## REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

## 1944-1945

This has been a year of special significance for Ebell and for the world. At this historic moment, even while the war continues in the Pacific, we look with hope to the United Nations Conference in San Francisco to solve some of the complexities of the peace.

Within our own Ebell, despite the demands of war activities, we are ending a Golden Jubilee Year, long to be remembered.

Excerpts from reports previously given by officers of the Board of Directors will supply proof for this statement.

The Monday programs have had an attendance of 29,387, of which 2,964 were guests.

Attendance at Ebell's sixteen departments has increased by more than 3,000.

The Year Book, commemorating the Club's Fiftieth Anniversary, is especially appreciated by the membership.

Although the registration fee for joining the Club was resumed May 15, 1944, we have added 114 members during the year, 19 of hom are Juniors. Our total membership at the end of this fiscal year is 2,168.

The Treasurer's report carried as its highlight the payment of \$50,000 on the mortgage during the Golden Jubilee year, leaving \$188,500 balance unpaid. Special Fiftieth Anniversary contributions and gifts amounted to approximately \$8,300, rentals from the Figueroa and Clubhouse properties were \$28,856.46 while \$3,000 was raised by the former officers of Ebell; \$800 from Solarium Teas, and \$336.40 from the June Benefit by the Hospitality Committee.

We regard the serving of more than 64,000 persons by the House Chairman and staff a noteworthy achievement, during this

year of food problems.

The war activities of Ebell are commended by the Club and by the community. These include knitting, Red Cross production, all forms of work in the United Service Organization, and Bond and Stamp sales. Ebell is credited with the sale of \$135,928.50 in Bonds and Stamps.

Red Cross, War Chest, Chaplain's Service, and other civic organizations have been granted the club's facilities for their meetings. All of these are Ebell's contribution to the great National War effort.

The Needlework Guild has an active chapter in the club, raising \$430.80 during the current year.

The Scholarship Chairman reported that twenty-five scholarships, twenty academic and five nursing, have been maintained through the year. The care exercised in the selection of these students is proved by the following record: three have been awarded Phi Beta Kappa honors; three Phi Kappa Phi; and one President of Mortar Board.

Ebell Rest Cottage Association numbers 463 members. More than 100 women have been guests in Rest Cottage at 135 North Park View during the year. Ebell takes great pride in the altruistic work done by the officers and the members of this Association in aiding and encouraging women who are in need of this service.

At the annual Palm Sunday Vesper Concert, the Ebell Chorus presented the impressive Cantata, My Beloved Son, composed by Mr. Robert Flack.

The Art Salon continues to provide interesting programs and exhibits.

We are justly proud of our Juniors. They have not only increased their active membership and maintained their high standard of programs and participation in war activities, but they have also contributed \$250 to the Club mortgage fund and \$585 to the Scholarship Fund.

It is with a feeling of sincere pride and appreciation that the President reviews the year's achievements made possible by the loyal support and co-operation of the Board of Directors and the entire Club membership. Your encouragement and friendliness have made the year a treasured experience in my life. May the new year be as joyous and successful.

## REPORT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP CHAIRMAN

The awarding of Ebell's twenty-five Scholarships is a pleasant task, because it is gratifying to encourage worthy, ambitious students to continue their education and to hold before them the ideal of high scholastic standards. To achieve this end, the rules are flexible and the Scholarship Committee concentrates on the best service to each individual student. We do not consider that our work is complete when we have made an award to a deserving boy or girl. It begins by encouraging them to earn the award and continues when that goal is attained to give them an incentive to forge ahead to greater achievements.

The number of awards is limited because the Committee must operate on a budget derived from the investments of the principal of the Scholarship Endowment funds, plus cash donations, and an amount given by the general fund of Ebell. This year we carried twenty-five students. Twenty were academic and five were nursing. The academic were ten at the University of California at Los Angeles, six at the University of Southern California, three at Occidental, and one at Los Angeles City College. The five nursing are: one student nurse at St. Vincent's, two student nurses at California Lutheran, and one pre-nursing each at University of California at Los Angeles and Los Angeles City College. All are girls, because no awards can be made to boys on account of the draft.

The Scholarship is a gift, and with the present accelerated program of education, the award is \$160 for the eight-month school year. There are now three semesters in a twelve-month period, and a student may complete the old four-year plan in two and one-half full years; thus the budget is being drawn upon continuously every month of the year.

Today we recognize that there is not only an increased economic opportunity, but also that there are requirements for intelligent, responsible, and upright leadership in the postwar era. The wide variety of subjects in which our Ebell students are majoring shows that college-trained women are preparing themselves for an active part that will contribute toward a world that we hope will perhaps be a little better than it has been before.

Our students are achieving honors in both scholarships and activities. Three have been elected to Phi Beta Kappa, three to Phi Kappa Phi, and among others are Beta Gamma Sigma, Mu Phi Epsilon, Sigma Alpha Iota, Prytananean, Spooks and Spokes, and one is President of Mortar Board.

Occasionally Ebell members, bearing in mind the worthiness of a scholarship, give us a cash donation which is gratefully received. Among those contributing are the Ebell Juniors, who gave us \$585 to be applied on nursing scholarships. In acknowledging these generous gifts, the Scholarship Committee members share with the donors the satisfaction of participating in this interesting part of Ebell's work. We sincerely appreciate the generosity of Ebell members for such a worth-while program.

## REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Chairman of Public Relations has represented The Ebell of Los Angeles throughout the past year at monthly meetings of the Women's Tax Study Group, the Consumers' Research Committee of the Better Business Bureau, the Los Angeles Co-ordinating Council, and the Women's Division of the Chamber of Commerce. She has been a member of the Women's Committee of the War Chest and of the committee organized locally to carry to completion the United Nations Clothing Drive. She has gone to various meetings at the request of the President, and has had the privilege of representing Ebell on other occasions.

There have been meetings arranged in the Ebell theater for the annual meeting of the Los Angeles Chapter of American Red Cross, two meetings of the Chaplains' Service Corps, two meetings of the War Chest, one meeting in the Fine Arts Room of War Chest Colonels, also a meeting of the Women's Committee of the War Chest in the dining room. There has been no rental charged, the Club feeling this was a way to be of service to the community.

The United Nations Clothing Drive used one room as a depot for used clothing and more than one thousand pounds of good clothes were sent from this room.

As Chairman of War Activities, your Public Relations Chairman has headed a committee of nineteen branches contributing to

winning the war.

We have sold War Bonds and Stamps every Monday in the Club and at a downtown booth each Tuesday Our members have been instrumental in selling \$135,928.50 worth of these Bonds and Stamps, and the Club is to have a Hospital Service plane named in its honor. More than 850 hours have been given to this project. Through the thoughtful generosity of a friend of Ebell, one firm allocated its purchase of \$1,000,000 worth of bonds to our credit.

Ebell members have accounted for 10,000 hours spent in making surgical dressings in a Red Cross room provided by a downtown

firm.

The production unit of Red Cross has a total of 15,584 hours given to sewing in the Solarium, where many garments have been made. There was average attendance of 56 weekly.

The Knitting Chairman reports 27,000 hours turned in by various women who have knitted garments whenever yarn was available.

Thirteen thousand, nine hundred ninety-two hours have been recorded by our members as they worked in USO centers in the capacity of hostesses and canteen workers. We have monthly canteen days in the Pershing Square USO, the Main Street USO. and Union Station USO. The entire third week of each month finds Ebell women serving canteen in the Service Women's Lounge. One day each week our members act as hostesses in in Pershing Square USO and in the Main Street USO. The men appreciate such women to counsel with and to cheer them on their way. The USO Nursery at Union Station has many Ebell members on its active workers' list. The USO Scrapbook project has been supported by the Club. One room has been given to it, and many members have made these interesting books to be sent to hospitalized service men and women. Home hospitality has been offered to numerous men in uniform by Ebell members. One member reports one hundred guests over week-ends or longer. An 'E' award was made to the Club in recognition of its contribution to the musical programs for armed forces, sponsored by the Government.

The United States Naval Hospital at Corona has received many bathrobes made by our members, as well as money at Christmas time. We have done a great deal of mending for this hospital also.

## REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF ART SALON

The Art Patrons have completed the Golden Jubilee year of the Club with some success and satisfaction. They have enjoyed an increased membership, the support of the Club and the cooperation of all committees and of the art clubs of this city. The pictures and sculpture have been of a high standard.

The first exhibit, in October, was by the Scandinavian-American Art Society of the West and Mr. Carl von Schneidau, the President, painted a portrait for the Art Salon tea program.

In November, the California Art Club exhibited in the Art Salon and at the Tea. Mr. Paul Lauritz lectured on "How to Study a Picture." This exhibit hung on through the first two weeks of December.

In January, the Club enjoyed a one-man exhibit by Mr. John Hubbard Rich, President of the California Art Club. This was a most interesting exhibit, not only because of its excellence but because it also showed the growth of an artist. This pleasure was further enhanced by Mr. Rich's modest discussion at the monthly tea, on the work of an artist. Mr. Rich also did a portrait in charcoal from memory.

February brought us a very delightful exhibit by the Pasadena Art Institute. Mr. Jarvis Barlow, Director of the Institute, spoke on the function and development of an art gallery, at the Art Salon Tea.

In March, the Society for "Sanity in Art" exhibited in the clubhouse, and at the tea Mr. Joe Duncan Gleason, well known for his paintings of ships, spoke on ships and his assignment by the Government to the Coast Guard. He also showed us his very intricate chart of perspectives which he used in the painting of a ship.

In April, the Club enjoyed the work of the Women Painters of the West, and at the monthly tea Mrs. Eugenie Grant, who is well known for her beautiful pastels, "did" a pastel for the program while Miss Catherine Jackson played softly on her harp.

In May came the eighteenth Annual Art Exhibit, to which many of the most outstanding artists and sculptors of Los Angeles were invited to send their work. This exhibit consisted of twenty-four large oils, eighteen water colors, and smaller oils and five pieces of sculpture.

On Wednesday, May 23, a reception was given in the lounge for the exhibiting artists at which time prizes were awarded. The jury of awards consisted of Mr. Orrin White, Mr. Clyde Scott and Mr. Leland Curtiss, three of last year's prize winners.

The prizes were war bonds and certificates of award and were given as follows:

The first in oils to Mr. Burt Proctor for his Gray Horizon; the second in oils to Mr. John Hubbard Rich for his Portrait of a News Boy Extra; the first in water colors to Miss Loren Barton for Taking a Bow; the second in water colors to Miss Irene B. Robinson for her Spring Bouquet; first in sculpture to Mr. Edgardo Simone for his bust of Mr. Theodore Dreiser; and second in sculpture, to Mr. Merrill Gage for his beautiful Madonna.

## REPORT OF THE GENERAL CURATOR

The Departments of Ebell are the very heart and soul of the Club and can rightfully be called "The University of Ebell." Our Department Curators have endeavored to provide programs of education, entertainment and relaxation during these days of unparalleled strain and stress. Keeping in mind the motto of our Club-"I serve"-and that of its founder, Dr. Adrian Ebell-"I will find a way or make one"—they have accomplished their purpose.

We have had sixteen active Departments during the year. The Garden Department, after a period of inactivity, was re-organized. The success of a department cannot be measured by the number of persons who attend its sessions. The large department contributes inspiration through lecturers and guest artists: the smaller department has three decided advantages: opportunity for close friendships; development of individual responsibility; and service.

There have been 150 department meetings during the year, including the weekly sessions of the language departments. There was a total attendance of 23,708, as compared with a total of 20,647 last year. Nine departments exceeded their 1943-1944 attendance. The curators planned and conducted the program for the President's Luncheon in April. Three conference meetings of department curators have been held.

The French Department contributed \$91.86 to the Mortgage Fund; the Poetry Department gave \$27.39 for the same purpose; the Garden Department provided \$8.00 for plants for the patio: and the money remaining in the budgets of the other departments was used to purchase a lectern for the Fine Arts Room. # REPORT OF THE EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

The exigencies of war have finally made themselves felt in the quiet precincts of Rest Cottage and interfered to an unprecedented degree with its usually placed course.

Early in October the Assistant Matron resigned to take a position at a higher wage than the War Labor Board allowed us to pay and it was impossible to interest anyone at the wage we were paying. From October to May, Mrs. Lush, the Matron, carried the burden of the household alone except for very occasional extra help.

Here war conditions stepped in to help, for while no applicant was turned away who was at all eligible to enter, there were fewer requests for entrance. Women had plenty of work at high wages; Social Security contributes to higher morale and there is less giving way to ailments unless they are unavoidable emergencies.

The duties of the Matron are not light at any time. Supplies must be purchased and carried home, as there are almost no deliveries. Three meals daily must be planned, cooked and served; the house made ready for new guests; the comfort and pleasure of the whole household always a matter of concern.

For over half a year Mrs. Lush has carried on single handed, with never a word of complaint; the Cottage has been kept clean, the meals have been well balanced, and the guests contented and happy as their grateful "Thank you" letters have attested.

It was with great pleasure, then, that the Board of Directors of the Cottage welcomed the day when much of the pressure was removed and we were able to pay our Matron a more adequate salary and provide her with adequate help. The means to that end is a story in itself, involving much filling out of forms, hopeful if interminable waiting and finally release.

Mrs. Holt, our able House Chairman, was very fortunate in securing a deep freezer for about one third of its original cost. Now supplies that are perishable can be purchased when available and kept until they are needed.

Mrs. Van Sant, the Garden Chairman, had a sprinkling system installed in the front lawn which removed some of the burden from Mrs. Lush's shoulders when we had no gardener. That time, too, has passed and we have an elderly man who is quite efficient.

Mrs. Edwin G. Howard, the Assistant Chairman, reports nearly 10,000 meals served at an average cost of 24 cents per meal, an increase of 3 cents a meal over last year.

Charlotte M. Brown, M.D., and J. Margaret Roberts, M.D., have investigated 160 cases, one third of which were rejected. No guest enters the Cottage without their approval.

We continue extending the time of the guests' stay in the Cottage. They are so often hurried out of the hospitals to make room for more urgent cases, so their period of convalescence with us is necessarily lengthened.

Many of our guests this year have been elderly women still forced to earn their living and sometimes wringing our hearts with their patience and their gratitude for this small glimpse of a world less complicated than theirs.

The Membership Chairman, Mrs. Joseph Alexander Hartley, reports 463 Ebell women have become members of the Rest Cottage Association; four life members: Mrs. William Brill, Mrs. Frank Good, Mrs. John Pierce Herrick and Mrs. Paul G. Stevens; and one memorial given by Mrs. Harry W. McQuaid for her mother, Mrs. R. E. Whitson.

Twice during the year members are invited to visit Rest Cottage: in October, a luncheon and in April, a Tea. In June we held a garden party in Mrs. Lyman Farwell's garden. This year brought a rare June day, and 80 guests came to enjoy Mrs. Farwell's hospitality, her garden, the day, the luncheon, and one another.

Mrs. M. Erle Leaf and her committee have had charge of three social events.

At Christmas time, as usual, Rest Cottage invited former guests to a Christmas dinner in the Club dining room. The Secretary, Mrs. Robert C. McAvoy, sent out 400 invitations and many of the women on the Rest Cottage Committees came to help Mrs. Leaf: Mrs. Harry Quine's committee for service, Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher's special occasion hostesses, the President, Mrs. Kirby, the Ebell Board of Directors, and the Rest Cottage Board all lending their presence and interest to make it a festive occasion for our guests. One hundred twenty former guests and 71 Ebell members, who were eligible, came to enjoy a special Christmas dinner and program of music and readings.

The report of the Treasurer, Mrs. Edgar Allan Doran, follows this one.

Some changes have been made in our portfolio. Bonds have been called, stocks sold, and re-investments made under the supervision of Mrs. James Andrews Rogers, Chairman of Finance, and the direction of the three investment advisors.

This is the last of the many reports it has been my pleasure and privilege to make to you. With mingled reluctance and relief I turn over to the new Chairman the work which has been one of

the most satisfying labors of a lifetime—reluctance to leave the inner circles of efficient women without whose care Rest Cottage would not be able to function, and yet with relief that new thought and new plans will be injected into this work, which sometimes I have felt was going stale under mine.

The best wish I can give to my successor is that you accord her the loving support you have given me.

## RESOLUTIONS

## Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

The Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of the Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

# Form of Bequest or Devise FOR BENEFIT OF EBELL REST COTTAGE

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

# SECTION 41 OF THE PROBATE CODE

# Restrictions

No estate, real or personal, may be bequeathed or devised to any charitable or benevolent society or corporation, or to any person or persons in trust for charitable uses, by a testator who leaves a spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor surviving him who, under the will, or the laws of succession would otherwise have taken the property so bequeathed or devised unless the will was duly executed at least thirty days before the death of the testator. If so executed at least thirty days before death, such devises and legacies shall be valid, but they may not collectively exceed one-third of the testator's estate as against his spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancestor, who would otherwise, as aforesaid, have taken the excess over one-third, and if they do a pro rata deduction from such devises and legacies shall be made so as to reduce the aggreggate thereof to one-third of the estate. All property bequeathed or devised contrary to the provisions of this section shall go to the spouse, brother, sister, nephew, niece, descendant or ancester of the testator, if and to the extent that they would have taken said property as aforesaid but for such devises or legacies; otherwise the testator's estate shall go in accordance with his will and such devises and legacies shall be unaffected.

# BY-LAWS OF EBELL REST COTTAGE ASSOCIATION

# ARTICLE I

# OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

# ARTICLE II

# **OFFICERS**

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. The three directors who are elected from Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be chairmen, respectively, of Finance, House and Garden.

Section 2. The past Chairmen of thee Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

# ARTICLE III

# DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Executive Committe eshall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except those members otherwise provided for, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

Section 3. The Chairman of Finance shall head a committee composed of the President, Chairman of Finance and the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles, and the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association. This Finance Committee shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Association. The Chairman of Finance and the Chairman of Rest Cottage shall be assisted by an advisory committee of three investment counselors who shall advise as to the investment of all Endowment Funds, together with such other moneys as may be available for investment. The Finance Chairman shall bring to the Finance and Executive Committees meeting together the recommendations of these advisors for approval. Upon approval by a majority of said committees of a recommended investment the Chairman of Finance shall be empowered to make such transactions. The Chairman of Finance shall verify the monthly financial reports of the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Section 4. The House Chairman shall have charge of all replacements and repairs at Ebell Rest Cottage, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The Garden Chairman shall have supervision of the planting and upkeep of the garden, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

# ARTICLE IV

# DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all standing committees. She shall appoint all special committees and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall approve

all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Section 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

Section 4. The Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall receive from the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles all moneys due and contributed to the Association, together with a statement showing the accounts for which such moneys have been contributed and shall give a receipt for same. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and she shall be bonded as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

# ARTICLE V

# STANDING COMMITTEE

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Finance
- 2. Membership
- 3. Investigation
- 4. Service
- 5. Follow-up
- Program
- 7. Hospitality
- 8. Field Survey

# ARTICLE VI MEMBERS

Section 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

Section 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life.

# ARTICLE VII

#### DUES

Section 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar peryear, payable in October.

Section 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

Section 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars

or more per year.

Section 4. A payment of One-Hundred Dollars may be made by any person for a life membership or a memorial gift.

# ARTICLE VIII

# **MEETINGS**

Section 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall he held on the first Friday of each month, except the month of August, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the months of August and September, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Monday in June, unless otherwise ordered.

Section 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

Section 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

# ARTICLE IX

# **ELECTIONS**

Section 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Section 2. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Section 3. The members of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President, Treasurer and Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be divided into two groups of three members each. Group Number One shall consist of two directors and the Treasurer to be elected at the annual elections in even-numbered years for a term of two years. Group Number Two shall consist of one director, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary to be elected at the annual elections in the odd-numbered years for a term of two years. At any election a member may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 4. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva-voce vote.

# ARTICLE X

# AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of such proposed amndment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

Section 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

# REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

Because of popular demand, Ebell Juniors had not less than three regular monthly functions for twelve consecutive months beginning in July 1944 and ending in June 1945. For seven months we had five monthly functions. Due to the wartime restrictions, our members felt a greater need for Ebell activities and this need was satisfied because of our increased number of meetings.

Officially, our club year began on Tuesday, October 10, 1944, with our first monthly luncheon meeting. We have had seven of these business and program meetings. The luncheons which were held in the Solarium were planned by the Luncheon Chairman. Mrs. Gerald Stone. The decorations were arranged at little expense by Miss Winifred Jones. The programs, under the direction of the Program Chairman, Mrs. Grant Cooper, were: October: a War Department film, To the Ladies, presented by Mrs. Clifford A. Wright, Captain Eugene Wallace of the Army Air Forces, and Lieutenant Mary Eileen Ryan, Civilian Liaison Officer for the Women's Army Corps. November: Judge May Lahey, Past Presiding Judge of the Municipal Court of Los Angeles. January: Mrs. Charles Zimmerman showed her colored motion pictures of The Southwest and Mexico. February: Miss Patricia Winters, singer; Mrs. Louis K. Sims, founder and head of the Chaplains' Service Corps, and Mrs. Lyman Henry Johnson of the Red Cross. March: Miss Martha Logan, Home Economist for Swift & Co., and Mr. James Quick, executive assistant at North American, Inc. April: Mr. Jerry Geisler, nationally famous authority on criminal law. May: U. C. L. A's Panel of Americans, and Mrs. Sherman Beardsley, charm expert. June: Installation Luncheon was held in the Art Salon, the ceremony being followed by bridge.

Total membership for 1944-45, 98 members. The Membership Chairman, Mrs. Arthur Lundin, welcomed into the group 18 new members.

Our two main philanthropic projects for the year were helping the Ebell Scholarship Fund and the USO Canteen at the Union Station. We gave \$250 for Nursing Scholarships to Ebell and each month gave on an average \$18 to the Canteen. This June we gave an additional \$335 to the General Scholarship Fund of Ebell. In the summer we gave a \$25 Campership to the Girl Scouts. We gave also \$250 to the Ebell mortgage fund.

Each month, under the guidance of our Philanthropy Chairman, Mrs. Richard Gunter, five members served on the fourth Friday at the USO Canteen at the Union Station. Each member serving donated six dozen sandwiches. Our treasury provided the rest

of the sandwiches, doughnuts, milk and coffee. An average of 5000 boys were served by us each month.

In order to raise money for our charities, we gave two major benefits. In the fall, we sold blankets. The Chairman was Mrs. Russell Trevillian. From this sale we netted \$460.90. In April, we had a bridge luncheon in the dining room and the Art Salon. Mrs. Helmuth Hannemann was Chairman and we netted \$381.84.

We had twelve Pot-Luck Suppers held at the home of various members. Mrs. Downie Muir III was Chairman, and to these suppers we invited our husbands. Each member contributed towards the food, besides purchasing a ticket. We netted \$370.

We had also twelve dessert-bridge benefits, held at members' homes, under the supervision of the Chairman, Mrs. Richard Moores. These netted \$127.84. The receipts for all of the benefits totaled \$1,340.58.

Book Chamber met at members' homes with programs following dessert In the fall Mrs. Roy M. Davenport was Chairman. In the spring Mrs. Bertram C. Coffey, Jr., was the Chairman. She presented musical programs with the reviews of books by our own members.

Miss Patricia Van Norden, Chairman of the War Chest, formed a Motor Corps of Ebell Juniors. Members served throughout the month of October.

We formed a new committee this year. It is the House Committee and the Chairman was Mrs. Allan L. Leonard, Jr. This committee arranged for the houses and the co-hostesses for each book chamber, bridge benefit and pot-luck supper.

Our Publicity Chairman, Mrs. Duane F. Sparks, was able to get four pictures of Juniors and six articles in the Los Angeles Times.

"Ye Belles," Ebell Juniors' own monthly publication, was edited by Mrs. Colin B. McMullen.

Each member was invited to each function by the Telephone Committee. The Chairman was Mrs. Thomas B. Oakley, Jr.

The Children's Party was again held in Griffith Park. Mrs. William Hudson McGee planned the party.

During this year, we have had to make changes not only in policies but also in personnel, due to wartime conditions. Mrs. Paul D. Dodds, Mrs. Ernest Alvin Coons and Mrs. Paul Hallingby were the members of our Advisory Committee.

It has been a rare privilege to be your President and because of your loyalty and dependability a lasting pleasure.

# BY-LAWS OF THE EBELL JUNIORS

# ARTICLE I

# NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

# ARTICLE II

# **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

# ARTICLE III

# **OFFICERS**

Section 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

Section 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE IV

# DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

- Section 2. The First Vice-President shall furnish for the Ebell Bulletin all copy concerning Junior activities. She shall assist the President as the President may desire.
- Section 3. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.
- Section 4. The Third Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.
- Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.
- Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Juniors not otherwise provided for and shall issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee.
- Section 7. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Executive Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor, and she shall sign all vouchers for expenditures. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

# ARTICLE V

# STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
- 2. Courtesy and Membership
- 3. Credentials
- 4. Program
- 5. Social Welfare and Scholarship
- Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.
- Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.
- Section 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.
- Section 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.
- Section 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Chairman of Ebell Scholarships, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors. The chairman of this Committee shall exofficio be a member of the Scholarship Committee of the Club.
- Section 6. Chairman of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Evecutive Committee.

- Section 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.
- Section 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to th Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.
- Section 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

# ARTICLE VI

# **MEMBERS**

- Section 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty-five years.
- Section 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation, and if favorably acted upon by the Board of Governors, shall then follow the procedure for regular club membership.
- Section 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of memberhsip.
- Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

# ARTICLE VII

#### DUES

- Section 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.
- Section 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues are payable. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall constitute forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before June 30, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 3. The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club. Section 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees, but shall have all other rights and privileges, including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written appilcation each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall received a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

#### ARTICLE VIII

# **MEETINGS**

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of the month, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December, except when otherwise ordered by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

Section 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending all regular Monday meetings during each year.

# ARTICLE IX

# ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

# Nominations

Section 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting proceeding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

Section 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall then be called for. Names of all nominees shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin.

# Election

Section 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alphabetical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Executive Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Adviser on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

Section 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first, provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together during the months of May and June for the appointment of standing committees.

# ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

# Articles of Incorporation

Know All Men By These Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

\*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted, is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A.D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

# **BY-LAWS**

# ARTICLE I

# NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

# ARTICLE II

# OBJECT

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

# ARTICLE III

# **OFFICERS**

The Officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Roard of Directors.

# ARTICLE IV

# POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings, and equipment.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect. from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

Section 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any person serving more than one-half of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

Section 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

Section 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

#### ARTICLE V

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees, including the Presentation Committee, and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers, but in her absence or disability, the First Vice-President shall sign such checks, contracts, and other legal papers. The President shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of May following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

Section 2. The First Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may

desire. In the absence or disability of the President, she shall sign all checks, contracts, and other legal papers.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee and managing editor of the Ebell Bulletin.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Executive Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Executive Secretary an itemized statement of all moneys paid to her, designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall direct the Executive Secretary to deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors, and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall present a statement at all regular meetings of the Board of Directors and a semi-annual report to the Club. She shall give a bond to the Club for the faithful performance of her duties in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

Section 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

In the month of May following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

Section 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club, and unless otherwise provided for in

these By-Laws, over all committees of the Club having power to receive and disburse moneys. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

Section 8. The Chairman of Hospitality shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees.

Section 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations, and report to the Board of Directors from time to time the activities of such organizations.

Section 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval. She shall have supervision over all theater employees.

Section 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The EBELL OF LOS ANGELES and a semi-annual report to the Club.

Section 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. An Executive Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall give a bond similar to that of the Treasurer, for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall issue duplicate receipts for all moneys paid to the Club, and received by her, and deposit all such funds in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall give to the Treasurer an itemized statement of all funds received, designating the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall assist the Board of Directors in all matters pertaining to the business of the Club. The Executive Secretary shall be the custodian of the seal, the books, and the records of the Club, and shall keep an inventory of all property of the Club and deliver the same to her successor, requiring a receipt therefor.

# ARTICLE VI

# STANDING COMMITTEES

- Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be:
  - 1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents
  - 2. Former Officers' Round Table
  - 3. Departments
  - 4. Finance
  - 5. Hospitality
  - 6. House
  - 7. Membership
  - 8. Printing
  - 9. Program
  - 10. Public Relations
  - 11. Rentals
  - 12. Rest Cottage
  - 13. Scholarship
  - 14. Such other committees as the Board of Directors deems necessary.
- Section 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.
- Section 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.
- Section 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.
- Section 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals. It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any other matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills,

claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Hospitality Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.

Section 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and sshall supervise the building and its contents.

Section 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.

Section 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Bulletin and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.

Section 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering. It shall keep in touch with and report the activities of all organizations in which Ebell holds membership and assists financially.

Section 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

Section 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

Section 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

Section 15. Chairman of committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Executive Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

# ARTICLE VII

# **MEMBERS**

Section 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Bulletin and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than five applications for regular membership, five for temporary membership, and five for Junior membership during each year.

Section 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

- Section 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.
- Section 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management. Regular members include those members specified in Sections 4 and 5 of Article VIII.
- Section 5. Any member may apply for life membership who has continued in good and regular standing for five consecutive years next preceding the filing of the application for life membership. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application for regular membership in Article VII, Section 1. If the application is granted, the applicant shall pay the sum of \$500.00 provided she is under fifty (50) years of age, otherwise \$300.00. She shall receive a certificate of life membership and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.
- Section 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership without payment of dues.
- Section 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.
- Section 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.
- Section 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a nonmember for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.
- Section 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, between the ages of eighteen (18) and thirty-five (35), are entitled to be special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend all Monday programs each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approvial of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees unless she has been a Junior member for three years, in which case she may become a regular member of Ebell without further registration fee.

Section 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, became a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed in any subsequent year, provided the applicant is still a temporary resident. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

Section 12. Any member may resign at any time. Such resignation must be in writing and be accompanied by the payment of all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one-half of the regular admission fee, or one-half of the dues accrued during the time of nonmembership.

Section 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE VIII

# DUES

Section 1. The registration fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). The payment of this fee may be suspended for a stated time at any regular meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote, provided due notice of the proposed suspension has been given.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues are payable. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first, and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Nonpayment of dues for one year shall constitute forfeiture of membership.

The Board of Directors by a unanimous vote may remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

Section 3. In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year, that unless such dues are paid on or before June 30, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

Section 4. A regular member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a nonresident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 5. A regular member of the Club whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees but shall have all other rights and privileges including the right to vote.

Section 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### MEETINGS

Section 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June, inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All businesss to be transacted must be specified in the call.

Section 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no

further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meetings and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

#### ARTICLE X

# ELECTIONS

Section 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two years and shall be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. In order to be eligible for election to an office on the Board of Directors a member must have been in good standing for at least three years immediately preceding election. No member shall be eligible to the office of President who has not served on the Board of Directors for at least two years.

\*The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Chairman of Rentals, Treasurer, General Curator, and Chairman of Hospitality. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Chairman of Finance, Recording Secretary, Chairman of Public Relations, Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

Section 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in May and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in May, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent. be by viva-voce vote.

# Nominations

Section 3. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members, who shall have been active members of the Club for five years. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

<sup>\*</sup>Note: (That this grouping may be established, the following changes are made if the above amendments are adopted: At the election in 1946 the Recording Secretary will be elected for one year. At the election in 1947 the Chairman of Rentals will be elected for one year.)

Section 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in January for the purpose of electing a chairman and a secretary. Meetings thereafter shall be held at the discretion of the committee.

The Nominating Committee by a two-thirds vote of its members shall select one or more candidates, who shall consent to serve if elected, for each office to be filled at the annual election.

Section 5. Not later than March 1 of each year, the Nominating Committee shall cause to be mailed to each voting member of the Club a ballot in blank for each office to be filled at the ensuing election.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with the name of not more than one member for each office. This ballot so filled out shall be signed by the member as her name appears in the Year Book and must be returned to the Ebell office on or before March 21.

Section 6. On March 22, or immediately thereafter, the Nominating Committee shall meet, count the nominating ballots and prepare the ballot for the annual election. This ballot shall contain the names of the candidates presented by the Nominating Committee and the name of each candidate receiving fifty (50) or more votes for one office on the nominating ballot, or a combined vote of seventy-five (75) or more votes, the office in this case to be the one for which she received the largest vote. The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the election ballot.

Section 7. On the second Monday in April the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report, designating method of nomination, shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

#### Election

Section 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occurring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin.

Section 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the Election Board between April first and April fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

Section 11. A sample ballot stating hours of election, as set by the Board of Directors, shall be included in the May issue of the Ebell Bulletin. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Before casting her ballot, each member shall sign the register as her name appears in the Year Book. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in May the names of those candidates receiving a plurality vote. A full report of the number of votes cast for each candidate shall be filed in the office of the Club and shall be available to any member.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Executive Secretary, who shall destroy them after the installation of the new officers.

Section 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the second week in May for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year.

# ARTICLE XI

# CLUB ACTIVITIES

Section 1. This Club shall have six definite forms of activity: (1) General Monday Afternoon Programs; (2) Study Departments; (3) Ebell Rest Cottage Association; (4) Scholarships; (5) Ebell Juniors; (6) and Art Patrons.

Section 2. Each study department shall have a Curator who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. All curators are subject to the General Curator and must confer with her concerning all department work.

All members of departments must be members of The EBELL of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in April each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the officers of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club. No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

# ARTICLE XII

# CLUB POLICIES

Section 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

Section 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

Section 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

# ARTICLE XIII

# AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to be voted upon and the date of such voting. At the regular Monday meeting preceding the date of voting, the section or sections to be amended shall be read and the proposed amendment or amendments shall be read and explained.

Section 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

# ARTICLE XIV

# PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

# ARTICLE XV

# CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

# STANDING RULES

# ADMISSION

- 1. Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.
- 2. Regular members may bring three guests to all but special programs, by paying the stipulated fee including tax.
- 3. Junior members will receive six guest cards for departments of Ebell, one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.
- 4. Auditorium guest tickets are sold by the Guest Ticket Committee at the Lucerne Boulevard and Eighth Street entrances. Regular members will receive six guest cards for departments; one-half to be issued July first and one-half January first.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of May, 1945. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

- 5. No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.
- 6. Husbands of club members may be admitted to all department meetings on members' calling cards.
- 7. Husbands of club members may be admitted on members' calling cards to all except special Monday programs. These cards must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.
- 8. Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.
- 9. All courtesy admission cards for Monday afternoons must be exchanged at the box office and Federal tax paid.

# MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

- 1. Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.
- 2. New members notified of their election during January or June shall pay dues from January first and July first, respectively.
- 3. Applications for either non-resident or business rates should be presented before October first for the ensuing year or before March first for the last half of the year.
- 4. Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

# SOLICITATIONS

- 1. Canvassing for funds to provide gifts for curators, instructors or officers is definitely against the policy of the Club.
- No solicitation of signatures to petitions, memorials or similar documents shall be permitted in the clubhouse.
- 3. No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and the Board of Directors; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.
- 4. Members may not solicit gifts, commissions or favors from merchants or commercial concerns of any kind.
- 5. Members may not sell tickets for outside events in the club rooms.

# MISCELLANEOUS

- Curators, committee chairmen and others arranging for called meetings in the club shall notify the office, stating the time and place of meeting.
- Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

- 3. A member may not represent Ebell on any outside committee unless so appointed by the President or Board of Directors.
- 4. No refreshments are to be served at any time in the Lounge, except to the Reception Committee and for major benefits within a designated area.

# LUNCHEON AND DINNER TICKETS

- 1. Tickets will be sold for all meals.
- Reservations for all meals should be made two days in advance. If reservations are not cancelled, members making them will be responsible for payment.
- 3. An extra charge of ten cents will be made on luncheon tickets purchased after eleven o'clock that day.
- 4. Cancellations for luncheon reservations will not be accepted after ten o'clock of the day.
- 5. Cancellations for dinner reservations will not be accepted after twelve o'clock of the preceding day.
- 6. Reservations for Monday luncheons should be in on Friday.

# STANDING RULES GOVERNING THE ART SALON

The Art Exhibitions Committee of Ebell was organized in 1916. Its name was changed to The Art Salon in 1931. Its purpose (so recorded in the minutes of the Board of Directors) is to exhibit the work of professional artists of high standing in conservative art. All work accepted for exhibition must conform to that standard.

Before any art art object shall be exhibited in the Club, the exhibitor shall sign a written release waiving any claim against the Club on account of damage, theft, or other loss of art object. (Adopted by Board of Directors in 1939.)

A written order must be issued by the Art Chairman and presented at the club office before any art object may be removed.

All art objects must be removed from the clubhouse within thirty days after the exhibition.

Exhibitions of the work of outstanding painters, sculptors and miniature painters are held from October first through May in the Salon, water colors and prints in the Galeria.

The May exhibition is always competitive and prizes are given for the best work in each medium.

Competing artists may be invited by the Art Chairman or a general invitation may be sent out by the Chairman to all artists. In either case their work must pass a Jury of Selection and Awards appointed by the Chairman.

Dues shall be paid by the Art Patrons and shall be used by the Art Salon to pay for overhead expenses, for transportation of the exhibitions and for prizes additional to those given annually by interested

Art Patrons. A prize is also given for the popular-vote choice of the Ebell members. It is the consensus of opinion that these prizes shall be of sufficient value to make them a worth-while honor.

All money collected by the Art Salon shall be paid at once to the

Executive Secretary of Ebell and a receipt required therefor.

In June the Galeria is given over to the exhibition of the work of the artist members of Ebell, each member exhibiting not more than one in each medium.

The May exhibition in the Salon is usually held over, in whole or

in part, through the month of June.

It is customary for the Art Patrons to hold an evening reception during the month of October, honoring exhibiting artists, and an artists' dinner in May, when the prize winners are announced.

The Art Salon shall be under the direct control and supervision of

the President of Ebell.
