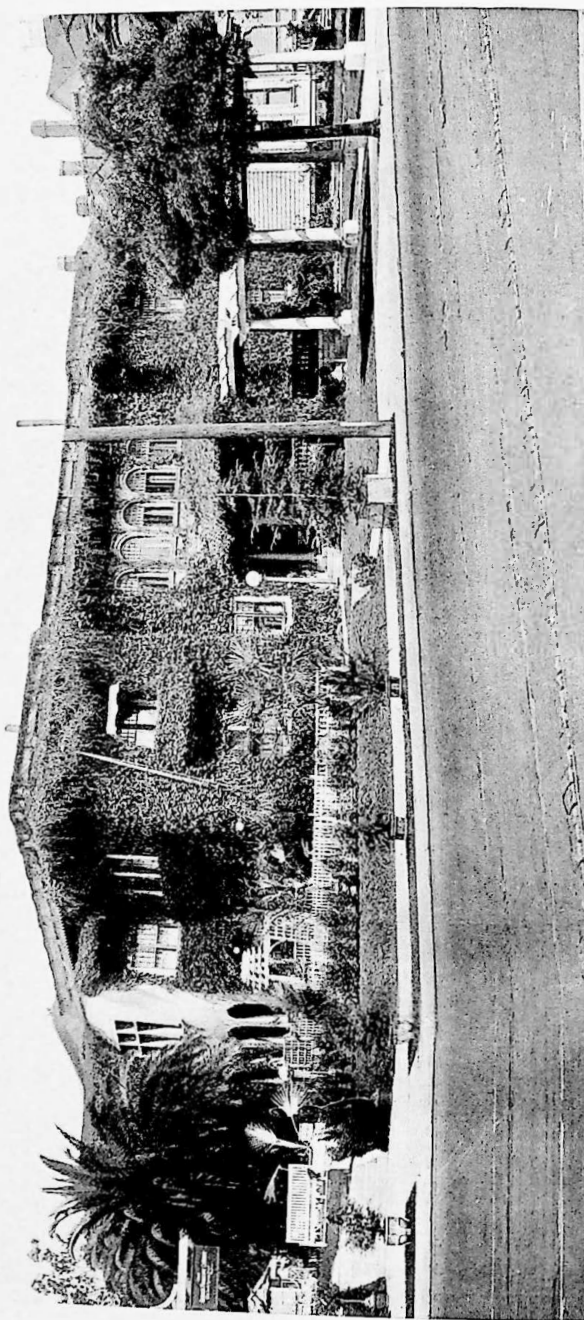

The Ebell of Los Angeles

The first issue of the Ebell Year Book, dated 1899-1900, sets forth the following facts as a part of its foreword: "While the name 'Ebell' is identified with women and their work, it was originally adopted to honor the memory of a man, Dr. Adrian Ebell, a scholar and traveler, who conceived the idea of establishing an international academy of science, art, music and languages for women, with chapters all over the world.

"The first chapter was formed in Oakland in 1886, and, in October, 1894, The Ebell of Los Angeles was called into being by a little company of women assembled for the purpose, in response to the personal invitation of their hostesses, two of the number being charter members of the Oakland chapter.

"The Society was organized with sixty-four charter members, the constitution being modeled after that of the Oakland Ebell. It consists of a central organization with a system of study departments."

The By-Laws recited that "The object of the society is advancement in all lines of general culture." "I serve," was chosen as the motto.

The Ebell of Los Angeles entered its second year with three study departments fully launched: the Tourist, Literature and Music Departments. Indicative of growth in cultural opportunity, the present Club Year Book names fourteen departments.

In 1897 the Club was incorporated, and in this year, joined the General Federation. In 1900 it became a Charter Member of the State Federation.

In 1903 the Ebell Building Association was incorporated with power to issue stock, buy and sell real estate and build and own buildings, the Ebell, as a literary organization, having no power to issue stock.

The growth and success of the society is due not only to the broad and carefully laid foundation planned by its organizers, but to the conscientious and efficient work of each succeeding administration in the building of the superstructure.

Organized at a psychologic time, in a strategic position, benefiting by the cultural need and desire of a rapidly growing center where the young, virile, investigating spirit of the West meets the meditative habit and mystic philos-

ophy of the Orient, and where the best from all lands, together with the flotsam always drifting toward a metropolis, congregates, Ebells' growth has been rapid in numbers; and the fact that no important movement in the City or in the State fails to seek her endorsement speaks for the extent and, we hope, the quality of her influence.

This is in spite of the fact that, up to the present time, Ebells has maintained the consistent attitude of the student toward all civil and political questions, but has refrained from all political activity.

Worthy of mention as indicating something of the beginnings of Ebells is the fact that, early in its history, during the years 1898 and 1899, a magazine, "The Ebells," was published. This was edited by a member of the youthful society and the contributors were all Ebells members. Copies of "The Ebells" in the possession of members of the Club are, today, much prized by them.

During the first twelve years of its history, Ebells lodged successively, in the homes of members; in the vacated residence of former Gov. Downey on Main Street near Third; in a flat on Flower Street; coming to a somewhat permanent basis in a home built specially for the Club by a loyal member, on South Broadway. But Ebells rapidly outgrew even these quarters and when the first Cumstock Hall was built on Figueroa at Fifteenth, succeeded in securing the additional Auditorium and Department room space rendered necessary by the increasing membership.

The corner stone of the present Club House was laid July 31, 1905, and through the untiring labor of the Directors of the Ebells Building Association, the formal opening was held on the evening of January 9, 1906, when the Club and the Building Association united in a brilliant housewarming.

This happy event was hastened by the individual and united loyalty of the Building Association Directors, one of whom by the purchase of a lot on Hope Street, just north of the Synagogue, holding the same, and later, turning it over to Ebells together with an increased valuation of \$5500.00, in return for the first payment with interest and taxes, contributed materially to Ebells' ability to purchase and build on the present Figueroa Street site at Eighteenth.

A handsome bronze tablet placed conspicuously in the Club House, fittingly commemorates the work of these builders.

An Arts, Crafts and Loan Exhibit lasting ten days, signalized this first year in the Club home. This served to create wide spread and lasting interest in the progress and

promise of Los Angeles as an art center, a promise of which, today, the ultimate fulfillment is assured.

With the passing years, Ebells, through her Forward Work Council, has been represented in every civic, artistic, philanthropic and educational phase of our municipal life, expressing itself through accredited organizations. A list of these affiliations has been printed in each issue of the Year Book.

Effort, however, is being concentrated more and more on the things most vitally affecting women and children, the home and the school. Ebells, at present, is carrying ten scholarships, enabling that number of worthy girls to obtain High School or College education otherwise impossible to them.

No sketch, however cursory, of Ebells' activities during the more than twenty-five years of the Club's existence would be complete without mention of Ebells Rest Cottage. Realizing that study and any resultant culture are worth while only when translated into life values expressed in service for others, a group of Ebells members, about four and a half years ago, organized themselves into a Social Service Committee, which soon became a regular Club department. Looking for an objective that should not duplicate any already existing philanthropy, they decided after investigation, to work toward a home for convalescent women. A timely offer of a lot with a small cottage as a gift, provided it be used and developed for this purpose, moved the Ebells Board of Directors to pass an enabling act creating the Ebells Rest Cottage Association within Ebells, which Association might, through The Ebells of Los Angeles, accept bequests and endowments.

Thus the Ebells Rest Cottage at 1305 West Ninety-fifth Street (not a hospital, not a sanitarium, nor an institution in any sense, but just what its name implies, a place where convalescent women needing a little additional time for recovery of health, may find it amid restful surroundings, with good food, pure air, and a friendly, care-free atmosphere) was placed on a sure foundation.

From various successful bequests, from the Farquhar bequest, and from Rest Cottage Association Life Memberships sufficient sums have been realized to justify the immediate building of a beautiful modern home for Rest Cottage guests on a more convenient site. Here, it is hoped, can be carried out the Association's aim, which is toward intensive rather than extensive rehabilitation.

In July, 1920, an independent Practical Relief Committee was organized to carry on that part of the Social

Service work not taken care of by Rest Cottage or Scholarships.

For Ebell's war record it need only be said that her men—husbands, sons and brothers—fought, and her women worked. Four of her members were accepted for medical service overseas. Her Honor Roll contains two hundred sixty-one stars; twelve of these are gold. Those who have lived through the months and years of that human cataclysm, the results of which are still with us, will have no difficulty in recalling the drama that was enacted between these reminiscent statements. All usual Club activities were suspended, and time, energy and resources served but one cause—our Country's.

The Ebell Auxiliary of the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Red Cross contributed over three thousand garments made in the Club sewing room; two thousand nine hundred one garments made by the knitting department; sixty-six thousand surgical dressings from that department; and \$10,500.00 in cash values for the period of service.

Ebell Liberty Loan Committee sold \$555,700.00 worth of Bonds during the five drives, placing Ebell at the head of all women's organizations in the State of California. The Club subscribed for Bonds in the sum of \$15,500.00.

The Red Star and Animal Relief Committee by earnest and untiring effort, raised the sum of \$1058.00.

It is the purpose of the Club to erect a worthy memorial to Ebell's sons, brothers and husbands who gave all for God and for Country. This memorial is to be a bronze fountain, a work of art, designed by one of America's foremost sculptors and will be an honor, not only to the Club, but also to the city of Los Angeles.

The recent purchase of the lot on the northwest corner of Eighteenth and Figueroa immediately adjoining the present Club House site, gives to Ebell a holding full of possibilities, and is reason for intense satisfaction.

The roster of Ebell's Presidents—the women who have served through the years, giving unstintedly of time and strength, and of that intangible asset which creates all other values—personality, speaks for itself and needs no encomium. These noble women stand always for the best, not only in the Club but in the community where they are "Living Epistles," showing forth daily the spirit that has made The Ebell of Los Angeles, and that must continue to be its energizing force—the motive of all worthy living—the spirit that lives only as it serves.

Standing Rules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members will receive four guest cards for Monday afternoon programs and eight for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

A member may invite but one guest to any Monday program. Members' visiting cards will admit gentlemen to all open meetings.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

An applicant for absent rates must state in writing that she expects to be away from Los Angeles a full year or more. In lieu of a card of admission, she shall be given a certificate of membership with no guest privileges.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse partisan political measures or persons.

President's Report

To record material development is a comparatively easy task; but it is impossible to indicate in cold type that growth which is spiritual and therefore vital. Debts paid and members acquired are satisfying evidences of activity; but there is something better than these things. It is this ineffable, intangible *something* (which cannot be incorporated in a report) that has given solidarity to our Club, and has enabled Ebell to accomplish the many things that stand to her credit.

Early in the club year the hearts of Ebell were bowed in grief, for the Angel of the Higher Life called away our beloved past leader, Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson. Her beautiful, helpful, loving spirit for years had been an inspiration and a guide to us; and her brilliant and gifted mind had animated the Club. The memory of her noble life, every impulse of which was for the happiness and the benefit of others, will ever remain with the legion of those who loved her. "To live in hearts of those we love is not to die."

As a slight token of the honor and love in which her memory is held, the Club has placed her name on the Founders' Roll of the California Federation of Women's Clubs, as a perpetual memorial.

Aside from this grief, the year has been a very happy and a very busy one. It has held many successes, educational and financial.

Perhaps the outstanding material achievement of the year has been the wiping out of the debt of \$27,400 (July 1, 1922) on our lot at Eighteenth and Figueroa streets. This has been done through two agencies working harmoniously: (1) The intensive campaign carried on by our Ways and Means Committee under the wise and efficient leadership of Mrs. William Read. Through many gifts ranging from \$200 to \$10 and even less in a few cases, and through life memberships, much of this money has been raised. Mrs. Read reports over \$1100 in excess of the stipulated quota. This amount over our indebtedness has been applied to the fund now accumulating for the new club home to which we look with anticipation. The fund has been augmented by over \$900 in virtual gifts by members, being the War Tax refund from the government, it having been collected under a misapprehension.

The wise and careful financial management of the Board of Directors and the Treasurer has been the second factor which has enabled us to close the year free from debt.

The membership reported June 30 is as follows: Regular members, 2089; Junior Auxiliary, 103; total, 2192. The new members have been cordially welcomed into the Club and introduced to officers and curators at three delightful teas, conducted by our membership chairman, Mrs. John S. Thayer.

The weekly Club luncheons have been an outstanding innovation this year. Their popularity has been unquestioned, as the demand for tickets has far exceeded the supply. Besides a long list of brilliant speakers, an added interest has been the appearance each week of a toastmistress, chosen from among the most active of our Club workers.

The bulletin has this year expanded into a paper bringing to the Club related activities of women throughout the world. The thought underlying this plan has been that "we are members one with another," and that "no man liveth to himself alone." It is the spirit of Federation that we have been endeavoring to express through the pages of the bulletin. Mrs. Thayer, editor, has received much commendation for her painstaking and untiring work.

Rest Cottage has challenged a wide attention this year. Its Life Membership list has doubled; while many citizens of Los Angeles have become actively interested in its work. Its annual report (which appears elsewhere) attests the excellent work done by the Association under the leadership of Mrs. A. B. Ross, and the expansion of its sphere of influence.

Not less worthy has been the work of the Scholarship Committee, headed by Mrs. Ilot Johnson. A financial report appears elsewhere; but an account of dollars and cents can give no adequate idea of the constructive work done. Ten young women, seven of whom are college students and the others in High School, have been especially assisted by the Committee. When our Club considers that through our Scholarship work we are helping to fit needy girls, the most brilliant and deserving that can be found, to earn a livelihood and to make themselves valued members of society when otherwise they would be obliged to bury their talents in menial labor, it surely must make a wide appeal. Four of our young women were graduated from the Southern Branch of the University of California this year, and are prepared to go out as teachers well equipped to do fine work. One of these girls who graduated last year has made a remarkable record as a teacher of backward

children in the Los Angeles schools. No work should have a greater appeal to a Club whose avowed purpose is advancement in all lines of general culture than this, which enables us to extend to our less fortunate young sisters the advantages which have been ours.

Closely correlated with Rest Cottage and Scholarships is the work of the Practical Relief Committee. Mrs. Gertrude R. Nash, chairman, has offered her report to the Club, touching briefly on the vast amount of work done. This report cannot tell of the desperate needs met, nor of the aching hearts that have been cheered, nor of the lives whose currents have been changed through the kindly ministrations of this group.

Largely through the efforts of the Benefits and Entertainments Committee has the work of these three philanthropies been carried on, for this Committee has furnished a large sum of money which has been applied to meet the needs of each of the three. This remarkable Committee gave three benefits netting respectively, \$1502.25, \$700, and \$8150, a total of \$10,352.25. Generalship, devotion, untiring zeal, ingenuity, good humor, unselfishness—these are the concomitants of Mrs. W. A. Moses, the chairman, and her untiring committee.

Others who have worked notably along altruistic lines have been the Red Cross Committee, Mrs. Chester C. Ashley, chairman of a group of 150 women who raised \$1000 through Ebells and \$4000 outside, a total of \$5000 of the \$38,000 raised. The Needlework Guild, with Miss Della Bates as chairman, collected through the Club \$168.55 and 220 garments. Miss May Neill collected \$80 for Christmas gifts for the old men at the County Farm. Mrs. W. M. Holland and her committee sold poppies for the Disabled Veterans, bringing in \$123.54 thereby. Our "Brotherhood Box" has brought in various sums totaling \$276.52 for philanthropic work with various beneficiaries. \$185 of Club funds have been disbursed for philanthropies. Many philanthropic rentals have been given, the value of which has been rather considerable. If we compute the actual monies raised for philanthropies through Ebells' activities this year, it falls but a few hundred dollars short of \$20,000.

Ebells' Emergency Relief Fund account for the Disabled Veterans of the World War, Los Angeles Post No. 1, was opened in June, 1921, with a bank deposit of \$3,234.66. This amount, in addition to \$840 sent direct, and to further contributions this year of \$390.70, totaled \$4,465.36, which amount has been sent to the D.V.W.W. as their need required. Every dollar of this sum has been used by the

D.V.W.W. for the individual relief of disabled soldiers in Los Angeles, and the canceled checks returned to Ebells.

Our Library has grown both in size and usefulness, there having been much more demand for books than formerly. The sad passing of our Librarian, Mrs. S. J. Keese, whose amiability and worth made her beloved by all, made it necessary to appoint a successor. Under Mrs. Austin E. Elliott, the Library has continued to serve the needs of the Club. 315 volumes have been added this year, about 150 of which came as the result of the Valentine Shower. The Library now numbers 1415 volumes.

The growth and activities of the Junior Auxiliary have been a source of gratification. Under the encouragement and advice of the Advisory Committee, Miss Laura Paxton, chairman, the Auxiliary has made itself a very delightful and valuable feature of the Club.

Ebells showed her good will and her desire to play her part in Federation activities when she gave her episode of the Yosemite Pageant and showed the film of the pageant at an evening affair in November. Two performances were given, netting almost \$300. Ebells was also hostess at a very delightful tea given to the visiting clubwomen at the time of the State Federation in May, at which time she entertained several hundred guests.

Our third annual Shakespearean Commemoration in charge of our good friend, Mr. Frederick Warde, proved a deservedly popular event and justified the large attendance, all of which could not be accommodated in the auditorium. A reception to Mr. and Mrs. Warde followed the program.

Space does not permit the individual mention of others of the officers, the directors, the curators, the chairmen of committees, and a large number of workers in the ranks who have faithfully and conscientiously served in their various capacities. Each one has been as vitally essential to the welfare of the Club as have others serving more prominently. To these faithful ones is due the meed of praise and appreciation, and to them the President would express the deepest gratitude for services well and faithfully rendered.

It is with a sense of security and satisfaction that the President on retiring from office turns over the administration of the affairs of Ebells to the incoming President, Mrs. Grantland Seaton Long. The work of the Club is well understood by Mrs. Long, as she has served Ebells in many responsible offices heretofore; and the Club as an entity is to her an object of deep regard. With the same generous support that the members have accorded always, the incoming administration must be most successful

Let us not, however, be satisfied with successful accomplishment of routine affairs. Ebells needs a new club home; and it is the parting charge of your President, as she steps out of office, that you work as a unit toward the achievement of our desire. The impetus, the tremendous momentum of twenty-two hundred women pressing unitedly towards a goal, is irresistible. Let us not for one day fail to make definite progress in this direction; then Ebells's new Club Home must soon be a material achievement.

Report of the Recording Secretary

1921-1922

For the sake of clearness in reviewing the work of the club for the past year, I shall treat the many activities under two heads,—(1) What the Club has done for its members, and (2) What it has done for the community.

EBELLS'S SERVICE TO ITS MEMBERS

Under the direction of Mrs. E. C. Gates, Program Chairman, thirty-five Monday programs have been presented. Of this number, eight were musicales; six, drama and dramatic readings; four, general topics; four, political; three, educational; two each of biography, literature, travel and peace; one on art interpretation; and one in the interest of the World War Veterans.

These programs covered a wide range of subjects and were presented by artists and lecturers from many lands. Dr. Charles K. Edmunds of Canton, China, told us of the true democracy of the Far East and made us see why we should help the Chinese establish a stable government. Mrs. Beatrice Robertson Hale assured us that the women of the world must assist in no small way in solving international problems. John Cowper Powys contrasted the strong individualism of England with the community spirit of America, and the Hon. John Barrett, father of the Pan-American Conference, told us what Pan-Americanism meant to the peace of the world.

On Monday afternoon, October thirty-first, the Charter Day reception was held. It was a pleasant, informal meeting with a delightful musical program given in the patio. Under the direction of Mr. Frederick Warde, Ebells's third

Shakespearean Commemoration program was given Monday evening, April twenty-fourth. A reception followed the program, affording members and their guests an opportunity to meet Mr. and Mrs. Warde.

A second weekly program has been given Ebells members this year at the Wednesday luncheons. Through the activity of our President, Mrs. Toll, who has been responsible for the luncheon speakers, many inspiring messages have been brought to us.

The various departments of the club offer from four to six worth-while programs each week. Here, in smaller groups the members may study and discuss the topics of their choice.

The Corresponding Secretary has written seven hundred ten letters to members; they are letters of appreciation, felicitation and sympathy.

There have been twenty-four meetings of the Board of Directors and thirty-six meetings of the Executive Committee. At these meetings such business as finance, housing, improvements, philanthropy, and programs have been considered and worked out for the best interest of the club.

The club has given the members opportunity for service—service on our Monday programs, service on our Department programs and service on our many Committees. The club offers opportunity for self-development. Contact with our fellow-members in a group of twenty-one hundred people is beneficial to each one of us.

EBELLS'S SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

In a brief report of this kind I can mention only a few of our larger activities beneficial to the community. Our programs are open to a limited number of people, who enjoy the same educational advantages as the members. During the past year our scholarships assisted ten young women to secure a higher education. Our club stands for the proper housing and equipping of our Public Schools and Universities.

In Civic and Public affairs, we have endorsed measures supporting efficient City Government; the proper policing of the city; the necessary care of our City's dependents; the extension of parks and recreation centers; vocational guidance for women; wholesome moving pictures, and observance and respect for the laws of the land.

In Philanthropy, Ebells has taken especial interest in the work of Rest Cottage Scholarship and Practical Relief. In addition, she has given financial aid to fifteen other

organizations and has given the use of the auditorium and reception rooms to many worthy causes.

Resolutions endorsing the Barbour bill with Mr. Barbour's amendment.

Resolutions approving the stand taken by Mr. Will Hays on moral standards in motion pictures.

Ebell's greatest activity, the one in which she excels, is the one hardest to catalogue. For many years the club has taken an active part in matters of public interest affecting this section of our country, and during that time has developed a sane and sympathetic judgment on such matters. I believe that the stand Ebells has taken on these questions has been a mighty force in moulding public opinion in a sound, progressive and uplifting manner.

Report of General Curator

Again the departments of Ebell have closed a successful year, with nine hundred forty different members registered in the fourteen sections. Of this number, thirty-three were members of the Junior Auxiliary. During the year, twenty-seven hundred forty-five guests were entertained.

A complete record of the programs follows this report showing the variety of the work accomplished. Many lecturers, musicians and readers have taken time from their busy professional lives to come to us, and many of our talented club members have given their services for the benefit of the others.

The English Department, Mrs. W. B. Hunnewell, Curator and Instructor, held fifteen meetings during the year, with an average attendance of forty-eight. Those who attended regularly developed a knowledge of English phonetics, enunciation and voice projection.

The French Department, Mrs. Charles D. Burt, Curator, held twenty-seven meetings and had an average attendance of sixty-four. The Department was divided into four classes under the excellent instruction of Prof. Louis F. D. Briois. In April, Prof. Briois gave a Moliere evening under the auspices of the French classes for the benefit of Ebell's Scholarship Fund. The Department closed the year with a well acted French play.

The Spanish Department, Miss Emma E. Seibert, Curator, held twenty-eight meetings under the instruction of Senorita Madeleine Novion. There was an average attendance of thirty-two. Three classes were formed in grammar, reading and conversation. A Spanish play and entertainment was given in the spring for the benefit of the Building and Lot Fund. Informal luncheons were held in the patio once a month.

These three language departments held a luncheon, followed by a program, at the close of the year. Each department furnished professional entertainers who delighted a large audience.

The Parliamentary Law Department, Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, Curator and Instructor, held fourteen meetings with eighteen as an average attendance. Mrs. McKelvey's Outline of Parliamentary Law was studied, followed by drill in the purpose and form of motions used in ordinary assemblies.

The Social Science Department, Mrs. Elizabeth McManus, Curator, held seven meetings with an average attendance of one hundred thirty-five. The departments of city and county government were brought to the attention of the members. Affairs of international importance were also discussed.

The Art and Travel Department, Mrs. Albert W. True, Curator, held seven meetings with an average attendance of two hundred fifty-seven. Lectures, many of them illustrated, were given on the aims and achievements of Art. The Curator presided at two luncheons.

The Psychology Department, Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, Curator, held eight meetings, with an average of fifty-nine in attendance. This Department was organized in February for the purpose of arousing and stimulating interest in psychological inquiry.

The Drama Department, Mrs. J. Granville Robertson, Curator, held six meetings, averaging two hundred forty-six in attendance. Lectures on the drama were given and a number of late plays were read before the Department. The Curator Emeritus, Mrs. Ada Henry Van Pelt, presided at one of the Wednesday luncheons when the speakers were women connected with the stage and screen.

The Music Department, Mrs. William Ernest Mabey, Curator, held seven meetings, and had an average attendance of one hundred twenty-nine. The general topic of study was the development of music in America. The Curator presided at three luncheons when artists from home and abroad were special guests.

The Shakespeare Department, Mrs. Thomas R. Coles, Curator, held fourteen meetings with an average attendance of thirty-five. The study consisted of the reading of plays, class discussion, lectures and dramatic readings. Mrs. Herbert True, Assistant Curator, presided the last part of the year during the Curator's absence.

The Bible Department, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator, held fourteen meetings with an average attendance of sixty-six. Mrs. M. Winifred Rouzee gave a course of illuminating lectures on the Searchlights of Archaeology and History as applied to the Bible.

The Books and Current Literature Department, Miss Frederica de Laguna, Curator, held seven meetings averaging three hundred sixty-five in attendance. There were given interesting reviews of the best in current magazines, the modern poetry, and late books of fiction and biography.

The Browning Department, Mrs. Harry A. Ford, Curator, held fifteen meetings with an average attendance of

thirty-four. The truth and beauty of Browning from the simple animal poems to the more complex dramatic and religious poems were searched for and discussed. A luncheon was held after Mrs. Bannell Sawyer's lecture at the end of the year's work.

The Choral Department, Mrs. John W. Monahan, Curator, and Mr. Hugo Kirchhofer, Director, held thirty meetings averaging twenty-one in attendance. This Department sang before the Club at three Monday meetings and at two Department meetings. The guests at the Rest Cottage Christmas party also enjoyed them.

Each department has made a definite contribution, not only to the Club but to the community. Interest has been stimulated in the worth while elements of life, and fraternity has been promoted.

The success of the departments was achieved, not only through the interest and work of the curators, but by the members who gave generously of their time and talents for the benefit of their associates.

For the record of the beginning and history of this work, reference again is made to the report of the first Chairman of the Association as found in the 1919-1920 Year Book.

A Drive during October, 1921, under the Chairmanship of Mrs. William Wherry with an able committee, resulted in bringing the Sustaining and Associate Membership to 664; Life Members, 36.

During the month of November, 300 garments from the Needlework Guild, together with the Thanksgiving baskets generously donated by the pupils of Miss Fulmer's School were distributed among Rest Cottage families and guests.

December—a Christmas party was given for all former Rest Cottage guests and families aided by the Practical Relief, when a distribution of Christmas stockings, jams, jellies, and clothing was made.

The Executive Committee of Rest Cottage Association wishes to gratefully acknowledge the receipt of \$8898.49 from the benefit card parties and Garden Fete; \$500.00 from the Kappa Kappa Gamma Alumnae Association; and all gifts sent to Rest Cottage in care of our capable and sympathetic matron, Mrs. William Steinbaugh.

Twelve business meetings were held, and resulted in the purchase of a site 100x150 feet at First Street and Park View. Definite plans are formed for a new Rest Cottage building that may accommodate twelve women. The money from our benefits, together with the \$900.00 yearly allowed from the Ebells treasury, will permit this activity during the summer months.

Interesting reports from the Investigation, Follow-up, and Transportation Committees are available; also a list of the founders of this unique work, who we feel must be forever striving to know "the good, the true and the beautiful."

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Report of the Practical Relief Committee

The Practical Relief Department rather prides itself on its ability to maintain the modern tendency to double receipts and expenditures in one year. Indeed it has increased more than twofold its activities, and we trust its helpfulness and influence. While this has added to the trust and confidence of the working force that the department is justified, it has also added to its work. For, while production and contacts have doubled, the number of workers has remained stationary, and it is only by each one speeding up to her greatest capacity that the collective conscience of the department can be satisfied, for any considerable denial to the many pathetic appeals is unthinkable.

Beyond question the most extensive relief work ever done by this department has been done this winter for the sick and broken World War Veterans at Sawtelle. Such urgent appeals were made by the office of Industrial Education at Sawtelle, that an increased appropriation was made to the Practical Relief Department by Ebells Board of Directors, which enabled it to send to the ex-service men 98 shirts, woolen and cotton, 24 bath robes and some shoes, at the approximate cost of \$188.00.

Eleven other institutions have received aid through the department, and seventy-six individuals, among these many school and scholarship girls. Twenty-four pairs of new curtains were made for the Club House and Ebells linen, new and old, carefully put in order. Many visits of investigation were made, and every Friday the time of one—and often times two—members of the department was consumed in giving material aid and sympathetic attention to the stories of the overburdened.

As the work grows in scope it assumes varying characteristics. A certain impression is evolved that practical relief work as it centers itself in Ebells beautiful Club House possesses a peculiar opportunity. The applicant for help so often registers in differing ways the singular impression that is made when the knowledge penetrates her consciousness that her insignificant life, and the welfare of her family, really is a matter of interest to a great cultural organization, composed of the leading women of the city. Often a certain joy is detected because the opportunity is given for little friendly visits on Fridays, and sometimes to drink a cup of tea in the Club House.

Over 3100 garments have been distributed this season

as against 1400 in 1920-21. More than two hundred of these have been made from new goods, and much altering and mending of old garments has been done. That an average force of twenty women was able to accomplish so much is due to the efficiency of the Vice-Chairman, Miss Elizabeth Moorhead, who plans and directs the work.

Report of the Junior Auxiliary of Ebells

The first year of any organization is usually one of trial. This has been true of the Junior Auxiliary, not only to justify its existence, but to interest its members, to help them to become acquainted with each other, and with the Ebells Club, and to become familiar with club work in general. Through the loving interest shown by the Ebells, many of the trying situations have been made easy, and the Auxiliary has found the joy and happiness resulting from being Club-workers, and not merely Club-members.

The Junior Auxiliary's first year has been crowded with interesting activities. We

have assisted on four membership drives, for Rest Cottage, the Red Cross, the Y. W. C. A., and the Salvation Army; participated in the Yosemite Benefit Pageant; presented a ten-minute "skit" at the Benefit Dance; a twenty-five minute play at the May meeting of the Drama Department; assisted in the play given by the Spanish Department; and ushered at numerous Department meetings. Six members assisted Mr. Frederick Warde in presenting the Shakespearean program on the evening of April 24th. Twenty Auxiliary members assisted at the Garden Fete by taking charge of the Fish-Pond, the Evening Dance, and by selling tickets and candy. The cover design for the Bulletin and six large posters for Ebell were made by one of the artistic Juniors.

Many of the programs for the Auxiliary meetings have been given by our own talented members. Two programs of special interest, were the Drama-Musical in December, and the Fashion-Revue in April.

Through the efficient Publicity Chairman, Mrs. Harry Shults, we have received many splendid newspaper notices. Knowing that the Auxiliary would enjoy them, and would agree with Byron that "'tis pleasure sure to see one's name in print," these have been carefully collected and mounted in a scrap book.

To our Advisory Board, with Miss Laura Paxton, Chairman, we express our thanks and appreciation, for their sympathetic helpfulness and their inspiring co-operation. That the Auxiliary has not only sustained the interest of its members, but has grown from a membership of 66 to 103, must be a source of gratification to its founders.

We have lost but one member through resignation, and death has removed two, Miss Margaret Helyn Abbott and Miss G. Madeleine McWilliams. In the passing of these girls the Junior Auxiliary suffers the first break in its ranks, and deeply mourns the loss of these beloved members. During the year five Junior babies have been born, and we proudly make them "Honorary Members."

Our Annual Luncheon, June fourteenth, marked the close of the Club year. From our members has come cheerful co-operation, strong friendships have been formed, and Club loyalty has been developed. With the close association, and the encouraging helpfulness of the Ebell Club, we are inspired to do really creditable things. Emerson says: "Hitch your wagon to a star!" With Ebell for our "Star" we know that if we follow in its path of guiding light our highest ambitions may be fulfilled.

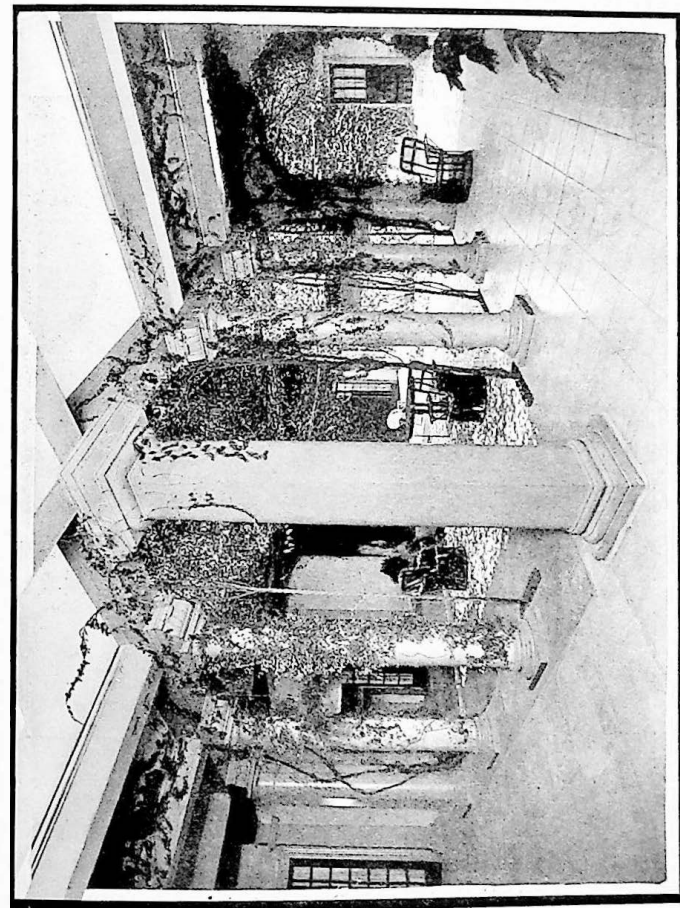

In Memoriam

There comes to all of us at rare and precious intervals a quiet twilight hour when, having watched the glorious sunset of some fading hope, we sit down in our house of life and count our treasures. There is none of us so poor but that a glittering heap dazzles our eyes. There are the blood-red rubies of soul-building sacrifices; there are the heaven-tinted sapphires of spiritual conquests; there are the gleaming diamonds of intellectual enjoyment; there are the emeralds of placid content; and here and there, the white high-lights of the treasure heap, are the pearls of friendship.

Sometimes as we gather one of these in our caressing hands, the Master of the Treasury stands beside us and says, "My child, this jewel is too precious to be kept in earthen vessels, where thieves break through and steal. Give it to me, that I may take it to the Heavenly Storehouse and guard it for you until the time when you may claim it as eternally your own." Reluctantly, yet thankfully, we place it in His keeping; and as we watch it going from our sight, we find our hands are not empty, but hold a rare amethyst of memory. We stoop to place it in our jewel casket and find under the gleaming treasures the priceless black pearl of death.

"Dear beauteous Death! the jewel of the just,
Thriving nowhere but in the dark,
What memories do lie beyond thy dust,
Could man outlook the mark!
He that has found some fledged bird's nest may know
At first sight that the bird has flown,
But what fair stream or grove he sings by now,
That is to him unknown."

To such an hour of reminiscence we have attained today. We have not come here to mourn one pearl committed to the Master's keeping; we have come to "bide a wee" among our memories, and to thank the Giver of Good Gifts that we can count among our treasures the friendship of Margaret Robertson.

Victor Hugo said, "If I were stone, I would be a lode-stone; if I were metal, I would be gold; if I were woman, I would be a star."

Margaret Robertson was all of these. Her wit, which never stung, her radiant smile and cordial greeting, were a

lodestone to draw all hearts to her. Her intelligence and ready grasp of business; her indomitable courage in meeting difficulties; her unvarying kindness of word and thought, all bore the stamp of pure gold; and as woman, she was a star radiating light to all that came within her influence. To those who knew her best, the vital quality of her mind and spirit was an abiding proof of immortality. No wise God would create so vivid a soul and limit it to the frail brevity of decaying flesh. Somewhere today, with wondering, eager eyes, she looks upon that life where work is without weariness and attainment without pain.

What she was seems more important than what she did; yet her achievements were many. Essentially feminine in gentle bearing, she shared with men the larger activities of our city, being a member of the City Planning Committee, and giving her interest to educational movements of many kinds. She has served as president of the Ebells and of the Galpin Shakespeare Clubs, and for four years she was president of the Los Angeles chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy. She was a member of the Friday Morning Club, and at the time of her death she was president of and an active worker for the newly organized Woman's Athletic Club. Her private charities were many, and her interest in struggling women was unflagging.

But Ebells claim her as peculiarly her own. Here for twenty-one years she gave lavishly of her talents and business ability. Here she gathered her closest friends about her. We recall, with a tender smile her ready luncheon stories, her quick sense of humor which saved many a difficult situation, and how the young members of Ebells loved her; they were so sure of her understanding sympathy.

Mrs. Robertson is the first president of Ebells who has passed from the transient unrealities of this life to the verities of the life beyond. She has gone in her prime, spared all the pain of failing powers. We watched her for years ministering to the needs of her mother who, blind and helpless, though keen in mind, walked falteringly down the slopes of old age. We could not picture for her that fate.

"And we shall shortly know that lengthened breath
Is not the sweetest gift God makes his friend,
And that sometimes the sable pall of death
Conceals the fairest boon His love can send.
If we could push ajar the gates of life
And stand within, and all God's workings see,
We could interpret all this doubt and strife,
And for each mystery could find a key."

We have all stood before that statue at the World's Fair of a spent horse and his exhausted rider reaching the End of the Trail. His shoulders droop; his head is bowed; no joy has he in the long road behind, and no anticipation of what lies beyond the end. He has simply finished his task.

Not so did Margaret Robertson reach the Great Adventure. Head up, a smile upon her lips, her eager, questioning eyes looked beyond the clouds and glories of the sunset. Alert, at attention, she tossed a salute to the past, and turning to meet the unknown, she cried in glad surprise, "It is not the end, but the beginning."

Thus we expect to see her some day, planning new achievements, released from the limitations of flesh, acclimated to Heaven.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be **THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES**.

**Second*—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV

Powers and Duties of Directors

SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SEC. 5. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a Standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization.

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ARTICLE VI *Duties of Officers*

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the President-elect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor stating the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company, and be approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curator-elect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship fund of The Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship Funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 9. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt.

SEC. 10. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII

Standing Committees

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Committee on Membership;
2. Committee on Printing;
3. Committee on Programs;
4. Committee on Departments;
5. House Committee.

SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.

SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.

SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.

SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.

SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII

Members

SECTION 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting, when the applicant shall be voted upon by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board and, if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

An application for membership in the Junior Auxiliary of The Ebell shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

Any member of the Junior Auxiliary may become a regular member of The Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the admission fee, provided such application is made within one year after membership in the Junior Auxiliary has lapsed.

No member of the club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for membership in the Junior Auxiliary, during one year.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card of a current year from a Federated Club may use that card as an endorsement.

SEC. 2. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election to membership.

SEC. 3. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SEC. 4. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the admission fee and one-half the annual dues.

SEC. 5. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.

SEC. 6. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of three dollars (\$3.00) per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

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SEC. 7. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 8. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

SEC. 9. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 10. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX

Dues

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$15.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

SEC. 3. Members of the Club who are employees, and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted. They shall receive one-half the guest cards allowed regular members.

SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted.

SEC. 5. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, pay one-half the yearly dues from date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

SEC. 6. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred

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dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.

SEC. 7. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

ARTICLE X

Meetings

SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p.m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.

SEC. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI

Elections

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by *viva voce* vote.

Nominations

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

"We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES, propose the name of..... as a nominee for the office of..... in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES for the term from July 1, 19...., to July 1, 19....; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office."

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. of the date set; three members of the election board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June, provided, however, that the President-elect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE XII

SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV

SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted shall, when approved by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convenings bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1921. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

By-Laws of the Junior Auxiliary of the Ebells of Los Angeles

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ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY OF THE EBELLS OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this organization is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the community, and participation in social welfare work.

ARTICLE III

Membership

SECTION 1. Membership in the Auxiliary is open to the daughters of Club members and their friends between the ages of 19 and 23 years for a period of three years.

SEC. 2. Applications for membership shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

SEC. 3. Any member of the Junior Auxiliary may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee; provided such application is made within one year after membership in the Junior Auxiliary has lapsed.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

SECTION 1. The officers of this Auxiliary shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer.

SEC. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the annual meeting of the Auxiliary.

SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an advisory committee of three Ebells members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of the Auxiliary, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

ARTICLE V

Dues

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be ten dollars (\$10), which amount shall be deducted from the regular entrance fee when the applicant becomes a member of Ebells.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be five dollars (\$5), payable in advance; one-half the first Monday of October, and one-half the first Monday of March.

SEC. 3. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year may, upon written application to the Executive Committee of THE EBELL, pay one-half the yearly dues from the date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the date of application.

Sec. 4. Neither the Auxiliary nor any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on Ebell, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI

Meetings

SECTION 1. The Auxiliary shall meet on the second Wednesday and fourth Friday. The annual meeting shall be on the first Wednesday of June.

Sec. 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Auxiliary members.

Sec. 3. Members of the Auxiliary shall have the privilege of nine regular Monday meetings during the year.

ARTICLE VII

Amendments

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Executive Committee by a majority vote. Notice of such amendment shall be given at the previous meeting.

Resolutions

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage; and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los

Angeles, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors thereof.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from sustaining, associate and life members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the Auditor of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebells Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebells of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebells Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebells of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebells Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebells Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise For Benefit of Ebells Rest Cottage

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It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebells for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebells of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage -----dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebells of Los Angeles that real property described as follows-----"

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the moneys derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

Ebells Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

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ARTICLE I

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebells Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebells of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1. The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebells of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebells of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III

Duties of the Executive Committee

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebells Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebells Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebells of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebells of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the association.

ARTICLE IV

Duties of Officers

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebells. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

SEC. 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebells all moneys due the association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of The Ebells.

The Ebells of Los Angeles

ARTICLE V

Members

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebells of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebells Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

SEC. 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining and Life Members.

ARTICLE VI

Dues

SECTION 1. The dues for Associate Members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

SEC. 2. The dues of Sustaining Members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SEC. 3. The dues of Contributing Members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SEC. 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a Life Member.

ARTICLE VII

Meetings

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at ten A.M.

SEC. 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at eleven A.M.

SEC. 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Tuesday in June at ten A.M. Polls open until noon.

SEC. 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SEC. 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII

Elections

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebells of Los Angeles shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election when there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by *viva voce* vote.

SEC. 3. At the regular meeting in May, a nominating committee shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the annual business meeting.

SEC. 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary, and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE IX

SECTION 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SEC. 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebells of Los Angeles.

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
