

Dr. Adrian Ebell, a distinguished German scholar, realizing woman's limited opportunity for mental development and the necessity of fitting her to cope more effectively with the strenuous and complex forms of modern life, conceived the idea of establishing an international academy with headquarters at Berlin and tributary chapters in all parts of the world, for the object of developing feminine mentality along serious and scientific lines.

The first of the several chapters on the Pacific Coast bearing his name was the Oakland Ebell, organized in 1876. The Los Angeles Ebell, established in 1894, with its central organization and various study departments, was modeled upon the same lines as this admirably planned Mother Club.

Annual Report of the Recording Secretary

Another year of progress marks the history of Ebell. Whether the aim has been for pleasure or for profit undoubtedly each member must feel that she has received a large measure of that which she most coveted.

Financially, the Club is in a very gratifying condition, as it now owns 2875 shares of the Ebell Build-

ing Association Stock.

There have been one hundred ninety-seven new members received during the year; two qualified as Life Members, eleven as Associate and twenty-seven as Temporary. Eighteen members have resigned. It is with sorrow we record that twelve received the final summons and have passed over into the Great Beyond. The total number of regular members is now 1148.

At the Monday afternoon programs three thousand five hundred ninety-seven guests have been entertained. The Club is greatly indebted to the Program Committee, Mrs. John Haywood Francis, Chairman, for thirty-four afternoon programs, beside the Charter Day reception, an evening of music and social enjoyment in connection with the Arts and Crafts Exhibit, the Children's Christmas Party, an Exhibit of Applied Work of the Los Angeles Public Schools and the Annual Luncheon.

There have been eighteen lectures, eleven musicales,

one dramatic sketch and four readings.

In the lectures given a wide diversity of subjects was presented. What our attitude toward human progress should be was revealed to us by Dr. Robert J. Burdette in his lecture on "Human Orientation." Mr. John Vance Cheney touched our hearts with poetic sentiment in the reading of his original verse and

an address on "Our Inheritance Here in this Southland." With stereopticon we were thrice carried across the waters to entrancing scenes in Europe; Prof. Haig Arklin took us on a visit to the famous Art Galleries in his lecture on "Masterpieces of Art;" by word and by picture Mr. B. R. Baumgardt in "Athens and the Golden Age of Pericles," portrayed the indebtedness of modern civilization to the ancient Greek for art, philosophy, poetry and architecture; and Mrs. W. S. Bartlett graphically described the Passion Play as she had seen it at Oberammergau.

The ever-recurring and ever-important topic of woman was twice discussed; Mrs. Charles Louis Michod tracing the intellectual development of woman from primitive ages to the present time, and Prof. John H. Francis in his theme, "Some Problems Common to Club Women and the Public Schools," showing how the home ought to co-operate with the school in the development of the child.

Some of the grave problems of human existence were treated by Rev. Dana W. Bartlett in a stereopticon talk on "Life's Contrasts," and by Mrs. Alice Stebbins Wells in "Some Side Lights on the Social Question."

An interesting phase of modern art was presented in the Arts and Crafts Exhibit, which was supplemented by the instructive addresses of Miss Leta Horlocker, Miss May Gearhardt and Mr. Hector Alliot.

To be permitted to see an unknown land through the eyes of another was our delightful privilege in the "Travel Sketch—Porto Rico" by Dr. John Willis Baer. The heart was thrilled with patriotism on Abraham Lincoln Anniversary Day by Miss Frances M. Richardson's address on the "Growth and Triumph of the American Flag," and by the presentation to the Club of a beautiful flag by Mr. and Mrs. Joseph E. Coleman.

How to use some of the mysterious powers of the mind in a practical way was scientifically discussed by Mr. Richard Ingalese in his lecture on "Practical Occultism." To the ardent devotee of books, Mr. Arthur E. Bostwick gave special pleasure in his talk on "The Companionship of Books." No other lecture during the year was so unique as that of Mr. Henry Oldys on "Bird Notes"—his imitation of bird songs by whistling being marvelous.

Some legislative affairs were ably presented by Senators Leslie R. Hewitt and Lee C. Gates.

Miss Katherine West Nathan cleverly illustrated the art of amusement in her dancing and her talk on the "Evolution of National, Court and Drawing Room Dances."

A new feature introduced on the programs this year was a preliminary talk before the regular program by a representative person on some theme pertaining to the advancement of the city or the welfare of the community. Those who have appeared in this capacity are Mr. D. E. Luther, Mrs. Von Wagner, Mr. Hughes, Miss Bessie Stoddard, Dr. P. V. K. Johnson, Mr. William Spalding, Mr. W. A. Alderson and Dr. Luella Clay Carson. Others who have spoken before the Club but whose names did not appear on the regular program are, Dr. Erwin S. Chapman, Mrs. Harriet W. Myers, Mr. Miller of the State Normal School and Mr. Norman Hackett.

The musical afternoons have given much pleasure to large and enthusiastic audiences. Two song recitals, one by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Balfour and the other by Mr. Arthur Alexander, awaken delightful memories. To the Dominant Club Quartette Ebell is especially grateful as the musical numbers most greatly enjoyed were the original song compositions of one of our own members, Mrs. William H. Jamison.

Groups of songs by Miss Jean Clerihew and Mr. Fred G. Ellis were most charmingly rendered. To Mrs. Grace Widney Mabee and Mr. Homer Grunn, Miss Margaret Goetz and Mrs. Gertrude Ross we offer deepest appreciation. A Christmas Song Cycle by

Miss Mary Carter assisted by Mrs. William H. Jamison portrayed most vividly the story of the Christ-Child.

A program of musical enjoyment was a group of children's songs of her own composition sung by Mrs. John J. Abramson. This was accompanied by the exceedingly artistic telling of some children's stories by Miss Fannie E. Foote.

In two lecture-recitals given, one by Dr. Bruce Gordon Kingsley and the other by Mrs. Edward Mac Dowell, assisted by Miss Zerlina Bartholomew, there was a happy combination of entertainment and instruction.

A chorus in costume of National Folk Songs under the direction of Miss Margaret Goetz was not only pleasing to the ear but beautiful to the eye. Ebell counted herself especially favored in being permitted to listen to Miss Olga Steeb in a piano recital. An afternoon with the Glee Clubs and orchestras of the Los Angeles and Polytechnic High Schools, under the leadership of Miss Verna Blythe and Mrs. Gertrude Parsons, demonstrated the fine work being done in our city schools. Others who have assisted on musical programs are Miss Lorna Gregg, Mrs. Wallace Cahill Ayer, Mrs. Harmon Ryus, Mr. J. P. Dupuy, Mr. Will Garaway, Miss Florence Gratrix, Miss Hazel Peterson, Miss Irma Hahn, Mr. Ernest E. Pither, Mr. Baxter and Mmes. Menasco and Adolph Fleischman.

Among readings and plays we are pleased to note "Prophecy and Fulfillment—the Bible" by Miss Ida M. Leonard, "The Shepard" by Mrs. Cora Mel Patton, "A Kentucky Cardinal" by Mrs. Katherine Wisner McCluskey, "The Piper" by Mrs. George Goldsmith, and a Dramatic Sketch by Miss Marjorie Rambeau.

The Ebell Children's Christmas Party brought much joy to two hundred eighty-three children, but it is safe to say that the little hearts made truly the happiest were the three hundred sixty-nine settlement children entertained the next day—children whose moments of supreme happiness are very rare.

The growth of Ebell is in no way more forcibly shown than in the increased interest in the following nine departments, which work along different lines, yet all unite in one aim, the development of the individual. Thirty mornings the members of the Department of French met under the able instruction of Prof. Alliot, with Mrs. L. R. Quint as Curator. The members of the Department of Expression wandered far afield in thought and consequent expression, with Emerson for their guiding star, and with Mrs. W. L. Jones, Curator, and Mrs. J. W. Holder, assistant, to see that the wagon was ever "hitched to the star." The Department of Shakespeare, with Mrs. Edward North as Instructor and Mrs. F. W. Beau de Zart as Curator, spent fifteen profitable mornings carefully studying the three great Roman Plays. The Department of Art and Travel visited England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Miss Alice Mitton was the Instructor and Mrs. B. N. Pratt Curator. The Department of Music, with Mrs. Harmon Ryus, Curator, has had fourteen Wagnerian lecture-recitals of unparalleled interest, in which Dr. Kingsley completed the exposition of "The Ring of the Niebelung," with a final concertreview of the year's work. The Department of Books and Conversation, with Mrs. George Goldsmith as Curator, held seven enthusiastic meetings. The work ranged from the classics to the latest books and dramas. Mrs. W. S. Cross was chairman of the Hospitality Committee, and managed the luncheons more than ably. The Department of Science has been carried through the year with a committee of six strong members, with Mrs. D. K. Dickinson, Curator, as chairman. Each member of this committee furnished a speaker for one morning, making seven lectures in all, the subjects being as varied as the callings of the various speakers. And "last but not least," the Department of Drama, with Mrs. Ada Henry Van Pelt, Curator, held fourteen meetings, when different phases of the Drama were presented.

Books for the Club library have been bought from time to time, the most notable being the latest edition of the Century Dictionary.

That Ebell does not exist for self-culture alone is proven by the good work of the Civics and Philanthropy Committee, Mrs. W. R. Dickinson chairman. Space permits of the special mention of but two facts: The securing of two hundred ninety-six dollars for the scholarships, and the furnishing of the model bun-

galow at the Utah Street School,

Other committees that have contributed to the pleasure and success of the Club, and especially of the Monday afternoons, are the House Committee, Mrs. Edwin A. Curtis chairman, whose ministrations added social enjoyment to the tea rooms; the Courtesy Committee, Mrs. Reuben Shettler chairman, whose gracious cordiality made the member and the guest alike feel welcome; the Credential Committee, Mrs. Malone Joyce chairman, who so tactfully guarded the doorway; the Ushers Committee, Mrs. Samuel V. McClure chairman, who so carefully ministered to the comfort of the audiences; and the Decorating Committee, Miss May Neill chairman, whose services added beauty and attractiveness to the stage and the reception rooms.

During the year the Club has been the recipient of useful and handsome gifts from Mrs. Henry Valk, Mrs. Nell D. Brooker, Mrs. M. M. Ritterband, Mrs. Alexander Campbell and Mr. and Mrs. Joseph E. Coleman. Mrs. F. W. Johnson, Mrs. Philip Gengembre Hubert, Mrs. James Warren Holder, Mrs. J. H. Miles and many others donated books, clothing, money and other gifts in aid of the benevolences of the Club.

By-Laws

Article I

The corporate name of this Club shall be The Ebell of Los Angeles.

Article II

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

Article III

The officers of this Club shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Article IV

Powers and Duties of Directors

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

- Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.
- Sec. 3. The Directors shall appoint their own Secretary and an Auditor of the Club from their own

number. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

Sec. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

Article V

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.

Sec. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

Sec. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

Sec. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

Article VI

Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an honorary member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

Sec. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

- Sec. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall be exofficio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.
- Sec. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all Committees their instructions in writing.
- Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive

Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

Sec. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She is also ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

Sec. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as Financial Secretary.

Article VII

Standing Committee

Section 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing;
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Departments;
- 5. House Committee.
- Sec. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- Sec. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the
- Sec. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- Sec. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of
- Sec. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the build-
- Sec. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Article VIII

Section 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her application shall be endorsed by

three members in good standing, and of more than one year's membership. The application shall be handed to the Membership Committee, who shall investigate the same, and either cause the names of the applicant and endorsers to be posted on the Bulletin Board, and published in the next issue of the Monthly Bulletin; or, in case of non-acceptance, the application shall be returned by the Chairman of the Membership Committee to the first endorser. At the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the second Thursday of each month, applications which have been published shall be voted upon, and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be required to elect to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of The Ebell of Los Angeles."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card from a Federated Club, dated not more than one year previous, may use that card as an endorsement.

Sec. 2. Business women, members of the Club, whose hours of business are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted.

- Sec. 3. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted.
- Sec. 4. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Club for five (5) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.
- Sec. 5. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the initiation fee and one-half the annual dues.
- Sec. 6. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- Sec. 7. A non-resident may become a temporary member by having her name presented by two members in good and regular standing, with the approval of the Chairman of the Membership Committee, upon the payment of \$2.00 per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the
- Sec. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee

or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

- Sec. 9. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous recommendation of the Committee on Membership.
- Sec. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues.
- Sec. 11. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- Sec. 12. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

- Sec. 13. Members in good and regular standing who resign, may upon application, receive a resignation card stating their standing.
- Sec. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

Article IX

Dues

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- Sec. 2. The annual dues shall be \$8.00 payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership.
- Sec. 3. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay one hundred dollars (\$100), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.
- Sec. 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.
- Sec. 5. Members who may be absent from the city for one year or more shall pay half the annual dues.

Article X

Meetings

Section 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a reguar meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30

- p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.
- Sec. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.
- Sec. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.
- Sec. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.
- Sec. 5. The semi-annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in January.

Article XI Elections

- Section 1. All officers shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.
- Sec. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect.

Nominations

Sec. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Elec-

tion Board of three members, two of whom shall be selected by the Club members on the first Monday of April, and the third shall be named by the Executive Committee from their own number.

The Election Board shall prepare a nominating ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from April 14th until the first Monday in May. A copy of the nominating ballot shall be sent to every Club member, with the Monthly Bulletin for

The nominating ballot shall contain the names of all candidates for the various offices, in whose behalf a properly signed petition shall have been filed with the Election Board, or with the Clerk in the Office, before April 12th. Petitions must state that the candidate agrees to serve if elected, and must contain the signatures of not less than ten regular members of the Club. If no candidate appears for some certain office, the Election Board shall supply a name.

Nominees shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

All nominating ballots shall be returned by the first Monday in May.

Sec. 4. All persons receiving twenty-five (25) or more votes on the nominating ballots shall be declared the nominees for the offices for which the votes were given, and their names shall be printed in alphabetical order on the ballots prepared for final election. If no person shall receive twenty-five (25) votes for some

certain office, then the two persons receiving the highest number of votes for that office shall be declared the nominee for that office; if only one is voted for, that one shall be the nominee.

Sec. 5. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election

- Sec. 6. Two directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.
- Sec. 7. The annual election of directors and officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.
- Sec. 8. Balloting shall take place between the hours of 10 a. m. and 3 p. m. on the date set. The Election Board shall announce the result to the Club on the second Monday in June, reporting at this time the number of votes cast for each candidate.
- Sec. 9. Installation of directors and officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

Article XII

Section 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

- Sec. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.
- Rule 1. All members of Departments must be members of "The Ebell of Los Angeles."
- Rule 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- Rule 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Department Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Departments are to meet, and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a secretary to assist her in the Department.
- Rule 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- Rule 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name,

and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

- Rule 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.
- Rule 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

Article XIII

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

Article XIV

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

Article XV

- Section 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- Sec. 2. The power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Club, or to add new By-Laws thereto, may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

Sec. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall include mailing to every member of the Club, not less than ten days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to add, repeal, alter or amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon; also announcements from the platform, at two regular meetings previous to that of voting, which announcements must state the character of the proposed changes and the date of voting.

Sec. 4. Any such repeal, alteration, amendment or new By-Law so adopted shall, when adopted by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

Sec. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

Article XVI

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

Article XVII

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

Article XVIII

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any

of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

Article XIX

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell Club, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June, 1911. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.
