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
Dr. Adrian Ebell, a distinguished German scholar, realizing woman's limited opportunity for mental development and the necessity of fitting her to cope more effectively with the strenuous and complex forms of modern life, conceived the idea of establishing an international Academy with headquarters at Berlin and tributary chapters in all parts of the world, for the object of developing feminine mentality along serious and scientific lines.

The first of the several chapters on the Pacific Coast bearing his name was the Oakland Ebell, organized in 1876. The Los Angeles Ebell, established in 1894, with its central organization and various study departments, was modeled upon the same lines as this admirably planned Mother Club.

The plan of study for the year includes the history and art of Belgium, Holland and Germany, the early religious pictures, the Nibelungenlied and subjects from Goethe and Schiller.

Annual Report

"Incorporated for the advancement of all lines of general culture," Ebell looks back upon a year of well spent activity; not alone restricted to individual progress, but tending also to that wider development of home, city, state and country.

The Departments have given opportunity for individual growth, while at the open meetings subjects of broader significance have been presented, enabling the Club as an organization to consider and endorse measures intended for the benefit of the community at large.

Fifty-seven members have qualified during the year, two names have been added to the list of Life Members, and Mrs. Robert J. Burdette has been elected an Honorary Life Member. Twenty-two Associate and ten Temporary Members have availed themselves of the Club privileges during their sojourn in the city.

About 3400 guests have been entertained at the open Monday Meetings.

It is with deep sorrow we record the names of six of our Active Members who have been called to the "Land of the Hereafter": Mrs. Homer Laughlin, Mrs. F. H. Fellows, Mrs. J. A. Clark, Mrs. William A. Phelps, Miss Frances Maurice, Mrs. I. W. Shirley.

During the year the Club has acquired 147 shares of Ebell Building Association stock, making the total holdings 1494 shares, representing an investment of \$14,940.00. Five shares were presented by Mrs. C. N. Flint.

The sum of \$501.61 has been expended on furniture and permanent improvements.

Assistance has been given or memberships have been taken in the Juvenile Improvement Association, the Archaeological Institute, the Maternity Hospital, the Bethlehem Institute, the Registration Bureau, the Barlow Sanatorium, the Junior Republic, the Legal Aid Society, and smaller donations made to many other worthy cause. Ebell has also furnished the Junior Club room

of the Young Woman's Christian Association, at a cost of \$500, the Club starting the fund with \$100, and Mrs. John H. Norton, Chairman of the Furnishing Committee, having obtained subscriptions amounting to \$400 for this purpose.

The Club is indebted to many of its members and friends for

books, pictures and other gifts.

The Departments, under the efficient management of the General Curator, Mrs. W. L. Jones, now number ten, all doing work so earnest and active that this short report can in no way do them justice. These Departments are Ebell's workshops, where matters of science, art, civics or philosophy can, by their members, be worked down, brought from the abstract to the concrete, from a passive to an active force. As growth and youth are synonymous, all who enter the Departments find that wondrous fount sought by many, but realized only by those who learn in wisdom's school that "we are never old while we grow."

The Department of Parliamentary Law met each Monday, before the general session, until March, under the capable curatorship of the late Mrs. J. A. Clark. The instructor, Mrs. J. A. Osgood, Club Parliamentarian, has given the members excel-

lent drill in parliamentary procedure.

The Department of Science, in charge of Mrs. Jay B. Millard, assisted by Mrs. Sidney J. Parsons, met the third Tuesday of each month, and has witnessed a great material growth, due in part to the breadth and scope of subjects discussed.

The Department of French, in charge of Mrs. E. C. Bellows and Mrs. P. Newmark, has held three classes weekly under the instructorship of Professor Gabriel Durnerin. In March, at an open meeting, this Department cleverly presented two French

plays.

The Department of Current Topics, under the management of Mrs. Frank A. Kelly, has given to the Club, at open meetings, seven interesting programs on vital subjects of the day. This work has fallen naturally under the heads of Foreign Affairs, Home Affairs and New Books. Each program has been ably presented by Club members only, and was followed by general discussion of interest and profit.

The newest Department, that of Expression, has done enthusiastic work under the leadership of Mrs. William W. Orcutt and Mrs. Fred Hooker Jones. The aim has been to develop the power of original expression, and to that end extempore speaking and debate have been important features, as have story telling and more general literary work. This Department gave an interesting program for the open meeting of April sixth.

The Department of Music, under the curatorship of Mrs. Marion Welsh, has done exceedingly good work, the music of different nations being studied, with Mrs. Edwin G. Voigt as instructor. A delightful program from living composers was rendered in January before the Club.

The Department of Art and Travel began the year with its usual enthusiasm, Mrs. A. J. Chandler acting as Curator, and later Mrs. C. Q. Stanton, with Miss Alice Mitton continuing as instructor. The first half of the year was devoted to the Napoleonic Period and Modern French Art, the latter half to Dutch and Flemish Art. Miss Mitton's collection of pictures added much to the pleasure of the work. February third, this Department furnished a unique program, entitled "The Street Cries of Nations."

In the Department of Shakespeare, with Mrs. John S. Thayer and later Mrs. F. W. Johnson as Curator, and Mrs. Edward North as instructor, the plays "Two Gentlemen of Verona," "King Lear" and "The Tempest" have been studied. By means of papers and discussion, excellent work has been done.

The Department of Civics, under the leadership of Mrs. Russell J. Waters and Mrs. William Baurhyte, has been a practical one, designed to answer some of the many needs of the complex living of to-day. Many plans have been launched or assisted, such as the Legal Aid Society, whereby the poor are to be legally helped in trouble; the Club Women's Registration and Information Bureau, where the woman who can do things well is made known to the woman who wants things done well. This Department has placed itself on record as favoring the movement for the lessening of the hours of child labor, the introduction of certified milk through the Los Angeles County Medical

Association, and has co-operated with the Los Angeles Civic Association in the campaign against billboards. An interesting program was given to the Club in March.

The Department of Books and Conversation, under the leadership of Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, assisted by Mrs. Stephen S. Wilder and Mrs. Eugene T. Pettigrew, has furnished instructive programs to an enthusiastic monthly audience. The course this year, one of comparative literature, dealing with the drama, poetry, and old and new values in fiction, was particularly varied, and interesting. The luncheons which followed were in charge of Mrs. T. T. Knight.

The Club has enjoyed thirty-five regular Monday afternoon programs, exclusive of the Charter Day Reception, October 28th, and the Children's Christmas Party, December 30th. The Chairman of the Program Committee, Mrs. Willitts J. Hole, and her able assistants, furnished excellent programs. The musical work has been of a high order; such names as the Mendelssohn String Quartette and Milan Opera Company recall delightful afternoons in the early season; later, a charming program was rendered with ballads of Early England, Ireland and Scotland, sung in costume by Louise Nixon Hill, with dialect stories by Miss Kavanaugh; an excellent matinee was furnished by Mrs. Robert Wankowski, of the Club, assisted by Mr. Natorp Blumenfeld, violinist; a recital of French songs was given by Miss Blanche Ruby, assisted by Miss Smith, pianist; and a remarkably fine interpretation of Salome was presented by Miss Lelia Holterhoff. In lighter vein was an afternoon of Spanish song and dance.

The Christmas program was in charge of Mrs. Edward C. Dieter.

The Honovary Members have been particularly obliging this year. In the early season, Lieutenant General Adna R. Chaffee addressed the Club on "Cuba, China and the Philippines;" later, Rev. Robert J. Burdette spoke on "Woman's Sense of Humor," and Mr. B. R. Baumgardt vividly reviewed the scenes of old Pompeii.

Among other speakers. Dr. Titian Coffey showed how "the other half" live in this city, and Rev. Dana Bartlett explained the great work of the Bethlehem Institute. The Club traveled over that country of special interest, Palestine, with one of its members, Mrs. A. C. Smither, and wandered in the forest primeval with Mr. E. A. Mills, United States Forester, also made a trip to Ellis Island with Dr. John Willis Baer, and watched the mighty stream of immigration pour into this country, realizing that in these foreigners its future brawn and strength is largely vested.

Among the literary days, those to be especially remembered were the afternoons with Mr. Mestayer on Henrik Ibsen, Mrs. Merrill Moore Grigg in her wonderfully realistic reading of that soul problem, "The Scarlet Letter," and Miss Cora Mel Patten, who gave a dramatic interpretation of the "Sunken Bell."

In Art, an instructive lecture on "Phidias and the Parthenon" was given by Dr. H. H. Powers, and later Miss Locke spoke on "Architecture as an Expression of Race Consciousness."

The Children's Christmas Party was, as usual, the one time when the little ones of Ebell made merry at their mothers' club house. Under the supervision of Mrs. B. R. Baumgardt, they enjoyed a delightful little play, followed by the time-honored appearance of Santa Claus and his pack. Toys brought by the children were sent to the Day Nursery, Bethlehem Institute and the Church of the Neighborhood.

Much pleasure has been derived from the cup of tea that cheers, which has been served by the hospitable Chairman of the House Committee, Mrs. Edward C. Dieter, and her assist-tributed to the general sociability

The final meeting of the Club followed the annual luncheon, June 22nd, at which time the retiring President, Mrs. P. G. Hubert, installed the officers for the following year.




Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

By=Laws

Article 1

The incorporate name of this Society shall be the Ebell of Los Angeles.

Article 2

The object of the Society is advancement in all lines of general culture.

Article 3

The officers of this Society shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of Seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Article 4

Powers and Duties of Directors

- Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Society.

Sec. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

Article 5

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Society, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meetings of the Society.

- Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Society.
 - Sec. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- Sec. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 5. The Curators of the Sections shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

Article 6

Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Society, and shall be an honorary member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

Sec. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- Sec. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall be ex-officio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Society and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- Sec. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Society, and of the Executive Committee,

and shall submit a report at the annual meeting, sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all Committees their instructions in writing.

- Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Society; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Society and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Society in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Society.
- Sec. 6. The Curator shall keep posted upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Society a statement of the time and place of all Section meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Society. She shall ascertain which Section a new member desires to enter. She shall receive application for the formation of new Sections, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Section, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make reports of the same at the annual meeting of the Society. She is also ex-officio chairman of Committee on Sections.
- Sec. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee, who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Society. She shall keep an inventory of all such property, and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as Financial Secretary.

Article 7 Standing Committees

Section 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing;
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Sections:
- 5. House Committee.
- Sec. 2. The Committee on Membership, upon receiving the properly endorsed names of applicants for membership, shall investigate the same and report at the next regular meeting of the Executive Committee; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- Sec. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Society.
- Sec. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- Sec. 5. The Committee on Sections shall assist in the organization of Sections, and advise the Curator of Sections in arranging their course of study.
- Sec. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- Sec. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Article 8

Members

Section 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her name shall be endorsed by three regular members in good standing and of more than one year's membership. The application shall be handed to the Membership Committee. Upon receiving the endorsement of the Committee and having been posted two weeks, it shall be voted upon by the Executive Committee at its next meeting. Endorsers shall be personally responsible for applicant.

The notice of acceptance shall be sent to the proposed member by the Clerk, together with bill for admission and half yearly dues.

No member of the Society may sign more than three applications for regular membership, or more than three for associate or temporary membership, during one year.

- Sec. 2. Business women, members of the Society, whose hours of business are such as to make only an occasional attendance possible at the regular meetings of the Society, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, have their dues remitted one-half.
- Sec. 3. Any member in good and regular standing who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Society for five (5) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.
- Sec. 4. The wives of resident Clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of regular initiation fee and half the annual dues.

- Sec. 5. The wives of Army and Navy Officers may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- Sec. 6. A non-resident may become an associate member for the current year by having her name duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues. This privilege shall be extended for one year only. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the Corporation, nor be privileged to attend business meetings. She may become a regular member at any time by the payment of the initiation fee.
- Sec. 7. A non-resident may become a temporary member by having her name presented by one member in good and regular standing, with the approval of the Chairman of the Membership Committee, upon the payment of \$2.00 per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- Sec. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- Sec. 9. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous vote of the Committee on Membership.
- Sec. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues.

Sec. 12. Honorary life membership in this Society may be given by vote of the Society in recognition of distinguished services. Such honorary membership shall confer all rights and privileges to ordinary membership without payment of dues.

Sec. 13. Members in good and regular standing who resign may, upon application, receive a resignation card stating their standing.

Sec. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

Article 9

Dues

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

Sec. 2. The annual dues shall be \$8.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March, each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues; if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership.

Sec. 3. Any member paying \$100 shall receive a certificate of life membership and shall be exempt from payment of dues.

Sec. 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Society.

Sec. 5. Members who may be absent from the city for one year or more shall pay half the annual dues.

Article 10 Meetings

Section 1. Excepting during the months of July, August and September, a regular meeting of the Society shall take place on each Monday at 2:30 p. m., at which Sections may report, papers be presented, or business be transacted.

Sec. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Society for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Society.

Sec. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.

Sec. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.

Sec. 5. The semi-annual business meeting of the Society shall take place on the first Monday in January.

Article 11 Elections

- Section 1'. The annual meeting for the election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.
- Sec. 2. A nominating ballot shall be sent to every member of the Club by the 14th of April.
- Sec. 3. Such ballots shall be returned by the first Monday in May, and shall be handed to the Committee on Nominations, which shall consist of three members, two of whom shall be selected by the Club members on the first Monday in May, and the third shall be named by the Executive Committee.

It shall be the duty of this Committee to notify each nomineer receiving twenty-five votes, or over, of her nomination, and ascertain which candidates accept, and which decline nominations, and when ascertained, the Committee shall prepare the ballot and make all arrangements for the annual election. If, however, no candidate shall receive the required twenty-five votes for some certain office, the matter of supplying a name shall be left to the discretion of the Committee on Nominations.

- Sec. 4. Elections shall take place by ballot, and a plurality vote shall elect.
- Sec. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election. Officers shall be elected for one year. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.
- Sec. 6. No member shall be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms.
- Sec. 7. Installation of Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee the fourth Thursday of June.

Article 12

- Section 1. The Society shall be divided into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Society may deem advisable.
- Rule 1. All members of Sections must be members of "The Ebell of Los Angeles."
- Rule 2. Members wishing to form Sections must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- Rule 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Sections and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Section Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Sections are to meet and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a secretary to assist her in the Section.
- Rule 4. Sections have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- Rule 5. Sections may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Sections may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.
- Rule 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Society.

Article 13

All communications on business must be made in writing.

Article 14

Ten members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee, which will include amendments, complaints concerning neglect of duty or transcending of privilege by any officer or member, or concerning any other matter pertaining to the Society. The Executive Committee shall at once refer the communication to the Board of Directors for immediate attention, after which it shall be referred back to the Society for final vote.

Article 15

Not less than twenty-five (25) members of this Society personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Society, or to add new By-Laws thereto, may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, and any such repeal, alteration, amendment or new By-Law so adopted shall, when adopted by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

Article 16

All meetings of the Society and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Roberts' Rules of Order.

Article 17

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day," commemorating the organization of the Society. A reception shall be given on this day, when the President of the previous year shall present the members of the Society to the newly elected officers.

Article 18

No notice of any of the stated meetings of this Society or of the Board of Directors or of any of the Committees or other convening bodies of the Society, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws, need be given. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the bulletin board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

Article 19

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Society, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Society have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the laws and regulations of the Society, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these laws and regulations.

Article 20

A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Society, adopted at the first regular meeting on the 1st day of September, 1898, and as amended and revised from time to time by the Society up to and inclusive of April, 1908. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Society at legally called meetings of the Society and of the Board of Directors as required by law.
