# Report of the President

Ebell has turned a year of depression into one of expression. Expressions of faith in and love for the club comprise your president's report.

First in importance has been the expression of confidence in the worthwhileness of the club by the addition of 631 new members. This is the largest gain in membership in one year the club has ever experienced.

The members of the club have expressed their interest in the Monday programs and department meetings by attending in increasing numbers over previous years.

Our belief in the importance of sharing our blessings with others found expression in giving almost one-fifth of our income for philanthropic activities.

The financial security of the club is shown in our auditor's report, which shows that we have met all of our obligations and paid \$22,700 on our mortgage; that the net income for the year is \$1,407.21; the cash in the bank shows an increase of \$2,239.78 over last year; the current assets are increased \$4,864.13 and there was a decrease in current liabilities amounting to \$2,672.92. Certainly this is a showing of which the club is proud.

We were very happy to have the assistance of two of our large colleges and one of our oldest men's clubs for our Monday programs. The Music Department of the University of Southern California opened the year with a beautiful musical interpretation of the Rubaiyat. Our closing program consisted of a classic pantomime by the Art Department of the University of California and an Olympic program furnished by the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Among other highlights of our Monday programs were lectures by Mrs. Percy V. Pennybacker, past president of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, Tony Sarg, internationally known as the originator of marionettes, as well as illustrator and designer, and Kathleen Norris, distinguished author, who brought us a valuable message in her talk, "New Fashions in Old Lovalties." Capacity audiences welcomed many of our Monday afternoon speakers and seats on the stage were necessary at times to accommodate the overflow.

Our program chairman, Mrs. Albert H. Purdue, anticipated the popularity of the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia and prepared for the large audience which assembled on that day. In addition to the seats on the stage, chairs were placed in the lounge and Salon of Art where loud speakers were installed and more than twenty-three hundred women were able to hear this noted exponent of hundreds of years of royalty.

On Armistice Day the Public Affairs Department, Mrs. William Read, Curator, presented an inspiring patriotic program in the Auditorium, to which the public was invited. Several hundred persons attended, including many club husbands.

Charter Day was of especial interest this year for on that day the club received the gift of the portrait of our first president, Mrs. Harriet W. R. Strong, from her daughters, Mrs. Dean Mason, Miss Harriet P. Strong and Miss Nelle de Luce Strong. With appropriate ceremony the picture was unveiled and it hangs in a prominent place in our lounge.

The club's acceptance of its civic responsibilities was expressed in many ways; first in the opening of our clubhouse to the Community Chest for headquarters and during the drive for funds in November. The committee reported an increase in donations which they said was due, in part, to the courtesy extended to them by our club. Our Salon of Art was thrown open to the public on Wednesday afternoons, that lovers of art might enjoy our exhibitions. The response to the appeal from the Committee for the Unemployed was expressed in the gift of \$1,216.00; for the Parent-Teachers Association Food Fund, \$836.92 was given by our membership; 1,844 cans of milk were given to the Food Conservation Committee.

Outstanding Thursday evening events of the year were two Law Observance dinners sponsored by the Former Officers' Round Table and the Public Affairs Department. Speakers included such noted men as Dr. Chester Rowell, author and publicist, and Dr. Rufus von KleinSmid, president of the University of Southern California. Other evening meetings were the Old Times Party given by the Ways and Means Committee, when four hundred men and women enjoyed old time costumes, old time food, music and dancing; and the complimentary dinner to the artists who have exhibited in our gallery, which was given by the members of the Art Patrons'

Committee, at which time the art prizes for the year were awarded.

Our Monday luncheons have become very popular with our members and the diningroom was filled many times during the past year. A special luncheon in the spring was in honor of members of our club who were serving as state hostesses for the Olympic Games. Every state in the Union was represented, as well as several foreign countries. Old acquaintanceships were renewed while plans were made for the entertainment of the visitors from the home states.

The club's profit from the diningroom this year was \$1,469.77.

The demands upon Rest Cottage and Practical Relief have been unusually great. However, the members of the club have been so generous that Mrs. William R. Wherry and Mrs. T. I. Fletcher have expressed satisfaction in the results attained.

In addition to being grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint for their splendid gift to Ebell for the Scholarship Fund, the club is indebted to them for the wisdom they showed in selecting the securities in which this gift was invested. In this time of omitting payments of dividends, our Scholarship Fund has not been deprived of a single payment.

The gift of the elevator from Mrs. Nicholas Rice and Mrs. Reuben Shettler and the beautiful hangings and Oriental rug from the Art Patrons have added greatly to the comfort and beauty of our club home.

Among erudite speakers on our Department platforms have been Dr. E. C. Moore, Dr. William Munro, Dr. Fredric P. Woellner, Dr. Charles F. Aked, Dr. Carl Sumner Knopf, Hon. Joseph Scott, Mr. Millard Sheets and Mr. Arthur Millier.

The new Garden Department held three meetings and the enthusiastic interest of the members predicts a flourishing department for the new year.

Our Juniors, Miss Winifred Huntington, president, and the other members have been most helpful. In addition to their own definite work they have produced two fine plays for a Monday afternoon program, presented a gift of \$100.00 to the Practical Relief Committee and have assisted with our benefits, Thursday night programs and the new members' tea.

Mrs. Edward L. Wright has been a busy woman with the distribution of 25,000 Law Observance stickers. She has made [39]

many contacts in the city and nation which will prove profitable to the furtherance of law observance.

And the Theatre,—it is very gratifying to note that in such a trying year for most theatres our rentals have exceeded those of last year. The rental by Mrs. James Andrew Rogers of our auditorium to the Thirty-second Church of Christ, Scientist, in December, 1931, for a period of three years, provides a splendid regular income to which incidental rentals may be added.

Members of the Ways and Means Committee, Mrs. Howard R. Miner, Chairman, have given some delightful entertainments. Their quota was reached in May, but they assisted the Board of Directors in the presentation of the final event of the club, our Festival of All Nations. The program, provided through the courtesy of the foreign consuls and their friends, was given late in the afternoon and evening. A buffet supper of home-cooked foods donated by our members will long be remembered. The proceeds, \$674.00, were applied on the mortgage.

Ebell is unique, I think, in the large number of members who actually perform some service to the club and in the individual interest in club business taken by the members at large. And in this very distinct characteristic lies the secret of her continued growth and usefulness. Each committee from the Information Committee and Credentials Committee, which greet you at the door, to the Board of Directors, which supervises the whole club machinery, is an important spoke in the wheel of progress of Ebell's work.

To each member of each committee the president wishes to express her appreciation and gratitude for the faithful, constructive service which you have given your club. The period of association with you was one of the busiest but one of the happiest experiences of her lifetime.

# Report of the Recording Secretary

The records of the Recording Secretary of the Ebell of Los Angeles show that minutes have been taken this year for thirty-five Monday afternoon meetings, forty-one regular and ten called meetings of the Board of Directors.

During the President's hour, preceding the Monday program, prominent speakers have addressed the club on subjects of city, state and national problems, the versatility of which is shown in the following subjects of interest: The Pacific Fleet, Growth of Famous Wedgwood Ware, Law Observance in Traffic, The Community Chest, Occupational Therapy at Sawtelle Soldiers' Home, South Africa, Outdoor Christmas Trees, Present Problems of India, Conservation of Food, Feeding the Hungry in Los Angeles, Need of Our Schools for Temperance Education, Present Financial Conditions, Work of Seaman Church Institute at San Pedro, Relief Work for Unemployed Women in Los Angeles, Philharmonic Orchestra, Abraham Lincoln, Women's Civic Conference at U. S. C., Women Today as Intelligent Thinkers, Better Music Among Children, Associated Women's Committee of Unemployment Relief, Condition of China, 1000 Homes for 1000 Unemployed Women, The Olympic Pins, Entertainment Planned for Olympic Guests, and Summer Feeding of School Children by P. T. A.

Following the presentation of those subjects which called for the immediate relief, an appeal was made from the platform for assistance. As a result, the following responses were made: 1,844 cans of milk were donated to the Food Conservation Committee; \$1,216.00 given for the relief of Unemployed Women and Girls; \$836.92 to feeding of school children this summer; \$437.19 was given as a special collection to needy, through Practical Relief Committee.

Aside from this tangible evidence of interest in outside activities by the club members, upon the request of the Chairman of Resolutions, the following action was taken and confirmed by vote of the club:

A Resolution that we give public support to better law observance in traffic, by constituting ourselves a part of the Citizens Safety Committee of the Los Angeles Traffic Association.

In matters of public interest, the Board of Directors has acted upon recommendation, and confirmed by vote, the following:

Endorsement of the action of Citizens Community Welfare Committee in borrowing \$100,000 to meet the immediate necessity for welfare in community, said sum to be included in Community Chest budget this fall.

Requested letters be sent each councilman expressing the willingness of Ebell Club to cooperate on any proposed plan for the opening of Eighth Street.

Endorsed the Colorado River Bonds.

Sent request to Governor Rolph that a woman, preferably from Southern California, be placed on State Industrial Commission.

Sent letters to each councilman protesting proposed additional stop signals, and requesting instead additional motorcycle police.

Granted use of clubhouse for District No. 1 headquarters during campaign of Community Chest.

Opened Salon of Art one Sunday evening and one Wednesday afternoon a month, that public might be privileged to view pictures on exhibition.

Adopted resolution requesting Frank T. Hines of Washington, D. C., to allocate \$500,000 for building a National Home at Sawtelle for exclusive use of the disabled United States Service Women.

Reaffirmed Ebell's endorsement to Board of Regents of University of California requesting required work for teachers be offered at U. C. L. A. as well as at Berkeley.

In dealing with club policies of importance, the Board of Directors sent a letter to every member of the club inviting suggestions as to how best to retain members. As a result of this consensus of club opinion, the Board took action, and made a temporary special arrangement for reinstatements and new members.

A permanent change was made by a vote of the club at the annual business meeting in June by the following amendment to the Ebell By-Laws:

Article VIII, Section 1, was amended by striking out the words "One Hundred Dollars" and substituting the words

"Fifty Dollars," to read, "The registration fee shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)."

The records for the year show that much of the time and discussion of the Board of Directors has been spent in making every effort to retain the membership through this time of economic stress. The wisdom of this deliberation is shown in the potent results of concessions made, which has enabled the club not only to pay all current expenses, but to reduce materially her indebtedness and to increase the membership roll.

Another year has been written in the history of Ebell—a year of test, from which she has emerged a stronger factor for service than ever before, to her members and to this community, whose best interests she promotes.

# Report of the General Curator

More than ever the adult education in our Ebell University has appealed to our membership. It is gratifying to note that there has been a total attendance of twenty-one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (21,921).

All the curators of our eighteen departments deserve praise for the high type of programs which their efforts have presented. It has been their aim to use our own talented women along with the outside speakers. A new Garden Department was organized in April, with over fifty in attendance.

Throughout the year there have been meetings for the curators to discuss departmental business.

Six departments had professional instructors and conscientious work was carried on. It is through the courtesy of Dr. E. C. Moore of the University of California, Los Angeles, that the instructors may be had for our language classes. Miss Florence M. Bischoff, Court Commissioner in the Probate Department, has generously given a series of lectures for several years in Ebell's Law Department.

Mrs. Frank McQuoid and Mrs. Herbert Chesshire Stone, Assistant General Curators, each assumed a responsibility, keeping in touch with the needs and comforts of the large audiences. They also helped to arrange the programs presented at the Thursday night dinners. Mrs. William P. Traynor, General Credentials Chairman, kept systematic records of attendance, which are useful in organizing work and selecting department officers for the following year.

Our President, Mrs. Charles S. Crail, attended the departments regularly, encouraging and supporting the work. Her interest was a stimulus to the curators and officers.

Club members often expressed their appreciation of the many privileges afforded them in the various fine departments. The new elevator made it possible for some of our members to attend meetings who otherwise were unable to do so. The daily luncheons continued to be a convenience and a source of friendly contact for those present at the morning sessions.

# Report of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

We are happy to again acknowledge our indebtedness to the Social Welfare pioneers in our club who, with dauntless spirit, inspired by prophetic vision and foresight, founded our convalescent home, which has been an "oasis" to hundreds, yes thousands, of women in our community. The black economic cloud that oppresses us all has a silver lining. We have caught glimpses of it through rifts in the cloud, in unselfishness and self sacrifice that heartens the committees in their endeavors.

Mrs. Jack Armstrong Jevne, Assistant Chairman, reports that the food is excellent at the Cottage. The daily menu is recorded in a book for ready reference. Gifts of a hammock for the garden and scales for the bathroom have been received. All the holidays are celebrated, with specially planned table decorations provided by the House Mother.

Our garden is beautiful, under the care of our Garden Chairman, Mrs. Frank P. Ewins, assisted by Mrs. Hunter.

Mrs. George H. Mosher, House Chairman, reports the purchase of a new hall carpet, and that the kitchen and one bedroom have been freshly painted. She invites your attention to the immaculately kept cottage.

The Executive Committee of Rest Cottage recommended to the Board of Directors of Ebell, that the customary fifteen hundred dollars allocated to Rest Cottage from the fund contributed by the Ways and Means Committee be applied this year on our club indebtedness. It was so ordered.

Mrs. James Andrew Rogers, Finance Chairman, reports the purchase by the committee of a one thousand dollar government bond, to be added to our Endowment Fund.

We call attention to the report of Mrs. Edward Everett Sherrard, Membership Chairman, with a record of four new life members and six added to our In Memoriam. Total membership seven hundred fifty-nine; total receipts two thousand six hundred thirty-two dollars and forty cents. We have had gifts of two hundred dollars for Endowment Fund. Mrs. F. W. Pitcher's cash on hand last year, July 1st, was \$1,340.18; this year on July 1st the cash balance is \$1,529.17.

Mrs. W. H. Fine, Chairman of Investigating Committee,

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reports ninety-two investigations made. Two hundred fifty women applied to the chairman for admission. Some were recognized at once as not eligible, while others came with direct recommendations from hospitals and physicians. One hundred sixty-five received our hospitality.

Mrs. Louise Helen Kramer, Transportation Chairman, and her committee fulfilled their required duties, brought guests from hospital and home to Cottage, and extended their service as occasion demanded. On their own initiative they planned drives to beach and country.

Through the findings of conditions in homes of former guests by Mrs. Gilbert Osborne Miller and the Follow-up Committee, many things have been done; to give a brief and varied synopsis: A tubercular child was placed in Olive View Sanitarium; a woman received a pension for the blind; a bedridden invalid was loaned a radio; families in dire need received emergency aid, while hurried contacts were made with Social Welfare Agencies; clothing supplied many times by Mrs. T. J. Fletcher and Practical Relief Committee, also by gifts of clothing to committee and supplies received from Needle Work Guild; admittance to hospital arranged.

Miss Laura Paxton, Press and Program Chairman, gave full reports of our meetings to our club magazine, arranged our Christmas program and gave us interesting programs at our meetings when time permitted.

Mrs. Frank Howell Stanbery, Hospitality Chairman, commenced the year's duties October second with a buffet luncheon honoring Mr. Charles E. Crary, who was represented by his daughter, Mrs. Roy Aldrich Pearson, who presided at the beautiful table, part of the memorial gift for Mrs. Crary.

On December the nineteenth, the annual Christmas dinner was given at the club house to guests and former guests. The hostesses were the officers, former chairmen and committees of Rest Cottage and the Board of Directors of Ebell. The hospitality was keenly appreciated. Hospitality and membership committees gave a tea at the Cottage on March the fourth to all Ebell members.

The Christmas dinner entailed special work for the Secretary, Mrs. Harry J. Brown,—the sending out of three hundred forty-three invitations, checking acceptances and regrets, besides the regular routine. The cheer and beauty that

was brought into the lives of our guests for one glad day was ample compensation to everyone assisting.

We have gratifying cooperation from our house mother, Mrs. Hunter, with her years of hospital service, as graduate nurse and her sympathetic understanding which has been invaluable to the guests and the Chairman. This year in our work each emergency has been met with a response commensurate to the need.



# Report of the Scholarship Committee

The Scholarship Committee of the Ebell Club is pleased to make the following report for the year 1931-1932:

Assistance in full or part scholarships was given to thirty students during the year. Twenty-seven students received the full amount of the Scholarship throughout the school year. Twenty-six young women and four young men have been on our Scholarship roll.

This has been made possible from income derived from four sources.

1st. Income from the Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint Scholarship Fund,

2nd. Income from the Ebell Scholarship Fund,

3rd. Monthly appropriations from the Ebell Treasury,

4th. Gifts from interested friends.

At the close of the first semester, Miss Gladys Brown, student at Chouinard School of Art, was discontinued from the roll as she was able to finance herself. Miss Brown was awarded an Ebell scholarship in February, 1928. An exhibit of her work was hung in our club, in December, and received much praise from visiting artists. Many of her beautiful etchings were sold and many orders taken.

At the close of the second semester eight students graduated. Six from the University of California at Los Angeles; one from Los Angeles Junior College; one from the School of

Optometry at University of Southern California.

Mr. and Mrs. Flint for the fourth time sponsored a Prize Essay Contest, offering one hundred and fifty dollars, in four prizes, for the best essays written on the subject, "The Larger Education." Twenty-two students competed. The four winners were presented their prizes at the Public Affairs Department, by Mrs. Ilot Johnson, a former chairman of the Scholarship Committee.

Excellent work has been done by all our students. The honor of Phi Beta Kappa was given to Maysie F. Johnson,

Junior at U. S. C.

This has been an extremely difficult year for students to earn money and several of our students would not have been able to finish the school year had they not been holders of an Ebell Scholarship. Letters of sincere gratitude and apprecia-

tion from our students show very clearly how greatly they prize the honor of an Ebell scholarship. Scholarships are honor awards, recipients chosen with regard to their scholastic attainments and character, as well as their financial need.

# Lam Gbservance

Report on Law Observance Car Stickers:

25,000 law observance stickers have been distributed for use this year. They are adopted and used by two transportation companies, three large utilities, one department and two furniture stores, the delivery service of six of the large dry goods stores, the Railway Express, some motor coach companies, nine ice cream companies and creameries, five water refrigerating companies and several dairies.

These stickers have been given out at many women's meetings, D. A. R., temperance, Y. W. C. A. city and county, and there have been speakers at the larger groups of church women. Advance notices have been given out by the Church Federation and the ministers of all large churches in Los Angeles and Hollywood presented them this year as was done last year. They have been used at U. S. C. and U. C. L. A. at student and Christian associations. They have been adopted and used at conventions of the Southern California Christian Endeavor, Epworth League and Baptist Young People, and were announced and given out at Allied Prohibition meetings last fall.

Although about one hundred a week are picked up at information desks of the Public Library, the Chamber of Commerce and Automobile Club, yet many people write and telephone for them. Four hundred of them have been mailed out with an eastern magazine. One thousand were sent for and used by the W. C. T. U. of New Jersey. The California Federation of Women's Clubs will formally present a resolution endorsing them, at their summer conference.

I wish you could see the earnestness with which some of these men in high executive positions take hold of this project, and more especially, that you could hear the sincere words of appreciation and approval of Ebell's public declaration and leadership for Law Observance.

# Report of the Practical Relief Committee

Our year began with so many appeals not only for clothing but for work, money and food that we planned for a more strenuous season than we had ever experienced. While we have given out more than ever before, we have also received more.

We are indebted to the Needlework Guild for two hundred sixty garments.

We have sent one hundred fifteen garments to Good Will Industries. We have dressed forty college girls. Eight Helen Matthewson girls graduated this June. Material for seven dresses was given and we made a graduating dress for one girl who was unable to make hers. We have made seven graduating dresses and have dressed twenty-seven high school girls. Thirty-three Rest Cottage women have come to us for assistance and eight women from Hollenbeck Home. Clothing has been sent to Breed Street School and shirts and comforters to Boys Community Lodge. Fifteen layettes have been given out, including two for twins.

The Community Laundry has cleaned twenty-three dresses and three coats free of charge. We feel indebted to the management for its generosity.

Ebell has knitted for the Red Cross from June 1, 1931, to June 1, 1932, twenty-six sweaters for adults, twenty sweaters for children, eight pairs of socks.

Not to leave any warm clothing on our shelves during the holidays, we sent four suits of men's clothing, four pairs of golf trousers, three coats, four odd vests and one woman's coat to Mrs. Snider, organizer of a Women's Service League of the Hollywood Congregational Church. This clothing was very old.

We enjoyed a vacation during July but have met every Friday since with the exception of Christmas and we met Thursday, December thirty-first, instead of New Years. The average attendance has been small, fourteen; this due to the very small attendance during August and September.

Our Christmas activities included thirty-nine nightingales and thirteen hoods sent to the Woman's Infirmary at the County Farm. We sent out one hundred twenty-eight Christmas baskets at an expense of \$2.90 a basket. As our baskets

were very full, most of them being bushel baskets, we could not have been able to do this if it were not for the generous donations of food-jelly, jam, candy, nuts and many canned vegetables and fruits. Two Ebell members brought us eighteen large boxes beautifully wrapped, of home made cookies cut in animal shapes. These were distributed among the families with the largest number of children. Every cent of money donated for Christmas baskets was spent for food with the exception of \$8.75 spent for baskets. We were enabled to do this because Ebell members distributed the baskets, and never before was this work of distribution done so well and so expeditiously. We are indebted to Bullocks for two hundred twenty-four articles. These were distributed among the baskets with the exception of twelve pairs of shoes and twenty hats. The gift included toys, candy, toilet articles, shopping bags and clothing, mostly for children, but our green rubber rain coat made a young girl very happy. She would have had very little for Christmas if we had not taken care of her.

As so many hungry people had appealed to the Practical Relief for food, it was decided by the Board of Directors to allow this committee to make an appeal for money and food. Since the first appeal made in January, one hundred six baskets have been sent out and \$129.29 has been received. Only a few times did we get any great amount of food. Once a crate of eggs was received. Two cases (at different times) of canned tomatoes and one case of mixed canned vegetables were donated. For a month we received very little food and not much money, but since the third appeal in May, we have received over \$40.00, nearly one-half as much as we had received in three and a half months before, but practically no food. Fridays we have given four or five cans to anyone coming to us in great need. This was followed by a big basket later.

The donations from members for this work amounted to \$62.30; with the \$127.29 donated for baskets and other donations mentioned, a total of \$223.00 was spent for the hungry and unemployed.

The past year has been a most strenuous one. Never have we given out so many garments; never have we received so many. The accomplishment would not have been possible if it were not for the cooperation of every member of our depart-

ment. We have heard many curators tell of what fine workers they have but I know there are none finer, and I believe none as hard working, as the members of Practical Relief.

Our thanks are due to our President, Mrs. Charles S. Crail, to the Social Welfare chairman, Mrs. Harry A. Ford, and to the remaining members of the Board of Directors. Neither do we forget many kindnesses extended by Mrs. Stribling, the office force, Mr. and Mrs. Glenn, Max and Will. To the members of the Ebell Club as a whole and to the Ebell Juniors, who with their generous gift have made it possible for us to carry on this summer, we extend our sincere thanks and appreciation.

# Salon of Art

Turning a retrospective eye over the past year, we believe the Salon of Art may feel that something has been accomplished, something done toward that for which it was organized: a stimulated interest within our club toward all things artistic, a friendliness and helping hand extended toward the artists in our midst, and a fostering of that subtle, refining influence of Art in our community.

It has been the effort of the committee to bring to Ebell the best art available in paintings, prints and sculpture, in the nine varied exhibitions of the year. Distinguished among these was the one-man show of Dean Cornwell, whose murals soon to be installed in our Public Library will make of him a world renowned name, and that of Colin Campbell Cooper, A. N. A., whose architect pictures were among those most enjoyed. One of the outstanding months was the "Religious Art" exhibition in December when our beautiful gallery was aglow with the old world pictures of the past centuries. Other exhibitors were the Wachtels (Marion and Elmer), two of California's much loved artists; Aron Kilpatrick, best painter of eucalyptus trees; Hansen Puthuff, gentle nature poet of the Sierras; Karoly Fulop, the gifted Hungarian artist; Gordon Coutts, worldwide painter, now of Palm Springs, and Willy Pogany, whose illustrations of The Rubaiyat were admired by all.

Two interesting print collections have occupied the Galeria, one by well known men who are doing work in that line, the other by the eminent art critic and etcher, Arthur Millier, and his students. Artists of note have occupied the space with water colors, such as H. Neville-Smith, Harold Gaze, and

Elsie Palmer Payne.

In May the Annual Exhibition of California Painters was held, together with a splendid showing of the California Sculptors. Three prizes came from individual members of the Art Patrons' Committee and a fourth from the committee at large. The Jury of Awards, composed of representative artists of Los Angeles, voted the first painter's prize, the "Elizabeth Holmes Fisher Prize," to Edward Bruce. of California; the second, the "Jean C. Cook Prize," to Maynard Dixon of San Francisco. To Claribel Gaffney, young Los Angeles woman, was given the first sculptor's prize, and the second, the "Mrs. Wil-

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liam Clark Brown Prize," went to Eugenia Everett. In June, the California Water Color Society exhibition was hung in the Galeria, representing most of our best water colorists. Two prizes were given for this, the committee giving the first to Lee Blair, and "An Art Patron," the second, awarded to Lola C. Lewis.

It is hoped by many of the committee that next year we may add to our dignity by having a "Jury of Selection."

The social side of the committee, under the direction of Miss Ada A. Dryden and her excellent committee, gave a number of brilliant parties, outstanding among them, perhaps, the December dinner, when our club was gay with the Christmas spirit, and made especially lovely by the background of the Gallery, hung with the pictures of faces and figures which created our Christmas time. There were two Sunday teas, one honoring the students of the art departments of our colleges, the other, in June, having as special guests the members of the California Water Color Society and California Art Club. One long-to-be-remembered day was when the group made a "Little Journey" to Palm Springs in April, visiting the desert studios of the Village.

In January the committee members were entertained, through the courtesy of Mrs. von KleinSmid, by the Art Department of U. S. C., and on another occasion by the Art Department of U. C. L. A. An innovation of this season has been the "Open House Day" which we hope in time may become a feature of the Gallery. The closing event of importance was the May dinner when more than one hundred artists who had exhibited during the past year were entertained at a dinner and musical. The program was provided by the Zoellner Quartette, in honor of Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher, who had just returned from a world tour.

In the early part of the year the Salon was hung with velvet, purchased with funds accumulated from the two years' chairmanship of Mrs. Sydney A. Temple, and in May the beauty of the Salon seemed completed by the addition of an oriental rug, the gift to the club by the Art Patrons' Committee

More than thirty new members have been added to the list of names forming the Art Patrons' Committee, and an

added interest has been shown by the ever increasing numbers always in attendance in the galleries.

The chairman cannot relinquish this work without expressing a word of the gratitude she feels toward the President of Ebell and her Board of Directors for their support at all times, and to the women of the active committee whose cheerful and able assistance has made of this arduous task, a real joy.

### Report of the President of the Ebell Inniors

The co-ordination of its many parts and the co-operation of its members are indispensable essentials in any successful organization, and the achievements of the Ebell Juniors this past year have been based on, and due to, a continuous application of these two factors. Success of one kind is measured only by deeds accomplished—both the kind of a deed and the number of deeds. Another type of success is much more difficult to measure, for it is an intangible something—the growth of Aims, Ideals, and the spirit of Friendliness and Companionship. One type of success without the other would indicate a poorly balanced organization, and yet it is impossible to fully incorporate an expression of the advancement made in this intangible line in a report of this kind. Suffice it to say that it has been a predominating influence over the more concrete deeds.

The Ebell Junior sections have been enthusiastically supported, and there has been an increase in the amount of work completed, as the following reports will indicate.

The expansion of the Drama Department was so rapid in its first year that it was thought advisable to hold the meetings this year at Ebell instead of at the homes of members. The two meetings a month were held on the second and fourth Tuesdays, and the programs included not only entertainment, but also study and instruction in the various phases of Dramatic Art. Included in the latter subjects were Play Reviewing and Reading, Pantomime, Make-up for the stage, Theater Ethics, and Delsarte.

Outstanding in the other activities of the Drama Department was the production of four one-act plays. Two of these, "Love is Like That," by Florence Ryerson and Colin Clements, and "The Imp," by Erastus Osgood, were presented as a Monday afternoon program for Ebell. These two plays were given in place of our customary three-act play. The second performance of one of the other plays constituted the entertainment for a Thursday night dinner, and was directed, as were the others, by Mrs. Charles Edward Futch.

Mrs. Cameron Livingston Thom and her assistant, Mrs. William Molony, Jr., have been responsible for a most inter-

esting year for the Junior Book Chamber. The meetings have been held at the homes of members, and have had a spirit of informality that has encouraged even the most timid to take courage and review a book. Approximately eighty books were reviewed, and current events were presented at most of the meetings. The average attendance was twenty-five. Our largest meeting was the one with an attendance of forty-five, and our most unusual one was the combined Book Chamber and Swimming Party at the beach.

The Third Vice-President of the Ebell Juniors is chairman of the Social Welfare Committee. This office was held by Miss Elizabeth Lloyd, and great credit is due to her for the work carried on in answering the many calls increased by the stress and strain of present economic conditions. Starting with the first Monday in October, regular meetings were held at the homes of the various members. Due to the faithful efforts of the girls who attended these meetings, forty-four dresses and five rompers were completed. These garments helped in the clothing of the nineteen children of the five families supported by the Ebell Juniors. All other clothes were purchased from our Welfare Fund or were donated by our many friends, as were also milk and food. One Thanksgiving basket and nine large Christmas baskets, containing a wellbalanced dinner and candy and toys for each child, were distributed during the holidays.

Two scholarships—one for the entire year, and the other for half of the year—were given to students at the University of California at Los Angeles. As this work is really a part of the Junior Welfare work, the two funds, the Scholarship fund and the Child Welfare fund, have been combined into one fund known as the Ebell Junior Welfare fund. In so doing, it is felt that the scope of activity will be increased, and that greater benefit will be derived from the one large fund.

Under the direction of Mrs. Robert Silas Redington, chairman of the Work and Play Committee, and her assistants, Mrs. Frank Copple and Mrs. Paul Robinson, the monthly bridge parties were carried on with great success both from the social as well as from the financial point of view. The parties were given on the fourth Friday of each month, with the exception of December, in the Solarium, with an average attendance of forty-five. In addition to these seven parties,

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a Contract Bridge Party was given on April the eighth, with an attendance of seventy-two. The proceeds from this party amounted to twenty-two dollars and ten cents, and the proceeds from the other parties came to thirty dollars and sixty cents, totalling fifty-two dollars and seventy cents. This sum was added to the Welfare fund.

The first benefit of the year was a supper-dance at Ebell on December eighth. The dining room of the clubhouse was transformed into a Hawaiian scene, and our guests were given the opportunity to enjoy "A Night at Waikiki." The net profit from this party was forty-four dollars and twenty-six cents, the whole of which was used for the Christmas work of the Social Welfare Committee.

Two hundred thirty dollars and sixty-nine cents were also added to the Welfare fund as the profit from the Bridge Tea and Fashion Show given at Ebell on May twenty-first. Bullock's generously presented the fashion show, with fifteen of our own Junior girls modeling the clothes. This party, as well as the supper dance, was in charge of the Benefits Chairman, Mrs. Thomas Mahl, and Miss Ruth Kennedy, Chairman of Tickets.

The amount of money raised from these activities and added to the Ebell Junior Welfare fund totaled three hundred twenty-seven dollars and sixty-five cents.

The expenses for the year were as follows:

For the two scholarships—one hundred fifty dollars. For the Social Welfare dress and sewing materials—one hundred nineteen dollars and fifty-two cents. For Christmas baskets—forty-one dollars and sixty-four cents. The total expense amounted to three hundred nineteen dollars and sixteen cents.

One hundred dollars was presented to the Practical Relief Committee of Ebell for summer work carried on by them.

The Thursday Night dinners at Ebell were well attended and greatly enjoyed by our members. On the evening of October twenty-ninth, the Ebell Juniors acted as co-hostesses and decorated the dining room in true Hallowe'en fashion. Witches, pumpkins, and ghost stories added gaiety to the atmosphere.

One hundred six new members were admitted to membership in the Ebell Juniors this year, and it has been the pleasure of the Membership Chairman and Second Vice President, Mrs.

Lawrence Hauge, and of the other officers and members of long standing to extend a cordial welcome to these girls.

Three years ago the Juniors were honored by being made representatives of Ebell on the Los Angeles Girls' Council, and have continued as such since that time. This past year, the added honor of being a member of the Executive Board of the Council was bestowed upon us. The President of the Juniors has served in this capacity. The members of our organization served as ushers at two conferences held by the Council, and the Executive Board representative assisted on the Program committee for the annual Spring Conference, March fourth and fifth. The theme for the program was "The Philosophy of Today's Girl."

The latter part of the club year presented an opportunity unique and possible only in the year Nineteen Hundred Thirty-two. This was the opportunity of combining with all of the other Junior Club organizations in and about Los Angeles to form the Junior Olympic Hospitality Group. The purpose in organizing this group was to have an organization of young women co-operating with and under the direction of The Hostesses of the Tenth Olympic Games. The Ebell Juniors have taken a prominent part in this work through the individual ardor and faithfulness of many members, and we are happy to have been privileged to participate in any work pertaining to the Olympic Games.

The programs for the regular monthly meetings were under the direction of the Program Chairman, Mrs. Brodie Ahlport, and her assistant chairmen, Mrs. Harold Craig, Miss Therese Joannes, and Miss Elizabeth Scattergood. These excellent and worthwhile programs were as follows:

OCTOBER: "Timely Modes," a fashion show by our members wearing their own clothes. The groups of styles were separated and interpreted through the hours of the day by the means of a large clock made by the Poster Committee.

NOVEMBER: Two one-act plays presented by our own members: "Cats' Claws," by Gertrude E. Jennings, and "Tea and Conversation," by Colin Campbell Clements. These plays were directed by Mrs. Charles Edward Futch.

JANUARY: An informal lecture on Contract Bridge by Mrs. Walter Kaufmann.

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FEBRUARY: Musicale: Miss Emily Korstad, Violiniste, accompanied by Miss Lucile Mahaffery; Miss Arlene Washburn, Reader; and Miss Mary Elizabeth Waldorf, Soprano.

MARCH: The Honorable Lewis R. Works. Subject: "The History of Dueling."

APRIL: Program under the auspices of Book Chamber: Mrs. Edward A. Tufts presented a delightful program of book reviews.

MAY: Annual children's party at the home of Miss Elizabeth Scattergood.

JUNE: Installation Luncheon.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to serve as President of the Ebell Juniors, and this has been true largely due to the loyalty, faithfulness, and co-operation of the Junior Board and the entire Junior membership; to the assistance and wise counsel of Mrs. Charles S. Crail, President of Ebell, and Mrs. Harry A. Ford, Chairman of the Junior Advisory Committee; and to the Ebell Board of Directors for their generosity and interest in the Ebell Juniors. I hope that the same spirit of friendliness and harmony will continue under each new President for many years in the future, and the Ebell Juniors will "Carry On" to even greater heights than we, in this year, can possibly anticipate.

### Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

\*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

## By-Laws

#### ARTICLE I

#### NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

#### ARTICLE II

#### OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

#### ARTICLE III

#### OFFICERS

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE IV POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

SECTION 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

SECTION 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election.

### [The EBELL of Los Angeles]

Any person serving one half or more of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

SECTION 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions given for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SECTION 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

#### ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees and a Club Parliamentarian, and be exofficio a member of all committees. She shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers; shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club, and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

SECTION 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Magazine.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

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The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.
- SECTION 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.
- SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly report of all receipts and expenditures. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

SECTION 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

SECTION 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

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SECTION 8. The Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees and shall represent on the Board of Directors all welfare activities not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws.

SECTION 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations.

SECTION 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval.

SECTION 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

SECTION 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer, giving her a statement designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Chairman of Rentals and all other directors in charge of the business of the Club. She shall be custodian of the seal, books, and records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club, and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer for the faithful performance of her duties.

#### ARTICLE VI STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Former Officers' Round Table
- 3. Departments
- . Finance

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- 5. Hospitality and Welfare
- House
- Membership 7.
- Printing
- 9. Program
- 10. Public Relations
- 11. Rentals
- 12. Rest Cottage
- 13. Scholarship
- 14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.

SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.

SECTION 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.

SECTION 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.

SECTION 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 6. The Hospitality and Welfare Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the

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Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

SECTION 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall supervise the building and its contents.

SECTION 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

SECTION 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Magazine and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

SECTION 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering.

SECTION 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

SECTION 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

SECTION 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

SECTION 15. Chairmen of Committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

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All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Magazine and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the applicant for a period of .................................(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted

as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than three applications for regular membership, three for temporary membership, and three for Junior membership during each year.

SECTION 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SECTION 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

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SECTION 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.

SECTION 5. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for one (1) year may apply for life membership by signing the blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in ARTICLE VII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay five hundred dollars (\$500.00), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

SECTION 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Magazine and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership, without payment of dues.

Section 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

SECTION 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

SECTION 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

SECTION 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club mem-

bership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

SECTION 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed once in any subsequent year. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

SECTION 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one half of the regular admission fee, or one half of the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SECTION 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VIII

DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SECTION 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the

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Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member of the Club who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

#### ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

SECTION 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

SECTION 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted

at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

#### ARTICLE X

#### ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for three (3) years and shall not be eligible for election for a second consecutive term in the same office. No member shall be eligible to serve more than nine (9) consecutive years on the Board of Directors.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into three (3) groups: the first group shall consist of the President, the First Vice-President, the General Curator, the Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, and the Chairman of Public Relations; the second group shall consist of the Fourth Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Chairman of Finance, the Chairman of Rentals, and the Chairman of Rest Cottage Association; and the third group shall consist of the Second Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Corresponding Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Scholarships.

At each annual election one of these groups shall be elected for a term of three (3) years beginning with Group Number Three. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

(See Footnote)

SECTION 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

#### Nominations

SECTION 3. The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors and shall not be eligible for a second term.

Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in October for the purpose of electing

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a chairman and completing the organization of the committee. Meetings thereafter shall be held at least once a month at the call of the Chairman. A meeting may be called at any time by any three members of the committee.

SECTION 5. Not later than March first of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for the several offices to be filled at the ensuing election including nine places for the Nomincting Committee.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with a name of not more than one member for each office. This blank so filled out shall be signed by the member as her name appears in the Year Book and returned to the chairman of the Nominating Committee at the clubhouse on or before April first.

SECTION 6. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a ballot for the annual election which shall include all names receiving on the nominating ballot fifty (50) or more votes for one office and such other names as the Nominating Committee shall, by a two-thirds vote, select for each office.

The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing the name on the ballot.

SECTION 7. On the fourth Monday in April the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

#### Election

SECTION 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

SECTION 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine.

SECTION 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between May first and May fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall

be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary. The Board of Directors shall canvass these ballots at the first regular meeting after the election, after which these ballots may be destroyed.

SECTION 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

#### ARTICLE XI CLUB ACTIVITIES

SECTION 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) the Social Welfare Work, specific and general, including Ebell Rest Cottage Association under the control of its own Chairman, and Practical Relief and General Philanthropies; (4) Scholarships; (5) and the Ebell Juniors.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

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All members of departments must be members of The Ebell

of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments. plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband: to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference

to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members

of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Com-

mittee on Departments.

#### ARTICLE XII CLUB POLICIES

SECTION 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

SECTION 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

#### AMENDMENTS ARTICLE XIII

SECTION 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

SECTION 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

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SECTION 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

#### ARTICLE XIV PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

#### ARTICLE XV CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1398, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1932. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

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### Resolutions

### Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified

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public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

# Form of Bequest or Devise For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage.......dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:.....

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

# By-Laws of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

#### OBJECT ARTICLE I

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

#### OFFICERS ARTICLE II

SECTION 1. The officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SECTION 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE III DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SECTION 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except the Chairman, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

#### ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees, shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the Association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged,

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and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of Ebell.

#### ARTICLE V STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Finance
- 2. Membership
- Investigation
- Transportation
- Follow-up Program
- 7. Hospitality

SECTION 2. The Finance Committee, one member of which shall be the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles, shall verify the monthly financial reports of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

SECTION 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining, Life, and Memorial Members.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### DUES

SECTION 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

SECTION 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SECTION 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SECTION 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a life or a memorial member.

#### ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the month of August.

SECTION 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Friday in June at eleven A.M. Polls open until noon.

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SECTION 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SECTION 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SECTION 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

SECTION 3. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeting.

SECTION 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

#### ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SECTION 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

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### By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

#### ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

#### ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

#### ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

SECTION 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of the Ebell Juniors.

SECTION 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors, but shall defray all expenses not so authorized.

#### ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall sign all bills; shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

SECTION 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell Magazine, all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

SECTION 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SECTION 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

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SECTION 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee.

Section 6. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive from the Financial Secretary of Ebell all moneys ordered paid to her by the Treasurer of the Club, giving a receipt therefor, in which shall be stated the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

#### ARTICLE V STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Courtesy
- 3. Credentials
- 4. Program
- 5. Scholarship
- Social Welfare
- Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

SECTION 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

SECTION 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

SECTION 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Scholarship Chairman of Ebell, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors and shall administer all the scholarship funds of the Juniors.

Section 6. Chairmen of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

SECTION 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

SECTION 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

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#### ARTICLE VI

#### MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty years.

SECTION 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation and shall then follow the procedure for regular membership in Ebell.

SECTION 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SECTION 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of a member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional

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attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted: she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

#### ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Wednesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December.

SECTION 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

SECTION 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending nine regular Monday meetings during each year.

#### ARTICLE IX ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in June. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

#### Nominations

SECTION 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

SECTION 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

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Nominations from the floor shall be called for and if there are no further nominations, the report of the Nominating Committee shall be accepted. This report shall be published in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine.

#### Election

SECTION 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Advisor on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of standing committees.

#### ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

# Standing Kules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members may bring three guests to all open Monday afternoon programs by paying fifty cents each.

Junior members shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and may bring three guests to such meetings, by paying fifty cents each.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive ten guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

Calling cards may be used for guests in the Bible and Public Affairs Departments.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.
