

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#### The Ebell

Dr. Adrian Ebell, a distinguished German scholar, realizing woman's limited opportunity for mental development and the necessity of fitting her to cope more effectively with the strenuous and complex forms of modern life, conceived the idea of establishing an international academy with headquarters at Berlin and tributary chapters in all parts of the world, for the object of developing feminine mentality along serious and scientific lines.

The first of the several chapters on the Pacific Coast bearing his name was the Oakland Ebell, organized in 1876. The Los Angeles Ebell, established in 1894, with its central organization and various study departments, was modeled upon the same lines as this admirably planned Mother Club.

Each of these great music dramas is explained with the special view of bringing before the minds of the audience what actually takes place at the best performances, and at each lecture-recital a program of the music is rendered on the pianoforte. References are frequently made to the interpretations given by the great singers. In order to make the course more inclusive, Wagner is shown not merely as the superb musician, but as the dramatist, poet, philosopher, and deep ethical teacher.

The class lessons are for the purpose of stimulating greater interest in these renowned masterpieces. On these occasions the members of the Music Department are entitled to ask questions either viva voce or in writing, and thus individual difficulties are explained.

The aim of the Director is so to train the artistic faculties that each of his hearers may become a cultured musician, able to appreciate the beautiful in music, and ready to exercise a keen, judicious, and always sympathetic criticism. The course should commend itself to the beginner as well as to the advanced, to the pianist, the vocalist, the student of musical form and instrumentation, and to those wishing to become acquainted with Wagnerian traditions.

# Annual Report of the Recording Secretary

The last year of The Ebell of Los Angeles has been not only one of continued progress in those special lines of culture for which our Club was founded, but has been notable also as one in which our material prosperity may be said to have received a distinct impetus. We refer to the purchase of 261 extra shares of Ebell Building Association Stock—our holdings now amounting to 1755 shares, valued at \$17,550—thus giving the Club, as an organization, the controlling interest in the clubhouse property. As loyal members of Ebell we rejoice in this knowledge.

One hundred and sixteen regular members have qualified during the year, five names have been added to the list of Life Members, fifteen Associate and thirty-two Temporary Members have enjoyed the privileges of the Club for the year. Twenty-one members have resigned. It is with sad hearts we record the death of five of our Active Members, and one Honorary Member. The total number of regular members in good and active standing is 918. There have been 4787 guests entertained at the open Monday afternoon programs.

The Club is indebted for gifts of pictures, books, etc., to Mrs. Richard Gird, Mrs. O. H. Churchill, the Department of Art and Travel, the Department of Shakespeare, Mrs. P. G. Hubert, Mrs. George H. Kress, Mrs. Benj. Thorpe, Mrs. Elizabeth Hancock, Mrs. F. W. Johnson, and Count Bozenta.

The Club has had the pleasure of assisting the following philanthropic and civic organizations: The Barlow Sanitarium, the Maternity Hospital, the Archaeological Society, the Berkeley Loan Fund, the Legal Aid Society, the McKinley Home, and of giving smaller donations to several other worthy causes. The Los Angeles County Chapter of the California Branch of the American National Red Cross was launched under Ebell auspices—the initial expense being paid by the Club. By the kindness of our members who participated in it, one of our Monday programs was reproduced for the benefit of the Sicilian earthquake sufferers, \$227.50 in this way was turned over to that worthy cause.

We have had thirty-five regular Monday afternoon programs, exclusive of Charter Day Reception, and the Children's Christmas Party—all of which have been excellent and varied. We have had ten musical programs, five of which were arranged by our own members, namely: Mesdames Welsh, Martindale, Ogilvie and Stanton. The names of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Clifford Lott recall a delightful program, and "The Raven," under the direction of Mr. Archibald Sessions will long remain a delightful memory. Mr. and Mrs. Thilo Becker furnished an artistic program later in the season.

Our lectures were all good, of sufficiently varied subjects to bring out interested audiences. Early in the season Mr. Charles Keeler spoke on "Man, the Creative Artist, in His Relation to Nature." This was the first of a series of lectures given by Mr. Keeler. Our Honorary Member, the Hon. Frank P. Flint, kindly addressed us on "Our National Resources," bringing us in touch with the vital happenings at Washington, and those special things that affect the interest of our state and city. One of the gems of the year was the theme "The Bible as Literature," presented by Mrs. Hume, our State President. Dr. M. S. Hughes told us in his inimatable way of "The Penalties of Progress"; while Mr. C. A. Ballreich addressed us on "City Politics," touching on that im-

portant subject, "Women's Suffrage." Dr. Ross Moore and Rev. Dana Bartlett spoke to us on the much-discussed and highly interesting subjects, "Psycho-Therapy" and "Religio-Therapy." We are indebted to Mr. Frank G. Tyrrell for a lecture on "The Romance of the Desert," which, under his magic touch, blossomed like a rose. Through the courtesy of Dr. Fitch C. E. Mattison, Dr. George H. Kress and Mr. Leslie Hewitt, "City Problems" were discussed—the first two gentlemen devoting themselves to problems of physical health, and the latter to problems of political health. We again had the pleasure of traveling with Mr. Baumgardt—this time through that land of the warm sunshine—"Broad-Breasted Spain."

We have had readings and plays varying from the comic farce of Howells to Browning's immortal "Saul." Mrs. Eliza Tupper Wilkes gave us a delightful program. Mrs. Lillian Burkhart Goldsmith presented a clever farce by Bernard Shaw, and the Department of French gave two French plays. We are indebted to Mrs. C. L. Higbee for a most pleasing June program.

The social feature of all these Monday meetings was made attractive and cordial by the kindness of the House Committee, whose courtesy over the tea cups added a charm to the whole.

Our Children's Christmas Party was a pleasure to all. Once more the auditorium rang with the merry laughter of happy children as they welcomed their time-honored guest—"Old Santa," with his pack. Only a few of the members know of the happy faces and the hearts made glad by the lovely toys left by our little ones for their less fortunate friends.

The following day was one of pure delight to sixty little folk, brought from different parts of the city by loving members, interested in each particular child. What happy loads the borrowed automobiles con-

tained! There was a glorious ride, the wonderful Clubhouse reached, toys received, "Santa" seen, grand slides across slippery floors, and off again to a fairy home where the choice of eating ice cream or rolling down real grassy hills, would have made some little ones miserable, but that the gracious hostess, Mrs. Robert Marsh, kindly gave time for both. Sixty little hearts made happy! Those who made this possible, certainly realized the meaning of the words: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." The complete success of this party would indicate that this feature for Yule Tide bids fair to become an Ebell annual.

The report of the General Curator, Mrs. E. C. Bellows, shows that the department work has been earnest and thoughtful, and well maintained throughout the year. This branch of our Club work is participated in by nearly half the members, and they are enthusiastic in their appreciation of the value of the

opportunities offered.

The Department of Parliamentary Law met twice a month, during five months, under the instruction of Mrs. J. A. Osgood. In the course of her excellent drill, some valuable discussions on current events occurred. After the close of Mrs. Osgood's engagement, part of the class continued to meet during two months more, for practice under the leadership of the Assistant Curator, Mrs. C. B. Dickson.

The Department of Science, with Mrs. Jay B. Millard and Mrs. Charles N. Flint as leaders, held seven meetings, two of which were symposiums by members of the Department, and the others, lectures

by prominent workers in the scientific field.

The Department of French, Mrs. James Bert Stearns, Curator, met each week. The Club is indebted to this section for a Monday afternoon program.

The Department of Expression, under the leadership of Mrs. W. L. Jones, spent fourteen meetings in studying the Essays of Emerson, and the members unite in declaring that the work was both pleasant and profitable.

The Department of Shakespeare, Mrs. F. W. Johnson, Curator, held fifteen sessions. They studied the plays "Twelfth Night" "Hamlet" and "Midsummer Night's Dream." The regular attendants found the discussions of great value to a just understanding of

life, as well as the master dramatist.

The Department of Music, Mrs. Katherine Kimball Forest, Curator, held seven meetings during the year. The programs, given by local artists of more than local reputation, have covered a wide range of musical knowledge and beauty, including valuable papers on the "Evolution of Music," both historical and constructive; a morning of Irish songs and three of opera.

The Department of Books and Conversation, with Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, as leader, enjoyed seven instructive programs dealing with the drama and re-

cent works of interest.

The Department of Art and Travel, in charge of Mrs. Allison Barlow, Curator, spent a profitable year in the study of Flemish, Dutch and German Art.

Under the supervision of the General Curator, more than fifty dollars' worth of books have been added to

our library.





Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

#### By-Laws

#### Article I

The incorporate name of this Society shall be The Ebell of Los Angeles.

#### Article II

The object of this Society is advancement in all lines of general culture.

#### Article III

The officers of this Society shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

#### Article IV

#### Powers and Duties of Directors

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i.e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Society.

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- Sec. 3. The Directors shall appoint their own Secretary from their number.
- Sec. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

#### Article V

- Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Society, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meetings of the Society.
- Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Society.
  - Sec. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- Sec. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 5. The Curators of the Sections shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

#### Article VI

#### Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Society, and shall be an honorary member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

Sec. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- Sec. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall be exofficio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Society and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- Sec. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Society, and of the Ex-

ecutive Committee, and shall submit a report at the annual meeting, sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all Committees their instructions in writing.

- Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Society; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Society and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Society in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Society.
- Sec. 6. The Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Society a statement of the time and place of all Section meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Society. She shall ascertain which Section a new member desires to enter. She shall receive application for the formation of new Sections, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Section, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make reports of the same at the annual meeting of the Society. She is also ex-officio chairman of Committee on Sections.
- Sec. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secre-

## Article VII Standing Committees

Section 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing;
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Sections;
- 5. House Committee.
- Sec. 2. The Committee on Membership, upon receiving the properly endorsed names of applicants for membership, shall investigate the same and report at the next regular meeting of the Executive Committee; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- Sec. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Society.
- Sec. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
  - Sec. 5. The Committee on Sections shall assist in

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the organization of Sections, and advise the Curator of Sections in arranging their course of study.

- Sec. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- Sec. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

#### Article VIII

#### Members

Section 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her name shall be endorsed by three regular members in good standing and of more than one year's membership. The application shall be handed to the Membership Committee. Upon receiving the endorsement of the Committee and having been posted two weeks, it shall be voted upon by the Executive Committee at its next meeting. Endorsers shall be personally responsible for applicant.

The notice of acceptance shall be sent to the proposed member by the Clerk, together with bill for admission and half yearly dues.

No member of the Society may sign more than three applications for regular membership, or more than three for associate or temporary membership, during one year.

Sec. 2. Business women, members of the Society, whose hours of business are such as to make only an occasional attendance possible at the regular meetings

- Sec. 3. Any member in good and regular standing who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Society for five (5) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.
- Sec. 4. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of regular initiation fee and half the annual dues.
- Sec. 5. The wives of Army and Navy officers may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- Sec. 6. A non-resident may become an associate member for the current year by having her name duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues. This privilege shall be extended for one year only. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation, nor be privileged to member at any time by the payment of the initiation fee.
- Sec. 7. A non-resident may become a temporary member by having her name presented by one member in good and regular standing, with the approval the Chairman of the Membership Committee, upon the payment of \$2.00 per month. She shall have no corporation.

Sec. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

Sec. 9. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous vote of the Committee on Membership.

Sec. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues.

Sec. 11. Each member of the Society must sign the Bv-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Sec. 12. Honorary life membership in this Society may be given by vote of the Society in recognition of distinguished services. Such honorary membership shall confer all rights and privileges to ordinary membership without payment of dues.

Sec. 13. Members in good and regular standing who resign may, upon application, receive a resignation card stating their standing.

Sec. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

#### Article IX

#### Dues

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- Sec. 2. The annual dues shall be \$8.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March, each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues; if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership.
- Sec. 3. Any member paying \$100 shall receive a certificate of life membership and shall be exempt from payment of dues.
- Sec. 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Society.
- Sec. 5. Members who may be absent from the city for one year or more shall pay half the annual dues.

#### Article X

#### Meetings

Section 1. Excepting during the months of July, August and September, a regular meeting of the Society shall take place on each Monday at 2:30 p.m., at which Sections may report, papers be presented, or

Sec. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Society for

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regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Society.

- Sec. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.
- Sec. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.
- Sec. 5. The semi-annual business meeting of the Society shall take place on the first Monday in January.

#### Article XI

#### Elections

- Section 1. The annual meeting for the election of directors and officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.
- Sec. 2. A nominating ballot shall be sent to every member of the Club by the 14th of April.
- Sec. 3. Such ballots shall be returned by the first Monday in May, and shall be handed to the Committee on Nominations, which shall consist of three members, two of whom shall be selected by the Club members on the first Monday in May, and the third shall be named by the Executive Committee.

It shall be the duty of this Committee to notify each nominee receiving twenty-five votes, or over, of her nomination, and ascertain which candidates ac-

- Sec. 4. Elections shall take place by ballot, and a plurality vote shall elect.
- Sec. 5. Two directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election. Officers shall be elected for one year. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a director for one year.
- Sec. 6. No member shall be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms.
- Sec. 7. Installation of officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee the fourth Thursday of June.

#### Article XII

Section 1. The Society shall be divided into departments for the study of special subjects or the carments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and deem advisable.

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- Rule 1. All members of Sections must be members of "The Ebell of Los Angeles."
- Rule 2. Members wishing to form Sections must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- Rule 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Sections and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Section Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Sections are to meet and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a secretary to assist her in the Section.
- Rule 4. Sections have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- Rule 5. Sections may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Sections may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.
- Rule 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Society.
- Rule 7. No Section or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Society, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

#### Article XIII

All communications on business must be made in writing, and those from less than ten members must pass the Board of Directors and Executive Committee before being presented to the Society.

#### Article XIV

Ten members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee, which will include complaints concerning neglect of duty or transcending of privilege by any officer or member, or concerning any other matter pertaining to the Society. The Executive Committee shall at once refer the communication to the Board of Directors for immediate attention, after which it shall be referred back to the Society for final vote.

#### Article XV

Not less than twenty-five (25) members of this Society personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Society, or to add new By-Laws thereto, may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, and any such repeal, alteration, amendment or new By-Law so adopted shall, when adopted by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

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#### Article XVI

All meetings of the Society and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

#### Article XVII

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Society. A reception shall be given on this day, when the President of the previous year shall present the members of the Society to the newly elected officers.

#### Article XVIII

No notice of any of the stated meetings of this Society, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Society, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws, need be given. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the bulletin-board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

#### Article XIX

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Society, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Society have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the laws and regulations of the Society, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these laws and regulations.

#### Article XX

A quorum to do business being present, any By-Laws may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Society, adopted at the first regular meeting on the 1st day of September, 1898, and as amended and revised from time to time by the Society up to and inclusive of June, 1909. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Society at legally called meetings of the Society and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.
