President's Report

The facts set forth in the report of the president of Ebell for the year 1930-31 might well be called an exemplification of the scriptural verse, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." The year's work of the club has been a demonstration of giving to others by many persons, who were generous both with their time and their money. They surely would not have given so much if they had not been happier in so doing.

The Former Officers through their continued interest in the club have assisted in the work by sponsoring certain events and by preparing the new By-Laws. On this latter undertaking the committee worked through the greater part of last summer. The Board members have devoted the major part of their time through the year to planning and executing the detailed tasks essential to a successful club. The curators have been busy preparing and producing the programs for their departments. The chairmen and members of the respective committees have worked early and late to secure that harmony of action and achievement which has been like smoothly running machinery.

Important men and women have without charge given to the club the benefit of experiences gained in various parts of the world and through long years of study in the fields of literature, art, drama and public affairs. Among these have been residents of our own community, who through excellence in their fields of endeavor have become known throughout the world; and among them, also, have been men and women who have brought to us messages from many lands, lands ranging from our familiar sister country, England, to the strange, mysterious, distant Tibet. Their subjects have been as varied as their personalities. Some of the discourses have carried us, with their presentation of cultural and idealistic achievements, on flights of ecstasy; such for instance as the development of a new method of sculpture through the aid of motion pictures, as presented by William F. Engelman, or the approach of the millennium, as presented by Christabel Pankhurst, or the exploring of the temples of Angkor, lost to the world for several centuries and described to us by the daughter of one of our own members.

Our feet have been kept on earth by addresses on such

practical subjects as the purpose of our Navy, as told to us by Admiral Schofield, who is at the head of the Navy of the United States; the American citizen's neglect of his right to vote, which Richard Washburn Child pointed out; the suffering and need which exists in our midst as described by officers of the largest Parent-Teacher organization in the world and by other welfare organizations. These are but a very small number of the many topics we have been privileged to hear discussed during the year. The list could be extended profitably over many pages.

The financial gifts are equally impressive. Mr. Charles N. Flint and his wife Mrs. Flint, Past President and Lady Bountiful of the club, have added to their former gift to the Scholarship fund of \$40,000, another \$15,000, which increases our scholarships to twenty-seven. Mr. and Mrs. Flint also gave \$5000 for an Endowment Fund for Rest Cottage, \$1000 for current expenses of the Cottage, and \$150 for Scholarship essay prizes. Mrs. George F. Bishop presented Rest Cottage with a new sun-room, Mr. Charles Egleston Crary gave a dining room set and other friends gave an electric refrigerator and additional furnishings.

From the estate of Oliver P. Hershman came a bequest of \$2500 less the inheritance tax. Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher again gave prizes for best paintings by California artists. Members of our club who are Native Daughters of California presented the club with a beautiful silk California flag. Mrs. Harold Janss gave \$40 for prizes for the best poems written by Ebell members. In honor of the birthday of Shakespeare, Mrs. Norman P. Hall had planted in our garden a live-oak tree. Mrs. Ruth McClintock gave the club the new large flower urns in the patio and smaller pots for the dining room which were decorated beautifully by the Applied Design Department. Members who have written books have given autographed copies, others have given current books to the library. The Juniors gave from their fund \$150 to be applied on the philanthropies of the regular club. From the general membership have come gifts which made possible a generous offering of almost \$2000 to the Child Nutrition Fund, \$1280.44 to the Red Cross and one hundred twenty-nine Christmas baskets to the Veterans.

In a year of world depression the financial condition of the club is sound and promising. Twenty thousand dollars has

Through our Rentals chairman, Mrs. James A. Rogers, and the help of our Theater Manager, our rentals have amounted to \$16,416.71. An income from auditorium guest tickets of \$2739 was reported by Mrs. Hosmer C. Graham, chairman. The Solarium Tea Committee, with Mrs. Robert M. Hartwell, chairman, brought in \$711.44 from which they presented \$528 to our philanthropic fund, \$100 for the black stage curtain, and have a small amount left in the treasury.

The dining room furnished a revenue of \$1946.48. The Benefits Committee, of which Mrs. Frank Brown Wheat is chairman, gave three parties. With the co-operation of the Music and Drama Departments an Easter Pageant was given under the direction of the Benefits Committee and in June the committee produced an operetta with a cast of many professionals and members of Ebell. The proceeds from these entertainments amounted to \$2533.55 and is to be applied to

our philanthropies.

Through strict economy on the part of our chairmen and committee members the various departments of the club have been able to reduce the cost of operating in almost every instance. With a view to presenting the best programs possible, the Monday program budget was increased to \$7500 last year. Our programs were excellent and the large attendance was evidence that the members were pleased with them. Lectures from a literary standpoint were the best attended during the year. Will Durant brought out the largest number of people. Mrs. Vallely's book reviews welcomed the greatest number of guests. The business meetings were the most poorly attended as has been usual during the years. This seems strange when one realizes that at the business meetings the officers elected by the members give reports of their stewardship in our association in which each member is an interested partner. Next to book reviews in the order of their popularity were lectures, dramatic presentations, and musicales.

The daily luncheons and Thursday night dinners have offered opportunity for many splendid programs by the departments and special committees. Too much can not be said in recognition of the efficient manner in which Mrs. Newton Everett Cramer and her assistant, Mrs. Charles F. DeLong and their committees have handled this new venture in our

club life. Four luncheons were outstanding: October twentyseventh, exactly thirty-six years from the day Ebell was founded, a luncheon was given in honor of our Charter Members, nine of whom were with us and responded to toasts. At another table twenty-eight other women who have been members of the club thirty years or more were honored. During the Christmas holidays, Rest Cottage Association entertained the guests and former guests at their annual Christmas luncheon. Later in the year members of our club who are presidents of other organizations or who serve on important civic commissions or committees were honored, and the list numbered one hundred four. Our last meeting of the year was a luncheon honoring the retiring officers of the Board: Mrs. William Read, who has served the club in many capacities from department chairman to president of the club, Mrs. Charles D. Burt, who has long years of service to her credit, Mrs. Julian E. Garnsey, our efficient auditor, and Mrs. Harry L. Bentley, who arranged the splendid Monday programs during the last year.

The attendance at the Thursday night dinners has warranted their continuance for another year. The response from the departments that furnished programs following the dinners has been most gratifying. Our dinners have brought to the club the families and friends of the members who on their

part have expressed their appreciation of the club.

Several evening meetings are worth noting. On January twentieth, Ebell was hostess to a group of the noted men and women who are residents in our community. The group included scientists, philosophers, musicians, artists, actors, authors, and public men who have brought distinction to Southern California. The program was given by our guests and it therefore gave us the privilege of seeing and hearing many famous persons, our only knowledge of whom heretofore had come through long distance range. Mrs. William Milton Kinney had general charge of the arrangements for the dinner. In March the Former Officers' Round Table sponsored a dinner stressing the importance of Law Observance. Executives from student organizations and men and women in active public life were our guests. Miss Frederica de Laguna

arranged the program which consisted of talks by men in important educational and civic positions, and greetings from the young student groups. At this time the launching of the Law Observance stickers for automobiles was announced, a movement suggested by one of our own members, Mrs. Edward L. Wright, which has spread throughout the city, state and nation. Another night gathering was under the direction of x the Art Patrons Committee when the guests of honor were artists and sculptors who have exhibited in the club during the year. The Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher prizes were awarded at this time. Then there was the dinner when the Book Chamber provided the program and had as guests and speakers authors of mystery stories. In May our Public Relations Committee invited as guests officials of city, county and state departments with which Ebell has direct dealings, with the object of closer co-operation. Mr. S. S. McClure, noted editor and writer, was the speaker of the evening.

In addition to their regular meetings, almost every department has had one or more special luncheons, with distinguished guests and unique programs, including Shakespearian actors in the Shakespeare Department, motion picture stars and stage celebrities in the Drama Department, famous musicians in the Music Department, a mock trial in the Law Department, and many other special features in other departments. The Poetry Department received the local poets at a tea in the reception room in the month of April. The Juniors entertained their mothers on one occasion and their children on another. The members of the Salon of Art visited galleries within and outside the city.

Last April for the first time, Ebell had a Creative Exhibition when our members exhibited their own creations. The Exhibition was the inspiration of Mrs. Daniel Beecher, curator of the Applied Design Department, and included paintings, prose, poetry, music and crafts.

Under the new By-Laws several important changes should be noted. The Board of Directors numbers fifteen, all elective. The first vice-president becomes the program chairman. A Finance Committee is formed which has general supervision over all finances of the club. The age limit of the Juniors is raised to thirty years.

Included in the losses we have suffered by death are those of two former presidents, Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, and Mrs. William T. Lewis, also Mrs. Charles Egleston Crary, a former director.

Club work, like mercy, is twice blessed; it blesses him that gives and him that takes. Success in club work is assured if certain qualities are possessed by the workers, and success in club work multiplies those same qualities. They are faith, hope, and friendship, and the greatest of these is friendship.

Report of the Recording Secretary

The records of the Recording Secretary of the Ebell of Los Angeles during this year have been extensive, for they contain the changes in our laws necessitated by the advancement of our organization, and a desire to simplify its government to the greatest degree. These pages contain the revision of the By-Laws of the Ebell of Los Angeles, The Ebell Juniors, and the Ebell Rest Cottage Association. Minutes have been taken for thirty-five Monday afternoon meetings, thirty-four regular meetings of the Board of Directors and two called meetings, and thirty-five regular and eight called meetings of the Executive Committee.

The desire to promote that innate spirit of friendly courtesy, which has ever characterized Ebell Club, has been manifested on the Monday platform by the President, Mrs. Charles S. Crail, during the hour preceding the program, in presenting to the Club the Chairmen of all Standing Committees, and by the General Curator, Mrs. W. L. McLeod, in introducing department curators, thus permitting the Club to become better acquainted with the active workers of the year.

During this President's hour also, prominent speakers have brought messages of outside interests to the Club, on the following subjects: The Community Chest; Exemption of Taxes for non-profit Hospitals; World Peace; Citizenship; Public Safety and Traffic from Auto Club View Point; Lighted Living Christmas Trees; Soldiers' Relief at Holiday Time; the Unemployment of Women and Girls; Civic Grand Opera of Hollywood; Law Enforcement of Traffic by Police; Red Cross Relief Work; The Boys' Community Lodge; Relief to Drought Sufferers; Young Women's Christian Association; Abraham Lincoln; Creating Work for the Unemployed; D. A. R.'s work in Preserving History; Employment of Married Women; Law Observance; Need of Passage of School Bonds; Work of R. O. T. C. during Time of Peace; Prevention of Forest Fires; League of Nations; Women's Part in World Peace; Our Public Schools; Forgotten Islands of the South Seas; Sesqui-Centennial Celebration; The Hollywood Bowl; California Motion Picture Council for Better Films; The Pilgrimage Play; Los Angeles Municipal Band; Work of P.-T. A for City's Undernourished Children; and Value to Los Angeles of coming La Fiesta.

These messages have created interest in civic activities, and Ebell has endorsed some with memberships and resolutions.

Mrs. A. Bennett Cooke, Chairman of Resolutions, has presented, and the Club has confirmed by vote, the following resolutions:

- To President Hoover, endorsing him in his position that the relief to drought sufferers be given through the medium X of the Red Cross.
- To City Council, requesting that a traffic signal be placed x at intersection of Wilshire and Lucerne.
- 3. To Regents of University of California, endorsing the action of the Educational Committee of Los Angeles City Teachers, requesting that the extension work for teachers be offered at U. C. L. A. as well as Berkeley.
- 4. To Citizens' Sewer Bond Committee, endorsing the bond issue for constructing a larger sewer system in Los Angeles.
- To President Hoover, endorsing the accession of the United States to the World Court.

A letter was sent to the City Council by the Board of Directors, protesting change of name of Cahuenga Pass and San Fernando Road to Highland Avenue. A telegram was forwarded from the Executive Committee to the Hon. Clifford Wixson, Labor and Capital Committee, Sacramento, opposing the proposed bill on the restriction in employment of married women in State positions.

The revised By-Laws were presented at the regular Monday meeting by Mrs. Charles D. Burt, Chairman of By-Laws Committee, and passed by vote of the Club, and are printed elsewhere in the Year Book.

The Board of Directors has transacted all permanent business of the Club. Each Director has reported on the definite work assigned to her.

Report of the General Curator

Throughout the club year of 1930-1931, more than half of the department programs has been furnished by our own membership. Total number of meetings was two hundred eight (208) and the total department attendance seventeen thousand two hundred thirty-one (17,231). There were one hundred forty (140) officers serving in departments.

It has been the endeavor of all curators "to prefer to look for the highest, not simply the high."

The programs presented in the Bible Literature, Browning and Shakespeare groups have been a moulding influence on the character and mind of Ebell members. Curators of these departments aimed to present their subjects for better understanding, for enlarged visions and unbiased opinions.

The Poetry and Applied Design Departments emphasized creativeness and originality. A contest was held for writers of poetry, with prizes awarded and honorable mention conferred. Members of the Applied Design section painted fifty-five (55) attractive flower pots for use in Ebell's dining room. Both these departments entered heartily into the Creative Work Exhibition, held during the month of April.

A large increase in attendance of the Book Chamber Department indicates interest in training for that line of work under its efficient instructor. Members by request have repeated their book reviews at the Friday Morning and the Hollywood Woman's Clubs.

The Drama and Drama Workshop Curators have encouraged worthy and artistic play writing, stage training and presentation. The curator of Drama has brought to us eminent men and women who have given interesting talks as well as entertained us with their talents.

From Public Affairs, Law, Parliamentary Law, and Lives and Times we have gained useful knowledge and instruction. We have had civic affairs, information on the laws women should know, and affairs of interest for the home-maker. Special drills in Parliamentary Law were given for curators and secretaries, aside from the regular course of study. Miss Florence Bischoff, an attorney, again donated her services to the Law Department. In realization of our moral obligations, reverence for and observance of law were featured.

No expense to the Club has been incurred, for all the speakers donated their services and valuable time.

The Art Exhibitions Chairman and Committee have brought to us varied and charming collections of paintings and sculpture for our Salon, with a definite purpose of stimulating a greater appreciation for the finest in Art. The Art Patrons made it possible for us to hear a lecture from the famous sculptor, Lorado Taft. Gallery talks have been featured and the brilliant evening parties at Ebell were much appreciated and enjoyed.

Art and Travel Department carried us to Mexico, Oberammergau, India, little known and far-away Tibet, then to our own Nantucket and Los Angeles Plaza, with fine lectures and pictures and also attractive musical numbers. Large audiences attended each meeting.

With the best of instructors from the University of California at Los Angeles, our French and Spanish study classes have progressed most satisfactorily. The course of instruction prescribed for our language classes corresponds to that at the University, in that our thirty lessons at Ebell equal the work of a quarter, or ten weeks, at the University.

One curator, along with her several subjects, treated during the club year, recommends the following: "Learn to laugh; learn to tell a helpful story; learn to keep your troubles to yourself; learn to stop croaking; learn to greet your friends with a smile; try to bring yourself into such rhythm and harmony in your work and in your play that your lives will always express the real joy of living."

Report of the Art Exhibitions Committee

The Art Exhibitions Committee begs to submit the following report of the season's activities and the numerous exhibitions of painting and sculpture held in the respective galleries, namely: the Salon of Art, the Galeria and the Fine Arts Room.

From October, 1930, to July, 1931, these galleries have held exhibitions of oils, water colors or etchings of exceptional merit, new exhibitions being hung at the beginning of each month, an average of eighty-five new paintings being required. Attractive catalogues have been furnished the members at the cost of ten cents apiece, and the sale of them has been most gratifying.

Nicolia Fechin, born in Russia, is one of the greatest painters in America and lives in Palm Springs. We had a oneman show of his this year.

William Spencer Bagdatopoulus is an Englishman and a distinguished painter of portraits and figures. His water colors are superb. We presented his work as a one-man show.

Samuel Armstrong of Santa Barbara, whose murals as well

as his portraits are very fine and show extreme refinement. was also granted an entire gallery.

Count Arnaldo Tamburini of Italy has given us some ex-

quisite canvases.

The Samuel Kingan Collection gave us the privilege of studying the important works of our American men, each canvas being a museum painting.

- We have exhibited paintings that ranged from one hundred dollars to as high as thirty thousand. A liberal education!

Kathryn Leighton was given the only one-woman show in the Salon.

We have established the Ebell Salon of Art as one of the most important on the Pacific Coast, and we shall maintain it as such in the future.

In May of each year fifty of the outstanding painters of Southern California are invited to exhibit with us, and the "Elizabeth Holmes Fisher Prize" is awarded to the painting selected by a Jury of Awards. Carl Oscar Borg was awarded the first prize in 1930. Douglas Parshall, A.N.A., received it this May, 1931. First Honorable Mention was given to Armin Hansen, A.N.A., of Monterey, and Second Honorable Mention to Gaston Lavrillier, formerly of Paris, France.

A complete list of the California painters whose canvases have been in our loan exhibitions this past year will be found in the Ebell Magazine for June. The limited space does not

allow its reprint.

We have had an exhibition of the separate works, in sculpture, of David Edstrom in February and of Jason Heron in January. Roger Noble Burnham has assembled three exhibitions for the Salon by the outstanding sculptors of Southern California.

The California Water Color Society has held two annual spring exhibitions in our Galeria, and we hope to make it an established event. This year three prizes were given. Fifty dollars was awarded to Elizabeth Baskerville, twenty dollars to Adelaide Kromer and ten dollars to Bessie Ella Hazen.

The Salon opened its first exhibition with a reception honoring the President and Executive Board of Ebell. In December Mr. Lorado Taft of Chicago gave us his interesting lecture, "My Dream Museum." A reception and musicale followed. In March a dinner and musicale was given by the Art Patrons, and the fourth large party was an Artists' Dinner

given in June, honoring the exhibiting artists. Each entertainment was a brilliant success.

It has been the desire of the Chairman to give something of lasting value to each of the Art Patrons at the monthly meetings, and to that end, the meetings have been held in the homes of the members, where worthy paintings are owned, or where a talk on art was given.

The first meeting of the season was held in the Sydney A. Temple Gallery. Mrs. William Henry Lyman opened her home for a meeting also. Both of these collections are the works of contemporary American painters. Miss Ada A. Dryden and Mrs. Charles H. Thompson entertained the group at a buffet luncheon. Mrs. Robert Malone entertained with a tea, assisted by Mrs. Lincoln Godshall, Mrs. Arthur Elon Huntington, Mrs. Arthur Hurt and Mrs. R. E. Burge. Mrs. S. D. Tuttle and Mrs. George Harris Cook held the last official meeting, with a lovely garden party for the members at Mrs. Tuttle's home.

The year has been made more interesting by visits to the studios of artists, both in and out of the City of Los Angeles. Among these delightful affairs was the reception at the Biltmore Galleries during the Exhibition of old Masters from the Vose Galleries of Boston. Mr. Robert Vose was the honor guest on this occasion and Mrs. Leafie Sloan-Orcutt the hostess. Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Henry entertained the Art Patrons in their studio with a musicale tea.

In January, one hundred members and many "husbands" had a memorable day in Santa Barbara! A luncheon in the historic El Paseo, followed by a trip to the Courthouse (a building with an international reputation for beauty), on to Montecito, to be received by Miss Amy Du Pont and to view the murals of Samuel Armstrong. The gardens of the Du Pont home are among the famous ones of Santa Barbara and we had the pleasure of meeting Mrs. De Witt Parshall, who assisted the hostess in the exquisite Cactus Dining-room, done by Mrs. Albert Hurter and Samuel Armstrong.

In June the group made a "pilgrimage" to Laguna Beach. We were received by the officers of the Laguna Art Association in the Art Gallery, taken to many interesting galleries, had a delicious luncheon in a quaint hotel and after more visits to studios, ended with tea at the studio home of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Hunt. At twilight we were guests of Dr.

Dean Cornwell is the artist whose murals are in the Los Angeles Public Library. They are equaled only in size by the great works of Michaelangelo in the Sistine Chapel in Rome. Mr. Cornwell has painted the canvases in London and has been at work on them for three years.

We trust our report shows the effort of the committee to offer to its members meetings of unusual and valuable profit in the realm of art appreciation. We are organized to stimulate a greater interest in art on the part of the layman and to be of lasting service to the artist in the West and in the East. We have established a greater confidence in the mind of the artist toward the women's clubs of Los Angeles and their value as a place of exhibition, but this confidence will be lost unless the future years show a sale of paintings. Artists must live and support their families the same as bankers and merchants-paintings are their commodities.

There is a splendid balance in the treasury which will be used for hanging the Salon in velvet. All monies not used in the actual expenses of galleries will, upon vote of the committee, be used either in the clubhouse or in prizes to encourage

artists toward better creations.

The Art Patrons Committee of the Ebell Salon of Art urges the individual members of the club to join the committee and assist with the delightful work.

Report of the Scholarships Committee

The Scholarship Committee of the Ebell Club is pleased to make the following report for the year 1930-1931:

The income for the scholarships is derived from the following sources:

- 1st. Appropriations from Ebell treasury.
- 2nd. Interest from the Ebell Scholarship Fund.
- 3rd. Interest from the Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint Foundation Fund.
 - 4th. Gifts from Individuals.

We were made very happy by an additional gift of fifteen thousand dollars from Mr. and Mrs. Flint in January which increased the Flint Foundation Fund to fifty-five thousand dollars and makes our total investment seventy thousand dollars.

Scholarship awards have been made to twenty-nine young people, of whom twenty-six are young women and three are young men. At the close of the first semester, one student graduated from U. C. L. A. and two students were granted leave of absence on account of financial stress. At the close of the second semester, eight students were graduated as follows: one from California School of Technology, one from the University of Southern California and six from the University of California at Los Angeles.

Throughout the year, the scholarship students have done excellent work. Eighteen students competed in the Prize Essay Contest which was sponsored for the third time by Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint. Prizes were awarded to the four winners at the Public Affairs Department by our dear and loyal friend of Scholarship work, Mrs. William Read. Special honors were bestowed on two of our students: Miss Catherine Noel, a senior at the University of Southern California was awarded membership in the Phi Beta Kappa and Miss Orris Cook, our music student, was awarded membership in the Athenian Society, which is the highest award granted by the Los Angeles Junior College.

Thirty applications were received and investigated to fill vacancies. Scholarships are given as Honor awards, the recipients are chosen with regard to scholastic attainments, character, health, energy and financial need.

Report of the Practical Relief Committee

The unemployment situation has made the work of our committee very strenuous for the past year, but if we have given out more clothing and have used more money, the Ebell members have appreciated the situation and have been very generous in supplying both clothing and money.

We received from the Needlework Guild clothing, bedding and towels, in all three hundred articles, which are included in the five thousand thirty garments and articles received, and we gave out five thousand five hundred seventy. We made six hundred ninety-seven new garments, remodeled fifty-six, pieced six comfort tops, made fourteen comforters. Six of these were given to Rest Cottage and we received six used ones, which were quickly given out. We made five graduating dresses and furnished materials and planned five more. Ten sweaters were knitted for our use. Red Cross asked Ebell members to knit for them and reported eighty-five sweaters and nineteen pairs of hose sent in. One hundred forty-five families have been helped,-those of disabled veterans and others,-fifty individuals and twenty Rest Cottage guests have been cared for and nine guests of Hollenbeck Home. We have clothed twenty-four college girls and have helped twenty-eight college and high school girls; also have helped two scholarship boys and given evening clothing to six college men.

While the response to our requests for jelly and jam for our annual shower for the Helen Matthewson Club was good, it was supplemented by what was brought at the request of our benefits chairman, Mrs. Frank Brown Wheat, to the benefits luncheon November twenty-second. The Rest Cottage Thanksgiving baskets benefited by these donations also. The beautiful clothing was made of good use by the Practical Relief Committee. There were many cans of vegetables and soup and some groceries turned over to us, and while we sent out a large part of this for Thanksgiving, a portion was kept for the relief of the many persons who came to us hungry. We received at Thanksgiving, from our neighbor, the Charing Cross School, groceries, canned goods and children's clothing. Four families were supplied with these canned goods and a few cans given out to individuals.

Our Christmas activities included the County Farm, to

which fifty nightingales were sent; Barlow Sanitarium, which received twenty nightingales, twelve pairs of bed socks, ten hoods and twelve outing nightgowns. To the Children's Tuberculosis Ward of the General Hospital we sent fifty packages of candy, attractively wrapped in red cellophane paper, two boxes of artificial flowers, which the children enjoy holding in their hands, and a few toys and games. All we sent to the General Hospital was given us by Bullock's Santa Claus. In addition to these there were packages of soap powder and rouge, which we distributed among the Christmas baskets. Just after Christmas we received from Bullock's two boxes of clothing, stockings, gloves and many pretty scarfs, all of which we used to good advantage.

Last year we sent out seventy-three baskets to the disabled veterans, but the response this year to our appeal for money was so generous that we decided we could supply one hundred twenty-nine bushel baskets. The baskets contained not only Christmas dinners but enough food to last for several days. In addition to this a box of apples and a box of jelly and jam were donated. These were distributed among our baskets. Each basket was marked with a Christmas card saying "From Ebell Club of Los Angeles," with the name and address of the man and the number in the family.

So many disabled veterans were disappointed that the manager decided to give a dinner at their club for more than one hundred men and asked us if we could furnish the turkeys. So we gave four turkeys and six pounds of cranberries.

We found that the most difficult part of this work was the distribution of the baskets. It was expensive, too, although Mr. Dillon of the Akron Transfer Company delivered seventy-five baskets being paid only for extra help. The Anderson & Jordan Truck Company delivered twenty-three baskets at reduced rates. The remaining baskets, numbering thirty-one, were delivered by a man who had a small truck. He wanted to do something for us and had called for his own basket. Mrs. Paul Taylor and Mrs. Clara Wort Kenyon, of our Transportation Committee, and a friend who knows the disabled veterans well, delivered a number of baskets for us.

Our Christmas work was a big undertaking and could not have been accomplished without the co-operation of all the members of the Committee. Nothing is too much for them to undertake cheerfully and efficiently. We extend our sincere

thanks to our treasurer, our house manager, our office force and our janitors. We were more impressed than ever that our Ebell Club is just like one big family working harmoniously in service for others.

The contributors agreed to spend the money they had subscribed for the building of the room to the purchase of a Frigidaire, the extension of the screen porch and other needed conveniences. Mrs. George H. Cook, with the assistance of Mrs. June Paschall, sponsored the furnishings of the new rooms. They were liberally helped financially.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint gave the Association one thousand dollars for current expenses, and created a special Endowment Fund to be known as the Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint Ebell Rest Cottage Endowment Fund. They placed to its credit five one thousand dollar bonds.

Death called suddenly from our midst our beloved and loyal director and friend, Mrs. Charles Egleston Crary. Mr. Crary is giving new dining room furniture as a memorial to Mrs. Crary.

Rest Cottage received a bequest in the will of the late Mr. Oliver S. Hershman for twenty-five hundred dollars, netting the Association twenty-two hundred fifty dollars.

Mrs. Harry J. Brown, secretary, sent out three hundred fifteen letters.

Mrs. George H. Mosher, house chairman, reports the painting of the exterior of the Cottage for preservation and the building of a new retaining wall, as the old one was beyond repair. Mr. Francis H. Blackford gave time and service in survey of premises preparatory to the building of the wall. The Cottage has had an unusually thorough renovation, including paint and brush where necessary.

We have purchased five one thousand dollar bonds for the Endowment Fund.

Mrs. Edward Everett Sherrard, membership chairman, reports five new life members, seven added to our In Memoriam; total memberships eight hundred sixty-five.

Mrs. R. C. Chaffin and committee have made sixty-three investigations.

It met with an immediate hearty financial response, and a recommendation was made by the Association to the Ebell Board of Directors that an appeal be given from the platform the following Monday, which was done.

We have had application from two hundred fifty-four women for admission to the Cottage this year. One hundred fifty-five have been received as guests. The Rest Cottage Committee has done some very worthwhile rehabilitation work, which cannot be expressed in words or figures.

In closing this very inadequate report, it is fitting to express appreciation to the Benefits Committee, The Practical Relief and the Needlework Guild for their steadfast loyalty and support.

Regulations

Establishing Thell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and

control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effectiv euntil approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angees.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified

public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise

Bur Benefit of Ebell Best Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage..................dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:.....

If the clesire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to

be known by the name of the person designated.
You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed

in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

By-Laws of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

ARTICLE I

OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with troi and maintenance of Hoon Read States in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SECTION 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SECTION 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except the Chairman, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees, shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the Association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged,

and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the and shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of Ebell.

STANDING COMMITTEES ARTICLE V

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Finance
- Membership
- Investigation
- Transportation
- 5. Follow-up
- 6. Program
- 7. Hospitality

SECTION 2. The Finance Committee, one member of which shall be the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles, shall verify the monthly financial reports of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may he a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the pavment of dues.

SECTION 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining, Life, and Memorial Members.

ARTICLE VII

Dues

SECTION 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per vear, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SECTION 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SECTION 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a life or a memorial member.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month.

SECTION 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the month of August.

SECTION 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Friday in June at eleven A.M. Polls open until noon.

SECTION 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SECTION 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SECTION 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

SECTION 3. At the regular meeting in May, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeting.

SECTION 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SECTION 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Report of the President of the Ebell Juniors

A successful year in an organization such as ours should show progress. Therefore, this past year our object has been to strengthen and extend the many and varied activities of the Ebell Juniors.

It has been felt for some time that the age limit of our group should be raised. During the summer months a petition was prepared, setting forth the desirability of such a change and asking that the age limit be raised from twenty-six to thirty. Accordingly, the petition was presented to the Executive Committee of Ebell in September, and it was favorably voted upon by the members of Ebell in November. We were more than pleased by this favorable action as it enabled us to retain as members twenty young women, whose training and experience in the work of the Juniors were especially valuable to us. We believe that this change will prove of great benefit, not only to the Juniors, but to the older Club as well, for when our members reach the new age limit they will be better trained in club work and thus be better fitted for their duties in the older organization.

The Junior sections, which meet informally at the homes of our members, continued their popularity, not only because of the delightful afternoons spent in work and study, but also for the fine opportunities of becoming better acquainted.

The Junior Drama Section formed this year is the outgrowth of an interested group who, up to this time, have had no definite outline of work. They now meet regularly on the third Tuesday of each month. Much credit for its initial year is due Mrs. Wendell C. Cole, Jr., who has served very efficiently as drama chairman. Plays were reviewed, informal discussions of current productions took place, and instruction in diction was given.

Mrs. Helen S. Houston, chairman of the Book Chamber, and Miss Edith May Anderson, her assistant, were responsible for a very interesting year in this group, which met the first and third Thursdays. An additional feature was current events. About one hundred books were reviewed.

Social Welfare of the Juniors has two interests, Child Welfare and Scholarships. The first named committee, one of our

sections, met every other Monday. It has supplied clothing for fourteen children. At Christmas time toys, candies, Christmas trees and overflowing baskets of food were taken to seven families. Mrs. J. Ellsworth Ross and her two assistants, Mrs. Edwin Cox and Miss Elizabeth Lloyd, proved most capable in directing this responsible work. We have two scholarships which were continued from last year. One is a Sophomore at the University of California at Los Angeles. The other is a widowed mother of three of the children for whom we are caring. She will attend summer school that she may sooner obtain a teacher's certificate.

The monthly bridge parties, under the direction of the Work and Play Committee, were well attended. They were held in the Solarium of the club house on the fourth Friday of each month. The committee, with Miss Ruth Kennedy as chairman, assisted by Mrs. Marion Erwin Lyon and Miss Margaret Bunn, who proved to be charming hostesses, are to be complimented on the success of these parties. The policy to have both a social aim and a charitable one was continued, and as a result thirty-seven dollars was added to the Child Welfare fund. A new feature has been added by this group, the party in honor of our mothers, which was attended by sixty guests and enjoyed by mothers and daughters alike.

The Benefits Committee should be given credit for three successful affairs. Mrs. D. Gains Hon, chairman, Miss Charlotte McGrath, assistant, Mrs. Brodie Ahlport, tickets, and Mrs. Robert Silas Redington, decorations, were in charge.

The first benefit was on December ninth. It was "A Night in Old Mexico" and was given in the dining room of the club house. This gave us a net profit of ninety-five dollars, part of which was used for the Christmas work of the Child Welfare Committee. The second one was the annual three-act play, presented on the evening of March third. The Drama chairman, Mrs. Wendell C. Cole, Jr., directed "The Busybody," a domestic farcical comedy by Dorrance Davis. This successful evening added one hundred sixty-one dollars and forty cents to the scholarship fund. The annual bridge tea and fashion show, attended by about two hundred fifty guests, was "A Day in Deauville." It was held in the dining room of the club house. As a result the sum of one hundred fifty-three dollars and sixty cents was added to our benefit fund. We received in all a total of four hundred forty-seven dollars

The Thursday night dinners at Ebell were also enjoyed by our group. On the evening of January fifteenth the Juniors were asked to be the assisting hostesses. By way of entertainment we were requested to again present the two oneact plays which had been given at our November meeting.

Last summer the By-Laws of Ebell were revised. Those of the Juniors, already out of date, conflicted with them in many points, and it was necessary to have them entirely rewritten. Our new By-Laws correspond to those of Ebell and definitely outline our many activities.

Programs for regular meetings were of a high standard. These delightful and worth-while afternoons were arranged by Miss Ann Sumner, chairman, Mrs. Lawrence Hauge and Mrs. Paul James Robinson. They were as follows:

OCTOBER: "Ebell Junior Modes of 1930," a fashion show by our members wearing their own clothes. Four groups of styles and models presented by Miss Winifred Huntington, Sports; Mrs. D. Gaines Hon, Street; Miss Charlotte McGrath, Afternoon; Mrs. Harold E. Craig, Evening.

NOVEMBER: Two one-act plays presented by our own members: "Paris Labels," by Lida Larrimore and directed by Mrs. Wendell C. Cole, Jr., and "Joint Owners in Spain," by Alice Brown and directed by Mrs. D. Gaines Hon; music by Miss Evelyn Connor, soprano, accompanied by Miss Katherine Foge.

JANUARY: Two informal lectures by authorities on early California history: Mrs. Virginia Stivers Bartlett, whose subject was "A Day on the Hacienda," and Miss Marian Parks, who spoke on "A Lady of Old Los Angeles."

By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS.

SECTION 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

SECTION 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club. one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of the Ebell Juniors.

SECTION 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors, but shall defray all expenses not so authorized.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall sign all bills; shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all stand-

SECTION 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell Magazine, all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

SECTION 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SECTION 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

SECTION 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee.

Section 6. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive from the Financial Secretary of Ebell all moneys ordered paid to her by the Treasurer of the Club, giving a receipt therefor, in which shall be stated the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents

Courtesy

- 3. Credentials
- Program
- Scholarship
- Social Welfare

Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

SECTION 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

SECTION 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Scholarship Chairman of Ebell, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors and shall administer all the scholarship funds of the Juniors.

SECTION 6. Chairmen of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings 80 that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

SECTION 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

SECTION 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty years.

SECTION 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation and shall then follow the procedure for regular membership in Ebell.

SECTION 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SECTION 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of a member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SECTION 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional [The EBELL of Los Angeles]

attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted: she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees,

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Wednesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December.

SECTION 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell

Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

SECTION 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending nine regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in June. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect

at any election.

Nominations

SECTION 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell

Magazine.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of

each candidate before placing her name on the ballot. SECTION 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall be called for and if there are no further nominations, the report of the Nominating Committee shall be accepted. This report shall be published in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine.

Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Advisor on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.



Thell's Koll of Honor

Mrs. William T. Temis

In the thirty-seven years since the Ebell of Los Angeles was organized it has lost by death only five of its ex-Presidents, two of these having been called away during the past year.

Our Club Presidents have, as a rule, been chosen for long and efficient work in other departments of the organization, but Mrs. William T. Lewis was unique because she was called to the office as an untried stranger, who was believed to have brilliant possibilities. In the Spring of 1900 the Club was torn by the only factional difficulty which has ever arisen in its ranks. The wise leaders of the Club, looking about for a way out of the impasse, saw in Mrs. Lewis—who had been a mereber for less than a year, but who, by her charming personality, had made many friends—a candidate upon whom all might unite. How well she accomplished this purpose is testified by the following quotation from the minutes of the last meeting of her Executive Board, June second, 1902,— "Mrs. Flint in a few words expressed her appreciation of the harmonizing influence and impartial spirit which Mrs. Lewis, the retiring President, has ever shown during her two years of service."

Mrs. J. B. Millard, General Curator during this time, writes,—"Mrs. W. T. Lewis, without ambition for office, conscientious in accepting responsibility, kindly disposed toward all, open minded in regard to Club preferment, loving and lovable, proved a most harmonizing personality."

Mrs. Lewis was never a permanent resident of Los Angeles. Her home for many years was in Racine, Wisconsin, but she sought the climate of California in winter. The last ten years of her life she claimed Daytona, Florida, as her home, although much of her time was spent in Paris, where she was a member of the American Woman's Club. She attended the dedication of the new club house in that city just a week before her death. She was a member of the National Council of Women, the General Federation of Women's Clubs and an honorary member of the Wisconsin Federation of Clubs. In all these varied occupations she never lost her interest in Ebell and retained her membership until her death. She was

active in civic affairs and while President of Ebell inspired the Club to participate in many movements for civic betterment.

The small club of less than two hundred members over which she presided in 1900-1902 has expanded until few today recall her presence and personal friendship, or know of her benign influence in a critical time of Ebell's history, but those few gladly unite in offering her a tribute of admiration and gratitude.

Ars. Sumner #. Bunt

Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, who succeeded Mrs. Lewis as President of Ebell in 1902, joined the Club only a few months after its organization in 1894. By inheritance, education and temperament she was fitted to be an inspiration to the young society, whose avowed object was culture. She was the daughter of John Hancock Edwards, Commissioner of Education in Ohio. Her mother was also a teacher. The family came to Los Angeles in 1885. Mrs. Hunt was a graduate of the State Normal School and became vice-principal of the Los Angeles High School. In 1891 she married Sumner P. Hunt, the architect to whom this City owes so many notable buildings. From her marriage to her death, a period of forty years, she occupied the same home, a most unusual record in this City of constantly moving population. This seems to indicate one of Mrs. Hunt's marked characteristics, constancy.

In 1899 Mrs. Hunt was elected General Curator of Ebell, and in the minutes of the first meeting of the Executive Board, at which she took her place, it is recorded that each member present expressed her pleasure in welcoming this new coworker.

Mrs. Hunt was elected President in 1902. During the preceding year the Club had been obliged, by the sale of the property, to move from the lovely little club house, leased to them by Mrs. Burdette, to quarters in the Shakespeare Building on Figueroa Street. At once Mrs. Hunt urged the necessity of owning a permanent Club home, and she appointed a committee to investigate the purchase of a lot. During her administration and afterwards as Chairman of the Building Committee, her enthusiasm never lagged, and the difficult task reached fulfillment largely through her inspiration.

Mrs. Hunt's interest in public schools was constantly

evidenced while President of Ebell. She led the Club to decorate the walls of several schools with educational and cultural pictures, and to raise funds for the feeding of undernourished pupils. When her term of office expired she did mittees and in departments.

For the past ten years Mrs. Hunt has been best known through her deep interest in Psychology and Philosophy. She spent much thought on the religions of the world and claimed that she found so much good in all of them that her own creed became selective. Theoretically she was a Theosophist, practically she followed the Golden Rule, living the precept to love all men and bear malice to none. She had to a marked degree the power of seeing both sides of a question, which saved her from dogmatism.

Ebell misses her bodily presence, but will long treasure her teaching and her inspiration. She was one of those who led and never lagged, who lifted and never leaned.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First-That the name of this corporation shall be THE ERELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Fourth-That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Sixth-That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I

NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF Los ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research,

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarshi p. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

SECTION 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election.

Any person serving one half or more of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

SECTION 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions given for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SECTION 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees and a Club Parliamentarian, and be exofficio a member of all committees. She shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers; shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club, and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

SECTION 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Magazine.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SECTION 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

SECTION 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly report of all receipts and expenditures. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment

as officers of the departments.

SECTION 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

SECTION 8. The Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees and shall renresent on the Board of Directors all welfare activities not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws.

SECTION 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend membershine in other organizations.

SECTION 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval.

SECTION 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association: and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

SECTION 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

SECTION 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer, giving her a statement designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Chairman of Rentals and all other directors in charge of the business of the Club. She shall be custodian of the seal, books, and records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club, and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer for the faithful performance of her duties.

ARTICLE VI STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.

SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when re-

SECTION 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.

SECTION 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.

SECTION 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 6. The Hospitality and Welfare Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the

Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

SECTION 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors: and shall supervise the building and its contents

SECTION 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

SECTION 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Magazine and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

SECTION 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering.

SECTION 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

SECTION 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

SECTION 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

SECTION 15. Chairmen of Committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of

Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices

ARTICLE VII

MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed hy the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall he presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ehell Magazine and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to mem-

bership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the applicant for a period of(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted

as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than three applications for regular membership, three for temporary membership, and three for Junior membership during each year.

SECTION 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SECTION 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

SECTION 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.

SECTION 5. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for one (1) year may apply for life membership by signing the blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in ARTICLE VII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay five hundred dollars (\$500.00), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Magazine and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership, without payment of dues.

SECTION 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

SECTION 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

SECTION 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

SECTION 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed once in any subsequent year. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

SECTION 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one half of the regular admission fee, or one half of the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SECTION 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues

of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SECTION 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the

Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission have one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member of the Club who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

SECTION 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

SECTION 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted

at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall he elected for three (3) years and shall not be eligible for election for a second consecutive term in the same office. No member shall be eligible to serve more than nine (9) con-

secutive years on the Board of Directors.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into three (3) groups: the first group shall consist of the President, the First Vice-President, the General Curator, the Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, and the Chairman of Public Relations; the second group shall consist of the Fourth Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Chairman of Finance, the Chairman of Rentals, and the Chairman of Rest Cottage Association; and the third group shall consist of the Second Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Corresponding Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Scholarships.

At each annual election one of these groups shall be elected for a term of three (3) years beginning with Group Number Three. At any election members may be elected to fill an

unexpired term. (See Footnote)

SECTION 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations

SECTION 3. The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors and shall not be eligible for a second term.

Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by

the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in October for the purpose of electing

a chairman and completing the organization of the committee. Meetings thereafter shall be held at least once a month at the call of the Chairman. A meeting may be called at any time by any three members of the committee.

Section 5. Not later than March first of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for the several offices to be filled at the ensuing election including nine places for the Nominating Committee.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with a name of not more than one member for each office. This blank so filled out shall be signed by the member as her name appears in the Year Book and returned to the chairman of the Nominating

Committee at the clubhouse on or before April first.

SECTION 6. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a ballot for the annual election which shall include all names receiving on the nominating ballot fifty (50) or more votes for one office and such other names as the Nominating Committee shall, by a two-thirds vote, select for each office.

The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each

candidate before placing the name on the ballot.

SECTION 7. On the fourth Monday in April the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

SECTION 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occuring on the Election Board.

SECTION 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine.

SECTION 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between May first and May fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall

be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

SECTION 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Sccretary. The Board of Directors shall canvass these ballots at the first regular meeting after the election, after which these ballots

may be destroyed.

SECTION 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

ARTICLE XI CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) the Social Welfare Work, specific and general, including Ebell Rest Cottage Association under the control of its own Chairman, and Practical Relief and General Philanthropies; (4) Scholarships; (5) and the Ebell Juniors.

SECTION 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of The Ebell

of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference

to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members

of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Com-

mittee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII CLUB POLICIES

SECTION 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

SECTION 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

SECTION 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SECTION 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1398, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1931. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.
