# Bur Club Rame

EVERY member of EBELL should be able to answer with certainty the question, often repeated within and outside the Club membership,—"Why are we called 'Ebell'?"

Adrian Ebell, born September 30th, 1840, in Ceylon, of mixed German-British-Dutch ancestry; brought to America while very young by an older sister who had married an American missionary, gaining his education at Easthampton and Yale, and later, at German Universities; dying at the age of thirty-seven, after seeing the ideal conceived in boyhood well on the way towards realization; may be regarded as an international figure.

Always deeply interested in a wider horizon for women everywhere, through the extension of opportunities for higher education in all lines tending to the enlarged sympathy that results from the assimilation of broad culture when pursued with the ultimate motive of unselfish service, Dr. Ebell initiated the organization of study classes for women in the eastern part of our country and, after a visit to California, was returning to Europe to further his plans for an international college for women, when he was stricken with fever that resulted in his death.

While a student at Yale, his brilliant personality and rare courage attracted the attention of a man of large wealth who had no son. Given his choice between the lure of all that belongs to the sole heir of a vast fortune and the struggle and deprivation attached to carving his own career, but on condition that another name be added to that of Ebell, he elected to keep his honored birthright unsullied and to tread the path of self-denial. This he chose rather than to risk, through the temptations frequently accompanying great wealth, possible belittling of a name that had stood through generations for fidelity to ideals of loyalty, truth and honor.

Such was the man to whose memory the Ebell Clubs of California—among which The Ebell of Los Angeles is third in order of organization—chose to build living monuments by taking his name and carrying on his work through the education of women. May we perform the task worthily and prove loyal to our chosen legend, "I serve."

# Standing Rules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of current term only.

Regular members will receive four guest cards for Monday afternoon programs and eight for departments; one-half to be issued October first and one-half March first.

A member may invite but one guest to any Monday program. Members' visiting cards will admit gentlemen to all open meetings.

Any member of an out-of-town federated club may, on presentation of credentials, receive a complimentary guest card good for ten days.

Current membership cards will serve as cards of introduction to federated clubs of other cities.

No person eligible to membership shall be admitted as a guest to more than two Monday afternoon meetings in one year.

· New members notified of their election during February or June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Endorsers of temporary membership applicants must state length of time applicants have been in Los Angeles and probable length of stay. All applications must be made in writing each year and the membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

No appeals for financial aid shall be made from the platform or in the club rooms except by permission of the President and Executive Committee; nor shall there be any personal canvass for funds, but a table may be so placed that voluntary contributions may be received.

# President's Review

IT is with a feeling of grateful appreciation that the President reviews the achievements of our Club members during the past two years. Also, with a corresponding feeling of satisfaction, she reflects upon the sound financial condition in which she is able to turn over the business of the Club to her successor.

The regular activities of the Club, the Department meetings, Monday Programs, and Guest Luncheons, have all maintained their usual standard of excellence and we have been privileged in these functions to meet and exchange ideas with many men and women of nationwide and worldwide reputations.

Since reports of these meetings appear elsewhere in the Year Book, it becomes the duty and the pleasure of the President to recall only those outstanding and unusual features that give individuality to the history of the past year.

First, the completion of the Scholarship Endowment Fund, the goal we set for ourselves two years ago. This is a fine, worth-while accomplishment, one of which we have a right to be proud. Ebell's Scholarship Endowment adds a new jewel in her crown of dignity and service, and it is to those sympathetic and far-seeing members who have contributed to the sum, as well as to the untiring loyalty and zeal of our Scholarship Committee, that the thanks of the Club are due.

Second, the continued growth of Rest Cottage. In order to assist the Scholarship Endowment campaign, the Ebell Rest Cottage Association Committee has refrained this year from any extraordinary demand upon the attention of our members, and as a reward for

modesty and generosity, perhaps, the Cottage with its business has flourished like the proverbial bay tree. It has grown more beautiful and more useful as the months have passed. The property has increased in value appreciably and under the wise management of the committee, Ebell Rest Cottage has come to be an asset of recognized importance in the Social Service life of the city.

The work of the Practical Relief Department is of such a nature that the attention of the public is not drawn to it, but the self-sacrificing women who work on this committee obtain their reward in the happiness they are able to give to others and in the gratitude and love that comes to them from the many families they have assisted and the many young men and girls to whom they have given a friendly hand in time of need.

Third, the Golden Scroll. The most notable affiliation which we have consummated this year with undertakings outside of our Club, was our initiative campaign to assist in building the Mission Theatre at San Gabriel. Our interest in this enterprise was based upon the fact that this magnificent theatre, which is to be spaciously and solidly built of brick and concrete, on beautiful and enduring lines, modeled after the old mission of San Antonio, will stand as a monument to the high appreciation and the love which our people have for the history and the literature of the early days of California. Only California plays will be given there and the entire proceeds will go to the upkeep of the theatre and to the preservation and perpetuation of our California History and Landmarks. The contribution of Ebell's members to this fund has already reached two thousand, one hundred thirty-one dollars.

Fifth: The monthly exhibition of paintings from the brushes of many of our finest California artists is also one of our inspirational contacts and creates an increased atmosphere of culture and charm to our Auditorium meetings.

No report of the Club year of 1924 would be complete without a reference to that great event of national importance in the Club world, the Biennial Convention of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, which met here in June. Ebell's share in this convention, aside from her one hundred per cent contribution toward the expenses and the work of a large number of her members on the committees, was the very brilliant and unique affair at the Club House on the evening of June seventh, at which we entertained seven hundred of the Biennial delegates.

The affair assumed the character of an Early California Fiesta. The Club gardens and patio were decorated with that motif; the stage setting recalled the pueblo days; the refreshments, the strolling players, the Spanish dancers, the costumes of the hostesses were all in keeping with that period in the history of California, so treasured by us all in song and story; and we were amply repaid for all the effort and time and talent expended, in the enthusiastic enjoyment of our guests, most prominent of whom were the retiring President, Mrs. Alice Ames Winter, and the incoming President, Mrs. John D. Sherman.

May we speak briefly now of our Club House dream? Eighteen months ago, when we acquired the building site at Wilshire Boulevard and Shatto Place, we cast our eyes into the future and visualized our Club House as fronting on the most beautiful boulevard in

However, the speed and realism of modern life have overwhelmed us. The rapid growth of Los Angeles since that time, and the re-zoning of Wilshire Boulevard, have placed our location, in a few months, in the midst of commercial buildings and in the heart of the crash and uproar of traffic caused by the intersection of two main arteries of the city. For these reasons it became necessary for us to look for a more appropriate site.

On account of the size and unusual requirements of our Club, it has been difficult to find that spot which would meet with the approval of a majority of our members. From the large number submitted for approval, two beautiful pieces of ground were selected, only to be reluctantly relinquished eventually, on account of building restrictions. It is the hope of the Directors that a suitable place may be acquired this summer.

In the meantime, the President has kept a careful hand on the Wilshire-Shatto property, giving a great deal of time and thought to realty values, and is prepared to state that by reason of our purchase of the Wilshire-Shatto property and the increase in values since then, we may hope to realize a very handsome profit which can be applied on our new Club building. There is not in the minds of the Directors any regret until 1925.

A word as to the immediate future: If any regret has arisen in the mind of the retiring President at the thought of stepping down from the high position of

honor and trust that has been accorded to her by our members for the past two years, it has been quickly dispelled in the assurance she has of the superior qualities of our new presiding officer.

Fifteen years of intelligent and devoted service to the interest of our Club, with an eye ever single to its integrity of purpose, its usefulness in the community, and its exalted spirit of love and co-operation, have amply fitted her to hold this office. We could not have secured a more inspiring leader than Mrs. William Read, and Ebell is to be congratulated upon her new President.

# Report of the Recording Secretary

WITH our President, Mrs. Grantland Seaton Long, as guiding star, Ebell has completed a most successful year, one that has been full of service and accomplishment. In her opening address, our President asked each member to give of her loyalty, initiative and cooperation. The Ebell members heard the call and have responded.

Mrs. William B. Scarborough, our First Vice-President, has rendered valuable and efficient assistance. As Chairman of Printing, she supervised the printing of the Year Book and of the monthly Bulletin, and as Chairman of Reciprocity has attended or sent representatives to fifteen reciprocity meetings. Also she has represented our President and Ebell on many occasions.

Our Second Vice-President, Miss Frederica de Laguna, as Chairman of the Program Committee, has presented thirty-six Monday programs. Of this number two were plays; three, illustrated lectures; three, symposi ums; five, readings; ten, musicales; and twelve, lectures. These programs were prepared with care and discrimination and with an endeavor to suit the varied tastes, and have been of exceptional excellence as many outstanding artists and noted lecturers appeared.

The worth and variety of these programs will be recalled as we name Mr. William McFee, Rebecca West, Dr. Edwin Mims, Celeste Nellis-Ryus, Dr. Edwin E. Slosson, Amy Cryan, Dr. B. R. Baumgardt, Mari onCraig Wentworth, John G. Neihardt, Katharine Oliver McCoy, Dr. Benjamin Harrison Warren, Dr. Samuel Crothers, Elizabeth Drew, Philip Tronitz, Porter, the Gilmore Brown Players, and many others.

Throughout the year, our Third Vice-President, Mrs. Lyman Curtis Blakeslee, with her House Committee, has carefully attended to the many needs and comforts of the Club as eons.

Miss Ada A. Dryden, Fourth Vice-President, Chairman of the Membership Committee, has successfully taken charge of

all matters pertaining to the admissions and resignations of members. She reports that our total membership is now two thousand three hundred seventy-seven. Miss Dryden's Committee also arranged the beautiful reception and breakfast given by Ebell on April thirtieth, in honor of our new members.

Our Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Birney Donnell, has written seven hundred ninety-two letters during the past year. Among these have been business letters and letters of appreciation, sympathy, and congratulations which have expressed Ebell's loving interest in her members.

Mrs. Walter C. Vallikett and her Club Welfare Committee have assisted Mrs. Donnell by keeping in close touch with the members.

The Chairman of Courtesy, Mrs. Lewis W. Andrews, and her Committee have graciously extended a welcome to all members and their friends and have endeavored at tea time to introduce members to one another.

Mrs. Laura P. Joyce, Chairman of Credentials, has been a most faithful and tactful doorkeeper, while the Ushers' Committee, of which Mrs. Robert M. Hartwell was Chairman, has efficiently performed its duties of administering to the comfort and safety of the Club. Both of these Committees have effectively handled our large audiences.

Mrs. George Tomlinson and her Decorating Committee have tastefully made our Club House beautiful for each occasion, while the Art Committee, with Mrs. George W. McCoy as Chairman, has beautified our Club walls with exhibitions of rare and attractive paintings.

Our Library Committee, under the fine leadership of Miss Emma E. Seibert, has made it convenient for our members to secure books, and through gifts and purchase has added many new books to Ebell's collection.

Mrs. Patrick Campbell, as Publicity Chairman, has kept the daily papers in constant touch with Ebell's activities and has written many interesting articles for "The Club Woman" concerning Ebell. Mrs. Campbell also had charge of the Press Luncheon given by Ebell on January thirty-first, in honor of the Club Editors.

Our Federation Secretary, Mrs. Emerson Clyde Gates, represented Ebell at the Federation meetings and brought the

Mrs. Charles Van Valkenburg, Chairman of Red Cross, and Miss Della F. Bates, Chairman of the Needlework Guild, with their respective Committees, have carried forward their splendid work and brought much credit to Ebell.

There have been twenty-five meetings of the Board of Directors and twenty-seven meetings of the Executive Committee. At all these meetings the Club's business has been carefully considered and faithfully executed according to the best interess of the Club.

Ebell's interest has not been self-centered for she has also been busy in many activities which radiate into the life of the community, and her influence has been far reaching. Outside of her three worthy philanthropies, Rest Cottage, Scholarship, and Practical Relief, she has given financial aid to eighteen other organizations, and has allowed many free rentals. Her keen interest in civic and public affairs may be judged by glancing at the resolutions she has adopted, and also is evidenced by the fact that many of her members have served on important social and civic committees.

The following resolutions were endorsed by the Club: Resolutions of respect to the memory of Woodrow Wilson; resolutions asking the City Council to rescind its ordinance establishing an industrial district in the Bimini Ravine, in order to permit the property owners to proceed with their park project; resolutions asking the Mayor and City Council to prevent the erection of a Hospital on the ground overlooking the Bimini Ravine and to preserve this ravine as a beautiful park for our city; resolutions commending the Standard Oil Company's decision to remove their bill boards from our California highways; resolutions petitioning the City Council to place upon the ballot the proposition to issue bonds for the purpose of acquiring a site and the building of a Civic Auditorium; resolutions endorsing the three measures pending in Congress, concerning Indian Welfare; a resolution endorsing the Will Bill; resolutions urging the establishment of a Soldiers' Hospital at Sawtelle; resolutions urging Congress to take action in favor of the International Conference of the Anti-Narcotic Society; a resolution urging action by Congress for the relief of the Disabled Veterans.

At the Monday meetings held June second and June ninth, Ebell's By-Laws were revised.

In addition to our regular meetings and departments the Club has had a number of noteworthy affairs. On Monday afternoon, October twenty-ninth, Ebell celebrated its twenty-ninth anniversary with a reception held in honor of its Charter Members. There was music in the Patio, and at tea time a large birthday cake surrounded by candles, lighted for each happy year our Club has been organized, was cut by Ebell's first President, Mrs. H. W. R. Strong, and by our beloved President, Mrs. Long.

Our special guest luncheons have been among the notable social features of the year. The after-luncheon speakers have been entertaining and diversified, as many distinguished and world speakers have been our guests. Among these were Chief August Vollmer, John Steven McGroarty, Rebecca West, Ralph Arnold, Ella Buchanan, Arthur Hazard, William Preston Harrison, and Admiral Samuel S. Robison.

In harmony with the Christmas spirit Ebell brought great joy to the hearts of two hundred public school children by giving them a real Christmas party on December fourteenth.

Our fifth Annual Shakespearean Commemoration program was given on Saturday evening, April twenty-sixth, under the splendid direction of our friend, Mr. Frederick Warde, and proved to be an exceptionally fine performance. An informal reception followed this enjoyable program.

Our closing affair of the year was a brilliant luncheon given at the Ambassador Hotel on Monday, June twenty-third. The program was a delightful musicale in charge of Celeste Nellis-Rvus.

This is not a complete record of Ebell's activities, yet it reveals a record of growth and achievement and exemplifies the spirit that has made and continues to guide Ebell,—"that spirit that lives only as it serves."

This was followed by a delightful tea served by the hotel.

The third party was held in our Club House on May ninth. The Committee felt we should give Club members one opportunity to entertain their friends at a party in their Club Home. We called this our Spring Party and the Decorations Committee made the Club House festive with spring blossoms. The Denishawn School for Dancing gave several beautiful spring dances by young girls in their professional class, for the enter-

# Report of the Practical Relief Committee

T IS not a question of whether she is deserving, only a question of whether we can help her," was the reply given to your Chairman when discussing what answer to make to an appeal for help that had come to the Department. With this always in mind our aim is not only to help in a material way, but to give sympathy and courage to these unfortunate ones, and to let them know that they have friends in Ebell.

In the past year we have made more than seven hundred new garments, received more than three thousand old ones, and distributed more than four thousand.

A large part of our work is for ex-service men and their families, many of whom have come from all parts of the United States, seeking to regain health in our wonderful climate. It is most distressing that these men who have sacrificed so much in the service of their country (and we must not forget that it is our country too) should be in need of the necessities of life.

Our attention was called to a young woman, wife of an ex-service man whom the stress and horrors of the war had left. as it did so many of our soldiers. in such a nervous state that at times he lost his mental balance. In one of these lapses he left home, and his wife, failing to find him in San Francisco, started to walk to Los Angeles, hoping to find him here. After some harrowing experiences she arrived here thoroughly exhausted and discouraged. She obtained work as a waitress, but eventually had to go to the General Hospital for a major operation. When she left the hospital she was taken into the home of another ex-service man and given room and board in return for the little help she was able to give. This family was in need of bedding and clothing, which the Practical Relief was privileged to supply. Through the Disabled Veterans Club, the husband was located in Chicago. The Hollywood Post of the American Legion furnished transportation. She was sent to her husband and at last reports was comfortable and happy.

Again, we found a wife and three children without sufficient food, who were selling the furniture piece by piece to get the necessities of life. The husband, a Spanish War Veteran, in

the Sawtelle Hospital, suffering from tuberculosis, was unable to eat from thinking of his starving family. They wanted to sell their home in order to live, hoping the husband would recover and be able to work again. We supplied their needs and finally succeeded in persuading them to receive help from the Out Door Relief Association, and then to save their home. Through our Scholarship Committee the oldest girl is enjoying a scholarship from the Parent Teachers Association. The husband is home now, much improved in health.

We have adopted two babies in the Kiddie Koop. A letter from the Superintendent says in part: "I would not presume to thank you for undertaking what is your blessed privilege, but I will say you are being a great help to the Kiddie Koop as well as a Godsend to those babies, whom I consider the most needy here, and there are many. It's a big thing for you women to do."

A woman, well educated, refined, and at one time very prosperous, came to us with only thirty cents in her pocket, and having to leave her boarding house the next day. She was sick and in a bad nervous condition. The doors of Rest Cottage were opened to her, and after a rest there the Out Door Relief gave her a place in Vacation Home. She writes that she is much improved in health and is now ready to work. These are only a few of the pathetic cases we have found.

Our thanks are due the Out Door Relief and Juvenile Protective Associations, the Johnson Apartments, and the Hollywood Post of the American Legion for their co-operation.

The members of the Practical Relief Committee number twenty-seven and we fully realize that it would not have been possible to accomplish what we have, had it not been for the sympathy, encouragement and financial aid given us by the fine women of Ebell. We ask your continued co-operation through the year before us. It is not what we give but what we share, and we know that the spirit lives only in service.

# Report of the Scholarship Committee

THROUGHOUT the year the wonderful spirit of Ebell A has been shown in the way in which everyone has co-operated to finish the fund of \$10,000. Ebell's share of the permanent Scholarship Fund. The Benefits and Entertainments Committee, the Spanish Department, the French Department have all given material assistance; and Rest Cottage and Practical Relief have quietly withdrawn from any active solicitation. Individual members of our Club have given generously. That the Endowment Fund has "gone over the top" is due to this general co-operation.

Three beautiful parties have added to the joy of our social life, as well as much to our funds. The Spanish Ball under the able direction of Mrs. A. B. Griffith was a charming affair. The Special Scholarship Benefit at the Ambassador, under the leadership of Mrs. William C. Warmington, gave us \$1000. We are particularly grateful to the Benefits and Entertainments Committee and to the Ebell Juniors, those charming "models" for this brilliant event. The Ten-Dollar-a-Plate Luncheon at the Biltmore netted the largest sum of any benefit of the year. a total of \$1462.50. The success of this is due to the happy team-work of the Scholarship Committee, and especially to Mrs. Albert Laurance Bagnall, who suggested the idea and acted as Chairman of general arrangements: to Mrs. Fred C. Hartmann, Assistant Chairman; to Mrs. Julian E. Garnsey, Treasurer; to Mrs. Ralph B. Hardacre and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, who arranged the program. We also appreciate the interest manifested by every member of the Ebell Board.

From the experience of several years, we have formulated a suggested policy for the Scholarship work. The scholarship shall be a gift, limited to twelve girls, and to fifteen dollars a month; preferably, girls whose homes are in Los Angeles. Later, perhaps, in years to come, the sum may be increased, but never to more than twenty-five dollars, inasmuch as it is intended to assist a good student, not to maintain her entirely. It is to be kept constantly in mind that it is a great honor to be an Ebell Scholarship girl, and that those worthy of this honor shall hold it until receiving a degree of graduation.

Our twelve girls have been a joy and an inspiration. Three are graduating from a University, one of them receiving the highest honors, awarded to only four of the Seniors. One has left school to marry; so we have eight girls to depend upon Ebell for next year—"hold-overs," we call them. Three other girls have found scholarships through the recommendation of our committee.

The joy of working together, and the social contact with these enthusiastic young people has made the Scholarship work a continuous pleasure. We wish to thank all concerned for the opportunity of joyous service to Ebell's philanthropy.

# Report of the General Curator

IN 1923-24 the thirteen departments of Ebell completed an interesting year of activity. The following brief report of the work of the various departments will indicate in a measure the wide cultural field covered. The enthusiastic co-operation of the officers and members made possible the success of the departments,

The Art and Travel Department, Miss Helen Louise Stubbs, Curator, held seven meetings with an average attendance of two hundred and seventy-eight. Art and Travel programs alternated. A valuable part of each program consisted of a short talk on the work of visiting artists, given by Mrs. George W. McCoy. The wide scope of Art in modern life was emphasized throughout the year. This was uniquely demonstrated in the program on Costume Design, generously given by Miss Norma Gould. In the Travel programs we journeyed far. The longest jaunt we took was with Mrs. Charles H. Thompson who, by means of the stereopticon and slides made from original views, took us to see "Landmarks Around the World before Columbus."

The Bible Department, Mrs. Joel B. Gwynne, Curator, held fourteen meetings, with an average attendance of one hundred and forty-seven. During the months of October and November four lectures were given by Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, vividly portraying "The Life and Works of Paul of Tarsus." On December twentieth a Christmas program was given under the management of Miss Margaret Goetz. In January Miss M. Winifred Rouzee began a delightful lecturing tour around the world, visiting places familiar in sacred history. With Miss Rouzee's spiritual interpretation these lectures were greatly enjoyed. The annual luncheon closed the year's work.

The Books and Current Literature Department, Mrs. Albert Denison Jack, Curator, held seven meetings with an average attendance of three hundred and ninety-eight. Local poets and poems were placed in the foreground, adding much

to the popularity of the department. Biography took precedence over fiction. One patriotic program was given. The last meeting of this department was given over to Miss Rebecca West, an English author.

The Browning Department, Mrs. John E. Coffin, Curator, held seventeen meetings, with an average attendance of forty. The study of The Ring and the Book was completed. Ten members of the department presented the different parts of the poem under the general direction of the Curator. Music was contributed for some of the meetings. On May eighth the anniversary of Robert Browning's birthday was celebrated. Dr. Walter F. Dexter lectured. Music and luncheon speakers concluded the program.

The Choral Department, Mrs. John W. Monahan, Curator, met for three months, with an average attendance of seventeen. Owing to the Director's being called out of town, the department work was discontinued.

The Drama Department, Mrs. Margaret Barbrick Gillette, Curator, held seven meetings, with an average attendance of one hundred and ninety-eight. The programs have been varied and always interesting, covering play production, modern play reading and ten-minute play reviews. Mrs. Aurania Rouveyrol read her poetic drama, "Magic," at the October meeting. Throughout the year many prominent authors and dramatists spoke before this department. Addresses were given by Mr. Gilmor Brown of the Pasadena Community Theatre, Mrs. Roger Sterrett, District Chairman of Better Films, and many others.

The French Department, Mrs. Charles D. Burt, Curator, held twenty-nine meetings, with an average attendance of fifty-one. The first class studied Chardenal's Grammar and read several short stories from "Les Petits Contes de France," by Meras. The second class completed the study of Introductory French Composition by Francois, and "Le Gendre de Monsieur Poirier," by Augier. The third class completed the study of

Advanced French Composition, by Francois, and read four novels. On May twenty-ninth the French and Spanish classes gave a joint luncheon in the auditorium. The French class gave \$108.00 to the Scholarship Fund.

The Music Department, Mrs. Berne S. Barker, Curator, held seven meetings, with an average attendance of two hundred and three. A special program was given during Music Week. The year was spent in studying the various influences which have been brought to bear upon American music during the building up of its present distinctive type. More than sixty-five artists and speakers of prominence contributed their services to this section. An active interest was taken in the promotion of the Los Angeles Grand Opera Association, the Hollywood Bowl Summer Concerts, and an ovation which was arranged by the musicians of the city for one of its composers, Charles Wakefield Cadman. The lecturer for the year, Mrs. Gertrude Ross, an Ebell member and composer of note, was chosen to present her own compositions at the Biennial of the National Federation of Women's Clubs.

The Parliamentary Law Department, Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey, Curator and Instructor, held fourteen meetings, with an average attendance of fourteen. At each session new motions were studied, with review of past work and general suggestions of parliamentary procedure. A new feature this year was the organization of the Smalltown Improvement Club, to give practical drill in the work. By-Laws were adopted, officers elected, and regular meetings held.

The Psychology Department, Mrs. Summer P. Hunt, Curator, held fourteen meetings, with an average attendance of eighty. Dr. Louise Unger, a student of Jung, and a practicing psychoanalyst of this city, lectured, as did John Maud, a practicing hypnotist. Child psychology was studied and several books were reviewed by members of the department.

The Shakespeare Department, Mrs. Herbert F. True, Curator, held fourteen meetings, with an average attendance of

forty-four. During the past year time was spent in studying Roman history of the period of Julius Caesar. There was a debate, with earnest argument on both sides, and active readings given of parts of all plays studied. Questions and answers on the subject matter of the plays were a feature of the department. Three luncheons were given, each followed by an interesting program of addresses and music.

The Social Science Department, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator, held seven meetings, with an average attendance of two hundred and five. During the past year this department has covered a wide range of subjects of local and national importance, such as socialism, drug addiction, heredity, community welfare work, and immigration. Current events have been reviewed at each meeting.

The Spanish Department, Mrs. A. B. Griffith, Curator, and Senora Maria Lopez de Lowther, Instructor, held thirty meetings, with an average attendance of fifty-two. Instruction was given in primary, intermediate and advanced Spanish. In December a ball was given, and the sum of two hundred and thirty-seven dollars was presented to the Scholarship Fund. In May the Spanish and French Departments gave a joint luncheon, which was followed by a delightful musical program and an artistic presentation of "El Avantal," by members of the Spanish Department.



# Report of the Chell Rest Cottage Association

EVERY member of Ebell Club who has had even a small part in the building and support of Rest Cottage, must feel a pride in that very tangible evidence of the unselfish thought of the women of our Club, for those whose lives have been cast in less pleasant lines than their own.

The Cottage is lovely now, with the roses blooming, the well-kept lawn and the abundant shrubbery, and the artistic interior is as clean and white as when it was opened more than a year ago.

The two thousand five hundred sixty-six dollars expended for the convalescent fund represents that many days of cheerful environment and comfort for the one hundred ten women to whom Ebell has offered a gracious hospitality. Their letters tell of renewed hope, of spirits revived, and, as one said, "of a new faith in womankind."

It is interesting to note that the majority of women coming to the cottage the past twelve months have been recommended by Ebell members or their friends.

The sum of thirty-five hundred dollars has been added to the Endowment Fund. This includes five hundred dollars bequeathed by Miss Annie L. Bartlett and invested in securities, the interest of which will go toward the support of the Cottage in the years to come. The increase in the valuation of property in the neighborhood of First and Park View Streets has added very considerably to Ebell's holdings.

The earnest work of the Membership Committee has resulted in the enrollment of about one-third of the members of Ebell. A complete list of the Life Members, which now number seventy-five, will be found on a succeeding page.

It is impossible to record in this short space, all of the activities of the busy year just past—the delightful social gatherings at the Cottage, the Thanksgiving offerings, the Christmas fes-

tivities—nor may we tell of the long list of new friends enrolled, and all the generous gifts to the Cottage.

The Executive Committee wishes to express sincere appreciation of the co-operation of the Practical Relief, the financial help given by the Benefits and Entertainments Committee, and that wonderful bag of clothing and linens from the Needlework Guild. These have made possible much of the follow-up work of the Association.

The Chairman cannot close this report, which ends two years of happy service, without an expression of deep gratitude for the fine spirit of loyalty and friendship which has come from the working force of Rest Cottage. Each chairman has been ever diligent to do her part and each committee member has given of her best. We consider it a privilege to have served Ebell in this work with its strong heart appeal.

# Resolutions Establishing Evell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage: and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman, appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each annual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, how-quests, memorials, gifts and regulations shall not become effective or be ever, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the

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Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Board of Directors thereof.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.

b. All membership fees received from sustaining, associate and life members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.

d. The Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as provided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be the Auditor of Ebel! Rest Cottage Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Executive Committee of The Ebell Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles;

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed

# Form of Bequest or Devise For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage .......dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:.........."

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "and I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the moneys derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

# Chell Rest Cottage Association By-Laws

#### ARTICI.E I.

The object of this association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

#### ARTICLE II.

Section 1. The officers of this association shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Auditor of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Sec. 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory

members of the Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE III. Duties of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SEC. 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except in those offices appointed by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be filled by the Executive Committee of

the association.

#### ARTICLE IV Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the association and of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees, approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell. She shall retain office until her successor is

# Report of the President of the Chell Juniors

m BELL}$  JUNIORS, a Department, which three years ago was considered by some of our Ebell Household as a doubtful venture, stands today a justified organization, which is helping to develop the minds and talents of the younger women of this community; it is with considerable satisfaction and a great deal of pride that I record their work for the past year.

Having been an officer in the Ebell Juniors since it was organized. I have seen it grow from a tender sapling to a splendid tree, until now it stands a joy to the eye and a delight to the passer-by. As I have said before, Ebell Juniors are going to be known all over the United States eventually, and they have made a splendid beginning, having been the inspiration for Junior organizations in Tennessee, Arkansas, Massachusetts, and Arizona.

During the past year there were seven meetings, one Musical Tea and the Annual Closing Luncheon. On March 12th, a red-letter day in the history of our Club, we were given the privilege of presiding at the President's Luncheon. Addresses were given by Mrs. Long, Mrs. Hoard, and Regge Doran. There was also given a Duet Solo by two of our own members.

With the exception of two meetings, the programs were given by our own members. These two were contributed to by the California Telephone Company, who gave a Switch Board Demonstration, and Miss Lorraine Simons, who gave a Russian Ballet number.

Organizing Department work is a very difficult and rather slow undertaking, but although we have only one real flourishing Department, the Drama, we are duly proud of it. Each year three one-act plays are directed and produced by our own girls, many of whom have studied professionally.

Our Philanthropic objective has been the California Home for Crippled Children. The first benefit given was a dance on

the evening of November 21st, and the net proceeds were \$210 During the month of November voluntary contributions amounting to \$10 were used in buying cooking utensils, dishes and paper napkins. At Christmas time a lovely bathrobe and a pair of knitted bedroom slippers were given to each child, fourteen in all: also six bed-spreads and six bed-pads. On Washington's Birthday, a Supper Dance was given and the net proceeds were \$80. used to pay some delinquent bills. Through personal interest on the part of our members, and the response to the great amount of publicity sponsored by the Juniors, the California Home for Crippled Children was saved from bankrupter, and I am happy to say that today the Home is carrying the weight of its own expenses and has all bills paid.

The Junior girls have assisted on Red Cross Drives and Salvation Army Drives; were models at the Spring Card Party given at the Ambassador; and also assisted at the Biennial Convention, and the Early California Fiesta, a gala night at Ebell. Miss Dorothy Sherrard also contributed to the program on Washington's Birthday, in the Books and Current Literature

The Bridge Teas given on the first Friday of each month for the members have been a splendid success. Girls have become acquainted and many new members have come into

Early in the Club year the hearts of the Juniors were saddened by the passing of Mrs. John A. Clinkscales, and our sincerest sympathy is with her beloved ones.

As your retiring President, I charge you with this one thing: That you do not forget the symbol of your state work, "The Torch." Keep it lighted with the love of God and Man. Supplant hatred with love and suspicion with confidence, and if you do that your pathway shall be illumined and made straight.

# Chell Juniors By-Laws

#### ARTICLE I.

#### Name.

This Department of the Ebell of Los Angeles shall be known as THE EBELL TUNIORS.

#### ARTICLE II.

#### Purbose.

The purpose of this special Department is the advancement in all lines of general culture of the younger women of the Club, and participation in social welfare work.

#### ARTICLE III.

SECTION 1. Membership in the EBELL JUNIORS is open to the daughters of the Club members and their friends under the age of 26 years.

Sec. 2. Application for membership shall follow the procedure for regular membership in THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Sec. 3. Any member of The EBELL JUNIORS may become a regular member of THE EBELL upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the difference in the entrance fee; provided such application is made within one year after membership in THE EBELL JUNIORS has lapsed.

### ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. The officers of this Department shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

Sec. 2. These officers shall be elected for one year at the annual

meeting of the Department, SEC. 3. The Executive Committee of THE EBELL shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three Ebell members, one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Committee. These, together with the officers of The EBELL JUNIORS, shall constitute the Board of Governors.

### ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the entrance fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of The

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be one-half (1/2) the amount paid by the regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. Onehalf the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

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SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.

SEC. 4. The officers of this Department shall have no power to

# Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF

"Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of

Fourth-That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is

fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

# By-Laws

#### ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

#### ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture, through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

#### ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These Officers, with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President), shall constitute the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE IV.

#### Powers and Duties of Directors.

SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, a Treasurer from the membership at large, a Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association from the membership of the Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be reported to the Executive Committee at the meeting following.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

SEC. 6. At the first regular meeting in July, the Directors shall appoint two from their own number—one of whom shall be Chairman—to serve with the President, Auditor, and Treasurer as a Budget Committee.

SEC. 7. In the absence of the President the Board of Directors shall appoint a Chairman protem from their own number.

#### ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The Chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the amount appropriated in the Budget for the current expenses of the Club.

Sec. 3. Nine members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VI.

#### Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

In the month of June following her election, the President-elect shall have the power to appoint all committees for the ensuing year and have the same ratified by the incoming Executive Committee.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all committees their bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive applications for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department. reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

In the month of June following her election, the General Curatorelect shall present to the incoming Executive Committee for ratification the names of the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

SEC. 7. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its Matron and Guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee. She shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer and shall make a monthly report to the Executive Committee of The Ebell of Los Angeles. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

SEC. 8. The Chairman of Scholarships shall, with the assistance of her committee, select the girls to be the beneficiaries of the Scholarship fund of the Ebell. Each beneficiary must at least be in High School and be vouched for by her class teacher and the Vice-Principal of the school as to her high mentality, integrity, energy and good health. All names must have the approval of the Executive Committee. The Chairman of Scholarships shall sign all requisitions on the Scholarship Funds and make a monthly report to the Executive Committee. She shall retain office until her successor is appointed.

Sec. 9. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions, given for the establishment of a Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SEC. 10. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who shall receive and receipt for all moneys due the Club and shall pay the same to the Treasurer together with a statement designating the fund to which such moneys shall be charged and shall receive from the Treasurer a receipt showing the amount of money so received and the funds to which it is to be charged. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties. She shall also act as Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring

#### ARTICLE VII.

#### Standing Committees.

SEC. 2. An Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Club shall be a standing Committee to assist in the general management of the affairs of the organization. This Committee, whose Chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

SEC. 3. The Budget Committee shall prepare a statement of the estimated receipts and expenditures of the Club for the ensuing year and submit it to the Board of Directors at their second regular meeting in July.

SEC. 4. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.

SEC. 5. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and such special meetings as are authorized by the Executive Committee.

SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.

Sec. 7. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 8. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.

SEC. 9. The Rentals Committee shall, with the assistance of the

Financial Sccretary, supervise all rentals and leases.

SEC. 10. The Social Welfare Committee shall consist of one Director, who shall be Chairman, and the Chairmen of Benefits, Practical Relief, Rest Cottage Association, and of Scholarships. This Committee shall have general supervision of the philanthropic and social welfare of this Club.

SEC. 11. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Exec-

utive Committee.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

#### Members.

SECTION 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee at the next regular meeting, when the applicant shall be voted upon by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board and, if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership, two for temporary membership, and two for Junior membership during one year.

An applicant for membership in this Club who brings a card of the current year from a Federated Club may use that card as one endorsement.

- SEC. 2. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of the election to membership.
- SEC. 3. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 4. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, Temporary.
- SEC. 5. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and who is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management,
- SEC. 6. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for three (3) years may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Secton 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay three hundred dollars (\$300), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.
- SEC. 7. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote of the members present, in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Bulletin and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such

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a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

SEC. 8. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

SEC. 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee, in recognition of merit or for the best interests of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

SEC. 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of twenty-six (26) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club, at one-half the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and any of the Study Departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Executive Committee.

SEC. 11. An application for a Junior Membership in Ebell shall follow the procedure for regular Club membership.

Any Ebell Junior may become a regular member of the Ebell upon written application to the Executive Committee and the payment of the Difference in the admission fees, provided such application be made within one year after the Junior membership has lapsed.

SEC. 12. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of three dollars (\$3.00) per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 13. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE IX.

#### Dues.

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25).

SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be twenty dollars (\$20). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

- SEC. 3. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interests of the Club.
- SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members and have one-half their dues remitted.
- SEC. 5. The Executive Committee may by unanimous vote and where the need is apparent remit one-half of the admission fees and dues of wives of resident clergymen when application for regular membership is made.

#### ARTICLE X.

### Meetings.

SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday in October, a regular meeting of the Club shall be held on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.

SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular, life, and honorary life members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.

Sec. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.

SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a. m.

SEC. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

#### ARTICLE XI.

#### Elections.

Section 1. All Officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

#### Nominations.

Sec. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

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The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. of the date set; three members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. day in June, provided, however, that the President-elect may call special meetings of the incoming Executive Committee during the month of June following her election, to ratify appointments to committees and the officers of the departments for the ensuing year.

#### ARTICLE XII.

#### Club Actiquities

- SECTION 1. This Club shall have four definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs under the direction of the Second Vice-President; (2) the Study Departments under the direction of the General Curator: (3) the Social Welfare Work in charge of the Chairmen of Rest Cottage Association: of Scholarship: of Practical Relief: of Benefits: and of one Director: and (4) the Ebell Juniors, who shall have self government, subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of Ebell.
- SEC. 2. Each Study Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee. All Curators are subject to and shall report to and confer with the General Curator.
- RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.
- Rule 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.
- RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- RULE 5. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.
- RULE 6. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.
- Sec. 3. At a regular meeting in May each Department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the Department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator-elect the first week in June, to be presented by her to the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

#### Business.

- Section 1. All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.
- SEC. 2. Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

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#### ARTICLE XIV

Section 1. Not fewer than one hundred (100) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending at a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting,

SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted, shall, when certified by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. Only those eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

#### ARTICLE XV.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Roberts' Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

#### ARTICLE XVI.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

### ARTICLE XVIII.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regulir meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1924. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

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
