Report of the Recording Secretary

and must soon be written as EBELL history, it becomes the duty of your Recording Secretary to present an epitome, as nearly as may be, of the activities of the club as a whole, as heretofore submitted in detail from week to week throughout the year, and of our present condition as to growth in numbers and more intangible things, as the cumulative effect of the passing weeks and months.

From the report of the Membership Committee, of which Mrs. J. T. Fitzgerald is chairman, we learn that the year has added to our roll 206 new names; 16 members for various good reasons have resigned; 18 in accordance with our By-laws have been dropped for non-payment of dues during a period of eighteen months; 10 the Angel of Death has garnered for the larger life; our total membership at present is 1380. One new name has been added to our list of life members and two have been made honorary members.

From the viewpoint of those close to the inner workings of the club it is difficult to see how Mrs. Brock, chairman of our House Committee, could more thoughtfully have cared for our physical comfort. By her wise supervision we have been warmed or cooled, cheered and fed and provided with all the necessities and many of the luxuries of a well-ordered home. A pleasing addition to our tea room is the beautiful urn on the china cabinet.

Our members and their guests have been met at the threshold by the welcoming smile of the chairman of the Courtesy Committee and it is a current saying in Ebell that no one who has felt the handclasp of Mrs. Barlow or any of her co-workers can ever again feel strange in our club home.

The Social Committee, under the leadership of Mrs. Edmund E. Smith, has distributed those thoughtful, sympathetic attentions that lighten the sorrow and add to the joy that are a part of the life of each of us.

The patient skill of our ushers, under Mrs. F. E. Hughes' direction, in caring for the audiences that have taxed the capacity of our club house from week to week is known to all, while Mrs. Goddard and her faithful Decorating Committee have been ever present in the faces of lovely flowers not only on great occasions like Charter Day and New Year's receptions, but at every meeting of the Club.

Mrs. S. M. Browne, chairman of the Credentials Committee, whose welcome comes only at sight of a certain bit of paste board of definite color and superscription, reports the entertainment at our regular Monday meetings of three thousand eight hundred seventy-one guests, one hundred twenty-four of these being men. Fifty have been admitted to the various departments. If we add to these those entertained on special occasions, Charter Day and New Year's receptions, our Children's Christmas parties, Reciprocity Day and the Blue Bell Operatives' Club evening, it will be seen our total number of guests is about five thousand.

The Program Committee, Mrs. E. W. Martindale, chairman, has provided thirty-six programs, thirty-two for regular Monday meetings, one for each of the Children's Christmas parties and one for our New Year's

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reception, these for our upbuilding mentally, morally and spiritually, our all-round artistic development and our growth along all lines of culture. Never has the spirit of Christmas hovered closer to Ebell nor the Christmas light and joy, reflected in the happy faces of little children, entered more homes that might have been desolate on the birthday of the World's Joy than in the Yuletide season of nineteen hundred twelve.

From Mr. Henry Bailey we learned how to discern our architectural inheritance in our present day architectural environment and from Mr. Ernest Bachelder to feel the humanness of the great cathedrals which represent the aspirations, the ideals and the personalities of their builders. Dr. Van Dyke established the existence of a moral law in art and the logical sequence that the artist's character is of vital importance, leaving its lasting impress on his work.

Professor Maria Sanford in her lecture on the Beauty of the Bible brought to us the spiritual lesson of Faith, the most potent factor in the building of character—the supreme end of living.

Reciprocity and Legislation Day when it was Ebell's pleasure to have as our guests at luncheon delegates from each of the Federated Clubs and to listen with them at our afternoon meeting to discussion of important legislative measures, and our Political Program just before the National Election when the situation was clearly presented from three standpoints by Mesdames Florence Collins Porter and O. P. Clark and Miss Mary Foy, are red-letter days which we all remember with pride.

Ten musicals, presented by artists, most of whom we are proud to claim as residents of our city and not a few as members of our Club, have given us opportunity

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to hear the best in this—to many—highest expression of art.

The liquid notes of Madame Vicarino delighted one of our largest audiences on a day already rich in the theatric and artistic interest of papers by Mr. Otheman Stevens and Mr. John Mitchell.

With Mr. Baumgardt we read a marvelous tale—the Romance of Civilization—and with Mr. and Mrs. Edward Kemp we viewed the creation of that greatest triumph of modern civilization, our own Panama Canal. And again, we lingered with Miss Cocke in Sicily and the Isles of Greece.

An afternoon with the Drama Department and one with Mrs. Goldsmith brought illumination through lecture and dramatic interpretation.

The Johonnot lectures and especially the spirit of co-operation that brought them here and that is still with us mark a step forward in Los Angeles club life. At the postponed semi-annual business meeting held February Seventeenth, an amendment to the By-laws raising the Life Membership fee from one hundred to two hundred dollars was adopted by the Club.

Thus week has succeeded week bringing these and other feasts among which choice has been difficult because of general excellence and only necessity could be permitted to keep one away.

Resolutions as follows have been adopted by the Club as a whole:

Favoring the establishment of Vocational Schools throughout the country in all suitable grades of school work.

Endorsing the movement for Permanent Grand

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Petitioning against the sale by the Council of the Water Board lot.

Endorsing the principle of equal pay for equal work, regardless of sex, as now provided by the law of California.

Endorsing the campaign to raise funds for the Social Service Hospital.

Protesting against the destruction of Magnolia Avenue's (Riverside) noble line of trees.

Petitioning our City Council and Board of Supervisors each for an appropriation for \$2500 toward the maintenance of the People's Orchestra and the People's Chorus.

Ebell contributed one hundred dollars toward a guarantee fund to bring to our city in the Exposition Year, the Biennial meeting of the National Association of Federated Music Clubs, of which our own member, Mrs. W. H. Jamison, is Vice-President for California. We also joined the Federation through our Music Department, whose curator, Mrs. H. D. Ryus and Miss Gentry Wickizer, one of our members, represented Ebell as delegates at the convention of the Federation held in Chicago in May.

The Ebell Scrap Book, begun by Mrs. Roscoe B. Ashley in the early days of the Club and presented to Ebell by its compiler at the beginning of this club year, is a unique and valued addition to the library. Mrs. Ashley continues to add to the work.

At a business session of the Club, on June 2, 1913, an amendment to our By-Laws, increasing the annual dues, raising them from \$8 to \$10, was adopted.

Early in the year Ebell transferred her dramatic activity from the National Drama League with head-

quarters at Chicago, to the Los Angeles Center of the League, paying dues here and co-operating with the local association, our Club having a representative on their Executive Board and our Drama Department presenting the program on the occasion of the League's Reciprocity Day at San Pedro.

Through the appointment by our President of a committee of twenty-nine representative Ebell members and appearing in our Year-book under the caption of Forward-Work Council, Ebell has been kept in touch with practically every line of social service activity in both our city and our state.

At the closing session of the Civics Department three minute reports were presented by the members of this Council on their respective work and the listeners realized that these reports were the result of personal knowledge.

With the growing power and prestige of Ebell as a factor in the life of the city, many causes have sought her endorsement or approval, but while never hesitating to array herself on the side of any measure making for the uplift and betterment of our citizens, Ebell has chosen, in faring forth to new fields of possible accomplishment or defeat, to cultivate angelic caution and rather than risk acting unwisely, to welcome every opportunity for investigation and enlightenment in the problems of citizenship, that our individual members may be fully informed in the premises; but for the present, as a Club, not to endorse specific political measures.

At a postponed semi-annual business meeting held February 17th the Club voted against limiting its membership and Ebell continues to grow in numbers and prestige. Shall we be able to preserve that homogeneity, that unity of purpose that make for efficiency and

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strength in the testing times and that are not a matter of size but of character? If we do, it must be through high and ever higher standards of thinking and living in all our relations with our fellows, club members and others, and through the constant fidelity to the altruistic legend on our banner which have made possible the Ebell of which we are all, to-day, so proud.

Let us continue to seek first the only prestige that can endure—that character that is the unfailing fruit of daily culture through service.

Annual Report of the General Curator

Too MUCH cannot be said in praise of the Department work, one of the strongest features of EBELL. The Departments are the conservers of the cultural ideals of the Club; they promote loyalty and allegiance, and are the source of tender friendships and lasting intimacies.

An outline of the work shows first, the Department of Parliamentary Law, Mrs. Matthew S. Robertson, Curator, studying the first principles of governmental action; methods of parliamentary procedure, origin and enactment of laws, all of which topics have new meaning and interest to women who have a practical part in the making and enforcement of laws; women whose highest privilege as well as duty it is to study at first hand the machinery of the state and nation. This Department held thirteen meetings and had a registration of forty-four.

The Department of Expression spent the year on some of the essays of Emerson, in "Conduct of Life" and "Society and Solitude." They studied carefully and minutely the gracious words given to the world by this poet and seer, were inspired by the thoughts he uttered, and the aspirations he awakened; they studied also with reverence the beautiful life he lived so that he might through loving appreciation be as immortal as a mortal can be. Mrs. Ilot Johnson was Curator until January when Mrs. William Read accepted the

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position. This Department held eleven meetings, and had a registration of fifty-three.

The Department of Shakespeare, with Mrs. Edward North as Instructor, Mrs. Wm. H. Mayne, Curator, studied three plays of the great bard, Romeo and Juliet, Love's Labor's Lost, and Winter's Tale, showing the contrasts of Love versus Hate, Learning and Jealousy. Historic and geographic settings, special topics of customs, comparative readings and character sketches, gave zest and variety to the programs, as did also the lay sermons, quotation contests, and active readings. This Department held fourteen meetings and had a registration of ninety-six.

The Department of Art and Travel, with Miss Anna Beckley as Instructor, Mrs. E. R. Potter, Curator, enjoyed a "Tour of Germany," beginning with Cologne and the historic Rhine and ending with the nation's capital, Berlin; they journeyed through picturesque and romantic scenery, visiting monuments and ruins and revelling in art-museums and cathedrals. Talks from members recently travelling in Europe were greatly appreciated. This Department held fifteen meetings and had a registration of two hundred and thirty.

The Department of Music, with Dr. Bruce Gordon Kingsley as Director, Mrs. Harmon Ryus, Curator, began the year with the study of the mystical music-drama "Parsifal," and Wagner's wonderful harmonies of music and thought were presented so skillfully and interpreted so feelingly by Dr. Kingsley that five meetings seemed all too few for the consideration of this masterpiece. Lecture recitals were also given on "Great Symphonies," and the modern operas, "Haensel and Gretel" and "Natoma." During Dr. Kingsley's absence in April and

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This Department held fourteen meetings, and had a registration of one hundred and six. At the closing musicale and annual luncheon May 28, Madame Katherine Fiske as a special courtesy gave a song recital with Mr. Axel Simonsen, violoncello, Mrs. Sidney B. Webb, violin, and Mrs. Ryus, piano.

The Department of Books and Conversation, Mrs. W. S. Bartlett, Curator, made a departure in the line of study this year by emphasizing the "Human Side of Literature," bringing before the Department the personality of authors as shown in Autobiography and Letters. The subjects discussed were Memories and Impressions of Modjeska, Love Affairs of Literary Men, French Memoirs, Mark Twain, American Memoirs, Martin Luther and the Monastery Poets, New England Letter-writers. An important feature of the year's work was the critical review of each month's books given by Mrs. William Read the first two meetings, and by Mrs. W. Ri. Mail the other five times. This Department held seven meetings, and had a registration of one hundred and sixty-one.

The Department of Drama, with Mrs. Mila Tupper Maynard as Instructor, Mrs. Ada Henry Van Pelt, Curator, studied Maeterlinck's dramas in chronological order, with outlines and active readings of each of the fifteen plays; they also discussed two of Zangwill's plays, and touched upon recent British drama, Bernard Shaw, Arnold Bennett, and others, not forgetting the

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consideration of current local plays, one of the features of the Department from the first, now taken up and recommended by the Drama League of America. In February, the Department gave a complimentary entertainment to EBELL members and their friends, presenting the reading of Zangwill's "The Melting Pot," by Mrs. Charles S. Hall. Members of the Department also gave a program on Reciprocity Day at the San Pedro Woman's Club, which was highly appreciated. This Department held fourteen meetings, and had a registration of two hundred and twenty-five.

The Department of Civics, Mrs. James Bert Stearns, Curator, has taken up subjects pertaining to city and national problems, and vital to the American house-wife; a few of the topics only can be mentioned, the high cost of living, pure food, the problem of supply and demand, the interest of the employer and the protection of the employed, domestic immigration policies, journalism, education, and bills to be presented to the Legislature. This Department held seven meetings, and had a registration of one hundred and fifty-six.

The Department of Social Science, Curators, Mrs. Charles N. Flint, Mrs. Sumner P. Hunt, was added to the curriculum of study-sections last year, and took for its leading thought the broad field of Democracy. The different phases discussed were The American Idea, Progress and Poverty, The Great State and its Constructors, Woman in Democracy, Economics in Democracy, Ethics in Democracy. There was ample scope for the development of this Department along broad lines, and it has been well sustained. Six meetings were held, and the registration was ninety-one.

The Department of Bird-Study, with Mrs. W. N. Sarver as Curator, though formed late in April, has

shown gratifying progress. Two lectures, with stereopticon, were given; one by Prof. Thompson on Birds,
their nests, and economic value, another by Mrs. Harriet
Myers, on "Warblers." Bird-skins were loaned from
Exposition Park Museum where a large collection of
stuffed birds may also be seen. There were three fieldday excursions to Eastlake Park, Sycamore Grove and
Eagle Rock, where as many as twenty-five varieties of
birds were observed. The Department will be strengthened and enlarged the coming year by the study of
Forestry. Six meetings were held, and the registration
was fifty-two.

The Department of French was discontinued the past year, but has been reorganized and promises well for next year's work.

A registry of names of members attending the Departments is taken as an index of interest shown, and as a working basis for Department programs. These lists are incomplete, but accurate as to actual attendance of those registered. The total registration is twelve hundred and four.

The social features of EBELL are emphasized by the luncheons given by the Departments, some serving luncheon each month, others only once or twice during the year; the theme of the morning is continued with Round-Table Talk, and toasts, interspersed with music and readings. It has been an enjoyable privilege to be able to bring guests to Department meetings on regular guest cards. EBELL is generous toward her Departments, providing when necessary the most competent instructors, and buying needed books for reference. A catalogue of books in the EBELL Library will soon be placed in the hands of members who are requested to

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preserve it for reference as the basis of reading for Department work. "Reading maketh the full man, conversation the ready man." A fine stereopticon is to be purchased before October, also a post-card projector. Several magazines are subscribed for and are to be found upon the library tables.

The Monthly Bulletins which contain the programs of each week should be preserved and often consulted; they are perfect little hand-books and outlines of the year's study, a treasure-house of literary, artistic and practical suggestion and should be prized accordingly.

Each year more of the members are realizing the opportunities of intellectual and spiritual growth to be had by attending the Departments, and that the ones who write papers and take part in the discussions are those who receive largest benefit. If one day in the week could be regularly given to self-improvement in the Club, this would mean the attending of at least two Departments and sharing in the broadened horizon and deepened life there to be gained. Is it not worth earnestly striving for?

The Department work of EBELL cannot be measured by rule, nor calculated by figures, for does not the poet say, "For who has sight so keen and strong that it can follow the flight of song?" and we will say, where is the plummet that can sound the deep things of the spirit? The added mental equipment, increased "initiative," richer soul-life and spiritual strength gained in Department work may be felt, not told; but are realized with inward satisfaction, and a conscious joy.

Annual Report of the Treasurer

THERE is a tide in the affairs of men—also of clubs it would seem, as the close of the Club Year found Ebell possessed of 206 new members and practically free from debt.

Two hundred and seventy-one of the 284 shares of stock outstanding have been purchased, and only the fact that the remaining shares were unobtainable kept Ebell from becoming their owner.

The repairs during the year have not been extensive and were chiefly made in the Auditorium, where the walls were retinted, new curtains hung at doors and windows, and the wooden posts under the balcony replaced by iron columns.

The dressing-room was refurnished, linen and china shelves replenished, and many little additional touches given all through the club house. At the entrance to the driveway two lighting posts were installed, adding to the beauty of our exterior and to the comfort of our members.

Realizing that in the near future a larger club house will be necessary to adequately accommodate our members and care for their needs, an Emergency or Sinking Fund has been created and the sum of \$2,000.00 put therein. It is hoped to increase this amount from time to time, as possible, so a working capital will be available when the time comes to use it.

A detailed report of Receipts, Expenditures and the Assets and Liabilities of Ebell follow, and are respectfully submitted.





Articles of Incorporation

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the State of California, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating under the laws of the State of California an association, and in pursuance of said purpose we do hereby adopt these articles of incorporation, and

We do hereby certify:

First—That the name of this corporation shall be THE EEELL OF Los Angeles.

Second—That the purposes for which it is formed are for advancement in all lines of general culture.

Third—That the place where the principal business of this corporation is to be transacted is in the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Fourth—That the term for which said incorporation is to exist is fifty (50) years from and after the date of its incorporation.

Fifth—That the number of Directors of said corporation shall be seven, and that the names and residences of the Directors who are appointed for the first year, and who are to act until their successors are elected and qualified, are as follows:

Sixth—That the said corporation has no capital stock.

Seventh—That, pursuant to a call therefor, this association was organized at a meeting duly held at 1054 Flower Street, in

the City of Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, State of California, on the twenty-sixth day of June, A. D. 1897; and it was then and there resolved to proceed to incorporate this said association; and an election was then and there duly held for the election of Directors of this said corporation; that a majority of the members of the said association were then and there present, and voted at the said election, which said election resulted in the choice of the above named Directors of the corporation; all of which is more particularly set forth in the certificate and verification by the officers conducting the said election, hereto annexed, and made a part and portion of these Articles of Incorporation.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I.

The corporate name of this Club shall be THE EBELL OF LOS ANGELES.

ARTICLE II.

The object of this Club is advancement in all lines of general culture.

ARTICLE III.

The officers of this Club shall be a President, four Vice-Presidents, a Corresponding Secretary, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, and a General Curator. These officers with its Board of seven Directors (one of whom shall be the President) shall constitute the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Directors.

Section 1. The powers of this corporation, except as herein otherwise provided in the By-Laws, are vested in the Board of Directors.

SEC. 2. The Board of Directors shall consider and control all permanent matters, i. e., financial investments, disbursements, and all established matters that pertain to the life, welfare and methods of the Club.

SEC. 3. The Directors shall appoint their own Secretary and an Auditor of the Club from their own number. The Auditor shall examine and approve all the bills and accounts of the Club as they are presented and report the same to the Executive Committee.

SEC. 4. Resolutions passed by the Directors shall be handed in writing to the Executive Committee to be entered on their minutes.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall arrange and control the current affairs of the Club, receive the reports of all committees and act upon them. The chairman shall report mat-

ters of general interest at the business meetings and at the annual meeting of the Club.

- SEC. 2. The Executive Committee shall incur no indebtedness beyond the necessary current expenses of the Club.
 - Sec. 3. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- SEC. 4. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Committee shall be filled by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 5. The Curators of the Departments shall constitute an Advisory Board to be called upon when required by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI.

Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President shall be chairman of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee; shall preside at all meetings, call all special meetings, appoint all committees, sign all bills authorized by the Executive Committee, and make an annual report.

All appointments of committees made by the President shall be subject to the ratification of the Executive Committee.

The President shall exercise supervision over all the affairs of the Club, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. In the absence or disability of the President, her duties shall be assumed by the Vice-Presidents in the order of their rank. In the absence of the presiding officers, if a quorum is present, a temporary chairman may be appointed.

SEC. 2. At the request of the President, the First Vice-President shall represent the Club at any conference, meeting or convention which the President would otherwise attend, shall assist in the preparation of the Year Book and otherwise as the President may desire,

The Second Vice-President shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

The Third Vice-President shall be chairman of the House Committee.

The Fourth Vice-President shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall be ex-officio chairman of the Printing Committee, and shall attend to the correspondence of the Club, and issue all notices ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall assist in the preparation of the

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SEC. 4. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Club, and of the Executive Committee, shall submit a report at the annual meeting, and sign all bills and corporation papers. She shall hand to all committees their instructions in writing.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall have charge of all the funds of the Club; shall pay all bills audited by the Executive Committee; shall submit a report of all receipts and expenditures monthly to the Executive Committee, and annually to the Club, and to the Board of Directors when called upon. She shall give a bond for the faithful performance of her duties to the Club, in such sum as the Board of Directors may require, which bond shall be executed by some reliable security company. The cost of obtaining said bond shall be defrayed by the Club.

SEC. 6. The General Curator shall keep posted, upon the Bulletin Board in the rooms of the Club a statement of the time and place of all Department meetings, and any information which may be of general interest to the members of the Club. She shall receive application for the formation of new Departments, and shall keep herself informed of the general character of the work of each Department, reporting the same to the Executive Committee monthly, and make a report of the same at the annual meeting of the Club. She is also ex-officio chairman of the

Committee on Departments. SEC. 7. A Clerk shall be engaged by the Executive Committee who, in addition to specific duties assigned her by said Committee, shall act as Financial Secretary, Librarian and Custodian of the property of the Club. She shall keep an inventory

of all such property and deliver the same to her successor in office, requiring from her a receipt. She shall give a bond similar to the Treasurer's for the faithful performance of her duties as

Financial Secretary.

SEC. 8. Chairmen of Committee, both standing and appointed, shall call meetings of their respective committees for organization or conference as seems to them necessary. They shall in all cases inform the President of the time and place of such meetings, so that she may be present if she desires.

ARTICLE VII.

Standing Committee.

SECTION 1. Chairmen of the Standing Committees shall be members of the Executive Committee.

The Standing Committees shall be:

- 1. Committee on Membership;
- 2. Committee on Printing; 3. Committee on Programs;
- Committee on Departments;
- 5. House Committee.

- SEC. 2. The Committee on Membership shall have charge of all matters relating to the admission of new members, or applications for life membership; and shall investigate all resignations before reporting to the Executive Committee.
- SEC. 3. The Committee on Programs shall see that a program is provided for each regular meeting of the Club.
- SEC. 4. The Printing Committee shall attend to the necessary printing of notices, membership cards, blanks, bulletins, etc., and the Year Book.
- SEC. 5. The Committee on Departments shall assist in the organization of Departments, and advise the Curators of Departments in arranging their courses of study.
- SEC. 6. The House Committee shall have charge of all social occasions, buy all house supplies ordered by the Executive Committee, and supervise the building and its contents.
- SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of all Committees to assist the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Members.

Section 1. An applicant for membership shall sign blank provided. Her application shall be endorsed by three members in good standing, and of more than one year's membership. The application shall be handed to the Membership Committee, who shall investigate the same, and either cause the names of the applicant and endorsers to be posted on the Bulletin Board, and published in the next issue of the Monthly Bulletin; or, in case of non-acceptance, the application shall be returned by the chairman of the Membership Committee to the first endorser. At the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the second Thursday of each month, applications which have been published shall be voted upon, and ten (10) affirmative votes shall be required to elect to membership.

The form of endorsement shall be as follows:

Not more than one member of any family shall be accepted as endorser for the same applicant.

No member of the Club may sign more than two applications for regular membership during one year, nor more than two for temporary membership.

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An applicant for regular membership who brings a card from a Federated Club, dated not more than one year previous, may use that card as an endorsement,

- Sec. 2. Business women, members of the Club, whose hours of business are such as to make possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, have one-half their dues remitted.
- SEC. 3. Members who reside more than fifty miles from the city, making possible only an occasional attendance at the regular meetings of the Club, shall, upon application and the consent of the Executive Committee, be classed as non-resident members, and have one-half their dues remitted.
- SEC. 4. Any member in good and regular standing, who has reached the age of seventy (70), and has been a member of this Club for five (5) years, shall, upon application to the Executive Committee, have her dues remitted.
- SEC. 5. The wives of resident clergy may become regular members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of one-half the initiation fee and one-half the annual dues.
- SEC. 6. The wives of Federal Officers in active service in the Army, Navy, and Public Health and Marine Hospital Service may become members by having their names duly presented and upon the payment of the annual dues.
- SEC. 7. A non-resident may become a temporary member by having her name presented by two members in good and regular standing, with the approval of the chairman of the Membership Committee, upon the payment of \$2.00 per month. She shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC. 8. Complimentary members may be elected for the current year, who may have the privilege of attending the open meetings, but not business meetings. They shall not be required to pay admission fee or dues. They shall have no interest in the management, property or assets of the corporation.
- SEC 9. Election to membership shall be forfeited unless confirmed by the payment of the admission fee within one month after notification of election as a member. A lapsed or forfeited membership may be restored by the Executive Committee upon the unanimous recommendation of the Committee on Membership.
- SEC. 10. Any member may resign at any time upon the presentation of such resignation in writing and the payment of all back dues.

- SEC. 11. Each member of the Club must sign the By-Laws before she shall be entitled to any of the rights or privileges of membership.
- SEC. 12. Honorary life membership in this Club may be given to a member by vote of the Club in recognition of distinguished services. Such members shall retain all the rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary membership, without payment of dues.

Honorary membership in this Club may be given to nonmembers, for one year, by vote of the Club. Such membership shall confer the privilege of attending all meetings of the Club, or of its Departments, without payment of dues.

- SEC. 13. Members in good and regular standing who resign, may upon application, receive a resignation card stating their standing.
- SEC. 14. The name of any member may be dropped from the roll of membership upon the written request of twenty-five (25) regular members in good standing and the approval, by a majority vote, of the members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IX.

Dues.

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$25.00.

- SEC. 2. The annual dues shall be \$10.00, payable in advance; one-half on the first day of October, and one-half on the first day of March each year. Non-payment of dues for one year shall cause forfeiture of membership, but such members may be restored upon regular application and payment of back dues if such application is made within eighteen months of lapse of membership.
- SEC. 3. Any member who has continued in good and regular standing for five (5) years, may apply for life membership by signing blank provided. The application shall be investigated, published, and voted upon as provided for application for regular membership in Article VIII. Section 1. If granted, the applicant shall pay two hundred dollars (\$200), receive a certificate of life membership, and be exempt from payment of annual dues.
- SEC 4. The Executive Committee shall have authority to for the best interest of the Club.
- SEC. 5. Members who may be absent from the city for one year or more shall pay half the annual dues.

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ARTICLE X.

Meetings.

- Section 1. Beginning the first Monday of October, a regular meeting of the Club shall take place at 2:30 p. m. on each Monday until the end of June, except that the Executive Committee may, at its discretion, omit two meetings at the Christmas holiday season, and one at the end of June, or on any legal holiday, or may substitute a different date for any of these meetings. At all regular meetings Departments may report, programs be presented, or business be transacted.
- SEC. 2. On the first Monday of each month may be held a business and social meeting of the Club for regular members only, at which time the Executive Committee may report on business transacted and bring new business before the Club.
- SEC. 3. A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 9:30 a. m.
- SEC. 4. A regular meeting of the Executive Committee shall take place on the second and fourth Thursdays at 10 a. m.
- SEC. 5. The semi-annual business meeting of the Club shall take place on the first Monday in January.

ARTICLE XI.

Elections.

Section 1. All officers shall be nominated and elected as provided in this article.

Sec. 2. All elections shall be by ballot and a plurality vote shall elect.

Nominations.

SEC. 3. All matters pertaining to the nominating ballot and to the election shall be arranged by an Election Board of five members, three of whom shall be elected by the Club members, on the first Monday in April. The other two shall be named by the Executive Committee, and at least one of these two shall be a member of that body. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Election Board.

The Election Board shall prepare a sample ballot, which shall be posted on the Bulletin Board at the Club House from the second Monday in May until the first Monday in June. A copy of the sample ballot shall be sent to every Club member with the Monthly Bulletin for June.

The names of the candidates proposed for office in the Club shall be placed on the ballot through a nominating petition signed by not fewer than twenty-five (25) nor more than thirty-five (35) regular members of the Club. Said nominating petition must be filed with the Election Board or with the Clerk in the office on or before the first Monday in May.

The nominating petition shall read as follows:

Upon receipt of a properly signed petition, the Election Board shall communicate with the proposed nominee to secure her consent to serve, if elected. If the consent is not secured, the petition becomes void. If no nominee is proposed by petition for some certain office, the Election Board shall nominate one or more persons for that office.

Officers shall be chosen by ballot. Members shall indicate their choice by placing a cross (X) after the name of one candidate for each office to be filled, or by writing the name of the person for whom she wishes to vote, if such name is not printed on the ballot.

SEC. 4. On the second Monday in May the chairman of the Election Board shall report to the Club the nominees for the different offices.

Election.

SEC. 5. Two Directors, to hold office for three years, shall be elected at each annual election, and shall not be eligible for a second consecutive term. Officers shall be elected for one year, and shall not be eligible for election to the same office for more than two consecutive terms. The President, by virtue of her office, is elected a Director for one year.

SEC. 6. The annual election of Directors and Officers for the ensuing year shall be held on the first Monday in June. No further notice of the election shall be necessary.

SEC. 7. Balloting shall take place between the hours of 10 a. m. and 3 p. m. on the date set. Not fewer than three during the balloting, and shall require each voter to register

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before casting her ballot. The Chairman of the Election Board shall announce the result to the Club on the second Monday in June, reporting the number of votes cast for each candidate.

SEC. 8. Installation of Directors and Officers shall take place at the last regular meeting in June, and they shall enter upon their duties at the regular meeting of the Executive Committee, the fourth Thursday in June.

ARTICLE XII.

SECTION I. The Club shall be organized into Departments for the study of special subjects or the carrying on of different branches of work. Such Departments to be Art, Science, Literature, Language, and such others as from time to time the Club may deem advisable.

SEC. 2. Each Department shall have a Curator, who shall be appointed by the Executive Committee.

Rule 1. All members of Departments must be members of The Ebell of Los Angeles.

RULE 2. Members wishing to form Departments must apply to the Executive Committee through the General Curator.

Rule 3. Curators shall preside at the meetings of their Departments, and plan a course of study and make an annual report of the work of the previous year when called upon to do so by the Executive Committee. Department Curators shall notify the General Curator of the dates when their Departments are to meet, and when they adjourn for vacation. A Curator may appoint a Secretary to assist her in the Department.

Rule 4. Departments have no power to organize or disband, nor to dismiss or appoint Curators, but may express a preference to the Executive Committee.

Rule 5. Departments may limit their number and close admission, by showing ability to keep their number complete. New Departments may then be formed, based on the same line of work, bearing the same name, and numbered according to order of formation, 1st, 2nd, etc.

Rule 6. All Departments are open and free to all members of the Club.

RULE 7. No Department or any officer thereof shall have power to incur any indebtedness or liability binding upon the Club, but shall defray all its expenses not properly authorized in detail by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

All communications on business must be presented in writing, and must pass the Executive Committee before being presented to the Club.

ARTICLE XIV.

Fifty members in good and regular standing may in writing at any tune request special action by the Executive Committee, The Executive Committee shall at once investigate the matter and refer it back to the Club.

ARTICLE XV.

Section 1. Not fewer than twenty-five (25) members of this Club, personally attending at a regular or properly called meeting, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 2. The power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Club, or to add new By-Laws thereto, may be exercised at any such meeting by a two-thirds vote of such members so assembled, due notice of the proposed changes having been given.

SEC 3. The required notice of proposed changes in the By-Laws shall include, mailing to every member of the Club, not less than ten days before the vote is taken, a printed copy of the section or sections it is proposed to add, repeal, alter or amend, with the change or changes clearly indicated thereon; also announcements from the platform at two regular meetings previous to that of voting, which announcements must state the character of the proposed changes and the date of voting.

SEC. 4. Any such repeal, alteration, amendment or new By-Law so adopted shall, when adopted by the Board of Directors, become effectual.

SEC. 5. A quorum to do business being present, any By-Law may be suspended by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE XVI.

All meetings of the Club and of the Executive Committee shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XVII.

The twenty-seventh day of October of each year shall be known as "Charter Day" commemorating the organization of the Club. A reception in honor of this event shall be given on the

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last Monday in October, when the members of the Club may be presented to the newly elected officers.

ARTICLE XVIII.

No notice need be given of any of the stated meetings of this Club, or of the Board of Directors, or of any of the committees or other convening bodies of the Club, the time of holding of which are fixed by these By-Laws. Any of such meetings may be adjourned to a day certain, even though less than a quorum be present, and no further notice of such adjourned meeting need be given, and any business may be done at such adjourned meeting which might have been transacted at the original meeting. Notice of all special meetings must be given, either personally or through the mail, or by posting on the Bulletin Board for such reasonable time as the officer calling the special meeting may prescribe.

ARTICLE XIX.

Whereas the provisions of these By-Laws require the signature of each member of The Ebell Club, and those who have already signed the By-Laws of the Club have, by such signing, bound and pledged themselves to abide by the Laws and Regulations of the Club, therefore we do hereby, in signing the same, pledge ourselves also to abide by these Laws and Regulations.

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The foregoing By-Laws comprise the original By-laws of the Club, adopted at the first regular meeting on the first day of September, 1898, and as amended from time to time by the Club up to and inclusive of and as amended from time to time by the club up to and inclusive of June. 1913. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in June. 1913. And the foregoing By-Laws have been adopted and passed in accordance with the rules of the Club at legally called meetings of the Club, and of the Board of Directors, as required by law.

Potices

The clerk will be in the office daily from 9 A.M. to 12:30 P.M., and 1:30 P.M. to 4 P.M., except Saturday afternoons.

The Year Book may be obtained at the office on presentation of membership card. Additional copies of the Year Book may be obtained from the clerk for fifty cents each.

The program will be announced monthly.

Members leaving the city for a full year may, on application, obtain absent rates.

Any member in good and regular standing who desires to visit Federated Clubs of other cities, may, upon application receive a card of introduction.

In commemoration of Charter Day (October 27th), a reception will be held Monday, October 27th.

The Annual Luncheon will be held in June.

Regulations Concerning Guests

Admission to meetings by card of current term only. Each member in good and regular standing is entitled to six cards for guests. Gentlemen admitted on calling cards. Guests not admitted to business meetings. Guests admitted to Departments on regular guest cards.
