

Rare Historical Portraits To Be Exhibited Tomorrow

Show At Maryland Institute To Mark Golden Jubilee
Of National Society, D. A. R.

Famous faces will look down from the walls of the print room of the Maryland Institute when an exhibit of rare historical portraits opens tomorrow to commemorate the golden jubilee of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Included will be a portrait of George Washington said never to have been exhibited publicly before. This portrait, mentioned in Martha Washington's will has remained in the family, and was lent to the society by its present owner, Mrs. Wilfred Mustard, great-great-great granddaughter of Martha Washington.

George Washington is shown in full length on a horse, and in the background is the encampment of the American Army at Verplanck's Point on the North river in 1782.

Also in the exhibit is a portrait of the "Three Graces," the Caton sisters, granddaughters of Charles Carroll of

Carrollton, lent by Mr. and Mrs. Philip A'Costa Carroll, of Doughoregan Manor.

Another portrait of Washington has been lent by Miss Anne E. Clark, who also lent portraits of James Ball, cousin of Washington, and Mrs. James Ball. A portrait of Commander Henry Rolands and engravings of Betty Washington Lewis and Mary Ball Washington are included.

The first two are lent by Mr. and Mrs. George Armistead Whiting, and the latter by Miss Clark. The Whitings also lent a portrait of an unknown artist. Mrs. Whiting is the great granddaughter of Eleanor Parke Custis who married Lawrence Lewis, nephew of Washington.

Two portraits by Charles Wilson Peale, one of Mary Sterrett Gist and the other of her husband, Gen. Mordecai Gist, were lent by Mrs. La Motte Smith, of Westminster, a descendant of the general.
