FIFTY GOLDEN YEARS

A "beauteous golden Autumn day" in October, 1894, saw a little band of pioneer women meet to organize THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES. Fifty golden years of constant thought, united effort, and high purpose have made the promise and hope of Ebell's founders, a glad reality.

This company of determined optimists worked for industrial and international arbitration and pledged themselves to strive together toward better administration of juvenile delinquency and civic righteousness. From the early beginnings of "placing seventy pictures and casts in the Amelia Street School" to its present effectual Scholarship program, Ebell's interest in education has been unflinching.

Constructive charity consisted in contributions to innumerable city, county and state philanthropies and to maternity and rest hospitals. In cases of national and international disasters, Ebell was among the first to contribute to the relief of famine, earthquake, fire or flood victims. The same generation of workers that had closed its books so joyously on the long and arduous toil of World War I, has taken up its burden again and seventeen war activities have functioned with a chairman at the head of each.

The milestones along this golden pathway attest the undying faith in the institution that is Ebell. In 1897, THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES was incorporated and that year moved into the first structure in Los Angeles, built exclusively for a woman's club, at 724 South Broadway. Ebell soon determined to build its own clubhouse at 1719 South Figueroa Street. This was Ebell's home from January, 1906. Various parcels of valuable property were purchased including the lot at Wilshire and Lucerne Boulevards where the present stately clubhouse was erected and opened in October, 1927.

The definite activities of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES are: (1) the general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) and Ebell Juniors.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association was the outgrowth of the Social Service Committee and its present home, located at 135 North Parkview Street, was dedicated in February, 1923. Scholarships became a distinct activity of the club in 1920. Ebell Juniors was organized in 1921 and the Former Officers' Round Table in 1927. The Salon of Art continues the earlier work of the Art Exhibits Committee with the assistance of the Art Patrons' Committee. Ebell Associates with its accomplished "Five-Year Program," raising \$50,000 which was paid on the mortgage indebtedness, came into existence in 1939.

Ebell's object of "individual development, a united effort toward harmony, charity and that broad culture which comes through service to others," and the pledge of all its members, "I serve," have made its fifty golden years a joyous accomplishment.

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REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

1943-1944

A year ago today I asked you to retrospect for a moment before looking ahead into the future, which we would call "our adventure." This year of accomplishment, during a period of anxiety, with its feverish and busy days, has truly been an adventure.

You have again heard the annual reports of the various officers of the Board of Directors. The Treasurer has reported, among other items of interest, more than \$60,000 received from memberships, \$4,700 of that amount being for life memberships; \$22,000 in rentals from the Figueroa and Clubhouse properties; \$33,125 paid on the mortgage during the year, \$1,863 of which was contributed by the former officers of Ebell; \$42,100 of the Club's funds have now been invested in war bonds. This represents Ebell as a Club, together with the Scholarship and Rest Cottage Endowments.

The four hundred new members added to the Club rolls have augmented substantially the year's income. The dining room revenue has increased materially as well, although much of the profit was returned to equipment and necessary repair. The dining room Manager reports that sixty-four thousand meals have been served this year. This includes Club and rental activities.

Our Scholarship Chairman, in her report, announced that we, during the year, have maintained a full complement of twenty-five scholarships, five of which were granted to student nurses. From July 1, 1944, as scholarships are now awarded for a twelve-month period instead of the former ten-month period, sixteen regular and five nursing scholarships will be maintained. Many of the students who are receiving assistance from Ebell have achieved honor in both scholarship and activities. Their accomplishments in the future will be watched with much interest.

Ebell Rest Cottage Association has gained one hundred thirty-eight members during the year. Additional funds have been made available for this worth-while philanthropy of Ebell, amounting to \$15,340. Dues amounting to \$2,032 have been paid by members of Rest Cottage Association, the highest for twelve years. Many of our members continue to work unselfishly in the cause of the less fortunate women whom we are privileged to assist along the way of life.

This year we take particular pride in the achievements of the members of our Junior organization. They have not only increased their active membership, but have maintained one two-hundred-fifty-dollar nursing scholarship. At their last business

meeting they voted to contribute two hundred fifty dollars to the Club mortgage. This amount, augmented by another sum from the regular Club treasury, will be applied to the mortgage, bringing the year's total mortgage payment to \$1,500 over the \$31,625 already reported to you.

A commendable record has been made during the year by all of our war activities committees, including Knitting, United Service Organizations, Bandage Rolling, Bond Selling, and Red Cross Production.

Our Club facilities have been freely used by the Red Cross, War Chest, and other civic and national organizations in the interest and welfare of mankind. It can be truly said that we are an integral part of the national war effort, for, because of our organization, much has been accomplished. Without it, individual effort would have seemed small.

As stressed by my greeting to you in October of last year, we need friendship and companionship more than ever before, with understanding in our hearts, a willingness to work with our neighbor, to help that neighbor whenever possible, carrying always in our minds the objective toward which we strive—the welfare of the Club. This past year stands as an example of friendliness and understanding, perhaps because of the world chaos in which we are all involved. It is because of the sincere cooperation of all chairmen of Committees with the Board of Directors that the present fine results have been realized.

When undertaking the big obligation of President, I realized perhaps more than anyone, the opportunity afforded me for growth in many ways. I have endeavored to uphold the ideals and traditions of Ebell. I have felt the warmth of your response whenever you have been called upon to meet emergencies, and there have been many during the past two years. I have learned to be more understanding of my fellow man, willing to make allowances for mistakes for I, too, have made them.

If friends are riches, I count myself rich, for my service to Ebell has permitted me to make new friendships and become better acquainted with the old friends. May I now thank each one of you who has stopped long enough in your busy days to give me a word of encouragement during the past two years. To have served as your leader has been a joy and a liberal education, too. To have helped to solve your problems could not but develop a better understanding and a greater tolerance.

For all this and more would I voice my grateful appreciation and best wishes for continued prosperity and a brilliant future for Ebell.

REPORT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP CHAIRMAN

According to Ebell's By-Laws, one of the five definite forms of activity of the club is Scholarships. It is the pleasant task of the Scholarship Committee to supervise all scholarship awards and administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and other sources. The number of awards is limited because the Committee must operate upon a budget derived from the investments of the principal. Because of the accelerated war program of education, a student may complete the old four-year plan in two and one-half years, and the majority are ambitious to achieve this so that they can take advantage of the splendid opportunities offered today. Therefore, as compared to the old award of two hundred dollars for the ten-month school year, the scholarship now is one hundred sixty dollars for an eight-month school year. The natural conclusion is that we can carry more students than before. Unfortunately, it works the other way, because our budget is being drawn upon continuously twelve months of the year instead of ten, as heretofore.

Each semester a different number of students graduates, necessitating a continuous change in our disbursement of funds. Operating upon the limited budget we cannot carry the same number of students the entire year and we did not carry the maximum load until the final semester. Fortunately, three semesters coincide with the club's fiscal year. Thus, in the July to October semester, we carried sixteen students, in October to March, nineteen, and from March to June, twenty-five.

Twenty were academic awards and five were nursing scholarships. There were twelve at the University of California at Los Angeles, five at the University of Southern California, two at Occidental, and one at George Pepperdine. The five nursing scholarships are: one at Queen of the Angels, one at St. Vincent's, and three pre-nursing—one each at the University of California at Los Angeles, Los Angeles City College and Pasadena Junior College.

We were able to carry only one boy who was under eighteen, up to the March semester, due to the draft, affording him the opportunity to get a good start in a course essential to the war effort.

We are proud of our roster of students, and their major fields are varied. They are achieving honors in both scholarship and activities. Scholastic awards are: Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Chi Theta, Beta Sigma Gamma, Alpha Kappa Lambda, and others. Among the many activities represented are: one student is Associated Women's Students President; two are Mortar Board (one being President), and one is in national collegiate Who's Who.

We gratefully acknowledge the cash donations which we have

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Chairman of Public Relations has attended all Board meetings and called meetings, except two, during her past year in office. As a representative of Ebell, she has attended monthly meetings of the Women's Tax Study Group, the Consumers' Research Committee of the Better Business Bureau, the Los Angeles Coordinating Council, and some of the meetings of the Women's Auxiliary of the Chamber of Commerce. She has brought to the attention of the Board, various recommendations of these groups on which action has been taken.

The Public Relations Chairman has represented the Club at several civic functions where visiting dignitaries were honored.

As Chairman of War Activities, she has headed a committee of twenty women, each one of whom has a sub-committee and is responsible for carrying out the programs outlined by the American Red Cross, the United States Treasury Bond and Stamp sales, and the United Service Organizations. Several hundred women have been active in these branches, so our Club has a record of 58,006 volunteer hours spent in war work.

Ebell served two monthly canteens for USO, providing the sandwiches and doughnuts, and provided the hostesses for two downtown centers of USO one day each week, staffed a booth downtown for the sale of War Bonds weekly, and sold them in the Club every Monday afternoon. A day room for Officers of Battery A.A.A. 603th Gun Battalion was furnished this year.

The Public Relations Chairman arranged for three War Chest meetings, for a WAVES recruiting meeting, also for the annual meeting of the Los Angeles Area of the Red Cross to be held in our auditorium.

A group of women sewing in our Solarium under the supervision of Mrs. Robert H. Bacon has made for the United States Naval Hospital at Corona, many needed articles. These include 514 robes, 1406 surgical dressings, and 1228 pieces mended, such as sheets and pajamas. There have been 25 layettes for service men's wives, made for the hospital, also.

There have been knitted 140 pairs of socks for distribution by Bundles for America, 25 afghans and 25 pairs of bootees, which

were sent to the Norco Hospital. These were handled by Mrs. Grigsby.

A detailed report of Red Cross production of sewing and knitting follows this report.

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF ART SALON

The Art Salon, in spite of various difficulties, on account of war conditions, has enjoyed a satisfactory year because of the complete support of the Club and the generous cooperation of the Art Clubs in the city.

The first exhibit in October was an outstanding one by some of the prominent artists of the West. Mr. Paul Lauritz painted one of the snow scenes, for which he is so well known, at the monthly Art Salon tea. This exhibit was so much enjoyed that it was re-hung for the November exhibit. At the Art Salon tea, Miss Jason Herron, Art Chairman of the Friday Morning Club, spoke on "The Art Situation in Los Angeles."

In December, Mr. Charles Drogkamp gave a one-man show. His subjects were varied, scenes of New York City, and tropical views of Central America and Panama. Mr. Arthur Millier, the well-known art critic, spoke on "The Place of Art in Modern Life."

In January, the Painters and Sculptors Club exhibited in our salon. Mr. Philip Paval, whose beautiful silver work was on exhibition, spoke on "The Art of the Silversmith." Mr. Jarvis of the Pasadena Art Institute was prevented from appearing because of illness, so Dean Roscoe Shrader spoke briefly in his place.

In February, the Art Patrons were hostesses to the California Art Club. Mr. John Hubbard Rich painted a portrait of a model at the Art Salon tea.

In March, the Society for "Sanity in Art" exhibited in the Clubhouse. The program was of unusual interest as Mr. James Swinnerton, nationally known cartoonist, told a story in cartoons, and at the same time Mr. Roger Noble Burnham, the equally well-known sculptor, made a bust of Mr. Swinnerton while he cartooned.

In April, we welcomed the Women Painters of the West to the Salon. At this monthly tea, Mr. Alexander Markey, who has lived

many years among the Maories, gave an interesting and vivid account of their lives and customs.

May, as always, was given over to the annual competitive exhibition by local artists, who exhibit by invitation.

On June first, the Art Patrons gave a reception to the exhibiting artists and to those who had exhibited throughout the club year. One hundred seventy-five attended the reception. A jury, composed of Mr. George Barker, Mr. Conrad Buff, and Mr. Edward Taggart, awarded the prizes as follows:

The first prize in oils to Mr. Orrin White, the second prize in oils to Mr. Clyde Scott. The first prize in watercolors to Miss Loren Barton, the second prize in watercolors to Mr. Leland Curtis. There was a tie vote for first prize in miniatures, so it was divided between Mrs. Ruby Walker Usher and Jay Trueworthy. The prize for sculpture was won by Mr. Peter Ganine.

The number of visitors to the Art Salon and their keen interest, the beauty of the pictures, and the arrangement of the exhibits, show that the Art Patrons have made a real contribution to the lives of our Ebell members.

For the first two weeks in June, we enjoyed an exhibition of the work of our artist club members in the Galeria.

The attendance at the Art Salon has been as high as 325 at a single meeting. On the whole, the year has been a successful one for the Art Patrons.

WELFARE PROGRAM

In January of 1943, members of the Lives and Times Department inaugurated a movement to set apart at the Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal a room for the exclusive use of women traveling with small children. After interesting the railroad managers, U.S.O., and Travelers' Aid Society, the Women's and Children's Lounge was opened on February 16, 1944. Before March 1, the Lounge service cared for 863 mothers and 948 babies. Since that time, twelve to fifteen hundred women and a larger number of children, more than three-quarters of whom are families of members of the Armed Forces, use the Lounge each month.

Previous to the establishment of the Lounge, interested members of the Department enrolled in a child-care class, and now serve in turn at the Lounge. Latolae, the Department organization, acts as sponsor, furnishing toys, craft materials and small luxuries from time to time. Two of the five members of the advisory committee are members of the Lives and Times Department.

REPORT OF THE EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

Again the wheel of time has turned to complete a cycle in the history of Rest Cottage, closing the twenty-fifth since its small beginning out on Ninety-fifth Street; an uneventful year, except, that its bequests and donations have reached an all-time high mark for one year.

One wonders just whose influence in days gone by was responsible for the bequests that are the red life blood of the Cottage now, without which we would dip too deeply into the red ink of deficit since its earned income is not yet adequate for its needs.

Another \$9,000 has been received from the estate of Miss Jamie Maud Blanchard, \$1,875 from that of Mrs. George Bishop, \$1,000 from Mrs. Charles E. Wolfenden, \$250 from the Louis D. Beaumont Trust Fund and \$2,000 from the May Company in appreciation of care given to many of its employees.

Other donations, large and small, and from many sources, including those from some of our grateful guests, bring the year's gifts to \$15,289. Part of this has been invested in high-grade securities recommended by the advisors, the balance added to the savings and commercial accounts for immediate needs. Mrs. James Andrews Rogers, the Chairman of Finance, attended to the details of the purchase and reports \$3,502.78 received in interest and dividends from the Endowment Fund this year.

Mrs. William Bertram Burns, House Chairman, reports that her work has been very light this year. The kitchen has been painted, and plumbing, furnace, and radio repairs made as usual. She has replenished the linen supplies, bought wood for the fire place, and a maple bed and dresser, mirror, and box springs for Mrs. Lush's room.

The garden is still a lovely sanctuary despite the wind, rain, and lack of a caretaker, but Mrs. Robert S. Hardy has had a new lawn made, removed the fallen trees, replaced hose and garden tools, and a swing canopy, and the garden has responded and provides a delightful haven for lovers of sun and air.

Mrs. Edwin G. Howard has nothing but praise for the menus over which she keeps a watchful eye. She reports 10,851 meals served during the year, at an average cost of 21.7 cents per meal. Mrs. Lush has mastered the intricacies of ration-point marketing and the meals are plentiful, delicious, and well-balanced.

Twice during the year, members are invited to be guests at the Cottage. Mrs. Dwight S. Moore, the Registrar, counted 75 at the luncheon in October and 60 at a tea in April, both of which were planned and directed by Mrs. Erle M. Leaf.

In December, Mrs. Leaf assisted Mrs. Charles W. Partridge who arranged the annual Christmas dinner given to former Cottage guests. Mrs. Robert C. McAvoy, the Secretary, had sent invitation to 475 women, 135 accepted. Mrs. George H. Miller and Mrs. McGrath saw to it that the dinner was all it should be. The blue and silver table decorations were the handiwork of Mrs. William Hardy Montague; the Choral group sang for the guests in the Lounge; Mrs. Lon V. Smith arranged the program; and the 71 Ebell women, whose services for the Cottage made them eligible to attend, were the hostesses who left nothing undone to make this a red-letter day for women whose lives seldom fall in such pleasant places.

The fourth Rest Cottage social event was planned as a garden

party in the grounds of the home of one of Rest Cottage's most faithful friends, Mrs. Lyman Farwell.

Because of weather, the party resolved itself into an indoor affair where, after the regular business meeting, 66 new and old members of Ebell assembled in the spacious room for a buffet luncheon arranged by Mrs. Leaf and her committee.

Drs. Charlotte M. Brown and J. Margaret Roberts continue their inestimable aid to the Cottage work; investigating 192 cases during the year, 67 of which were rejected; and there are many applications which never reached the two physicians.

The Rest Cottage plan is for rehabilitation and is not a home for indigents, nor women needing medical and nursing care. It has been found helpful to establish a sixty-year age limit, but the plan is elastic enough to stretch for some of the elderly women who are still self-supporting and self-respecting, and intensely grateful for the peace, rest, and good food which the Cottage offers until they get on their feet again.

There is a never-ending interest in watching these guests of ours—coming as they do from all walks in life—some down and almost out from the “stings and arrows of outrageous fortune,” others serene and hopeful; thankful that their estate is no worse and, by their own serenity and faith, building anew for the future. Some are extremely inconsiderate of others' comfort; some continually doing little acts of kindness. A few who have not been honest in their answers to our questionnaire—the \$64 question being “Has she a place to go when her time is up at the Cottage?” But they are all grateful for what the Cottage gives them and nearly all of them write to tell us so: a number of them send small contributions to express their gratitude.

It is interesting to note, too, how many different ills there are that flesh is heir to, more than thirty-one last year. The most interesting case was a nurse who came to us after surgery on a broken back. When nature refused to replace the cushion between two vertebrae, four steel pins did the work. Now she is recovering. She loved the Cottage and made a substantial contribution when she received her insurance.

Another suffered from a gastrectomy operation; there were many cases of hysterectomy and appendectomy; a few of cholecystectomy, nephropexy—one of pneumectomy and the others simpler perhaps in name, such as nervous exhaustion, anemia, and shingles, but often more difficult to recover from.

Crowded hospitals are still pushing their patients out too soon, and the two-week limitation is often disregarded. Some of the girls beg to stay longer, others would leave too soon rather than seem to impose on our hospitality. Few leave without asking the

Lord's blessing on the women of Ebell whose altruism has made and is still making this service possible.

RESOLUTIONS

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of the Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise FOR BENEFIT OF EBELL REST COTTAGE

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the Maintenance of Rest Cottage
.....dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:....."

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

SECTION 41 OF THE PROBATE CODE

Restrictions

No estate, real or personal, may be bequeathed or devised to any charitable or benevolent society or corporation, or to any person or persons in trust for charitable uses, by a testator who leaves a spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor surviving him who, under the will, or the laws of succession would otherwise have taken the property so bequeathed or devised unless the will was duly executed at least thirty days before the death of the testator. If so executed at least thirty days before death, such devises and legacies shall be valid, but they may not collectively exceed one-third of the testator's estate as against his spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor, who would otherwise, as aforesaid, have taken the excess over one-third, and if they do a pro rata deduction from such devises and legacies shall be made so as to reduce the aggregate thereof to one-third of the estate. All property bequeathed or devised contrary to the provisions of this section shall go to the spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor of the testator, if and to the extent that they would have taken said property as aforesaid but for such devises or legacies; otherwise the testator's estate shall go in accordance with his will and such devises and legacies shall be unaffected.

BY-LAWS OF EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. The three directors who are elected from Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be chairmen, respectively, of Finance, House and Garden.

Section 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except those members otherwise provided for, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

Section 3. The Chairman of Finance shall head a committee com-

posed of the President, Chairman of Finance and the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles, and the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. This Finance Committee shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Association. The Chairman of Finance and the Chairman of Rest Cottage shall be assisted by an advisory committee of three investment counselors who shall advise as to the investment of all Endowment Funds, together with such other moneys as may be available for investment. The Finance Chairman shall bring to the Finance and Executive Committees meeting together the recommendations of these advisors for approval. Upon approval by a majority of said committees of a recommended investment the Chairman of Finance shall be empowered to make such transactions. The Chairman of Finance shall verify the monthly financial reports of the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Section 4. The House Chairman shall have charge of all replacements and repairs at Ebell Rest Cottage, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Garden Chairman shall have supervision of the planting and upkeep of the garden, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all standing committees. She shall appoint all special committees and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall receive from the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles all moneys due and contributed to the Association, together with a statement showing the accounts for which such moneys have been contributed and shall give a receipt for same. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and she shall be bonded as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE V**STANDING COMMITTEE**

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Finance
2. Membership
3. Investigation
4. Service
5. Follow-up
6. Program
7. Hospitality
8. Field Survey

ARTICLE VI**MEMBERS**

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

Section 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life.

ARTICLE VII**DUES**

Section 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

Section 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

Section 4. A payment of One Hundred Dollars may be made by any person for a life membership or a memorial gift.

ARTICLE VIII**MEETINGS**

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month, except the month of August, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the months of August and September, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Monday in June, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

Section 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE IX**ELECTIONS**

Section 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Section 2. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Section 3. The members of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President, Treasurer and Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be divided into two groups of three members each. Group Number One shall consist of two directors and the Treasurer to be elected at the annual elections in even-numbered years for a term of two years. Group Number Two shall consist of one director, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary to be elected at the annual elections in the odd-numbered years for a term of two years. At any election a member may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 4. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

ARTICLE X**AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

Section 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

The program of the Ebell Juniors was streamlined this year to solve problems of transportation brought about by the war. Being cognizant of the desperate need for trained nurses, the Juniors contributed \$250.00 to the Scholarship Fund of Ebell for this purpose, thus changing their philanthropic interest to one directly necessary to the war effort. An equal sum, \$250.00, was given to Ebell to be used for the Mortgage Fund in appreciation of the privileges the Juniors enjoy and in recognition of the extremely co-operative relationship between the President of Ebell and the Board of Directors and the Junior organization.

A definite effort was made to eliminate unnecessary expenses in the Junior budget. With this goal in mind, the Junior President, with the advisors, made a budget to plan more efficiently the expected income and probable expenditures for the year. Economy in decorations for the luncheons; simplification of the printing of "Ye Belles"; elimination of remuneration for speakers. All contributed to the successful working out of this plan.

Two money-making events were organized and carried out by the Benefit Chairman. The first netted the club \$98.00 and resulted from the sale of pencils. On St. Patrick's Day, the Juniors held a Bridge Luncheon at the Club which was an unusually successful affair, both socially and financially. This party added \$245.35 to our treasury.

The Juniors met four times monthly to meet the curtailment of transportation facilities: at the luncheon and business meeting held the second Tuesday in the Solarium; the Book Chamber section which met following dessert at members' homes; the Bridge with tea, also arranged at homes; and the Pot Luck Suppers.

The Book Chamber section featured a résumé of current literature by the Chairman and individual reviews given by members. The average attendance was 35.

Bridge provided a necessary social outlet for many members whose husbands are in the armed forces beside contributing \$50.98 to the treasury for philanthropy.

The Pot Luck Suppers gained in popularity this year. These informal affairs had an average attendance of forty and netted \$308.22 during the year.

As usual, the Juniors cooperated with the War Chest campaign. Our other civic contribution was that of awarding a Campership of \$25.00 to the Girl Scouts.

Both because of added home responsibilities and transportation difficulties, our Red Cross work was limited in its scope. During

the summer, the Production Unit held monthly meetings to make equipment necessary for the hospitals. A quilt and many useful smaller items were furnished by this committee. The members brought sandwiches, and a beverage was served by the hostess. After October, one day each month the Juniors took over canteen work under the United Service Organizations, furnishing and serving food for the inductees.

During the year, twenty-two new members were accepted. The first event of the club calendar was a dessert bridge for prospective members at the home of one of our advisors, Mrs. Carl B. Van Sant.

In October, we began the first of our eight monthly luncheons and business meetings followed by a program which we held in the Solarium. The speakers included: Lieutenant Colonel Charles Titus, who described the everyday experiences of soldiers in Australia and New Guinea; Mrs. Doran, an artist designer, whose "Language of Clothes" gave an unusual presentation of the expression of personality in the choice of wearing apparel; a summary of strides in the aviation industry by Frank Cunningham, biographer of Donald Douglass; Frank Graham, CBS announcer and actor, in dramatic readings; Mrs. James Scarborough, State President of the League of Women Voters, on "How to Be a Good Citizen in 1944"; Mrs. Fairfax Walkup of the Pasadena Community Playhouse; and Miss Ruth Clifton, who spoke on methods of combatting juvenile delinquency as exemplified in the Moline Plan.

In May, the program was dedicated to our Mothers at the Annual Mothers' and Daughters' Luncheon. Juniors modelled in the Fashion Show and an interesting talk was given by Mrs. Thompson describing her experiences in returning from China with her baby daughter.

The Children's Party was again held in Griffith Park. Thirty-eight participated in this annual event.

Our year was terminated at an impressive installation ceremony on June 16 in the Art Salon. Fuchsia shades were used to highlight the tones of the room.

It was a year of changes in personnel and of simplified activities, and yet it was a year of accomplishments. Friendliness was the keynote of the Junior group. In retrospect, it presents an interesting parallel to America's progress in the war. We witnessed a reorganization of our committees; were handicapped by transportation problems; achieved minor victories due to the able leadership and the cooperation of our members; were rewarded in recent months by the success resulting from a smoothly functioning organization.

My heartfelt thanks to the Executive Board and Chairmen,

and to the Advisory Committee who assisted in carrying out our various activities.

BY-LAWS OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

Section 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell

Bulletin all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.

Section 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.

Section 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Juniors not otherwise provided for and shall issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor, and she shall sign all vouchers for expenditures. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
2. Courtesy and Membership
3. Credentials
4. Program
5. Social Welfare and Scholarship
6. Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

Section 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Chairman of Ebell Scholarships, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors. The chairman of this Committee shall ex-officio be a member of the Scholarship Committee of the Club.

Section 6. Chairman of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Section 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

Section 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years.

Section 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation, and if favorably acted upon by the Board of Governors, shall then follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Section 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

ARTICLE VII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-

resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees, but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

Section 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending all regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

Nominations

Section 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five mem-

bers. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

Section 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall then be called for. Names of all nominees shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin.

Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Adviser on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first, provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together during the months of May and June for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Articles of Incorporation

Know All Men By These Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be **THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES**.

**Second*—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted, is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A.D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

BY-LAWS**ARTICLE I****NAME**

The corporate name of this Club shall be **THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES**.

ARTICLE II**OBJECT**

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

ARTICLE III**OFFICERS**

The Officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV**POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

Section 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any person serving more than one-half of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

Section 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of **THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES** and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

Section 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V**DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees, including the Presentation Committee, and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers, but in her absence or disability, the First Vice-President shall sign such checks, contracts, and other legal papers. The President shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may

desire. In the absence or disability of the President, she shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly statement of all receipts and expenditures to the Board of Directors and a semi-annual report to the Club. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of

Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

Section 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club, and unless otherwise provided for in these By-Laws, over all committees of the Club having power to receive and disburse moneys. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

Section 8. The Chairman of Hospitality shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees.

Section 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations, and report to the Board of Directors from time to time the activities of such organizations.

Section 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board off Directors for approval.

Section 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES and a semi-annual report to the Club.

Section 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer, giving her a statement designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Chairman of Rentals and all other directors in charge of the business of the Club. She shall be custodian of the seal, the books, and records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club, and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor. She

shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer for the faithful performance of her duties.

ARTICLE VI

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
2. Former Officers' Round Table
3. Departments
4. Finance
5. Hospitality
6. House
7. Membership
8. Printing
9. Program
10. Public Relations
11. Rentals
12. Rest Cottage
13. Scholarship
14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.

Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.

Section 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.

Section 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.

Section 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to

this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Hospitality Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

Section 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall supervise the building and its contents.

Section 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

Section 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Bulletin and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

Section 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering. It shall keep in touch with and report the activities of all organizations in which Ebell holds membership and assists financially.

Section 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

Section 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

Section 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

Section 15. Chairman of committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she

desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VII

MEMBERS

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the applicant for a period of.....(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than five applications for regular membership, five for temporary membership, and five for Junior membership during each year.

Section 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America

and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

Section 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management. Regular members include those members specified in Sections 4 and 5 of Article VIII.

Section 5. Any member may apply for life membership who has continued in good and regular standing for five consecutive years next preceding the filing of the application for life membership. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in Article VII, Section 1. If the application is granted, the applicant shall pay the sum of \$500.00 provided she is under fifty (50) years of age, otherwise \$300.00. She shall receive a certificate of life membership and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership without payment of dues.

Section 7. Aspecial membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

Section 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

Section 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a nonmember for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

Section 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend all Monday programs each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be sub-

mitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed in any subsequent year, provided the applicant is still a temporary resident. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

Section 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one-half of the regular admission fee, or one-half of the dues accrued during the time of nonmembership.

Section 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The payment of this fee may be suspended for a stated time at any regular meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote, provided due notice of the proposed suspension has been given.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first, and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 4. A regular member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 5. A regular member of the Club whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX

MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June, inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

Section 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no

further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meetings and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X

ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two years and shall be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. No member shall be eligible to election to the office of President who has not served on the Board of Directors for at least two years.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, General Curator, and Chairman of Hospitality. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Chairman of Finance, Chairman of Rentals, Chairman of Public Relations, Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

Nominations

Section 3. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members, who shall have been active members of the Club for five years. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in January for the purpose of electing a chairman and a secretary. Meetings thereafter shall be held at the discretion of the committee.

The Nominating Committee by a two-thirds vote of its members shall select one or more candidates, who shall consent to serve if elected, for each office to be filled at the annual election, and shall post these names on the bulletin board on April 1 or immediately thereafter.

Section 5. Not later than April 1 of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for each office to be filled at the ensuing election.

Each voting member may fill out such a blank with the name of not more than one member for each office. This ballot so filled out shall be sealed in a plain envelope, enclosed in a second envelope upon which is written the name of the voting member as it appears in the Year Book, and mailed to the chairman of the Nominating Committee at the Ebell office before April 21. When received, the office secretary shall check the name and, if the member is in good standing, shall open and discard the outside envelope and deposit the sealed envelope in the ballot box.

Section 6. On April 21, or immediately thereafter, the Nominating Committee shall meet, count the nominating ballots and prepare the ballot for the annual election. This ballot shall contain the names of the candidates presented by the Nominating Committee and the name of each candidate receiving fifty (50) or more votes for one office on the nominating ballot, or a combined vote of seventy-five (75) or more votes, the office in this case to be the one for which she received the largest vote. The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the election ballot.

Section 7. On the second Monday in May the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

Section 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

Section 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between May first and may fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received *before* the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Bulletin. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the names of those candidates receiving a plurality vote. A full report of the number of votes cast for each candidate shall be filed in the office of the Club and shall be available to any member.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary, who shall destroy them after installation of new officers.

Section 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

ARTICLE XI

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) and Ebell Juniors.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the officers of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII

CLUB POLICIES

Section 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

Section 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to be voted upon and the date of such voting. At the regular Monday meeting preceding the date of

voting, the section or sections to be amended shall be read and the proposed amendment or amendments shall be read and explained.

Section 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by *Robert's Rules of Order Revised*, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV

CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

* * *

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1943. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

STANDING RULES

ADMISSION

1. Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
2. Regular members may bring three guests to all but special programs, by paying the stipulated fee including tax.
3. Junior members will receive six guest cards for departments of Ebells, one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
4. Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive six guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
5. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.
6. Husbands of club members may be admitted to all department meetings on members' calling cards.
7. Husbands of club members may be admitted on members' calling cards to all except special Monday programs. These cards must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.
8. Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.
9. All courtesy admission cards for Monday afternoons must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

1. Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.
2. New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from January first and July first, respectively.
3. Applications for either non-resident or business rates should be presented before October first for the ensuing year or before March first for the last half of the year.
4. Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

SOLICITATIONS

1. Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.
2. No solicitation of signatures to petitions, memorials or similar documents shall be permitted in the clubhouse.
3. No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and the Board

of Directors; nor shall there be an personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

4. Members may not solicit gifts, commissions or favors from merchants or commercial concerns of any kind.
5. Members may not sell tickets for outside events in the club rooms.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. Curators, committee chairmen and others arranging for called meetings in the club shall notify the office, stating the time and place of meeting.
2. Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.
3. A member may not represent Ebell on any outside committee unless so appointed by the President or Board of Directors.
4. No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Lounge, except to the Reception Committee and for major benefits within a designated area.

LUNCHEON AND DINNER TICKETS

1. Tickets will be sold for all meals.
2. Reservations for all meals should be made two days in advance. If reservations are not cancelled, members making them will be responsible for payment.
3. An extra charge of ten cents will be made on luncheon tickets purchased after eleven o'clock that day.
4. Cancellations for luncheon reservations will not be accepted after ten o'clock of the day.
5. Cancellations for dinner reservations will not be accepted after twelve o'clock of the preceding day.
6. Reservations for Monday luncheons should be in on Friday.

POLICY ON DELINQUENT DUES AND REINSTATEMENT

A member who has been dropped because of delinquent dues may be reinstated by payment of the delinquent dues plus an amount the equivalent to the intervening dues and become a member in good standing. The original date of becoming a member may then appear in the year book.

STANDING RULES GOVERNING THE ART SALON

The Art Exhibitions Committee of Ebell was organized in 1916. Its name was changed to The Art Salon in 1931. Its purpose (so recorded in the minutes of the Board of Directors) is to exhibit the work of professional artists of high standing in *conservative art*. All work accepted for exhibition must conform to that standard.

Before any art object shall be exhibited in the Club, the exhibitor shall sign a written lease waiving any claim against the Club on account of damage, theft, or other loss of art object. (Adopted by Board of Directors in 1939.)

A written order must be issued by the Art Chairman and presented at the club office before any art object may be removed.

All art objects must be removed from the clubhouse within thirty days after the exhibition.

Exhibitions of the work of outstanding painters, sculptors and miniature painters are held from October first through May in the Salon, water colors and prints in the Galeria.

The May exhibition is always competitive and prizes are given for the best work in each medium.

Competing artists may be invited by the Art Chairman or a general invitation may be sent out by the Chairman to all artists. In either case their work must pass a Jury of Selection and Awards appointed by the Chairman.

Dues shall be paid by the Art Patrons and shall be used by the Art Salon to pay for overhead expenses, for transportation of the exhibitions and for prizes additional to those given annually by interested Art Patrons. A prize is also given for the popular-vote choice of the Ebell members. It is the consensus of opinion that these prizes shall be of sufficient value to make them a worth-while honor.

All money collected by the Art Salon shall be paid at once to the Financial Secretary of Ebell and a receipt required therefor.

In June the Galeria is given over to the exhibition of the work of the artist members of Ebell, each member exhibiting not more than one in each medium.

The May exhibition in the Salon is usually held over, in whole or in part, through the month of June.

It is customary for the Art Patrons to hold an evening reception during the month of October, honoring exhibiting artists, and an artists' dinner in May, when the prize winners are announced.

The Art Salon shall be under the direct control and supervision of the President of Ebell.
