

THE EBELL CLUB OF Los ANGELES was organized in 1894 on lines similar to the Ebell of Oakland, California, which was founded in 1876 by Doctor Adrian Ebell of Berlin. It consists of a central organization with a system of study departments.

In 1897 the Club was incorporated and in this year joined the General Federation. In 1900 it became a Charter Member of the State Federation.

In 1903 the Ebell Building Association was incorporated with power to issue stock, buy and sell real estate and build and own buildings—the Ebell, as a literary organization, having no power to issue stock.

In 1905-6 a lot was purchased and the present club house erected, the Ebell eventually becoming the sole owner of the stock.

The active membership of the Club is limited to 1550, with a waiting list.

The growth and success of the society is due not only to the broad and carefully laid foundation planned by its organizers, but to the conscientious and efficient work of each succeeding administration, in the building of the superstructure.

President's Report

As the horizon of the individual woman has been widened by the opening of new doors of opportunity and responsibility since the granting of Suffrage—so the horizon of the Club has been immeasurably extended by our interest in the stupendous world events of the past year.

The unusually large number of measures of great import to women that have been before our State Legislature and the Congress of the United States have received our close consideration. Letters and telegrams have been sent to our Senators and Representatives urging the establishment of a Woman's Bureau; an appropriation to enforce the Child Labor Laws; the purchase of certain lands adjoining the Yosemite Valley to include certain wonderful mountains and waterfalls; National Prohibition; prohibition of the use of grains for the manufacture of liquors during the war; inauguration of a franking system for all soldiers' mail from abroad and from training camps. Local and State legislative measures have also received our attention and action and we feel that we have stood for right and justice as true women should.

Your President has served on committees of many Civic organizations: — Chamber of Commerce Survey Committee of Billboards; Chamber of Commerce Special Power Bond of committee of seven; Organization Committee of New Jail, Association; Prisoners' Aid Society; Director of Morals Efficiency Committee; Vice-President of Japan Society and Director of the Los Angeles Branch American Red Cross.

The crisis in our national affairs caused by the Great War has found us ready to serve — we have formed a large and active Ebell Auxiliary to the Red Cross, making many dozen hospital garments, forming four classes for Home Nursing and two classes in Surgical Dressings. We have also cooperated with the National Council of Defense in the sale of Liberty Bonds and the distribution of seven hundred copies of the President's War Message to the City High Schools. Hundreds of our women have signed the G. F. W. C. pledge for plain living and later the Hoover Food Pledges. The Club and individual members gave five hundred dollars for Y. M. C. A. work in Military Camps and five hundred seventy three dollars and seventy-five cents was raised in one afternoon by voluntary offerings for the National Red Cross Fund Drive. Our Red Cross work has continued through the summer and we stand ready to devote our best energies to our Country's needs in the coming year.

New opportunities and responsibilities call for our highest and best endeavor and freely as we have received as a Club so freely shall we give of our substance and of ourselves that at the end of another year we may look back with pride to feel that we have done what we could to alleviate the suffering and need of the world and to uphold the honor and dignity of womanhood.

So do we face the unknown future with high courage, with faith and determination to uphold the ideals of Democracy, of Liberty and of Service.

Report of the Recording Secretary

N the second day of October, 1916, Ebell's twenty-second Club year was begun, to draw to a close on June twenty-fifth, 1917; a year unprecedented in its history, with its augmented Departmental work, enlarged field of Philanthropies and Social Service and its activities to meet the needs of the crisis which is rocking the world today, the Great War.

Members who used to attend the more superficial programs, come now to help in the work of mercy and relief, to make garments and bandages and to learn the care of the sick and wounded, while intelligent investigation has brought to their observance cases of illness and need at home.

Never have women responded as they have to this call, never have they held so much at stake.

Mrs. Ashley assumed the Presidency realizing from previous experience the import of her office, and during the year has given unstintedly of her time and thought, not only to the Club but to Committees and Conferences where her presence was desired.

Mrs. Grantland S. Long, First Vice-President, presided at the Board meetings during the summer, as Mrs. Ashley, owing to illness in the family, was obliged to be absent. As Chairman of the Printing and Red Cross Nursing Committees, her influence has been widely felt.

Mrs. Walter Harrison Fisher, Second Vice-President, as Chairman of the Program Committee has supplied thirty-eight Monday programs, and has been of

great assistance in the Department program work. On the evening of November twenty-first, Senator Gore was engaged to give a lecture, "Social Duty." The guests on this occasion were the men friends and relatives of the members.

Mrs. Henry Van Bergen, Third Vice-President, Chairman of the House Committee, has devoted her time to the needs and comfort of the Club, arranging for Monday teas, receptions and special luncheons.

Mrs. Lyman C. Blakeslee, Fourth Vice-President, as Chairman of the Membership Committee, gave the following report at the annual business meeting:

On March twenty-third, Mrs. Frederick Warren Johnson, on account of duties at home, tendered her resignation as one of the Directors of the Club. This was accepted with keen regret and it is Ebell's good fortune that a Past President, Mrs. Charles N. Flint, was willing to fill the vacancy.

Mrs. Will H. Smith, Chairman of Credentials, submits an interesting report. Ebell entertained over three thousand guests during the year at the regular and Department meetings.

Mrs. Adolf K. Brauer, Chairman of Ushers, with her assistants has performed her duties most efficiently with the observance of every measure for safety and comfort.

Mrs. Charlotte E. Wood, Chairman of the Decorating Committee, has, with the aid of her assistants, supplied the reception rooms and auditorium with effective and tastefully arranged flowers and ferns, throughout the year.

Mrs. Edwin A. Curtis, Chairman of the Courtesy Committee, has extended a welcome to the members of the Club and their friends, her assistants also being ready to dispense hospitality on all occasions.

The following Resolutions have been adopted by the Club during the past year:

Resolution, addressed to the City Council, asking that a parcel of land be rented or donated to the Anti-Tuberculosis Society, on which to erect a Preventorium for the care of tubercular children.

Resolution, of thanks and appreciation to the artists who loaned paintings for Ebell's first Art Exhibition.

Resolution, in support of the Channel Club in its effort to secure an appropriation from the Board of Supervisors for the repetition of the Nativity Play, during the Christmas holidays at Exposition Park.

Resolution, in appreciation of the work of Mrs. Carrie Jacobs Bond, and of regret at her illness at that time.

Resolution, of sympathy at the death of Mrs. Eliza Tupper Wilkes.

Resolution, endorsing the action of the City Attorney in his effort to abate the Billboard nuisance.

Resolution, asking the State Assembly to postpone indefinitely, action on Bill No. 798 which allows the sale of dogs and cats from the public pounds for the purpose of vivisection.

Resolution, appealing to our Government to take the initiative in passing a National Prohibition Bill.

Resolution, urging our State and National Administrations to protect our women and children by maintaining all regulations regarding child-labor and women's employment.

Numerous letters and telegrams to United States Senators and Representatives and State Senators and Assemblymen urging on and commending their support of Bills and Measures relating to the public welfare and promoting good citizenship have been authorized and sent.

Ebell has been the recipient of some very interesting gifts during the year: one a gavel, presented by Mrs. Sherman W. Wiggins, is made from the various woods of California, combined to make a most beautiful design. It has been exhibited in a great many Chambers of Commerce throughout the country and the Club is proud in the possession of such a prize. Another, a photogravure, "The Blind Bard," was given by Mrs. C. D. Clawson, and hangs in the tea room, a charming reminder of the donor. Besides these several volumes have been added to the Library through the generosity of Mrs. Lewis Clark Carlisle, Mrs. Alexander Campbell and others.

On Thursday, June 7th, a special meeting was arranged for consideration and discussion of important emergency measures in connection with our present national crisis. Stirring appeals were made and after the meeting those present responded most generously to the Y. M. C. A. Military Work Fund.

Every thought and action of our women has been colored and shadowed by the cloud that seemingly overcasts the earth today, but with rare spirit, dauntless courage and true patriotism they have done their share.

We live today the things that are borne in from the outer world and from across the seas. They are the emergencies in which women look from their own hearts to seek the sympathy of their sisters and are

comforted to think that they are banded together in a way to make their work more effective, their insight more keen and their quest for the best guidance so directed. Our future, we know, holds everything. Our motto, "Ich Dien," never meant so much.

Report of the General Curator

-01

Since activity is the test of a living organism we may say Ebell is truly alive in the world of today when we consider her sixteen active departments. The question has been asked, "Why stay we on earth except to grow?" and Ebell answers, "During the year the growth is shown by the two new departments added, the Choral and the Spanish, in order that our horizon may broaden and that we may meet and satisfy the varying interests."

The Parliamentary Law Department, with Mrs. Charles S. McKelvey as Curator, has had a year of earnest, practical study including the organization of assemblies, elections, by-laws, the introduction of business and the use and relation of the secondary motions. The attendance has been constant and regular to a remarkable degree and the aim has been to become intelligent, helpful members of our organization.

There were twenty-eight enrolled with an average attendance of sixteen and the guests numbered thirty-one.

With Mrs. Horatio Cogswell as Curator, the Department of Music had a season of great interest and educational value. The opening meeting was devoted to Ebell's composers who proved their worth in a delightfully varied program. The remaining meetings, with the exception of the last, were in charge of Mrs. Ethel Graham Lynde, who was assisted at the piano by Miss Grace Adele Freeby. Two of Mrs. Lynde's lectures dealt with Operas; one being "Iris" by Mascagni and the other "The Nightingale" by

Stravinsky. Otherwise her lectures were interpretations of the programs given by our Symphony Orchestra. In these programs Mrs. Lynde dealt with Symphonies by Mozart, Beethoven, Brahms and Tschaikowsky, besides many works of lesser These lectures have created a well deserved interest in our Symphony Concerts. On the morning of January tenth, Mr. Cadman was present at the meeting and, graciously responding to Mrs. Lynde's request, played and elucidated his "Thunderbird Suite." The season closed with a musical given by the Ebell Chorus, the Symphony String Quartette, Karoly Horvath, who introduced the Hungarian national instrument, the Cymbalour, Mrs. Guy Bush, pianiste, and the Ebell Quartette. This program was followed by a luncheon at which the guests of honor included the artists of the morning, Herr Tandler, Mr. and Mrs. Behvmer and Madame Hesse-Sprotti.

There was an enrollment of two hundred three and an average attendance of ninety-three; with guests to

the number of seven hundred eighty-three.

"American Ideals" was the topic of the year's study in the Emerson Department. The Curators, Mrs. Ilot Johnson and Mrs. W. R. Mail, felt that there was unusual significance at this time in the seeking to determine from actual events whether history has not in itself spiritual forces which may result in a "Renewed confidence in our threatened idealism and a revived confidence in the might of right." Their plan was to study American original thinkers with their contribution and effect upon American Ideals. By papers and discussions, the ground was covered from the Mysticism of Jonathan Edwards to the Philosophy of Josiah Royce. Suggested outside readings covered Plato, Jefferson, Hamilton, Milton, Whitman, Carpenter,

Tagore, Buckham, James, Royce, Woodbridge Riley, Darwin and Florence Huntley. The class read together Emerson's Essays, "Milton," "Modern Literature," "The Oversoul," "Art and Criticism," "The Tragic," and the chapters on "Commodity," "Beauty" and "Language" in "Nature Addresses."

There was an enrollment of one hundred three, an average attendance of thirty-five, and the total number of guests was twenty-four.

The aim of the Department of English has been to arouse an interest in the analytical study of our language thereby gaining an understanding of the fundamental facts and attaining a relative completeness and accuracy of expression. With Mrs. C. S. Ward, Curator, at the beginning of the year, and later Mrs. Malone Joyce, this Department has been zealous in its efforts to improve under the able guidance of the instructor, Mrs. Ilot Johnson.

There were sixty-four enrolled, with an average attendance of thirty-six, and nine guests.

With Mrs. Charles A. Stavnow, Curator, and Mrs. Edward North, Instructor, the Department of Shakespeare began the year's work confident in the faith that each year's study of Shakespeare means a clearer understanding of life and of mankind. In the study of "The Tempest," they found that "Living gives us our philosophy which in turn makes our life what it is." These lines in "Measure for Measure" come as a trumpet call at this hour of crisis in the world: "Thyself and thy belongings are not thine own so proper as to waste thyself upon thy virtues, they on thee. Heaven doth with us as we with torches do, not light them for themselves; for if our virtues did not go forth of us, 't were all alike as if we had them not." In "Othello" they

came to know Iago, who at the last realized the futility of attempting to harm the souls of men. The study of this Department was broken by three happy hours of social pleasure in the three Department luncheons of the season.

There was an enrollment of seventy-eight, an average attendance of forty-eight, and the total number of guests thirty-four.

In the Department of Social Science with Mrs. Charles N. Flint and Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, Curators, the members who had charge of the monthly programs of this Department most ably reviewed the following books: Cabot's "What Men Live By," Devine's "Misery and Its Causes," Ross' "Social Control," Nearing's "Poverty and Riches," and Mrs. W. E. Keepers gave a scholarly "Appreciation of H. G. Wells from a Sociological Standpoint." In April a lecture on "Liberty" was given by Reverend E. Stanton Hodgin and in May, one on "India, Its Problems and Solutions" by Dhan Gopal Mukerji. These reviews and lectures were supplemented by a series of "Practical Talks" on Civic Conditions given by Mrs. Estelle Lawton Lindsay (City Council), Mrs. Katherine J. Haw (Superintendent Juvenile Hall), Doctor Harriet Probasco (Juvenile Hall), Miss Anna Dempsey (Hamburger Department Store), Miss Maude Minor (Secretary New York Probation Association).

In July, 1916, under the direction of the Social Science Department a "Social Service Committee" was organized with Mrs. William Read as Chairman. The report appended—as given by its efficient and untiring Chairman—is a brief outline of the great work done by the Social Service Committee.

The Social Service Committee of the Social Science Department held its initial meeting July seventh, 1916.

Its purpose — the practical application of social science principles as presented in the Department work and the establishment, ultimately, of a rest home for convalescents. To give immediate relief to some of the helpless and suffering was the first task. Cooperation with existing social agencies with similar aims was sought and secured. Sub-committees were formed to visit places of instruction, recreation, and correction; schools, playgrounds, homes, courts, jails, homes for children, homes for the aged or infirm, hospitals, vacation homes, housing apartments. At the County Hospital patients needed warmer sleeping hoods and shoulder wraps. To provide these a sewing room was necessary. Generous members contributed sufficient money to purchase one sewing machine and generous business firms gave the free use of others.

During the Club year 745 new garments have been made and 1180 used garments or other useful articles collected and distributed to the County Hospital, Florence Crittenton Home, McKinley Home for Boys, Needlework Guild, Neighborhood Settlement, various schools, numerous individuals, and the Red Cross. From available funds many convalescent patients have been given a month's rest and many destitute families rendered less miserable. But most important is it that the ninety-five to one hundred women who have aided in the social welfare work are now awakened to the evil effects of the existing industrial and social systems and are convinced of the futility of depending solely upon alleviation of suffering for social progress. cause of these evil conditions must be found and removed and a wiser system established on a fairer foundation.

There were one hundred sixty-nine enrolled in the Social Science Department, an average attendance of

ninety-eight, and the guests numbered two hundred

eighteen.

Miss Anne H. Smith, Curator, and Miss Jessie Weimar, Instructor of the Voice Training Department have realized that to be heard is an important thing for the Club woman with a message and their object has been to assist the individual to more ably serve. Technical exercises have been given to develop the voice in purity, strength, flexibility and sustaining power as well as in the economy of breath. The importance of the training of the ear, the position of the body and ease of manner have been recognized. Twenty-eight profitable lessons have been enjoyed, and on the closing day the old English comedy "Confusion," by Joseph Derrick, was presented, followed by the joint luncheon with the English Department.

There were one hundred one enrolled, an average attendance of thirty with one hundred seventy-nine

guests.

The aim and purpose of the French Department. may be said to be two-fold: to acquire fluency and accuracy in speaking the French language and to become familiar with the literature and the ideas and ideals of the French people. These two goals are logically inseparable, and under the guidance of Madame de Kerpezdron the members of the Department have made marked progress. A beginners' class was inaugurated in October, to which the first half-hour of the session has been devoted. Considering the handicap of so short an instruction period, the members of this class have made commendable progress, especially in the excellence of their pronunciation. The Curator, Mrs. B. W. Zens, opened the work of the Department in October, but was forced to relinquish her post the first of November, owing to an extended absence from the

City. The Department was in charge of the assistant Curator, Miss Amy Wheeler. In January the Department presented a comedy, "Le Jeu de L'Amour et du Hasard," by Marivaux, preceded by a short address by Madame de Kerpezdron, and an appropriate musical number. In March, the Department presented a musical and literary program, followed by a luncheon. During the year the Department listened to lectures by their instructor on French authors from Balzac and Victor Hugo to Victorien Sardou and contemporary writers, thus completing a three years' course in French literature.

There was an enrollment of eighty-five and an average attendance of thirty-four, with two hundred thirteen guests.

The Department of California History and Landmarks, with Miss Margaret F. Phillipson as Curator, opened the year with a most instructive program, given by Miss Grace Stoermer, on the "History and Development of California Industries," illustrated with motion pictures. After this auspicious beginning, the greater part of the year was given to considering the early life in Los Angeles and the bird life and flora of the vicinity. Seven Franciscan missions were studied and two programs on the El Camino Real were presented by Mrs. A. S. C. Forbes. Mrs. M. E. Bartlett provided music for each meeting.

There were one hundred forty-five members enrolled, an average attendance of thirty-four and the guests numbered eighty-one.

One of the newest Departments of Ebell is the Choral Department with an enrollment of twenty-eight and an average attendance of twenty-two; under the able direction of Mrs. T. D. Wallace. The weekly meetings have been devoted to the practice of vocal exercises and songs. Several programs have been given. Much credit is also due Mrs. Guy Bush, the accompanist, for her regular attendance and the inspiration given. Miss Maude Merryweather, the Curator, has held monthly business meetings and harmony in spirit as well as in sound has been the key note of this Department.

A Department of Spanish was organized the first Wednesday in October with Miss J. Maud Blanchard as Curator and Senora Aurelia Borquez de Whenthoff as Instructor. The course consisted of conversations and story writing in Spanish, based upon the text book "A Series of Spanish Conversations" (Whenthoff). Great interest was shown from the beginning and the enthusiasm of the class was evident from the large attendance, as well as by the many study circles that met for an hour of practice several times each week, in the Club House, and by the willingness to help one another.

March seventh was chosen as Spanish Reciprocity Day, a large number of guests from other clubs responded to the invitation, hearing a short story in connection with the lesson. On Thursday, May thirty-first, the Department gave a Spanish luncheon. This was followed by a Spanish Play, written by Senora Jeannette Fischer and presented under her direction.

The enrollment was one hundred forty-nine, an average attendance of sixty-eight and forty-eight guests.

The Department of Bible Study, with Mrs. W. S. Bartlett as Curator, had seventy enrolled and an average attendance of thirty-one, with forty-one guests. Leaders of men and nations, prophets, priests and kings were the topics considered, and many of our present

laws were traced back to their foundations under Moses; the prophecies of Christ in the Old Testament, patriotism as shown in the Book of Esther, a review of the little known Book of Tobet and a "Garden on a Spring Morning" with descriptions gleaned from the Bible. A lecture by Dr. W. H. Fishburn on "What the world owes to the Jew and why he has not passed from the earth," was much enjoyed; also the story of "The Witnesses," by Mary Raymond Shipman Andrews. While this Department is not numerically large, the interest and enthusiasm of its members cannot be excelled.

The Browning Study Department with Mrs. Thomas B. Stowell and Mrs. Sidney J. Parsons as Curators, has given its entire time to the study of the first six books of "The Ring and The Book." Forceful and thoughtful discussions of vital and inspiring topics were participated in by a large number. resume of Hodell's "The Making of a Great Poem" by Mrs. Ilot Johnson was printed for the use of the class and an original poem uniting Maeterlinck's "Monna Vanna" and Browning's "Pompilia" was presented by Mrs. Thomas R. Coles. A permanent contribution to aid Browning students is the booklet containing more than three hundred questions on "The Ring and The Book" prepared by the Curators and published by the Ebell. The annual luncheon to honor Browning's birthday was held May eighth and observed as a reciprocity day for other Browning Clubs.

The enrollment was ninety-eight, an average attendance of sixty-seven and thirty-five guests.

The Art and Travel Department, taking for its motto — "Art for Life's Sake," — has studied a number of cities from the viewpoint of what they offered their citizens that would make life in them more livable;

beautiful buildings, parks and gardens, public art galleries. The Department has had fourteen illustrated lectures — some from the American Federation of Arts, others by professional lecturers, on Municipal Art in Florence, in Brussels, in Mexico City, New York, Washington City and others; also lectures on American Mural Painting, American Sculpture, American Municipal Art.

It has had seven exhibitions of paintings; one — a miscellaneous collection from the California Art Club — and six one-man exhibitions — C. P. Townsley, Frank W. Cuprien, Hanson Puthoff, Elizabeth Gowdy Baker, John W. Rich and Arthur J. Vernon.

The Curator furnished a winter's outline of study for one of the smaller art clubs of the city and several outlines for a club in another state.

The enrollment has been three hundred eighty-two, the average attendance one hundred eighteen, and the guests numbered two hundred sixty-eight.

The Department of Drama with Mrs. A. W. Allen, Curator, studied the chief contemporary dramas of the following countries: Norway, Germany, France, Russia, England, Ireland and America. The third act from Zangwill's "The Melting Pot" was presented by the Polytechnic High School under the direction of Miss Craig; scenes from "My Lady's Dress," by Knoblaugh presented by Manual Arts High School under the direction of Miss Maude Howell: "A Pot of Broth," by Yeats, the Egan Dramatic School, and a one-act play by Strinberg, directed by Mrs. Alfred Whitney Allen. The year culminated with a scintillating talk on the "American Drama" by Dr. Paul Jordan Smith, and an illuminating reading from Ibsen's "Ghosts" by Nicholas Dunaew.

The enrollment was one hundred thirty-five with an average attendance of two hundred ten, and guests to the number of ninety-three.

Mrs. George H. Kress, Curator of the Books and Conversation Department, remembering that reading is primarily for the reader to find himself, devoted the early part of the year to a few autobiographies. Having gained a broader vision of man, later time was given to modern twentieth century literature, both English and Russian, in the endeavor to secure a more universal vision.

Reading to acquire a knowledge of people of our own age, especially of woman, what she stands for economically, politically and socially, the members of this Department have been stirred by the knowledge of woman's achievements. 
There were one hundred nine enrolled, with an average attendance of one hundred six and the guests

Clothing and other articles were sent to eight settlement schools including the Ann Street Preventorium, which received blankets, comforts, eiderdown coats and wool caps to a value of \$58.50.

Other charitable institutions were aided through regular channels. Among these were the County Hospital, Florence Crittenton Home, McKinley Home for Boys, Needlework Guild, Neighborhood Settlement, Johnson Housing Apartments and the Los Angeles Clinic.

296 new garments, 117 articles of clothing contributed for the purpose and other necessities were taken to the County Hospital.

206 new garments with other infants' apparel contributed were sent to the Florence Crittenton Home.

The Neighborhood Settlement received 417 boxes and packages.

One of the most important sub-committees was the Friendly Visitors Committee the members of which were indefatigable in the pursuit of their duties.

This Committee has become the Red Cross Auxiliary of Ebell.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

Second—That the purpose for which it is formed is advancement in all lines of general culture.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws



ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

- SECTION 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.
- SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint an Auditor of the Club from their own number, and a Treasurer from the membership-at-large. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.
- SEC. 5. The Recording Secretary and the Treasurer shall meet with the Board of Directors, but shall have no vote.

ARTICLE V.

- SECTION 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report matters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.
- SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.
 - SEC. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

SEC. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

SECTION 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint a Club Parliamentarian, a Federation Secretary and all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be sub-

ject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

SEC. 2. The First Vice-President shall be chairman of the Printing Committee; she shall assist the President in the preparation of the Year Book, and otherwise as the President may desire.

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Com-

mittee and a member of the Printing Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee. The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book.

SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, of the Board of Directors, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instruc-

tions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee, or by the Board of Directors; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club, a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the

same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She shall be a member of the Printing Committee and ex-officio chairman of the Committee on Departments.

- SEC. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as Financial Secretary.
- SEC. 8. Chairmen of Committees, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII. Standing Committees.

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing;
- 3. Committee on Programs;
- 4. Committee on Departments;
- 5. House Committee.
- SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.
- SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.
- SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

Article VIII. Members.

SECTION 1. The number of active members of this Club shall not exceed 1550.

SEC. 2. An application for membership shall be signed by the applicant, endorsed by three members in good standing and of more than one year's membership, and handed to the Membership Committee for investigation. The chairman of the Membership Committee shall present the application, together with the result of their investigation, to the Executive Committee for action. The applicant shall be voted upon by ballot at a regular meeting of the Executive Committee, and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be necessary to election; the Chairman of the Membership Committee shall notify the applicant of the result of the election. The names of those so elected shall be published alphabetically in the monthly bulletin and posted on the bulletin board, and if no protests are received within two weeks after publication, they shall be placed upon the waiting list in the order of application, and transferred to the list of active members as vacancies occur.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

"I, the undersigned, having personally known the above applicant for a period of (state number of years or months), vouch for her as a desirable member of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES."

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

An applicant for regular membership who brings a card of a current year from a Federated Club may use that card as an endorsement.

- SEC. 3. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of transfer to the list of active members.
- SEC. 4. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 5. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one half the initiation fee and one-half the annual dues.
- SEC. 6. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- SEC. 7. A temporary resident may, by having her name presented by two members in good standing, or by one member together with a card of the current year from a Federated Club, and with the approval of the Membership Committee, become a temporary member upon the payment of two dollars (\$2.00) per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.

SEC. 9. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to non-members, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

SEC. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues. She shall then receive a card of resignation. Former members holding resignation cards and applying for reinstatement must follow the order prescribed for the admission of new members, except that they shall not be required to furnish endorsers. The admission fee for such members shall be one-half the regular admission fee, or one-half the dues accrued during the time of non-membership.

SEC. 11. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$10.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership.
- SEC. 3. Members of the Club who are employees, and whose hours of employment are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the meetings of the Club, shall, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted. They shall not be included in the list of active members or be eligible to election to office in the Club. They shall receive one-half the guest cards allowed active members.
- SEC. 4. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted. They shall not be included in the list of active members.
- SEC. 5. A member who is to be absent from the city for one year or more may, upon written application and with the consent of the Executive Committee, pay one-half the yearly dues from date of application, provided her dues are not in arrears at the time of application. She shall receive a certificate of membership in lieu of a regular membership card.
- SEC. 6. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Club for ten (10) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.

- Sec. 7. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII, Section 2. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.
- SEC. 8. The Executive Committee shall have authority to remit the fees and dues of any member for one year when it shall be deemed for the best interest of the Club.

ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

- SECTION 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.
- SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.
- SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.
- SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a.m.
- SEC. 5. The annual business meeting of the Club shall take place the first Monday in June, and the semi-annual business meeting the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

- SECTION 1. All officers, except those appointed by the Board of Directors, shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.
- SEC. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect. At any election, except the annual election in June, if only one candidate is nominated for an office, the election may, by unanimous consent, be by viva voce vote.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Mon-

day in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club of more than one year's standing. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. This shall not apply to officers appointed by the Board of Directors. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of ten a. m. and three p. m. of the date set; three members of the election board must be present during the balloting. Each member shall be required to register before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall notify each candidate of the result of the election, and post the names of the officers-elect on the bulletin board, as soon as possible after the votes are counted, and report to the Club on the second Monday in June the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

ARTICLE XII.

- SECTION 1. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.
- SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.
- RULE 1. All members of Departments must be members of THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.
- RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.
- RULE 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee.
- RULE 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.
- RULE 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.
- RULE 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.
- Rule 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any time request special action by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV.

- SECTION 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- SEC. 2. The power to amend the By-Laws of the Club may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.
- SEC. 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall consist in mailing to every member of the Club, not fewer than ten days before the vote is to be taken, a printed copy of the section or

sections it is proposed to amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon, and the date of voting.

- SEC. 4. Any such amendment so adopted shall, when approved by the Board of Directors, become effectual.
- SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by the rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised," in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Special Rules of Order of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX.

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of THE EBELL CLUB, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-Laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of June. 1917. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in all respects in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally-called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

The Membership Committee does not assume responsibility of proving the truth or falsity of derogatory rumors concerning the character of applicants for membership, but persistent and general rumors will be deemed sufficient to bar the applicant.

New members notified during February and June shall pay dues from March first and October first respectively.

Temporary Membership must be continuous from the date upon which it is granted.
