

MRS. WILLIAM SPRINGER BARTLETT

Memorial Mrs. William Springer Bartlett

In ancient Gothic histories a legend survives of certain tried and experienced women in each tribe, who were especially reverenced as the keepers of the soul and traditions of the race. Such a guardian woman in this later time, Mrs. Bartlett appeared to me.

When we bade good-bye to the dear beauty spot on Figueroa Street that had been the scene of so many happy associations, and moved into this, our magnificent new home, we asked Mrs. Bartlett for an expression of her feeling. These are her words:

"When, thirty-three years ago, a little group of women raised an altar to an ideal they called "Ebell," they could not then see how the years would crown their work.

"The task of the women of today is to carry a coal from that altar to their new home, and to nurture it until it becomes a beacon of inspiration to the city of Los Angeles, even to the nation; and may each member of the club carry as an accolade the motto, 'I serve'."

Then, and since then and today, we have called her "The

Spirit of Ebell."

It was she who planted the seed that has grown into this great club. It was Mrs. Bartlett who helped to organize it and set its standards. It was she who unswervingly and continuously has held before us the purposes for which we were organized and the ideals to which we aspire.

She has stood ever on the Watch-tower, alert and anxious always that our standards should *not* be lowered; and, not content with leadership, she was ever ready to step down into the ranks

and lend a hand to any task that was required of her.

In spite of increasing years and crippling illness, she was always able to reach back into the rich storehouse of her memories and bring to us the stimulating results of a lifetime of study and research. Only a few weeks before her death I heard her give a remarkable talk on the "Heroes of the Southland"; and only ten days before her demise, she addressed a meeting at the West Adams Presbyterian Church on the subject "Christmas."

In her brave and gallant way, she often said she had planned to die in the heat of battle—that she never meant to surrender!

Franklina Gray was a child, living in Brooklyn, when Civil War was declared, but her people were of the Old South, and thus it was that all her childhood and young womanhood were colored

and clouded by the pain and bitterness that grew out of the historic conflict.

In 1864, when she was eleven years old, she removed with her parents to San Francisco, but returned a year later to Baltimore and entered Patapsco Seminary, where she remained until she was seventeen years old, spending her summers with her uncle at the family estate in Halifax County, Virginia.

Her father, Franklin Gray, was also a Virginian, but prior to his marriage to her mother, Matilda French, he had heard the call of California in the gold rush days, and was one of the intrepid band of young men we call "the forty-niners." Later, he became one of the banking firm of Graham, Gray and Company, and also served his city as Alderman, following the first Charter Election of San Francisco. This accounts in some measure, perhaps, for some of Mrs. Bartlett's abiding love for early California history.

She was surrounded by every comfort and luxury and to her was given every opportunity for education at home and in foreign lands, that wealth and loving care could provide. Her fine mind eagerly grasped all the mental stimulus that came to her, and as the years passed on, bringing changes of scenes and conditions, she came to be sought out for advice and suggestions, in every community in which she lived.

In 1874, the family came to Southern California and in 1876, Franklina Gray became the wife of William S. Bartlett whom we remember as the president of the German American Trust and Savings Bank. They lived for a time in Santa Ana where Mrs. Bartlett organized the Santa Ana Ebell Club, and some years later they established their permanent residence in Los Angeles. It was in 1894 that she, with other charter members, organized The Ebell of Los Angeles, fashioning it after the model of the Oakland Ebell of which she had been a member.

Mrs. Bartlett has long been regarded as one of the commanding leaders of thought in this community, but tribute must also be paid to her for her uncompromising loyalty to her ideals, and to her singlehearted, courageous championship of those principles that she believed to be vital and enduring.

No power was ever able to change the current of her high aspirations nor to weaken, in any way, her impulse toward the goal she had set for herself; not the absorption of family life, with all it implies of personal joy and sorrow and pain and illness, anxiety and hope and struggle of many kinds; not the disillusion that often comes in strange lands, amid new faces and alien customs; not that last corroding ache of disappointment we sometimes ex-

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perience at the failing enthusiasms of our friends and companions. Throughout the years she has been faithful to her conception of what home and Christian living should be, of civic responsibility, of the urgent duty that each generation owes to the generation that is to follow.

She has held aloft the torch of life and love and beauty that was handed to her at her birth, and its light and warmth and fragrance have gladdened every human heart that has come within its glow.

The Ebell of Los Angeles has honored her as its creator and its foremost leader for forty years, and acknowledging this, each administration, from the first, has looked to her for encourage-

ment and endorsement, knowing that her guidance would be

steady, unchanging, helpful and sane.

It was her prayer that she might not falter and that she might serve on to the end; and that prayer was granted. In the fullness of years and in complete possession of her faculties, she "passed from slumber to a dream and from a dream to death."

And now she has gone from us, a radiant spirit, taking its flight just as she would have wished to go—at the Christmas season, while the bells were ringing out tidings of Peace and Goodwill, and the green holly wreaths were giving forth their message of Life Everlasting.

A noble Christian woman, a devoted mother, an honored friend and leader! In your new abode on high, Franklina Gray

Bartlett, we salute you!

Report of President

For the third time your presiding officer will attempt to give a brief summary of the year's work. The interested members will read in detail the reports of all officers and committee chairmen appearing elsewhere in this year book, because there one will find the real history of this wonderful club of ours. We share alike in the pride of achievement as evidenced by their reports. It is in the cooperation of all members and all workers that the club has maintained its high standard and to all we owe a deep debt of gratitude. The gratification of work well done is surely theirs. A few things may be added to those reports and an analysis of parts of them may present an interesting sidelight on the most interesting and most absorbing experience of many years.

That we have survived the depression as well as we have is very comforting. We have accepted our responsibilities and met all our obligations. To do this, when it is said that sixty per cent of our population is caring for the other forty per cent—to be among the sixty per cent—has required all we possess of courage and resourcefulness. The trend of things is shown in the history of our most important rental. Three years ago we were receiving from this group seven hundred dollars a month for our auditorium; for the past year the same group have given us two hundred fifty dollars for our Fine Arts room and now it is extremely doubtful if they can continue with so great a reduction. But with such a disappointment our rentals show a handsome profit of about fourteen thousand dollars.

We are still the largest Federated club in the city and that probably makes us the largest club in the West. Even so our membership has returned to the level of 2500 or less. However, the interest and enthusiasm is manifested in the attendance, which helps us bear the disappointment of the loss of members. Over a period of three years the attendance at the departments has increased from 21,921 in 1931-1932 to 32,158 in 1934-1935. Because of the reorganization of several departments during the current year, there have been fourteen meetings less than last year and therefore the largest attendance on record was in 1933-1934, when we achieved 35,978. In addition the attendance at the Monday programs has numbered 29,925. These figures attest the attitude of the membership. If our club has been a source of inspiration to this number, if it has been entertainment, if it has been an escape from the worries that beset us all, if it has met the need of any one of these groups, it has been a work worth while. We are truly a pioneer in adult education and "our university"

fills a real need in the lives of many women of Los Angeles.

Though Federal Relief has completely changed the type of work of all private agencies, Ebell is still expertly organized for emergency relief, and being so attuned to the needs of the day has met every obligation presented. At that everyone wishes we could have done more. There have been many distressing problems but as in the past, such cases belong to our private files and you would not wish it otherwise. With the adjustments to the prevailing rapidly changing conditions, the welfare work has been particularly difficult but our committees have been both patient and helpful. Theirs has been the most wearying work in the club but their cheerful demeanor under all circumstances quite belies the charge that the burden is heavy.

The refinancing of the mortgage, of the insurance, of the rentals, of the endowment funds of both Scholarship and Rest Cottage—the whole of some and a part of the rest—has been a grave responsibility. We can only hope that the future will show it was wisely done. We were fortunate indeed that Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint, though not obligated to assist in the reorganization of the securities of the Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint Scholarship Endowment Fund, proved themselves willing auditors to the many committee meetings needed for this refinancing. After it was an accomplished fact their approval gave great satisfaction to your committee. In addition they gave to their endowment fund five hundred shares of stock in the Security-First National Bank, quoted today at 41. Every pledge to a student has been fulfilled but we were not able to assign as many new scholarships as formerly. However, fourteen grateful young men and women are happily representing Ebell in our local higher schools of academic culture.

A new departure was the Mortgage Party given by the Former Officers' Round Table, when \$1,050 was earned and a brilliant party given in our auditorium. It was a great success in every way. That and the other three parties, sponsored by Practical Relief, Rest Cottage and Scholarship, made this a banner year for benefits,—all of them adding \$3,460.16 to our income, giving beautiful entertainment to our members and their friends.

The decrease in income from registration fees and dues has been in a measure offset by the decrease in taxes and interest paid. The amount of interest paid this year is about \$3,500 less than three years ago and the amount paid in taxes is about \$6,000 less. Our income from all sources, which includes the Former Officers' gift and the \$9,000 bequest from Mrs. Oliver Hershman-Martinek's estate (with the approval of her daughter),

helped to maintain our high standard. The reputation that Ebell is such a rich club has to be met repeatedly with the assertion that we are rich in opportunity for service. If one could give only a small measure of the words of praise for our beautiful club house that have been so enthusiastically voiced by our friends, it would fill many pages. Our visitors from far and near are extravagant in their commendation. With such a setting it is all the more necessary that we maintain our high standards of righteous living. So though the financial problem has been al-

ways uppermost in our consciousness, because of the depression, we hope we have not forgotten that the real emphasis should always be placed upon the spiritual values.

The theme of the past year has been one of creative work, beginning with the pageant in October, celebrating our fortieth birthday, the Junior Extravaganza, the Shakespeare pageant, poetry, plays and other programs in the departments—all original work. An Ebell play won the prize given by the Festival of Fine Arts group for the best play presented in competition with other federated club plays. It was "The Fox Woman" written by Miss Pauline Curran. Ebell gave a contract prize of \$100.00 for the winner of the Little Theatre Groups. "Inglewood Players" thereby gave us our last Monday program.

Two disappointments have come with this year; namely the change from the magazine to a bulletin and the destruction of the Maxine Albro murals in our patio. The former was necessary because of the financial failure of our young publisher and the latter because of the majority ruling. Some of our members really prefer the new bulletin. It is very nice. After two years and two opportunities for expression from the membership as to the fate of the beautiful murals, one can hold no resentment at the outcome because we must abide by our well-known policy of

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majority rule. One wishes that there had been a larger vote, as only a few over six hundred members voted on this important subject.

Our relation to the outside public has been one of quiet suggestion and cooperation rather than radical expression of a stand upon any subject. However, we sent resolutions to the U.C.L.A. authorities warmly approving the stand taken by Director E. C. Moore against the communistic propaganda on the campus of our State University. We also wrote to the Regents asking for a favorable consideration of establishing a school for Social Service training there. We also protested the tax upon our motion picture industry. We asked to have our streets cleaned and so requested in a letter to Mayor Shaw. A delegate from Ebell attended the Institute of World Affairs at Riverside. We cooperated with the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce in many ways,—welcoming their speakers on our platform for enlightenment upon all kinds of civic enterprises: national trade week and the California International Exposition at San Diego, to name a few. We expressed our interest in retaining the Municipal Art Association; many of us attended the Woman's Civic Conference. Our own Salon of Art has kept in touch with the best that is offered in the field of Fine Arts, bringing celebrated artists to us as well as exhibiting their works. Our annual dinner, honoring our exhibiting artists of the year, when substantial prizes are given, is now recognized as the outstanding art function of Los Angeles. Our usual Thursday Assemblies have brought talented speakers and though the number of dinners has been decreased to one a month, the attendance has been large and our membership has been assured of a brilliant social evening, after a very instructive program. On Wednesday afternoons the Salon of Art has been opened to the public, and the Solarium teas have given our members social relaxation as well as earning a tidy sum for our treasury,-both events being hailed with delight.

Aside from the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint to their Scholarship Endowment Fund, there have been numerous gifts to our Rest Cottage Association, notably among them being the one thousand dollars given by Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher, several gifts of pictures to the club, and a bequest of \$25,000 from Miss Florence Riley, \$10,000 of which was given to the club proper to be used as a payment upon the mortgage if so desired by the Board of Directors. However, it is extremely doubtful if we receive any of Miss Riley's bequest because there is a technicality involved as to whether the will complies with the California law. Being one of our charter members and loving this club for over

forty years, it was a beautiful expression of devotion and appreciation from Miss Riley.

One of our most beautiful and impressive services was the special hour honoring our former past president and charter member, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, who died in January. No one can replace so gifted and talented a member as our own beloved Mrs. Bartlett. A fitting tribute to one so representing the Ebell ideal was given by another past president, Mrs. Grantland Seaton Long, a devoted friend as well. The Shakespeare pageant was given in honor of the great Frederick Warde, who also passed away in the spring, and who has always been associated with our annual celebration of Shakespeare's birthday.

Some unusual opportunities have come to your presiding officer as ex-curricula activities, the high light of all being when Ebell joined with the Club Cooperation group of our Los Angeles Community Chest in giving a luncheon for Mrs. Herbert Hoover. Our First Lady gave a delightful and encouraging talk in our auditorium to six hundred presidents from other clubs. It was interesting to be one of the small executive committee which arranged the first national birthday party for President Roosevelt. It was inspiring to listen to Admiral Joseph Mason Reeves, Commander-in-Chief of our U. S. Fleet, at our Thursday Assembly, honoring the gallant officers of our Navy. The Sunday reception given by our Music Department in honor of Director and Mrs. Otto Klemperer of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra added laurels to our club history. The Japanese Princess, one of the Royal Family of Japan, was entertained by the Board of Directors one Saturday morning. It was intriguing to attend the Labor Conference in San Francisco at the request of the Honorable Secretary of Labor, Frances E. Perkins. It was gratifying to continue as treasurer of the Associated Women's Committee for Unemployment Relief of Women, a connection maintained for five years and one reluctantly relinquished. The last function of the year was the reception honoring the officers and delegates of the American Association of University Women, assembled here for their biennial convention. Dr. Meta Glass, a sister of Senator Carter Glass, is national president of this organization and stood in line with other officers. This was an occasion similar to the receptions of former years when the Board opened the club to receive the women delegates to the Olympic Games and to receive the wives of visiting governors, here for the Western Conference. These have been stimulating contacts.

Reviewing it all one is reminded again of the infinite variety that is Ebell. Whether the greatest pleasure came from sharing

an experience near the seats of the mighty, acting as model in the Junior Fashion Show, playing the part of the interlocutor at the Workers' Luncheon (that intimate occasion of our very own), it is hard to tell but one is safe in saying that no state of apathy exists at Ebell. It is an absorbing, stimulating experience to be a worker in so important a community group.

Though in a report like this one is not supposed to mention any names, your Board of Directors, each one of whom presides over a special club activity, and is in every way responsible for the great success of that phase of the whole club work, deserve special words of commendation. The plan developed through these forty years is an admirable example of expert organization and as long as we have such devoted Board members as you have known during these past three years, you can rest assured that the club will wax strong. Working together has been the great satisfaction. It is not the individual that counts. If your particular service has been just one-half hour's service, that brief period is as important as all the rest, because the picture is not complete until each part is well done. The real things of life come to us in this service for others: the deepening friendships, the understanding human frailities. We have extended our own mental horizon, we have educated ourselves better to understand the world problems. In serving others, we have served ourselves and have found anew that work is the greatest gift to man. We have traditions to follow; we must keep abreast of the times; to adjust one to the other, to do the best in every new situation, remembering the past and its policy, requires careful, painstaking endeavor. Your presiding officer has made many failures and deeply regrets them. However, not much time could be spent in contemplation of the mistakes made because too many problems awaited each new day with other and worse pitfalls to be avoided. One is deeply grateful for the honor of such services as Ebell offers. It is a great experience. Surely we can very happily reiterate: "It IS the greatest club in the world."

Report of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Rest Cottage, although small in size, wields a mighty influence for good in our community. Sad to relate the "I. Q." average of our guests has been raised considerably since the financial depression, but with it has come a finer appreciation of Ebell's hospitality. So I reverently say, God bless Rest Cottage and its founders. In this quiet, cheerful environment, combined with excellent food, the business woman and the young mother are soon able to again cope with their respective duties and problems.

Rest Cottage is credited with helping many families to hold together, when at the breaking point from ill health and discouragement, and in reuniting other families. Confidential letter files bear testimony to these statements.

Mrs. John B. Long, assistant chairman, reports that we have had two hundred sixteen guests in the Cottage "that the officers all agree that the type of women has been unusually high." She also says, "We know the Cottage has saved the lives of several girls. One girl said, 'No one ever loved me before.' And another, 'I didn't know that there was a place like this where somebody cared.' And so we go on to another year with greater faith in the benefit of Rest Cottage."

Mrs. Louise Helen Kramer, house chairman, tells us that many valuable gifts have been received at the Cottage. A beautiful seven-piece bedroom set given by Mr. Staples in memory of his sister and our club member, Mrs. Anne S. Tremper, a silver tea service by Mrs. John W. Musselman, in memory of her husband and many valuable gifts by Mrs. Kramer, which she failed to report, have been given. Many members have contributed generously.

Mrs. James Andrew Rogers, finance chairman, has practiced alert, watchful waiting and thereby saved us money. All the investments made by the present committee, serving three years, are paying interest. The chairman says, "that our finances have held up wonderfully well during the times of depression." For financial statement in full we refer you to the treasurer's report on another page.

Mrs. Jess E. Wilson is planning with the advice of an experienced landscape gardener, "to have flowers blooming every month of the year; a friendship garden for choice bulbs and flowers, gifts to the Cottage, and a rose garden; through the medium of flowers to bring new hope to our guests."

Mrs. Herbert Chesshire Stone, membership chairman, has, with the assistance of her committee, collected fifteen hundred dollars in memberships. She reports two life memberships: Miss Ada A. McClelland and Mrs. Frances A. Stribling; a memorial membership given by Mrs. John Pierce Herrick for her mother, Mrs. Joseph A. Brown.

Dr. J. Margaret Roberts, chairman of investigations, reports that her committee has made one hundred eighty-five investigations. Miss Clemence A. Renard, chairman of transportation, records eighty-two calls made. Mrs. Jack Armstrong Jevne, chairman of follow-up committee, has made eighty visits, frequently

carrying with them material aid.

Mrs. Charles Ashworth Stavnow and the hospitality committee have served with efficiency in their many and varied activities this year, beginning with the workers' luncheon at the Cottage in October; then the Christmas party given at the Club on December the fifteenth for women who have been guests at the Cottage. Each dinner seems to surpass the preceding one in friendliness and loveliness. This year the benefit party was added to the duties of the hospitality committee. From the proceeds of this party, we were able to reimburse the Ebell treasury for the amount of its yearly allotment, nine hundred dollars to Rest Cottage. The other committees gladly assisted the hospitality in every way desired. At the benefit party, Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher gave Rest Cottage a most generous gift, a check for one thousand dollars which has been placed in the endowment fund. The closing meeting of the year was followed by a delightful picnic.

Mrs. Allen C. Stelle and the field survey committee visited many interesting places this year. They brought instructive accounts of these visits to the meetings. The Needlework Guild was able to give us, this year, the articles most needed.

The opportunity to work for Rest Cottage is a priceless privilege and in saying this, I voice the enthusiasm of the officers, chairmen and committees.

And now for the traditional postscript. Since writing the above report, we are happy to announce that Mr. Alva S. Staples has taken out a Memorial Membership for his sister and our member, Mrs. Anne S. Tremper.

Report of Scholarship Committee

The Ebell Scholarship work has had a very good year. In September, 1934, we had fourteen students enrolled, two of whom were graduated in February, at which time we awarded two new scholarships. In June five more completed their University courses and we are confident that we will be able to fill these vacancies in September. The Ebell Juniors will support two half scholarships with us next year. One of our students, Harry Koons, will be awarded a fifth year so that he may receive his Master's degree at the California Institute of Technology at Pasadena, having received his degree in Science there this year.

As will appear in the financial report further on, quite a few of the Scholarship investments have been sold and the money re-invested. This was necessary, primarily, because of re-organizations and changes in the companies in which our funds were

invested.

The money which supports the Ebell Scholarships is derived from four sources: (a) income from the Mr. and Mrs. Charles N. Flint Scholarship Endowment Fund, (b) income from the Ebell Endowment Fund, (c) a monthly appropriation from the Ebell treasury and (d) gifts from members of the club.

This Ebell Scholarship work, which we define as an educational activity, by assisting so many young people through Universities, is a noble work and the members of Ebell may be justly

proud of it.

Report of Practical Relief Committee

The Ebell Practical Relief has worked under a new policy this year in order to cooperate with changed conditions in city and county welfare work. When Federal funds became available for use, needy families who had for years depended on our Practical Relief for food, clothing and spending money were put on county lists or on S.E.R.A. projects. This left us free to concentrate on the care of emergency cases,-clothing for school boys and girls, layettes for depression babies, and bedding, spectacles, shoes and groceries for special needs. Inasmuch as the garments most in demand could be purchased so cheaply ready-made, we have discontinued the making of such articles, except that about 100 comforts and garments already on hand were finished. The Council of Social Agencies helped us in checking our individual cases, so that we were able to work more intelligently and avoid duplication. We have tried to keep within a definite territory and not encroach upon the boundaries of other welfare groups. However, club members, persons recommended by club members, and school and college girls and boys have been served without obtaining such clearance.

At our monthly meetings the heads of various welfare agencies came to tell us of their field and of what we can do to help them. Miss Alice Streckwald spoke on what is being done by the Children's Protective Association; Mr. Adams of the Children's Home Finding Society, told of their work; Miss Mary Stanton gave us an insight into the work of the Council of Social Agencies; Mrs. McKinley of the Home Service Department of the Red Cross, explained the scope of that organization; Miss Irene Dudley told about the Day Nursery of the Goodwill Industries; and Miss E. A. Valens of the Children's Hospital told of the out patients' department. Mrs. Chester C. Ashley, our special assistant chairman, gave us at each meeting an introductory talk which connected the speaker's activities with those of the Community Chest and explained the relationship between the various relief agencies in the city.

The committee has not limited its work to Fridays but has been busy many mornings each month arranging and giving out the garments donated by club members, and preparing layettes, for which there is a great demand. Representatives from the Practical Relief have attended four meetings of the Associated Women's Committee for Unemployment Relief, and five meetings of the Association of Volunteers in Social Service held at the Hamburger Home.

We have received 919 useful used garments or other items as gifts; we have purchased 145 adult items, 18 doz. baby garments, and 55 doz. diapers; we have knit 18 baby sweaters, and made some 50 other baby garments. We have distributed 891 garments, 30 layettes and 173 yards of goods. 26 boxes of foodstuffs were given out, mostly at Christmas. Approximately \$105 has been spent in direct relief. Seven bags of miscellaneous articles, unsuited to our purposes, have been given to the Goodwill Industries. In many cases, dress goods and accessories were given to women who were able to make their own garments, thus increasing their feeling of self reliance. For needs such as eyeglasses, children's shoes, etc., cash was given so that proper fittings could be made.

We have made no appeals from the stage for money for Christmas or any special use, nor have we solicited directly from members, but we gave one large party this year which netted \$1,196.00, much more than enough to supply our budget for the year.

Report of Salon of Art

Nine exhibitions of paintings, sculpture and prints, and two of miniatures, all of wide variety, were shown in the galleries the past year. Most of these works of art were by California artists and were assembled from the far-flung corners of our country, from New England to Honolulu. We sincerely hope they have brought pleasure to the members of Ebell. That our club is an art-loving organization is evidenced by the ever increasing crowds gathered in the Salon of Art during the busy days throughout the year, and it is that interest which has made the work seem very much worthwhile. Now that it is becoming known that we share the beauties of our galleries, there are many visitors from our own city and out-of-town guests who avail themselves of the "open house," Wednesdays. The guest book records names from all over the world.

The Art Patrons are a social-minded group, as well as artlovers, and each month some event has been planned by the social chairman, Mrs. Robert M. Hartwell and her committee, usually combining luncheon or tea with a little journey to some shrine of art. The opening party of the season was an evening reception on October the fourth, honoring the California Art Club, whose members were exhibiting in the galleries that month. Two Assembly Dinners were sponsored by the committee. The Christmas party, when the club was gay with the "white Christmas" motif, was an evening we will always remember. In May during the annual competitive showing of California artists, more than one hundred of the artists who had loaned their works for exhibition, were entertained at dinner, with some three hundred club members and their guests. On that evening the Art Patrons were happy to present fourteen prizes, amounting to six hundred fifteen dollars. Three hundred twenty-five dollars of this amount was given by generous donors among the members: Mrs. Willitts J. Hole, Mrs. Samuel Cary Dunlap, Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher, Mrs. R. T. Burge, Mrs. William Clark Brown and Mrs. S. D. Tuttle. The remaining amount came from the Art Patrons' treasury. The closing social day of the season was an afternoon at the charming country home of Mr. H. B. Nelles of Van Nuys.

Sales aggregating something over seven hundred dollars have been made by the sales committee and others and, while Ebell receives no commission in *money* from these sales, we are gratified to be able to do something for the artists who show a fine spirit of cooperation towards the club and this branch of its work.

Many are the expressions of appreciation from them for "the constructive work Ebell is doing for a better Art understanding in Los Angeles."

We wish we might mention by name every member of the committees. They have done splendid work and the chairman is happy to have served with them, and regrets the ending of this year of fine friendships and contacts made.

Report of President of Ebell Juniors

Annual reports of any organization are apt to be dull, mundane matters unless those who read them can visualize clearly the fine type of activity which lies back of the compilation of figures and statistics.

A story of friendliness and cooperation lay behind every report that a committee chairman presented at the final Junior luncheon on June 12, and as outgoing Junior president I am proud indeed to set down the combined results of a year of varied

and profitable activity.

Because it is the one department which works whole-heartedly for others, we list first the work of the Social Welfare Committee. Under the chairmanship of Mrs. Wellman B. Mills, this department held eighteen meetings during the year with an average attendance of about twenty members. On these occasions eighty-five children's dresses, with matching "shorts" and ten pairs of rompers were made for distribution to needy families. During the year eight families, with a total of twenty-six children, were cared for and upon the chairman's books are listed such items as: 32 pairs of shoes, 60 pairs of socks, 10 sets of underwear, 1 brace for a little victim of infantile paralysis, 14 well-filled Christmas baskets and many other items. Mrs. Mills, to whom we extend grateful credit for her great personal interest and labor, was aided by two assistants, Miss Ellen O. Mead and Miss Frances Audrey Stevens.

"The Talk of the Town," was indeed that, when the drama department presented it on December 7, in Ebell Auditorium. Its success called for a second performance, and it appeared as a regular Monday afternoon program at Ebell in February. Mrs. Robert M. Hixson, chairman of the drama committee, wrote the Extravaganza. Her drama department met twice a month throughout the year at the homes of members. Their year's work culminated in the production of a mystery comedy, "Strange Guests," produced under the direction of Robert Frazer as the program for the regular Junior meeting in May. Mrs. Hixson had as assistant chairman Miss Lillian D. Howard.

Under the chairmanship of Mrs. Kenneth D. Holland the Benefits Committee entertained with two parties during the year; a dinner dance at the Victor Hugo and a spring fashion luncheon given at the clubhouse. The latter event yielded \$190.00 for the treasury.

Junior membership on May 31 included two hundred thirty-

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six members, forty of whom were new members, according to Miss Albertina M. McGrath, courtesy chairman.

Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt the articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF Los Angeles.

*Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is to advance in all lines of general culture; to carry on educational and philanthropic work; and to accept and administer under the terms and conditions thereof endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; to acquire the real property necessary to carry out any of the above purposes; to convey the same by deed or otherwise; to incur indebtedness and to secure the same by bonds, notes, mortgages or otherwise; and to do anything in the carrying out of the foregoing purposes that a natural person might or could do.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

†Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be fifteen, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D., 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I

NAME

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II

Овјест

The object of this Club shall be advancement in all lines of general culture through departments of education, research, and social welfare.

ARTICLE III OFFICERS

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a General Curator, a Chairman of Finance, a Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, a Chairman of Public Relations, a Chairman of Rentals, a Chairman of Rest Cottage Association, and a Chairman of Scholarships. These officers by virtue of their election are Directors of the corporation and shall constitute the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV POWERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors shall have the powers granted by the laws of the State of California and as outlined in the Articles of Incorporation; shall have control of the current affairs of the Club, with the power to enact and enforce rules regulating the use of the clubhouse, its furnishings and equipment.

SECTION 2. The Board of Directors shall have the power to elect, from its own body each year, four members who, together with the President of the Club, shall constitute an Executive Committee. This committee shall meet at the call of the President to act on any emergency matter that does not affect the policies of the Club or require the expenditure of more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). This committee shall investigate such matters as are referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors, and shall have power to act when necessary in the interim between board meetings or to recommend action by the Board. This committee shall report such action or recommendation at the following meeting of the Board and shall at all times be under the control of the Board.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall, before the close of the year, employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Club.

SECTION 4. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board until the next annual election. Any

person serving one half or more of a prescribed term shall be subject to the rules governing limitations of re-election.

SECTION 5. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts, and contributions for the establishment of the Ebell of Los Angeles Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be under the control and management of the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and of the Scholarship Committee. Such funds shall be invested under the direction of the Board of Directors and the income received therefrom, together with such annual contributions as may be received from the treasury of Ebell, or otherwise, shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and support of the yearly scholarships.

SECTION 6. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the first and third Thursdays of each month unless otherwise ordered by the Board. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 7. At any regular meeting of the Club, a quorum being present, the number of directors of this corporation may be increased or diminished, within the limits prescribed by law, by a two-thirds vote, provided notice of the proposed change has been given according to the method prescribed in these By-Laws for amendments.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. With the advice and consent of the Board, she shall appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws; shall appoint all special committees and a Club Parliamentarian, and be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall sign all checks, contracts and other legal papers; shall report all matters of interest at meetings of the Board and of the Club, and make an annual report to the Club. She shall carry into effect all acts, orders, and proceedings of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Club.

In the month of June following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have power to call the incoming Board of Directors together for the appointment of all standing committees not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws and for the appointment of officers of departments.

SECTION 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee and shall assist the President as the President may desire.

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The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee and shall direct the house manager and the employees of the house subject to the advice of the President.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Member-ship Committee.

SECTION 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors; shall sign all contracts and other legal papers; shall transmit to the Financial Secretary all orders of the Board of Directors that affect the management of the Club; and shall make an annual report to the Club.

SECTION 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all the correspondence of the Club not otherwise provided for; shall issue all notices ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall be the General Federation Secretary.

SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall receive from the Financial Secretary all moneys paid to her, giving a receipt therefor in which must be stated the account to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall immediately deposit all such moneys in a bank designated by the Board of Directors. She shall pay all bills approved by the Finance Committee and authorized by the Board of Directors and she shall pay no bills not so authorized. She shall make a monthly report of all receipts and expenditures. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club in such sum as the Board of Directors may require. This bond shall be executed by some reliable surety company and approved by the Board of Directors or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles. The cost of obtaining such bond shall be defrayed by the Club. At the expiration of her term of office, the Treasurer shall transfer immediately to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Club in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

SECTION 6. The General Curator shall keep posted on the department bulletin board a statement of the time and place of all department meetings and any other information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each department; shall receive applications for the formation of new departments; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors. She shall be chairman of the Committee on Departments and a member of the Printing Committee.

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In the month of June following the annual election, the General Curator for the ensuing year shall submit to the incoming Board of Directors a tentative list of names for appointment as officers of the departments.

SECTION 7. The Chairman of Finance shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee, which shall have general supervision over all the finances of the Club. At specified regular intervals or at the request of the President of the Club or of the Board of Directors, she shall call the committee together for conference and to prepare recommendations for the Board.

SECTION 8. The Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare shall serve as chairman of the hospitality committees and shall represent on the Board of Directors all welfare activities not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws.

SECTION 9. The Chairman of Public Relations shall report to the President and to the Board of Directors all recommendations of the Public Relations Committee; shall prepare and present to the Club all resolutions ordered by the Board of Directors; and, after investigation, shall recommend memberships in other organizations.

SECTION 10. The Chairman of Rentals shall have charge of the leases and rentals of all Club property. She shall submit all proposed leases to the Board of Directors for approval.

SECTION 11. The Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall have general supervision over Rest Cottage, its matron, and guests. She shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of its Executive Committee; shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer of the Association; and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles and a semi-annual report to the Club.

SECTION 12. The Chairman of Scholarships with the assistance of the committee shall select each student who is to be awarded an Ebell scholarship from the Scholarship Endowment Funds of the Club, or from other funds contributed for this purpose. Each applicant for this honor must be at least in high school. The high mentality, integrity, energy, and good health of each applicant must be vouched for by the Vice-Principal of the high school or by the Dean of the college or university which the student may attend.

Section 13. A Financial Secretary shall be engaged by the Board of Directors as manager of the business office. She shall receive and receipt in duplicate for all moneys due the Club and

- SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Club, shall meet with the Board of Directors for conference when requested.
- SECTION 3. The Former Officers' Round Table shall be a committee to perpetuate the ideals of the Club and to promote its general welfare. The incumbent officers of the Club may attend the regular meetings of the Round Table.
- SECTION 4. The Committee on Departments composed of the General Curator, her assistants, and the curators of the several departments shall have general supervision over the departmental work of the Club and shall make recommendations concerning the formation of new departments.
- SECTION 5. The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Chairman of Finance, the First Vice-President, the Third Vice-President, the Treasurer, and the Chairman of Rentals.

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It shall be the duty of this committee to serve in a general advisory capacity concerning the finances of the Club and such other matters as may be referred to it by the President or by the Board of Directors. It shall make such reports as are deemed advisable to the Board of Directors concerning the credit and the financial operations and status of the Club. It shall investigate and advise the Board on any major expenditure for buildings and improvements, or on the sale or acquisition of any real property, or on any others matters pertaining to the financial credit of the Club.

This committee shall submit an annual budget to the Board of Directors early in July of each year. All bills shall be presented to this committee after being approved by the chairman to whose department or committee the expenditure shall be charged. These bills, claims, requisitions, or warrants shall be examined by the committee and if approved and authorized by the Board of Directors must be countersigned by the Chairman of Finance before payment is made by the Treasurer. This committee shall at all times be under the control of the Board of Directors.

- SECTION 6. The Hospitality and Welfare Committee shall be composed of the hospitality committees of the Club under the Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare. The duties of this committee shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities of the Club.
- SECTION 7. The House Committee shall have charge of the house at all times; shall buy all supplies ordered by the Board of Directors; and shall supervise the building and its contents.
- SECTION 8. The Membership Committee shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members and to the applications for life membership, and shall investigate all resignations before reporting them to the Board of Directors.
- SECTION 9. The Printing Committee shall publish the Year Book and the Ebell Magazine and attend to the printing of necessary notices, membership cards, blanks, etc.
- SECTION 10. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular Monday meeting of the Club and for such special meetings as are authorized by the Board of Directors.
- SECTION 11. The Public Relations Committee through its chairman shall keep the Board of Directors advised on such civic matters as directly concern the Club or which the Club wishes to assist in furthering.

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SECTION 12. The Rentals Committee shall supervise all rentals and leases of Club property.

SECTION 13. The Rest Cottage Committee, which shall be the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association, through its chairman, shall report to the Board of Directors all matters of interest pertaining to Rest Cottage, including a monthly statement of the receipts and disbursements, and shall make a semi-annual report to the Club. The members of this committee shall be elected in accordance with the By-Laws of the Club and of the Rest Cottage Association.

SECTION 14. The Scholarship Committee shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Club and shall administer all revenues received from the Scholarship Endowment Funds and from other sources.

SECTION 15. Chairmen of Committees both standing and special shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings so that she may attend if she desires to do so. They shall incur no indebtedness that is not authorized by the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Board of Directors.

All moneys collected for club activities shall be paid to the Financial Secretary at once and a receipt required therefor.

All officers and chairmen of departments and of committees shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VII MEMBERS

SECTION 1. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant and endorsed by three members in good standing of more than one year's membership, or by two members in good standing of more than one year's membership, and by the Federated Club of which the applicant is a member. This application shall be accompanied by the registration fee and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The application, together with the result of the investigation, shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for approval.

An alphabetical list of the names of all applicants approved by the Board of Directors shall be published in the Ebell Magazine and posted on the bulletin board. If no protests are received

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from members of the Club within two weeks after publication, the names shall be presented by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the Board of Directors at its next regular meeting for election to membership. All protests must be made either in writing or in person to the Membership Committee. Should a protest be received, the application protested must be referred again to the Membership Committee for further investigation.

Voting shall be by ballot and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary for election. The Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of her election to mem-

bership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

I, the undersigned, having personally known the applicant for a period of _____(State number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted

as an endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than three applications for regular membership, three for temporary membership, and three for Junior membership during each year.

SECTION 2. Each member of the Club must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the By-Laws of the Club before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

SECTION 3. The memberships in this Club shall be classified as (1) Regular, (2) Life, (3) Honorary Life, and (4) Special. Special memberships may be Complimentary, Junior, and Temporary.

SECTION 4. A regular member is one who pays full fees and dues and is entitled to all the privileges of the Club and to an interest in the assets of the corporation and its management.

SECTION 5. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for one (1) year may apply for life membership by signing the blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted on as provided for in an application tor regular membership in ARTICLE VII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay five hundred dollars (\$500.00), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues. She shall retain all the rights and privileges of a regular member.

SECTION 6. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a regular member by a three-fourths vote in recognition of distinguished services. Before the vote is taken the name of the person to be so honored must be published in the Ebell Magazine and announced from the platform at a regular Monday meeting. Such a member shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to regular membership, without payment of dues.

SECTION 7. A special membership in this Club does not confer any interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation; or any vote.

SECTION 8. Only regular members of more than one year's standing whose dues are paid to date, life members, and honorary life members shall vote at annual elections.

SECTION 9. A special complimentary membership in this Club may be given to a non-member for one year, by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, in recognition of merit or for the best interest of the Club. Such a member shall not be required to pay admission fees or dues.

SECTION 10. The daughters of Ebell members and their friends, under the age of thirty (30) years, are entitled to become special members of this Club at one-half of the fees and dues of regular members. Such members shall be known as Ebell Juniors. They shall be privileged to attend one Monday program each month and all of the study departments. They may elect their own officers, have one regular meeting each month, and manage their own affairs, subject to the guidance and approval of the Board of Directors.

An application for Junior membership in Ebell shall first be submitted to the Board of Governors of the Ebell Juniors and then shall follow the procedure for regular club membership.

An Ebell Junior may become a regular member of The Ebell of Los Angeles upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in registration fees.

SECTION 11. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00) a month for six months. This membership may be renewed once in any subsequent year. She shall have no interest in the management, property, or assets of the corporation.

SECTION 12. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of

all delinquent dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. If a former member who has resigned wishes to apply for reinstatement she must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that she shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such member shall be one half of the regular admission fee, or one half of the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SECTION 13. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of members on the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of each year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October first and the second half becomes delinquent after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of any member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SECTION 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member of the Club who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the Club may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have

one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards for one-half of the Monday meetings and one-half of the departments during the Club year. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Club shall meet on each Monday from the first Monday in October to the third Monday in June inclusive, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors. At all regular meetings departments may report, programs be presented, and business be transacted. Any meeting of the Club may be closed to all but voting members by order of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. Not fewer than one hundred fifty (150) qualified voting members of this Club, personally attending a regular meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 3. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting on the first Monday in January.

Section 4. Special business meetings of the Club or of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or by the Board of Directors. All business to be transacted must be specified in the call.

SECTION 5. No notice need be given of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which is fixed by these By-Laws. Any such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be transacted at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be sent through the mail to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting and posted on the bulletin board of the Club for the same length of time.

ARTICLE X ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. Each member of the Board of Directors shall be elected for two (2) years and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term in the same office. She shall, however, be eligible for election to another office on the Board of Directors for the following two years. No member shall serve more than six (6) consecutive years on the Board of Directors.

The members of the Board of Directors shall be divided into two groups. The first group shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, General Curator, Chairman of Hospitality and Welfare, and Chairman of Public Relations. The second group shall consist of Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Treasurer, Chairman of Finance, Chairman of Rentals, Chairman of Rest Cottage Association and Chairman of Scholarships.

At annual elections in even numbered years, Group Number One shall be elected for a term of two (2) years, and in odd numbered years Group Number Two shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. Provided, however, that any member already holding office in 1935 shall be permitted to serve the full term for which she was elected. At any election members may be elected to fill an unexpired term.

SECTION 2. The annual election shall be by ballot on the first Monday in June and a plurality vote shall elect. A tie vote in any election shall be decided by a ballot of the Board of Directors and a majority vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations

SECTION 3. The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of nine members. The members of this committee shall be nominated annually and elected in the same manner as the members of the Board of Directors and shall not be eligible for a second term.

Vacancies in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. The President shall call a meeting of the Nominating Committee in October for the purpose of electing a chairman and completing the organization of the committee. Meetings thereafter shall be held at least once a month at the call of the Chairman. A meeting may be called at any time by any three members of the committee.

Each voting member may fill out such blank with a name of not more than one member for each office. This blank so filled out shall be signed by the member as her name appears in the Year Book and returned to the chairman of the Nominating Committee at the clubhouse on or before April first.

SECTION 6. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a ballot for the annual election which shall include all names receiving on the nominating ballot fifty (50) or more votes for one office and such other names as the Nominating Committee shall, by a two-thirds vote, select for each office.

The Nominating Committee shall obtain the consent of each candidate before placing the name on the ballot.

Section 7. On the fourth Monday in April the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Club the names of the nominees for each place to be filled. The report shall forthwith be posted on the bulletin board of the Club and shall remain so posted until the day of the annual election.

Election

SECTION 8. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of seven members, four of whom shall be elected by the members of the Club on the first Monday in April. The other three shall be elected by the Board of Directors and at least two of these shall be members of that Board. The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancies occuring on the Election Board.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed in alphabetical order the names of the nominees for each office submitted by the Nominating Committee with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled and a box to the right of each line in which a cross (x) shall be stamped to indicate the choice of the voter. No vote shall be counted for any candidate unless a cross (x) has been stamped in the box to the right of the name. A sample ballot shall be printed in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine.

SECTION 10. Any voting member who is unable to vote in person at the annual election may apply to the Chairman of the

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Election Board between May first and May fifteenth for a voting ballot. This ballot enclosed in a blank envelope shall be mailed to the applicant and her name placed on the absent voters' list. The member shall mark the ballot and enclose it in the blank envelope. This envelope shall be sealed and enclosed in a second envelope upon which the member shall write her name as it appears in the Year Book. She shall then mail it to the Chairman of the Election Board at the club office in time to be received before the day of the annual election. This outside envelope shall be opened on the day of the annual election by the Election Board and the enclosed envelope containing the ballot deposited in the ballot box and the member's name checked as having voted before the other members are admitted to vote.

SECTION 11. Balloting shall take place between the hours set by the Board of Directors and published with the sample ballot in the June issue of the Ebell Magazine. Five members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board as soon as possible after the votes are counted. She shall report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

The Chairman of the Election Board, in the presence of at least five members of that board, shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary. The Board of Directors shall canvass these ballots at the first regular meeting after the election, after which these ballots may be destroyed.

SECTION 12. The installation of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place at the last regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Board of Directors together during the month of June for the appointment of standing committees and of officers of the departments for one year only.

ARTICLE XI CLUB ACTIVITIES

SECTION 1. This Club shall have five definite forms of activity: (1) The general Monday afternoon programs; (2) the Study Departments; (3) the Social Welfare Work, specific and general, including Ebell Rest Cottage Association under the control of its own Chairman, and Practical Relief and General Philanthropies; (4) Scholarships; (5) and the Ebell Juniors.

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All members of departments must be members of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Curators shall preside at the meetings of their departments, plan a course of study, and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Board of Directors.

Departments shall have no power to organize or disband; to dismiss or appoint curators, but may express a preference to the Board of Directors.

At a regular meeting in May each department may propose the name of one or more members for each of the offices of the department for the ensuing year. The Curator shall hand these names to the General Curator to be presented to the incoming Board of Directors.

All departments are open on equal terms to all members of the Club.

No department or officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding on the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized by the Board of Directors.

Members wishing to form new departments must apply to the General Curator who shall present such application to the Board of Directors with the recommendation of the Committee on Departments.

ARTICLE XII CLUB POLICIES

SECTION 1. It shall be the policy of this Club to endorse only such measures as shall promote the general public welfare, and to refuse endorsement to partisan political measures or persons.

SECTION 2. All communications on business must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being presented to the Club.

SECTION 3. Fifty (50) members in good and regular standing may, at any time, request in writing special action by the Board of Directors. This Board shall at once investigate the matter and with its recommendations refer it to the Club for decision.

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ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. The power to amend the By-Laws of this Club may be exercised at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, due notice of the proposed change having been given.

All amendments to the By-Laws adopted by a vote of the Club shall be incorporated in the minutes of the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to each member of the Club, not fewer than ten (10) days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

SECTION 3. Only members eligible to vote may attend the business meetings at which By-Laws are to be amended or adopted.

ARTICLE XIV PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

All meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order Revised, in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club or with the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XV CHARTER DAY

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as CHARTER DAY, commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of the Charter Members shall be given on the last Monday in October.

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Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and whereas, those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1932. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Resolutions

Establishing Ebell Rest Cottage Association

Whereas, There has been conveyed by Deed of Gift to The Ebell of Los Angeles certain property described as Lot 206 of Olivito Heights Tract, as per map recorded in Book 8, Page 47, of Maps in the office of Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California, which property is known as and hereinafter referred to as Ebell Rest Cottage and

Whereas, The terms and conditions on which said property was so conveyed, required that it should be made a place of rest for women, who, because of their physical condition, need rest and quiet for a period of time to enable them to resume their former occupation, and that it shall be maintained as such by The Ebell of Los Angeles; and

Whereas, It is necessary to adopt rules and regulations governing said property and to provide for its maintenance and to secure the funds necessary therefor by endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions and to protect the donors thereof in accordance with such endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting on December 26, 1918, that to carry out and make effective the terms and conditions of said gift, there is hereby organized from the membership of The Ebell of Los Angeles an association to be known as Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles who contributes \$1.00 per month shall be a sustaining member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association and any member who contributes \$1.00 per year shall be an associate member. Any person who contributes the sum of \$100.00 may be made a life member of said Association.

The officers of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee. At the first annual business meeting of the Association three Directors shall be elected, the one receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for three years, the one receiving the next highest number of votes shall serve for two years, and the third Director shall serve for one year. Thereafter at each an-

nual election one Director shall be elected who shall serve for three years.

That said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, when organized as aforesaid, shall have full power and authority to adopt rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance and control of Ebell Rest Cottage and of any endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions therefor, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not become effective or be changed or modified in any manner whatever unless approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall provide forms to be published in the Year Book showing what manner endowments, annuities, devises, bequests and memorials for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be made and shall provide that in every instance The Ebell of Los Angeles shall be named therein as trustee of any fund so created for the benefit of said Ebell Rest Cottage.

That Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be charged with the following funds:

- a. All endowments, annuities, devises, bequests, memorials, gifts and contributions given for the benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage.
- b. All membership fees received from associate, sustaining, life, and memorial members of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.
- c. Such monthly sum from the treasury of The Ebell of Los Angeles as the Board of Directors deems necessary to make effective the purpose of said association.
- d. Ebell Rest Cottage Association may raise such other funds as in its judgment are necessary in any way which the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles shall approve.

That all funds becoming available for the support and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage shall be paid immediately by the Treasurer of The Ebell of Los Angeles to the Treasurer of said Ebell Rest Cottage Association, who shall give her receipt therefor.

That the Treasurer of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall give a bond in the sum to be determined by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles, which bond shall not become effective until approved either by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles or by the presiding Judge of the Superior Court in and for the County of Los Angeles.

That said bond shall provide that the Treasurer giving the same shall faithfully perform all the duties of her office as pro-

vided by the laws of the State of California and the rules and regulations of said Association, and shall also provide that she shall keep true and faithful books of account showing the amount of money in her hands and the accounts to which it is charged.

That at the expiration of her term of office the Treasurer shall transfer to her successor all funds, books, papers, records, and other property of the Association in her possession, requiring a receipt therefor.

That the Executive Committee of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall before the close of each year employ a certified public accountant to make an annual audit of the books and accounts of the Association.

That monthly reports shall be made by the Chairman of Ebell Rest Cottage Association to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

That the books of Ebell Rest Cottage Association shall be open at all times to the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution shall be printed in each edition of the Ebell Year Book together with the forms before mentioned and such other matter pertaining to Ebell Rest Cottage as may be deemed necessary.

Form of Bequest or Devise

For Benefit of Ebell Rest Cottage

It is suggested that one of the following forms be used when money or real estate is to be left to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the benefit of Rest Cottage.

If money, use the following form: "I hereby give and bequeath to The Ebell of Los Angeles for the maintenance of Rest Cottage dollars."

If real estate, use: "I hereby give and devise to The Ebell of Los Angeles that real property described as follows:_____

If the desire is to leave money or real estate with the intention that only the interest or income therefrom shall be used for the maintenance of Rest Cottage, then add to the above forms as follows: to the first, "And I direct that said sum of money be safely invested and the interest or other proceeds arising therefrom shall be used for said purpose."

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To the second form add, "And I direct that the income from said property shall be used for the support of said Rest Cottage and in the event that it is deemed advisable to sell the said property so devised, that the money derived therefrom shall be invested and the proceeds used for said purpose."

At the suggestion of the donor such bequest or devise may be left as a memorial to erect a building or endow a room to be known by the name of the person designated.

You may make your own will without any witnesses being present. To do so it must be wholly dated, written and signed in your own handwriting.

In the event that it is written by other persons it must be signed by you and by two witnesses, who must sign at your request after you have declared to them that the instrument is your last will and testament. They must sign in your presence and in the presence of each other.

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By-Laws of Ebell Rest Cottage Association

ARTICLE I OBJECT

The object of this Association is to provide for the control and maintenance of Ebell Rest Cottage in accordance with the purpose for which it was deeded to The Ebell of Los Angeles.

ARTICLE II OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Officers of this Association shall consist of a Chairman elected by a vote of the members of The Ebell of Los Angeles, an Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer elected by the Association. These officers with five Directors (two of whom shall be the President and the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

SECTION 2. The past Chairmen of the Association shall be advisory members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE III DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall have charge of the current affairs of the Association and of Ebell Rest Cottage. They shall formulate rules and regulations governing Ebell Rest Cottage and submit the same to the Association for ratification. Such rules and regulations shall not become effective until approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

SECTION 2. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee, except the Chairman, shall be filled by the Executive Committee of the Association.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Chairman shall have the general oversight of Rest Cottage, its matron and guests. She shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. With the advice of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees, shall approve all bills before they are paid by the Treasurer, and shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The Assistant Chairman shall keep a record of all Rest Cottage guests, their social relations and condition with a view to rehabilitation; and shall assist the Chairman in other ways as required.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee, and shall present a report of the work of the year at the annual business meeting.

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SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall receive from the Treasurer of Ebell all moneys due the Association, together with a statement showing the funds to which such moneys shall be charged, and shall give a receipt for same, which receipt shall state the funds to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall pay all bills approved by the Chairman and shall give a bond as provided by the Board of Directors of Ebell.

ARTICLE V STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Finance
- 2. Membership
- 3. Investigation
- 4. Transportation
- 5. Follow-up
- 6. Program
- 7. Hospitality

SECTION 2. The Finance Committee, one member of which shall be the Chairman of Finance of The Ebell of Los Angeles, shall verify the monthly financial reports of Ebell Rest Cottage Association.

ARTICLE VI MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Any member of The Ebell of Los Angeles may be a member of Ebell Rest Cottage Association upon the payment of dues.

SECTION 2. Members shall be known as Associate, Contributing, Sustaining, Life and Memorial Members.

ARTICLE VII DUES

SECTION 1. The dues for associate members shall be one dollar per year, payable in October.

SECTION 2. The dues of sustaining members shall be twelve dollars per year, payable one-half in October and one-half in March.

SECTION 3. The dues of contributing members shall be two dollars or more per year.

SECTION 4. Upon the payment of one hundred dollars any person may be made a life or a memorial member.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Friday of each month.

SECTION 2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

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SECTION 3. The regular meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Friday of each month except the month of August.

SECTION 4. The annual business meeting shall be held on the first Friday in June at eleven a.m. Polls open until noon.

SECTION 5. The Chairman shall call such special meetings as she may deem necessary; due notice of such meetings to be given by the Secretary.

SECTION 6. Seven members shall constitute a quorum at any regular or called meeting of the Association.

ARTICEL IX ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. All officers, except the Chairman, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

SECTION 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect, except that at any election where there is but one candidate for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

SECTION 3. At the regular meeting in April, a Nominating Committee of three shall be elected who shall prepare a ballot to be presented at the next regular meeting.

SECTION 4. An Assistant Chairman, a Secretary and a Treasurer to serve for one year, and a Director to serve for three years, shall be elected at each annual business meeting.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1. The By-Laws of this Association may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided notice of such proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding regular meeting.

SECTION 2. Such amendment shall become effective when approved by the Board of Directors of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

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By-Laws of the Evell Juniors

ARTICLE I

NAME

This group shall be known as the Ebell Juniors.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this group shall be advancement in all lines of general culture including social welfare work.

ARTICLE III OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The officers shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee and shall have general supervision over all the activities of the Juniors.

SECTION 2. The Board of Directors of Ebell shall appoint an Advisory Committee of three regular members of the Club, one of whom shall be a member of that Board. These, together with the Executive Committee of the Juniors, shall constitute the Board of Governors which shall decide all matters of policy concerning the Juniors. The Advisory Committee shall meet at the call of the President of Ebell Juniors.

SECTION 3. The officers of the Ebell Juniors shall have no power to incur any indebtedness or liability which has not been authorized in detail by the Board of Directors, but shall defray all expenses not so authorized.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall preside at all regular meetings of the Juniors and at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall call meetings of the Advisory Committee and special meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary. With the advice and consent of the Executive Committee she shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for in the By-Laws; shall be ex-officio a member of all committees. She shall sign all bills; shall report all matters of interest at the meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Juniors, and make an annual report to the Club at the annual meeting in June. She shall carry into effect all orders of the Board of Directors and shall enforce the provisions of the By-Laws and the Standing Rules of the Club.

In June, following the annual election, the President for the ensuing year shall have the power to call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of all standing committees.

SECTION 3. The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee. She shall keep the membership records and act as Chairman of the Courtesy Committee.

SECTION 4. The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Social Welfare Committee.

SECTION 5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Juniors and of the Executive Committee. She shall attend to all correspondence not otherwise provided for.

SECTION 6. The Treasurer of the Juniors shall receive from the Financial Secretary of Ebell all moneys ordered paid to her by the Treasurer of the Club, giving a receipt therefor, in which shall be stated the accounts to which such moneys shall be charged. She shall receive all moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities and shall immediately transmit them to the Financial Secretary of the Club, requiring a receipt therefor. She shall make an annual report at the regular meeting of the Juniors in June.

ARTICLE V STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Standing Committees shall be:

1. Advisory Council of Past Presidents

- 2. Courtesy
- 3. Credentials
- 4. Program
- 5. Scholarship
- 6 Social Welfare
- 7. Such other committees as the Executive Committee deems necessary.

SECTION 2. An Advisory Council of Past Presidents, whose chairman shall be the incumbent President of the Juniors, shall meet with the Executive Committee for conference when requested.

SECTION 3. The Courtesy Committee shall act as a general hospitality committee whose duty shall be to co-ordinate all hospitality activities.

SECTION 4. The Program Committee shall provide a program for each regular meeting.

SECTION 5. The Scholarship Committee, with the advice of the Scholarship Chairman of Ebell, shall have supervision over all scholarships given by the Juniors and shall administer all the scholarship funds of the Juniors.

SECTION 6. Chairmen of committees, both standing and special, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference when necessary. They shall inform the President of all such meetings so that she may attend if she so desires. They shall incur no indebtedness not authorized by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 7. It shall be the duty of all committees to assist the Executive Committee.

SECTION 8. All moneys collected by the Juniors for club activities shall be paid at once to the Treasurer of the Juniors and a receipt required therefor.

SECTION 9. All officers and chairmen shall hand promptly to their successors all records pertaining to the work of their offices.

ARTICLE VI MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Membership shall be open to the daughters of members of Ebell and to their friends. All members must be between the ages of eighteen and thirty years.

SECTION 2. An application for membership shall first be presented to the Second Vice-President of the Juniors for investigation and shall then follow the procedure for regular membership in Ebell.

SECTION 3. Each member of the Ebell Juniors must pledge herself to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and must sign the Junior By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.

Section 4. Any Junior may become a regular member of Ebell upon written application to the Board of Directors and the payment of the difference in the registration fees.

ARTICLE VII DUES

SECTION 1. The registration fee shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members, which amount shall be deducted from the registration fee when the applicant becomes a regular member of Ebell.

SECTION 2. The annual dues shall be one-half of the amount paid by regular members. The Club year shall begin on the first day of July of the current year, at which time dues may be paid. One-half of the dues becomes delinquent after October

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first and the second half after March first of each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.

In the month of May the Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Club shall notify all members whose dues are delinquent for one year that, unless such dues are paid on or before July first, their names shall not appear in the next issue of the Year Book.

SECTION 3. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to remit the fee of an applicant for membership and the dues of a member for one year, by unanimous consent, when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

SECTION 4. A member who resides more than thirty-five (35) miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, be classed as a non-resident member and have one-half of her dues remitted. She may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 5. A member who is an employee and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, have one-half of her dues remitted; she may have admission cards to one-half of the regular meetings which the Juniors are permitted to attend. She shall not be eligible to election to office or to serve on committees.

SECTION 6. A member who is absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application each year and with the consent of the Board of Directors, pay one-half of the yearly dues from the date of her departure provided, however, her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month.

The regular meetings of the Ebell Juniors shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month from October to June inclusive, excepting December.

SECTION 2. All departments of Ebell shall be open to Ebell Juniors on the same terms as to regular members.

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SECTION 3. Ebell Juniors may have the privilege of attending nine regular Monday meetings during each year.

ARTICLE IX ELECTIONS

SECTION 1. Each member of the Executive Committee shall be elected for one year at the regular meeting in May. No member shall be eligible to serve two consecutive years in the same office.

Election shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect at any election.

Nominations

SECTION 2. The names of the candidates for office shall be placed on the ballot through a Nominating Committee consisting of five members. Two members of this committee, a chairman and an assistant chairman, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting preceding the regular meeting of the Juniors in March; the other three members shall be elected from the floor at the regular meeting in March. Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

SECTION 3. On or before April first the Nominating Committee shall meet to nominate candidates for each office to be filled. All nominations must be approved by the Board of Directors before being published in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine.

The Nominating Committee must obtain the consent of each candidate before placing her name on the ballot.

SECTION 4. At the regular meeting in April, the Nominating Committee, through its chairman, shall report to the Juniors the names of the nominees it has selected for each office to be filled.

Nominations from the floor shall be called for and if there are no further nominations, the report of the Nominating Committee shall be accepted. This report shall be published in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine.

Election

SECTION 5. All matters pertaining to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of three members, two of whom shall be elected by the members at the regular meeting in April. The other member shall be elected by the Executive Committee at its regular meeting in April and must be a member of that Committee.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the Election Board to cause to be printed ballots upon which shall be placed, in alpha-

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betical order, the names of the candidates for each office, with as many blanks as there are offices to be filled.

Balloting shall take place at the hours set by the Executive Committee and published with the report of the Nominating Committee in the May issue of the Ebell Magazine. At least two members of the Election Board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. Only members whose dues are paid to date shall vote at annual elections.

The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result of the election at the close of the regular meeting in May.

The Election Board shall place the counted ballots in the ballot box, seal, and deliver it to the Financial Secretary of the Club. These ballots shall be given to the Junior Advisor on the Board of Directors who shall report the results of the election at the next regular meeting of that Board.

SECTION 7. The installation of officers shall take place at the regular meeting in June. They shall enter upon their duties July first provided, however, that the President for the ensuing year shall call the incoming Executive Committee together for the appointment of standing committees.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These rules may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Notice of such amendments shall be given at the previous meeting.

Whereas, the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of the Ebell Juniors; and whereas, those who have already signed the Junior By-Laws have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club; and whereas, we as citizens of the United States of America enjoy the protection of its government: therefore we do hereby, in signing these By-Laws, pledge ourselves to uphold the provisions of the Constitution of the United States of America and also to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Club.
