs. Guy Frederick Bush, furnished the program.

Other outstanding events of the year were two meetings at the Cottage. The first was in October. After a business meeting of the Association, Mrs. George H. Cook gave a moving picture travel lecture to the convalescents and the Association, after which all adjourned to the garden for an informal lunch. In the month of May all Ebell members were invited to a tea at the Cottage. Mrs. Stavnow provided programs for the special occasions, as well as short, appropriate ones for the monthly meetings.

Miss Hattie Newman, finance chairman, reported an addition to our endowment fund, which had resulted in the purchase of five one-thousand dollar bonds.

Mrs. Walter E. Barrett, secretary, sent out three hundred fifty letters.

Dr. and Mrs. John Rollin French extended hospital and clinic service at the Golden State Hospital to the amount of one thousand dollars. This proved of inestimable value.

Two hundred thirty women asked for admission to the Cottage. Through the valuable service of the investigating committee, Mrs. Chaffin and her able corps, one hundred fifty-five enjoyed the hospitality of Ebell Rest Cottage this year. We gained much from acquaintance with these brave women, and rejoiced when the assistant chairman, Mrs. Willis Charles Sharon, reported that a gratifying per cent were able to return to their former positions in the business world or to resume their duties as homekeepers.

We can not close this brief, inadequate survey without voicing our appreciation of the loyal support given the Association by the Ebell Benefits Committee and by Practical Relief.

Rest Cottage is unique, for it is the only non-profit convalescent home, exclusively for women, in Los Angeles, which makes Ebell Club a pioneer in the work.

Resolutions

Establishing Ehell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and

control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors therefor.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angees.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the samount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the

Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise Nor Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage........dollars,"

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:.....

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

Ehell Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II.

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III.

Duties of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the association.

ARTICLE IV.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

SEC. 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell.

ARTICLE V. Members.

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

SEC. 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining, Life, and Memorial Members.

ARTICLE VI.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The dues for Associate Members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

SEC. 2. The dues of Sustaining Members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SEC. 3. The dues of Contributing Members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SEC. 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a Life or a Memorial Member.

ARTICLE VII. Meetings.

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month at tenthirty A. M.

SEC. 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month at eleven A. M.

SEC. 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Friday in June at eleven A. M. Polls open until noon.

SEC. 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SEC. 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII.

Elections.

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

[The EBELL of Los Angeles]

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

SEC. 3. At the regular meeting in May, a nominating committee shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary, and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX.

SECTION 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SEC. 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Report of the President of the Ehell Muning

On reviewing the events of this past year, we find them most varied and interesting, and appealing to Ebell Juniors whatever their tastes may be. This has been a year of change and added activity, one of broadening interests and individual

participation.

Before the opening of the new club year on the second Wednesday in October, a new committee had made its successful appearance. The Junior Book Chamber, under the direction of Miss Ann Sumner and Mrs. Cameron Livingston Thom, was organized during the summer months and had its first meeting at the home of Mrs. Thom on Thursday, September 9th. Since then the Book Chamber has met twice each month at the home of some member for an informal discussion of the outstanding books and publications. It has more than fulfilled the hopes of those who planned it, in providing a means of bringing our members into more intimate contact with one another and also in helping them keep up with the current news in the book world. From the reviews presented at the Book Chamber meetings, the most interesting and appropriate were chosen to be given before the regular programs at the monthly meetings of the Juniors. This has proved a most popular addition to our activities, and its success is due in no small part to the able leadership of its chairmen.

On Tuesday, October 15th, our members were invited to gather for tea in the solarium to meet those whose names were appearing in the year book for the first time, and to greet their old friends who had assembled after the summer months

to renewed activity.

The policy of the Work and Play Committee, whose chairman, Mrs. Daniel Gaines Hon, has proved most efficient, was changed slightly to admit a broader aim. In addition to the purely pleasurable motive of the monthly card parties, it was thought advisable to alter the system of fees somewhat in order to set aside a worthwhile sum to be donated to our Child Welfare Committee at the end of the club year. Season tickets to the bridge parties were sold to the members and were filed and punched at each party. These were transferable at any time and due allowance was made in case the owners were unable to attend any party. In order that we might use the

solarium for our monthly bridge teas, the day was changed to the fourth Friday of each month.

Our first benefit of the year was an informal bridge dinner held in the dining room of the club on Tuesday evening, November 19th, under the direction of Mrs. Henryetta Bohon Miller, assistant chairman of Benefits; Mrs. Daniel Gaines Hon, Work and Play chairman; and Mrs. Charles Wayne Hickey, Ticket chairman. The proceeds totalled \$33.26 and were donated to the club. Realizing the club is under a very great burden in paying the debts necessarily contracted during its construction, the Juniors wanted to show their love and loyalty to the club by turning over the proceeds from our first two benefits.

The second benefit was the annual three-act play given March 4th through the Drama Workshop of Ebell. "The Creaking Chair," by Allene Tupper Wilke, a farcical mystery drama, was directed by our Drama chairman, Mrs. Leslie S. Bowden, and was a real success, both socially and financially. Mr. King Baggot, well-known motion picture actor and director, kindly gave much of his time and talents to help us, playing a leading role and assisting Mrs. Bowden with the direction. We cleared \$215.99 from the one performance.

The Spring Fashion Show and bridge tea given May 10th was well attended and most popular. Mrs. Alfred D. Davey, chairman of Benefits, was in charge of this affair and was most ably assisted by Mrs. Charles Wayne Hickey, tickets; Mrs. Harold E. Craig, fashion show; Mrs. Daniel Gaines Hon, bridge; and Mrs. Hayes H. Halverson, refreshments. Due to the co-operation of the Juniors and their friends, we were able to add \$201.50 to our Child Welfare Fund, bringing the total raised from our benefits to \$450.75.

The Child Welfare Committee has met every two weeks with very few intermissions since appointed this year, and the faithful work of the members of the committee kept our many children well clothed and happy. In addition to the clothing supplied, we furnished milk for the children whose families could not afford the amount necessary. At Christmas time baskets of fresh vegetables, fruit, cereals, chickens and canned goods, and most important of all, tarlatan stockings filled with nuts, candies and toys for the children were taken to the seven families for whom we care. The day before Christmas was a busy one for the Child Welfare workers who met at the home

of Mrs. Jesse T. Riffe, the chairman, to pack and deliver the baskets. Mrs. Riffe has directed the work admirably and has a splendid record to show for all the time and effort she expended.

Our other Social Welfare activity, the Scholarship Committee, with Mrs. Dwight H. Reay as chairman, has aided two women with needed scholarships. One, a mother of two of our children, was enabled to take several extension courses that will help her earn a teacher's certificate; the other, a freshman at the University of California at Los Angeles, found it possible to meet her expenses with our help every month. The fund has been most capably administered and much credit is due Mrs. Reay and her assistants.

The Juniors were honored this year by being made the representatives of Ebell on the Los Angeles Girls' Council. The President of the Juniors and Miss Winifred Huntington served in this capacity. The members of the Juniors acted as ushers at the annual Conference on Twentieth Century Girlhood held March 28th and 29th. The Council "aims to serve as a clearing house of information in the field of girls' work, and as an agency that may co-ordinate more effectively the efforts of executives and leaders in girls' groups."

The programs, under the direction of Mrs. Hayes H. Halverson, have been excellent and very worthwhile. They were as follows:

October—"Costume Designing," Lecture by Mrs. Louise Sooy, Professor of Fine Arts at U. C. L. A. Models from the University and from the audience.

November—Two one-act plays presented through the Drama Workshop: "Cherry Special," by Beatrice Humiston McNeil, a delightful modern comedy, directed by Mrs. Leslie S. Bowden; "The Duchess Says Her Prayers," by Mary Caff Canfield, a costume drama with a Florentine setting, directed by Mrs. Margaret Barbrick Purcell; the music by Miss Emily Greene Korstad, violinist, accompanied by Mrs. B. Primeaux.

December-No meeting.

January—Musicale: Miss Aukje Kapteyn, violinist, accompanied by her mother; Mrs. Homer Broadman, pianist; Mr. Lewis Meehan, tenor.

February—Lecture and exhibition of Japanese prints by Miss Helena Whitford, an authority on Chinese and Japanese art.

March—Annual Children's Party with Punch and Judy Show; Mr. John Daggett, "Uncle John of KHJ," and Mr. Glenn Hood, "The Songbird of Yosemite Valley."

April-Lecture on "What They Are Using," by Mr. Edgar Harrison Wileman, Consulting Decorator of Barker Brothers.

May—Program by Junior Book Chamber; Mr. John Curtis, President of Bobbs-Merrill Publishing Company, guest of honor; reviews presented by Mrs. Dwight H. Reay and Miss Lois McQuistion.

June—Installation Luncheon; Program by Miss Emily Greene Korstad, violinist, and Mrs. Glendon Tremaine, soprano.

It is an honor and a privilege which I fully appreciate to have served as President of the Ebell Juniors. The resulting associations with the older members of Ebell have been both pleasing and helpful, and I only hope that the future Junior Presidents may have as delightful a year as I have had.

By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

ARTICLE I.

Name.

This Department of the Ebell of Los Angeles shall be known as The Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II.

Purpose.

The purpose of this special department is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the Club, and participation in social welfare work.

ARTICLE III.

SECTION 1. Membership in this department is open to the daughters of the Club members and their friends under the age of 26 years.

SEC. 2. Application for membership shall follow the procedure for regular membership in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

SEC. 3. Any member of this department may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. The officers of this department shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

SEC. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the annual meeting of the department.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three Ebell members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of THE EBELL JUNIORS, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

ARTICLE V.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be one-half (½) the amount paid by the regular members, which amount shall be regular member of THE EBELL.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members. The Club year shall be egin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first

and the second half b ecomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. The officers of this department shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on THE EBELL, but shall defray all expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI. Meetings.

SECTION 1. THE EBELL JUNIORS shall meet on the second Wednesday of each month. The annual business meeting shall be on the first Wednesday of June.

SEC. 2. All departments of THE EBELL shall be open to THE EBELL JUNIORS.

Sec. 3. The EBELL JUNIORS shall have the privilege of nine regular Monday meetings during the year.

ARTICLE VII. Amendments.

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Executive Committee by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture, through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

- SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, *i. e.*, financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare, and methods of the Club.
- SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be reported to the Executive Committee at the meeting following.
- SEC. 5. The First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.
- SEC. 6. At the first regular meeting in July, the Directors shall appoint two from their own number to serve with the President, Auditor, and Treasurer as a Budget Committee.
- SEC. 7. In the absence of the President the Board of Directors shall appoint a Chairman pro tem from their own number.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The Chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

- SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the amount appropriated in the Budget for the current expenses of the Club.
 - SEC. 3. Nine members shall constitute a quorum.
- SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee: shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary, and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the Presidentelect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Ex-

ecutive Committee.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House

Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club. and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive applications for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curator-elect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the Depart-

ments for the ensuing year.

- SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.
- SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship Fund of the Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The

Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is ap-

SEC. 9. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions, given for the establishment of The Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SEC. 10. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt.

SEC. 11. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seem to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committees.

SECTION 1. The standing committees shall be:

Advisory Council of Past Presidents;

Budget Committee:

- Committee on Departments: Committee on Programs;
- House Committee:
- Membership Committee;
- Printing Committee:
- Rentals Committee;
- Social Welfare Committee.

SEC. 2. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization. This Committee, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent Pres-

ident of the Club, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

SEC. 3. The Budget Committee shall prepare a statement of the estimated receipts and expenditures of the Club for the ensuing year and submit it to the Board of Directors at their second regular meeting in July.

SEC. 4. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of De-

partments in arranging their courses of study.

SEC. 5. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and such special meetings as are authorized by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.

SEC. 7. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 8. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins,

etc., and the Year Book.

SEC. 9. The Rentals Committee shall, with the assistance of the Financial Secretary, supervise all rentals and leases.

SEC. 10. The Social Welfare Committee shall consist of one Director, and of the Chairmen of Benefits, of Practical Relief, and of Rest Cottage Association. This Committee shall have general supervision of the philanthropic and social welfare of this Club.

SEC. 11. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist

the Executive Committee.

SEC. 12. All scholarship work shall be classed as an educational activity under the supervision of the Chairman of Scholarships.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation.

The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular

meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of names of all applicants approved by the Executive Committee shall be published in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting for election to membership.

Should a protest be received the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further

investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of................................. (State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted

as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for Junior membership during one year.

- SEC. 2. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, Temporary.
- SEC. 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and who is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.
- SEC. 5. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for one (1) year may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay five hundred dollars (\$500), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.
- SEC. 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote of the members present, in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Bulletin and announced from the platform

at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

- SEC. 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.
- SEC 8. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, in recognition of merit or for the best interests of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.
- SEC. 9. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of twenty-six (26) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club, at one-half the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and any of the Study Departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 10. An application for Junior Membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors and then shall follow the procedure for regular Club membership.

Any Ebell Junior may become a regular member of the Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

- SEC. 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for three months, at the expiration of which time a renewal of another three months may be applied for. This membership may be renewed once in any subsequent year. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC. 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be the regular admission fee, or the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.
- SEC. 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The Registration fee shall be one hundred dollars (\$100).

- SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.
- SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.
- SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members and have one-half their dues remitted.
- SEC. 5. The Executive Committee may by unanimous vote and where the need is apparent remit one-half of the admission fees and dues of wives of resident clergymen when application for regular membership is made.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

- SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday in October, a regular meeting of the Club shall be held on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.
- SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular, life, and honorary life members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.
- SEC. 3. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending at a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the first and third Thursdays at 9:30 A. M.

SEC. 5. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the first and third Thursdays at 10 A. M.

SEC. 6. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

SECTION 1. All Officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than one hundred (100) nor more than one hundred fifty (150) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Nominating petitions may be secured at the office on and after the first Monday in April. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF Los Angeles, propose the name of in as a nominee for the office of in THE EBELL OF Los Angeles for the term from July 1, 19....., to July 1, 19.....; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office.

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No

further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten A. M. and three P. M of the date set; three members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June, provided, however, that the President-elect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XII. Club Activities.

SECTION 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs under the direction of the Second Vice-President; (2) The Study Departments under the direction of the General Curator; (3) The Social Welfare Work in charge of the Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, the Chairman of Practical Relief, the Chairman of Benefits, and one Director, who shall be chosen by the Board of Directors from their own number, and who shall supervise the miscellaneous philanthropic gifts and activities of the Club; (4) the Department of Scholarships under a Chairman of Scholarships; and (5) the Ebell Juniors, who shall have self

government, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of Ebell.

SEC. 2. Each Study Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee. All Curators are subject to and shall report to and confer with the General Curator.

Rule 1. All members of Departments must be members of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 6. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the Department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

Business.

SECTION 1. All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

SEC. 2. Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICIE XIV.

Amendments.

SECTION 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a

printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 3. Any such amendment so adopted, shall, when certified by the Board of Directors, become effective.

SEC. 4. Only those eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XV.

Parliamentary Authority.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVI.

Charter Day.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVII.

Notice of Meetings.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1930. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Standing Kules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members may bring one guest to all open Mon-

day afternoon programs by paying fifty cents.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one

Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Street entrance. This committee is on duty one hour before each meeting held in the Auditorium.

Regular members will receive ten guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

A check for admission fee must accompany all applications for membership.

New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first, respectively.

Applications for non-resident rates will not be granted after October first for the ensuing year, or after March first for the last half of the year.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the plat-

form or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Reception Room except to the Reception Committee.

Luncheon tickets will be on sale in the Galeria every club day from 11:30 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. At other times they may be procured at the office.

For the convenience of members, checks mailed to the office will be accepted for reservations, but no reservations may be made over the telephone.

To insure efficient service, reservations should be made for the Wednesday luncheons and the Thursday night dinners by 5:00 P.M. of the day preceding.

Reservations are not obligatory for the Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday luncheons.

Tables may be reserved for Departments and other groups. It is a rule of the Club that there shall be no tipping.
