1. Who was the National League pitcher from 1911 to 1930 who pitched the greatest number of shutouts in the National League and shares the record for the greatest number of wins?

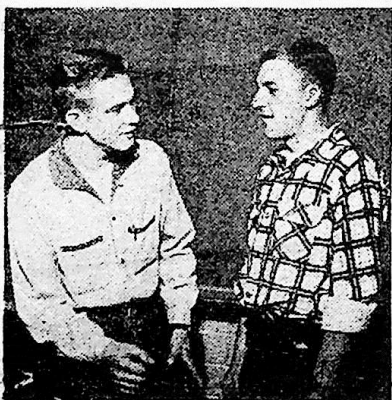
2. Who was an American League outfielder for 24 years and its batting champion for half of these years. He hit over .400 in three different seasons?

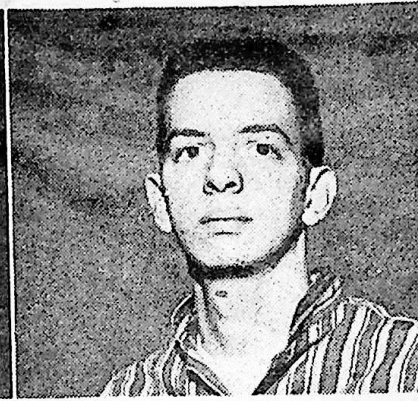
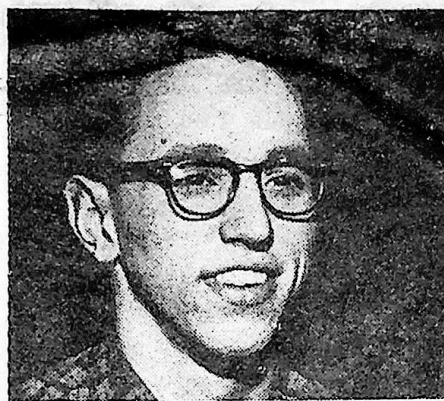
4. Who holds the major league record of accepting 317 chances in 187 consecutive games without making an error?
