Voter turn out was good as 69.7% of the student body voted in the mock election.

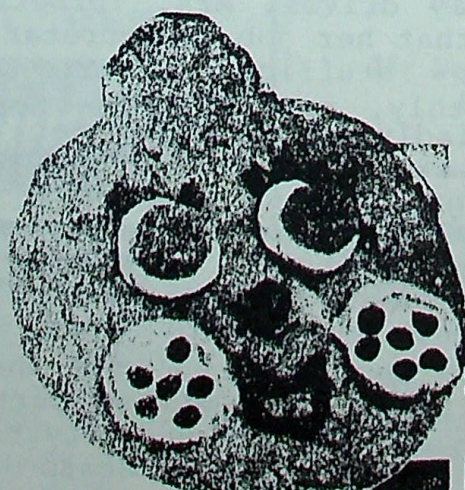
