President's Report

1917:1918

ACAREFUL survey of the activities and achievements of Ebell during the last two years gives me reason to be deeply grateful for the privilege of being President of so responsive a body of women. No appeal for help, and the appeals have been many and continuous, has come in vain. The needs of Armenia, Belgium, France, Italy and Poland, of the Red Cross and the Red Star have played upon your heart strings till the purse strings have been widely loosened.

Contributions of over eleven hundred dollars each have been made to the General Federation of Women's Clubs for Furlough Homes for American Soldiers in France; and the Navy Base Hospital No. 3, with its unit of Los Angeles Doctors and Nurses, for a wireless Telephonograph equipment, consisting of a mahogany Victrola case containing a Victor phonograph, two Edison storage batteries and an Audio-Frequency wireless transmitter, and another case containing fifty-four movable bed telephone receivers and eighty phonograph records. This is a wonderful invention of Earl C. Hanson, son of our member, Mrs. Charles L. Hanson, whereby music from a victrola in a distant part of a hospital is transmitted wirelessly to a 'phone attached to the bed of any patient desiring to listen, without disturbing others who should have quiet. One or all of the fifty-four phones may be used at one time, and we

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hope the tedium of many a weary convalescent hour may be lightened for our wounded men in France, by its use.

Five hundred dollars of Club funds were appropriated for each of the two drives of the Y. W. C. A. and for the Y. M. C. A., these amounts being increased to approximately five thousand dollars each by the personal gifts of our members, and by the Committees organized of Ebell women.

Our Liberty Loan Committee consisting of Mrs. Lewis Clark Carlisle, Mrs. Charles N. Flint and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, received subscriptions from Ebell members as follows:

of which \$10,500.00 was subscribed from Club funds. We have also purchased the limit of \$1000.00 in War Savings Stamps.

These war times are teaching us the value of small things—spare minutes, teaspoons of sugar, ounces of wheat flour, small economies and small gifts—as we find them, when multiplied by the many, transmuted into countless socks and sweaters, tons of sugar, pounds of flour, our limit in thrift stamps and thousands of dollars for war needs.

We are proud of the fact that over \$4,350.00 has been given in small donations by our members for the various works of relief, \$1,620.00 for our Allies, the remainder for local funds for war work or for Red Star or Red Cross.

Mrs. William Read, Chairman of Social Service, Mrs. Charles N. Flint, Chairman of Philanthropy, and Mrs. George Warder Bayly, representing the Methodist Hospital, have by their broad vision and untiring efforts, established Ebell's own contribution to the philanthropies of the city, the Ebell Rest Cottage.

The great activity of our Club year, the one dearest to our hearts, has been the Red Cross work of our Auxiliary. It was organized under our Los Angeles Chapter before our entrance into the war. It is growing steadily in numbers, interest and in work accomplished, to the gratifying totals set forth in the report of the Vice-Chairman and Purchasing Agent, Mrs. Ilot Johnson, to whose boundless enthusiasm and untiring devotion, executive ability and tactful personality much of the success is due.

In May, 1917, the Social Service Committee under Mrs. William Read, Chairman, was merged with the Auxiliary, turning over to the Red Cross sewing machines, materials, workers and equipment, to which we have added constantly as the work has grown. Classes in Home Nursing were formed and many of our members have continued through the hospital training course and classes in first aid, dietetics and canteen service. Our surgical dressings classes continued work throughout the hot summer of 1917 under Mrs. O. O. Witherbee, and during the winter with Mrs. George B. Macaulay, Chairman, classes have worked four days a week with the gratifying results shown in the report. The club knitters are legion—the flying needles seem never still. Mrs. George H. Mosher and her committee added substantially to the Red Cross funds from the sales of the Jumble Inn held in the patio each Monday during May and June.

So far as we can ascertain, every member of Ebell is a member of the Red Cross. A most thrilling scene was presented on May 6th, when the President, as Chairman of Ebell Auxiliary, administered the oath of allegiance first to our uniformed Red Cross workers, then to the Executive Committee and the audience, who rose en masse and, with uplifted right hand, repeated the solemn pledge. Many Ebell members are also Chairmen of other Auxiliaries, or Salvage Precincts, while every division of Red Cross activities at headquarters or chapter house finds some Ebell woman at work.

Through its officers and various members, Ebell has been represented on the boards and committees of all the war activities of the city. They have also fully carried on the work of the usual and much needed local civic and philanthropic organizations, for a list of which consult our Forward Work Council.

We are proud of our member, Doctor Helen H. Woodroffe, who has been in active relief work in France for a year; and of the gallant men whose

names are inscribed on our Honor Roll; and of our brave members, their mothers, wives and sisters, who have sent them off with a smile and a God speed! May we but live up to their splendid example, and do what we can to help win the war!

Our Special Guest Luncheons on the first Thursdays of each month, following the interesting programs of the Social Science Department, have been the outstanding social features of our year. The attendance of members and guests has averaged two hundred; the table appointments and decorations arranged by Mrs. S. E. Faroat, Luncheon Chairman have been beautiful; and the after-luncheon speeches have been thrillingly interesting and varied, as many speakers of note have been our guests.

Our regular Departments, luncheons and Monday programs have sustained the high order of excellence for which they have ever been noted, and your President wishes to thank all the Curators, Officers, Chairmen of Committees and members of the same, who have stood so loyally by their Club duties in spite of the increased call upon their time and interests by the Red Cross and other war activities. Not one has failed to shoulder the extra burden, and this generous loyalty and co-operation of officers and members alike has made possible the wonderful work we as a Club have accomplished—merely hinted at in the foregoing figures—and has made the year one of great joy and pride to your President.

We have been banded together in a labor of love with a spirit of loyalty and devotion to our Country, that Liberty, Fraternity, and Equality shall be the heritage of all, and Justice and Right shall prevail.

Report of the Recording Secretary

BELL'S twenty-third year began on Monday, October first, 1917, with a new realization of human interdependence brought about by the Great World War. In her opening address the President, Mrs. Ashley, challenged each to give her best service. Feeling safety and pride in her capable leadership, the members have made gratifying response.

Mrs. Grantland S. Long has proven her whole-hearted allegiance and given efficient service as First Vice-President. As Chairman of Printing, she supervised the Year Book. She has carried through the campaign for Furlough Home Fund; completed the two Honor Rolls of the one hundred forty-four young men who have gone from our midst in defense of our country; and has represented our President at various meetings.

Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, Second Vice-President, as Chairman of the Program Committee, has supplied thirty-nine Monday programs which have brought pleasure and profit to the members and friends. The Program Chairman was able to augment the printed programs by a remarkable list of important War speakers whose names follow: Ex-Ambassador James W. Gerard; A. J. Sacks, of the Russian Mission; Miss Jane Addams, of Hull House, Chicago; Mrs. George H. Bass, Chicago; Dr. Carl S. Patton; Congressman H. Z. Osborne; Mr. Motley H. Flint; Madame Arabella Angellini, for Italian Relief; Lieu-

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tenant McKinnon of Scottish Infantry; Louise Closser Hale, for the Stage Women's War Relief; Mrs. Robert J. Burdette, Federal Food Commission; Congressmen Lewis and Adamson; Father Patrice Flinn, of the Diocese of Paris; and M. William Sandoz and Madame M. Lantes, representing the Relief Committee for Invalided Soldiers, Reforms No. 2.

Mrs. W. W. Homan, Third Vice-President, Chairman of the House Committee, was early incapacitated by ill health, and Mrs. Grantland S. Long attended to her duties until the appointment of Mrs. Benjamin Franklin Perkins, to this office. Since December twenty-seventh, Mrs. Perkins has attended carefully to the material needs of the Club. Co-operating with the National Food Conservation Committee, the Club voted to restrict the serving of teas to one Monday each month. Strict observance of all wheatless rules has been maintained in the serving of war cakes.

Mrs. Sidney M. Haskell, Chairman of Credentials, reports three thousand seven hundred two guests entertained during the year, and directs attention to the fact that lectures have been as well attended as musicales.

Mrs. Tom P. Robertson, Chairman of Ushers, has been tireless in observing rules adopted for the safety and comfort of the Club.

Mrs. William M. Kinney, Chairman of Club Welfare, has kept close watch over the Ebell family in order that recognition should be given as occasion demanded.

Mrs. Edwin G. Howard, Chairman of Courtesy Committee, manifesting the cordial spirit of Ebell, has graciously welcomed all members and friends.

Mrs. Milton E, Hammond, Chairman of the Decorating Committee, has effectively accomplished her work. The varied artistic effects achieved have delighted all eyes.

The following resolutions have been adopted by the Club during the past year: Resolutions addressed to Congress: Favoring increase of Letter Carriers' Salaries; Favoring reduction of Postal Rates; and

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Endorsing the Food Commission in limiting the use of barley in brewing. Resolutions to Los Angeles County Supervisors: Urging the erection of new Nurses' Home at the Los Angeles County Hospital; and Favoring increase of School Budget. Resolutions to City Council: Relating to the City Inspection of Buildings; For increase in salary of Police-women; Favoring Efficiency Budget; Favoring protection of Cooked Food; Endorsing Fire Protective Association; Endorsing Industrial Home for Women; and Favoring Maintenance of Industrial Standards for Women and Children in War Time. Resolutions of sympathy on the deaths of Mrs. Anna Hall Ashley, Mr. George Gibson, Mrs. Lydia B. Torrey and Mr. William L. Jones. Resolution Endorsing Mrs. Josiah Evans Cowles for a second term as President of the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

The Club year ended with a delightful Garden Party on Monday, June twenty-fourth, at the Hooker Gardens, 325 West Adams Street. While enjoying social pleasure, Ebell maintained her habit of service by giving the entire proceeds, amounting to twelve hundred sixteen dollars, to the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Steadfastly adhering to her high standard of patriotic loyalty, Ebell has been ready to respond to each call with both workers and money. Opportunity is not what may come to us tomorrow, but what we make out of today. The world is not measured by the reach of our arms nor the horizon of our vision, but by the never ceasing influence of our thoughts and our acts.

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Report of the General Curator

THE departments of Ebell may readily be separated into two groups, one, that of the "Program Departments," where the topic for the day is presented by one or more speakers: the other group, that of the "Study Classes," wherein all present are supposed to take part. To the first group belong Social Science, Books and Conversation, Art and Travel, Drama, and War Economics. To the study group belong the departments of Browning, Emerson, Shakespeare, Parliamentary Law, Language Classes, (including English, French and Spanish) and the Choral.

It is an interesting fact to note that the average attendance of this year in every Study department was below that of the same department last year, while in the Program departments, in every instance, this year's average exceeded that of last year.

The work of the departments for the year just closed followed very closely the announcements as given in the monthly bulletin. All programs were composed to harmonize with present day conditions, and the Great War, consciously or not, was the real topic underlying all discussions.

The Social Science department, Mrs. Jay B. Millard, Curator, emphasized throughout the year the Individual Responsibility of One and All in the world today. "Reform, ethical or political, national or international, can be brought about only through readjustment of the ideals of the individual." The papers and lectures were of very great value, and

covered many subjects, closing with a fitting climax, "The Potentialities of the Coming Race."

The departments of Books and Conversation, Mrs. George H. Kress, Curator, gave reviews of books, including many on war topics; the reading of letters from the front; of poems from the trenches; and closed with a very dramatic reading of an up-to-theminute war play, "Man's Efficiency." At each meeting a short time was given to literary notes from current magazines.

The Art and Travel department, Mrs. A. B. Cooke, Curator, continued the work of last year, The Study of American Cities and American Art. Great emphasis was given the fact that "Patriotism demands that we keep our artistic standards as high as possible, for a nation with high artistic ideals always stands high in the scale of civilization." Programs were illustrated by means of lantern slides, and by exhibitions of pictures, oriental rugs, pottery, and tiles.

Mrs. W. B. Scarborough, Curator of the Drama Department, scoured the vicinity of Los Angeles to bring us all phases of modern drama. We learned of The Community Drama, The Art of the Kinema, The Japanese Stage of Today (also of The Ancient Drama of Japan), The Little Theater Movement and The One Act Play. The work was illustrated by informal talks, papers, lectures, and by plays reviewed, read, or acted. "The Tents of the Arabs" and "Six Who Pass While the Lentils Boil" are two short plays which were beautifully presented by students of Los Angeles Junior College under the direction of their Instructor, Mrs. Miller.

With their much beloved Curators, Mrs. Thomas B. Stowell and Mrs. Sidney J. Parsons, the members of the Browning department concluded the work begun last year, the reading and discussion of "The Ring and The Book." This wonderful poem was the inspiration of many fine papers. The year's work closed with an address by Doctor George Wharton James, subject, "A Personal Appreciation of Browning."

The Emerson department continued reading and discussion of the essays in the volume entitled "Nature Addresses." These discussions, led by the Curator, Mrs. David Unruh, brought out many beautiful and helpful thoughts. The several points of view added much to the interest. The year closed with an address by Reverend E, Stanton Hodgin, subject, "Idealism."

In the Shakespeare department, Mrs. Charles Stavnow, Curator, "Patriotism" was the theme for the year. This topic was admirably developed in the discussion of the historical plays, led by Mrs. Edward North, Instructor. The final conclusion of the department was, that today, as well as in Shakespeare's time, Victory or Defeat depends upon the motive governing the action.

The Parliamentary Law Department, Mrs. Charles McKelvey, Curator and Instructor, did faithful work in teaching woman to fit herself for business meetings; to understand the forms of parliamentary procedure; to know the purpose and place of motions used in ordinary assemblies; and to preside at meetings with the dignity that comes from the consciousness of doing and saying the right thing at the right time in the right way.

The three language classes did good work. The English class, Curator, Mrs. Malone Joyce; Instructor, Mrs. Ilot Johnson, continued painstaking

work in the study of pure English and in the nicety of the choice of word to fit the thought. The French class, Mrs. J. B. Gwynne, Curator; Madame de Kerpezdron, Instructor, specialized this year in conversational work. "Details of the Beautiful Buildings of Paris" was the subject used to develop conversational powers. At each meeting Madame de Kerpezdron gave a short lecture on French historical characters. Three meetings during the year were devoted to programs which included French music, vocal and instrumental, readings, poems, anecdotes, and short plays. Monsieur Louis Briois gave a delightful morning, speaking with much understanding and feeling on the unknown heroes of France; his talk was interspersed with many beautiful anecdotes, not only of the plain soldier in the trenches but also of the brave mothers and sisters at home. The Spanish department, Miss J. Maud Blanchard, Curator; Señora Aurelia Borquez de Whenthoff, Instructor, continued the work begun last year, using the conversational method; having as text book "A Series of Spanish Conversations in the Conjugational Order"-Whenthoff. This year, however, there were two classes, one for beginners, the other for second year students. Realizing the importance of frequent practice in conversational work in learning a language, several study groups were formed on the Big Sister plan, and regular meetings were held in addition to the classroom work.

The Choral department, Mrs. Reynold Blight, Curator; Mrs. Abbie Norton Jamison, Director; Mrs. Guy F. Bush, Accompanist, gave special attention to Folk Songs, thus getting a fuller understanding of national characteristics. American music was represented by several negro spirituals and by the best

known of our patriotic songs. At all times great emphasis was placed upon pure enunciation, and upon the laws of time and rhythm.

Our club year began with thirteen departments and closed with thirteen; one, the Bible department, was discontinued after two meetings, as its Curator, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, was absent from the city during five months. Another department, "War Economics," was formed, Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt and Mrs. Charles N. Flint, Curators, and weekly meetings were held during two months. Food Conservation, including canning, drying and preserving; Food preparation; Meat and Wheat Substitutes were ably discussed and demonstrated by our speakers, who were mainly from the teaching force of the Home Economics department of our Normal and High Schools. Many valuable recipes were distributed; great stress at all times was laid upon the importance of all housewives abstaining from the use of any wheat whatsoever at the present time, the best substitute being a combination of several other products, as barley, corn flour, rice flour, and potato flour.

An important phase of department activity for the year just closed was the great interest in all that concerned the welfare of our soldiers and sailors. Whatever the cause presented to any department, it met a ready response, were it an opportunity to subscribe for a membership in Red Cross or Red Star, to purchase tickets for Red Cross benefits, to send books and magazines to the camps, or to subscribe to the Furlough Homes, that wonderful movement of the Women's Clubs to provide in France a place of repose far back from the fighting line, for our battle-weary men. During all meetings a large percentage of the members knitted industriously, and

the musical click of their needles was the low rhythmic answer of woman to her country's call.

The French department was the first one to undertake any independent war relief; through individual subscriptions of its members it adopted for one year a little mite of a French girl, whose mother had been widowed by the war. This was given as an offering of love and gratitude to the land of Lafayette.

Through the courtesy and kindness of Mr. Samuel I. Keese and his friends (all members of the Autochrome Club) the Social Science department presented a very beautiful entertainment, called An Evening of Color. This included an explanation of the process of the preparation of the plates used in photographing in the natural colors; a very wonderful exhibition of lantern slides, picturing trees, flowers, desert and mountain scenery, all in the natural colors; and most unique of all, the microscopic projection of the growth of crystalline forms in color, as shown by the polariscope. The proceeds of the sale of tickets provided for the relief of one Belgian Baby for one year, and for a six months' scholarship for our local scholarship fund. This fund is used to assist children to remain in school, who, owing to present conditions, might be obliged to become wage earners at too early an age.

For the benefit of our Red Cross Auxiliary fund, the Spanish department gave two representations of "Scenes from Spanish Speaking Countries," being living moving pictures interspersed with song. Many members of the Spanish colony assisted, adding much to the beauty and success of the entertainment, and providing an opportunity for better reciprocal understanding and appreciation between our neighbors

to the south and ourselves. The Mexican Market in the patio added a goodly sum to the Red Cross fund. By request, the Spanish entertainment was repeated at the submarine base at San Pedro for the pleasure of the men stationed there.

In keeping with the times, few luncheons were given at the club this year, and then only in celebration of some special occasion. The only exception was the Special Guest luncheon, every first Thursday, immediately following the Social Science Section, and which afforded an opportunity to club members and to local and visiting celebrities to know one another. Our President, Mrs. Chester C. Ashley, presided at these guest luncheons and introduced the speakers.

A warm word of appreciation is due the officers of the departments who gave many hours of their time to provide us all with entertainment and diversion; who furnished us a quiet hour of relaxation with the poets, dramatists and philosophers; who brought speakers on the great questions of the day, who presented squarely and fairly the facts and conditions of the times, and thus helped us to keep a steady, sane grasp of the situation. Sometimes our Curators may have felt that the times were too big, too full of portent for the building of programs, but they went steadily on in the line of accepted duty—truly Soldiers of the Home Guard.

In closing, the writer wishes to pay a tribute of love and appreciation to her able and kind assistant, Mrs. J. Elton Lang, who was ever ready with a smile to do whatever fell to her lot.

Red Cross Report

-06

THE Ebell Auxiliary of the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Red Cross was organized by Mrs. William Read in May, 1917.

Under the leadership of Mrs. O. O. Witherbee during the summer of 1917, the Surgical Dressings instruction was enthusiastically attended by Ebell members. When the Club year opened in October, the Chairman, Mrs. George B. Macaulay, developed a strong corps of instructors. One hundred fifty of the members are enrolled. 12,800 yards of gauze have been used at a cost of \$600.00. The cost of the muslin and cotton used make the total expenditure \$662.37. The Department has recut large quantities of dressings sent out by Red Cross headquarters.

2,984 yards of muslin and outing flannel were bought at a cost of \$451.95. The material for 38 Aviators' Jackets, emblems, needles, thread, tapes and buttons brought this amount to \$572.46. 166 suits of pajamas, 482 hospital bed shirts, 25 Aviators' Jackets have been turned in to headquarters, leaving on hand July 1st, 61 suits of pajamas and 13 Aviators' Jackets. 165 hemmed pieces of old linen, 35 miscellaneous articles make a total of 873 articles. All garments were cut under the direction of Mrs. Gustave Pockles.

The work of this Department has been carried on by a group of quiet workers. Sewing is not a novel service appealing to the romantic, but a prosaic everyday task, one performed solely from a truly patriotic sense of duty.

By teaching the beginners and encouraging the experienced, Mrs. William Hope Henderson and Mrs.

William R. Dickinson have so increased the numbers of the knitters that the services of Mrs. Frederick B. Braden as Secretary were needed to take over the task of accounting. 300 active knitters were reported at the close of the Club year.

1,094 socks, 358 sweaters, 175 helmets, 128 mufflers, 60 wristlets, 43 miscellaneous articles, a total of 1,858 garments, were turned in to headquarters, leaving on hand July 1st, 61 pounds of wool, 67 sets of needles, and 234 unfinished garments. 147 garments were made and presented from wool bought in the market.

The Salvage Department was organized by Mrs. Herbert P. Barton in June, 1918, showing a return for the first month's work of \$73.58. The organization has twelve Precinct Captains, who are enthusiastic and ready for the work of the coming year.

Ebell Rest Cottage

N December twenty-ninth, nineteen-seventeen, through the generosity and co-operation of Miss Lillian B. Flanders and the Board of the Methodist Hospital of Southern California, Ebell became the owner of a small cottage and large lot in the Oliveta Tract at 1305 West 95th Street.

At this cottage Miss Flanders had helped Ebell to care for many convalescing women and here Ebell purposes maintaining a modest "Home" where the good work may be carried on, where rest and atmosphere may do their part in building up new life in worn bodies and furnishing new strength and courage to weary, flagging spirits.

Since July, nineteen-seventeen, more than a score of women have been sustained and comforted through the trying period of convalescence, at a total cost of four hundred sixty-nine dollars and sixty cents. Only a part of this expense has been paid out of the Ebell treasury, the balance being subscribed by members of the Committee or other outside agencies.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First-That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is advancement in all lines of general culture.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, and a Treasurer from the membership-at-large. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Com-

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SEC. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Com-

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation

Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Com-

mittee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee. The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.
- SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee, or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.
- SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on De-
- Sec. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as Financial Secretary.
- SEC. 8. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the

President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committees.

Secrion 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership:
- 2. Committee on Printing:
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Departments:
- 5. House Committee.
- SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.
- SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.
- SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

SECTION 1. The number of active members of this Club shall not exceed 1550.

SEC. 2. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee for action. The applicant shall be voted upon by ballot at a regular meeting of the Executive Committee, and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary to election; the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of the result of the election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board, and if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, they shall be placed upon the waiting list in the order of application, and transferred to the list of active members as vacancies occur.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF Los Angeles."

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Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card of a current year from a Federated Club may use that card as an endorsement.

- SEC. 3. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of transfer to the list of active members.
- SEC. 4. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 5. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the admission fee and one-half the annual dues.
- SEC. 6. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- SEC. 7. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of two dollars (\$2.00) per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC. 9. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

- SEC. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.
- SEC. 11. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

SECTION 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$10.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.
- SEC. 3. Members of the Club who are employees, and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted. They shall not be included in the list of active members or be eligible to election to office in the Club. They shall receive one-half the guest cards allowed active members.
- SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted. They shall not be included in the list of active members.
- SEC. 5. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, pay one-half the yearly dues from date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.
- SEC. 6. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Club for ten (10) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.
- SEC. 7. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 2. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.
- SEC. 8. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

- SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.
- SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.
- SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.
- SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a. m.

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SEC. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

Section 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

- SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.
- SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a. m. and three p. m. of the date set; three members of the election board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

ARTICLE XII.

SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive

RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV.

SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted shall, when approved by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected

ARTICLE XVIII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX.

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1918. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Standing Rules

Admission to all meetings shall be by card of the current term only.

Regular members will receive four guest cards for Mondays and four for Departments; one-half to be issued on October first and one-half on March first.

But one guest-card may be used at Monday meetings. Gentlemen are admitted on member's calling cards.

Any member of a Federated Club, on presentation of credentials, shall receive a complimentary guest card, good for ten days.

A regular member desiring to visit Federated Clubs of other cities may, upon application, receive a card of introduction.

Members leaving the city for a full Club year may, by applying in advance, obtain absent rates.

Certificates of membership, in lieu of regular membership cards, will be furnished to members having absent rates.

A letter of endorsement is required from each signer for a new member.

The Membership Committee does not assume responsibility of proving the truth or falsity of derogatory rumors concerning the character of applicants for membership, but persistent and general rumors will be deemed sufficient to bar the applicant.

New members notified during February and June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Temporary Membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.

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
