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This altimeter was in the control tower at the Tinian Air Base when the Enola Gay took off for the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in August, 1945

I, Hubert J. Topliff, personally removed this from the control tower, and have had it ever since. The Tinian Air Base, WAS COMPLETELY CLOSED AND ABANDONED. There not a single Air Force person on the base. I was there for a few minutes in the spring of 1947. Our task at that time was to go to all of the abandoned bases in the Pacific, remove the radio equipment and stock pile it in Japan for spare parts

I am donating this to our NHAHS museum. In addition I have a calculator we used to ^{calculate} course and speed in flight. This one is called a Mark 7. There are other types that were used by navigators, some called the E6B.
