Report of the President. 1941-1942

Ebell's motto "I Serve" will never be followed with more loyalty than in the year of 1941-1942. Capable hands have held it high for all to see and follow, thereby bringing unity of purpose into our club life.

Before the attack on Pearl Harbor, we were conscious of a world at war and the pulse quickened to the requests for organized effort for National Defense. Conscious, too, of responsibility to maintain the club activities with programs planned months in advance, an endeavor was made to adjust the programs to those for National Defense.

It was necessary to form a policy of support to this war program. The Los Angeles Chapter of the American Red Cross answered that need. Training in any one of nine volunteer courses is now returning the fruits of that labor, bringing untold happiness in service to others.

The Production Unit was the first to organize in the spring of 1941. A report of all activities of our National Defense Committee will be found elsewhere. Ebell finds itself in the first line of defense with one of the best organized units reported at the General Federation of Women's Clubs Convention held at Ft. Worth, Texas, in May, 1942.

The list of Monday programs printed elsewhere is worthy of your review. These programs kept the members informed of world events, music, and science. News analysts from the war zones helped to clarify the need for loyal co-operation and an all-out effort to support the leaders in this crisis.

Seven Assembly dinners, and one Vesper concert given by the Ebell Chorus on Palm Sunday, brought many distinguished guests. The Assembly dinner speakers were John B. Hughes, radio news commentator; Joe Fisher, world traveler; Salom Rizk, sponsored by the Reader's Digest, and Richard Wilmer Rowan, one of the great authorities on international secret service. The usual Christmas party was held. A President's luncheon was held on the first Wednesday of each month. The Art and Travel Department met in the morning and the fine programs brought a large attendance to the luncheons. Ena Louise Spencer, the former owner and manager of a balloon and parachute factory in London, told of the use "England Under Fire" made of the same balloons now being used in America to protect our oil fields and airplane industries.

Mrs. John Stearns Thayer, President of the California Federation of Women's Clubs and a life member of Ebell, spoke on the part women must play in the coming peace. Honor guests with her were Mrs. C. H. Oneal, President of the Los Angeles District, California Federation of Women's Clubs, and Mrs. Ann Meservy, President of the Los Angeles County Federation.

The Birthday Luncheon of the Ebell Associates, with Mrs. Samuel Cary Dunlap, Chairman, brought a large attendance. Reports of the fourth year of their five-year plan were given.

Thomas Wolfe spoke on "Glider Builders of Today; Pilots of Tomorrow."

The President's half hour on Mondays brought speakers on employment, conservation of rubber, and consumers' products. Visitors from Rumania, Norway, England, France, China, Dutch East Indies, the Philippines and Hawaii brought laughter and tears. It is these twice-told tales that are bringing the women of all nations to a unity of thought and action.

The financial report represents hours of service. The membership, the Ebell Associates, the Former Officers' Round Table, the Benefits Committees, the Solarium Teas and the Rentals have all given whole-hearted co-operation. The year closed with advanced payments on the mortgage made up to February, 1943.

The financial gifts have continued. Rest Cottage has received bequests. Donations were made to the Red Cross, Christmas Welfare, Needlework Guild, the Community Chest and the Southern California Symphony Association. Membership has been held in many civic and philanthropic organizations.

Many gifts have been made by Ebell members throughout the year, such as two silver tea urns, two silver trays, one

silver bread tray, one carved teakwood table, seven tablecloths and two cases for exhibition of miniatures in the Art Salon.

Seven members have taken out life memberships and a contribution of \$50.00 was added to the advance dues account.

A reciprocity tea was given for club presidents, and many invitations to Ebell's president created friendly relations with clubs throughout the city and county.

New members were honored guests on special occasions during the year, and an effort to meet and know them has been made by the Board and Membership Committee.

The Memorial Service was held on June first for thirty-one members. The families of these members were invited to attend.

A special authors' luncheon on May eighteenth honored George Palmer Putnam, Jean Marie Putnam, Dame May Whitty, Craig Rice, Maren Elwood and Harry W. Flannery.

Report of First Aid

In February of last year, the American Red Cross, seeing the probability of approaching war, established First Aid day and evening classes in many schools to train the public to care for the sick and injured in possible emergencies.

The Ebell stepped into line and a First Aid Class was established. This began March 6, 1941, and had its final examination June 18, 1941; forty-four enrolled and twenty-five passed the examination and received certificates from the American Red Cross, entitling them to act as Directors in First Aid and Life Saving.

Since July 1, 1941, five Beginners or Standard Classes have completed the course. There have also been three Advanced Classes. The instructors were Mr. Shaffer, Mr. Pat O'Neill and Mrs. Stella Bodey.

Total enrollment for Standard Course since July 1, 1941 two hundred forty-seven; one hundred six-nine received certificates.

Total enrollment for Advanced Classes—one hundred twelve; ninety-nine received certificates.

First Aid training is a foundation for other branches of Red Cross work. The members of these classes are interested in Defense work, and a number have entered the Motor Corps, some the Interceptor Command Service; many have signed up for casu-

alty stations. Four have become instructors in First Aid, and others are taking the Instructors' Course. Some have become nurses' aids. All have found the training valuable in every-day life.

Needlework Guild

The Needlework Guild of America continues steadfast in its work during times of stress, as it does when "All's well with the world." During the last World War, it increased its membership by nearly 40,000 members and in co-operation with the American Red Cross, contributed millions of articles and a large sum of money to aid in the war stricken areas. After the Armistice, the city of St. Quentin was officially adopted by the Guild and a committee formed there to receive and distribute the clothing, materials and cash sent over from America. Many war orphans were adopted by Guild Branches.

NEEDLEWORK GUILD

Members of the Guild have met the problems of the last sixty years with fortitude and determination, and face the future with the conviction, that having work to do, there can be no thought other than doing it faithfully and well.

During November of 1941, when the Annual Collection of clothing for the needy was held, Ebell members contributed six hundred twenty-one garments, all of excellent quality. With the money donated, much needed garments, blankets and as many sweaters as possible were added. We sent in also a cash contribution of \$11.21. All these articles were distributed by the Guild to hospitals, charitable institutions and homes in our own community.

Members of Ebell, by their generosity, have given the Guild the right to look forward to the 1942 Collection with confidence.

Report of the Librarian

The Library committee was composed of fourteen members. Two meetings were held during the year, and their records were put into writing and turned over to the Ebell committee on policies and procedures for the information of future Library committees.

Report of the Salon of Art.

A poet once said, "You can live without poetry, music and art." Not so in Ebell. The importance of the cultural arts is not overlooked. Beginning early in the life of the Club, art has been one of the main features. Exhibits of art were shown in the old club house throughout each year, but it was not until the new club house was built that a place was set aside in which art exhibits could be shown to advantage. The Salon of Art and Galeria now serve that purpose, and the year 1941-1942 has been

an active one. Oils, miniatures, watercolors, sculptures, etchings, Chinese scrolls, and screens, all of well recognized modern living artists have been shown. These exhibits comprised the works of three leading art clubs, three traveling shows of "Top Flight" artists of Northern and Southern California, a joint show of Cornelis Botke and Jessie Arms Botke, and the final competitive Art Exhibition in May. The competitive exhibit was extended into June, and was supplemented by works of Ebell members, the entire Galeria being given over to the exhibit of the members.

Two conference Teas were held, one at the home of the Chairman, Mrs. Ralph Emerson Filcher, and one at the home of the Chairman of Courtesy, Mrs. Cyrus B. Sweet.

Tours were made to Santa Barbara, to the Los Angeles Museum, the Fisher Gallery, the Hancock Foundation, the Harris School of Science, the Huntington Library, the Southwest Museum and the Grace Nicholson Gallery in Pasadena.

Eight program Teas were given in the Salon honoring exhibiting artists. These programs featured art subjects and demonstrations of paintings by leading artists. The average attendance was two hundred.

An opening reception was held in October, honoring the members of the California Art Club who were exhibiting that month. The attendance was three hundred.

A course in Art Appreciation was started in February, with Loren Barton, artist and teacher, as lecturer. Classes were held twice a month.

The Art Patrons were sponsors of the Artists' Dinner, May 14, at which time prizes were awarded to the winners in the competition. There was an attendance of three hundred thirty, over one hundred of whom were artists and leaders of art groups.

A gift of two miniature cases was added to the Salon equipment.

Sales totaling more than \$600 were made.

A donation of \$100 was made to the Ebell Associates.

The year opened with \$278 in the treasury. After paying all bills, there is now a balance of \$331.53.

Report of the Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Rest Cottage pursues the even tenor of its way, untouched as yet by the cares, problems and dangers that beset the rest of the world. The rooms are just as attractive, the garden as lovely, the food as plentiful and the gracious spirit of hospitality just as evident as they were in more peaceful times.

Dr. Charlotte M. Brown, who is the head of her own hospital, and Dr. J. Margaret Roberts, one of the anesthetists at the Good Samaritan Hospital, continue to give their invaluable services. It is they who make the final decision as to who may enter the Cottage. They have investigated one hundred sixty cases this year, accepting one hundred seventeen.

The requirements for admission of these convalescent guests are simple. They must be ambulatory, have no communicable disease, must be women employed, and must have a place to go when their time expires at the Cottage. We do not accept women who can afford to pay for services or women on relief. Some of the guests like to make small gifts to show their appreciation and these are accepted. Few of them neglect to write their "bread and butter" letters which overflow with gratitude and blessings for the women who have made possible this oasis in the desert of their lives.

Conditions brought about by the war, changes in medical care, and social service arrangements in hospitals and clinics, have made it necessary to-liberalize the policies to some extent. Women are hurried out of crowded hospitals before they are quite ready, even for a convalescent home. They have to return to the hospital for "shots" and "check-ups." It retards their progress in a way, but it can be met by the flexibility of the two-weeks' rule.

Under the efficient supervision of the House Chairman, Mrs. William Bertram Burns, every inch of the interior of Rest Cottage was painted, even the white iron bedsteads, which were fitted with new double ball bearing casters replacing the old rusty ones which had splintered the floors to such an extent that linoleum was the only solution and the floors of seven bedrooms and the service porch were covered. Through the generosity of one of our Board members, fourteen new inner spring mattresses and thirty goose feather pillows were purchased at cost. Blankets, spreads, and draperies for bedrooms and the living room were secured at the special sales. The new draperies in the dining-room were the gift of another Ebell member.

Bargain basements and auction rooms were searched for a davenport and chairs which, when recovered, were equal to top floor wares. The old wicker living room chairs were relegated to the garden and more comfortable ones secured for the invalids.

It had been planned to defer any requests for entrance for those few intensive weeks of house cleaning, but we could not turn the guests away and they thrived on it and enjoyed it, spending most of the days in the garden swings, and some of the nights in the sun-room.

To Mrs. Edwin G. Howard, Assistant Chairman, has been given the duty of supervising the menus which Mrs. Lush provides, to the end that they are sufficient and well balanced. She and the Treasurer, Mrs. Edgar Allan Doran, watch the costs, which in these war times are higher than last year. She reports 5355 meals served for six months at a cost of seventeen cents each.

Mrs. Robert McAvoy, Secretary, reports ten business meetings, ten regular executive board meetings, and four called meetings. She wrote four letters and four hundred sixty-four invitations to the Christmas party.

The report of the Treasurer, Mrs. Edgar Allan Doran, follows this report.

Mrs. Charles W. Partridge, Chairman of Finance, reports a number of changes in the Rest Cottage financial portfolio, selling high priced bonds, investing \$20,000 in War Bonds, Series G, purchasing preferred and common stock, and holding some cash in the savings account for emergencies. This was done on the advice of the investment advisors. In these unsettled times too much care cannot be taken, and before important decisions are made, we are thankful to be able to call on the investment advisors, the Advisory Committee of Past Presidents, both the Ebell and Rest Cottage Boards, and sometimes the Auditor and the Attorney.

Five Social Welfare projects were visited under the direction of Mrs. Estella C. Roath, Field Survey Chairman; the Bide-A-Wee Home, the Los Angeles Orphans' Home, Goodwill Industries, Mary Martha Home, and the California Christian Home at San Gabriel.

Our historian, Mrs. Charles F. Rathman, has compiled a comprehensive history of Rest Cottage, with many pictures and interesting stories.

Mrs. Robert S. Hardy keeps the garden, a place of beauty, rest and peace. Mrs. Harry J. Brown holds her committee in reserve for emergency calls.

Mrs. O. Arthur Elmo, Membership Chairman, announces five Memorials,—Mr. Robert Hugh Williams \$100, Miss Gertrude Williams \$100, Mrs. Phoebe Roberts \$100, Mrs. G. Warren Patterson \$100, and Mrs. William R. Wherry \$252; one Life member, Mrs. Lee Champion, \$100; Associate, Sustaining, and Contributing Members, \$960; a total from four hundred ninety members, \$1,712.

The Juniors continue their interest and their donation of \$30.00 a month, arrange the program for the Christmas party and sew and help in many ways.

There has been an average attendance of twenty at the business meetings; eighty-nine attended the luncheon at the Cottage in October, and sixty-four, the tea in May. Two hundred and four guests came to the Christmas party. These social events were arranged by Mrs. Harry Quine and the Hospitality Committee, and the attendance checked by the Registrar, Mrs. Howard R. Miner.

About seventy-five members, officers, committees, and chairmen are actively engaged in the routine work which is involved in the management of Rest Cottage; four hundred ninety are listed as paying members and the rest of the Ebell members are automatically a part of this unique and beautiful plan, which means so much to the guests, many of whom have never before, in their lives, had an opportunity to share in the comfort, friendliness, fellowship, and sympathy which are the watchwords of Rest Cottage. They come to it, ill and under-nourished, mentally depressed, and at low ebb financially, and it is gratifying to see them respond to its influence so quickly, in brighter eyes, firmer steps, and readier smiles. When their time is completed, they are loath to leave the Cottage and the friendships they have made there, but carry with them on their return to work, a happy memory of a time of rest and peace, and the heart-warming knowledge that someone cares.

Resolutions

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and

regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of the Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

RESOLUTIONS

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise

For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

SECTION 41 OF THE PROBATE CODE Restrictions

No estate, real or personal, may be bequeathed or devised to any charitable or benevolent society or corporation, or to any person or persons in trust for charitable uses, by a testator who leaves a spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor surviving him who, under the will, or the laws of succession would otherwise have taken the property so bequeathed or devised unless the will was duly executed at least thirty days before the death of the testator. If so executed at least thirty days before death, such devises and legacies shall be valid, but they may not collectively exceed one-third of the testator's estate as against his spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor, who would otherwise, as aforesaid, have taken the excess over one-third, and if they do a pro rata deduction from such devises and legacies shall be made so as to reduce the aggregate thereof to one-third of the estate. All property bequeathed or devised contrary to the provisions of this section shall go to the spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor of the testator, if and to the extent that they would have taken said property as aforesaid but for such devises or legacies; otherwise the testator's estate shall go in accordance with his will and such devisees and legacies shall be unaffected.

By-Laws of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

ARTICLE I

OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. The three directors who are elected from Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be chairmen, respectively, of Finance, House and Garden.

Section 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except those members otherwise provided for, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

Section 3. The Chairman of Finance shall head a committee composed of the President, Chairman of Finance and the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles, and the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. This Finance Committee shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Association. The Chairman of Finance and the Chairman of Rest Cottage shall be assisted by an advisory committee of three investment counselors who

shall advise as to the investment of all Endowment Funds, together with such other moneys as may be available for investment. The Finance Chairman shall bring to the Finance and Executive Committees meeting together the recommendations of these advisors for approval. Upon approval by a majority of said committees of a recommended investment the Chairman of Finance shall be empowered to make such transactions. The Chairman of Finance shall verify the monthly financial reports of the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Section 4. The House Chairman shall have charge of all replacements and repairs at Ebell Rest Cottage, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Garden Chairman shall have supervision of the planting and upkeep of the garden, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all standing committees. She shall appoint all special committees and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall receive from the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles all moneys due and contributed to the Association, together with a statement showing the accounts for which such moneys have been contributed and shall give a receipt for same. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and she shall be bonded as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be

- 1. Finance
- 2. Membership
- 3. Investigation
- 4. Service
- 5. Follow-up
- 6. Program
- Hospitality

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

Section 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining, and Life.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

Section 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

Section 4. A payment of One Hundred Dollars may be made by any person for a life membership or a memorial gift.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month, except the month of August.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the month of August.

Section 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Friday in June.

By-Laws of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Section 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

Section 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Section 2. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Section 3. The members of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President, Treasurer and Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be divided into two groups of three members each. Group Number One shall consist of two directors and the Treasurer to be elected at the annual elections in even numbered years for a term of two years. Group Number Two shall consist of one director, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary to be elected at the annual elections in the odd numbered years for a term of two years. At any election a member may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 4. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

Section 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Report of President of Ebell Juniors

On July 1, 1941, the Ebell Juniors' membership was one hundred forty-three. The group worked and met together as a whole and also in specialized sections. As in the past there were sectional groups representing various interests and these were similar to many smaller clubs within the unit whole. Each was headed by a chairman.

The two main charitable projects, started in 1940-1941 and continued this year, were Ebell Rest Cottage and The Children's Hospital. Every month the Ebell Juniors contributed \$30.00 to each of these organizations to be used in its charitable pursuits. In addition to this financial consideration, donations of clothing and linen supplies were made through the Social Welfare section. As usual, the Juniors co-operated with the civic Community Chest Drive and raised \$206.00 which was more than the designated quota for this area.

This was the first war year for the Juniors and great changes came to everything and to everybody. Quite a metamorphosis occurred in the club, but as war was not declared until December, the club year opened as usual. The sections were as follows: Athletics, Arts and Crafts, Book Chamber, Bridge Benefits, Drama, Music, and Social Welfare. The committees were: Advisory, Benefits, Community Chest, Credentials, Decorations, Luncheons, Membership, National Defense, Programs, Publicity, Ebell Junior Directory, and "Ye Belles."

The first event of the year was the Annual Membership Tea held in October to meet prospective Juniors. During the year twenty-one new members were accepted. In October, we began the first of our eight monthly meetings. We met in the Solarium for luncheon, after which followed the regular business meeting and program. The regular Luncheon, Decoration, Telephone, Credential, and Program committees functioned for each of these meetings. The programs were varied and with two or three guest speakers they were usually adjourned about 3:30 p. m.

The Arts and Crafts was a section which was dropped in January because of the call upon members' time for war work.

The Book Chamber met on the fourth Friday of each month at the homes of members and the average attendance was thirty. Five of the programs were of current book reviews given by members and two sponsored guest speakers. Tea was served following the program.

The Music Salon met at the homes of members. The programs included: Opera Excerpts, a Pianist-composer and Pu-

pils, Lecture on Music, Creative Music for Children (with teacher and her pupils), Music in Defense Work, Review of Phonograph Records, Ebell Junior Talent. Beginning in March the Book Chamber and the Music Salon held their meetings together. This was done to conserve automobile tires, and to economize on the time of members because of pressing needs of the war emergency. The Music group attended lectures on the Symphonies before each concert.

The Bridge Benefit section met the first Wednesday of each month for dessert and bridge, and charged a fee of fifty cents a person. The profits of \$27.77 were deposited in the Junior Treasury.

The Drama Section began the year with monthly meetings and dramatic programs, but after the declaration of war the activities of this section were diverted to those of canteen work under The United Service Organizations. One day each month the Juniors took over the canteen of the Army Induction Center, furnishing and serving food for the inducted men. Money was raised through individual effort, and with this, plus a monthly donation by an Ebell member, a Defense Fund was begun to be used in this activity.

The Social Welfare Section held luncheon meetings at the homes of members. The afternoons were spent in sewing for the Children's Hospital and Ebell Rest Cottage. Pajamas, dresser scarfs, and luncheon napkins were made. During the latter part of the club year some of the Welfare meetings were turned over to bandage-making under the guidance of The Children's Hospital. Thirty-two hundred bandages were made.

The innovations for this year were: A National Defense Committee was formed to organize and direct all activities in this line. Under the recognized agencies of Red Cross and the United Service Organizations, the Juniors formed and attended First Aid Home Nursing, and Canteen classes at the Club. Production work was also directed by the Red Cross. Members formed hostess groups for the servicemen at United Service Organization headquarters and aided in dances for the men at the Club House. Some members took the Nurses Aid classes and became active in the hospitals. Others served at the Blood Bank, and the Central Board of the Listening Post. Some became First Aid instructors, and many of the members' husbands entered the service of the United States.

A Central Telephone Committee was established to call all members for each regular meeting and for each section meet-

ing. This committee also gathered and disseminated necessary club information. The Chairman of the Junior Directory acted as Chairman of the Telephone Committee.

A definite effort was made this year to systematize the business of running the Junior Club. We made a budget in order to plan more efficiently the income, and the outlay for expenditures. A closet was procured in the Club House in which to store all property belonging to Ebell Juniors and an inventory taken. Annual reports from all chairmen were required. The monthly club publication "Ye Belles" was enlarged and beautified.

Three money-making events were organized and carried out by the Benefit Committee. The first was a Bridge Luncheon and Fashion Show given in the fall. It netted the Club \$261.00. In January, the Juniors sponsored the showing of a colored motion picture of the Philippines and a timely lecture on the subject. The profits of the endeavor were \$45.78. The main benefit was a Patriotic Carnival given in the spring. Servicemen were our special guests and we realized a profit of \$364.00, making a total of \$670.78 on these three affairs.

This being the twenty-first year in the life of our Junior organization, a birthday celebration was held in March. Founders and past officers were included among our many honored guests. History, progress, and old friends highlighted the day. In May a Mothers' and Daughters' Luncheon was given and the program dedicated to our Mothers. This innovation proved delightful.

The year was terminated at an impressive installation ceremony in June, amidst magnolia blossoms and candlelight. The story of the year was told in the annual reports of the officers and chairmen. It was a year of many changes, and a wonderful year for this president who is proud to have played her small part in Ebell and she extends her sincere good wishes to the successful future of the Juniors.

By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

Section 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the

ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell Bulletin all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

Section 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.

Section 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.

Section 6. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor, and she shall sign all vouchers for expenditures. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Courtesy and Membership
- 3. Credentials
- 4. Program
- 5. Social Welfare and Scholarship
- 6. Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

Section 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Chairman of Ebell Scholarships, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors. The chairman of this Committee shall ex officio be a member of the Scholarship Committee of the Club.

By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

Section 6. Chairman of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Section 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

Section 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty years.

Section 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation, and if favorably acted upon by the Board of Governors, shall then follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Section 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid.

By-Laws of the Ebell Juniors

One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees, but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive,

excepting December, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

Section 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending all regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

Nominations

Section 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

Section 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall then be called for. Names of all nominees shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin.

Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

By-Laws of the Ebell Tuniors

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Adviser on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together during the months of May and June for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First-That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

*Second-That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third-That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted, is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth-That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth-That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Seventh-That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed

to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I

NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

Section 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any person serving more than one-half of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

Section 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

Section 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees, including the Presentation Committee, and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers, but in her absence or disability, the First Vice-President shall sign such checks, contracts, and other legal papers. The President shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club, and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments,

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may

By-Laws

desire. In the absence or disability of the President, she shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly statement of all receipts and expenditures to the Board of Directors and a semi-annual report to the Club. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

Section 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club, and unless otherwise provided for in these By-Laws, over all committees of the Club having power to receive and disburse moneys. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

Section 8. The Chairman of Hospitality shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees.

Section 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations, and report to the Board of Directors from time to time the activities of such organizations.

Section 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval.

Section 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

Section 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer, giving her a statement designating the accounts

to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Chairman of Rentals and all other directors in charge of the business of the Club. She shall be custodian of the seal, the books, and records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club, and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer for the faithful performance of her duties.

ARTICLE VI

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Former Officers' Round Table
- 3. Departments
- 4. Finance
- 5. Hospitality
- 6. House
- 7. Membership
- 8. Printing
- 9. Program
- 10. Public Relations
- 11. Rentals
- 12. Rest Cottage
- 13. Scholarship
- 14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.

Section 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.

Section 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall

make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Hospitality Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

Section 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall supervise the building and its contents.

Section 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

Section 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Bulletin and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

Section 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering. It shall keep in touch with and report the activities of all organizations in which Ebell holds membership and assists financially.

Section 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

Section 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its

By-Laws

chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

Section 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

Section 15. Chairmen of Committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VII

MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application

protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than five applications for regular membership, five for temporary membership, and five for Junior membership during each year.

Section 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

Section 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management. Regular members include those members specified in Sections 4 and 5 of Article VIII.

Section 5. Any member may apply for life membership who has continued in good and regular standing for five consecutive years next preceding the filing of the application for life membership. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in Article VII, Section 1. If the application is granted, the applicant shall pay the sum of \$500.00 provided she is under fifty (50) years of age, otherwise \$300.00. She shall receive a certificate of life membership and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership, without payment of dues.

By-Laws

Section 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

Section 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

Section 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a nonmember for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

Section 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend all Monday programs each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed in any subsequent year, provided the applicant is still a temporary resident. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

Section 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one-half of the regular admission fee, or one-half of the dues accrued during the time of nonmembership.

Section 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Section 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A regular member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 5. A regular member of the Club whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from

the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX

MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June, inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

Section 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meetings and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two years and shall be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. No member shall be eligible to election to the office of President who has not served on the Board of Directors for at least two years.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-Presi-

dent, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, General Curator, and Chairman of Hospitality. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Chairman of Finance, Chairman of Rentals, Chairman of Public Relations, Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

Nominations

Section 3. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members, who shall have been active members of the Club for five years. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in January for the purpose of electing a chairman and a secretary. Meetings thereafter shall be held at the discretion of the committee.

The Nominating Committee by a two-thirds vote of its members shall select one or more candidates, who shall consent to serve if elected, for each office to be filled at the annual election, and shall post these names on the bulletin board on April 1 or immediately thereafter.

Section 5. Not later than April 1 of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for each office to be filled at the ensuing election.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with the name of not more than one member for each office. This ballot so filled out shall be sealed in a plain envelope, enclosed in a second envelope upon which is written the name of the voting member as it appears in the Year Book, and mailed to the chairman of the Nominating Committee at the Ebell office before April 21. When received, the office secretary shall check the name and, if the member is in good standing, shall open and discard the outside envelope and deposit the sealed envelope in the ballot box.

Section 6. On April 21, or immediately thereafter, the Nominating Committee shall meet, count the nominating ballots and prepare the ballot for the annual election. This ballot shall contain the names of the candidates presented by the Nominating Committee and the name of each candidate receiving fifty (50) or more votes for one office on the nominating ballot, or a combined vote of seventy-five (75) or more votes, the office in this case to be the one for which she received the largest vote. The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the election ballot.

Section 7. On the second Monday in May the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

Section 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

Section 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between May first and May fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She

shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the names of those candidates receiving a plurality vote. A full report of the number of votes cast for each candidate shall be filed in the office of the Club and shall be available to any member.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary, who shall destroy them after installation of new officers.

Section 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

ARTICLE XI

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) and Ebell Juniors.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

By-Laws

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII

CLUB POLICIES

Section 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

Section 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to be voted upon and the date of

such voting. At the regular Monday meeting preceding the date of voting, the section or sections to be amended shall be read and the proposed amendment or amendments shall be read and explained.

Section 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV

CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

* * *

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Standing Rules

ADMISSION

- 1. Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
- 2. Regular members may bring three guests to all open Monday afternoon programs by paying fifty cents each, plus tax.
- 3. Junior members will receive six guest cards for departments of Ebell, one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
- 4. Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive six guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
- 5. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.
- Husbands of club members may be admitted to all department meetings on members' calling cards.
- Husbands of club members may be admitted on members' calling cards to all except special Monday afternoon programs. These cards must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.
- Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.
- All courtesy admission cards for Monday afternoons must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

- 1. Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.
- 2. New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from January first and July first, respectively.
- Applications for either non-resident or business rates should be presented before October first for the ensuing year or before March first for the last half of the year.
- 4. Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

SOLICITATIONS

- Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.
- No solicitation of signatures to petitions, memorials or similar documents shall be permitted in the clubhouse.
- 3. No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and the Board of Directors; nor shall there be any personal canvas for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1941. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

STANDING RULES

- 4. Members may not solicit gifts, commissions or favors from merchants or commercial concerns of any kind.
- 5. Members may not sell tickets for outside events in the club rooms.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Curators, committee chairmen and others arranging for called meetings in the club shall notify the office, stating the time and place of meeting.
- 2. Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.
- 3. A member may not represent Ebell on any outside committee unless so appointed by the President or Board of Directors.
- No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Lounge, except to the Reception Committee and for major benefits within a designated area.
- 5. It is a rule of the Club that there shall be no tipping.

DINING ROOM RESERVATIONS

- Luncheon tickets may be reserved by telephone before 10:30 o'clock on luncheon day. If not used, member ordering them will be responsible for payment. If reserved after 10:30 o'clock, ten cents additional will be charged.
- 2. Reservations for the Thursday Assemblies will close by five o'clock of the preceding day.
- 3. Tables may be reserved for Departments and other groups.

Standing Kules Coverning The Art Salon

The Art Exhibitions Committee of Ebell was organized in 1916. Its name was changed to The Art Salon in 1931. Its purpose (so recorded in the Minutes of the Board of Directors) is to exhibit the work of professional artists of high standing in conservative art. All work accepted for exhibition must conform to that standard.

Before any art object shall be exhibited in the Club, the exhibitor shall sign a written release waiving any claim against the Club on account of damage, etc., theft or other loss of art object. (Adopted by Board of Directors in 1939.)

A written order must be issued by the Art Chairman and presented at the club office before any art object may be removed.

All art objects must be removed from the club house within thirty days after the exhibition.

Monthly exhibitions of the work of outstanding painters, sculptors and miniature painters are held from October first through May in the Salon, water colors and prints in the Galeria.

The May exhibition is always competitive and prizes are given for the best work in each medium.

Competing artists may be invited by the Art Chairman or a general invitation may be sent out by the Chairman to all artists. In either case their work must pass a Jury of Selection and Awards appointed by the Chairman.

Dues shall be paid by the Art Patrons and shall be used by the Art Salon to pay for overhead expenses, for transportation of the exhibitions and for prizes additional to those given annually by interested Art Patrons. A prize is also given for the popular-vote choice of the Ebell members. It is the consensus of opinion that these prizes shall be of sufficient value to make them a worth-while honor.

All money collected by the Art Salon shall be paid at once to the Financial Secretary of Ebell and a receipt required therefor.

In June the Galeria is given over to the exhibition of the work of the artist members of Ebell, each member exhibiting not more than one in each medium.

The May exhibition in the Salon is usually held over, in whole or in part, through the month of June.

It is customary for the Art Patrons to hold an evening reception during the month of October, honoring exhibiting artists, and an artists' dinner in May, when the prize winners are announced.

The Art Chairman and her Committee shall serve one year. On retirement she shall pass on all papers and records to her successor in office.

There shall be four formal business meetings during the club year.

The Art Salon shall be under the direct control and supervision of the President of Ebell.
