# President's Report

To avoid duplication of statement this report will omit all details of facts and of figures which properly appear elsewhere, leaving to other officers and committee chairmen the compilation of club data and the segregated summarizing of club activities. It will be impressionistic rather than realistic. In the final analysis the big things of life are not facts but emotions; not action, but the motive for action and the mental attitude toward life.

A new home has been built and furnished at a tremendous expense of money, time, and energy. What does it mean to us? What is its human, social value? Is its worth commensurate with its cost which has been great? The auditor's books show that \$898,486.67 has been spent for this property. This includes architects' fees; the building itself and the site; decorating and equipment but not furnishing; assessments for widening and repairing Wilshire and for the ornamental street lights; paving the Lucerne Street parkway for motors and all landscaping; also the taxes and interest on the mortgage loan to July 1, 1928.

Many have asked if a woman's club is justified in making such an investment. The reply cannot be hard and fast "yes" or "no," for it is a question of proportion, or of balance; of the need as compared with the difficulty of satisfying it; and of the alternative atrophy if the need is disregarded. Always insistent need determines the course of action. Ebell's urgent demand for room for expansion would not be denied. Therefore this club is justified in building. Many hardships have been suffered, many petty annoyances endured, but their memory has been displaced by the exhilaration which every builder feels when the home he has designed is sufficiently complete for occupancy and fairly ready for the ceremonies of life.

Just one short year ago the essential units of the new building were still incomplete and the decorating, furnishing, and landscaping were not yet begun, but the work was pushed feverishly to its happy conclusion and we moved in on time. Misses Yoch and Council, landscapists; Julian E. Garnsey, decorator; and the firm of George W. Reynolds, furnishings directors, worked night and day that Ebell might not be disappointed. They and the architects, Hunt and Burns, the builders, Scofield and Twaits, our attorneys and bankers,

Lewis W. Andrews, Charles H. Toll, and John M. Rugg, were special guests at the dedication ceremony.

The fragrance of that glorious day will linger in Ebell's consciousness for many years. The platform was strikingly beautiful with the new stage setting, the flowers, and foliage, but the eyes of all were drawn to the shining faces of the ten charter members and eight past presidents who graciously supported the Building Board in the day's program. Their presence added much to the impressiveness of the occasion.

The fitting and perfect climax was the announcement of a superlatively generous gift to scholarships. This magnificent contribution of forty thousand dollars is in the form of a trust which is to be known as the Mr. and Mrs. C. N. Flint Scholarship Endowment Fund, in honor of the donors, whose interest in the education of struggling youth is profound. The income from this fund will be used to equip promising young men and women for life and for leadership.

That Ebell should be chosen to administer this trust is proof of a confidence in the ability and integrity of the club's governing body which is immensely gratifying to the present directors. It seems to put the seal of approval upon their business judgment.

With the new home finished, furnished, and occupied, the payment of bills demanded attention. It has been stated many times that the building, complete except for furnishings, was financed by means of a mortgage loan, \$530,000.00 of which is still unpaid. The sale of the Figueroa Street property will reduce this loan so materially as to eliminate all anxiety on that score, but meanwhile interest and assessments and taxes must continue to be paid and a definite sum provided for furnishings.

The task of raising the required fund was intrusted to the Ways and Means Committee, Mrs. Grantland S. Long, chairman, Mrs. John Maclean Rugg, assistant chairman. The result is tabulated in Mrs. Long's report but that report says nothing of the unceasing effort, the contagious enthusiasm, and organized energy of the dynamic chairman, her assistant chairman, the many special chairmen, and entire committee. When the twenty dollars a member assessment, voted by the Club March 7, 1927, shall have been paid in full, as is confidently expected, the necessary sum for furnishings will have been realized. July 1, 1927, \$10,777.50 had been paid. June 30,

1928, \$48,642.50 more had been received making a total of \$59,420.00 of the estimated \$66,000.00. The many brilliant social affairs sponsored by this committee brought to Ebell much more than money. The by-products of happiness, friendliness, and understanding were of unexpected value. Co-operation raised the morale. Other committees and many departments added their quota to this fund. All are listed in the Gift Book. But brief mention must be made of the marvelousof the brilliant International Ball; of the Gay Nineties Party Portals It given by the charter members, the proceeds from which so nearly paid for the handsome Portals; of the delightfully unique Christmas Festival sponsored by the Former Officers Round Table, a full report of which is given by the Secretary. Miss Charlotte M. Rockwell; and of the scintillant Sunset Fiesta with its procession of radiantly beautiful young women in Spanish costume. Such committees as the one calling itself Appreciation and another known as the Piano Committee merit decided praise. Visible and beautiful and altogether useful are the results of their praiseworthy efforts.

Every loyal Ebell heart throbs with a fine frenzy of prideful appreciation whenever mention is made of the names of the generous donors who so quickly and gladly came to the assistance of their club. Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher's royal gift completely furnished the luxurious second floor dining room in honor of one she loved and trusted. Appreciation of this gift is sincere. Women have gone far when they have come to realize that to give freely is to live fully.

The raising of money has not been allowed to interfere seriously with the usual club activities or business management. Rentals have been sought and secured by the indefatigable chairman. First class tenants are rare but on the whole the seven or eight months since the new building has been equipped for leasing have brought a fair return.

Abraham Lincoln and Cobwebs were financial disappointments but Ebell's loss was a paper loss represented by the rent we might have received but did not.

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Had it not been for the disagreement about zoning, the returns would have been much more satisfactory.

There are many committees in Ebell serving faithfully and silently, often without public recognition. The work done is sometimes technical and exacting. The treasurer and auditor do such work. The first vice-president's work as bulletin editor and compiler of the Year Book is of this class. Last year instead of the usual bulletin a magazine was published at no expense to the club but at great cost of time and strength to the chairman and editor, Mrs. Ilot Johnson. That the venture was so decided a success is due to the editor, in part, and to the publisher and manager, Mr. Hal Horne, whose interest has been keen and continuous.

The third vice president, Mrs. James A. Rogers, has no report in this Year Book but it is due to the well organized and untiring efforts of her House and Equipment committees that the new home was ready for inspection, that the one and one-third acres of floor space in the sixty-eight rooms and the hundreds of windows were spotless, and the kitchen and dining room equipped to serve the multitude.

Through the difficult and exasperating time of moving and of readjustment, the office staff, under Miss Bess Osborn's guidance, ungrudingly put in many hours of over time, Ebell's interests their first consideration. At the end of the year Miss Osborn's resignation was sorrowfully accepted. She had become almost an essential part of Ebell and will be sadly missed by her many friends who, nevertheless, rejoice in her good fortune. The new committees, Checking, First Aid, Guides, Hostesses, and Information, have cheerfully responded to all demands for extra hours of service. Additional Credentials were appointed to care for the outer doors, and a new committee to take charge of selling tickets for auditorium guests and for evening entertainments in the theater. These were arduous duties but were smilingly undertaken.

The usual reports of programs, luncheons, teas, departments, social welfare, and other club activities show decided interest and progress. Certain days stand out with great distinctness: for instance the charter members day and the luncheon in honor of Alice Ames Winter, the Musicale Tea and the gorgeous Sunset Fiesta. Installation day was poignantly impressive. The serious acceptance of responsibility by the officers-elect, and the procession of beautiful young women

with baskets of lovely flowers brought tears of joy to the eyes of many in the audience. Ebell is marvelously kind, tenderly appreciative, and magnificently loyal to her chosen leaders. The past four years have been filled with evidences of the fineness of these distinctive Ebell qualities. Happy is the woman who has been permitted to serve such a club: to come near in thought to young and old alike.

Ebell is most fortunate in attracting alert young women to the Junior Department. Through the years they are giving evidence of an ever increasing interest in the serious purposes of the Club. Their attitude toward child welfare is sincere and practical, the report of their many activities convincing. Ebell's Social Welfare work is her crowning glory but as full reports are given by the chairmen, attention is called to but one point, which is that our club was placed on the honor roll of the General Federation largely because of the work done for others. The Benefits Committee was so successful in its efforts to finance Rest Cottage and Practical Relief that the quota was over-raised in two parties. The excess amount was donated to the Furnishings Fund.

The seventeen women who have sat at the same table for more years than Board members are usually permitted to enjoy have come to understand how much it may mean to work with kindred spirits for a desired end: to deal impersonally with questions and with people; to be guided in decisions first by the thought, "Is it right?", and second by the question, "Is it wise?", striving always to be just before being too generous.

It has been a rare privilege to belong to the Building Board. The lengthened term of office, due to the stress of building, insistent need again the determining factor, unified and stabilized opinions and methods of procedure and strengthened the ties of friendships already formed.

It is with the deepest sorrow that the first break in this close companionship is recorded. June 29, 1928, our dearly loved second vice-president and program chairman, Miss Helen Louise Stubbs was summoned by the death angel quite unexpectedly and suddenly.

We who knew her so intimately cannot yet realize that we shall see her no more at Ebell. Her radiant personality won all hearts. Her devotion to her parents, her friends, and her duties, from the first had been marked. Her influence

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will not cease to be felt. In our memories she lives and will not be forgotten. Nor will we forget dear Mrs. Edward Crumley or those other Ebell friends who this year have been permitted to enter upon that higher life to which we all look forward so confidently and eagerly.

Meanwhile we carry on as best we may. From a letter written by Mrs. W. S. Bartlett this paragraph is quoted: "In the garden of Ebell is a palm tree which should be taken as a symbol of our club. It began its career in the patio of the old club house on Figueroa Street. It has grown as we grew and now it has withstood the dangers of transplanting and waves its green plumes skyward seeming to challenge every club woman to carry on.

"'I am the past and the future of Ebell,' it seems to say. 'I have no regrets, only hopes. En avant'."

These last words find an echo in my own heart. After four years service as presiding officer of the finest club in the world, I have hope, only; no fear that Ebell will do aught else but grow.

# Report of the Recording Secretary

To the Members of The Ebell of Los Angeles:

Your Board of Directors has held sixty-five regular, adjourned and called meetings since July 1, 1927, at every one of which the President, Mrs. Read, has presided. Out of a possible attendance of six hundred sixteen, the number absent was only fifty-three.

Before the Club opened in October, the Board of Directors had been occupied with the various contracts for furnishings and equipment of the building, as well as with the final inspection and approval of the work of the architects and builders. It was a precious trust they had in charge, and each member gave her very best effort to the end that our new home might be as nearly perfect as was humanly possible.

Taxes and assessments were paid and funds for Rest Cottage and Scholarships were invested after careful investigation of securities. A schedule of rentals was made out as a working basis for possible income from the new building. The Figueroa property was leased. The Planning Commission and the City Council were interviewed in order to secure permission to lease our new theatre, and many hours were spent by the Directors in securing confirmation of the ordinance to lease, when a petition was sent to the Council to have it revoked.

In all our business affairs the Board has been guided by the counsel of our bankers and lawyers, Mr. Charles Toll and Mr. Lewis Andrews, who have generously given of their time and knowledge to Ebell's affairs, with a resulting feeling of security that the Board has appreciated to the fullest degree.

A great deal of time of the Directors has been devoted to interviews with people who wished to establish themselves in our new theatre. There seems to be no end to the number who have plans for little theatre movements, theatre guilds, community theatres, and similar organizations, and with the hope that some one with the capital to back such an undertaking would be discovered, the Board of Directors has interviewed all who have asked a hearing. So far no one has met the financial requirements that the Directors feel Ebell must demand.

After the club year was well under way, there was a complete inventory made of all furnishings in the house and

To each of the six Directors a special task was assigned. In addition to the duties of auditor, Mrs. Leslie R. Hewitt has had in charge the matter of insurance on the building and furnishings, and has spent many hours in going into the perplexing questions that have arisen in this connection.

Mrs. S. M. Browne has been chairman of rentals and has spent more time outside of board meetings than at them in interviewing possible renters and assigning dates for them. Thousands of dollars have been added to our treasury from this source. She has also had oversight of the Figueroa property, and a book might be written on that subject alone.

Mrs. Charles E. Crary has been chairman of Social Welfare. To her, appeals for help from the outside were referred, as well as the general oversight of our own social welfare work. It was through Mrs. Crary that Ebell's generous donation to the flood sufferers was collected and distributed.

Mrs. Grantland S. Long has been chairman of Ways and Means, and has devoted every possible moment to the tremendous task of raising the money for the furnishing of the new building. Her complete success stands out as one of the big accomplishments of Ebell, in which every member has had her part.

Miss Frederica de Laguna, chairman of Resolutions, and Mrs. A. Bennett Cooke, Federation Secretary and chairman of Civic Music, have, in addition, represented our President many times at civic gatherings and have stood ready at all times to do the extra duties that have continually arisen.

The financing of the building and furnishings, as well as the problem of overhead expense, has been entirely in the hands of the Board of Directors. Theirs has been the responsibility to see that every contract was met on time, that no more money was borrowed at any time than was necessary to meet our obligations, thereby saving interest, and in the midst of all this unaccustomed detail, with clear head and steady nerve, Mrs. Read has been a leader whose judgment has led us unfalteringly in the right path.

It is a million dollar business, this Ebell of Los Angeles, and your Directors, under the leadership of your President, have given their best efforts to run it in a businesslike way, with the result that when the auditors, Thomson, Cooper & Thomson, examined the accounts of the Club, checked the Secretary's minutes and the Financial Secretary's statements, they were found to agree to a cent, and Mr. Thomson paid a high compliment to the efficiency and businesslike methods of your officers and directors.

The Executive Committee has been equally devoted to duty. There have been fifty-five meetings during the year, with a possible attendance of nine hundred thirty-five, and only fifty-one absent. Mmes. Read, Long, Faroat and Rea have attended every meetings

The most important innovation of the year, which concerned especially Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Stookey and Mrs. Ford, was the publication of an Ebell Magazine. It is no small matter to collect, edit, read proof and publish on time a magazine such as ours, and we have reason to be proud of the result.

The Second Vice-President, Miss Helen Louise Stubbs, furnished thirty-seven Monday programs, selected with discriminating judgment and including such outstanding names as Will Durant, John Van Druten, Edwin Ware Hullinger, Branson de Cou, Hart House Quartette and Tandler String Ensemble. There were presented twenty-one lectures, seven musicales, four dramatic recitals, and two groups of two-act plays, one complete Shakespearean play and one three-act comedy by our Drama Workshop. Two Reciprocity Programs were given at the Friday Morning Club and the Beverly Hills Woman's Club, our representatives being Miss de Laguna and Mrs. Cooke.

Do you think it was magic that this big house was opened and running smoothly on the first Monday in October? It was the magic of hard work, hours and hours of it, over which our Third Vice-President, Mrs. James A. Rogers, had supervision, assisted by the entire Executive Committee and the entire House Committee. No one can imagine the multiplicity of detail involved. The result was an outstanding achievement.

Attracted by our beautiful home, as well as the outstanding place of Ebell in the civic growth of Los Angeles and by the announcement of an advance in the admission fee, three

hundred eighty-six applications were made for regular membership and thirty-nine for junior membership. This detailed work was in charge of our Fourth Vice-President, Mrs. Charles D. Burt, who carried it through with careful attention to correct listing and tabulation of data that required many hours of work, aside from those devoted to Executive Committee meetings.

Mrs. Harry A. Ford, the General Curator, has had supervision over nineteen departments, five having been added this year. These all had problems to meet in becoming settled in their new quarters. There have been harmony and effective work in each one, under Mrs. Ford's splendid oversight.

The Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Lyman B. Stookey, was one of the most active members of the building committee, in addition to her duties as Corresponding Secretary, which called for letters numbering seven hundred forty-one.

Rest Cottage, supervised by the Chairman, Mrs. Samuel Emerson Faroat, and Scholarships with Mrs. Alfred W. Rea, Chairman, have been administered so well that only the routine matters were brought to the Executive Committee meetings. The magnificent gift of \$40,000.00 to the scholarship fund from Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint enabled the members of Ebell to increase the number and amount of scholarships possible each year.

Committee work was carried on with extra enthusiasm, for every one was agreed to make this first year in the new club house an outstanding success. Mrs. Anne Campbell Fitz Gerald, Chairman of Courtesy, Mrs. Harry Walton Adams and Mrs. Allen Wood Ellington, Chairmen of Credentials, and Mrs. Frank Brown Wheat, Chairman of Ushers, with the members of the Committees, welcomed all comers and made them feel at home.

Four new committees were formed; Information, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Grace Nicholson; Checking, under Mrs. C. H. Montgomery; Guides, under Mrs. Frank C. Keach; and First Aid, under Miss Frances R. Whitesell.

Mrs. Sherrard, Chairman of Club Survey, continued the work so well started and added to club files much valuable data about qualifications of members for various positions in club work.

The library, in charge of Miss Flora Belle Houston, was enriched by the addition of four hundred ninety-two books,

four hundred sixty-six of which were gifts. The library committee arranged the books when they were moved and gave efficient service during the year.

The Benefits and Entertainments Committee, under Mrs. Roger Harrison Miller, gave two successful benefit parties, which more than raised their quota of \$2,000.00 and added \$585.94 to the furnishings fund.

Mrs. Dudley L. Frank and her publicity committee kept the newspapers and local magazines informed about Ebell social and cultural activities. The special benefits as well as regular club events received adequate space in all publications.

That Ebell was not unmindful of conditions outside of its own interests is evidenced by the resolutions passed during the year. The following is a complete list:

1. July 14, 1927: Regarding the sidewalk planting of Wilshire.

2. August 1, 1927: Regarding the disturbed conditions of El Retiro School.

3. September 1, 1927: Regarding the commercializing of the strip of land on Fifth Street opposite the Public Library.

 October 3, 1927: Regarding the tireless services of our President, Mrs. Read, in bringing the building of the club house to a successful issue.

5. December 19, 1927: Expressing sympathy for the bereaved family of little Marian Parker.

6. January 16, 1928: Expressing faith in our Courts of Justice that they would safeguard the children from a repetition of the murder of other children at the hands of criminals.

7. January 16, 1928: Asking the motion picture producers not to show pictures dealing with incidents in the lives of criminals, because of its effect upon the morals of the young.

8. April 12, 1928: Supporting the ideals of the League for the abolishment of Pugilism.

 April 19, 1928: Commending the Loan of the Munthe Collection of Chinese Art, and entering the plea that the Collection be secured as a permanent exhibition in our Museum of History.

 May 14, 1928: Resolution of gratitude for the work of Miss W. Winifred Rouzee and sorrow for her sudden death.

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11. June 4, 1928: Protesting against the cruelties of the rodeo practices throughout the State, and pledging ourselves to use our votes when available for the suppression of these practices.

Resolutions were passed during the year dealing with the finances and general management of the affairs of the Club.

We have had a successful year, full of the joy of achievement. We have been led by the indomitable spirit of Mrs. Read, and she has had the loyal support, the love and admiration of your officers and directors, each of whom has deemed it the greatest honor and privilege to serve The Ebell of Los Angeles.

To promote mental efficiency—to solve personal problems -to know human nature, how it is changed by training by training and the experiences of life—the department will continue the past policy of presenting accredited lecturers and speakers in alternation with book reviews and magazine articles dealing with psychological subjects.

# Report of the General Curator

The nineteen departments of Ebell have had a noteworthy year. In getting established in the new club house there were many adjustments to make but no troublesome difficulties were encountered. So I can report that the curators and officers have done their tasks vigorously and capably. They have gone forward to the next thing gladly and persistently. They have not stopped to compare their successes but have gone forward as a harmonious unit happy to have the opportunity to grow and serve.

Five new departments were organized during the year:

This department was organized primarily for the study of This department was organized primarily for the study of design, which is not in its greatest sense the making of patterns, but is a study of the principles of order, harmony and beauty in things we see about us. Following the first meeting, the members painted seventy color charts. Then problems showing the simplest use of the fundamental forms were given and at following meetings these problems became more difficult and comprehensive and were worked out in the homes, entirely from notes given by the curator and illustrated by one or more finished designs. There were thirteen meetings with an average attendance of fifty-two. A large number of designs were placed on the walls of the galeria during the first week in June as part of the Members Exhibition.

Second: Lives and Times, Mrs. Dudley L. Frank, Curator. Young women who formerly were Ebell Juniors and a group of other interested members organized this department in February. They held four regular meetings with an average attendance of twenty-eight.

The three-fold purpose of this new section as set forth in the petition was:

- 1. Self development of the members.
- 2. Philanthropic work.

" Just; applied Durger, "ma, Lural."

3. A bridge for the gap between Juniors and regular members.

Third: Law, Mrs. Charles S. Crail, Curator.

The object of this department is to familiarize the members of Ebell with certain points of law which arise in the ordinary procedure of the average woman's life. For, knowl-

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edge increases understanding and understanding increases freedom and security. The women are eager for such instruction. This is shown by the fact that the attendance during the ten meetings of the department rapidly increased from fifty at the organization meeting in January to six hundred on the last day with an average attendance of one hundred eighty-eight.

Fourth: Poetry, Mrs. William E. Keepers, Curator.

A group of thirty women met around the luncheon table in the private dining room twice each month. In poetry we know that tastes change. Every generation or at least the most excitable element in every generation conscientiously stones the prophets of its fathers. The aim of this department was to consider how far there is, underneath all these changes in fashion, a central and permanent tradition from which every age and every individual may make particular and temporary divagations, but which remains somewhere at the heart of all

styles, so far as they are truly poetical.

Fifth: Another department within a department was the Book Chamber, limited in number, which met for the sole purpose of analyzing and practising book reviewing. We did not count this as an extra section since Mrs. Jack Vallely, Curator of the Books and Current Literature Department, conducted this study. She reports that many of the women had never reviewed a book, indeed, had never appeared on a platform. Their serious study and sincere efforts made this venture more than satisfying for after completing their class work, they had their reviews before the main section, and their reception by the audience proved the success of the experiment. There were eighteen reviews from the Book Chamber before the large audience but every member prepared at least one book review during the year. Seven meetings were held, average attendance, thirty.

Two departments not having regular meetings but doing

constructive and significant work were the

Art Exhibits, Mrs. William H. Millspaugh, Chairman; Drama Work Shop, Mrs. A. H. Purdue, Chairman.

Their reports will be found elsewhere in the year book. Mrs. A. Halden Jones, Curator of the French Department reports that under the splendid instruction of Mademoiselle Madeleine Letissier they met twenty-nine Fridays, having an average attendance of sixty. Both the French and Spanish Departments were self-supporting this year which was a goal long anticipated.

Mrs. George W. McCoy, Curator of the Better American Speech Department reports that it has been this year's policy to devote two-thirds of the time alloted to each meeting to lectures, papers, and discussions on the part of members. A part of that time was set aside for a drill in speech correction. Mrs. George V. Shipley ably conducted this drill and from reports it is evident that this forms the crux of the work of this section. The remaining portion of the morning has been used by guest speakers, persons of distinction or achievement in the field of letters. Fourteen meetings were held with an average attendance of two hundred seventeen.

Miss Pauline Curran captured the twenty-five dollar cash prize furnished by Mrs. Seely Wintersmith Mudd for the best descriptive letter presented during the letter writing contest.

Mrs. H. Kenyon Burch received the prize of a similar sum offered by Mrs. James Catlett Ernst for the best short story submitted by an amateur.

Mrs. William Milton Kinney, Curator of the Bible Literature Department has conducted seven regular meetings with an average attendance of two hundred ten.

Current events in the field of religion were given at five meetings by the assistant Curator, Mrs. Alexander C. Smither and at one meeting by Mrs. Robert H. Hunstock.

One lecture each was given by James A. Francis, D.D.; Loyd C. Douglas, D.D.; and Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin. Dr. Lena Leonard Fisher as lecturer for the department gave four lectures, three illustrated: her general subject was, Messages from the Land of Great Remembrance.

Mrs. William H. Bryan, Curator of the Shakespeare Department held fourteen meetings with an average attendance of sixty. The class read the full text of the Merry Wives of Windsor; King Henry V; King Henry VI; Part I, II, seven papers given by members, two book reviews and four dramatic recitals; lecture by a dramatic actor and musical numbers by professionals. Dr. Frederick Warde gave scenes from several of Shakespeare's plays. Members of this section

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also took part in the play of The Merry Wives of Windsor given on a Monday afternoon program celebrating Shake-speare's birthday.

Mrs. Milton K. Young, Curator of the Browning Department led the year's work, there being continued increasing enthusiasm and response.

The program outlined for the year included a study of the life of Robert Browning and his poems, which were considered in chronological order: the former to fall into three periods.

First. His life up to the time of his marriage.

Second. His married life.

Third. His literary attainments.

Representative poems selected from each period were studied with a view to gaining a clearer insight into the poet's artistry, his aspirations, influences, purposes, ideals, together with the unfoldment and devolpment of his genius. This study was supplemented by intimate talks from members who had recently visited the Browning Shrines. Thirteen meetings. Average attendance one hundred and fifteen.

The work of the Psychology Department, Mrs. Edgar S. Stanley, Curator, has consisted of the presentation of six lectures by professional psychologists or philosophers, the review of ten standard books on psychology and two magazine articles. The books, Abnormal Psychology by William McDougall, reviewed by members of the department, and Individual Psychology by Alfred Adler, reviewed by the Curator, were intensively done, the reviewing extending over the entire spring's work.

It is interesting to note that few guests attended the fourteen regular meetings and the attendance averaging one hundred fifty-six was composed of studying members.

The Parliamentary Law Department continued under the curatorship of Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, holding thirteen meetings with an average attendance of twenty-nine.

This is purely a study department. The time is divided between the study period and the meeting of the Smalltown Club during which practical use of the motions gives to the members the poise and ability to take part in the business meetings of the organizations they reperceent. While the members are all in Ebell, they are those who are interested in organizations outside of the Club, including many from D. A. R.; Parent Teacher; church societies and P. E. O. Groups.

Five departments have met on Wednesdays.

Art and Travel with an average attendance of two hundred seventy.

Public Affairs with an average attendance of two hundred. Books and Current Literature with an average attendance of one thousand or more.

Music with an average attendance of three hundred thirty.

Drama with an average attendance of three hundred sixtysix.

Mrs. James W. Johnson, Curator of the Art and Travel Department presented programs of varied interests.

The appreciation of art consists in opening mind and heart to receive the impressions that it conveys; and if the appreciation is to be deep and true, it involves a process of discernment comparable to the artists' process of creation.

The department made two interesting studio visits; one, to the art gallery of Mr. and Mrs. John Frederick Kanst to view the paintings of Lillian Genth, A. N. A.; the other was to the private gallery of Mr. and Mrs. Willitts J. Hole.

Mrs. Leiland Atherton Irish, Curator, conducted the Public Affairs Department.

It is desired in this section to foster thought on all these questions which are imminent; and then whatever issues may arise in the affairs of the country may be dealt with in a sagacious and powerful way.

Mrs. Guy Frederick Bush, Curator of the Music Department has had diversified programs given by our own members, and by professionals who have national and international fame. She presented oratorio, opera, costume recital, child character delineation with music in addition to lectures on musical topics. Mrs. Bush and the music department deeply appreciate the co-operation of our city's finest musicians. The man or woman who gives to the world a great work of art renders rich that are rich in good works; not those that have abundance, but those that use it well."

Mrs. Jack Vallely, as Book and Current Literature Curator, presented all the programs given by members of the club on Children's Books. Believing it to be the duty of a literature section to completely cover the contemporary field of books, cation, the Curator in her talks during the year reviewed ten

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books of poetry, thirteen of travel, twenty-eight of biography, fifty-nine novels and fifteen books on miscellaneous subjects. These with the reviews of the Book Chamber make a total of one hundred forty-three books in all reviewed. The regular and large attendance attest to the fact that these meetings were of great value.

The Drama Department, Mrs. Lucile Bender Weddendorf, Curator, opened the year's work with a lecture by Mazie Fullman Garrett, on the Subject: The Drama, Whence and Whither: Then followed a Dramatic Reading of a three act play, The Foot of the Rainbow, by the Curator.

Medea by Euripides was staged by the Drama Work Shop.

Then followed two modern dramas, The Constant Wife by Somerset Maughn, read by Mrs. Ross T. Hickcox.

The Road to Rome, read by Zoe Ballard Shively.

The month of May in which flowers begin to bud and birds to sing always brings the spirit of exhuberance and abandon. The Drama Department caught this spirit and closed the year's work with a vaudeville performance in which many of its own members and a few guests participated.

Elsewhere you will read of the many contributions from the departments to the Furnishing Fund. Extra lectures, musicales, and entertainments were given besides many collections taken in the departments.

All the departments have expressed appreciation of the atmosphere of the department rooms and feel that much has been added to the success of the year's work by the very comfortable and suitable surroundings.

Mrs. John D. Fredericks as Assistant General Curator has fulfilled her tasks with an interest and result-getting concentration that left no room for anything but the very highest praise.

The truly educated woman has learned that she must ever be progressing. My wish for the eighty-eight faithful officers of the departments is that life may be an adventure for them all and that they may cultivate in their souls continued devotion to all that is beautiful in character and conduct.

## Report of the Practical Relief Committee

Moving into our new Club House last Fall retarded the work of the Practical Relief Committee, but after we were settled, the conveniences of our beautiful new quarters speeded the work. Much interest has been shown by the club at large and new members have been added, so we submit the following report with much pride.

We received 2,478 garments and articles including 147 pairs of shoes, 265 hats, 273 dresses, 73 coats and 563 garments and articles for men and boys. We gratefully acknowledge 362 garments received from the Needle Work Guild; 819 new garments were made which included 56 dresses, 25 comforts, 12 comfort tops pieced (the latter the work of a club member at home), 11 sweaters knitted out of yarn furnished by club members and principally by the club member who took the work home.

Rest Cottage was given 8 comforts and our work for Ebell was 149 lunch cloths and tea towels hemmed: three covers made for moving picture machines; one piano cover enlarged and sixteen curtain ties made; 4085 garments and articles distributed. Clothing has been given to 141 persons among whom were nineteen Rest Cottage guests and thirtyeight college and school girls. Most of these girls have been completely outfitted and have been clothed throughout their college years. Some of these girls have been on our list for three or four years. We have furnished three graduating dresses and material for one dress this spring. We have supplied six young men, who are working their way through college, with tuxedo suits so that they might enjoy social activities, which they otherwise could not have done. Letters of grateful appreciation show how much this has added to their pleasure in college life.

Whatever can not be used by this committee is sent to the Good Will Industries, but we can not say that they ever seem overwhelmed by our gifts.

A jelly and jam shower was given for the Helen Matthewson Club. We had a party in the solarium and thirteen of the fourteen members of the club were present. The girls' fruit closet was well stored for the winter and we hope to make this an annual affiair. We have supplied the Helen Matthewson Club with a few furnishings, and have remembered the Kiddie Koop and the Johnson House Apartments.

Our Christmas activities included the Nurses' Tubercular Camp in the San Fernando Valley. We sent them seven nightingales with twenty hoods and seven pairs of bed socks. Recently we sent them twelve outing cloth nightgowns. At Christmas we sent the Maternity Hospital twelve baby blankets.

Because there had been so many demands this year in Ebell, it was decided to let the treasury of the Practical Relief Committee bear the expense of the disabled veterans' Christmas baskets. However, voluntary subscriptions amounted to \$56.25. Only forty baskets were asked for and the total expense of these was \$157.82, which left \$101.57 for the treasury of the Practical Relief Committee to bear. Such a generous response to our request for jellies and jams was given that we were able to put three jars in each basket. Bullock's sent us two boxes of toys and a box of paper napkins and table cloths, which were distributed among the disabled veterans. In addition, much clothing was sent to the disabled veterans' club for the soldiers and their families.

After the terrible St. Francis Dam disaster Mrs. Charles Egleston Crary, Chairman of Social Welfare, raised through subscription, \$390.77, which was sent to the Times' Relief Fund.

The Practical Relief Committee entirely outfitted and gave \$20.00 to one woman who had lost her husband and two children. Clothing was sent to the Red Cross until we were asked to discontinue it.

We have thirty members enrolled and have held fortythree meetings with an average attendance of fourteen.

## Report of the Ebell Rest Cottage Association

In Service there is Gain

In reviewing the past and recalling the little group of Ebell women assembled to plan social service, with but one thought in mind, the love of humanity, we become aware that a seed of love was sown out of which Rest Cottage grew. This seed fell in fertile soil, for in the first year twenty-five women, needing rest, love and encouragement, were entertained, while this year the doors at 135 North Park View Street were opened in friendly hospitality to one hundred seventy-nine women, sixty-five per cent returning to their homes or employment, all expressing their appreciation of Ebell's generosity in placing this haven of rest at their disposal.

In July Mrs. Dora Brundige was engaged as matron. She, too, has caught the spirit of Ebell, for our guests radiate happiness under her watchful guidance. Minor repairs were made, such as interior decorating and painting of the roof, and a much needed range was purchased. Generous friends donated fruit, furniture and money, all this adding to the attractiveness and comfort of the Cottage.

Rest Cottage Committees' gift to our beautiful new Club Home was the furnishing of the First Aid Room and a chair in the Fine Arts Room.

Thanks are due to Miss Fulmer's School for its generous donation of Thanksgiving baskets, which brought happiness to many families and pleasure to those who were privileged to deliver them. Again we thank the Benefits and Entertainments Committee, the Needlework Guild, Practical Relief and many others who, by their interest and support, have helped us to carry on this work.

With sincere regret we accepted the resignation of Miss Hattie A. Newman, who for six years served faithfully and efficiently as Treasurer of Rest Cottage Association.

Through the earnest work of the Membership Committee, eight hundred eighty-eight members were enrolled, six hundred eight associate, one hundred ninety-seven contributing, sixty-four sustaining, eleven life, and eight memorial, making a total of three thousand nine hundred twenty dollars and fourteen cents.

Four thousand eight hundred thirty-six dollars and twenty-five cents have been added to our Endowment Fund, making the total Endowment twenty-three thousand nine hundred ten dollars and fifty cents. Rest Cottage is grateful for this support.

Investigating and Transportation Committees, always eager to answer a call, to take a guest to hospital or on a pleasure ride, are worthy of commendation; also the Follow Up Committee in their effort to keep alive the spark kindled in the hearts of our guests while sojourning at the Cottage.

Under the efficient guidance of the Program and Hospitality Committee, two outside speakers were obtained, bringing to us an outline of their work. Visits to several institutions brought us much encouragement. Among the delightful social gatherings were a tea, two luncheons and our annual Christmas party, to which ninety-one former guests responded. With the Cottage aglow with the Christmas spirit, a lighted tree in the garden, a sumptuous turkey dinner, with a gift for each guest, this day will be long remembered, for here we bind the past with the present in the spirit of once a guest always a friend.

We appreciate the generosity of Ebell members and friends who helped make this day possible, not forgetting our Ebell members who gave a delightful program of music and readings.

The Chairman wishes to express her sincere appreciation to our dear President, Mrs. Read, for her keen interest and generous support, to Ebell Executive Committee, Ebell Members, Rest Cottage Members and Rest Cottage Committee Members, for their loyalty and friendliness, helping us to reach forth a helping hand, bringing to fruition the vision of Service.

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#### Resolutions

## Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage; and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the

Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors thereof.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

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## Form of Bequest or Devise For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:....."

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property 50 devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

## Ebell Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II.

Section 1. The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be ad-

visory members of the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE III.

Duties of the Executive Committee.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of

the association.

## ARTICLE IV. Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as re-

quired.

SEC. 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell.

ARTICLE V. Members.

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of

SEC. 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing Sustaining, Life, and Memorial Members.

ARTICLE VI.

Dues.

Section 1. The dues for Associate Members shall be one dol-

lar per year, payable in October. SEC. 2. The dues of Sustaining Members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March. Sec. 3 The dues of Contributing Members shall be two dol-

SEC. 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a Life or a Memorial Member.

ARTICLE VII.

Meetings.

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at ten-thirty a.m. Sec. 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at eleven a.m.

SEC. 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first

Tuesday in June at ten a.m. Polls open until noon.

SEC. 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SEC. 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII.

Elections. SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Di rectors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Sec. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by vivo

Sec. 3. At the regular meeting in May, a nominating committee shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeti ng.

SEC. 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary, and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX. Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SEC. 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

## Report of the Scholarship Committee

1927 - 1928

The work of the Scholarship Committee has been materially widened this year through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint, whose munificent gift of forty thousand dollars in well invested securities has more than doubled our resources.

Their endowment has made possible an increase in the yearly check to each beneficiary. It has been our custom to give each student one hundred fifty dollars a year, payable in ten monthly installments of fifteen dollars. This amount has been raised to two hundred dollars, or ten payments of twenty dollars each. The added help has been appreciated greatly by our scholarship students.

Another change in our policy has been made by including young men as scholarship recipients, which was done at the suggestion of Mr. and Mrs. Flint. This was one of the con-

ditions upon which their gift was made.

We have now extended our benefits to include graduate work, and permit a year of advanced study to those of our students whose college record has been of exceptional merit.

In addition to the Flint Fund, there are three other sources of income for our work. They are: interest from Ebell's Endowment Fund bonds; six hundred dollars annually from Ebell treasury; and special scholarships and gifts from members.

Twenty-one students have been on our roll during the past year, one of whom was in High School. Of those in College, one was at each of the following schools: University of California at Berkeley, University of Southern California, Occidental, and a special Art School. The others were at the University of California at Los Angeles. Ten have been added in the past year. The Berkeley and High School students graduated the first semester, and three graduated the second semester from the University of California at Los Angeles.

One of our students is a young man who was the first recipient from the Flint Fund. Another is a blind girl who is a freshman at the University of California at Los Angeles.

Your committee desires to express their appreciation and gratitude to the members of Ebell, to our retiring president, Mrs. William Read, and to the Executive Committee for their

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interest and assistance during the past year, and to acknowledge, that through their help and co-operation, these things have been done.

# Report of the President of the Ebell Juniors

With the hope of more firmly establishing the Juniors in the Little Theatre movement which started with the presentation of *Perkins* last year, a three act play, *Hay Fever* was produced. This play, directed by Mrs. George F. Burdick, proved to be an excellent production and it is hoped that a three act play will become an annual event. The proceeds, \$123.38 went entirely to the gift fund.

The total receipts for the year from the above benefits amount to \$792.69.

## Ebell Junior By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

Name.

This Department of the Ebell of Los Angeles shall be known as THE EBELL JUNIORS.

ARTICLE II.

Purpose.

The purpose of this special department is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the Club, and participation in social welfare work.

#### ARTICLE III.

Section 1. Membership in this department is open to the daughters of the Club members and their friends under the age of 26 years.

Sec. 2. Application for membership shall follow the procedure

for regular membership in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Sec. 3. Any member of this department may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee; provided such application is made within one year after membership in THE EBELL JUNIORS has lapsed.

#### ARTICLE IV.

Section 1. The officers of this department shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

SEC. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the

annual meeting of the department.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three Ebell members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of THE EBELL JUNIORS, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

#### ARTICLE V.

Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the entrance fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of THE EBELL.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be Paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

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SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. The officers of this department shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on The EBELL, but shall defray all expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE VI.

#### Meetings.

SECTION 1. THE EDELL JUNIORS shall meet on the second Wednesday of each month. The annual business meeting shall be on the first Wednesday of June.

Sec. 2. All departments of The Ebell shall be open to The Ebell Juniors.

SEC. 3. THE EBELL JUNIORS shall have the privilege of nine regular Monday meetings during the year.

#### ARTICLE VII.

#### Amendments.

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Executive Committee by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

# Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF

\*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County

of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

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# By-Laws

#### ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF Los ANGELES.

#### ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture, through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

#### ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE IV.

### Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

- SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, *i. e.*, financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare, and methods of the Club.
- Sec. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be reported to the Executive Committee at the meeting following.

Sec. 5. The First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

- SEC. 6. At the first regular meeting in July, the Directors shall appoint two from their own number to serve with the President, Auditor, and Treasurer as a Budget Committee.
- SEC. 7. In the absence of the President the Board of Directors shall appoint a Chairman pro tem from their own number.

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#### ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The Chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the amount appropriated in the Budget for the current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Nine members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VI.

#### Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary, and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the President-elect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Executive Committee

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program

Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

## [The EBELL of Los Angeles]

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bonds shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. Sie shall receive applications for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curator-elect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the Departments for the ensuing year.

SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship Fund of the Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

Sec. 9. All endowments, annuities, devices, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions, given for the establishment of The Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors

and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SEC. 10. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt.

SEC. 11. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed. shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seem to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

#### ARTICLE VII.

#### Standing Committees.

Section 1. The standing committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents;
- 2. Budget Committee;
- Committee on Departments;
- 4. Committee on Programs;
- 5. House Committee:
- 6. Membership Committee;
- 7. Printing Committee:
- 8. Rentals Committee:
- 9. Social Welfare Committee.
- Sec. 2. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization. This Committee, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.
- SEC. 3. The Budget Committee shall prepare a statement of the estimated receipts and expenditures of the Club for the ensuing year and submit it to the Board of Directors at their second regular meeting in July.
- SEC. 4. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.
- Sec. 5. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and such special meetings as are authorized by the Executive Committee

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- Sec. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- SEC. 7. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 8. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- SEC. 9. The Rentals Committee shall, with the assistance of the Financial Secretary, supervise all rentals and leases.
- SEC. 10. The Social Welfare Committee shall consist of one Director, who shall be Chairman, and the Chairmen of Benefits, Practical Relief, Rest Cottage Association, and of Scholarships. This Committee shall have general supervision of the philanthropic and social welfare of this Club.
- SEC. 11. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

#### Members.

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation.

The application, together with the result of the investigation. shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of names of all applicants approved by the Executive Committee shall be published in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting for election to membership.

Should a protest be received the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investiga-

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of .................................(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The EBELL of LOS ANGELES.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for Junior membership during one year.

- Sec. 2. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, Temporary.
- Sec. 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and who is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.
- SEC. 5. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for one (1) year may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay five hundred dollars (\$500), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.
- SEC. 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote of the members present, in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.
- SEC. 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation: or any vote.
- Sec. 8. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, in recognition of merit or for the best interests of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.
- SEC. 9. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of twenty-six (26) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club, at one-half the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and any of the Study Departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Executive Committee.
- Sec. 10. An application for Junior Membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors and then shall follow the procedure for regular Club membership.

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Any Ebell Junior may become a regular member of the Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the pay-

ment of the difference in the registration fees.

Sec. 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for three months, at the expiration of which time a renewal of another three months may be applied for. This membership may be renewed once in any subsequent year. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be the regular admission fee, or the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The Registration fee shall be one hundred dollars (\$100).

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be twenty dollars (\$20). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinguent after October first and the second half becomes delinguent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

Sec. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members and have one-half their dues remitted.

SEC. 5. The Executive Committee may by unanimous vote and where the need is apparent remit one-half of the admission fees and dues of wives of resident clergymen when application for reg-

ular membership is made.

ARTICLE X. Meetings.

Section 1. Beginning the first Monday in October, a regular meeting of the Club shall be held on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular, life, and honorary life members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC 3. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending at a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.

SEC. 5. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a. m.

Sec. 6. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

#### ARTICLE XI.

#### Elections.

Section 1. All Officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by *viva voce* vote.

#### Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than one hundred (100) nor more than one hundred fifty (150) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Nominating petitions may be secured at the office on and after the first Monday in April. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

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Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

#### Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

- SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. of the date set; three members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.
- SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June, provided, however, that the President-elect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE XII.

#### Club Activities.

- Section 1. This Club shall have four definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs under the direction of the Second Vice-President; (2) the Study Departments under the direction of the General Curator; (3) the Social Welfare Work in charge of the Chairmen of Rest Cottage Association; of Scholarship; of Practical Relief; of Benefits; and of one Director; and (4) the Ebell Juniors, who shall have self government, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of Ebell.
- SEC. 2. Each Study Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee. All Curators are subject to and shall report to and confer with the General Curator.
- RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.
- RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.
- RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- RULE 5. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.
- RULE 6. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the Department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

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#### ARTICLE XIII.

#### Business.

- Section 1. All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.
- SEC. 2. Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

#### Amendments.

- Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.
- SEC. 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.
- SEC. 3. Any such amendment so adopted, shall, when certified by the Board of Directors, become effective.
- SEC. 4. Only those eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

#### ARTICLE XV.

#### Parliamentary Authority.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by "Roberts' Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

#### Charter Day.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

#### ARTICLE XVII.

Notice of Meetings.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same pledge ourselves

also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

# Standing Kules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members may bring one guest to all open Mon-

day afternoon programs by paying fifty cents.

Regular members will receive ten guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of intro-

duction to federated clubs of other cities.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

A check for admission fee must accompany all applications

for membership.

New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first,

respectively.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary

contributions may be received.

Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1927. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.
