

•Two well-known names in aviation in western Canada have recently retired from service with the Dept. of Transport. They are Charles Pickering, head of the climatological section of the Calgary forecast office; and George E. G. Craig, manager of Calgary's McCall Field.

Charlie Pickering came to Canada with his parents in 1910. He served with the Canadian Army in WW I, taking part in three major battles: Ypres, Somme and Vimy Ridge. He established the weather office at the airport at Medicine Hat in 1930 when the first and short-lived Prairie Airmail Service between Winnipeg and Edmonton was inaugurated. He continued in meteorological work.

George Craig flew with the RFC 1916-1918. Following the war he participated in several engineering ventures and joined the DoT in 1943 as an inspector on airport development. In 1945 he was made manager of McCall Field at Calgary.
