

Louisville Loses To North Canton 9-0

Louisville lost their first game of the '57 season as they were beaten by North Canton Friday, October 4. The Vikings beat the Leopards by the score of 9 to 0. Louisville now has a record of 3 wins against 1 defeat.

North Canton kicked off to start the first quarter. Louisville was forced to punt 3 plays later. The ball changed hands many times during the first quarter because neither team could pick up needed yardage.

In the second quarter the two teams were still playing even ball. But with a few minutes remaining in the quarter, North Canton scored the first touchdown of the game. The attempt for the extra point was no good. The quarter ended shortly afterward.

Louisville kicked off to North Canton to start the second half. Again the teams showed their ability against each other as neither team could score. In the latter part of the quarter the Vikings worked the ball down to the Leopards 15 yard line where the quarter ended.

At the start of the fourth quarter, the Vikings made good a 15 yard field goal. After that there was no further scoring for either team. When the game ended the score read, North Canton 9; Louisville 0.

Freshmen Lose Twice 12-0; 32-0

The freshmen lost their first game of the season to the Minerva freshmen 12-0. The Little Leopards held their own the first quarter, but Minerva rallied in the second quarter for their first TD. Minerva scored again in the fourth quarter for their final touchdown.

Louisville's second loss was to Lehman. The Little Leopards felt the loss of Jerry Hanlon, co-captain of the team, who had broken his leg in the Minerva game, as 32 points were scored against them.

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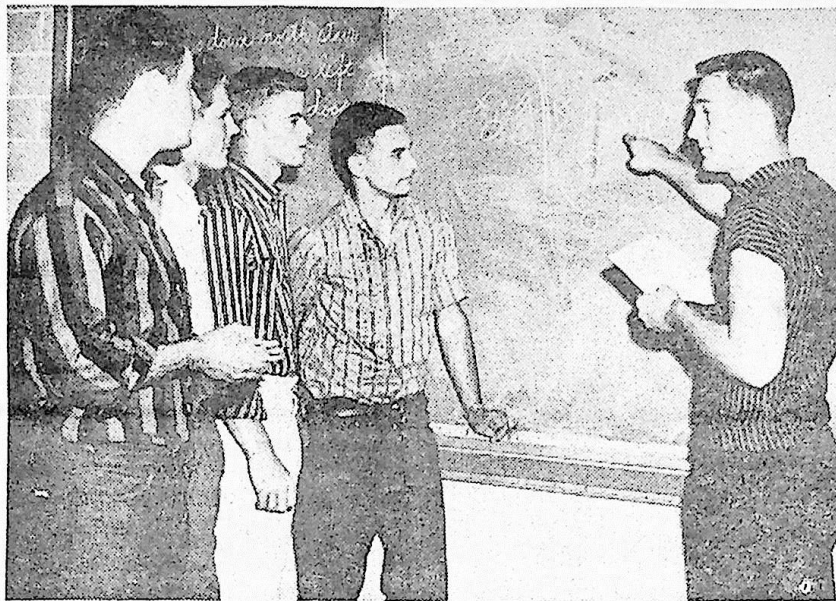
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Senior Lettermen of L. H. S.

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Leopards Triumph Over Sebring, 32-0

The Leopards proved themselves superior as they defeated the Sebring Trojans 32-0. The win was the second for Louisville in the Tri-County league standing. Sebring has yet to win a game.

Sebring received the Leopard's game-beginning kickoff; but they were forced to punt after 3 plays. Neither team could pick up needed yardage as they combined in punting a total of 5 times in the first period.

In the early minutes of the second quarter Bill Keyser scored the first touchdown of the game. Daryl Wartluft ran the ball into the end zone for the extra point. Sebring then decided to go to the air but their second pass attempt was intercepted by Paul Few on the Trojan's 49 yard line. On the third play Bob Kuhn ran over the goal for the Leopard's second TD. The extra point was blocked, and shortly after the kickoff, the half ended.

Sebring kicked off and recovered Louisville's fumble in first play of the third period. After 4 plays the Leopard's took over possession of the ball. Louisville gradually worked the ball down field until Walt Metzger carried it across from the 10. The extra point attempt was good.

The Trojans were forced to kick early in the fourth quarter. Louisville steadily drove down field with Bill Shank crossing the goal from the 5. The extra point was blocked. Sebring had the ball only a short time when Walt Metzger intercepted one of their pass attempts. Daryl Wartluft then completed a 25 yard pass to Jim Denton in the end zone for the Leopard's final TD.

Leopard Reserves Defeat Lehman 21-0

The Leopard Reserves got off to a good start this year by beating the Lehman Reserves 21-0. Louisville received the kick-off to start the game. Louisville pushed the ball down inside the 15-yard line where Daryll Wartluft hit Jim Denton with a pass to score the first TD. Gene Conner ran the extra point. Lehman received the ball but couldn't move and was forced to punt. Larry Bardash blocked the punt. After exchanging the ball several times, another Lehman punt was blocked by Louisville. Several plays later Dale Wartluft scampered across for the second TD and Conner again ran the extra point. At the half Louisville led 14-0.

The third quarter held no scoring for either team. In the final period the Leopards again went to the air as Wartluft threw to "Bugs" Boyles for the touchdown. The same play worked for the extra point. Several plays later the game ended with Louisville winning 21-0.

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
