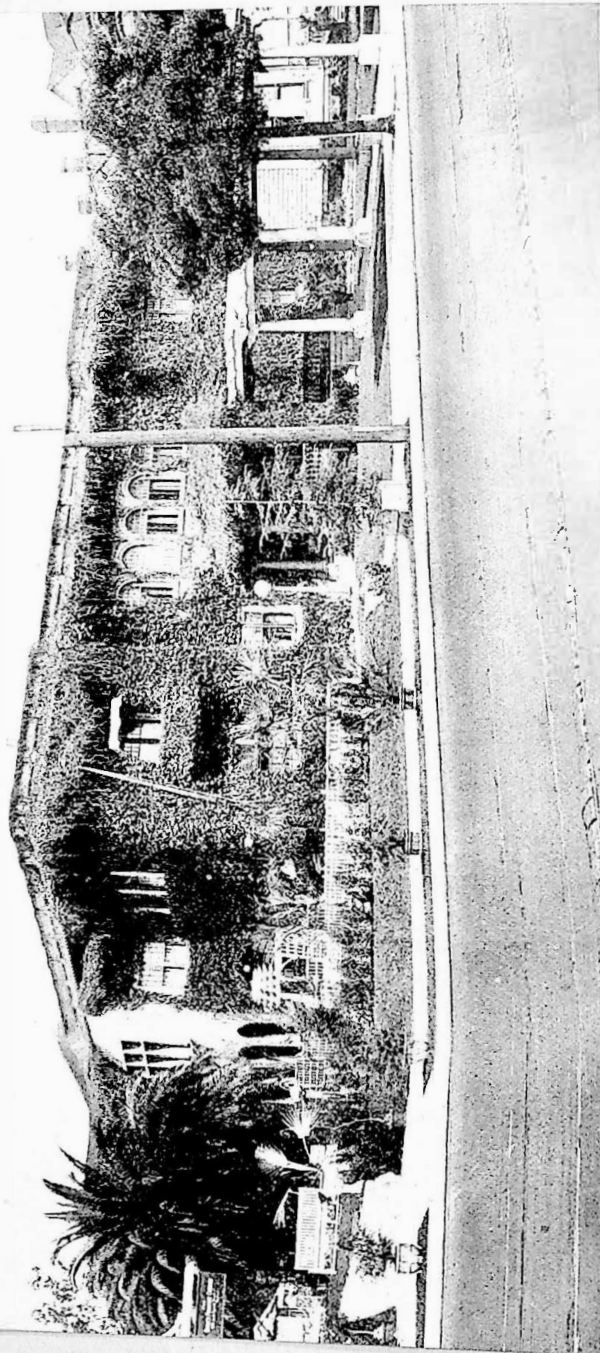

Our Club Name

Every member of Ebell should be able to answer with certainty the question, often repeated within and outside the Club membership,—“Why are we called ‘Ebell’?”

Adrian Ebell, born September thirtieth, eighteen hundred forty, in Ceylon, of mixed German-British-Dutch ancestry; brought to America while very young by an older sister who had married an American missionary, gaining his education at Easthampton and Yale, and later, at German Universities; dying at the age of thirty-seven after seeing the ideal conceived in boyhood well on the way towards realization; may be regarded as an international figure.

Always deeply interested in a wider horizon for women everywhere, through the extension of opportunities for higher education in all lines tending to the enlarged sympathy that results from the assimilation of broad culture when pursued with the ultimate motive of unselfish service, Dr. Ebell initiated the organization of study classes for women in the eastern part of our country and, after a visit to California, was returning to Europe to further his plans for an international college for women, when he was stricken with fever that resulted in his death.

While a student at Yale, his brilliant personality and rare courage attracted the attention of a man of large wealth who had no son. Given his choice between the lure of all that belongs to the sole heir of a vast fortune and the struggle and deprivation attached to carving his own career, but on condition that another name be added to that of Ebell, he elected to keep his honored birthright unsullied and to tread the path of self denial. This he chose rather than to risk, through the temptations frequently accompanying great wealth, possible belittling of a name that had stood through generations for fidelity to ideals of loyalty, truth and honor.

Such was the man to whose memory the Ebell Clubs of California—among which The Ebell of Los Angeles is third in order of organization—chose to build living monuments by taking his name and carrying on his work through the education of women. May we perform the task worthily and prove loyal to our chosen legend, “I serve.”

The Building of Ebell Club House

A Retrospect and a Prospect

Perhaps no venture in Club Life affects the interests and happiness of the individual member so vitally as the building of a "Club Home." It acts as a nucleus around which centers a common interest, and results—let us hope—in a certain joy and gratification in having contributed our individual quota toward the erection of a beautiful building in our home town.

The great essential is not so much money in hand, as women with vision. A vision to promote—modified, however, by business acumen and discretion, but strengthened by enthusiasm and faith. Faith in the project—faith in its ultimate accomplishment—for the most optimistic will have moments of doubt and discouragement while contending with the more conservative element of the Club—which will be able to launch forth on the sea of negation a veritable ship-load of plausible objections to the "Great Adventure."

The Ebell of Los Angeles, organized in 1894, incorporated in 1897, with a membership today approximating 2000, had less than one-third that number when she first formulated plans for the erection of a "Club Home."

In 1902, the report of a Ways and Means Committee appointed to procure a suitable site was: "That nothing desirable could be obtained under five thousand dollars." Five thousand dollars! Impossible! The responsibility was too great! The venture was temporarily postponed. What a change! Last year we negotiated the purchase of an adjoining lot for fifty thousand dollars.

In the year, 1902, the officers of the incoming administration were requested to make the building of a "Club House" their first and main interest. The responsibility was accepted. A new Ways and Means Committee was appointed and the project renewed, with the result, that in October of 1902, members of the Club had promised subscriptions aggregating between fourteen and fifteen thousand dollars, the Committee also reporting that they had obtained a ninety day option on a desirable lot.

This report was sufficiently encouraging to warrant "Ebell Club" (a literary association with no power to issue stock) to proceed to the organization of a "Building Association."

The organization was completed and the Association incorporated on "May 21, 1903, with a capital stock of

fifty thousand dollars, with power to issue stock, buy and sell real estate, build and own buildings."

A subscription agreement was then printed, subscriptions for stock solicited, with the result that the first two thousand shares at ten dollars per share, were all taken within four months. The "Directors of the Ebell Building Association" were now in the position to complete negotiations for their lot, which they did, paying the original price, fourteen thousand five hundred, with interest and taxes to date.

A second "subscription agreement" for stock was now issued, and plans for a Club House drawn up. About this time, however, the increase in property values made the sale of our Hope Street lot most expedient and profitable (it bringing in March, 1906, thirty-one thousand nine hundred dollars). A more desirable but less expensive lot was now purchased for ten thousand dollars, on Figueroa and Eighteenth Streets (present site).

It is of interest to know that through the business acumen of the "Directors of the Building Association" they were able to distribute to the stockholders a surplus of thirteen thousand dollars, as early as April, 1906. The same good judgment which so successfully planned the beginnings of our "Club House" carried the project to a successful finish and it was but a few years until Ebell Club owned the entire stock.

The cost of the lot on which we built, ten thousand dollars, added to the original cost of the Club House, twenty-five thousand dollars (it has since undergone a few changes and additions), totaled \$35,000.00. The cost of our original furnishings, seven thousand five hundred dollars has considerably increased as the years have passed, as have also our realty values, for inasmuch as we have in the meantime purchased adjacent lots, we have added to what we had already considered a most valuable investment, feeling sufficiently secure, in fact, to set our goal still higher; for we look forward in the near future, either to enlarging our present quarters, or to the building of a "New Club Home," for the better accommodation of our increased membership.

And if we should venture forth once again into the turbulent but energizing waters of "New Adventure," that same vision, and faith, the same "Ebell Spirit," which actuated and guided the brave builders of our present home, will guide us safely into a new and more commodious "Club Haven."

Standing Rules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
Regular members will receive four guest cards for Monday afternoon programs and eight for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

A member may invite but one guest to any Monday program. Members' visiting cards will admit gentlemen to all open meetings.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

The Membership Committee does not assume the responsibility of proving the truth or falsity of derogatory rumors concerning the character of applicants for membership; but persistent and general rumors shall be deemed sufficient to bar the applicant.

New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

An applicant for absent rates must state in writing that she expects to be away from Los Angeles a full year or more. In lieu of a card of admission, she shall be given a certificate of membership with no guest privileges.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

(Ebell's Episode in the Pageant, "California, the Land of Dreams," Given by the C. F. W. C. at the Annual Convention at Yosemite, May 25, 1921.)

In presenting this symbolic picture of Literature, the Ebell Club attempted to show the contributions of the Past, the Present, and, prophetically, the Future (through women, by women and for women) to the State of California. It was an attempt to show Woman's gift, through literature, to the upbuilding of the commonwealth.

* * * * *

Three dancers representing the attendant Graces introduced the episode to the on-lookers, with a graceful dance.

Their exit was followed by a processional, heralded by pages, and led by Literature herself, laurel-crowned and in trailing robes of purple, who, attended by her handmaids, Poetry, Prose and History and a lesser group of satellites clad in the shifting colors of the rainbow, greeted California, enthroned, saying:

"Out of the past, I, Literature, bring to thee
The dreams of many peoples; of fair women
Created by great poets, sung of in books,
And women great because they sang, themselves.
Here on the sacred tripod at thy feet
O California! see we kindle now
Those fires Prometheus stole, of Inspiration
To give to man, that he might have a light
To blaze a pathway down the ages."

At Literature's bidding, the attendant women kindled a fire upon the tripod set at California's feet. As the flames rose upward, Literature again chanted, and as she sang, the women appeared in a processional, with appropriate action.

"Man's dreams arising from these altar fires once more appear.

A great processional of women:

Lo, Isis, out of Egypt, come!
And Sappho, violet-crowned, the rose of Greece!
Frigga, the goddess-patron of the North,
And Eira, her attendant, she who taught
The power of herbs and simples to Womankind.
Then Beatrice, loved of Dante and Italy,

Joan of France, the warrior maid and guide,
Upon her milk-white palfrey trapped in gold;
And Shakespeare's Rosalind from English soil,
Wearing the dreams of Arden in her eyes.
America last,—Priscilla, the Puritan,
The women of the Revolution and
The grandame of the South of pre-war days;
And California's own dream-child, Ramona.

The Present ushers in the Modern Woman—
Lawyer or Teacher or Mother—all they who serve
In their capacities the State and you!

Steadily has it grown; each inch it has gained in girth, each additional foot of spreading branches being the result of *change* silently yet surely working within it, unseen save in attained results. The year just passed has witnessed the desirable expansion necessary to a healthily developing organization. Some of the changes noticeable and noteworthy have been:
The resumption of activities in the C.F.W.C.

The organization of a lively, growing Junior Auxiliary.

The raising of the dues to meet the additional needs of an expanding organization.

The resumption of weekly teas, with inevitably a more hospitable attitude toward the stranger, and a closer contact among the members.

The inauguration of club singing.

The resurrection of a defunct Music Section, now a large, interested group.

The growth of the Monthly Bulletin into a sheet of wider informational value, which we plan to increase to a much larger affair.

The establishment of a Bulletin Board to serve as a connecting link with worth-while activities outside our club. We expect this, in time, to have much educational value.

The increase in the number of small study groups, as adjuncts to section work.

These and other changes that have been wrought would never have been possible had it not been that there has been associated with the president a remarkable group of women endowed with clarity of vision and a belief in greater destinies for the club. I cannot now too warmly express my appreciation of the work and helpfulness of my associates in the Executive Committee. There has been stipulated work for each, and the tasks have been done cheerfully, promptly and well. No less helpful, each in her own sphere, have been the chairmen of the various committees. Our club has been most fortunate in having secured as Curators women who are specialists in their several lines of work. These have been assisted, wherever outside instruction has been necessary, by unusually gifted teachers.

Our Monday programs have been brilliant and sufficiently varied to satisfy all tastes. The pleasure of these programs has been enhanced by our artistically decorated platform, and the interesting and varied art exhibits that have lined the auditorium walls. We have enjoyed eight literary programs; eight of music; five dealing with countries of the world; four relating to applied education; four to club affairs; two referring to conservation; two to philosophy; and one each to social service, art, drama, citizenship, motion pictures, and dancing.

Our luncheons, made attractive by the work of the various decorations committees, have had for speakers some of the most brilliant celebrities that have visited Los Angeles, as well as others of local repute. We have listened with interest to the retired president of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, our state president, our retiring and incoming District presidents, our City School Superintendent, our City Clerk, the director of the Museum of Arts and Sciences, the director of the Southwest Museum, various literary men and women, musicians, artists, composers, actors, social service workers, travelers, scientists and educators. Our largely attended Purpose Luncheon for local Social Service workers, and our Reciprocity Luncheon for club presidents of the District, will long remain in happy memory; but not more so than our evenings by Mr. Frederick Warde and Mr. Frank Lowden, at which time we entertained the husbands of members. Other joyous occasions have been our Charter Day Reception, our children's Christmas party, our program and tea for Rest Cottage guests, our afternoon tea for our Junior

Auxiliary members, and the series of teas for the new members.

Our Library, under the fostering care of Mrs. Parsons and her committee, has been increased this year through gift and purchase by approximately three hundred volumes.

Rest Cottage, lovingly mothered by Mrs. Ross, has "carried on" in its fine, helpful way, and is looking with pleasurable anticipation to larger, new quarters in the not distant future.

Mrs. Johnson has carefully watched over the careers of our ten scholarship girls, five of whom are in local high schools, and five passed on to University work, all making excellent records as students.

A devoted band of workers whose efforts have helped many individuals, many homes and various institutional charities, is the Practical Relief department, whose guiding spirit is Mrs. Nash. This band of altruistic spirits, re-enforced by a number of our Junior Auxiliary members, is carrying on an all-summer session in order to be prepared for winter demands for supplies of clothing.

Our club has been the grateful recipient of many gifts of money, of books and of clothing for Practical Relief work, as well as of some considerable equipment for our card parties. Our members have invariably bestowed with a lavish hand whenever there has been a call for worthy purposes. Many outside organizations have been assisted in their benevolent work by securing the use of our clubhouse at philanthropic rates. Miss Hunter and Mrs. Hammond packed and shipped a box of lovely flowers from Ebell gardens to Whipple Barracks on our first National Hospital Day. Through Miss Neill's care the old men at the County Farm have partaken of Ebell's bounty and Christmas cheer. Mrs. Ross, at Christmas time, managed the sending of many baskets of food to needy families, Ebell's retainers.

The total amount of money raised by gift through the chairmanships of Mrs. A. B. Cooke, Miss Della Bates, Mrs. Matthew Robertson, Mrs. E. C. Magauran, Mrs. Edward Grumley, Miss Catherine Connell and Mrs. Charles H. Thompson (who, with her committee, did such notable work on several occasions), all of which money has been given through the generosity of Ebell members for the following purposes, is: Christmas Seals for the Tubercular, Needlework Guild, Near East Relief, Children's Hospital, Blackfeet Indians, Memorial Art Gift at Exposition Park, Salvation Army, Save the Redwoods League, Disabled Veterans of the World War, War Memorial Fountain for

the Clubhouse, our Lot, Club Singing, Rest Cottage, Scholarships, Practical Relief, the Old Men at the County Farm—this amount has reached the sum of \$15,674.02. This does not include \$3678.50 raised for the Red Cross by Mrs. E. C. Pyle and her committee, a part of which sum was donated by club members.

Our lot has not only grown more beautiful to see, but it has steadily risen in market value, until now it is one of the most desirable properties on Figueroa Street. Through the careful management of our Board of Directors and the watchfulness of our Treasurer, the indebtedness on the lot has been greatly reduced. We plan to pay off more than the amount owed the Bank next year; then we may begin to think seriously of a new club home.

We have endeavored to assist the Federation of Women's Clubs in its various departments, in every way. Mrs. Millard, the Federation Secretary, has attended many meetings and has kept us in close touch with the affairs of the District. Your president has attended nearly all of the Presidents' Councils. We have entertained the District Board, and have given the use of the clubhouse to the District for an afternoon devoted to European Relief. Your president has served as chairman of resolutions for both District and State conventions this year; and our club, assisted by a few women from other clubs, gave the beautiful episode of Literature at the State Convention at Yosemite. On this occasion, our club had the largest representation present of any club in the state, ninety Ebells members being in attendance.

The demands on the time and the energies of your president have been heavy. She has presided at thirty-one Monday meetings and at two evening meetings, at nine luncheons, at thirty-two Executive Committee meetings; has attended sixteen conferences with outside organizations, eight Reciprocity Days; has spoken at twenty luncheons and dinners; and, despite the alert and willing helpfulness of our Corresponding Secretary, she has written five hundred ten letters on club business, besides answering and making innumerable personal and telephone calls.

But, taxing as her work has been, your president considers it a great privilege to have served Ebells. Great joy has been hers because of the many kindly expressions of loyalty and the deeply appreciated offers of help that she has received.

THE SPIRIT OF EBELL!—that intangible thing which animates our club, and impels all who would serve her to give of their best! This is the portent that assures

me that, like my symbol, the tree, Ebells will continue to pulsate with life, will extend its beneficent influence, and, in so doing, will expand to meet the needs of changing times and conditions.

Report of the Recording Secretary 1920-1921

Once more in retrospective contemplation, we turn the pages of Ebells' record of another year, pausing to contemplate in passing, many a detail, while marvelling at the amazing pace at which this great club of ours has traveled.

Under the capable guidance of our President, Mrs. Charles Hulbert Toll, Ebells has taken its part in the life of the community, sowing with a lavish hand in many a by-corner, and now as we garner the harvest, we view with pride the achievements of a year spent not for ourselves but in the larger service of humanity.

Mrs. Charles H. Thompson, Chairman of Benefits and Entertainments, managed most successfully two card parties that netted \$3695.95 for the benefit of Ebells' Social Service activities. This money was divided among Rest Cottage, Scholarship, which has maintained ten girls in High School and College during the past year; and Practical Relief, which between the months of October and March, distributed 1018 garments among our less fortunate brothers and sisters, who would otherwise have suffered greatly.

In a few minutes on April 11th, the Club contributed \$3849.96 toward the pressing immediate relief of the Disabled Veterans of the World War, who have sought a haven of refuge in our sunny southland.

Ebells is proud of all that these men did for their country, and no sacrifice can be too great to show our appreciation of their response to their Country's call, but on memory's tablets there is also engraved the name of many a loyal heart who sleeps beneath the poppies in Flanders field. In loving tribute to these brave souls, Ebells hopes to consecrate a memorial fountain, that the generations to come may not forget. \$2412.50 has already been contributed to this memorial this year.

Our annual Red Cross drive under Mrs. E. C. Pyle, in spite of being handicapped by being allotted to a field

already covered by other organizations, reported \$3678.50.

In civic life Ebells has kept abreast of the times. The Club has been honored in having her President, Mrs. Charles Hulbert Toll, placed upon two important boards of state-wide scope; a member of the Board of Trustees of the Ventura School, and one of three women in the state to be appointed to the Board of Councillors of the "Save the Redwoods League"—a recognition of Ebells' influence in the civic life of the State.

Mrs. Matthew Robertson, a past president, has served as a member of the Executive Committee of the City Planning Commission. Emphasizing our belief in a Municipal Farm, our Mrs. William Read has represented the Club in all the meetings of civic bodies when this subject has been considered. Through our Social Service Committee we have kept in touch with the Alliance of Social Agencies, the Council of Community Service and the Municipal League. Our representatives have been the guests of the Men's City Club often when many important civic improvements have been discussed. Ebells is known far and wide as a power in the community.

Ebells' Art Exhibit Committee, Mrs. W. S. Bullis, Chairman, has exhibited nine fine collections of pictures, and as a direct result of these exhibitions, the artists have sold sixteen pictures this year.

Our Membership Chairman, Mrs. Bruce H. Cass, reports 231 new members; temporary members, 49; deaths, 11; dropped, 19; resignations, 45; making a total of 1981 members at the present time, June 30, 1921.

Following out the inception of a seed sown at the Biennial in Des Moines, and carefully nurtured and transplanted by our President, on November 29, 1920, there was presented to the parent organization, a beautiful garden of blossoms, the Junior Auxiliary—75 applications for membership have been received to date, of which number 66 have so far qualified. On May 12th, this debutante daughter of Ebells gave her first benefit party, clearing \$186.00 toward the relief of the Disabled Soldiers.

Our Program Chairman, Mrs. W. B. Scarborough, has invited us to a "feast of reason and a flow of soul" on 36 Mondays, bringing to our platform speakers of international fame as well as many of the constantly increasing number of celebrities for whom Los Angeles is becoming home. In the lecture field we have built castles in Spain, have grown indignant at the treatment of our California Indians, considered the problems of the Pacific, paid tribute to William Morris' influence in the art and literary world,

and to that rare genius, O. Henry. Through the eyes of a cultured Russian woman we viewed the tragedies that have overtaken Russian women; we have contemplated the dangers besetting civilization; enjoyed a fascinating Bible lecture with the teacher of Ebells' Bible Department; visited the little known coast of Chile and Patagonia and later traveled to Alaska in quest of museum specimens. We have learned the effect of color on life; viewed the making of a film set; marveled at the versatility of the genius of Leonardo de Vinci; heard of the wanton destruction of Nature's "wonderful monuments of beauty," the California Redwoods. In the field of psychic research we have considered Christian mystical phenomena; and in another program absorbed many bits of modern thought as promulgated by Einstein, Freud and Bergson. Two programs were devoted to the consideration of civic interests—considering charter amendments and community problems; an Americanization program in which we learned that our alien population study our lives and base their ideas of citizenship upon our example. Living models from our city schools showed us just what the school children of the city are doing in practical economics. A program upon French civilization showed the effect of past generations upon the country's literary productions.

In the field of modern poetry Edmund Russell brought us bits of verse culled from contact with our soldier boys, and Carl Sandburg interpreted some of his own poems.

"Of all the arts, great music is the art to raise the soul above all earthly storms," and in the past year, Ebells has been privileged to hear such artists as Gertrude Auld Thomas, Robert Albright, Nelle Lockwood Josephs, Homer Grunn, Mrs. Frederick Bower, Sol Cohen, Mrs. Ryus, Maude Fenlon Bollman, Cecil Fanning, Thomas Wilfred, Ruth Hutchinson, Henry Svedrofsky, Helen Thresher Simonsen, Florence Middaugh, Mme. Johnson-Bishop, Elinor Warren and Annis Howell.

The closing of the Club year was marked by a brilliant luncheon at the Ambassador Hotel, with 1133 present. A program of music and esthetic dances was a feature of the day.

Two evening programs were given when Ebells husbands and brothers were guests. On February 15th, former Governor Lowden of Illinois was the speaker, and at the second Shakespearian Commemoration program, Frederick Warde gave the program. At Christmas time Ebells' children commemorated the Pilgrim Tercentenary. There were two special programs at which Ebells entertained former

Rest Cottage guests and a tea to welcome our Junior Auxiliary members.

Among world-wide celebrities who have appeared on our platform were Dr. David Barrows, Lieut.-Col. Whittlesey, Miss Harriet Riddell, Rupert Hughes, Dr. Wilfred Grenfell.

The following resolutions have been endorsed:

November 29th—Amendment to By-Laws, permitting organization of Junior Auxiliary;

January 3rd—Amendment to the By-Laws, Article IX, Section 2;

January 17th—Endorsing an educational campaign for a new sewer. Protesting against the destruction of the California Redwoods;

April 11th—Amendment to the By-Laws, because of Federal ruling exempting Club from War Tax;

April 18th—Endorsing the Pastime Clearing House;

May 9th—Asking the State Board of Education to inaugurate a penny drive among school children of state for a fund to save the California Redwoods.

May 16th—Asking the Grand Jury to investigate the reason why prices of milk are so high as to make it prohibitive among the poor.

During the past year the Club has been the recipient of a Patron membership in the Los Angeles Symphony, through the courtesy of Mrs. H. W. R. Strong, Ebells' first President; of the gift of \$1000.00 toward a building for Rest Cottage, from Mrs. Robert Laird Gifford; five Christmas gifts of \$100.00 each toward the lot, from Mrs. Richard Gird, Mrs. Jesse B. Alexander, Mrs. Hampton L. Story, Mrs. Valentine Peyton, Mrs. C. N. Flint and one of \$50.00 from Mrs. W. L. Jones; of a Valentine Book Shower of 159 volumes to Ebells' library from Club members; of a copy of the Constitution of the French Republic from Prof. Louis F. D. Briois.

In her address, "The Widening Horizon," given at the beginning of the Club year, our President said, "Privileges mean responsibilities." As we review the year 1920-21, we can truly say Ebells has not shirked responsibility but has gone afield and assumed many a new one feeling that there can be no growth without effort.

"The pathway of success is in serving humanity. By no other means is it possible, and this truth is so plain and so patent that even very simple folk recognize it."

Report of the General Curator

Through the departments of Ebells, we enter into the very heart of the Club, for here are women drawn together into groups with the wish not so much to acquire facts as to seek for a knowledge that should in some way issue in life, in character and in power to think and to express a thought. For, as it has been truly said, "If your study does not directly or indirectly enrich the life of man, it is but a drawing of vanity with cart ropes, a weariness to the flesh, or at best a busy idleness."

Fourteen departments held regular meetings during the year, ranging in number of meetings from six to thirty-one, and in average attendance from fifteen to two hundred fifteen. 915 different members registered in the Departments, with a total enrollment for all Departments of 2095. During the year, 2895 guests were entertained.

A careful study of the Department programs following this report, shows the variety and comprehensiveness of the work done. The departments naturally divide themselves into study and lecture groups. The study sections are smaller where individual expression is encouraged and progressive thought developed.

The Emerson Section, Mrs. Emerson Clyde Gates, Curator and Leader, completed the reading of the volume, Letters and Social Aims, supplemented with The Over-soul and Idealism. Many of the poems added their illuminating thought to the discussion of the essays. Two stimulating lectures by Mary Andrews Connor and one by William H. Knight added to the pleasure of the year's work. At the end of the year, the Emerson and the Browning sections gave a luncheon inviting as special guests well known leaders of the literary world. Twenty were enrolled in this department with an average attendance of fifteen.

The Browning Section, Mrs. Edward Crumley, Curator and Leader, studied poems which illustrated the consummate artistry of the poet as portrait-painter of women, and which also showed how deeply he has interpreted the problems of existence, and how nearly he has fathomed the depths of human character. First of all we gazed upon Browning's own Lyric Love in One Word More, and By the Fireside. Then on his intellectual types—the youthful Balaustion, "Her learned eye which was still the loving one"; on Numpholoptos, like a pure white moonbeam, with her rare quality of mind; and in turn on the philosophic,

the shrewd, the brave, the unfortunate, the constant, the avenging; the wondrous types of motherhood, and the complex types of girlhood. Each character presented a struggle between good and evil, and showed the development of soul gained thereby.

Two delightful events marked the closing of the year's work—the joint luncheon of the Browning-Emerson Departments, on May 17th, and a day's outing at the beautiful rancho-home of Mrs. Philip L. Wilson, on June 8th.

Seventy-eight were registered and there was an average attendance of thirty.

The Shakespeare Section, Mrs. Thomas R. Coles, Curator and Leader, studied the gloomy tale of Troilus and Cressida, the powerful tragedy of Macbeth, and the lively Taming of the Shrew, supplementing these with Neilson and Thorndyke's Facts about Shakespeare. Miss Helen Augusta Brooks of the Cumnock School of Expression gave two interpretive lectures and an interesting dramatic reading was given by Miss Anina Doyle. The year closed with the costumed presentation of Taming of the Shrew by members of the class under the direction of Mrs. Herbert F. True. There was a registration of thirty-three and an average attendance of twenty-one.

The Choral Section, Mrs. B. F. Nance, Curator, started the year with Mrs. Charles T. Inman as Director, and Mrs. Lorenzo Wallace Foster, as Accompanist. Later, both of these able women, who had given their services, found it necessary to be relieved of their duties and Mr. Hugo Kirchhofer was engaged as Director while Mrs. Judson M. Davis became the Accompanist. With "Not how much, but how well" as its motto, good work was done not only in singing but in assistance to the club. One of its members undertook the raising of money for the Monday Community Singing, and when the call came to help the Disabled Veterans this Department gave fifty dollars. The Chorus gave a group of songs at the Christmas meeting of the Bible Department and at the end of the Club Year they joined with the Hollywood Woman's Club Chorus in providing a musical opening for the annual business meeting. Forty-seven were enrolled with an average attendance of twenty-two.

The Parliamentary Law Section, Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, Curator and Instructor, has followed a consecutive plan of study with practical drill at each meeting. The aim has been to make valuable and efficient members and officers for our own or any other organization. There

were thirty-six enrolled with an average attendance of eighteen.

The English Section, Mrs. N. O. Anderson, Curator, has pursued a course of study different, in some respects, from that of other years. That we might be well informed and a little more sympathetic with the needs of our friends in all lands, more responsive to the unspoken appeal for judgment and kindness near at hand, an examination of world events was incorporated into the study of English. The work followed three general lines. The vocabulary drill was led by Mrs. Ilot Johnson and grammatical errors were corrected by Mrs. Charles D. Burt. The rest of the time was devoted to perusal of the Covenant of the League of Nations; the Constitution of the United States; national, state and city political affairs and current events under the leadership of Mrs. N. O. Anderson. One hundred sixteen members were enrolled with an average attendance of thirty-seven.

The French Section, Mrs. H. Wade Ransom, Curator, had a successful season under the tutelage of Professor Louis F. D. Briois. The enthusiasm of the members resulted in the meeting for French conversation every other Thursday; a French orphan was again supported by the class; and at the close of the year a luncheon was given, followed by a French play presented by members of the section. There were eighty-six registered and an average attendance of forty-seven.

The Spanish Section, Miss Emma E. Seibert, Curator, held interesting and profitable meetings under the instruction of Professor Frederick Beckman. A luncheon was given to end the year with an attractive Spanish program provided by Mrs. Ziba Oaks Stocker and Dr. Beckman. Sixty-seven were registered with an average attendance of twenty-seven.

The Social Science Section, Mrs. Elizabeth McManus, Curator, heard from its platform some of the best known authorities of the State on Child Welfare and our share of the responsibilities in Juvenile problems. The special guest luncheons followed the meetings of this vitally interesting department, and preceding, Mrs. Almon Bartlett Ross, Chairman of Rest Cottage, gave a brief report of her work. There were three hundred twenty-seven enrolled with an average attendance of one hundred twenty-five.

The Music Section, Mrs. William Ernest Mabee, Curator, was revived with enthusiasm after having lain dormant for several years. The work of the American composer was considered and several artist composers inter-

preted their own music. Each meeting was an instructing and delightful musical. Three luncheons were given during the year at which many local and visiting musicians were honor guests. The Department had an enrollment of three hundred eighty with an average of one hundred sixty in attendance.

The Bible Section, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator, again felt the inspiration of Miss M. Winifred Rouzee, who gave her lectures on the Symbolism of the Bible to a most appreciative audience. Two hundred ten registered and there was an average attendance of one hundred twenty-eight.

The Art and Travel Section, Mrs. Fred Betts, Curator, has brought to its members much of beauty and a fine appreciation of what the artists are doing for the community. There have also been intimate glimpses of foreign lands. Four luncheons were given during the year with many artists as the special guests so that the club members could meet these men whose paintings have been shown on our walls and whose works of art make the city more beautiful. The Department registered three hundred four members and had an average attendance of one hundred thirty-one.

The Drama Section, Mrs. J. Granville Robertson, Curator, had a varied program. Lectures on the drama were given; several one-act plays were presented; other plays were read and a morning on pageantry was enjoyed; so that the members were able to observe the trend of modern dramatic expression. Mrs. Ada Henry Van Pelt, Curator Emeritus of this Section, presided over four luncheons which were made interesting by talks of men and women well known in the dramatic field. There were two hundred thirty-nine enrolled with an average of two hundred fifteen in attendance.

The Books and Current Literature Section, Miss Fred-erica de Laguna, Curator, has heard reviews of some of the best of recent literature: fiction, autobiography, essays, poetry, and that which was most vital in the current magazines. Man's soul-searching for truth becomes permanent in books. There were three hundred seventeen enrolled, with an average attendance of two hundred six.

The pleasure and inspiration given to the club members by the departments has been attained through the conscientious and tireless work of the officers of each section, and great appreciation and thanks are due to them.

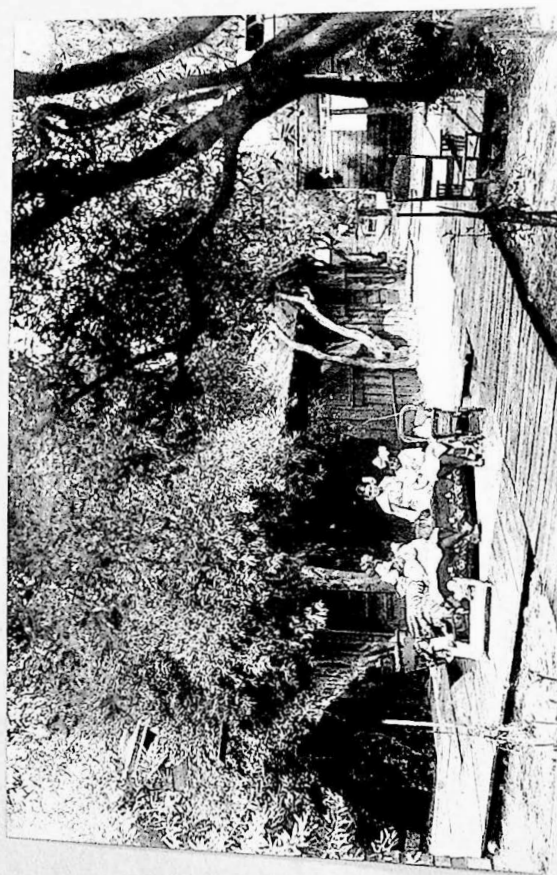

Report of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Ebell Rest Cottage now entering upon its third year of service, has more than justified its existence as a philanthropy of which Ebell Club may justly be proud.

For a record of the beginning and the history of Rest Cottage Association, reference is made to the report of the first Chairman of the Association, as found in the 1919-20 Year Book.

A Drive during October of 1920 as reported by Mrs. Charles E. Cray, Chairman, together with the Membership Committee's earnest work throughout the year brought the present total membership to 454. This includes Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life Members, of which last there are seventeen.

Mrs. Frank K. Rule, Chairman of House and Grounds, reports the equipment in splendid condition. The receipt of fruit, vegetables, milk and clothing, which has been generously donated during the year, is gratefully acknowledged.

Sixty-seven guests have been entertained during 1920-21. The Executive Committee wishes to commend the earnest work given by our Matron, Mrs. Eby, who, in spite of ill-health, has never permitted her interest in Rest Cottage to wane.

Interesting reports from the Chairman of Investigation, Follow-up and Transportation Committees are available. During the month of November, 300 garments from the Needlework Guild, together with twenty-four splendidly filled Thanksgiving baskets, through the generosity and kindness of the pupils of Miss Fulmer's School, were distributed among Rest Cottage families and guests. At Christmas time, 125 families were remembered with clothing, Christmas cards and candy.

The Executive Committee of Rest Cottage Association wishes to acknowledge the receipt of \$1150.00 from the Benefit Card Parties. Gifts to the Cottage steadily increase as the work becomes more widely known and understood.

Thirteen business meetings held during the year, had uppermost the thought and plan for the new Rest Cottage, for which \$6000.00 is now available.

The work is unique, and as such has received commendation from all those who have sent us guests. This has been gratifying to those whose desire has been to establish a Foundation where enduring bonds of friendship and understanding may tend toward mutual benefit.

Resolutions

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage; and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is unnecessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Philanthropy of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors thereof.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of

The Ebell of Los Angeles

Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from sustaining, associate and life members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage-----

-----dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:-----"

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "and I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the moneys derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

Ebell Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

ARTICLE I

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

Duties of the Executive Committee

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 3. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the association.

ARTICLE IV

Duties of Officers

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 2. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 3. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell.

ARTICLE V

Members

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

SEC. 2. Members shall be known as sustaining and associate members.

SEC. 3. Any person paying one hundred dollars may be made a life member of the association.

ARTICLE VI

Dues

SECTION 1. The annual dues for sustaining members shall be one dollar per month.

SEC. 2. The annual dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year.

SEC. 3. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a life member of the association.

ARTICLE VII

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Thursday of each month from ten to eleven A.M.

SEC. 2. The Annual business meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in June at ten o'clock.

SEC. 3. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary, due notice of such meetings to be given by the secretary.

SEC. 4. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month, at ten A.M.

ARTICLE VIII

Elections

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election when there is but one candidate for an office, the election may by unanimous consent, be by *viva voce* vote.

SEC. 3. At the regular meeting in May, a nominating committee shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeting.

Sec. 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer to serve one year, and a Director to serve for three years shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX

SECTION 1. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the association.

SEC. 2. The By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SEC. 3. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell.

Report of Practical Relief Committee

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The Practical Relief Department has met one day of each week during the Club Year, with an average of twenty efficient workers; but even so it has not been able to meet the constant demands made upon it by the giving of this one day alone, so its devoted members have carried home and finished there, numberless garments to fill some emergency call.

The institutions and families receiving aid from Ebell through this department are usually those which have been suggested to it by some wise and experienced club woman or some physician. The County Hospital, Barlow Sanatorium, Rest Cottage and Johnson Apartments stand at the head of institutions according to the number of garments received, though ten others have asked and received very material assistance. Twenty-two families, ranging in size from two to seven, and usually contending with illness, and eleven College and High School girls have been helped through a crisis.

The standard of work has been high, and the hope has been strong that the example of workmanship thus sent broadcast of "nice" things, well made, might result in increasing the desire for perfection in several ways. Our millinery, rug and bedding sections deserve special attention, —and receive it.

The financial end of this department has been amply provided for by funds derived from the Benefits for Social Service work, and further increased by individual donations. Our Department members deeply appreciate the never-failing interest and sympathy of the officers of Ebell and are most grateful to the members for the large amount of cast-off garments they have sent to the Club House in such excellent condition. It is under obligations for many

favours, to many people, and especially so to the Sassy Jane Manufacturing Company, for some hundreds of yards of beautiful gingham sold us for much less than nominal cost.

The Department has made, mended, knitted and distributed more than 1400 garments since November 1, 1920, and it has received much more than it gave, though not in dollars and cents.

Report of Library Committee

The Ebells Library Committee reports 1100 volumes July 1, 1921—an increase of 669 since the library was re-opened, October 1, 1919.

In addition to the best of modern fiction, there also will be found upon the shelves, the older as well as the newer books in essays, biography (including autobiographies, memoirs, letters, etc.), philosophy and social science; a few books of scientific value and many upon art and travel, all arranged in plainly marked cases.

The section devoted to the drama is especially representative of the modern tendencies; while the cases given over to Shakespeare and commentaries, to Browning and to Emerson, will command the interest of those working along these lines. A comparatively small number of French and Spanish books have added interest to students of these tongues, while the English Department has been provided with the periodical, "Correct English," and maps as occasion arose.

The new voices in poetry find their proportionate representation, among the older ones upon our shelves.

Our Club Library will be that which the interest and co-operation of the members make it. Let all give it that consideration which shall help it to function, an appreciated, valuable adjunct of our club.

Articles of Incorporation

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Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

**Second*—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

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ARTICLE I

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

Powers and Duties of Directors

SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SEC. 5. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a Standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization.

ARTICLE VI
Duties of Officers

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the President-elect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee. The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curator-elect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship fund of The Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship Funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 9. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt.

SEC. 10. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the Time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII
Standing Committees

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Committee on Membership;
2. Committee on Printing;
3. Committee on Programs;
4. Committee on Departments;
5. House Committee.

SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.

SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.

SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.

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SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.

SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII

Members

SECTION 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting, when the applicant shall be voted upon by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board and, if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

An application for membership in the Junior Auxiliary of The Ebell shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Any member of the Junior Auxiliary may become a regular member of The Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the admission fee, provided such application is made within one year after membership in the Junior Auxiliary has lapsed.

No member of the club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for membership in the Junior Auxiliary, during one year.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card of a current year from a Federated Club may use that card as an endorsement.

SEC. 2. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election to membership.

SEC. 3. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SEC. 4. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the admission fee and one-half the annual dues.

SEC. 5. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.

SEC. 6. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of three dollars (\$3.00) per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

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SEC. 7. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 8. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

SEC. 9. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 10. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX

Dues

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$15.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

SEC. 3. Members of the Club who are employees, and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted. They shall receive one-half the guest cards allowed regular members.

SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted.

SEC. 5. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, pay one-half the yearly dues from date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

SEC. 6. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 2. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred

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dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.

SEC. 7. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

ARTICLE X

Meetings

SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p.m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.

SEC. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI

Elections

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by *viva voce* vote.

Nominations

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

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"We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES, propose the name of as a nominee for the office of in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES for the term from July 1, 19...., to July 1, 19....; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office."

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. of the date set; three members of the election board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June, provided, however, that the President-elect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XII

SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV

SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted shall, when approved by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1921. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

By-Laws of the Junior Auxiliary of the Ebell of Los Angeles

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ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY OF THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the community, and participation in social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

Membership

SECTION 1. Membership in the Auxiliary is open to the daughters of Club members and their friends between the ages of 18 and 25 years for a period of two years.

The Ebell of Los Angeles

SEC. 2. Applications for membership shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

SEC. 3. Any member of the Junior Auxiliary may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee; provided such application is made within one year after membership in the Junior Auxiliary has lapsed.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

SECTION 1. The officers of this Auxiliary shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer.

SEC. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the annual meeting of the Auxiliary.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an advisory committee of three Ebell members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of the Auxiliary, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

ARTICLE V

Dues

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be ten dollars (\$10), which amount shall be deducted from the regular entrance fee when the applicant becomes a member of Ebell.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be five dollars (\$5), payable in advance; one-half the first Monday of October, and one-half the first Monday of March.

SEC. 3. Neither the Auxiliary nor any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on Ebell, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI

Meetings

SECTION 1. The Auxiliary shall meet on the second Wednesday and fourth Friday. The annual meeting shall be on the first Wednesday of June.

SEC. 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Auxiliary members.

SEC. 3. Members of the Auxiliary shall have the privilege of nine regular Monday meetings during the year.

ARTICLE VII

Amendments

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Executive Committee by a majority vote. Notice of such amendment shall be given at the previous meeting.

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
