

History of the Ebell of Cas Angeles

From 1894 to 1927

Few great movements affecting the social and moral life of a nation have had their birth, growth, and florescence in so short a time as that of Women's Clubs. One hundred years can easily compass their history. Therefore Dr. Adrian Ebell may be called a pioneer in his life work of widening the scope of woman's education. After some years of lecturing on the sciences at "Female Seminaries," he began the ambitious project of organizing around the world a chain of women's societies to be known as "Chapters of the International Society of Arts and Sciences." with headquarters at Berlin. The first of these Chapters in the West was established in Oakland, California, in 1876. It was not very popular, and on Professor Ebell's death was reorganized by Miss Mary Culbertson into a "Society for General Culture," which was named in honor of its originator, "The Ebell Society." It became the inspiration and model of the many societies later organized in Southern California and known by the name of "Ebell." The first of these to follow the example of the parent society was the Ebell of Los Angeles.

From a statement written by Mrs. H. W. R. Strong shortly before her death the following account of the founding of the Los Angeles Ebell is compiled.

In September 1894 Mrs. Strong and Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, both of whom had been members of the Oakland Ebell, met with the Misses Alice and Emmie Parsons, and the Misses Jeanne and Grace Dennen, to discuss the feasibility of organizing a club in Los Angeles on the lines of the one in Oakland.

There were in Los Angeles at that time two Women's Clubs, the Friday Morning and the Ruskin Art. It was gravely debated whether there was room in the city for a third. It was finally thought best to defer the decision for further investigation.

A subsequent conference resulted in the determination to try the experiment; and the selection of names was made from the visit-lists of those present, to whom Miss Grace Dennen was requested to write, explaining the plan of the proposed organization, inviting them to a meeting at the Parsons' home, 1226 South Olive Street. The drawing

room was filled on that occasion, and Mrs. Strong called

the meeting to order.

The account of that meeting is condensed from the Secretary's minutes. Mrs. H. W. R. Strong having been elected Temporary Chairman, stated the purposes of the proposed organization, and then read a letter from Miss Mary Culbertson, first President of the Oakland Society, giving an account of Dr. Adrian Ebell and his work. The Constitution and By-Laws of the Oakland Society were also read. After a unanimous vote to organize a club in Los Angeles on similar lines, the meeting elected the following officers:

It was at once voted to organize Study Sections on the following subjects: Music, Electricity, Biography, Sanitation, Languages, Literature, History, and Art.

Mrs. W. B. Berry was authorized to establish a study section in Pasadena. It was moved and carried to hold two meetings of the Society each month one of which would be in charge of Sections to be chosen in rotation. The following committees were appointed: To draft a Constitution and By-Laws, Mesdames J. J. Ayers, J. C. Merrill, Miss Alice K. Parsons; to select a name, Madame J. C. Merrill, Miss Alice K. Parsons.

The Society then adjourned until December 8th, when the organization was completed. To the list of officers were added the following: General Curator and Librarian, Miss Emmie H. Parsons; Critic and Parliamentarian, Miss

The name selected was the "Ebell of Los Angeles." The Constitution and By-Laws of the Oakland Ebell were adopted with some changes to suit local conditions. The list of charter members was declared closed, comprising

At this second meeting it was decided that fees and dues of the Club should be as follows: entrance fee, one dollar; annual dues, two dollars, payable semi-annually

in November and April.

Thus was launched an organization which for thirtythree years has established an ever widening influence, and which is today one of the largest Women's Clubs in the United States. Certainly its organizers laid its foundations wide and deep, with a vision of the ever increasing opportunities of the future.

The history of Ebell has been unique in this: that while the difficulties have been great at times, it has not only never stood still, but it has always gone forward. It has never swerved from its object, the advancement of women, nor abandoned its motto, "I Serve."

For three years, Mrs. H. W. R. Strong guided its destiny, overcoming by her courage, tact, and wisdom, the


HE RESIDENCE OF GOVERNOR JOHN G. DOWNEY ON MAIN STR.

many obstacle[§] which beset the unknown path of the new venture. At the end of [§]ix month[§] there were 140 members who listened to Mrs. Strong's first Annual Address, from which I quote the following:

"Ideas and ideals are far more than personalities. If our ideas are true and high, the world awaits. The Ebell Club has breadth of organization that gives room to students and listeners both, and also in its classes there is adequate assistance through expert instructors. Our people will become an ideal people when the girls and women are all, every one, educated to be not only the mothers of men but their mental equals. Then and only then will 'the scorn of the petticoat' be wiped out Women have accorded to them spirituality and heart. They are saying, "Let us have brains as well." Great fear has been expressed that women highly educated will be destructive of homes. Happiness belongs to the home, yet our honored forefathers declared to the nations of the world, their inalienable right to pursue happine's. This is a great mistake; happiness cannot be gained by pursuit. Men have compassed land and sea, they have organized clubs with home comforts, still in pursuit. They have speeded horses, they have employed steam and electricity, and now lastly, the bicvcle, still pursuing. Yet sweet happiness evades them. The idea that where one is, is not the best place to be, but somewhere else are wealth and joy, has made of us a nation seeking happiness by pursuit."

During the second year of its career the Ebell established a magazine under the editorship of Miss Grace Dennen. It continued for several years, and gave proof of the varied talents of the membership.

When the Club entered upon its second year it had outgrown the hospitality of a private home. The time not seeming ripe for building it was decided to investigate the renting of a place of meeting, at a maximum rental of \$35 a month. The Committee after diligent search reported that the lower floor of ex-Governor Downey's house was available. This spacious brick home surrounded by a garden was one of the notable mansions of the time, and stood opposite the Saint Vibiana's Cathedral on Main Street near Third. Here the Club remained until the sale of the building sent it to a flat at Flower and Eleventh Streets, which



however, was considered by the membership, as too far uptown. A special attraction was cited that the flat was fitted with eight-candle-power electric lights, a luxury still rare enough to be worthy of special mention.

The second President of Ebell was Mrs. Clara B. Baker, better known now as Mrs. Robert J. Burdette, whose enterprise and assistance secured for the Club its first real home. Mrs. Burdette erected a building suitable to the Club's purposes on a lot owned by her on Broadway near Seventh Street, for which a rent of fifty dollars a month was paid her with the understanding that should Mrs. Burdette decide to sell the property the Ebell would move. The erection of this building was a proof of the owner's faith in the future of the organization, for not long before the Club took possession of it we read, in the minutes of the Executive Board, that financial difficulties were many. The Treasurer reported in March 187 that out of a total of 121 members 50 were delinquent in their dues, twenty of whom were listed as "Hopeless." Monthly expenses were \$43 and monthly income \$23. A much heralded Poster Entertainment, which had cost much labor, reported total receipts, \$82.15; expenses, \$76.40; profit, \$5.75. So the building of the first Ebell Club was distinctly an act of faith.

The following is quoted from the Los Angeles Times of September 25th, 1897: "The Ebell Society of Los Angeles will this morning hold its first regular meeting of the third year of its existence, in a new and admirably planned building, erected for its own special use and occupancy, the first structure in the city to be built exclusively for the accomodation of a woman's club. The building which was only recently completed bears the number, 724 South Broadway, and is the property of Mrs. P. C. Baker, having been planned by her especially for the society's convenience. It is a modified Greek structure, simulating a temple, and both interior and exterior are exceedingly attractive. The woodwork and floors are polished Oregon pine, the walls and ceilings are softly and attractively tinted, the main auditorium in fawn color, the reception and committee rooms in pale blue gray. The wide front entrance opens on a hall of comfortable dimensions on either side of which are small rooms. One is cosily fitted as a reception room, with pretty and homelike appointments. The large auditorium which is the principal feature of the building, is an ideal place for chamber concerts, art exhibits, and like affairs, and will accomodate two hundred fifty to three hundred chairs. A commodious stage at the east end of the hall is lighted by a series of electric lights, which are placed throughout the building as well. Beyond the auditorium are committee rooms on one side, with a chamber for the maid, and a kitchen with pantries and all the conveniences of a home. The auditorium is heated by a furnace, and the smaller rooms by fireplaces. The grounds will shortly be put in order with lawn, vines and flowers.

The Society's strongest work is in its sections, which are practically small clubs, each presided over by a curator. They are divided as follows: Conversation, Current Events, Art, Literature, Science, Law, Physical Culture, Travel, and French. The Society has now about one hundred fifty members, and is governed by the following officers: President, Mrs. P. C. Baker; 1st Vice-President, Miss Alice K. Parsons; 2nd Vice-President, Mrs. Dean Mason; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. E. A. Praeger; Recording Secretary, Mrs. J. B. Hamilton; Assistant Recording Secretary, Miss Emmie H. Parsons; Treasurer, Mrs. T. T. Knight; Curator, and Librarian, Mrs. R. W. Burnham."

In this building began the first real social life of Ebell. Members of the Board at that time remember with tenderness the lunches to which each contributed twenty-five cents; and a committee, changed each meeting, went out and bought the edibles and served the meal. What delectable salads and chafing dish souffles we achieved in friendly rivalry! The intimate companionship of those days lingers in memory like a perfume.

As the lease of this club house was of uncertain tenure it was deemed wise to revive the project of buying a lot for future use. This had not materialized when in 1902 the necessity for the move came, and Cumnock Hall, 1500 of Ebell. This hastened for the temporary quarters build, and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, the new President, appointed a Ways and Means Committee with Mrs. Charles N. Flint as Chairman.

When the Club opened in October 1902 this Committee reported that various members had promised subscriptions aggregating between fourteen and fifteen thousand dollars, to be taken in stock if a stock company should be organized to build a club house. They also reported that a lot on Hope Street near Ninth had been selected, and through the agency of Mrs. Robert J. Burdette, an option on this lot had been secured for ninety days. At the end of that time Mrs. Burdette made the first payment on the lot, thus securing it, and she agreed to sell it to the Ebell Club Building Association when they should be in a position to purchase it for the price she had paid and all expenses incurred. These results of the labors of the Ways and Means Committee being deemed sufficiently encouraging to the Club to proceed, this Committee was discharged, and an Organization Committee appointed with Mrs. R. H. F. Variel as Chairman. This Committee with the generous assistance of Judge R. H. F. Variel, completed the organization of the Ebell Building Association, which was a stock company with a capital stock of \$50,000. The Directors of this Association were, Clara B. Burdette, Acsah I. Stimson, Caroline Variel, Rose L. Burcham, and Mary L. Hunt. Mrs. Variel was elected President, and Mrs. Burcham, Secretary. Too much praise cannot be given these ladies for the devotion and business wisdom which they brought to bear on their task.

A subscription agreement was printed and subscriptions solicited. The first two thousand shares at \$10 each were reserved for Club members and these were all to be taken within four months. This being accomplished, the Association purchased the lot on September 16th, 1903, paying Mrs. Burdette \$14,500, the original price of the lot including taxes and interest to date. A second subscription agreement was issued in which the remaining stock was offered to others not Club members. However, the great majority of these shares, 3550, were taken by Ebell Club and its members.

The values of real estate were increasing so rapidly that the Hope Street lot became a most fortunate investment and the Association decided to sell it and buy a less expensive one for the Club. Accordingly the Directors then bought the property at 1719 South Figueroa Street



for \$10,000. In March 1905 the cornerstone of Ebell Club House was laid in the presence of a number of members most interested. The following account is copied from the minutes of the Club Secretary, Miss Helen Louise Kimball.

"A special meeting of the Executive Committee was called at the new Club House site, at 18th and Figueroa Streets for the purpose of laying the corner stone; Mrs. Frank King, President, presiding. Those present were Mesdames King, Hunt, Swaine, Hubert, Chandler, Dieter, Crary, Cochran, and Miss Kimball of the Executive Board, and a number of members of the Club. Mrs. King read a short history of the Ebell Club of Los Angeles dwelling particularly upon the dream of the members which was now being realized, a dream of the time when the Club should have a permanent home, and not be obliged to move on. Mrs. Hunt read a history of the Ebell Building Association, showing how from a mere hope, the Club House had become a reality. Mrs. Josiah Evans Cowles extended the Club the good wishes, in the name of the State Federation of Clubs, of which she is President. Mrs. Hunt then placed in the receptacles prepared for them the histories just read by Mrs. King and Mrs. Hunt, Articles of Incorporation of the Ebell Club of Los Angeles, Articles of Incorporation of the Building Association, a copy of the first Year Book of the Club, a copy of each of the morning papers of Los Angeles, a few coins of current date. The box being sealed and placed, Mrs. King with a new trowel, spread the cement and the Corner Stone was lowered into its place. Mrs. Eliza Tupper Wilkes pronounced the benediction."

The architects of the Club House were Messrs. Hunt and Eager. The building cost \$25,000 and the furnishings, including two pianos, pictures, books, etc., cost \$7,500. At the time of its completion the Club owned 11,000 shares of its stock.

At the annual meeting of the Association, April 28th, 1906, the Directors after paying all bills and indebtedness, were able to distribute to the stockholders a surplus of \$13,000; giving to the Club \$3,000 for services rendered the Association; to the older stockholders 29% and to the recent ones, 25% of their total investment. This is a record of which able and experienced financiers might well feel




proud. The enterprise was conceived and carried to completion by women, not however without the valued advice of club husbands.

In this Club House, the Ebell has done its work since January 9th, 1906. For twenty-one years it has been one of the moulding forces of the life of the city; has grown with its growth; prospered with its prosperity; and as the city needs have evidenced, has enlarged its fields. No worthy philanthropy has lacked the interest and sustaining influence of Ebell Club. From the first the Club has given its assistance to all that concerned the Public Schools; decorating and beautifying the Amelia Street School in 1902; furnishing milk for underfed children; championing causes dear to the heart of every teacher. Frequent programs have been devoted to exhibits of Public School methods and work. The first Home Teacher in Los Angeles was financed by Ebell and the first Americanization Cottage at Utah Street furnished. The Penny Kitchen and Open Air Clinic were fostered by the Club. A keen interest in Art and Music has been sustained in Ebell ever since its organization. It endorsed the movement for permanent Grand Opera in Los Angeles as early as 1918, and has never ceased to support the idea. It contributed \$100 toward bringing the Biennial Meeting of the National Federation of Musical Clubs to Los Angeles, and Ebell members did much to insure the success of the Convention. It has maintained a Music Department ever since its organization, at which many notable musicians of the United States have appeared.

In 1914 the Club inaugurated exhibits of paintings by California artists, which have brought some profit to the exhibitors and much pleasure to the members.

The Los Angeles Chapter of the National Red Cross was launched under the auspices of Ebell, and the initial expense paid by the Club. As early as 1899, Mrs. Lowenberg, of San Francisco, President of the Philomath Club of that city, appeared before the Ebell to urge a movement among women to foster arbitration among nations, so that war might be forever banished. When, however this dream was not realized, the Club devoted itself with unswerving loyalty to the support of the Government during the critical years of 1916-18. Mrs. Chester C. Ashley, then President, applied her remarkable executive ability to organizing the

Club for patriotic work. Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, her successor, continued brilliantly the work she began. From Mrs. Ashley we take this report of accomplishment:

"No appeal for help has come to us in vain. The needs of Armenia, Belgium, France, Italy, and Poland, of the Red Cross, and the Red Star have played upon our heart strings until our purse strings have been widely opened. Contributions of \$1,100 each have been made to the General Federation of Women's Clubs for furlough homes for American Soldiers in France, and the Navy Base Hospital No. 3 with its unit of Los Angeles doctors and nurses. Approximately \$5,000 was contributed to the Y. W. C. A., and the same amount to the Y. M. C. A. by the committees organized by Ebell Women. The Liberty Loan Committees received subscriptions from Ebell members of \$195,000, \$10,000 being contributed from Club funds.

The great activity of our club year (1918-1919) has been the Red Cross work of our Auxiliary, organized under the Los Angeles Chapter before our entrance in the war. The report of Mrs. Ilot Johnson to whose boundless enthusiasm much of our success is due, gives totals of accomplishment which reflect the devotion of 150 workers. 12,800 yards of gauze were used at a cost of \$600. Cost of muslin and cotton used, \$662.37. 2984 yards of muslin and outing flannel were bought, also material for 38 aviators' jackets, 166 suits of pajamas, 482 hospital bed units, 165 pieces of hemmed linen and miscellaneous articles, making a total of 873. 300 machine knitters converted 882 pounds of wool into 2992 garments beside individual gifts of 147 articles."

Notwithstanding the stress of all these war activities, local needs were not neglected. For some time a necessity had been realized for a Rest Home in which women, wage earners or home-makers, broken down by the struggle of life, but unable to meet the heavy expense of sanitariums might recuperate before again undertaking to resume their duties. On December 29th, 1917, through the generosity and cooperation of Miss Lillian B. Flanders and the Board of the Methodist Hospital of Southern California, Ebell became the owner of a small cottage and a large lot in the Olivita Tract at 1305 West Ninety-fifth Street. At this cottage Miss Flanders had been helped by Ebell to care for

This Rest Cottage is not a hospital, neither is it a sanitarium; but it is what its name implies, a place where rest in cheerful surroundings, good food, and country air may complete the cures which science has begun, and may restore hope and courage to those struggling to take up life's burdens. While the world was at war and all resources were strained to the utmost, rooms were added to the original cottage, and sanitary plumbing was installed, a fence and shed for storage purposes were built, all financed from personal gifts, except \$150 from the Club treasury. Here this good work was carried on successfully until the Cottage became inadequate to the demands upon it, when the property was sold and a desirable lot purchased. The new Cottage at 135 North Park View Street was dedicated, free from all debt, February 6th, 1924. It has twelve large airy rooms, and provides accomodation for fourteen women.

The Ebell Club is indebted to Miss Julia Morgan of San Francisco, who donated the plans for the building, and to Mr. Sumner P. Hunt for valuable services rendered in supervising the work. The Club is now engaged in raising an endowment for Rest Cottage, of which \$19,074.25 has been received to date. The Cottage is supported by a grant of \$75 a month from Ebell funds, by dues from members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and by gifts.

Ranking in importance with Rest Cottage, Ebell carries on two other lines of community service, Scholarships and Practical Relief. Feeling the impending danger of world conflagration, the Social Service Committee, in 1916, at the home of Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher, perfected an organization to provide comforts for those in need, especially for the patients of the County Hospital. The present Department of Practical Relief was a result of the passion

for service engendered in the hearts of Ebell women by the strenuous years of the war. Hands unused to idleness were eager to relieve suffering which follows in the wake of war. There were veterans to be cared for, women and children to be helped on their way. So a band of devoted workers meets one day each week to sew, to revise and remake the garments supplied them by Ebell members; to meet applicants for help; to listen to and investigate their stories; to give freely not only of material things, but sympathy and encouragement.


The giving of scholarships to struggling students had been a feature of Ebell Social Welfare work from the beginning of its history. In 1921 this work was revived and vitalized. Since that time it has ever widened in scope and interest. Its object is to give opportunity to worthy and ambitious young people who need assistance in getting an education. The applicants are recommended by their teachers for their standing and deportment in school. Small sums are given monthly to assist in defraying expenses. The Practical Relief cooperates by outfitting any girl with suitable clothing at the beginning of each school year. More important still is the establishment of friendly relations between these girls and women of experience. Many a discouraged and lonely young student has gone forward with renewed courage knowing there was someone who cared.

During the year 1925-1926, the Scholarship roll of Ebell has contained the names of nineteen different girls who have received assistance. Twelve were university students; one a music student, and the rest high school pupils. Most of these girls are honor students, and are believed to possess qualities of leadership. An endowment fund is now being raised for carrying on this work, \$13,000 having

already been contributed.

One criticism of Women's Clubs which is often heard, is that they are composed of too many grey heads. Ebell determined to correct this, so in 1921 a Junior Department was organized. Young women under the age of twentysix were eligible. Reaching that limit they are expected to pass into regular membership. An advisory board of Ebell women assists them, but they elect their own officers and make their own plans for work and amusement. They





are following the ideals of the Club, and are making service their first object, having organized a Child Welfare Department, which meets to make garments for dependent children. They are already a most valued adjunct to many of the activities of the Club, besides preparing themselves to meet more ably life's responsibilities. That this training is not interfering with their home duties is proved by the fact that last year five babies were born to the group, and have been made honorary members of the Juniors.

The fate of Ebell has always been that of the "Old woman who lived in the shoe" and throughout her career she has been forced almost annually to agitate the need of more room. As early as 1914 the Directors purchased the lot at the rear of the Club House with the plan of enlarging. But the World War caused delay in the project. In 1919 the clear foresight of the President, Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, led her to urge the purchase of the lot adjoining the Club House on the south. The indomitable energy of the Ways and Means Committee working with her successor, Mrs. Eleanor J. Toll, raised the \$50,000 to pay for it. But the congestion of traffic and crowding of business led the Club reluctantly to decide that a location must be found where Ebell might abide in peace, and house her growing family. The real estate transactions which for several years have added work and worry to the officers of Ebell are too intricate to recount here, but they have been happily ended in the selection of the property on Wilshire Boulevard on which the stately new Club House is now rising. The history of what Ebell does with enlarged opportunity; what influence it wields in the life of the community belongs to the future and depends upon the continuance of its purpose of service.

When thirty years ago the little group of women raised an altar to the Ideal they called Ebell, they could not foresee how the years would crown their work. The task of the women of today is to carry a coal from that Altar to their new home, and to nurture it until it becomes a beacon of Inspiration to the City of Los Angeles, even to the Nation, and may each member of the Club carry as an accolade, the motto chosen at its birth:

"I SERVE"

President's Report

The year of 1926-1927 in Ebell will long be remembered as a period of intense activity. This activity had many different manifestations, chief among which was the building of our new Club home.

"Wisdom hath builded her a house" we read and we might add "and the building thereof demanded the service of both mind and heart."

From the very first day of the present Club year, July 1, 1926, to the last, June 30, 1927, there has been no cessation of effort. Plans were made and changed to meet financial conditions. Serious consideration was given to the expressed wishes of the Club members for spacious elegance and luxurious refinement but the excessive cost often made discriminating elimination necessary. Yet we have a building, nay a group of buildings, so simple as to seem almost austere but withal so correct as to be truly an ornament to the city.

November 18, 1926, the supplemental and final plans were approved, the cost being too near \$600,000 for comfort. November 29, the steam shovel was on the ground and excavation was begun. December 7, we had official approval of the final plans, preliminary and conditional approval having been granted July 26.

The architects, Hunt and Burns, and the builders, the Scofield Engineering and Construction Company, were ably abetted in their desire to give us the best of all houses, a friendly, comfortable home, built to live in as well as to look upon, by the remaining members of their staff: Julian E. Garnsey, interior decorator; George W. Reynolds, director of furnishings; Miss Florence Yoch, landscape designer. These assistants were chosen by the Board upon the recommendations of the various Committees which had investigated their fitness. Each is unexcelled in the particular line of work undertaken: each is an artist, a designer, as well as an executive. Ebell is most fortunate in their selection.

To finance a project so extensive and expensive, permission of the Court to mortgage all present real holdings of the Club was sought as early as April 1926, and secured the 18th of May.

In November, the Security Trust and Savings Bank accepted the mortgage, agreeing to lend us \$700,000 and to collect interest on such sums as were actually advanced. When we thought of owing this vast debt it seemed that with us, as with others, building might prove to be "a sweet impoverishing" but after four months and ten days of almost constant conference with realtors we received from the Troy Motor Sales Company a definite offer of \$315,000 for the Wilshire-Shatto lots and having convinced ourselves that we could not hope for a better price, we sold. But it required two and one half months more to get this property satisfactorily zoned and this sale consumated. January 20, 1927 we received the first \$105,000 of the contract price, less the commission and escrow charges, and by February 28 we were ready to lay the corner stone. The ceremony was made impressive by the presence and participation of many charter members and past presidents who had attended the similar ceremony at 1719 South Figueroa Street in 1905.

From the beginning the actual building has gone forward smoothly and rapidly. Today it seems certain that it will be finished in time to be furnished and ready for

occupancy in early October.

Although some part of every day, often the major part of it, has been given over to the building project, other factors pertaining to club life have not been neglected. Federation methods have been studied and well-considered amendments to the C. F. W. C. by-laws offered. Four of the largest clubs in the Los Angeles District combined in a campaign for recognition of the rights of the majority. It has long been the custom to permit an intrenched minority to control the policy of the C. F. W. C. There has never been representation according to membership nor taxation the form of dues) according to representation. Ebell, Club, and Hollywood Woman's Club joined in the preparaflagrant defects of the system.

Full delegations were sent to both the District and the State Conventions after careful instruction as to the ethics of the contention, but the unequal voting power under the signed to correct, made it easy for the minority member-

ship to keep control and to defeat every proposed improvement, thus keeping in force the antiquated system of representation by districts, artificial, political divisions, and denying the large majority-membership a controlling voice in federation policy. The selected group of women who represented Ebell at Sacramento came back thoroughly convinced that withdrawal from the C. F. W. C. was necessary to the preservation of our ideals. Reports were made to, and discussed by the Board of Directors and Executive Officers and the Advisory Committee of Past Presidents, in conference with the delegates, with the result that the Executive Committee decided, unanimously, to recommend to the Club that we withdraw from the C. F. W. C. This recommendation was presented to the Club at an open meeting, Monday, May 16, and again on May 23. As in 1915, the claims of justice were put in the scales against those of expediency and once more Ebell was swayed by the ethical rather than the sentimental. After full and free discussion from the floor, a vote was called for, and again, almost unanimously, Ebell decided to sever all connection with C. F. W. C. This step was taken neither in haste nor in anger but in sorrow and only after all our efforts toward co-operative correction of pervasive governmental faults had been spurned. The denial of proportionate representation is un-American, and must not be endured.

So absorbed have those nearest the center of club activity become that no thought of weariness has overcome their enthusiasm; no sacrifice of time, strength, or money has seemed too great if it but hastened or helped to perfect the desired supreme achievement; a fitting temple for the Ebell whose ideals are so sacred. To perpetuate these ideals has been the conscious aim of the governing body and the

working staff.

All former officers at the suggestion of Mrs. Edward C. Dieter, met, early in June, and organized a Round Table, with the idea of sustaining interest in their Club and stimulating support for its worthiest endeavors. Mrs. W. S. Bartlett was made temporary chairman and Miss Charlotte Rockwell secretary. Mrs. Chester C. Ashley was on June 16, made permanent chairman.

The evening programs were held under the auspices of the department curators and were pronouncedly successful affairs. They are listed elsewhere, but the annual tribute

to Shakespeare's memory is worthy of special mention because of the participation of Dr. Frederick Warde, an honored Ebell associate, whose genial yet dominating personality assures success.

The charter members luncheon (October 15); new members luncheon (May 16); and high tea on the closing day (June 27) were vivid examples of Ebell's hospitality.

Fortune has favored us.

Were it possible to write an appreciation instead of a report, many pages would be filled with well deserved praise of those serving their club so ably and cheerfully. As of one mind and for one cause chairmen of committees and their assistants; curators of departments and their staff; former and present officers, all have given their best thought to their duties; their loyal support to their officers; their assistance to the Club's social welfare activities; and to the Ways and Means Committee. To the members of the Club, the Executive Committee and the President, are deeply grateful for the confidence expressed in their management. The resolution passed by the Club April 4, 1927, setting aside the election of officers for 1927-1928 in order that the building program might not be interrupted was an evidence of faith highly prized by those whom it most nearly concerned.

With such an incentive there must be even more earnest service. Our hearts glow with gratitude that we are thought worthy to serve. With the shining example of Ebell's first president ever before us we do not mourn her absence. We hope to follow in her footsteps to help preserve the

When we enter the door of our spacious and grandly beautiful home we shall expect it to be gracious, warmly hospitable, sincerely friendly. We expect to say, "Behold our home! A spot of earth supremely blest." Enter in, dear Ebell members, to this soon-to-be-loved delightful

Report of the Recording Secretary

In the report of the Recording Secretary of the Ebell of Los Angeles for the year just closed, the business of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee assumes the greatest importance by reason of the building program, which has filled the time and occupied the serious

thought of each officer and director.

An unusually large amount of time has been spent in transacting the financial affairs of the Club. The sale of the Wilshire-Shatto property; the approval of plans and oversight of the new building, insurance policies, furnishings and equipment plans and contracts, as well as oversight of the finances of Rest Cottage and Scholarships have constituted a business of considerable proportion, running well over a half million dollars.

With the multiplicity of detail to be considered and acted upon, the Board of Directors held 47 meetings during the year, at which Mrs. Read presided. The attendance was 93 percent, no one being absent save for illness or enforced absence from the City. At many of these meetings, where financial matters were to be decided, the entire Executive Committee was present and consulted. Fifty meetings of the Executive Committee were held, the President presiding at every meeting with an average attendance of 88 percent. Here the regular Club work was planned, each member having her own particular assignment.

Mrs. Ilot Johnson, First Vice-President, was quietly and efficiently ready to assist and represent the President wherever needed. She served as Chairman of Printing, supervising the year book and bulletins, and as Chairman of Representation, has attended many meetings of other clubs in the District. Mrs. Johnson has also served on the Building Committee, as did Mrs. Lyman Brumbaugh Stookey, the Corresponding Secretary, whose report of

letters written for Ebell appears elsewhere.

Miss Helen Louise Stubbs, Second Vice-President, Chairman of Programs, arranged thirty-nine programs, seventeen of which were lectures; eight were illustrated travelogues, eight were musicales, and six were dramatic entertainments presented by the Drama Workshop. Our musicales have consisted of vocal and instrumental entertainments by internationally known artists. The best known

lectures appearing on our platform, this year for the first time, were Leo Katz, the artist, George Creel, Grant Over-

ton, and Lewis Brown. Our house has been kept in order and hospitality dis-

pensed through the united efforts of the House Committee with the Third Vice-President, Mrs. James Andrew Rogers, Chairman. The Monday afternoon teas have increased in poularity, more than 8000 persons having been served. Refreshments were provided and served for three evening receptions and out of its budget the Committee was hostess to the Club members at the final June meeting

when a delightful high tea was served.

Chairmen and members of committees have worked in harmony and understanding to maintain the standard of Ebell, and the results were never more gratifying. Mrs. William J. Wilson has been Chairman of the Benefits and Entertainments Committee; that splendid group of women who obligate themselves each year to provide a large portion of the funds for Rest Cottage, Scholarships, and Practical Relief. So successful were their efforts this past year that before January 1st their quota was raised and they allied themselves with the Ways and Means Committee, pledging a grand piano as their contribution to the furnish-

The records of the Club Survey Committee have been in charge of Mrs. Edward Everett Sherrard, who with her assistants has indexed and cross indexed the entire membership, placing names of all members under committees on which they have served. This Committee also regularly checked the vital statistics and the society columns, turning over the facts so gleaned to the Correspond-

ing Secretary and to the Membership Chairman.

Mrs. Lyman Curtis Blakeslee, Chairman of the Courtesy Committee, has with her assistants, given a cordial greeting to members in the tea rooms and has made an

especial effort to introduce new members.

Mrs. Frank Howell Stanbery, Chairman of the Credentials Committee, and Mrs. Frank Brown Wheat, Chairman of Ushers, with their Committees, have admitted and seated members and guests on Monday afternoons and at the evening meetings in an efficient and courteous way. Mrs. Stanbery reports 1439 guest cards have been used

The auditorium and tea rooms have been elaborately and beautifully decorated on Mondays by the Decoration Committee under Mrs. Bertam E. Green's leadership.

Miss Flora Belle Houston, Chairman of the Library Committee, reports 228 new books added to our shelves by gift and purchase. The Committee is planning to supervise the removal of the library to the new quarters.

Mrs. Edward A Tufts, Press Chairman, has sent notices and reviews of meetings to five daily and one weekly newspaper and a 2500 word article each month to the Club Woman magazine. A clipping book has been compiled, which includes more than 388 notices and articles. This book together with those previously filed, forms a valuable history of the activities of Ebell's club life.

To a great extent resolutions passed by the Club indicate high lights in our history. No one will question that we have made history this year, for we have established ourselves as a club of independent standards, and patriotic and practical ideals. In our withdrawal from the California Federation of Women's Clubs, we have signified our intention of carrying on our work with calm deliberation and conscientious endeavor.

When it seemed to us as if prohibition laws were to be tampered with by politicians, we sprang to arms and passed resolutions to defend the cause. The ever threatening clouds of war roused us to pass resolutions recommending a second tongue for all nations, so that a better understanding might strengthen neighbourly bonds. The necessity for flood control of the Colorado River caused us to express our sympathy in resolutions, copies of which we sent to our representatives in Washington. The furnishing of our new Club House awakened our zeal and we passed resolutions to assess each member \$20. We passed resolutions expressing our confidence in and gratitude to our President on the Sacramento mission.

In the midst of life there has been death. We have paid sad tribute to two beloved members, Mrs. H. W. R. Strong, first President of Ebell, and to Miss Helen Augusta Brooks. These women, even in death lead us through memory of their valiant souls to deeds of courage and beneficence.

The Ways and Means Committee

The Ways and Means Committee was organized to inaugurate and carry forward a plan to raise funds for furnishing our new Club House.

This magnificent building has been erected and financed without a call on the members of the Club for assistance in any way. It is the result of five years of earnest, careful management of our Club properties, on the part of the Directors, assisted by the valuable and free advice of our lawyers and bankers, and is a notable achievement.

However, it was found necessary and expedient that the members of the Club should provide for the furnishing of this, their own Club home.

After a careful appraisal of our assets and our needs, and keeping in mind, a handsome, dignified, and adequate mode of furnishing, our director of furnishings, Mr. George W. Reynolds, assisted by our architect, Mr. Summer P. Hunt, and our Furnishing Committee, Mrs. Jay B. Millard, Chairman, has estimated the sum required will be \$120,000.

Acting upon the recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee and with the approval of the Executive Committee, a resolution from the Board of Directors was submitted to the Club membership for endorsement, whereby it was proposed that the Club should assess its members the sum of \$20 each, to be paid in full, at once, if possible. or over a period of two years, if necessary, at the option of each member.

After due notice and consideration this resolution was unanimously adopted at a regular meeting of the Club on Monday, March 9. This assessment, with our membership should bring something over \$50,000.

The remainder of the fund is being raised by individual donations of money or of definite objects of various kinds as well as by pay entertainments of a very high order. These entertainments are gifts themselves, in that the several hostesses who present them bear the entire cost of each affair, leaving the total entrance receipts for the Furnishing Fund. These Dollar Parties are very successful and very popular and are meeting a need we have long felt for a closer social relation among our members.

The aim of this section of the annual report is to bring under brief review the various aspects of the Departments of Ebell, to make sure that we are providing a well rounded work for the members while keeping the first things in the first place. There was no marked change in the general plans and work of the Departments for the year past, the programs and studies being conducted in much the same manner as in previous years. It is interesting to observe, however, that the participation and enthusiasm of the members was far above normal. Perhaps the new club house cast its shadow before it, at any rate certain facts are increasingly evident. One is that the interest in this important phase of club life is steadily growing. Purpose, vigor, loyalty, and love permeated every session of the Departments.

Starting the week the Browning Department, under the Curatorsip of Mrs. Milton K. Young, met every first and third Monday morning. The year was devoted to the study of Browning's eight plays. The Drama Workshop presented *Pippa Passes* for the annual birthday celebration. A fund of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350) was collected and it is planned to purchase a table for the new club house.

The Parliamentary Law Department met at the same time every first and third Monday. Mrs. Charles S. Mc-Kelvey, Instructor, presented the rules of Parliamentary procedure in her own inimitable way. This Department held a benefit luncheon and card party, the proceeds to be used in the furnishings of the new club building.

Alternating with these Departments was the Psychology Department, meeting every second and fourth Monday. Mrs. Edgar S. Stanley, Curator, has presented book reviews and papers by members and lectures by professionals of standing. At the second annual luncheon two plays were given by the Drama Workshop. The growing attendance compelled the Department to move into the auditorium.

The Tuesday Departments are: The Better American Speech and Shakespeare; Curators, Mrs. J. Elbert Harshman and Mrs. William H. Bryan. Many interesting speakers were presented in both Departments. The Better

The Shakespeare Department held its annual luncheon under the old grape vine at San Gabriel and later attended the Mission Play. The members have purchased a marble bust of Shakespeare for the class room of the new club house.

The first Wednesday morning of each month the Art and Travel Department was privileged to be led by Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator. In her annual report she says, "The history of the Art and Travel Department is co-eval with that of the club as it was organized in 1894. Its appeal is universal as all Americans travel and most travelers are interested in Art." During the past thirty years the retiring Curator has three times led the Art and Travel Department and she feels qualified to testify that interest in the Quest of the Beautiful never lags. "Men may come and men may go" but the love of Art goes on forever. Mrs. James W. Johnson assumes the Art and Travel curatorship.

Mrs. John Stearns Thayer presided over the Public Affairs Department which met every second Wednesday morning. It is gratifying to report that this Department has won a place in the activities of the Club. There were educational programs on civic and legislative lines always giving both sides of the question in a controversial matter. Two innovations were made: a breakfast to which candinivited; a closing meeting, in the nature of a trip around Pedro Chamber of Commerce, the San Pedro Woman's Leiland Atherton Irish assumes the curatorship of this

The third Wednesday was always a busy day. Our largest Department, Books and Current Literature, meeting in the morning and the Music in the afternoon following the luncheon. Mrs. Jack Vallely, Curator, surveyed the

entire field of contemporary literature reviewing seventytwo novels, twenty-eight biographies, eight books dealing with political questions, and six books of travel. Members also contributed book reviews, essays, and poems.

Mrs. Guy Frederick Bush, Music Curator, has had varied musical entertainments presented by our own members and our artist friends. These programs have been an enriching factor in our club life.

The close cooperation of the Drama Department and the Drama Workshop was shown by the presentation, in February, of The Twig of Thorn, a play presented by the Drama Workshop for the regular meeting of the Drama Department. So successful was this play that it was repeated in April, as a compliment to the Drama Workshop of the Hollywood Woman's Club. Other programs comprised two plays read, a survey of the Negro Drama, a glimpse of the Evolution of the Motion Picture, and a Christmas program of Music and Song, thus rounding out the year's work under the able leadership of Mrs. Harry C. Bender.

We always found the Spanish Department meeting on Thursdays. Mrs. Franklyn A. Rauscher, Curator, reports that a group of advanced students studied during last summer and throughout the club year, meeting once a week at the various homes. This Department started a gift fund to aid in the furnishing of the new building. We welcome Mrs. W. L. McLeod as the new Curator.

The Bible Department met twice monthly, the second and fourth Thursdays. Mrs. Lena Leonard Fisher, Curator, has been the Lecturer. She has brought our attention to the study of the characters of the men of the Bible, under the general subject of Pictures of the Patriarchs. The primary object has been to make the Bible and the characters studied, real and vital, while abjuring any theological or sectarian phases of discussion. The Club recognizes the cooperation of the University of Southern California in making it possible for a teaching scedule to be arranged for Mrs. Fisher, which permits her work at Ebell.

In addition to the regular Friday meetings of the French Department Mrs. R. E. Filcher, Curator, reports that study classes have been conducted at the homes of members and at the club house for all three divisions. As

a result much greater progress was made in the study of French and the interest and enthusiasm of individual members was greatly stimulated. Mrs. A. Halden Jones assumes the French curatorship. In both language Departments the present instructors will continue, Señora Maria Lopez de Lowther in the Spanish Department, and Mademoiselle Madeleine Letessier in the French Department. These two departments joined with the Better American Speech Department in an annual luncheon. A musicale and two one-act plays given by the Drama Worksop followed the luncheon.

Mrs. A. H. Purdue, Chairman of the Drama Workshop and Mrs. Lurah C. Davis, Chairman of the Art Exhibits, give separate reports. There is no doubt about the valuable service these two Departments have rendered. Mrs. Purdue continues another year and Mrs. William H. Millspaugh will have charge of Art Exhibits.

The future of the Departments seems very promising. Two new ones have been organized and are to function next year. Poetry with Mrs. William E. Keepers as Curator and Arts and Crafts with Mrs. Lurah C. Davis, Curator.

To all Department Officers and to Mrs. James W. Johnson, Assistant Curator, the General Curator wishes to express the heartiest appreciation for the work during the past year.



Our guests express in numerous letters their appreciation of Ebell's generosity, for, with the few weeks rest they are renewed in body and spirit to assume their duties in the office or home.

Rest Cottage gratefully acknowledges the gift of one thousand dollars from Mr. Lewis Clark Carlisle in memory of Mrs. Carlisle, who was Ebell's Treasurer for eight years, and of a beautiful radio from Mrs. James Howard Moore.

Again we thank Miss Fulmer's School for the Thanksgiving baskets extending happiness to eighteen families.

Resolutions Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage; and

Whereas. The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas. It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the

Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors thereof.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the

Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Ange-

les; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Bevise For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest

If money use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottagedollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:....."

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of

Ehell Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II.

Section 1. The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be ad-

visory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III.

Duties of the Executive Committee.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of

the association.

ARTICLE IV. Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills pefore they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as re-

quired.

SEC. 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business

SEC. 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell.

ARTICLE V.

Members.

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of SEC. 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing

Sustaining, Life, and Memorial Members.

ARTICLE VI. Dues.

Section 1. The dues for Associate Members shall be one dol-

lar per year, payable in October. SEC. 2. The dues of Sustaining Members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SEC. 3. The dues of Contributing Members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SEC. 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a Life or a Memorial Member.

ARTICLE VII.

Meetings.

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at ten-thirty a.m.

SEC. 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
SEC. 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at eleven a.m.

SEC. 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Tuesday in June at ten a.m. Polls open until noon.

SEC. 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by

the Secretary.

Sec. 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII. Elections.

Section 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva

SEC. 3. At the regular meeting in May, a nominating committee shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the

SEC. 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary, and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX. Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SEC. 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Report of the Practical Relief Committee

The work of the past year has been full of interest and accomplishment. While we emphasize the work for the disabled veterans and their families, the Rest Cottage guests, and the college and school girls, we never turn away anyone applying for help without at least, giving encouragement and sympathy. We always try to send them to the Social Agencies that can give them the help we are unable to give.

We have six elderly women whom we clothe, all fine women, well educated, who now find themselves dependent through no fault of their own. Two of these women were at one time members of Ebell and one a member of the Friday Morning Club.

Besides giving 557 pieces of clothing to disabled veterans and their families, we sent fifty Christmas dinners, each basket accompanied by a second one filled with all kinds of fresh vegetables, the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Burt. At a Monday meeting of the Club a contribution of \$212.55 was given by the members to cover the expense of these dinners. Bullock's sent us 150 toys and 55 pieces of clothing to be distributed with the baskets. We also clothed twenty-five Rest Cottage guests.

We find our greatest interest in the college and school girls. We have completely outfitted twenty-eight girls and they will look to us for clothing until their school days are over. All of these girls are working their way through high school and college. We have supplied three graduating dresses and have also given a suit to a boy who faced graduation without suitable clothing. This boy has made a record in high school, standing at the head of his class. He has worked his way through school since he was twelve years of age, and is planning to take a college course through his own efforts.

One woman came to us in deep trouble, tired and in a nervous condition, having a baby two years old to support and not knowing how to get work. Before marriage she had earned her own living by means of her voice. A month at Rest Cottage rested her; she and her baby were clothed by the Practical Relief Committee and with the

assistance and advice of our Curator of Music, Mrs. Guy Frederick Bush, secured a position where she receives more than one hundred dollars a month.

We could tell you many stories of human interest had we time and space. We have received 4092 garments and articles, including 297 garments received from the Needlework Guild, and have distributed 3852. We have made 650 garments and remodelled 52 dresses and coats. We sent the flood sufferers fifteen comforts, one pair of blankets, six nightgowns, and six boy's blouses.

We have held forty-five meetings, thirty-three workers enrolled, with an average attendance of fifteen, showing that our work is not confined to Fridays, as much is done outside.

It is only through the devoted services of the members of the Practical Relief Committee and the cooperation of the offcers and members of our splendid Ebell Club that the record of the past year is so satisfactory.

Report of the Scholarship Committee

The past year has been marked by an unusual number of special scholarships. In addition to the twelve scholarships traditionally maintained by Ebell, five special yearly scholarships were given by individual club members. Twenty names in all appear on our list of beneficiaries. Fifteen girls were carried through the first semester, eighteen through the second semester, and two were given assistance to enable them to obtain their credentials for teaching in California.

Of the eighteen girls who received scholarships during the second semester, two were students in High School, twelve in the University of California, Los Angeles, one in the University of California, Berkeley, two in the University of Southern California, and one in Occidental

College.

The funds which made possible the above scholarships came from the following sources: (1) interest from Endowment Fund, (2) annual appropriation from the treasury of Ebell, (3) special scholarship donations from individual members, or groups of members, (4) smaller donations to the scholarship work, and (5) a share of the receipts from benefit parties given by the Benefits and Entertainments Committee.

Since our scholarships are given as honor awards, recipients are chosen with regard to their scholastic attainments and character, as well as their financial needs. Nearly all of them find employment in various capacities outside of their class periods, for our aim is to assist students

rather than to support them entirely.

The Committee has found encouragement in the reports from some of our graduates that they have secured good positions, mostly in the teaching profession, and that many of them wish to repay the sums advanced to them in order that other girls may be helped in their turn. The following quotation from a recent letter is indicative of the response which the generosity of Ebell awakens in our girls: "The world can't be such a harsh place after all if it contains so many helping women. I feel that I must do something fine with my life to justify the faith that has been put in me."

The Committee desires to thank the members of Ebell, on behalf of the girls assisted during the past year, for their interest and financial aid, and to express its indebtedness for support and guidance given by our President, Mrs. Read, and the Executive Committee. Grateful acknowledgment is also due to Mrs. Samuel Cary Dunlap and to Mrs. F. W. Pitcher, who acted as temporary Chairmen during the enforced absences of the permanent Chair-Doners to the Endowment Fund

Report of the President of the Ebell Inniors

Progress and achievement and the introduction of several new ideas into the working plan of the Department is the record of the Junior Department of Ebell for the past year. The fulfillment of two promises made a year ago at the installation of this regime, the first, to bring the Junior Department into closer contact with the Club proper; and the second, to distribute the responsibility of the Department's work among a greater number of individual Junior members, has made this record possible.

Our Child Welfare work, instituted last year by the Junior past President, Mrs. Loren Williard Babcock, has flourished this year under the very able direction of Miss Margaret W. Ross. In addition to the two boys taken last year, ten children have been "adopted" this year. The term "adopted" is not the legal one, but means the assumption of the entire responsibility of clothing and caring for the children, providing milk for the babies and, at times, assisting the mothers with food and clothing.

In order to augment the funds available for this humanitarian work, this enterprising Child Welfare Committee held a Rummage Sale, in March. This was a departure for the Juniors and proved a highly profitable one, netting approximately \$153.

As it is our happy privilege to be members of Ebell, it is always our earnest desire to do our "bit". With the completion of the new Club House in sight, the Juniors decided that they wished to make some lasting gift toward the furnishing of the new building. A Gift Committee with Mrs. Raymond Tremaine, Chairman, has been diligently searching this year for just the right gift.

To purchase this gift it was necessary to raise a sum of money. It was decided to venture into new fields and to stage a three-act play as a benefit. The comedy *Perkins* \$240.79. This play was staged by our Drama Committee with the very efficient chairman Miss Alice Elizabeth Warmtrayed by the Junior who has had the most to do with the advancement of our drama work, Mrs. Charles Axiom

Chamberlain, one of the Junior past Presidents. In addition to this the Drama Committee has given two monthly programs and one Monday program for Ebell.

Two benefiits, under the direction of Mrs. Loren Williard Babcock, Chairman, netted \$127.49 and \$368.20 respectively. One was a bridge-supper at the Club House and the other the annual luncheon and fashion-show held at the Ambassador Hotel. Of this sum, \$109.21 was added to the Gift Fund, making a total of \$350.00, and the remainder was turned over to the Child Welfare Fund, making a total of \$549.48. These two sums plus a gift of \$10.00 make a total of \$909.48 cleared this year.

Credit for the very splendid monthly programs is due the Chairman, Mrs. Edmund Alfred Jackson, and her committee. The most unusual one was the children's party given in April for the children of Juniors and former Junior members.

Ebell Junior By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

Name.

This Department of the Ebell of Los Angeles shall be known as THE EBELL JUNIORS.

ARTICLE II.

Purpose.

The purpose of this special department is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the Club, and participation in social welfare work.

ARTICLE III.

SECTION 1. Membership in this department is open to the daughters of the Club members and their friends under the age of 26 years.

SEC. 2. Application for membership shall follow the procedure

for regular membership in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Sec. 3. Any member of this department may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee; provided such application is made within one year after membership in THE EBELL JUNIORS has lapsed.

ARTICLE IV.

Section 1. The officers of this department shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

Sec. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the

annual meeting of the department.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three Ebell members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of THE EBELL JUNIORS, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the entrance fee when the applicant becomes a regular

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be one-half (1/2) the amount member of THE EBELL. paid by the regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year, by unanimous content fees and dues of any member for the best interests of the Club. sent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. The officers of this department shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on THE EBELL, but shall defray all expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

Meetings.

Section 1. The EBELL JUNIORS shall meet on the second Wednesday of each month. The annual business meeting shall be on the first Wednesday of June.

Sec. 2. All departments of The EBELL shall be open to The EBELL JUNIORS.

SEC. 3. THE EDELL JUNIORS shall have the privilege of nine regular Monday meetings during the year.

ARTICLE VII.

Amendments.

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Executive Committee by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES

In the recent tragic death of Mrs. Harriett W. R. Strong, the Ebell Club has lost its first President, and the city and state have lost one of their most useful and distinguished women.

Mrs. Strong's essential characteristic was courage; she never feared new paths. Her ancestry entitled her to this quality. The founder of her family in America came to this country in the 17th century. He was a Presbyterian clergyman, as were five generations of his direct descendants. He was a friend of Alexander Hamilton's and was Commissary General in the War of 1812. One of his grandsons was Noadiah Russell who was one of nine ministers who united to form a college, which was the foundation of Yale University.

Mrs. Strong was born in Buffalo, New York, but when she was a small child the family moved to California. One of her early memories was of being taken from boarding school at Benicia to San Francisco, to see the first Japanese Delegation to America after Commodore Perry had forced

open the doors of the Sunrise Kingdom.

At the age of nineteen she married Charles Lyman Strong who had been sent by the banking firm of Weller and Company of New York to establish the first bank in San Francisco.

Mr. Strong built the first fire proof building in that city, having sent to China for the brick. He also made the first gas on the Pacific Coast. He, too, was a courageous

promoter of new things.

Having come to California in broken health, he purchased from Governor Don Pio Pico part of his ranch at Whittier. After Mr. Strong's death, several years later in San Francisco, Mrs. Strong decided to return to Southern California and devote herself to developing this ranch. Contrary to the advice of experienced ranchers she decided to plant one hundred fifty acres to walnuts, the first which had ever been planted on high land. The experiment was a success and she developed what was, at that time the largest walnut orchard in the world. There were twenty-five miles of trees, if set in a single row. Seeking a crop for quick returns while her trees were maturing, she planted Pampas Plums and invented a process for curing them and giving them a silky finish. In the World's Fair at

Chicago she exhibited a pavilion made entirely of Pampas

Plumes, which won much attention.

Mrs. Strong was an inventor of no mean ability. She invented a system of water dams, a working model of which was exhibited at the Chicago World's Fair and for which she received two medals.

Mrs. Strong was deeply interested in promoting the Colorado Water project and was summoned before the Water and Power Committee of Congress, and questioned concerning her proposed plans for using the water. She obtained a number of patents on useful inventions.

Mrs. Strong was the first woman member of the Chamber of Commerce of Los Angeles and retained her

membership until her death.

At the time that her attention was occupied by these practical matters Mrs. Strong was actively supporting literary, musical, and scientific movements. She was first Vice-President of the Los Angeles Symphony Orchestra and was unremitting in the effort to further that organization. She composed a number of musical works, some of which have been orchestrated and sung in Los Angeles. She served as one of the judges in the City Public School Musical Memory Contests.

She was one of the founders of the Ebell Club of Los Angeles and its first President. She was a member of the Friday Morning and Ruskin Art Clubs, and President of the Hamilton Club, organized for the study of the Constitution of the United States. Her address on Constitution Day, 1924, was printed in pamphlet form and many hundred copies distributed. Mrs. Strong was also President

of the Business League of America.

To sum up the accomplishments of this remarkable woman seems an idle task. To have known her personally, is to realize her charm and her strength. Her work was acomplished so quietly that few will know of her deeds even in Ebell which owes her much. Beginnings are more important than endings; foundations are more vital than facades; and the pioneer who blazes a new trail is greater than the conqueror who walks in other people's paths.

So it is with reverence that the Ebell Club pauses to do honor to the woman who had the courage to be her first President, and the vision to plan her great future.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First-That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF

LOS ANGELES.

*Second-That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could

Third-That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County

of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth-That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth-That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF Los ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture, through departments of education, research, and social wel-

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

- SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare, and methods of the Club.
- SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be reported to the Executive Committee at the meeting following.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

SEC. 6. At the first regular meeting in July, the Directors shall appoint two from their own number-one of whom shall be Chairman-to serve with the President, Auditor, and Treasurer as a Budget Committee.

SEC. 7. In the absence of the President the Board of Directors shall appoint a Chairman pro tem from their own number.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The Chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the amount appropriated in the Budget for the current ex-

SEC. 3. Nine members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary, and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the President-elect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program

Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Member-

ship Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of

Directors may require, which bonds shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be

defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive applications for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly. and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curator-elect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the Departments for the

ensuing year.

SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall re-

tain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship Fund of the Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign ali requisitions on the Scholarship funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 9. All endowments, annuities, devices, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions, given for the establishment of The Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of

the yearly scholarships.

Sec. 10. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful

performance of her duties. She shall also act as Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in

office, requiring from her a receipt.

SEC. 11. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seem to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committees.

Section 1. The standing committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents;

Budget Committee;

- Committee on Departments;
- Committee on Programs;
- House Committee;
- Membership Committee;
- Printing Committee;
- Rentals Committee;
- 9. Social Welfare Committee.

SEC. 2. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization. This Committee, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

SEC. 3. The Budget Committee shall prepare a statement of the estimated receipts and expenditures of the Club for the ensuing year and submit it to the Board of Directors at their second reg-

ular meeting in July. SEC. 4. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Depart-

ments in arranging their courses of study.

Sec. 5. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and such special meetings as are authorized by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Com-

mittee, and supervise the building and its contents.

SEC. 7. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 8. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the

SEC. 9. The Rentals Committee shall, with the assistance of Year Book.

the Financial Secretary, supervise all rentals and leases.

SEC. 10. The Social Welfare Committee shall consist of one Director, who shall be Chairman, and the Chairmen of Benefits, Practical Relief, Rest Cottage Association, and of Scholarships. This Committee shall have general supervision of the philanthropic and social welfare of this Club.

SEC. 11. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the

Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be handed to the Membership Committee for investigation.

The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting for ap-

An alphabetical list of names of all applicants approved by the Executive Committee shall be published in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting for election to membership.

Should a protest be received the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investiga-

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of......(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANCELES.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as

endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for Junior membership during one year.

SEC. 2. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of the election to membership.

SEC. 3. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of mem-

SEC. 4. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, Temporary.

SEC. 5. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and who is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.

SEC. 6. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for three (3) years may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay three hundred dollars (\$300), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

SEC. 7. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote of the members present, in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

SEC. 8. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation;

or any vote.

SEC. 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, in recognition of merit or for the best interests of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay

admission fees or dues.

SEC. 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of twenty-six (26) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club, at one-half the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and any of the Study Departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular niceting each month and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 11. An application for a Junior Membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors and then shall follow

the procedure for regular Club membership.

Any Ebell Junior may become a regular member of the Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the admission fees, provided such application be made within one year after the Junior membership has

Sec. 12. A temporary resident may, by having her name prelapsed. sented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of three dollars (\$3.00) a month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets

Sec. 13. Any member may resign at any time upon the presenof the corporation. tation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must

follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members. except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-

Sec. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority

vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be fifty dollars (\$50). SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be twenty dollars (\$20). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members and have one-half their dues remitted.

Sec. 5. The Executive Committee may by unanimous vote and where the need is apparent remit one-half of the admission fees and dues of wives of resident clergymen when application for reg-

ular membership is made.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

Section 1. Beginning the first Monday in October, a regular meeting of the Club shall be held on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular, life, and honorary life members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC 3. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending at a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.

Sec. 5. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.

Sec. 6. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

Section 1. All Officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations.

Sec. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF Los Angeles, propose the name of..... as a nominee for the office of..... THE EBELL OF Los ANGELES for the term from July 1, 19, to July 1, 19; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office.

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

Sec. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the non and for the differ-

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further

notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. of the date set; three members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June, provided, however, that the Presidentelect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments

for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XII.

Club Activities.

Section 1. This Club shall have four definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs under the direction of the Second Vice-President; (2) the Study Departments under the direction of the General Curator; (3) the Social Welfare Work in charge of the Chairmen of Rest Cottage Association; of Scholarship; of Practical Relief; of Benefits; and of one Director; and (4) the Ebell Juniors, who shall have self government, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of Ebell.

SEC. 2. Each Study Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee. All Curators are subject to and shall report to and confer with the General Curator.

Rule 1. All members of Departments must be members of The

EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.

Rule 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference

to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

Rule 6. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the Department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

Business.

Section 1. All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being

presented to the Club.

SEC. 2. Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Amendments.

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC, 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 3. Any such amendment so adopted, shall, when certified

by the Board of Directors, become effective.

SEC. 4. Only those eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XV.

Parliamentary Authority.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by "Roberts' Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVI.

Charter Day.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVII.

Notice of Meetings.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1927. And the foregoing Ry-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Standing Kules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members may bring one guest to all open Monday afternoon programs by paying fifty cents. Members' visiting cards will admit gentlemen to all open meetings.

Regular members will receive ten guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

A check for admission fee must accompany all applications for membership.

New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.
