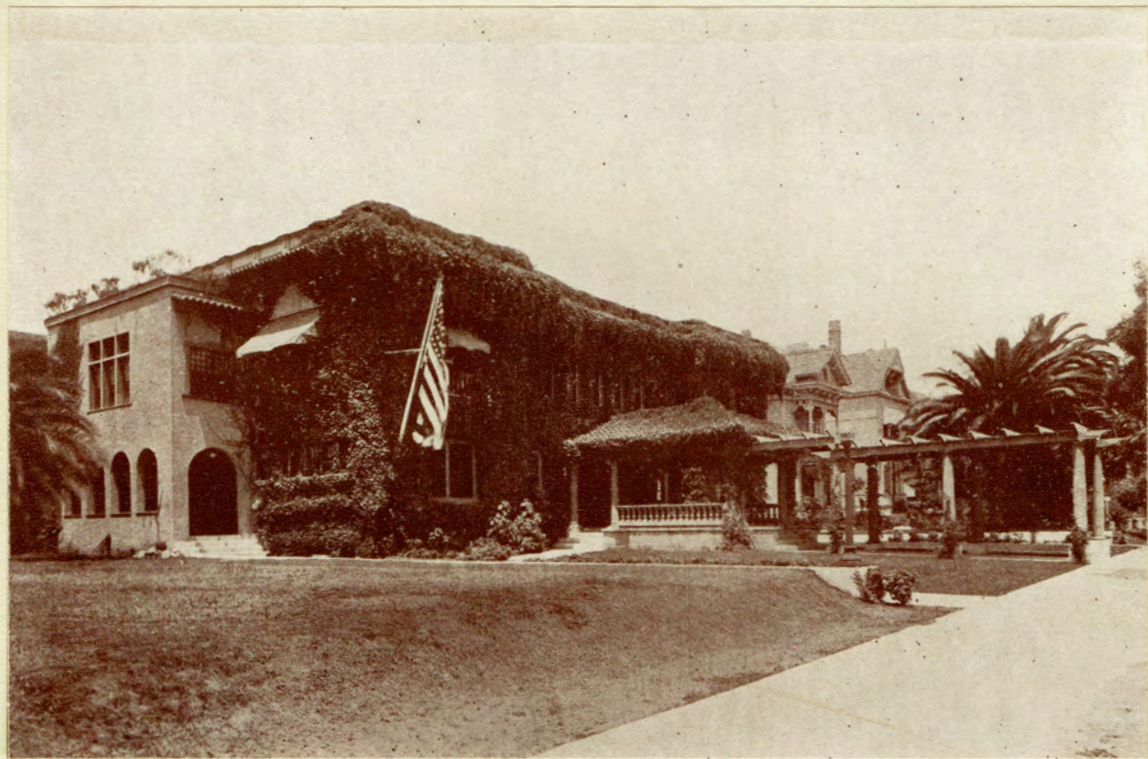

History



THE EBELL CLUB OF LOS ANGELES owes its plan of organization to the Ebell of Oakland, California, which was founded in 1876, by Dr. Adrian Ebell of Berlin. This eminent educator became convinced that the great need of the feminine mind was the study of science and philosophy. He therefore founded an "International Academy of Sciences," with headquarters in Berlin; and he designed to establish "Chapters" in all the large cities of the world. The first of these to be formed on the Pacific Coast, was the result of a lecture delivered by him in Oakland. Dr. Ebell dying shortly afterward, the Oakland Chapter decided to sever its connection with Berlin, reorganize the Society on broader lines, and name it for its founder. The following year, the system of study in departments was inaugurated, which secured the success and permanence of the institution. In 1894 two charter members of the Oakland Ebell, Mrs. H. W. R. Strong and Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, united with Miss Emmie H. Parsons and Miss Alice K. Parsons, in calling a meeting for the formation of a Los Angeles Ebell, on lines similar to those of the Oakland Society. Mrs. H. W. R. Strong became its first President and to her indefatigable efforts and fostering care, are due the remarkable growth of the infant organization. For a year The Ebell of Los Angeles met in the Misses Parsons' parlor, but as it increased in membership, it sought successively three rented homes. To its second President, Mrs. Clara B. Baker (now Mrs. Robert J. Burdette) the Club is indebted for substantial financial assistance and wise advice in the purchase of a lot, the sale of which made it possible to obtain the present location, where in 1905, the Club House was built.

Standing Rules



Admission to meetings by card of current term only. Each member in good and regular standing is entitled to six cards for guests, three of which are issued the first of October, and three the first of March. Gentlemen admitted on members' calling cards. Guests not admitted to business meetings. Guests admitted to Departments on regular guest cards.

A special form of admittance card will be issued to those who apply for membership before September tenth.

New members voted in during February and June shall pay dues from March first and October first.

Members leaving the city for a full Club year may, by applying in advance, obtain absent rates.

Certificates of membership, in lieu of regular membership cards, will be furnished to members having absent rates.

Any member in good and regular standing who desires to visit Federated Clubs of other cities, may, upon application, receive a card of introduction.

Members from out of town Federated Clubs with their credentials, may visit each Department once on application at the office for proper admittance cards.

The Membership Committee does not assume the responsibility of proving the truth or falsity of derogatory rumors concerning the character of applicants for membership, but persistent and general rumors will be deemed sufficient to debar the applicant.

Letters of endorsement are required from all signers for new members.

In case of petitions approved by the Executive Committee, a table may be placed in the Tea-room, where signatures may be received, but they may not be generally solicited.

Ebell seeks information on legislative measures, but does not endorse political ones.

The missions will be studied; their influence on the Indians, their architecture and their present condition considered.

Report of the Recording Secretary

1914-1915



THE year nineteen fourteen-fifteen which is just closing, will stand out in the records of Ebell for several reasons, but chiefly for the crushing sorrow that came to our President, following closely a most auspicious opening of her administration with the first meeting of the year on October fifth. On the following Monday Ebell met only to adopt resolutions of sympathy with Mrs. Bartlett in the sudden death of her husband, immediately adjourning to attend the funeral.

By a strange coincidence, the newly elected Recording Secretary, Mrs. Charles F. Patterson, was unable to serve on the opening Monday on account of the illness of her husband and, some months later, she, too, was called upon to lay away from earthly sight, her loved companion. Some time previous to Mr. Patterson's death, Mrs. Patterson tendered her resignation which was regretfully accepted, and Miss Mattie H. Wilson, who meanwhile had served as Acting Secretary, was regularly appointed Secretary by the Board of Directors.

Drawn more closely together by the sympathy born of these sad events in her immediate family, Ebell has met the responsibilities and endeavored to solve wisely the problems that have presented themselves during a year whose history and responsibilities, at home and abroad have been such as "try men's souls."

Stepping into the chief office of the Club, our First Vice-President, Mrs. Chester C. Ashley, carried us through the trying weeks and months during which our President was unable to be with us.

These days brought many appeals to all in our peaceful land for the sufferers from the awful war then just begun, as well for those in our midst thrown out of employment by the reflection of war conditions on our own industrial life. These appeals Mrs. Ashley presented to the Club, from week to week, even at the risk of becoming wearisome, but Ebell responded to each new call, doing her part most generously.

On the first Monday in January, in response to the insistent plea that she return to us, our President resumed her place and since that time her clear vision and calm judgment have been given unreservedly to the Club, her service reflecting that rare joy distilled only from sorrow, that it has been good for Ebell to know.

Mrs. Ashley, in her elective capacity as First Vice-President, during the year, represented Ebell on the Committee of Investigation of Conditions in the Probation Office; served on the Civic Centre League Committee; presided at the recognition meeting for new citizens, at the Los Angeles High School on January sixth, at which time Ebell was requested to act as hostess; acted as Chairman of the Committee having charge of the expenditure of Ebell's one hundred dollar Christmas donation for the purchase of warm clothing for poor school children, this being in lieu of the party hitherto given annually for them; represented Ebell at the luncheon and reception for Admiral and Baroness Uriu given jointly by the Japanese American League and the Friday Morning Club; attended or sent representatives to twenty-two reciprocity meetings and served as Chairman of Ebell's delegation to the state convention of the California Federation of Women's Clubs held in San Francisco in May. It will be seen that the office is not honorary.

To our Second Vice-President, Mrs. George P. Thresher, we owe the stimulus, intellectual, artistic, moral and spiritual, found on the recurring Mondays of the Club year, in the thirty-five programs presented under her supervision with the assistance of Mrs. F. W. King, formerly our President. Ten interpretative programs—

musical or dramatic, or a combination of both—have been enjoyed, leaving a preponderance of lectures on subjects, literary, artistic, philosophic, sociologic, economic, historic, ethical, ethnic, archæological and astronomical.

The worth and content of these will be recalled as we name Dr. David Beaton, Mr. S. S. McClure, Professor Frederick Starr, Professor Jerome Hall Raymond, Mr. Louis P. Stellman, Mr. B. R. Baumgardt, Miss Mary Bannister Willard, Mrs. Lillian Burkhart Goldsmith, Professor Maria Sanford, Mr. Harry C. Peterson, Mr. D. G. Mukerji, Dr. Robert Freeman, Dr. James A. B. Sherer, Dr. Alfred W. Martin, Mr. J. H. Francis, Mrs. Kate Waller Barrett, Professor E. J. Banks and many others, not least among whom were Lou Wescott Beck and his able assistant "Rufus."

Each program was full of human interest, no matter what its specific topic, directly or indirectly touching the widening circle of the thought that proclaims all men brethren and helps on the day when Peace and Good-will shall prevail on the earth.

For the delightful Fête Champêtre at Verdugo Park which, this year, replaced the annual luncheon hitherto held as the closing event of the club year, Mrs. Thresher provided an appropriate program in the presentation of "The Arrow Maker" under the supervision of Miss Willamene Wilkes. Staged among the trees on a terrace conveniently located by Nature, the Indian play was most enjoyable and those privileged to be present will not soon forget the part taken so splendidly by our own Mrs. A. H. Van Pelt, Curator Emeritus of Ebell's Drama Department.

Following up the extensive repairing and remodeling of the Club House, so efficiently accomplished during the summer vacation under the supervision of our Building Committee, Mesdames Bellows, Read, Carlisle and Ashley and Miss Rockwell, our Third Vice-President, Mrs. Herbert P. Barton, took up the work of cleaning and refurnishing, presenting to the Club in October a delight-

ful and homelike meeting place for members and their guests.

Throughout the year, Mrs. Barton, with her corps of assistants faithfully looked after all the details that make for hospitality—the kind for which Ebell is known—reaching a beautiful climax in the perfect reception tendered visiting delegates to the National Convention of Federated Music Clubs held in our city early in July.

Our Fourth Vice-President, Mrs. S. M. Browne, keeper of our Register, reports a gross increase in numbers of one hundred twenty-nine. Thirty-eight have resigned and twenty-nine have been dropped. Eleven have answered the call to the "Life more abundant."

Our membership July first, nineteen fifteen was fifteen hundred twelve.

During the year, forty-five have availed themselves of the privileges of Temporary membership in the Club.

Our busy Corresponding Secretary, Miss Augusta Lamb, reports two hundred eleven letters received and filed; three hundred twenty-eight letters and two hundred eighty-one notices and miscellaneous communications mailed; these last including letters of sympathy, condolence, congratulation and appreciation of gifts and other courtesies shown Ebell. Seventy-three letters were written at the request of the Welfare Committee, in whose work, Miss Della Bates, Chairman, reports the increasing need of cooperation on the part of the entire Club. Much work has been done, but much more may be done if members will report to this Committee circumstances calling for the expression of sympathy, in joy or in sorrow, which Ebell wishes to extend to all of her members alike.

The Courtesy Committee, of which Mrs. John C. McCoy is Chairman, has been present on all occasions calling for the welcoming hand and word. Mrs. McCoy desires to emphasize the simplicity in dress and form that has been made a feature of the work and that has been found so acceptable to the members of the Committee and the Club.

Mrs. Van Bergen, our genial but firm Chairman of Credentials, who, with her assistants, has kept the doors on Mondays reports four thousand forty-three guests entertained during the year. Of these three hundred seven are men and seven hundred ninety-five guests of the various Departments. As in the past, our overflow audiences have marked the musical and dramatic programs though the many fine lectures have been well attended.

To our courteous and withal efficient Ushers' Committee, Mrs. W. M. Kinney Chairman, members and guests of Ebell are indebted for consistently obliging and painstaking work in providing for the comfort of our large audiences.

The Decorating Committee need no testimony to their labors other than that given so eloquently by their friends and ours, the beautiful flowers which they have allowed to speak for them all through the year. Mrs. Godfrey Edwards is Chairman of this Committee.

At its regular meetings the Club, from time to time, has endorsed resolutions and legislative measures as follows:—

Requesting drastic regulation of the bill-board nuisance in Los Angeles city and county by the City Council and Board of Supervisors.

A bill before the State Legislature creating a refuge for wild life in the Angeles National Forest.

A petition to the President against the appointment to any Federal position of any man, Mormon or non-Mormon, giving political allegiance to the Mormon Church.

A petition to the Mayor for an increase in appropriation to the Los Angeles Public Library.

A letter to the Press protesting against the unnecessary publication of salacious details of criminal and political trials.

Petitioning our legislators to support a bill recreating Santa Catalina Island as a Fish Reservation.

Asking support of the Subsidy Bill carrying a one hundred thousand dollar appropriation to the Anti-Tuberculosis Association for their work in the county hospitals.

Asking support of a bill to preserve the trees on the state highways.

An amendment to the State Constitution declaring the Bible a non-sectarian book, and, as such, not to be excluded from any school or university in the state.

Asking support of the North-South Child Labor Law prohibiting inter-state commerce in the products of child labor.

Petitioning the President to appoint a National Marketing Commission.

In order that intelligent action might be taken many of the measures endorsed, as well as others not so commended, were discussed on the platform in regular program lectures or in brief hearings accorded representatives of the various causes preceding regular Monday programs.

The various causes represented on Ebell's Forward Work Council have been supported as opportunity offered or as aid has been asked.

The work planned by the Ebell Symphony Committee, Mrs. W. L. Jones, Chairman, in co-operation with the Los Angeles Symphony Association, has been effectively carried out and the results are most satisfactory. A course of six interpretative lectures on the Symphony programs, one preceding each concert, has been given before the Music Department, of which Mrs. Harmon Ryus is Curator, and invited guests of Ebell. These lectures were given by Miss Marie Elliott, assisted by Mrs. M. Hennion Robinson at the piano. Five hundred course tickets were distributed among Federated Clubs, music study clubs being given the preference. A block of one hundred concert seats was taken by Ebell members.

These measures stimulated the musical interest in and contributed to the financial support of the Symphony Association with the result that the former deficit was cut in two. Culturally, educationally, civically this is one of the biggest things Ebell has done and a letter of thanks signed by the Secretary of the Association, Mrs. Dean Mason, in which the hope was expressed that the same support would be continued during the coming year, is evidence of appreciation.

Ebell's conditional subscription to the guarantee fund of ten thousand dollars for the production of a prize American opera in Los Angeles was, this year, made an unconditional gift and the splendid interpretative lecture on the opera selected, "Fairyland," given at the closing meeting of the Music Department before an audience of about eight hundred, greatly stimulated interest in and contributed to the success of its initial production. Numerous messages of appreciation have been received by the Executive Committee in recognition of Ebell's active support of the American Opera Association.

At the annual business meeting on June seventh, amendments were added to the By-Laws as follows:—

To Section 6 of Article XI. Empowering the Directors to authorize the annual election by viva voce vote in case of there being but one candidate for each office to be filled.

To Section 13 of Article VIII. Providing for reinstatement of members who have resigned in good standing and who hold resignation cards, on application, election, and payment of one-half the regular initiation fee or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

At the same meeting a resolution prepared by Mrs. E. C. Bellows and unanimously endorsed by the Executive Committee at its meeting on June second, for presentation to the Club on June seventh, was read by Mrs. Bellows.

The resolution stated that for several years successive official Boards of Ebell have questioned the desirability of membership in the California Federation of Women's Clubs, but, out of deference to the sentiments of some of our active workers and members of long standing, each Executive Committee has refrained from initiating a movement for withdrawal.

C-1 The growing domination, however, of the Federation by the same partisan political methods so long employed by many men and so deplored by women and the absolute control, by these methods, of the State Convention in May, 1915, in addition to Ebell's inadequate representation, has led to the conviction that Ebell can no longer seem to endorse or condone these things by affiliation with a body whose members are permitted to practise them.

The resolution closed with a motion that The Ebell of Los Angeles sever its connection with the California Federation of Women's Clubs.

// The motion was promptly and repeatedly seconded and remarks were called for. The discussion was free and open, calm and deliberate and was extended to give the fullest opportunity for expression pro and con.

The audience, in personnel and size was the most representative ever gathered at a business meeting in the history of Ebell, between five and six hundred being present, all of whom except about thirty-five were members of more than one year's standing.

C-2 When, after repeated calls, the Chair finally put the "question" to vote, the result was overwhelmingly affirmative, only twelve voting "no."

Thus, at the close of a year whose hurrying weeks and months have chronicled events pressing home upon us all the sense of personal responsibility in character reaction to the opportunities for service in upholding moral standards, did Ebell register her realization of the sacred-

ness of the trust imposed upon the women of California with the gift of the franchise, and her determination to be true to her highest ideals for the home—the cradle of citizenship—and to strive to make her politics and her religion, her patriotism and her piety, *one*.

Report of the General Curator



THE vision of the founder of Ebell was a woman's club organized for serious and scientific study. That his dream has become a reality the work of thirteen active Departments attests. Each Department following some especial line of study under the direction of a competent leader, attracts and holds the listener as well as the student.

The desire on the part of many members for class work, expressed in the diverse interests of each Department and in the unity of interest of all, brings to the life of the Club harmony and beauty.

Enrollment in Departments keeps pace with the growth of the Club; an increase in the membership of one means a corresponding addition to the other.

The individual registration was 675, while duplication brings the registration of all Departments to 1450. These numbers are smaller than the actual attendance, as the list of names, as a rule, is incomplete. One faithful member attended eleven Departments while eighty attended four or more Departments.

Three new Departments, Browning Study, Bible Literature, California History and Landmarks, were added during the year.

Ebell is proud of her reading room and of her growing library. The former is made attractive by easy chairs, a couch and lights properly adjusted. Current copies of twenty or more of the leading magazines are to be found on the table, and encyclopedias and reference books on the shelves.

The books of the circulating library are, from necessity, kept in the office. Members are asked to call for these books and to use them freely. A list of recent books purchased will be found on the bulletin board.

Department luncheons constitute a unique factor in Ebell Club life, adding, as they do, the social touch that is needed in the hour of relaxation, making it a time for friendly intercourse and closer acquaintance. Some of the Departments have a regular monthly luncheon and others, but one or more during the year. A light program, preferably a continuation of the morning's work, in the form of recitations or music, or some art exhibit lends pleasure to the occasion.

BROWNING STUDY, Mrs. Thomas B. Stowell and Mrs. Sidney J. Parsons, Curators, held its initial meeting in October. Three poems, representing the author's early period, were carefully studied during the year: "Pippa Passes," breathing the author's optimism and faith—"God's in his heaven, all's well with the world"—; "Paracelsus," emphasizing his sympathy with man's desire for knowledge; "Pauline," voicing his artistic and poetic aspirations. Besides fourteen regular meetings, two special programs were enjoyed,—an interpretation of "Balaustion's Adventure," Reverend J. Westby Earnshaw, and a dramatic reading of "James Lee's Wife," by Mrs. Gustave Detzer. This Department had an enrollment of eighty-three and an average attendance of forty. An earnest spirit has been manifest and a growing interest in the work shown.

DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY LAW, owing to the continued illness of the Curator, Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, was led by the Assistant Curator, Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, whose work was ably conducted and much appreciated.

The outline of the work included General Rules of Parliamentary Procedure relating to the organization of assemblies and the conduct of business, with especial at-

tention to motions, first as to purpose and second as to procedure. The practical drill incited keenest interest and discussion.

DEPARTMENT OF EXPRESSION, Mrs. Fred Betts, Curator, read, analytically, "Courage" and "Success" from Emerson's "Society and Solitude" and three essays from "Natural History of Intellect."

Paralleling the works of Emerson with side readings from other thinkers, the members gained an insight into the idealism of nature as portrayed by Wordsworth and Tagore, and compared the spirituality of Emerson with the most modern thought on philosophy as expressed by James and Bergson.

Mrs. J. B. Gwynne read three helpful papers on the speaking voice; William Knight, Dr. Beaton and Dr. Hodgins, all spoke before the Department on subjects relating to the lesson of the day.

DEPARTMENT OF SHAKESPEARE, Miss M. E. Elliott, Curator, studied this year, under Mrs. North, Instructor, "King Lear," "All's Well that Ends Well" and "Richard III." The theme ever present, though not always in the foreground, as ever in the author's plays, was Love. Love treated directly, *i. e.*, as a basic element governing life, as in "Lear" and "All's Well that Ends Well"; and Love treated indirectly, *i. e.*, Love refused as a basic element governing life, as in "Richard III." The insistence of Shakespeare that Love with its attendant, Service, is the pivot upon which life must revolve, and consequently evolve, makes of this author a constant reminder of the cultivation of "that culture which comes through service to others."

An enjoyable part of the programs has been the active readings by the members, of parts of the plays.

DEPARTMENT OF DRAMA, Madame Ada Henry Van Pelt, Curator Emeritus, Mrs. Frank W. King and Mrs. E. T. Pettigrew, Curators, realizing that good drama when fitly represented in the theatre offers the rank and file of

the nation a recreation which brings moral, intellectual and spiritual advantages, aimed not only to educate its members toward an appreciation of the best that has been thought and said in modern drama, but to create a demand for good plays under right conditions.

Plays from the leading German, Norwegian, English, Russian and American dramatists were delightfully given by talented members of the Department. Among the prominent plays were: "The Mob" by Galsworthy, W. V. Moody's "The Faith Healer," "Brand" by Ibsen, "Cherry Orchard," Tchekof, Alice Brown's "Children of Earth" and Hauptman's "Prince Henry of Aue." Not only was the literary value considered, but especial attention was given to the construction and technique. The Department had two hundred twelve members and held fourteen meetings.

THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC, under the direction of Mrs. Harmon Ryus, Curator, spent an interesting and profitable year in the study of modern operas, especially those of Russia, the lecturers being Professor de Zielinski and Mrs. Bessie Bartlett-Frankel.

Herr Adolf Tandler, at the opening meeting, spoke on musical conditions in Europe.

Mrs. Evelyn Fletcher-Copp gave an illuminating insight into the modern method of music, which teaches the child to think and express itself in musical terms.

The climax of modernism was reached with the presentation of Horatio Parker's opera "Fairyland," which made its premier appearance during the biennial of the General Federation of Music Clubs in Los Angeles in June.

Mrs. Ethel Graham Lynde, assisted by Paul Eisler at the piano and soloists of the Opera Company, gave an excellent interpretation of this Prize American Grand Opera.

Ebell, through the Department of Music, gave a series of interpretative lectures on the Programs of the Los Angeles Symphony Orchestra, Miss E. Marie Elliott, lecturer, Mrs. M. Hennion Robinson, pianist.

It was fitting that a DEPARTMENT FOR THE STUDY OF CALIFORNIA HISTORY AND LANDMARKS should be organized in 1915, an epochal year in California history.

Under the leadership of Mrs. A. S. C. Forbes, Curator, the first meeting was held in March. At the five subsequent meetings were presented programs covering a general, chronologically arranged resumé of historic incidents.

In imagination the members traveled the Camino Real, lured on by the Mission bells along the way; stopped by the wayside tepee to hear from native lips the Indian folklore and legend; and lingered at the hospitable hacienda, charmed with Spanish romance, song and leisure. The cry of gold broke the sylvan quiet, then came the strenuous days of American occupation, the introduction of railways, the story of the state's fabulous growth in population, the building of the Transcontinental Highways and the Panama Canal.

Seventy-six women enrolled in the Department, and there was an average attendance of twenty-eight.

BOOKS AND CONVERSATION, Mrs. John Stearns Thayer, Curator, believing that every great epoch is influenced by some strong personality, has viewed certain periods of history through the life of the dominant character of that day. Among those considered were: Frederick the Great and the effect of his militarism upon Prussia; Louis the XIV with his costly magnificence which marked the beginning of the end of royalty in France; Savonarola, whose example of virtue, heroism and self-denial left its impress upon Italy.

Miss Gertrude Darlow of the Public Library, using Modern Essays as her theme, gave a review of much that is new in this fascinating class of literature.

ART AND TRAVEL, Mrs. C. Q. Stanton, Curator, Miss Helen A. Brooks, Instructor, continued the study of France begun two years ago.

The papers descriptive of people, places, industries and arts of Southern France, Normandy, Brittany and other provinces have been full of delightful bits as well as valuable information.

Art topics comprised during the first half-year, Foreign Art-in French Galleries, later the art study was of that in which France has been at her best, Architecture, with individual study of five of the greatest cathedrals. Under the guidance of Miss Brooks, many pilgrimages to the Louvre were made, Notre Dame was visited, a trip to St. Michel enjoyed, the magnificent fragment of Beauvais studied, a glimpse of Chatre caught, and Amiens, the Parthenon of France, explored.

The work of the CIVICS DEPARTMENT was planned by Mrs. John H. Francis, Curator, but was carried on after her resignation in January, by her Assistant, Mrs. Loren O. Crenshaw, who then became Curator. The Department held six regular meetings and postponed one meeting to allow members to attend the City Council in session.

The aim has been an intensive study of the city of Los Angeles, including city charities, municipal markets, civic centres, schools, parks. One day was given to the consideration of the proposed amendments to the state constitution. Knowledge of the departments of city government has been obtained at first hand by talks by city officials and by reports given by members of the departments.

Through the DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SCIENCE, Mrs. Charles N. Flint and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, Curators, offered to members of Ebell an opportunity to attend a course of lectures on social science by David Beaton, M. A., of Chicago.

Dr. Beaton's broad, philosophic treatment of his subject, his culture and rare personality all combined to make these lectures vitally interesting and of educational value.

Beginning with the foundations of society, he showed, step by step, why all men today are not enjoying their constitutional rights—liberty and the pursuit of happiness. He traced the cause and effect of antagonism between capital and labor, the growth and results of slums in cities, and of the enormous cost of the social parasites—all these factors contributing to the delinquency of so large a part of the body politic. Social amelioration will come through religious training, general education, safe-guarding the home, equality of rights and privileges.

DEPARTMENT OF FRENCH, Mrs. Charles Clark, Curator, Madame Isabell de Kerpezdron, Instructor, met four mornings each month during the year.

A lively interest in the work was shown by members who have studiously followed the first year's work from an outline of study covering a three years' course.

Some especial attention has been given to the drama and to the acting of plays. Under the direction of Madame Jeannette Fisher the following plays, "La Grammaire," "Les Deux Sourd," "Le Medicin Malgre lui"—de Moliere, and a day of old French Romance and Songs, were presented before large and interested audiences.

Gradually, however, comes the realization, that, after all, "Growth is not merely a gain in knowledge," but an ability to translate that knowledge into a creed for daily living that will fortify the individual life and strengthen the individual faith in humanity.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, and a Treasurer from the membership-at-large. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report mat-

ters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SEC. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

SEC. 2. At the request of the President, the First Vice-President shall represent the Club at any conference, meeting or convention which the President would otherwise attend, shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall be ex-officio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee, or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She is also ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

SEC. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as Financial Secretary.

SEC. 8. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committee.

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Committee on Membership;
2. Committee on Printing;
3. Committee on Programs;
4. Committee on Departments;
5. House Committee.

SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.

SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.

SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.

SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.

SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

SECTION 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her application shall be endorsed by three members in good standing, and of more than one year's membership. The application shall be handed to the Membership Committee, who shall investigate the same, and either cause the names of the applicant and endorsers to be posted on the Bulletin Board, and published in the next issue of the Monthly Bulletin; or, in case of non-acceptance, the application shall be returned by the chairman of the Membership Committee to the first endorser. At the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the second Thursday of each month, applications which have been published shall be voted upon, and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be required to elect to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of.....
(state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card from a Federated Club, dated not more than one year previous, may use that card as an endorsement.

SEC. 2. Business women, members of the Club, whose hours of business are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted.

SEC. 3. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted.

SEC. 4. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Club for five (5) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.

SEC. 5. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the initiation fee and one-half the annual dues.

SEC. 6. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.

SEC. 7. A non-resident may become a temporary member by having her name presented by two members in good and regular standing, with the approval of the chairman of the Membership Committee, upon the payment of \$2.00 per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 9. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous recommendation of the Committee on Membership.

SEC. 10. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SEC. 11. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

SEC. 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues.

SEC. 13. Members in good and regular standing who resign, may upon application, receive a resignation card stating their standing.

Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement, shall have their names published as in the case of other applicants, but shall not be required to furnish endorsers. If elected to membership they shall be admitted on payment of one-half the regular initiation fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$10.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership.

SEC. 3. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.

SEC. 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SEC. 5. Members who may be absent from the city for one year or more shall pay half the annual dues.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a. m.

SEC. 5. The semi-annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

"We, the undersigned, regular members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES, propose the name of..... as a nominee for the office of..... in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES for the term from July 1, 19....., to July 1, 19.....; and we hereby certify that we have not signed a nominating petition for any other candidate for the same office."

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

SEC 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

If, when the nominations are closed prior to any annual election, nomination petitions have been filed for only one candidate for each office to be filled, the above prescribed order of election may be changed by the Board of Directors, and the election may be by viva voce vote, at the business meeting on the first Monday in June. This change shall not dispense with sending a sample ballot to each member of the Club.

SEC 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of 10 a. m. and 3 p. m. on the date set. Not fewer than three members of the Election Board shall be present at all times during the balloting, and shall require each voter to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result to the Club on the second Monday in June, reporting the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

ARTICLE XII.

SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Department Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Departments are to meet, and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a Secretary to assist her in the Department.

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New

Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV.

SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Club, or to add new By-Laws thereto, may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall include mailing to every member of the Club, not less than ten days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to add, repeal, alter or amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon; also announcements from the platform at two regular meetings previous to that of voting, which announcements must state the character of the proposed changes and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such repeal, alteration, amendment or new By-Law so adopted shall, when adopted by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XVII.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX.

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1915. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.
