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# THE EBELL AND ITS WORK.

Dr. Adrian Ebell was a noted German scholar who saw the time had come in the world's history when a thinking woman was a necessity—a womanhood to meet and solve various questions which the stress of the age was presenting for solution more and more insistently. Realizing woman's limited opportunities for development along scientific lines he labored to establish an international academy with chapters all over the world. While traveling in America in 1876 he formed the first chapter, the Oakland Ebell. It is after this finely organized club that the Ebell of Los Angeles is modeled, consisting of a central organization with departments for study and advancement in all lines of general culture.

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#### PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT.

In making a report of the second year's work under her administration, your president is hampered by the fact that she was not present at the closing meetings of the year and so does not know just what reports were given to you by the other officers; but she cannot close her work with Ebell wrthout a parting review of what we have tried to do and what we have done in the last two years.

The law governing all human institutions is the law of change. Nothing is stationary and, if an institution does not progress, grow upward and onward, it must retrograde. That Ebell has obeyed this law of progress all our statistics will show. Two years ago we numbered 278; now we have 473 members. Today our treasury shows a balance of \$1,414.25 as compared with \$667.99, the balance of July 1902; and, besides, we own 50 shares of stock in our Building Association. Two years ago we only contemplated building a club house; now we own a valuable lot and, before another year passes, will see our club

home grown to fair proportions. Besides our advance in material possessions, those things that can be measured by dollars and cents, by feet and inches, we have progressed along more subtle lines, have amassed treasures in that spiritual garner house where "neither moth nor rust doth corrupt and where thieves do not break through and steal." We have grown in good fellowship and friendship and above all in that harmony which comes from appreciation of another's point of view, from the abnegation of self and the desire for the best good of all. This tenth year of club existence has shown better work than ever along all lines. The Majority of the officers were filling their second term of service, as were the greater number of the curators, so that they all had the benefit of experience as well as zeal in their work and that work has shown that experience is a most excellent teacher.

Ebell's first interest is her sections and of them we can say they have labored conscientiously and well. Not that they are beyond improvement, but they have done the best they could under existing conditions. The regret is often expressed that a greater proportion of our members do not take advantage of our section work, but, when we consider that the majority of them are women with homes and families, with all the duties owing to those homes, to society, to church and phil-

anthropy, we should be glad that so many of them do find time to gather together for Club work and self improvement.

The attendance upon Current Events Lectures surely justifies their continuance and their being open this year to the public has been a means of largely extending the Club's influence.

The members of the Travel Section have found that many interesting regions exist in our own country and, in spirit, they have traveled there most enthusiastically, under the leadership of their accomplished curators.

The large and flourishing Shakespeare Section proves that the great author they study is indeed, for all time, and all people, and that a desire to know him well is ever a bond of union to students and teacher.

Bible literature, the foundation of all literature, and current literature, its latest child, found many earnest students.

Each year we think the French Section could not do better and yet each year finds its members further on in their ability to speak French easily and to act French plays with true dramatic spirit.

The Music Section has continued its work along its accustomed lines and, this year, has made us acquainted with the fact that Los Angeles is not without musical composers of her own. The Section has

also introduced to Ebell many of the City's most admirable musicians.

Of the new Sections we can say "well done," with the hope that the future work along those lines will be even more successful.

The Club does not realize and certainly did not appreciate the efforts of the Curator of the Economics Section in bringing before that section so many able speakers on the vital question of the day.

The value of the work in Forensics can hardly be over-estimated in its endeavor to correct the greatest defect in us as club women, in ability to talk easily on an extemporaneous proposition.

The Physical Culture Section has aimed to produce, not only sound bodies, but sane minds in those bodies, by giving us a knowledge of the laws which govern all physical development, as well as the exercise which enables us to apply those laws.

These "Fountains of Knowledge" have been open to all and many have tasted of them.

The Club is greatly indebted to the zealous and untiring efforts of the Program Committee. Never before have such good programs been given us and we are proud to say that those programs, furnished us by our own Ebell members have been among the most interesting and profitable of them all. We need

only mention such names as Bishop Vincent, Rev. Robert J. Burdette, Bishop Johnson, Rev. Lawrence Ridgeley, President Edwards, Mr. Arthur Farwell, Prof. B. R. Baumgardt, Dr. Martin and Madame de Blumenthal, to remind the Club of our past intellectual feasts.

Besides the lectures, we have had those most delightful musical programs arranged for us by Mrs. Vosburg and Mrs. Ogilvie.

Last, but by no means least, in importance and in the pleasure they gave, we will ever remember our Social Days; our Charter Day Reception, with its most enjoyable musicale given us by the Treble Clef Club; our Children's Christmas Party, with its absurdly amusing "Mary Jane" and the charming Lobster Quadrille; our Colonial Tea, with its beautiful music, its quaint old costumes and its spirit of true patriotism; and our Annual Luncheon.

In our club life we have many pleasant surprises and discoveries of hitherto unknown talents, but of our toast mistress of this year and of those who responded to the toasts, we expected much and thought we could not be surprised, but behold! the half had not been told and such treasures of wit and wisdom were poured out for us that we could not express the half of our admiration.

So it all passes; but another year will give us other and perhaps greater pleasures.

Here we must say a few words in appreciation of our committees who make these pleasant times possible. Our House Committee, the Courtesy Committee, and the Decorating Committee—theirs are the willing hands that DO. We have only to tell them what we would like and with no further concern it is ours. In presenting to the Club Dr. Alfred Martin, in his most delightful and instructive series of lectures on Florentine painters, the Program Committee continued a branch of work which opened with the lectures of Dr. Kin. It is a phase of our work which we hope will grow and be of great benefit, not only to our own members, but to the strangers within our gates.

We have to report most gratifiying progress in the work of the Ebell Building Association. This Association has subscribed upon its books nearly \$25,000. It owns a valuable lot on Hope Street and it has plans completed for our Club House and all that remains is to induce the members of Ebell to subscribe the remaining \$15,000 necessary to pay for the building. For this they depend on the love and loyalty of the Ebell and we feel they will not ask in vain.

In the furtherance of the civic work of the city, we have aided all movements for the betterment of social

conditions by our sympathy and financial support, especially in the donation of \$200.00 to the cause of the Juvenile Court.

Death has been busy among us this year and taken from us some of our most valued members: Mrs. John Bley, whom to know was an inspiration to all things higher and better; Mrs. J. N. Russell, who was so interested in our work during the short time she was with us; in Miss Mary Asbury Kent we have lost a friend staunch and true, to whom the interests of the Club were dear; Mrs. Horace A. Brown, the assistant curator of the Travel Section, whose whole life was spent in aiding the development of the young in knowledge and character; Mrs. O. V. Sessions, the most efficient chairman of our Traveling Library work; and last our dear Mrs. T. D. Stimson who was a charter member of the Ebell and who has never failed in ten years of faithful membership to help the Club at all times with her wise counsel, warm sympathy and generous financial support. In the loss of these, our beloved co-workers, it would seem that death does indeed "love a shining mark;" but we know that what is our loss is their gain and that they will be prepared to take up the larger life of the "Great Beyond."

So numerous have been the weddings among our young members this year, we might have felt worried

over a possible loss in membership were it not that matrimony, instead of decreasing their interest in the Ebell, seems only to make the flame burn brighter. We wish to all our brides long life and happiness and the larger growth in all good things.

In closing this brief account of our year's work and in taking official leave of the Club, your president wishes again to express to you her heartfelt appreciation of all the kindness that has been shown her, her thanks for the perfect loyalty and untiring support that have been given her by all the officers and members of the Club. She began her work with fear and trembling; she leaves it with happiness, gratitude and regret.

# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do Hereby Certify:

First-That the name of this incorporation shall be

"THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Second—That the purposes for which it is formed are for advancement in all lines of general culture.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said corporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be shown and that the names and resirences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year and who are to act until their successors

are elected and qualified, are as follows:

# BY-LAWS

# ARTICLE I.

The incorporate name of this society shall be the Ebell of Los Angeles.

## ARTICLE II.

The object of the society is advancement in all lines of general culture.

## ARTICLE III.

The officers of this society shall be a President, three Vice Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator and Librarian. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE IV.

#### Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Society.

Sec. 3. The Directors shall appoint their own Secretary from their number.

Sec. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be acted upon and entered on the minutes.

#### ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the currant affairs of the Society, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meetings of the Society.

Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Society.

Sec. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum. Sec. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive

Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors. Sec. 5. The Curators of the Sections shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

## ARTICLE VI.

# Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual re-

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Exec-

utive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Society and shall be an honorary member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

Sec. 2. The Corresponding Secretary shall be exofficio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Society, and issue all notices except notices to proposed members. She shall see that each new member signs the By-Laws and shall keep a list of the Charter Members. (Amend-

ed April 7, 1902.)
Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Society, and of the Executive Committee, furnish a report of the membership to the Corresponding Secretary when called upon, and shall submit a report at the annual meeting, sign all bills and corporation papers, shall call the roll of the entire membership at the beginning of the year, and of the members in good standing at the annual meeting. She shall hand to all committees their

instructions in writing.

Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Society; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee and annually to the Society and to the Board of Directors when called upon; shall send notices to proposed members and issue membership

cards.

Sec. 5. The Curator and Librarian shall have charge of all the books and papers of the Society and keep an inventory of all the property belonging thereto, which inventory she shall deliver to her successor in office, requiring of such successor a receipt for the same. She shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Society a statement of the time and place of all Section meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Society. She shall ascertain which section a new member desires to enter. She shall receive application for the formation of new sections, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each section, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make reports of the same at the annual meeting of the Society. She is also ex-officio chairman of Committee on Sections.

## ARTICLE VII-(Amended April 7, 1902.)

# Standing Committees.

Section 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee:

The Standing Committees shall be:

- Committee on Membership.
   Committee on Printing.
- 3. Committee on Programs.

4. Committee on Sections. (Amended April 7, 1902.)

Sec. 2. The Committee on Membership, upon receiving the properly endorsed names of applicants for membership from the President, shall act upon the same and report at the next regular meeting of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the

Society. (Amended April 7, 1902.)

Sec. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the publication of the annual report, the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc.

Sec. 5. The Committee on Sections shall assist in the organization of Sections and advise the Curator of Sections in arranging their course of study.

Sec. 6. It shall be rhe duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee. They shall meet on the first Monday of each month and shall report in writing to the Executive Committee. (Amended April 7. 1902.)

# ARTICLE VIII.

## Members.

Section 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her name shall be endorsed by three members in good standing. This application handed to the Chairman of the Executive Committee at any meeting shall pass to the Membership Committee. Upon receiving the endorsement of this committee, it shall be voted upon by the Executive Committee at their next meeting.

The notice of acceptance shall be sent to the proposed member by the Treasurer, together with bill

for admission fee and half yearly dues.

No member of the Society may sign more than five applications for membership during one year. (Amended June, 1903.)

Sec. 2. Members may be elected for one year who shall be known as complimentary members and who shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues, but who shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

Sec. 3. A non-resident may become an associate member for one year by having ther name duly presented and upon the payment of five dollars, but she shall have no interest in the management, property

or assets of the corporation.

Sec. 4. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within on month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous vote of the Committee on Membership.

Sec. 5. Any member many resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and

the payment of all back dues.

Sec. 6. Each member of the Society must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Sec. 7. Honorary membership may be conferred at the discretion of the club. (Amended June, 1903.)

#### ARTICLE IX.

#### Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$10.00.

Sec. 2. The annual dues shall be \$5.00, payable in advance, one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues, if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership. (Amended April 7, 1902.)

Sec. 3. Any member paying \$100 shall receive a

certificate of life membership and shall be exempt from payment of dues. (Amended June, 1903.)

Sec. 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member which it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Society.

#### ARTICLE X.

Section 1. Excepting during the months of July, August and September, a regular meeting of the Society shall take place on each Monday at 2:30 p.m., at which Sections may report, papers be presented or business be transacted.

Sec. 2. On the first Monday of each month shall be held a business and social meeting of the club for members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new

Sec. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the Thursday preceding the first Monday at 9:30 a.m.

Sec. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the Thursday preceding first Monday at 10:30 a.m., and on each Monday at 2 p. m.

Sec. 5. The annual business meeting of the Society shall take place on the first Monday in January.

Sec. 6. The annual meeting of the Society for the election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in April at 2:30 p.m. Elections shall take place by ballot, and those elected shall enter upon their duties at the close of the year.

Sec. 7. Two Directors, to hold office three years, shall be elected at each annual meeting. Officers shall be elected for one year. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a director for one year. (Entire Article amended April 7, 1902.)

#### ARTICLE XI.

Section 1. The Society shall be divided into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language and such others as from time to time the Society may deem advisable. (Amended April 7, 1902.)

Rule 1. All members of Sections must be members of "The Ebell of Los Angeles."

Rule 2. Members wishing to form Sections must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

Rule 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Sections and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when calld upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Section Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Sections are to meet and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a secretary to assist her in the Section.

Rule 4. Sections have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

Rule 5. Sections may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New sections may then be formed based on the same line of work, bearing the same name and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2d, etc.

kule 6. All members of Sections are required to perform their portion of work assigned by the Curators.

Rule 7. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Society. (Amended April 7, 1902.)

Rule 8. No Section or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Society, but shall defray all its

expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE XII.

Section 1. Copies of all papers read before the Society and in Sections shall be placed on file with the Curators and at the end of one year shall be placed under care and charge of Librarian.

Sec. 2. All papers shall be written on legal cap, on one side of the paper only and fastend securely at the top.

(Former Article XIII. repealed and subsequent Article renumbered, April 7, 1902.)

## ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be made in writing.

# ARTICLE XIV.

Ten members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee, which will include amend ments, complaints concerning neglect of duty, or transcending of privilege by any officer or member, or concerning any other matter pertaining to the Society. The Executive Committee shall at once refer the Communication to the Board of Directors for immediate attention, after which it shall be referred back to the Society for final vote. In the case of amendments to the By-Laws a two-third vote of the Society is required. (Amended June, 1903.)

# ARTICLE XV.

All meetings of the Society and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

## ARTICLE XVI.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Society. A reception shall be given on this day, when the President of the previous year shall present the members of the Society to the newly elected officers.

## ARTICLE XVII.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Society, we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves to abide by these laws and regulations.
